MEDIA CREDENTIALING CRITERIA

The University of Missouri's decision to issue credentials to a media outlet for the purposes of covering a Mizzou Athletics event is determined by a variety of factors. They include the following:

- Space availability;
- Distribution/size of outlet: free, subscription, sale on newsstands, website traffic, etc.;
- Length of existence of the publication, amount of original copy generated, number of full-time employees of the publication and the journalistic experience of the reporter(s);
- Radio or TV station program format and audience size;
- Amount of coverage given to Mizzou through the season;
- Intention/ability to cover all 20 sports at Mizzou;
- Attendance at Mizzou media sessions, including Olympic sport opportunities;
- Professionalism, which includes but is not limited to conduct at games, press conferences, practices, on social media, etc.;
- Compliance with SEC media policy.

The University of Missouri has the right to deny or revoke credentials under its own discretion.

CREDENTIAL REQUEST PROCEDURE

In order to follow health and safety guidelines from the COVID-19 pandemic, space will be limited for credentialed members of the media at Audrey J. Walton Soccer Stadium.

Mizzou Athletics will only offer single-game credentials to affiliated media at home soccer games. Media wishing to apply for a single-game credential should email Nate Lowery, of the Mizzou Athletics Strategic Communications office, with all members from the outlet requesting credentials, by end of day Tuesday prior to the contest. Members of the media should allow 48 hours to receive notice of the approval or denial of their credential application.

INTERVIEW POLICIES

All interviews with University of Missouri student-athletes or staff members must be arranged through the Athletics Communications office. Media are asked to never contact a player or coach directly.

Due to health and safety guidelines because of the COVID-19 pandemic, in-person interviews will not be allowed during the season. All interviews will be conducted over phone or Zoom.

In general, athlete and staff interviews are conducted prior to or after practices. All pre-contest interviews must be made at least 24 hours in advance through the Communications office.

Interviews will be scheduled when student-athlete and staff schedules allow.

Pre-match interviews will not be allowed on gamedays. Post-match interviews will be conducted over Zoom at a predetermined time, which will be communicated to the media alongside the access link.

Playing fields, team locker rooms and other team quarters are private team areas. Media members are not permitted in these areas.

DR. MUN Y. CHOI

PRESIDENT & CHANCELLOR
UNIVERSITY OF MISSOURI

Fourth Year
Illinois, 1987

Mun Y. Choi is the 24th president of the University of Missouri System and, as of July 2020, now serves in a dual role as chancellor of the University of Missouri.

In this new role, President Choi oversees the academic, business, and financial aspects of the four universities, as well as a health care system and statewide extension program.

In partnership with the University of Missouri Board of Curators and university leadership, President Choi introduced a new collective vision for the system in 2018: to advance the opportunities for success and well-being in Missouri, the nation and the world through transformative teaching, research, innovation, engagement and inclusion.

This effort strengthened collaboration among the four universities and created a more efficient environment. He has worked tirelessly to transform the perception and value of higher education with the university community, alumni, legislators and Missourians.

Since his arrival, MU has celebrated three consecutive years of substantial enrollment growth, the highest graduation rate in the university's history and a record 90% retention rate for first-year students returning their sophomore year. This fall, MU also jumped up 15 places in the U.S. News & World Report rankings.

Choi has led efforts to strategically invest in UM System research, particularly through NextGen Precision Health with the anchoring facility set to officially open in Fall 2021 on MU's campus. In addition to attracting top scientists, NextGen Precision Health has the potential to make key discoveries — with treatments for prostate, breast and pancreatic cancers, traumatic brain injuries and rare musculoskeletal diseases — as well as increase health care access for rural Missourians.

Building a climate that promotes diversity and strengthens inclusion, is another key priority for Choi. For the first time ever, the entire university community is required this fall to complete cultural competency training. The American Council of Education recently cited MU as a national example for increasing its capacity to improve campus culture. In 2020, MU had the highest percentage of Black/African American students (7.7%) among all 11 Midwest flagship universities and, over the last four years, has increased its minority tenured-track faculty hires by 26 percent.

Choi strongly and continually advocates for every member of the university community to take personal responsibility for addressing

discrimination when witnessing it – no matter how subtle or unintentional. The burden of raising awareness and creating a more inclusive culture falls on everyone’s shoulder.

Choi came to Missouri in 2017 after nine years at the University of Connecticut where he served as provost and executive vice president (2012-2017) and earlier as dean of engineering (2008-2012). His 25-year career in higher education also includes serving eight years as a department head of engineering at Drexel University and six years as an assistant and associate professor at the University of Illinois at Chicago.

A product of and passionate champion for public higher education, he earned his bachelor’s degree from the University of Illinois. He secured his master’s and Ph.D. degrees in mechanical and aerospace engineering from Princeton University.

His parents brought their family to the United States from South Korea when Choi was 9 years old. His parents’ initial U.S. jobs making uniforms for Taekwondo students and teachers evolved into a highly successful family business. The Choi Brothers in Chicago, where President Choi worked as a young man, is now run by his sisters and is one of the country’s largest suppliers of martial arts uniforms.

Choi is married to Suzanne Choi and together they have three children.



PAMELA BRUZINA
FACULTY ATHLETICS REPRESENTATIVE
21st Year
Wisconsin, 1991

Dr. Pam Bruzina was appointed Faculty Athletics Representative in May, 2017, for a five-year term. Previously, Dr. Bruzina served as an executive member of the Intercollegiate Athletics Committee (IAC) and was the IAC Compliance Subcommittee Chair and the Student-Athlete Welfare Subcommittee Chair. Her dedication to the welfare of our student-athletes was evident during her time on the IAC.

Dr. Bruzina has served in the Department of Nutrition and Exercise Physiology since 2000. She has been an Associate Professor of Nutritional Sciences at MU since 2006, and has served as the department’s Director of Graduate Studies, Nutritional Sciences, since 2010.

Dr. Bruzina’s lab investigates the interactive effects of nutrition and physical activity on bone health. In particular, Dr. Bruzina’s lab is studying the effects of energy balance on bone turnover during weight loss and weight maintenance in overweight individuals. In addition, Dr. Bruzina is studying the efficacy of exercise-based interventions to increase bone mineral density in osteopenic males.

She was a student-athlete at the University of Wisconsin, competing in track and cross country. She earned a bachelor’s degree, with distinction, in molecular biology, which provides her with firsthand knowledge of the demands placed on student-athletes.



DESIREE REED-FRANCOIS

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

First Year

University of Missouri President Mun Choi announced on August 8, 2021, that Desiree Reed-Francois has been named as Director of Intercollegiate Athletics for the university. Reed-Francois was selected following a search led by UM Curator Jeff Layman and assisted by Parker Executive Search.

"This is a transformational day for Mizzou Athletics," Choi said. "Desiree Reed-Francois brings an unsurpassed passion for student-athletes and bold, visionary skills that will propel a championship culture at MU. As a proud member of the SEC, we are energized to go into the next era of Mizzou athletics with Desiree Reed-Francois at the helm."

Reed-Francois has more than 25 years of experience in intercollegiate athletics and was the first Hispanic female and woman of color athletics director at the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) level. She has served as athletic director at UNLV since 2017. At Missouri, she will be the first female athletic director in MU history and the first female athletic director in a public institution in the SEC.

"It is truly an honor to join Missouri's flagship institution, and I am extremely grateful to search committee Chair Layman and members of the search advisory committee for this incredible opportunity," said Reed-Francois. "The University of Missouri is a world-class academic institution with a strong commitment to athletics, and a resolve to further enhance its athletics programs to achieve elite national status is all of our endeavors. We have a proud and storied tradition; we compete in the premier athletic conference in the country; and, perhaps most importantly, we have a collective desire to be great. My family and I are excited to join the Mizzou Family, and I cannot wait to get started. Go Tigers!"

"She is a tough, dynamic, innovative leader who can help build upon Mizzou's successes and position us to regularly compete for championships in the SEC and beyond. The SEC is the toughest conference in the nation, and we are poised for continued success with Desiree as our leader," said Layman, who was chair of the search committee. "I'm indebted to members of the search committee for their tremendous effort. We had an exceptionally strong pool of candidates that demonstrates the bright future of Mizzou Athletics."

"We've taken an incredible step forward," said Darryl Chatman, chair of the UM Board of Curators. "I'd like to extend my welcome and congratulations to Desiree Reed-Francois and Mizzou. This is a fantastic hire, and I'm excited about the future. Our student-athletes compete in the nation's toughest conference and always have a national championship in their sights. I'm excited for our student-athletes, our university, our fans, our supporters and our state. We are building great things here at Mizzou."

"Desiree brings a variety of quality experiences to student-

athletes as a leader on many campuses and in many conferences," said Greg Sankey, commissioner of the SEC. "As she continues to build the University of Missouri athletics program, I look forward to working with her in her new role as we continue the progress of the SEC – the strongest conference in the country."

While at UNLV, Reed-Francois has hired head coaches in men's and women's basketball, football, women's soccer, softball, volleyball, and women's track and field, with three of them already earning Conference Coach of the Year honors. The UNLV head coaching roster is the most diverse in its conference and among the most diverse in the FBS.

Reed-Francois oversaw the opening of a new, \$35 million football complex and successfully negotiated a joint use agreement with the NFL's Oakland Raiders for UNLV's use of the new \$2 billion Allegiant Stadium. During her time at UNLV, she has completed or implemented more than \$70 million in facility upgrades.

She also has proven fundraising skills, with UNLV Athletics raising more than \$60 million, including an \$8 million estate gift, the largest estate gift in the school's history. During her time at UNLV, football season ticket sales and premium revenue has jumped by 50% and 70% respectively, and Reed-Francois introduced a new apparel agreement with Nike, all with a focus on creating a strong fiscal foundation for the business operations of UNLV Athletics.

Prior to UNLV, Reed-Francois served as the deputy athletics director at Virginia Tech and as a senior associate athletics director at the University of Cincinnati, in addition to stints at the University of Tennessee, where she was the first woman to oversee men's basketball in the SEC, California State University-Fresno, Santa Clara University, San Jose State University, the University of California Berkeley, and the University of San Francisco.

Reed-Francois earned a bachelor's degree from UCLA and a juris doctorate from the University of Arizona College of Law. She is a member of the State Bar of California and taught law classes at the University of Tennessee and at Santa Clara University. Prior to her work in college athletics, Reed-Francois worked as a legal associate for the Oakland Raiders and the NFL's Management Council.

She also has participated in the Division I Athletics Directors Leadership Institute and Fellows Program, the Women Leaders in College Sports' Executive Institute, and she currently serves as vice chair of the NCAA Baseball Selection Committee and formerly was a member of the College Football Playoff Committee's operations committee. In addition, Reed-Francois is a board member of the National Coalition of Minority Football Coaches. She is a member of the National Association of Collegiate Marketing Administrators and National Association of College Directors of Athletics and has been a presenter at NACDA, NACMA, Women Leaders, and Sports Business Journal's annual conventions.

She and her husband, Joshua, have a son, Jackson, who will be attending MU in Fall 2022 to study journalism.

Stefanie Golan is in her first season as the Mizzou Soccer head coach.

In nine seasons as head coach at Minnesota, Golan fashioned a 92-64-24 (.578) record with four NCAA Tournament appearances, one Big Ten regular-season title, a pair of Big Ten Tournament championships and eight winning seasons. Prior to taking the Gophers' job just two weeks prior to preseason camp ahead of the 2012 season, Golan spent nearly six years at Army West Point, the last three as the program's head coach. Her Black Knight teams went 33-18-10 (.623) under her leadership, highlighted by their second-ever NCAA Tournament appearance in 2011, to give Golan a 12-year head coaching record of 125-82-34 (.589).

"I am incredibly excited about the opportunity at Mizzou and the environment that my boys and I get to be a part of in CoMo," said Golan, who ranks as the second-winningest coach in the history of the Minnesota women's program. "It was evident from the moment I set foot on campus that Mizzou is a special place with incredible people. I have known Bryan Blitz ever since I was playing club soccer as a young girl in St. Louis, and I have always respected him as a person and as a coach, and I am excited to continue to build upon the foundation he has in place.

"I am grateful to President Choi, Jim Sterk, Tim Hickman and the entire search committee for this opportunity to continue to build a competitive program within the SEC that competes at a high level both on and off the field, and that develops women of high character who are ready to take on their next phase of life as confident women," she added. "I am looking forward to getting to know each woman on the team individually as well as the team collectively so we can drive forward together and maximize our potential this fall."

Minnesota bounced back from the only non-winning season (2019) in Golan's Gopher coaching career to post a 5-4-3 record playing against all Big Ten slate in 2020-21 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The 2018 Gophers put together an incredible run to the 2018 Big Ten Tournament championship by not allowing a single

goal after entering the event as the seventh-seeded team. That momentum carried over into the NCAA Tournament, as Minnesota upset Auburn, 2-0, in a first-round match before falling to UCLA in the second round. The 2017 campaign saw Golan earn her 100th career victory, as the Gophers went 11-5-3 overall and finish second in the Big Ten for the second-straight season (7-3-1).

Golan was named the 2016 Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading Minnesota to a 16-3-4 record, and the program's first-ever sweep of the Big Ten regular-season and tournament titles. Minnesota made back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances for the first time since a five-year run in the mid-1990s, and was rewarded with a No. 4 seed. The Gophers finished the 2016 campaign ranked in the Top 15 nationally after earning the highest national ranking in program history at No. 8 along the way. That squad also boasted the Big Ten Forward of the Year in Simone Kolander and the Big Ten Defender of the Year in Rashida Beal, who earned All-America honors and was drafted by FC Kansas City.

In 2015, Golan guided Minnesota to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2010 and a 12-7-3 record. The program was ranked as high as No. 11 during the season and Kolander earned the first of two Big Ten Forward of the Year honors. The Gophers posted a winning record, both overall and in the conference, as they reached the 2014 Big Ten Tournament semifinals.

The Golden Gophers earned an at-large bid into the 2013 NCAA Tournament, only the program's third trip since 1999, and picked up two signature wins in their 11-8-2 season with upsets over then-No. 13 Michigan and No. 7 Penn State. The team once again earned the NSCAA Team Academic Award with 10 student-athletes named Academic All-Big Ten. In addition, freshman Tarah Hobbs earned a pair of invites to the U20 Women's National Team Training Camps after a season where she was honored with NSCAA second-team All-Great Lakes, 2013 Big Ten Goalkeeper of the Year, All-Big Ten first team and Big Ten All-Freshman Team honors.

Golan arrived in Minneapolis two weeks before preseason started in 2012 and led the Golden Gophers to a fourth-place finish in the Big Ten and an 11-7-2 overall record. The 2012 team was awarded the NSCAA Team Academic Award and 12 student-athletes were named Academic All-Big Ten. Sophomore Taylor Uhl was named to the first-team All-Great Lakes, first-team All-Big Ten and third-team All-America teams during Golan's first season.



Before moving to the Twin Cities to guide the Minnesota program, Golan spent nearly six years at Army West Point, the last three as head coach. She first served as the program's Associate Head Coach for the 2007 and 2008 campaigns under 24-year head coach Gene Ventriglia, and together they helped the Black Knights to a Patriot League championship and the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance in 2008.

After debuting as the Black Knights' head coach in 2009, Golan's 2010 squad registered the program's highest win total since 1996 with its 14-4-3 record and allowed just six goals on the season en route to a share of the Patriot League's regular-season championship. In her final season at West Point, the Black Knights went 12-4-5, and won the 2011 Patriot League Tournament title with a thrilling 2-0 win over arch-rival Navy to earn the second-ever NCAA Tournament appearance in program history.

Prior to joining the Army West Point staff, Golan served as an assistant coach at the University of Pittsburgh and the University of Evansville after launching her career as a graduate assistant at Mercer University. An active member of the NSCAA and former Chair of the NSCAA Great Lakes Region for the organization's All-America Committee, she earned a soccer scholarship to Duke University, where she earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science in 2001. Golan earned her Master's in Sports Leadership from Northeastern University in 2012.

She has two sons, Travis and Max, and a pair of dogs, Sarge and Captain.

Golan replaces Bryan Blitz, who stepped down at the end of Tigers' 2020-21 season after starting the Mizzou program from scratch and serving 25 seasons as its head coach.

Andy Stoots enters his first season in the black and gold in 2021. Stoots comes to the Mizzou Soccer program by way of Louisville. He spent five years with the Cardinals' program, making two NCAA Tournament appearances. Working primarily with the goalkeepers and attacking players, Stoots helped Louisville's offensive production increase while improving its final RPI and win total in each of the last three seasons.

The Cardinals reached the NCAA Tournament in 2018 and 2019. In each season, they topped their previous program-best finish in ACC regular season play, finishing sixth in 2018 and fourth the following year. Stoots and the Cardinals reached the NCAA Tournament Second Round in 2019.

Prior to his stint at Louisville, Stoots spent time on Golan's Minnesota staff. As an assistant coach for the Golden Gophers, Stoots was a part of the 2016 team that captured both the Big Ten's regular season and tournament titles. Minnesota led the Big Ten in goals and assists while allowing only three goals during conference play en route to the First Round of the NCAA Tournament.

Prior to his tenure in the Twin Cities, Stoots made stops at a handful of institutions in the southeast that neighbor Mizzou's SEC rivals--Samford, Belmont, East Tennessee State and Troy.

"I am so excited to be joining the Mizzou Soccer family and work with Coach Golan once again," Stoots said. "I am looking forward to supporting our student-athletes and playing whatever role that I can to help move this program forward."

Stoots holds a USSF National D License and NSCAA Premier Diploma. He graduated from Milligan College in 2002 after a four-year career as a goalkeeper. He continues to hold a number of records including shutouts, goals against average and wins.

Molly Poletto enters her third season on the Mizzou coaching staff in 2021. She joined the Tigers in the winter of 2019, bringing eight years of coaching experience with her, the previous two at Boston University

Mizzou's goalkeeper coach, Poletto faced the unprecedented challenge in 2019 of starting three separate players in the net due to medical issues. Peyton Bauman, McKenna Sheehan and Gillian Schulte all saw their first minutes of collegiate action on the season, with Schulte — a walk-on, starting the season's final four games.

Poletto helped BU return to the top of the Patriot League in 2018, as the Terriers claimed their fourth Patriot League title and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the 14th time in program history. BU finished with an 11-7-4 record, including an unbeaten mark in Patriot League play at 7-0-2. Poletto was instrumental in guiding the goalkeeping unit to a combined 11 shutouts in 2018.

In Poletto's first season in 2017, her goalkeepers posted a then-record 10 shutouts as the Terriers finished with a 10-8-3 record and reached the Patriot League Tournament semifinals. Under Poletto's tutelage, BU surrendered just 0.86 goals per game and the goalkeepers combined for a .798 save percentage.

The Englewood, Colo., native worked primarily with the Utes' goalkeepers unit in 2016 as a volunteer assistant coach after spending the previous three years as an undergraduate assistant coach. Following her promotion, the goalkeeping crew improved its goals against average from the 2015 season's 1.21 to a miniscule 0.65, while boasting a .860 save percentage after finishing the previous year at .784. The Utes also totaled 10 clean sheets that season.

Poletto originally joined Utah as a student-athlete in the fall of 2011 but saw her collegiate career cut short by injury, leading her to focus on coaching. Beside assisting the Utes, she has also served as the Director of Goalkeeping and an age group head coach for the Utah Avalanche club team, while also working with the state's ODP program.

She holds a USSF "B" license and serves as an instructor for the USSF "E" licenses. After graduating cum laude from the University of Utah in 2015 with a degree in communications and a minor in psychology, she completed her Master's degree in sports psychology in the spring of 2017.

Poletto owns a six-year old border collie-lab mix, Callie.

- Missouri has made the NCAA Tournament field seven times in its history, with berths in 1999, 2003, 2007, 2008, 2012, 2014 and 2016.
- Mizzou owns a 4-7 mark in NCAA Tournament games.
- Eight of Missouri's 10 NCAA games have been played at the team's home field of Walton Stadium.
- Mizzou did not play an NCAA Tournament match away from Walton Stadium until 2014.
- Mizzou's first-ever NCAA game, a 3-2 four overtime loss to Marquette in the 1999 first round, stands as Missouri's longest-ever match. The game went 142 minutes.
- The Tigers' all-time leading scorer, Nikki Thole, tallied Mizzou's first-ever NCAA Tournament goal in the game against Marquette.
- Three of Missouri's NCAA games have gone to penalty kicks following two overtime sessions.
- Seven different Tigers have scored in NCAA Tournament games: Michelle Collins, Taylor Grant, Kristen Heil, Danielle Nottingham, Candace Ruff, Reagan Russell, Mallory Stipetich and Nikki Thole.
- Collins, Grant and Thole scored two goals in NCAA games. Both of Thole's came against Marquette in 1999, Collins scored one against SEMO in 2007 and the other against Evansville in 2008, and Grant tallied two against Kansas in 2014.

1999

NCAA TOURNAMENT - FIRST ROUND

Nov. 10, 1999 • Columbia, Mo.

Marquette 3, Missouri 2 (4OT)

COLUMBIA, Mo. - The University of Missouri women's soccer team was defeated Wednesday, Nov. 10, in the first round of the 1999 NCAA Tournament by Marquette, 3-2 in four overtimes. The match, which was the longest in both programs' history, was decided in the 142nd minute when Marquette's Amy Hnatow scored her first career goal.

After 35 minutes of scoreless play, Marquette got on the board with a score from Kate Gordon, her ninth goal of the season. The score stayed 1-0 at halftime before Marquette added its second goal in the 54th minute. Erin Morgan netted her eighth of the season on a pass from Lannette Rossini and Marquette led the Tigers 2-0.

Just over two minutes later, Nikki Thole put MU on the scoreboard when she knocked home a goalie deflection with a soft header. Thole's 22nd goal of the season got Missouri back in the match and reenergized the Tigers.

After she was hauled down in the penalty box, Thole scored the equalizer on a penalty kick that beat Marquette's goalkeeper low right. From that point on, nearly a full match was played before the next goal was scored.

Three full overtimes, and most of the day's sunlight, came and went with the team's trading opportunities in the extra periods. At 141:13, Hnatow placed a shot over Missouri goalkeeper Jackie Adamec's head from the right side and Marquette had the victory.



2003

NCAA Tournament First Round

Nov. 14, 2003 • Columbia, Mo.

Missouri 1, Eastern Illinois 0

COLUMBIA, Mo. - Appearing in their first NCAA Tournament match in four years, the Tigers continued their hard fought postseason rally defeating Eastern Illinois, 1-0. The victory marked Mizzou's first NCAA Tournament win in program history.

After a lackluster first half, Mizzou didn't waste any time shining up the scoreboard during the second period. Just three minutes into play, Kristen Heil put Mizzou up 1-0 scoring her 10th goal of the season.

Preparing the scoring play deep in the midfield, forward Melissa Peabody sliced a pass to Adriene Davis in the midfield circle, who then played a perfect pass to Heil at the top of the penalty box. Heil then bested two EIU defenders and keeper Tiffany Groene to deliver the game-winner.

NCAA Tournament Second Round

Nov. 16, 2003 • Columbia, Mo.

Kansas 2, Missouri 0

COLUMBIA, Mo. - Riding through a roller coaster season, the Missouri soccer team ended the 2003 campaign with loss in the second round of the NCAA Tournament to No. 16 Kansas, 2-0.

Backed by solid defensive play, Mizzou's offensive squad was able to concentrate its efforts on the KU net. Jennifer Nobis pulled out an exhilarating break away, but lost the ball to an aggressive play by Jayhawk keeper Meghan Miller.

Mizzou's defensive squad continued its valiant efforts, thwarting Kansas in the backfield. Unable to best the Tigers one-on-one, the Jayhawk offense finally found fruition in one of their nine cornerkicks. Lobbing a ball into the penalty box, the two teams batted the ball through the arcade of bodies until Smith caught a sharp foot on the ball and sailed it over the goal line.

Down 1-0 with just 13 minutes ticking on the clock, Missouri frantically tried to even out the score. Despite several extraordinary attempts by Davis, the Tigers struggled to come back. The frenzy opened up KU's second scoring play that dropped MU with a 2-0 deficit with just two minutes left to play. Kimberly Karfonta lofted a ball from midfield to Carmel Kaplinger who dribbled the ball to score.

2007

NCAA Tournament First Round

Nov. 16, 2007 • Columbia, Mo.

Missouri 1, SEMO 1 (2-0 PK)

COLUMBIA, Mo. - The 23rd-ranked Missouri soccer team tied Southeast Missouri State (SEMO), 1-1, with the Tigers advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament on penalty kicks. The Tigers and Redhawks were scoreless through 67:36 of action before the game was decided, 2-0, on junior Kat Tarr and junior goalkeeper Mallory Forst's shootout shots.

Sophomore Michelle Collins came up with Missouri's first goal of the night, dribbling the ball in from the top of the box. Shooting from eight yards out, Collins beat the keeper to the right, scoring 16:26 into the game. The goal was Collins' 12th of the year.

After SEMO tied the game and a scoreless overtime session, five Tigers were selected from the lineup to take Missouri's penalty shots. Tarr made Missouri's first penalty kick attempt but SEMO missed all four of theirs before Forst stepped up and hit her shot to advance the Tigers to the second round.

NCAA Tournament Second Round

Nov. 18, 2007 • Columbia, Mo.

USC 1, Missouri 0

COLUMBIA, Mo. - The eighth-ranked USC Trojans (16-3-2) defeated the 23rd-ranked Missouri Tigers (13-8-1), 1-0, in the second round of the NCAA Tournament in Columbia, Mo.

USC scored the game-winning goal on a header from less than five yards out by midfielder Ashley Nick with 5:12 remaining in the second overtime period. USC midfielder Megan Ohai tallied the assist off a throw-in.

The first half ended scoreless, with Missouri out-shooting the Trojans, 5-3. Missouri's best scoring chance came just four minutes into the game. Alysha Bonnick delivered two shots from inside the box, both saved by USC goalkeeper Kristin Olsen.

USC dominated the first overtime, out-shooting the Tigers, 5-2. Five minutes into overtime USC's Amy Rodriguez ripped a shot from just inside the box that was saved by keeper Mallory Forst. Missouri's only scoring chance came with 18 seconds left when Michelle Collins took a pass from midfielder Mo Redmond and had a break away. After a shifty move, Collins fired a shot to the near post from six yards out but the USC goalie smothered the shot.



2008

NCAA Tournament First Round

Nov. 14, 2008 • Columbia, Mo.

Missouri 2, Evansville 0

COLUMBIA, Mo. - Michelle Collins and Candace Ruff each scored a goal in the first half to give Missouri a first-round NCAA Tournament victory over Evansville, 2-0. With rain falling on the field and 14 mph winds coming from the Northwest, the Missouri women decided to waste no time in securing their spot in the regional championship game.

Michelle Collins started things early for Mizzou as she took a pass from Crystal Wagner and sent a shot past Evansville goalkeeper Theresa Bagby in the third minute of play. The goal marked Collins seventh on the season and gave the Tigers a 1-0 lead. The Aces weren't able to keep Mizzou quiet. Just thirty minutes after Collins' goal Ashley Hamblin passed one to Candace Ruff for the Tiger's second score of the game and Ruff's second career goal. Missouri recorded 16 shots in the first period while Evansville attempted just one.

NCAA Tournament Second Round

Nov. 16, 2008 • Columbia, Mo.

Illinois 1, Missouri 1 (4-3 PK)

COLUMBIA, Mo. - Missouri ended its season in a penalty kick shootout to the Illinois Fighting Illini, 4-3, after a 1-1 game after two overtimes in the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Freshman Kelsey Blincow, sophomore Alysha Bonnick and junior Bree Thornton all converted their penalty kicks against Illinois goalkeeper Alexandra Kapicka. The Illini made their fourth of five attempts and Kapicka made a save on senior Mallory Forst's shot to send Illinois to the sweet sixteen. Illinois dominated early play in the second half and the Illini went up 1-0 in the 56th minute when Jackie Santacaterina flicked a ball up to Chichi Nweke. The forward fired a 14-yard shot past Dittamore and into the lower far post. Missouri responded in the 74th minute when junior Michelle Collins played a ball up to sophomore Alysha Bonnick, who sent a pass to a wide open Mallory Stipetich. The freshman one-timed a 15-yard shot to the left of Kapicka and into the net for a 1-1 game. Regulation and overtime ended with both teams tied at 1-1 so the contest went to a shootout.

2012

NCAA Tournament First Round

Nov. 11, 2012 • Columbia, Mo.

Illinois 1, Missouri 1 (3-0 PK)

COLUMBIA, Mo. - Following a 1-1 game after 110 minutes of play between Mizzou and Illinois in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, the contest went to a penalty kick shootout, where Illinois advanced. The Tigers outshot the Fighting Illini 28-19 in the contest but had numerous shots hit off the post.

The Tigers could not convert on their first three penalty kicks, while the Fighting Illini made their first three attempts to advance. Illinois went up 1-0 in the 19th minute but Missouri battled back and used a goal from junior Danielle Nottingham to knot the score at 1-1 in the 53rd minute. Redshirt-freshman Lauren Flynn played a ball across the field to Nottingham, who was stationed outside the left corner of the box. Nottingham ripped a 20-yarder that sailed past Illinois' goalie and into the upper left netting. The tally was Nottingham's first of the season and ninth of her career. Flynn earned her first career assist on the play.

Mizzou sent a flurry of six shots toward the goal in the final nine minutes of regulation but could not take the lead. With just seconds remaining in the second half Grant blasted a shot but it flew just wide left of the goal. Following a scoreless first overtime session, the Tigers again seemed likely to score in the second overtime. The home team managed to earn three corner kicks and got off three shots but again could not score to send the contest to a penalty kick shootout.

Nov. 16, 2014 • Lawrence, Kan.

Missouri 3, Kansas 1

LAWRENCE, Kan. - Senior Taylor Grant tallied two goals and junior Reagan Russell added another as the Mizzou soccer team advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament with a 3-1 win over Kansas in Lawrence, Kan. The Tigers improved to 12-6-3 on the season, while the Jayhawks ended the year with a 15-6 record.

Missouri was on the attack from the first whistle and wasted no time scoring the first goal of the match. Junior Reagan Russell sent a long cross from the right side of the field to the far post. Grant, stationed near the post, chested the ball down into the net from a yard out for a 1-0 Tiger advantage.

Grant struck again early in the second half for a 2-0 Mizzou advantage in the 51st minute. Senior Kaysie Clark played up a perfect pass to Grant, who ran onto the ball at the top of the box. The Kansas keeper came off her line but Grant took a touch and sent a low shot past the goalkeeper and into the lower left netting for her team leading ninth goal of the season. A goal from the Jayhawks in the 57th minute cut Mizzou's lead to 2-1 to give Kansas some hope. In the 66th minute, Russell ran down the right sideline, ran into the box and slotted a low shot from 10-yards out into the far post for a 3-1 Missouri lead.

NCAA Tournament Second Round

Nov. 21, 2014 • Stanford, Calif.

Washington 1, Missouri 0 (OT)

STANFORD, Calif. - No. 24 Washington scored 1:03 into overtime to end the Mizzou soccer team's NCAA Tournament run with a 1-0 loss to the Huskies in the second round at Stanford, Calif. The Tigers and Huskies played 91 minutes of scoreless soccer before Washington ended Mizzou's season in extra time.

Early in the first overtime session, Washington's Kimberly Keever made a run down the left flank, cut into the box and unleashed a right-footed attempt toward goal. The shot flew over redshirt senior keeper McKenzie Sauerwein's arms and into the right side netting for the winner. The Huskies had a 17-10 edges in shots, although second half saw both squads send five attempts on net.

2016

NCAA Tournament First Round

Nov. 13, 2016 • Lawrence, Kan.

Kansas 1, Missouri 0 (OT)

LAWRENCE, Kan. - Kansas scored 40 seconds into the second overtime session to earn a 1-0 win over the Mizzou soccer team in the first round of the NCAA Tournament at Lawrence, Kan. The game was close throughout but the Jayhawks struck on a close-range shot to end the Tigers' season.

After 100 minutes of scoreless soccer, the Jayhawks used a five-yard strike from Lois Heuchan only 40 seconds into the double overtime to give the home team the win. The ball was crossed across the goal to Heuchan, who calmly beat Mizzou sophomore keeper Kelsey Dossey to the right netting.

The contest was evenly matched, with Kansas owning a 17-14 edge in shots and both teams committing eight fouls. The Tigers did have a 12-6 advantage in corner kicks, including a 10-3 lead in the second half and overtime.

Freshman forward Sarah Luebbert nearly put Mizzou up in the third minute when she received the ball at midfield and raced toward goal. However, the freshman's final touch was a bit heavy and the Kansas keeper came off her line to block Luebbert's 12-yard shot.

The Tigers' best chance of the day came from the foot of senior defender Erin Webb in the 81st minute. She dribbled into the box and unleashed a left-footed strike that sailed inches over the crossbar.
