UNIVERSITY LEADERSHIP



DR. MUN Y. CHOI
PRESIDENT & CHANCELLOR,
UNIVERSITY OF MISSOURI
Third Year

Mun Y. Choi is the 24th president of the University of Missouri System and, as of July 2020, now serves in a dual role as chancellor of the University of Missouri. In this new role, President Choi oversees the academic, business, and financial aspects of the four universities, as well as a health care system and statewide extension program.

In partnership with the University of Missouri Board of Curators and university leadership, President Choi introduced a new collective vision for the system in 2018: to advance the opportunities for success and well-being in Missouri, the nation and the world through transformative teaching, research, innovation, engagement and inclusion.

This effort strengthened collaboration among the four universities and created a more efficient environment. He has worked tirelessly to transform the perception and value of higher education with the university community, alumni, legislators and Missourians.

Since his arrival, MU has celebrated three consecutive years of substantial enrollment growth, the highest graduation rate in the university's history and a record 90% retention rate for first-year students returning their sophomore year. This fall, MU also jumped up 15 places in the U.S. News & World Report rankings. Choi has led efforts to strategically invest in UM System research, particularly through NextGen Precision Health with the anchoring facility set to officially open in Fall 2021 on MU's campus. In addition to attracting top scientists, NextGen Precision Health has the potential to make key discoveries — with treatments for prostate, breast and pancreatic cancers, traumatic brain injuries and rare musculoskeletal diseases — as well as increase health care access

for rural Missourians.

Building a climate that promotes diversity and strengthens inclusion, is another key priority for Choi. For the first time ever, the entire university community is required this fall to complete cultural competency training. The American Council of Education recently cited MU as a national example for increasing its capacity to improve campus culture. In 2020, MU had the highest percentage of Black/African American students (7.7%) among all 11 Midwest flagship universities and, over the last four years, has increased its minority tenured-track faculty hires by 26 percent.

Choi strongly and continually advocates for every member of the university community to take personal responsibility for addressing discrimination when witnessing it — no matter how subtle or unintentional. The burden of raising awareness and creating a more inclusive culture falls on everyone's shoulder.

Choi came to Missouri in 2017 after nine years at the University of Connecticut where he served as provost and executive vice president (2012-2017) and earlier as dean of engineering (2008-2012). His 25-year career in higher education also includes serving eight years as a department head of engineering at Drexel University and six years as an assistant and associate professor at the University of Illinois at Chicago.

A product of and passionate champion for public higher education, he earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Illinois. He secured his master's and Ph.D. degrees in mechanical and aerospace engineering from Princeton University.

His parents brought their family to the United States from South Korea when Choi was 9 years old. His parents' initial U.S. jobs making uniforms for Taekwondo students and teachers evolved into a highly successful family business. The Choi Brothers in Chicago, where President Choi worked as a young man, is now run by his sisters and is one of the country's largest suppliers of martial arts uniforms. Choi is married to Suzanne Choi and together they have three children.

Jim Sterk was named Mizzou's 20th Director of Athletics on Aug., 9, 2016, following highly successful tenures leading programs at San Diego State, Washington State and Portland State. His Win It Right vision for Mizzou Athletics is built upon the core values of Respect, Integrity, Gratitude, Humility and Together, and his first four years have produced unprecedented academic and athletic achievements for the Tigers.

Sterk joined the Mizzou family from San Diego State, where he enjoyed a highly-successful six-year tenure that included arguably the most successful five-year run in Aztec history with 32 team conference championships from 2011-12 thru 2015-16, including a Mountain West Conference-leading 28 titles in that span, and the nation's fourth-highest combined winning percentage in football and men's basketball. In addition, SDSU was one of only four schools nationally to have appeared in six-consecutive NCAA Men's Basketball Tournaments and have its football team play in five-straight bowl games over that stretch.

"Jim elevated SDSU to a respectable level both athletically and academically," said Marshall Faulk, a member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame and former St. Louis Ram and SDSU Aztec. "His leadership was instrumental in the rise of SDSU success. How we cared for our student-athletes was his No. 1 concern. While I'm sad to see him go, I am equally happy for Jim and his family, and I told him he is going to love the people of Missouri. Mizzou, you hired a man with impeccable integrity."

Selected as a 2015-16 Under Armour Athletic Director of the Year by NACDA, Sterk was appointed to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee as the Mountain West Conference's representative, however, he had to relinquish that prestigious position when he left for Mizzou.

Sterk went to SDSU from Washington State, where he served as athletics director from 2000-10. Prior to his hiring at WSU, he was athletics director at Portland State from 1995 to 2000, where he led the Vikings transition from NCAA Division II to the Division I level.

The NCAA recognized WSU and Sterk in 2006 as the Division IA Athletic Directors' "Program of Excellence." He oversaw a period of unparalleled success at WSU with historic academic and athletic accomplishments during his time in Pullman.

In his last three years at WSU, 13 Cougar teams competed in NCAA Tournaments, including back-to-back trips by the Men's Basketball team (2007 and 2008), while Women's Rowing earned five NCAA bids, including a fourth-place finish in 2006, the highest finish ever by a WSU women's team in NCAA competition.

A 1980 graduate of Western Washington University, Sterk earned four letters for the Vikings in football and one in basketball. He was credited with a school-record 164 tackles during the 1977 season, garnering first-team NAIA District I all-star accolades. He was named team captain and MVP, helping the Vikings to the district championship game. In 2010, Sterk was inducted into Western Washington's Athletics Hall of Fame.

He received his master's degree in sports administration from Ohio University. In addition to SDSU, Washington State and Portland State, he has served in athletic administrative positions at North Carolina, Maine, Seattle Pacific and Tulane.

Sterk and his wife Debi have three daughters: Ashley, Amy and Abby, and a granddaughter Kinsley Jane.

HEAD COACH ROBIN PINGETON

11th Season at Mizzou / 26th Season Overall
180-141 Record at Mizzou
515-298 Overall Record

Since stepping foot on Mizzou's campus in 2010, head coach Robin Pingeton has led the Mizzou Women's Basketball program to heights not reached in decades. Pingeton is entering her 11th season at Mizzou with four NCAA Tournament berths and seven overall postseason appearances to her resume while in Columbia. Overall, Pingeton has led her teams to six NCAA Tournament berths and 17 postseason appearances.

She is one of 37 active Division-I head coaches with 500+ career wins, and just 1 of 16 at the helm of Power Five program to reach that monumental milestone. Her 515 career victories currently rank second among active SEC head coaches.

Pingeton has restored a proud Mizzou Women's Basketball tradition and has recorded a 180-141 (.561) record, averaging 20.2 wins over the last five seasons. In her first decade, she has guided the Tigers to 21 wins over Top-25 teams and six over teams ranked in the Top-10. Among program history, Pingeton currently ranks second in winning percentage (.561), trailing only Mizzou Hall of Famer Joann Rutherford (.617, 422-262) and needs just six more victories to surpass Cindy Stein (185-177) for second on the program's career list.

In 25 years overall as a head coach, Pingeton's career record stands at 515-298 (.633). She has led her squads to postseason play 17 times and has mentored 40 all-conference honorees, nine All-Americans, seven Academic All-Americans and five conference Players of the Year. She has won three regular season conference titles, two postseason conference tournaments and has three times been named the conference Coach of the Year.

In 2019-20, Mizzou saw the emergence of the future, as freshmen Aijha Blackwell and Hayley Frank each earned All-SEC Freshmen team honors. Together, they became the first pair of freshmen in program history to average double-figure scoring outputs in the same season. The duo backed up their five-star, Top-30 national rankings and proved to be pieces to build around in the future.

Blackwell provided one of the most impressive freshman campaigns in program history, averaging 15.0 points, 7.3 rebounds and 2.7 assists per game. Blackwell was one of three freshmen in program history to record eight or more 20-point games, joining Julie Helm (12, 1996-97) and Sophie Cunningham (10, 2015-16) and had seven double-doubles on the season, the most by a Mizzou freshman since at least 2002-03. Frank was equally impressive in her first season in the Black & Gold, as she averaged 11.8 points and 4.0 rebounds per game. Frank led the SEC and finished 14th nationally in free throw percentage (.878), a mark which set a Mizzou freshman program record and ranked fourth on the all-time individual season list.

The 2019-20 season also saw the end of the decorated career for the senior class of Amber Smith, Hannah Schuchts, Jordan Chavis and Jordan Roundtree, who took the floor for three NCAA Tournament teams for Mizzou. Smith finished her career ranked 10th in 3-pointers made (126), 10th in 3-point percentage (.356) and 20th in scoring (1,299 points). She was 1 of 21 players in program history to record 1,000+ points and 600+ rebounds. Schuchts finished her career with 140 career blocks, the fourth-most in program history, while Chavis ranks fifth in program history in 3-pointers made (149) and eighth in 3-point percentage (.363).

Pingeton continued Mizzou's winning ways in 2018-19, as she led the Tigers to a fourth-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance, the first time since 1983-86 Mizzou has earned a berth to the Big Dance in four-straight seasons. Mizzou's 24 wins were the fifth-most ever in program history, and marked the first time since 1982-84 a Mizzou team had won 24 games in back-to-back seasons. It was also the first time since 1981-85 that a Mizzou team had won 22+ games in four-consecutive seasons. Mizzou played especially well against ranked opponents during the season, as it defeated four opponents ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 and six ranked opponents overall (AP/Coaches), the most since the 1982-83 campaign. In SEC play, Pingeton's squad racked up 10 victories, giving it 10+ wins in league play in three-consecutive seasons for the first time since 1982-85.

Among Mizzou's many historic achievements in 2018-19 was the Tigers' success away from Columbia. Mizzou recorded its first- and second-ever road wins over Top-10 opponents in the regular season. The magic first occurred on Rocky Top, as Mizzou defeated No. 10 Tennessee, 66-64, on Jan. 6. The win was Mizzou's first-ever at Thompson-Boling Arena, and just the 40th loss ever suffered by the Lady Vols since opening the Arena in 1987-88. Mizzou's second magical road trip came in Starkville against No. 5 Mississippi State on Feb. 14, as Sophie Cunningham's 24 points led Mizzou to a 75-67 victory. The victory marked the highest road win over a ranked opponent in the regular season in program history, and snapped a 30-game home win streak for the Bulldogs, who had not lost at home in nearly two seasons.

Pingeton reached individual milestone marks as well during the 2018-19 campaign, as she recorded her 500th career win on Feb. 10, 2019 in a victory over Vanderbilt, becoming just the 76th coach in Division-I history to reach 500 victories.

After another superb regular season, Mizzou followed with great success in the postseason, as the Tigers advanced to the semifinals of the 2019 SEC Tournament, and earned a win in the NCAA Tournament for the third time in four seasons. First at the SEC Tournament, Mizzou defeated Florida and Kentucky to advance to the SEC Tournament semifinals, its first trip to a conference tournament semifinal since 1994. In the NCAA Tournament, Mizzou defeated Drake in the first round to advance to the second round, marking the first time in program history Mizzou recorded three NCAA Tournament wins in any four-year stretch.

Cunningham capped off an incredible collegiate career in 2018-19, as she earned NCAA All-America third-team honors from the Associated Press and USBWA and Honorable Mention honors from the WBCA, while being named to the All-SEC first team. She became the first player in program history to earn All-America recognition in three seasons, the first to be named to an All-America team and the first to earn three all-conference first-team honors. Cunningham became Mizzou's all-time leading scorer, finishing with 2,187 points, while also ranking in the program's top-five in free throws made (first – 537), 3-pointers made (second – 238), 3-point percentage (second – 40.3), free throw percentage (third – 83.9), points per game (17.0), assists (390) and field goals made (706). She was the only player in the nation to average 17.0 ppg (17.8), make 80 3-pointers (85), make 150 free throws (151) and record 200 rebounds (205). Joining Cunningham in postseason recognition was Cierra Porter who returned to the team halfway through the season after originally retiring due to knee injuries. She returned in a big way, averaging 7.8 points and 5.0 rebounds in just 20.0 minutes per game, as she earned All-SEC Sixth Woman of the Year honors.

Following the season, Cunningham became Mizzou's ninth WNBA Draftee, and the highest selected player in program history when the Phoenix Mercury selected her with the first pick of the second round and the 13th overall selection. She became the third Mizzou player to be drafted during Coach Pingeton's tenure, following Christine Flores (2012) and Bri Kulas (2014).

In 2017-18, Pingeton led Mizzou to its third-straight NCAA Tournament and a 24-8 record, the Tigers' most wins since 1983-84. The 24 victories marked Mizzou's third-consecutive campaign with at least 22 wins, a feat which had not been accomplished since 1982-85. In SEC play, Mizzou won 11 games for the second-straight season and finished tied-for-fourth in the SEC. Mizzou's 22 wins in conference play in the 2016-17 and 2017-18 seasons are the most in a two-year span since Mizzou won 24 over the 1983-84 and 1984-85 seasons. Mizzou reached as high as No. 11 in the Associated Press Top-25 during the 2017-18 season, its highest ranking since 1984. For Pingeton's success in leading Mizzou during the 2017-18 season, she was named a Naismith Women's College Coach of the Year National Semifinalist and a WBCA National Coach of the Year finalist.

Mizzou had many memorable moments in 2017-18, but two of the more notable Tiger victories came in home wins against South Carolina and Tennessee. First, Mizzou knocked off the defending National Champion No. 4 South Carolina Gamecocks, 83-74, on Jan. 7. The victory was Mizzou's fourth win in program history against an AP Top-four opponent, and the first such victory since a 64-60 win over No. 4 Baylor on Jan. 4, 2006. Next, in front of a program-record 11,092 fans and behind 32 points from Cunningham, Mizzou downed No. 11 Tennessee, 77-73, on Feb. 18. The win marked the first time since 1993-94 Mizzou has defeated two Top-11 AP opponents in the same season.

Mizzou closed the 2017-18 season with its third-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance, as the Tigers entered the Big Dance as the No. 5 seed in the Lexington Region, its highest ever in a 64-team NCAA Tournament.

Cunningham and Jordan Frericks each received All-SEC honors for their performance on the court in 2017-18. Cunningham earned first-team honors for the second time in her career as she scored a career-high 18.5 points per game while also averaging 4.7 rebounds and 3.0 rebounds per game. Cunningham became the 35th member of Mizzou's 1,000-point win club during the season. Cunningham also received AP All-America honorable mention honors for the performance in her junior campaign. Frericks earned All-SEC second-team recognition for the third time in her career after averaging 11.8 points and 7.6 rebounds per game in her senior campaign. Frericks became just the third player in Mizzou history to join the 1,000-point and 1,000-rebound club, as she ended her career with 1,032 rebounds, the second-most in program history.

Mizzou was highly successful in the classroom as well in '17-18, as the team put together its best two semesters in program history, recording a 3.3 and 3.4 in the fall and spring semesters, respectively.

Pingeton was named the Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year in 2016-17 after being selected by both the Associated Press and the league's coaches for the honor. She steered Mizzou to its second-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance and a third-place finish in the SEC. It marked the Tigers' highest finish in league play since joining the SEC and the highest since 1990. Pingeton's squad piled up 11 SEC wins, the most since 1990, putting together two separate win streaks of five or more in league action in the same campaign for the first time in program history.

Mizzou capped off the special 2016-17 season with a trip to the Big Dance, advancing to the second round with a win over South Florida in the tournament opener. It gave Pingeton and company wins in back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time in program history.

Pingeton and the Tigers completed the incredible campaign despite losing All-SEC forward Frericks to a preseason knee injury. Mizzou was picked to finish seventh in the SEC, but the Tigers completed their fifth-consecutive winning season for the first time since 1985-90 and a campaign for the record books. As a result, Pingeton was named a Naismith Coach of the Year National Semifinalist, along with nine other coaches.

Earning individual honors at the end of the season was Cunningham, who earned All-SEC first-team honors, and Amber Smith, who was named the SEC's co-Freshman of the Year. It marked the first time Mizzou back-to-back conference freshman of the year winners since 1996 & 1997.

During the 2016-17 season, Mizzou beat eventual national champion No. 6 South Carolina, No. 25 Kentucky and No. 25 Texas A&M at Mizzou Arena, extending the Tigers' home win streak against ranked opponents to five.

In 2015-16, under Pingeton's guidance, the program's success on and off the court helped produce the nation's largest attendance increase as Mizzou fans came out in droves to support the team. Mizzou Arena welcomed an average of 3,990 fans per game, including a then-facility-record 7,989 fans for a showdown with Tennessee. Mizzou faithful were rewarded for their support as the Tigers spent eight weeks in the AP Top 25 poll and finished with eight conference victories for the first time in more than a decade, highlighted by victories over No. 6 Mississippi State and No. 22 Florida.

Pingeton's squad capped the season with the program's 10th NCAA Tournament appearance. Mizzou entered the Big Dance as a No. 10 seed and knocked off seventh-seeded BYU, 78-69, in the opening round to seal its first NCAA Tournament victory since 2001.

At season's end, both Cunningham and Frericks received recognitions for outstanding campaigns. Cunningham became the first SEC Freshman of the Year in program history and was one of eight finalists for the USBWA National Freshman of the Year award. Frericks took home second-team All-SEC honors after surpassing the 1,000-career point mark during her junior season.

Pingeton's system, defined by relentless hard work, also excelled in the classroom. The Tigers finished with a 2016 Spring team GPA of 3.31, which is the highest ever recorded in program history at the time. Additionally, redshirt senior Lindsey Cunningham was inducted into the Mizzou 39 Class of 2016, the most prestigious honor a student can receive at the University of Missouri.

In 2014-15, the Tigers finished 19-14, the highest win total for the program since 2005-06. Mizzou earned victories in each of the first two rounds of the WNIT. The squad featured a stifling defense, which ranked 12th nationally in opponent field goal percentage (35.1) and 17th in the nation with 29.0 defensive rebounds per game. It was also a banner year for the offense as the Tigers drained 49 more 3-pointers than any other school in the SEC and finished 31st nationally with 249 triples throughout the season.

On Feb. 26, 2015, Mizzou upset No. 12 Texas A&M, 70-69, and ended a 17-game home winning streak for the Aggies when Maddie Stock drained a game-winning 3-pointer with less than a second remaining.

The Tigers earned WNIT victories at Northern Iowa and at Kansas State to advance to the quarterfinals for the first time in 12 years. In a record-setting performance against K-State in the second round, Mizzou earned a 67-48 win, with the 19-point margin of victory serving as the largest in postseason annals for the Tigers. In that contest, the Tigers dominated the glass with a 50-31 rebounding margin which also established a new postseason program record. Morgan Eye tied a WNIT record with nine 3-pointers to lead the offense on a landmark afternoon.

Frericks earned second-team All-SEC honors and honorable mention All-SEC recognition from the Associated Press after leading the conference with 9.9 rebounds per game, the highest average by a Tiger since the 1997-98 campaign. Her 327 total rebounds ranked third in Mizzou single-season history and were the most since Renee Kelly's record of 395 set in 1985-86. Frericks tied a program record with 33 starts, equaling Lorraine Ferret's mark that had stood since 1980-81.

Eye closed her illustrious career with 367 baskets from beyond the arc, which is 141 more than any other player to ever wear a Tiger uniform. Following the season, she was invited to the State Farm College Women's 3-Point Championship at the Final Four in Indianapolis.

With one season of SEC play under their belt, Pingeton's Tigers came into the 2013-14 season with a vengeance, recording wins over two ranked foes in No. 25 Georgia and No. 16 Vanderbilt. The Tigers closed the season with a 17-14 record and advanced to the WNIT for the second year in a row. Mizzou broke its own 3-point shooting records with 292 made 3-pointers. The number stands not only as the most in Missouri history but also established an SEC record. In addition, Pingeton's squad topped Bradley early in the season, 126-55, to set the school's single-game and single-half scoring records.

Pingeton's recruiting talents were once again on display in 2013-14 as Mizzou's three true freshmen proved to be the most productive incoming class since the 1996-97 season. The trio of newcomers, Frericks, Kayla McDowell and Sierra Michaelis averaged 17.9 points per game on 44.4 percent shooting while pulling down 13.5 rebounds and dishing out 2.6 assists per game. Pingeton's Tigers were successful from top-to-bottom as first-team All-SEC selection Bri Kulas ranked among the conference scoring leaders by averaging 18.3 points per game. Kulas became Mizzou's seventh WNBA draft pick as she was selected by the San Antonio Stars in the third round (28th overall) of the 2014 WNBA Draft.

Pingeton's Tigers have also successfully proven themselves as standouts off the court as several Tigers were again given academic honors from the SEC. Lianna Doty was named SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year in 2013-14. Under Pingeton's tutelage, Missouri has seen a consistent increase in academic recognition each season as Lindsey Cunningham, Doty, Eye, Bree Fowler, Frericks, McDowell, Juanita Robinson, Maddie and Morgan Stock were all named to the SEC Winter Academic Honor Roll in 2014-15. Missouri has also consistently worked to better the Columbia area by volunteering in the community. The Tigers put in more than 350 hours of community service during the 2013-14 season, 333 hours in 2012-13 and 325 hours in 2014-15.

During Mizzou's inaugural season in the SEC, the Tigers showed that they would be a force to be reckoned with under Pingeton's guidance. In addition to setting numerous school and SEC records, the Tigers posted a 17-15 record, made the postseason for the first time since 2007 and knocked off three Top 25 teams on the way to a respectable league finish. Eye lit up the nets on her way to finishing the year as one of, if not the best, 3-point shooters in the NCAA. Eye led the country in 3-point shooting, set the Mizzou single-game record for triples (11) and set the SEC record for treys in a season (112).

The 2012-13 season under Pingeton showed that a solid foundation had been laid for Mizzou Women's Basketball. Not only did the Tigers knock off 12th-ranked South Carolina and NCAA Tournament-bound Florida, but the Tigers took down perennial power Tennessee in a victory that many of her peers say was a "program-changer." Through the recruiting efforts of Pingeton and her staff, three Tigers earned SEC recognition for their efforts and contributions on the court. Kulas was named second-team All-SEC, Doty made the SEC All-Freshman team and Eye was recognized as the SEC Co-6th Woman of the Year. Following the season, four Tigers were named to the SEC Winter Academic Honor Roll and five freshmen were named to the 2012-13 SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll.



HEAD COACH ROBIN PINGETON

Pingeton reinvigorated the Tigers program from the moment she stepped on-campus in Columbia. During her initial season, Missouri posted a 13-18 record and 5-11 mark in Big 12 Conference play, the best for the team since 2006-07. The Tigers accomplished those feats despite playing the nation's seventh-toughest schedule, a slate that featured 16 games against teams who qualified for the NCAA Tournament and 10 games against ranked opponents.

Mizzou recorded three wins against ranked foes, defeating No. 12 Georgetown, No. 22 Texas and No. 23 Iowa State. The three wins over ranked opponents were the most for the Tigers since the 2000-01 season. Additionally, Mizzou's win over Texas ended a 12-game losing streak to the Longhorns dating back to 2001, and was only the second time the Tigers had ever defeated the Longhorns.

Success for the Tigers continued in the 2011-12 season as Mizzou started out with a 10-1 record, the program's best start since the 2006-07 season when Mizzou began the year 12-1. Under Pingeton's direction, the Tigers went undefeated through the first five games for the first time since 1997. With Pingeton's leadership, Christine Flores became the first Tiger to record a triple-double since 1995. Flores set several records at Mizzou, including the most blocks in her career (209) and in a single season (93) before being drafted by the Phoenix Mercury in the third round (30th overall) of the WNBA Draft.

Before taking the reins at Mizzou on April 8, 2010, Pingeton spent seven years leading the Illinois State Redbirds, where she amassed a 144-81 (.640) record and brought the Redbird program back to national prominence. During her tenure, she led the school to three-straight Missouri Valley Conference regular season titles, two State Farm Missouri Valley Conference Tournament championships, a school-best four-straight 20-win seasons, two NCAA Tournament berths and three WNIT appearances en route to Missouri Valley Coach of the Year honors in 2004 and 2010. During her last three seasons in Normal, Pingeton compiled an 81-23 (.779), the best three-year span in Illinois State history.

In 2009-10, Pingeton led the Redbirds to a third consecutive Missouri Valley Conference regular season title, the semifinals of the WNIT and a 28-8 record. During Illinois State's WNIT run, the team earned wins over Butler, Purdue, Illinois and Kansas. The 28 wins tied the 1980-81 Illinois State team for the most in program history and marked the fourth-straight year the team won at least 22 games. Pingeton's efforts garnered Russell Athletic/Women's Basketball Coaches Association Region 6 Coach of the Year and Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year accolades.

In 2008-09, Pingeton's squad went 27-8 and had a 16-5 mark in The Valley as the team earned its first-ever outright Missouri Valley regular season title and advanced to the WNIT semifinals. One year earlier, the Redbirds went 26-7, posted the second-best winning percentage (.788) in school history, earned a trip to the NCAA Tournament and claimed the State Farm Missouri Valley Conference Tournament title and a share of the regular season crown.

In her first year on the Illinois State sideline, Pingeton earned Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year honors after going 16-13, the first winning season for the Redbirds in seven years. The following year, Illinois State earned its first NCAA Tournament berth since 1989 after claiming the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament championship. Pingeton then led the team to a 22-11 record in 2006-07, Illinois State's first 20-win season since 1989-90.

Before taking over at Illinois State, Pingeton spent three seasons as an assistant coach on Bill Fennelly's staff at Iowa State, including the 2002-03 season as associate head coach. During her time in Ames, the Cyclones went 66-33, made two NCAA Tournament appearances and won the 2001 Big 12 Tournament title.

Pingeton started her head coaching career in 1992 at St. Ambrose, her alma mater. In eight seasons, the Bees qualified for five NAIA National Tournaments, including Elite Eight berths in 1996 and 2000. Pingeton was named the conference coach of the year three times and the NAIA Kodak District Coach of the Year in 2000.

A 1990 graduate of St. Ambrose, Pingeton stands as the school's all-time scoring leader with 2,502 points and earned All-America honors in both basketball and softball. She also played three seasons of professional basketball in the Women's Basketball Association.

Pingeton and her husband, Rich, are the proud parents of two sons, Blake, born June 9, 2006, and Zach, born July 5, 2011. In her limited spare time, Pingeton enjoys spending time with her family on their boat and playing golf.

Jenny Putnam is in her 11th year as an assistant coach on the Mizzou Women's Basketball staff. In addition to joining the Mizzou family with head coach Robin Pingeton in 2010, Putnam played for Pingeton at St. Ambrose and has been a member of Pingeton's staff for 18 years. Putnam's presence on-staff brings loyalty, consistency and stability to the Tiger program.

Putnam's responsibilities as an assistant under Pingeton include assisting in the organization of practice plans for the team and individual student-athletes, on-court coaching with post players and assisting with daily operations and Tiger basketball camps. Putnam also plays an important role with the program's recruiting efforts and manages the scheduling for future seasons.

Mizzou Women's Basketball has consistently improved since Putnam's arrival. The 2019-20 campaign saw the emergence of the future for the Tigers, as Aijha Blackwell and Hayley Frank each earned All-SEC Freshman team honors. The duo became the fifth and sixth Tigers to earn All-SEC Freshman honors, with all six coming since 2016.

In 2018-19, Mizzou won 24 games for the second consecutive season, and made the NCAA Tournament for a fourth-straight season. Mizzou's 24 victories marked the fourth-consecutive year the Tigers won at least 22 games, something which had not happened since 1981-85.

Under Putnam's guidance, Cierra Porter was named the 2019 SEC Sixth Woman of the Year after returning from medical retirement halfway through the season. Porter was the second player in Mizzou history to earn the Sixth Woman of the Year honor, as she averaged 7.8 points and 5.0 rebounds per game in 22 contests. In addition, Porter was third on the team in blocks (14), despite playing 13 fewer games, and shot a remarkable 85.7 percent from the free throw line.

In 2017-18, forward Jordan Frericks earned All-SEC second-team recognition for the third time in her career after averaging 11.8 points and 7.6 rebounds per game in her senior campaign (2017-18). Frericks became just the third player in Mizzou history to join the 1,000-point and 1,000-rebound club, as she ended her career with 1,032 rebounds, the second-most in program history.

In 2016-17, Mizzou finished third in the Southeastern Conference, its highest finish since joining the league and the program's highest finish in conference play since 1990. Mizzou capped the season with a trip to the NCAA Tournament and a first-round win over South Florida, giving the program victories in back-to-back NCAA appearances for the first time in program history. The Tigers made a significant leap in 2015-16, reaching the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2006 and earning an opening-round victory for the first time since 2001.

Putnam's influence on the post players shined, most notably with gritty forward Frericks. Frericks averaged 12.1 points per game and 7.7 rebounds per contest on her way to earning second-team All-SEC recognition. Meanwhile, rising newcomer Cierra Porter made the SEC All-Freshman squad after a stellar rookie campaign. The inside-outside attack allowed Mizzou to finish 22-10. The Tigers spent eight weeks in the AP Top 25 and ended up with eight conference victories.

In 2014-15, the Tigers finished 19-14. Mizzou advanced to the WNIT quarterfinals, and the victories in the first two rounds were the most in postseason play since 2002-03.

Putnam's work with the post players was again evident as Mizzou featured a defense that ranked 12th nationally in opponent field goal percentage (35.1) and 14th in the country with 29.0 defensive rebounds per game. Frericks was named second-team All-SEC after leading the league in rebounding with 9.9 boards per game, the highest mark by a Tiger since 1997-98. Frericks grabbed 327 total rebounds on the year, which ranked third in program history and was the highest total since Renee Kelly's record of 395 in 1985-86. With 33 starts on the season, Frericks equaled Lorraine Ferret's program record that had stood since 1980-81.

Recognized as a top recruiter, Putnam was instrumental in recruiting and signing Mizzou's heralded 2015 freshmen class that was ranked 17th nationally by Prospect Nation. She played a large role in recruiting Sophie Cunningham, who became the first McDonald's All-American to sign with Mizzou, along with her Rock Bridge High School (Columbia, Mo.) teammate Cierra Porter, who was ranked the nation's No. 37 player by All-Star Girls Report. Hannah Schuchts (Tallahassee, Fla./MacLay School) rounded out the class and was ranked the No. 59 forward nationally by ESPN HoopGurlz.

With Putnam's continued efforts, Mizzou's successes continued through the 2013-14 season. The Tigers finished 17-14 overall and again advanced to the WNIT. Three true freshmen finished with one of the most productive seasons for an incoming class since 1997, while the Tigers reset a new school scoring record in a 126-65 victory over Bradley. The Tigers made their first postseason appearance since 2007 during the 2012-13 season as the team advanced to the WNIT.

The 2012-13 Tigers squad ended the year with a 17-15 record, the best for a Mizzou team since the 2006-07 campaign. The 2011-12 team started the season 10-1, which at the time marked the program's best start since 2006-07. With Putnam's aid, the Tigers went undefeated through the first five games for the first time since 1997.

Putnam's experience both as a player and coach brings a wealth of knowledge to the program, and this became apparent in the staff's first year. In her first season with the Tigers, Putnam helped coach the team to a 13-18 overall record and a 5-11 mark in Big 12 Conference play, the best for the team since 2006-07. The Tigers also earned three wins over ranked opponents, a feat that had not been accomplished since the 2000-01 season.



ASSISTANT COACH JENNY PUTNAM

Before coming to Missouri, Putnam spent seven years as an assistant coach to Pingeton at Illinois State. She helped turn around a program that had not earned a winning season in seven years. During her time with the Redbirds, the squad made five postseason appearances, earned three Missouri Valley Conference regular season titles, two State Farm Missouri Valley Conference Tournament championships and recorded a 144-76 record. During the 2009-10 season, Putnam aided the Redbirds to a third consecutive Missouri Valley Conference regular season title. Illinois State advanced to the WNIT semifinals and a 28-8 record. During the WNIT run, the team earned wins over Butler, Purdue, Illinois and Kansas. The 28 wins tied the 1980-81 Illinois State team for the most in program history and it also marked the fourth-straight year the program recorded at least 22 wins.

Putnam began her coaching career in 2001 at Bettendorf (Iowa) High School as the freshman girls coach and also served on the staff of the women's basketball program at Marycrest International University in Davenport, Iowa. Putnam was the facilities coordinator for athletics in 2002 at Marycrest before joining Gene Steinmeyer's women's basketball staff at Northwest Missouri State. Her scouting and film preparation work helped the Bearcats to a 16-12 record, marking the first winning season in five years for Northwest.

Before entering the coaching ranks, Putnam played collegiately at St. Ambrose under Pingeton. She was the leading rebounder on Pingeton's final team at St. Ambrose in 1998-99, a squad that finished 30-7 and reached the Elite Eight of the NAIA Tournament.

Putnam was also a starting outfielder on the softball team at St. Ambrose. She earned NAIA All-America honors in both basketball and softball during her playing years, equaling a feat also achieved by Pingeton previously.

A 1997 graduate of Alleman High School in Rock Island, Ill., Putnam was a standout athlete in basketball, softball and volleyball. She earned all-tournament honors as a freshman on Alleman's 1994 Illinois High School Association (IHSA) Class A State Championship softball team. On Sept. 22, 2006, Putnam was elected into the Alleman High School Hall of Fame.

A native of Moline, Ill., Putnam has three sons, Jack, Tyler and Callen.

Ashleen Bracey is in her fifth season as an assistant coach at Mizzou. A former player and graduate assistant under Robin Pingeton, Bracey has nearly a decade of coaching experience at the collegiate level. Mizzou has continued to evolve into a marquee program with Bracey on staff, as the Tigers have earned three trips to the NCAA Tournament in her first four seasons on staff.

Bracey has played a crucial role in Mizzou's recruiting efforts while on staff, as she contributed immensely to Mizzou's Class of 2019 which boasted a No. 12 national ranking by ESPNW. The duo of Aijha Blackwell (No. 8-ranked recruit) and Hayley Frank (No. 29-ranked recruit) went on to earn All-SEC Freshman team honors in 2019-20, becoming the fifth and sixth Tigers since 2016 to earn the distinction. Blackwell and Frank also became the first pair of freshmen in program history to average double figure scoring outputs in the same season.

Mizzou won 22 or more games in each of Bracey's first three seasons on staff, including its second consecutive season with 24 wins in 2018-19, a win total which ranked fifth all-time in program history. Mizzou reached the NCAA Tournament for a fourth consecutive season in 2018-19, a feat that had not been accomplished since 1983-86.

In 2018-19, Mizzou advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second time with Bracey on the Tigers' bench. In SEC play, Mizzou racked up 10 victories, giving the team 10+ wins in league play in three-consecutive seasons for the first time since 1982-85. Mizzou also defeated four opponents ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 and six ranked opponents overall (AP/Coaches), the most since 1982-83.

Mizzou closed the 2017-18 season with its third consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance, as the Tigers entered the Big Dance as the No. 5 seed in the Lexington Region, its highest ever in a 64-team NCAA Tournament.

In her first season on staff, 2016-17, Bracey helped Mizzou to its second-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance and a third-place SEC finish. It marked the Tigers' highest finish in league play since joining the SEC and the highest since 1990. Pingeton's squad piled up 11 SEC wins, the most since 1990, putting together two separate win streaks of five or more in league action in the same campaign for the first time in program history.

Mizzou capped off the special 2016-17 season with a trip to the Big Dance, advancing to the second round with a win over South Florida in the tournament opener. It gave Pingeton and company wins in back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time in program history.

Bracey joined the Tigers' staff after three seasons as an assistant at UAB, where she helped guide the Blazers to 49 victories in that span. There, she served as the recruiting coordinator and played a major role in player development on and off the court for a program that produced its highest team GPA in a decade during the 2015-16 campaign. In Bracey's time spent with UAB, the Blazers established a reputation for playing gritty defense. UAB led Conference USA in scoring defense in 2015-16, limiting opponents to just 57.2 points per game.

Bracey has a significant hand in recruiting efforts at Mizzou while assisting with player development and mentoring. With more than 10 years playing and coaching at a high level under her belt, she also uses her expertise to aid in scouting upcoming opponents for the Tigers throughout the season.

The ties between Pingeton and Bracey date back to 2006, when Bracey chose to play college basketball at Illinois State and helped the Redbirds become a consistent Missouri Valley Conference power. During Bracey's playing career, Illinois State claimed three MVC championships, clinched an NCAA Tournament berth in 2008 and advanced to the WNIT Final Four in 2009 and 2010.

As a senior, she was named team captain by Pingeton and engineered the Redbirds' third consecutive 20-win season. Bracey led Illinois State in scoring with 14.7 points per contest and secured both All-MVC first-team honors and MVC All-Defensive team recognition.

Upon graduation, Bracey signed a contract with Das Anos Liosia, a professional squad in Athens, Greece. She played a season with them before deciding to join the coaching ranks and immediately earned a chance as an assistant coach at Eureka (Ill.) College. In August of that year, Bracey and Pingeton reconnected as Bracey joined her former coach as a Mizzou graduate assistant in 2011.

In 2012, she spent a season as an assistant coach at Ball State, where she worked heavily with recruiting and created and administered game plans and scouting reports. Following that year, Bracey settled in at UAB on the staff of head coach Randy Norton, who was an assistant under Pingeton at both Mizzou and Illinois State.

Chris Bracey enters his third year as a Mizzou assistant coach after contributing greatly to the success of the Tiger program in his first two seasons. In his first season on the bench, Mizzou won 24 games, its fourth straight season with 22+ wins, and earned a trip to the NCAA Tournament for the fourth-consecutive season.

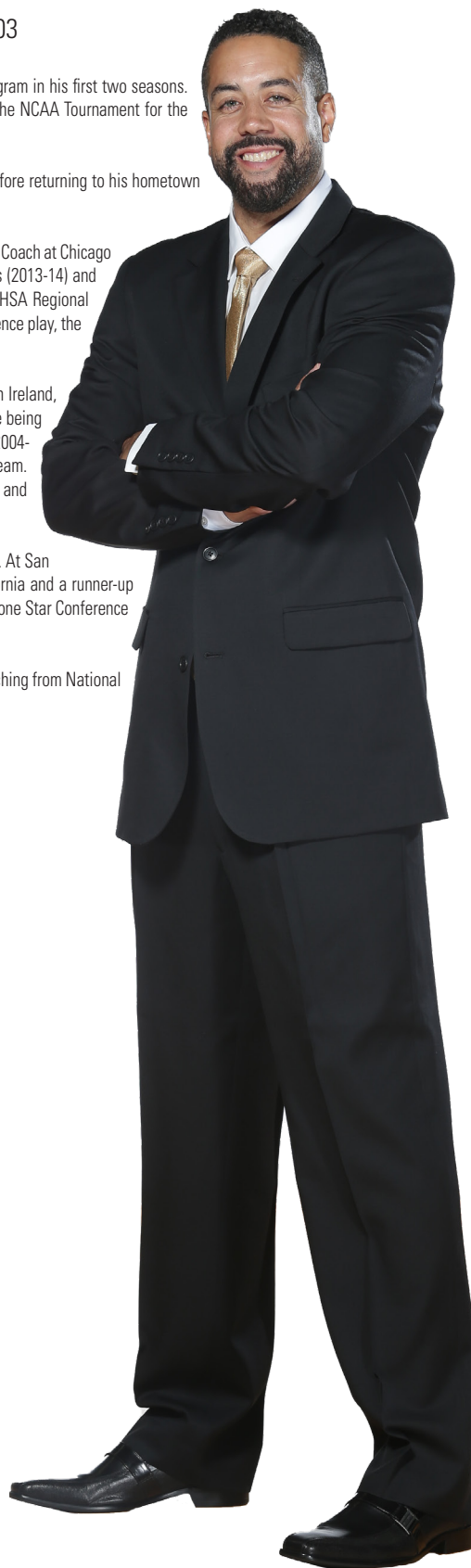
Bracey, the brother of assistant coach Ashleen Bracey, spent eight seasons playing professional basketball in Europe before returning to his hometown of Chicago to coach high school basketball for five years.

Bracey returned stateside in 2012 and began coaching high school basketball in Chicago, serving as the Boy's Varsity Head Coach at Chicago International Charter School Larry Hawkins Campus (2012-13), Chicago International Charter School Longwood Campus (2013-14) and Oak Park and River Forest High School (2014-18). At his last stop, Bracey led his alma mater to a Top 15 ranking and IHSA Regional championship in 2016-17. In 2017-18, Bracey led the Huskies to a Top 10 ranking and 12-0 mark in West Suburban Conference play, the first time in school history Oak Park and River Forest recorded an undefeated conference record.

Prior to entering the coaching ranks, Bracey spent eight seasons playing professional basketball in Europe, with stops in Ireland, Switzerland, France, Greece and Cyprus. In Ireland, Bracey led his team, Tralee, to the Irish National Championship while being named the Bosman Player of the Year in 2004, and played as a member of the Irish National Team for four seasons from 2004-08. In Switzerland, Bracey earned Player of the Year honors once again and was selected to the First-Team All-Swiss Team. Bracey also experienced many successful seasons in France with ALM Everux and SPO Rouen, in Greece with Egaleo and Pagrati and in Cyprus with Achilles Kaimakliou.

Prior to his stint overseas, Bracey played collegiately at San Jose City College (2000-01) and West Texas A&M (2001-03). At San Jose, Bracey led his squad to a 10-0 season in conference play, a No. 5 ranking among junior college schools in California and a runner-up finish in the California Community College Athletic Association (CCCCAA). 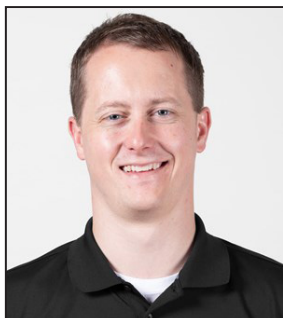

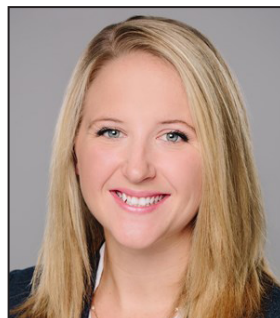

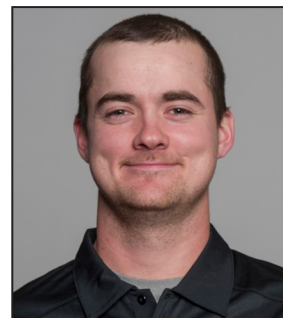

The first class was enshrined in 1990, in conjunction with Mizzou's observance of its 100th football season.

JONI DAVIS - CLASS OF 1991



A native of Highland, Kan., Davis ended her four-year career as the most prolific scorer (now No. 2) in Missouri Women's Basketball history, scoring 2,126 points from 1982-85, on four MU teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament. She was the Big Eight Conference "Player of the Year" in 1984 and '85, and was the Big Eight Tournament MVP three times. Davis holds four MU career and five MU season records. As a senior, when Davis averaged 25 points per game, she was an honorable mention All-American, second-team Academic All-American, the Big Eight Female Athlete of the Year, and won NCAA and Big Eight postgraduate scholarships. She later served as a graduate assistant coach at the University of Georgia, and is now a psychologist in California.

SHARON FARRAH - CLASS OF 2000



A native of Mexico, Mo., who was a standout guard on the first four teams coached by Joann Rutherford - teams that had a cumulative record of 82-39 from 1976-79. A four-time All-Big Eight selection who still ranks fifth in MU career scoring with 1,820 points and 10th with a career average of 15.0 points per game. She left as MU's career scoring leader, until Hall of Famer Joni Davis usurped her mark. Farrah played on MU's Big Eight Conference championship team in 1978, and on teams that placed second in 1976 and 1979. She was named to the Big Eight All-Tournament team in 1978 and 1979, and was later named an honorable mention selection to the Big Eight team of the 1970s. An excellent all-around athlete, Farrah also lettered twice at MU in softball. She later played professional basketball in Europe following her days at Missouri. Currently resides in Spring, Texas.

RENEE KELLY - CLASS OF 1994



A two-time Big Eight Conference Player of the Year, who dominated the league from her center position from 1984-87. Kelly ranks third in MU history with 2,119 points and holds the school career rebounding record at 1,098. In all, she holds six career, three season and four single-game records. While at MU, the Tigers made three trips to the NCAA Tournament. Kelly was the Big Eight Conference Female Athlete of the Year in 1987, then played five years of professional basketball in Italy and Brazil. She earned All-America honors in 1987, when she was a finalist for the Naismith Award. Kelly also was an Academic All-Big Eight selection, and is one of only two women's basketball players at MU to have her jersey retired. A native of Augusta, Ga.

JOANN RUTHERFORD - CLASS OF 2007



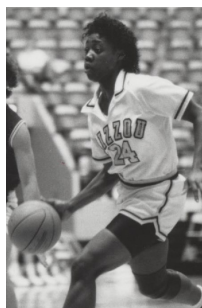
A pioneer of the women's basketball game at Mizzou, who is the school's winningest women's basketball coach with 422 career wins (422-263 overall, .617 winning percentage) in 23 seasons. She took over as head coach just one year after the program was established at the varsity level, and Mizzou enjoyed winning seasons under her direction in 19 of her 23 years at the helm, claiming Big Eight Conference championships in 1984, 1985, 1987 and 1990. Her teams also claimed five conference tournament titles, winning it all in 1978, 1983, 1985, 1986 and 1994. She was named Big Eight Coach of the Year in 1984, 1985 and 1990 for her efforts, and was also tabbed as the Big Eight Coach of the Decade for the 1980s, when her teams went a combined 213-98 (.685 winning percentage). Rutherford's career wins total of 422 ranked among the NCAA's Top 35 all-time at the time of her retirement. Her teams won 20 or more games 11 times, including an impressive stretch from 1977-87 where they did so 10 times in 11 seasons. Mizzou reached six NCAA Tournaments under Rutherford's direction (reaching the Elite Eight in 1982) and four times finished a season ranked among the AP Top 20, including 11th in 1984, 13th in 1978, 15th in 1983, and 20th in 1982. She had an amazing stretch from 1983-84 to 1986-87, where the Tigers won Big Eight titles in three of the four years, going 25-6 overall (12-2 in Big Eight play) in 1983-84, 22-9 overall (12-2) in 1984-85, 20-12 overall (8-5) in 1985-86, and 20-9 overall (9-5) in 1986-87. Nine of MU's 18 first-team all-conference players trained under Rutherford, including all-time greats Joni Davis and Renee Kelly, who are the only two Tigers to have their jerseys retired. Highly-regarded among her peers, Rutherford served on many high-level national committees, and coached the South team in 1986 to a gold medal in the U.S. Olympic Festival. She also served as the department's Senior Woman Administrator during the latter part of her career at MU.

AMANDA LASSITER - CLASS OF 2009

Missouri's first-ever WNBA Draft pick, chosen in the 2001 first round by the Houston Comets. Played for six seasons in the WNBA. Led Tigers to a 40-22 record and the 2001 NCAA Sweet Sixteen for the second time in school history and the first time since 1982. Real Sports Magazine second-team All-American, 2001. Full Court Press third-team All-American, 2001. Women's Basketball News Service fourth-team All-American, 2001. Women'sCollegeHoops.com All-Underrated Team, 2001. First-team All-Big 12, 2001 (MU's first in the then-five-year history of the Big 12). Third-team All-Big 12, 2000. Big 12 Newcomer of the Year, 2000. At the conclusion of her eligibility (just two seasons at MU), was in the MU career Top 10 in 3-pointers attempted (second), blocked shots (third), 3-pointers made (third), points per game (fourth), 3-point FG pct. (seventh), and scoring (21st). She is still in the MU career Top 10 in blocked shots (fifth), points per game (fourth) and scoring (35th). She is still in the MU single-season Top 10 in steals (first and fourth), 3-point field goals (seventh), 3-point field goals attempted (ninth), blocked shots (third and fourth), field goals attempted (second), field goals (fifth), scoring (seventh), and points per game (t-sixth). She still owns single-game school records for steals (11) in a game. The 11 steals is also a Big 12 Conference record. Led Missouri in scoring in both her junior (13.9 ppg) and senior (19.1) seasons. Also led her team in assists, blocks and steals in her junior season, and led team in blocks and steals her senior season.

**SANDIE PROPHETE - CLASS OF 2009**

One of the all-time greats in Tiger women's basketball, who has gone on to a very honorable life as a very accomplished member of the Harlem Ambassadors. Some 30 years after her playing days at Mizzou, her name is still littered all over the MU career record book. Still ranks 10th in scoring (1,480 points), 10th in field goals made (566) and seventh in steals (197). Her 579-point senior season of 1989 still stands as the ninth-best scoring season in Mizzou women's basketball history, while her 3-pt. shooting percentage of 41.9% in 1987-88 is 10th-best in MU single-season history. She was a Kodak honorable-mention All-American as a senior, and twice was a 2nd-Team All-Big 8 selection. She started as a freshman and contributed to Mizzou's 20-win season in 1985-86, which also included a Big Eight Tournament championship and NCAA Tournament bid. During sophomore season, Mizzou won 20 games again and tied for the Big Eight regular-season title, followed by a second-place showing as a junior and fourth as a senior. Since graduating from Mizzou, she has



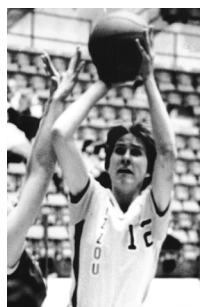
continued to demonstrate great leadership and positive mentoring to others through her work with the Harlem Ambassadors since 1998. Has toured around the world with the Ambassadors, entertaining young and old all around the world, showing a positive female role model figure for young girls who find themselves empowered by witnessing a woman directing a basketball team of male players, as well as competing against and beating male opponents. She has also served the country by entertaining the men and women of the armed forces, performing at over 300 events and over 120 bases in all service branches, including multiple engagements overseas. Part of her big messaging as part of the Ambassadors is promoting greater understanding between different races of people, while encouraging young people to make the positive life choice of staying in school and staying off of drugs.

LORRAINE FERRET - CLASS OF 2018

Lorraine Ferret is a pioneer of women's basketball at Mizzou who still is littered all over the program record books, more than 30 years after her prolific career drew to a close, as she helped lead MU to national prominence. Was an honorable mention Kodak All-American in 1983, and that same year was also a finalist for the Wade Trophy, given annually to the top female college basketball player. Earned All-Big Eight Conference honors in 1982 and 1983 who was a standout on some very successful Tiger teams coached by Joann Rutherford. As a senior in 1982-83, Mizzou went 25-6 overall and reached the NCAA Tournament, finishing 15th in the final polls, while the 1981-82 Tigers went 24-9 and reached the NCAA Sweet 16, while finishing 20th in the polls. Ended her Mizzou career with 1,624 points, which ranked as third most in school history at the time, and still ranks as seventh-best currently. Led the team in scoring as a sophomore (15.5 points per game) and as a junior (15.5 ppg). Also ranks eighth on the Mizzou career rebounding chart with 788. Went on to a standout pro career in Europe, playing primarily in Italy and Switzerland. Became a trailblazer in Switzerland, where she was the first American woman to compete professionally there, and she also won the Swiss League scoring title four times.

**NANCY RUTTER - CLASS OF 2020**

Highly-decorated founding member of Mizzou Women's Basketball program, Nancy Rutter was a member of the first-ever recruiting class in 1974-75. She was a key player that helped program improve from 9-8 record in freshman season to 26-6 record in senior campaign. The 1977-78 Tigers won the Big Eight championship and finished ranked No. 13 in the final Associated Press poll. She ranks second all-time in free throws made (481), third in rebounds per game (8.8), sixth in total points scored (1,641) and eighth in career points per game (15.3). Her 40-point performance at Graceland (Jan. 5, 1977) still stands as the most points recorded on an opposing court. She is the single-season record holder with 211 made free throws in 1976-77 and was a 1970s Big Eight All-Decade Team honorable mention selection.

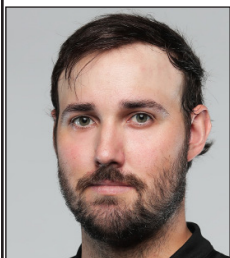

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COVERING DURING COVID-19

This year's media policies will pose a significant challenge to reporters as our strategic communications office continues to navigate the COVID-19 pandemic. Strict social distancing guidelines will make coverage of the 2020 season unconventional, but our aim is to provide each of you with the access you need to appropriately cover this year's team.

Due to the challenges presented by COVID-19, all media interviews will be conducted via Zoom. We know this is different that we have done in the past, but with us having to use Zoom, it will be the most efficient manner to deliver access to everyone.

Practice will be closed to the media during fall camp as the program continues to practice physical distancing safety procedures in relation to COVID-19. Photographers/videographers will be permitted to shoot for a specified period of time at the beginning of practice (approximately 30 minutes) on select days throughout camp. Photographers must stay in a contained area which will be roped off. There will be credentials available, and photographers must check in with a designee from the Strategic Communications office. For those unwilling to send photo/video from their outlet, Mizzou staff photographer Zach Bland is working on a photo pool each day that will be update. The strategic communications staff will share that information when it is made available.

MEDIA CREDENTIALING CRITERIA

The University of Missouri's decision to issue credentials to a media outlet for the purposes of covering a Mizzou Athletics event is determined by a variety of factors. They include the following:

- Space availability;
- Distribution/size of outlet: free, subscription, sale on newsstands, website traffic, etc.;
- Length of existence of the publication, amount of original copy generated, number of full-time employees of the publication and the journalistic experience of the reporter(s);
- Radio or TV station program format and audience size;
- Amount of coverage given to Mizzou through the season;
- Intention/ability to cover all 20 sports at Mizzou;
- Attendance at Mizzou media sessions, including Olympic sport opportunities;
- Professionalism, which includes but is not limited to conduct at games, press conferences, practices, on social media, etc.;
- Compliance with SEC media policy.

The University of Missouri has the right to deny or revoke credentials under its own discretion.

CREDENTIAL REQUEST PROCEDURE

For those who meet the criteria, season credentials will be issued as a "combo" credential for football and men's/women's basketball. When applicable, this season pass may also be used for admittance to home events for Mizzou Olympic Sport programs, please check with the sport contact to verify.

Requests for single-game credentials should be made as far in advance as possible.

- For football and men's basketball single-game credentials, requests must be made five days prior to game day online at Sports Systems.
- For all other sports, please contact the Communications staff member in charge of media operations of that sport (see staff directory) at least 24 hours prior to game day.
- Media covering all Mizzou sports are subject to the SEC credential policy <https://clients.sportssystem.com/clients/seccredentials/>

INTERVIEW POLICIES

All interviews with University of Missouri student-athletes or staff members must be arranged through the Athletics Communications office. Media are asked to never contact a player or coach directly.

In general, athlete and staff interviews are conducted prior to or after practices, after contests or by phone.

All pre-contest and telephone interviews must be made at least 24 hours in advance through the Communications office. Interviews will be scheduled when student-athlete and staff schedules allow.

For post-event interviews, there is generally a 20-minute cooling off period. Interviews will either be conducted on the playing field, outside the team locker room area, or at a formal press conference setting, depending on the sport and facility.

Playing fields, team locker rooms and other team quarters are private team areas. Media members are not permitted in these areas unless accompanied by appropriate Athletics personnel.

PHOTOS/LOGOS/VIDEO REQUESTS

Media members wishing to obtain photos and logos related to Mizzou Athletics should contact the Athletics Communications contact for the sport (see staff directory for sport assignments). Special photo galleries for media access are available following many events.
