Mun Y. Choi is the 24th president of the University of Missouri System and as of July 29, 2020, he was appointed as chancellor of the University of Missouri. As president, Dr. Choi serves as the chief executive and academic officer of the UM System, a land grant institution that provides centralized administration for four universities, a health care system, and extension program, and ten research and technology parks. Dr. Choi oversees all academic, public, business, financial and related affairs of the UM System under the policies and general supervision of the University of Missouri Board of Curators.

As a product of and passionate champion for public higher education, Dr. Choi advocates tirelessly on behalf of the four universities of the UM System with state and national business, political and civic leaders to achieve excellence. In partnership with the board and university leadership, Dr. Choi introduced a new collective vision for the UM System in September 2018: to advance the opportunities for success and well-being in Missouri, the nation and the world through transformative teaching, research, innovation, engagement and inclusion.

To fulfill this vision, Dr. Choi announced the Missouri Compacts for Achieving Excellence, a plan that includes \$260 million in strategic investments. The Missouri Compacts are a promise to achieve excellence through student success; research and creative works;

engagement and outreach; inclusive excellence; and planning, operations and stewardship to best serve our students and Missourians. The defining project of Dr. Choi's vision for the UM System is the Next Generation Precision Health Initiative, a statewide project to bring together and amplify the resources of the entire university system with the goal of creating personalized treatments for society's toughest diseases.

Dr. Choi's leadership has been instrumental in moving the University of Missouri System forward and strengthening the collaboration between the four universities in the system. Since he took office, the university has seen major changes, including the reversal of significant student enrollment declines at the flagship campus, administrative and budget transformations that support a more efficient and collaborative environment and the restoration of public funding through a dramatically improved relationship with the Missouri legislature. Most importantly, Dr. Choi is widely recognized to have regained the trust of the university community, alumni, legislators, and Missourians by changing the attitude of the entire state towards higher education.

Before serving as the UM System president, Dr. Choi's 25-year career in higher education included serving as assistant and associate professor at the University of Illinois at Chicago (1994-2000), department head of mechanical engineering and mechanics at Drexel University (2000-2008), then dean of engineering at the University of Connecticut (UConn) (2008-2012). Later, he took on the role of provost and executive vice president at UConn (2012-2017).

President Choi and his wife, Suzanne, have three children and live in Columbia, Missouri.

Dr. Pam (Hinton) Bruzina was appointed Faculty Athletics Representative by Interim Chancellor Hank Foley in May 2017.

Previously, Dr. Bruzina served as an executive member of the Intercollegiate Athletics Committee (IAC) and was the IAC Compliance Subcommittee Chair and the Student-Athlete Welfare Subcommittee Chair. Her dedication to the welfare of our student-athletes was evident during her time on the IAC.

Dr. Bruzina currently serves on the NCAA's Committee on Competitive Safeguards and Medical Aspects of Sport (CSMAS), as well as the Administrative, Practice and Prevention, Drug Testing and Research CSMAS Subcommittees. In addition, she is the Division I FBS representative on the Faculty Athletics Representatives Association Executive Committee.

Pam was a student-athlete at the University of Wisconsin, which provides her with firsthand knowledge of the demands placed on student athletes. Pam was a track and cross-country student-athlete, going from walk-on to All-American. She earned a bachelor's degree, with distinction, in molecular biology; she then completed her PhD in Nutritional Sciences at Wisconsin and postdoctoral training in Maternal and Child Nutrition at Cornell University.

Dr. Bruzina joined the Department of Nutrition and Exercise Physiology at Mizzou in 2000. She is a Professor of Nutrition and Exercise Physiology, and her lab investigates the interactive effects of nutrition and physical activity on bone health.

**DESIREE REED-FRANCOIS**

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Since her appointment in 2021, Reed-Francois has begun to transform Mizzou Athletics in every way: from department culture to the student-athlete experience; from facility enhancements to fundraising; and from community engagement to the fan experience.

Among her early accomplishments is the construction of the Stephens Indoor Practice Facility for football, the hiring of Dennis Gates as the new Whitten Family Men's Basketball Head Coach and Caroline Westrup in women's golf, dozens of enhancements to the football game-day fan experience, the implementation of Black & Gold Fridays across the state, a retooling of the Tigers' NIL program and the creation of the 24-stop Come HOME Tour which covered more than 7,500 miles.

In 2021-22, success came on the field and in the classroom for the Tigers, with the wrestling team winning the Big 12 Championship and both gymnastics and wrestling earning Top 10 finishes in the NCAA Championships, with wrestler Keegan O'Toole winning the National Championship. Football played in the Armed Forces Bowl and later secured the best recruiting class in program history, men's golf earned its first NCAA Regional bid since 2018 and softball played host to an NCAA Regional for the second-straight season.

Academically, the Tigers posted a school-record department GPA of 3.22 in Fall 2021, along with a 3.20 in Spring 2022. Mizzou posted a combined NCAA Academic Progress Rate mark of 990 with football posting its best-ever score and four programs (women's basketball, women's cross country, women's golf and women's tennis) earning perfect scores of 1,000.

The Tiger Scholarship Fund raised over \$41-million, the fourth-most productive year in TSF history and the highest production total in a year which did not contain a capital campaign.

Reed-Francois came to Mizzou after serving four years as the Director of Athletics at the University of Nevada Las Vegas. During her time with the Rebels, she completed or implemented more than \$70 million in facility upgrades, hired seven head coaches – three who earned Conference Coach of the Year honors early in their tenures and oversaw the completion and opening of a \$35-million on-campus football training complex and successfully negotiated a joint-use agreement with the NFL's Las Vegas Raiders and opened the new \$2-billion Allegiant Stadium.

An adept fundraiser, Reed-Francois led a \$60-million development drive at UNLV, including an \$8-million estate gift, the largest estate gift in the school's history. Football season ticket sales and premium revenue jumped by 200% and 70%, respectively, and Reed-Francois introduced a new apparel agreement with Nike.

Prior to arriving at UNLV, Reed-Francois served as the deputy athletics director at Virginia Tech, overseeing external relations, the day-to-day operations of the department and football and as a senior



associate athletics director at the University of Cincinnati. At the University of Tennessee, she became the first woman to oversee a men's basketball program in the SEC, which followed stints at California State University-Fresno, Santa Clara University, San Jose State University, the University of California Berkeley, and the University of San Francisco.

Reed-Francois earned a Bachelor's Degree from UCLA and a Juris Doctorate from the University of Arizona College of Law. She is a member of the State Bar of California and taught law classes at the University of Tennessee and at Santa Clara University. Prior to her work in college athletics, Reed-Francois worked as a legal associate for the Oakland Raiders and the NFL's Management Council.

She is a board member of the National Coalition of Minority Football Coaches, recently served as vice chair of the NCAA Baseball Selection Committee and formerly was a member of the College Football Playoff Committee's operations committee. In addition, Reed-Francois is a member of the LEAD1 Association, the National Association of Collegiate Marketing Administrators and National Association of College Directors of Athletics and has been a presenter at NACDA, NACMA, Women Leaders in College Sports, and Sports Business Journal's annual conventions. She has also participated in the Division I Athletics Directors Leadership Institute and Fellows Program and the Women Leaders in College Sports' Executive Institute.

A former rowing student-athlete at UCLA, Reed-Francois is the first female athletic director in Mizzou's history, the first female athletic director in a public institution in the SEC and was the first Hispanic female and woman of color athletics director at the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) level.

She and her husband, Josh Francois, are the parents of current men's basketball student-athlete Jackson Francois.

Dawn Sullivan was named the eighth volleyball head coach in University of Missouri history. Director of Athletics Desirée Reed-Francois announced Dec. 18, 2022.

Sullivan, who holds a 109-38 (.741) mark as a head coach, takes over the Tigers program after five seasons as the head coach at UNLV. She led the Rebels to the 2022 Mountain West Conference Championship, five-straight postseason appearances and 20 or more wins in four of five seasons, including 54 victories over the last two seasons.

An All-America player at Kansas State, Sullivan has spent all but the last five years of her career in the Midwest with coaching stints at Iowa State and Illinois State.

Sullivan, named Mountain West Coach of the Year twice, leaves UNLV as the second most winningest coach in program history with 109 wins. She was the fastest to break the 100-win plateau, achieving the feat in just 136 matches. The Rebels won the Mountain West Championship in spring 2021 and fall 2022 and were the winners of the 2021 National Invitational Volleyball Championship. Overall, she led UNLV to five-straight postseason appearances, including NCAA bids in 2020 and 2022.

AT UNLV (2018-22)

The 2022 UNLV squad won the Mountain West regular-season title and qualified for the NCAA Tournament. The Rebels went 17-1 in conference play, beating the longest win streak in program history, which was 12 wins in-a-row, set in the shortened Spring 2021 season.

Sullivan was named the 2022 MWC Coach of the Year while Isabel Martin was awarded the league's Player of the Year and Jhenna Gabriel earned MWC Newcomer of the Year. Martin, Gabriel, and Gabrielle Arretche-Ramos were selected first-team all-conference, and Jordyn Freeman was an Honorable Mention honoree.

Martin was also named an American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) All-America Honorable Mention and selected to the AVCA's 2022 Pacific South All-Region Team.

Statistically speaking, UNLV ended the season ranked 12th in the NCAA for match win-loss percentage with .839, sat 28th in hitting percentage (.263), 30th for kills per set (13.85) and 44th in the nation for assists per set with 12.71. The Rebels ranked second in the MWC for hitting efficiency (.263), second for both assists per set (12.71) and in kills per set (13.85), they also sat third for digs with 14.42 per set.

Sullivan helped Mariena Hayden become the program's first back-to-back conference player of the year (Spring 2021 & Fall 2021 Mountain West), as well as American Volleyball Coaches Association Honorable Mention All-American and Pacific South All-Region Team honoree for back-to-back seasons. Moreover, Hayden has also become only the fourth Rebel to be tabbed an all-conference team performer three straight years.

Additionally, Kate Brennan was named to the all-conference team in Spring 2021 after being an honorable mention selection the previous two seasons. Macy Smith was also named to the Spring 2021 All-MW Team, while Shelby Capllonch garnered Honorable Mention status.

During the Spring 2021 season, Sullivan guided the Rebels to the best start in program history (13-0) and, in turn, extended the longest win streak to 13 matches after the team's win over Illinois State in the first round of the NCAA Championship. Unfortunately, the streak was snapped in the second round of the tournament by eventual national champion and No. 2 seed Kentucky.

During the Fall 2021 season, Sullivan helped the Rebels to the best single-season record in program history with 28 wins, including the 2021 NIVC title.

The Rebels led the MW in five statistical categories in 2021, sitting atop the conference in aces per set, assists per set, hitting percentage, kills per set and winning percentage. Meanwhile, they were 32nd or better in all five of those, including sixth in hitting percentage (.298) and seventh in winning percentage (.929). Hayden led the country in aces per set and in service aces.

Sullivan became the fastest coach in program history to 50 wins - with a victory over San Jose State on March 19, 2021 - doing so in only 73 tries. Her 42 combined victories during the 2018 and 2019 seasons were the most in that time frame for any head coach at UNLV. Additionally, those 22- and 20-win totals from years one and two, respectively, matched the most 20-win seasons by a Rebel head coach, tying Allison Keeley (2004-10) and Cindy Frederick (2011-17).

In Sullivan's first season at the helm of the Rebel program, she led the Scarlet & Gray to an overall record of 22-12 and a fifth-place finish (10-8) in the Mountain West. The team earned an at-large berth in the NIVC and advanced to the semifinals after it defeated UC Irvine, Fresno State and Portland. Coincidentally, the final match of the year took place against her old squad, the Iowa State Cyclones in Ames, Iowa.

Delving deeper, those 22 wins in 2019 helped UNLV post a plus-14-win differential from the previous season's eight-win haul, which marked the largest improvement by an NCAA Division squad that season.

The Rebels concluded 2019 ranked in the top 100 of eight different NCAA statistical categories, such as: first in aces (251), third in aces per set (1.93), 38th in team kills (1,655), 61st in team assists (1,526), 66th in hitting percentage (.235), 67th in team total attacks (4,369), 80th in winning percentage (.647) and 99th in team digs (1,827).

Individually, Hayden led the NCAA in aces (114) and aces per set (0.90) and finished the year second overall in points (690.0), fifth in points per set (5.43) and 10th in total kills (543). Hayden's 114 aces were not only a UNLV single-season record, but they were the third most recorded by an NCAA student-athlete since the 25-point scoring format was adopted in 2008.

Sullivan earned her first career win against Southern Utah, a 3-0 sweep of the Thunderbirds, during the season-opening UNLV Invitational on Aug. 24, 2019. With the addition of 21 more triumphs, she became the second-winningest first-year coach in program history with 22.



In 2019, UNLV began the season slowly with a 4-9 showing before it turned things around with a nine-match win streak that evolved into a run of 16 wins in 18 contests to finish to the campaign. In all, the Rebels went 20-11 overall and finished third in the MW behind a 15-3 mark.

After opening the conference portion of the season with a pair of losses to Wyoming and then-No. 17 Colorado State, UNLV began 16-2 stretch with a 3-1 win at San Diego State, which was the catalyst to rewriting four single-season records: 15 conference wins, eight conference wins, eight-match road win streak and eight-match conference road win streak.

Statistically speaking, UNLV was ranked in the top 100 nine times: second in aces (241), fifth in aces per set (1.88), 21st in team kills (1,688) and team assists (1,568), 52nd in team total attacks (4,358), 71st in hitting percentage (.233), 79th in winning percentage (.645), 83rd in assists per set (12.25) and 85th in kills per set (13.19).

Once again, Hayden excelled under Sullivan's tutelage, finishing the 2019 campaign first in aces per set (0.69), third in service aces (70), 39th in points per set (4.70), 78th in kills per set (3.76) and 80th in points (479.5) despite missing time due to an injury.

IOWA STATE (2005-2018)

Prior to taking the UNLV job, Sullivan spent 13 seasons as an assistant and associate head coach at Iowa State. The Cyclones made 12 straight trips to the NCAA Tournament, including five regional semifinals and two regional finals. During that 12-year span, the Cyclones were one of only 11 NCAA Division I programs to participate in the postseason in each season.

Sullivan joined Johnson-Lynch's first-year staff with a focus on mentoring the outside hitters. She was promoted to associate head coach prior to the 2012 season and served in that role for seven years.

The coaching duo immediately made an impact upon its arrival in Ames as the program upped its win total by eight (to 16) during her first season. That team also finished five spots higher in the Big 12 standings (11th to sixth) from the previous season. One year later, the squad went 21-11 overall and 12-8 in Big 12 play (fourth place) en route to the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1995.

With Sullivan on staff, ISU volleyball posted 16 or more wins each season, including 12 straight with a minimum of 18 victories. The 2006 season marked the first of seven with 20 or more wins. In 2009, the Cyclones recorded program bests in overall wins with 27, conference victories with 17 and a No. 4 seed in the NCAA Tournament.

From 1996 to 2004, before Johnson-Lynch and Sullivan were with the program, the Cyclones went 13-167 overall with seven last-place finishes in nine seasons in Big 12 competition. Since 2005, ISU went 152-80 in league play with 12 straight double-digit winning seasons. The Cyclones finished second or third in conference play in nine-straight seasons.

The Cyclones had 13 student-athletes earn AVCA All-America honors 23 times, while 16 were recognized as AVCA All-Region performers 27 times. ISU has had 30 student-athletes named to the All-Big 12 Team 38 times. Academically, the team placed 56 student-athletes on Academic All-Big 12 teams, which included a program-record 10 honorees in 2011.

Sullivan began her collegiate coaching career as an assistant at Illinois State University in 2002 and helped the Redbirds boost their win total from 14 to 19 to 22 before leaving for Iowa State.

AS A PLAYER

Sullivan was a standout player at K-State from 1996-99, helping lead the Wildcats to their first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance in 1996 – the first of four straight during her playing career. She earned second-team All-America honors in 1999 and was inducted into the Wildcats' Athletics Hall of Fame in 2016.

Sullivan totaled total of 1,611 kills and 1,258 digs, which rank as the third and fourth-most, respectively, in Kansas State program history. She is one of only five KSU players to record 1,000 kills and 1,000 digs in a career.

As a senior, she served as a team captain and was later named an All-American and to the All-Big 12 Team. She also earned Academic All-Big 12 honors in each of her four years. Following graduation, Sullivan played professionally for the Grand Rapids Force of the United States Professional Volleyball League.

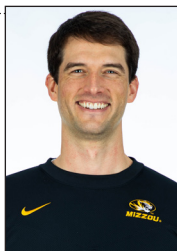

Cullen Irons joined the University of Missouri volleyball staff in January 2023 as Technical Coordinator.

Irons most recently spent the 2022 season on head coach Dawn Sullivan's staff at UNLV. The duo led the Rebels to the 2022 Mountain West Conference Championship and a berth in the NCAA Tournament.

The Rebels went 17-1 in conference play, beating the longest win streak in program history, which was 12 wins in-a-row, set in the shortened Spring 2021 season.

With Sullivan, Irons coached 2022 MWC Player of the Year Isabel Martin and Jhenna Gabriel who earned the league's Newcomer of the Year. Martin, Gabriel, and Gabrielle Arretche-Ramos were selected first-team all-conference, and Jordyn Freeman was an Honorable Mention honoree.

Martin was also named an American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) All-America Honorable Mention and selected to the AVCA's 2022 Pacific South All-Region Team.

At UNLV, Irons was primarily tasked with defensive systems and opponent scouting.

Irons is well-versed in his knowledge of the game and has a plethora of experience both on the collegiate and international stages. He has previously coached at Texas A&M, Oklahoma, and UC Santa Barbara along with the USA NORCECA (North, Central America, and Caribbean Volleyball Confederation) Continental Championships Team. He also served as a practice player for the USA women's Olympic team in 2020 and 2021.

As an assistant coach at Oklahoma, he shifted the entire blocking system, which resulted in a pair of top 10 blockers in the Big 12 conference and an NCAA tournament berth for the Sooners.

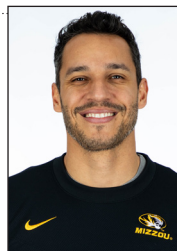
In 2016, he was named the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) Division I-II Men's National Assistant Coach of the Year after he helped guide UC Santa Barbara to their second 20-win season in the last 25 years. Irons was then elevated to the Gauchos' Associate Head Coach ahead of the 2019 season.

In April 2019, he was selected to the AVCA's Thirty Under 30 Award list and was one of just two recipients from the men's NCAA Division I-II level.

Irons was involved in all facets of the UCSB men's volleyball program, including recruiting, scouting, game planning, practice coordination, operations, and community service. With Irons on the staff, UCSB accrued a 99-68 record throughout six seasons.

Irons, a Hanford, California, native, played collegiately at UCSB from 2008-11, totaling at least 250 kills and 100 digs in all three of his seasons as a starting right-side hitter. He was named to the 2011 All-NCAA Tournament Team after leading the Gauchos in kills and ranking second in blocks and digs at the National Tournament, guiding his squad to a runner-up finish. Irons totaled 953 kills, 575 digs, and 174 blocks over his career at UC Santa Barbara.

Irons graduated from UCSB in 2011, receiving his Bachelor of Arts in Geography.

Wendel Camargo joined the University of Missouri volleyball staff in 2023 as recruiting coordinator.

Camargo heads to Columbia after spending five years as an assistant coach at Texas A&M under head coach Laura Kuhn. As a member of Kuhn's staff, Camargo helped lead the Aggies to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen as Kuhn was awarded SEC Coach of the Year in 2019.

That season, Texas A&M went 23-8 overall and 13-5 in conference play. Camargo helped guide Hollann Hans and Camille Conner to AVCA All-America honors, as well as AVCA All-South Region and All-SEC honors.

Camargo was in charge of training the setters and leading the Texas A&M offense during his time in College Station, Texas. Under his instruction, the Aggies had six players earn awards in the AVCA All-South Region, All-SEC, All-American Second-Team and Honorable Mention All-American, SEC All-Freshman Team, and All-SEC Team honors.

Camargo came to Texas A&M in January 2018 after serving four seasons as an assistant coach at James Madison University on Lauren Steinbrecher's staff. He was instrumental in the Dukes' immediate improvement and historic accomplishments during his tenure.

The Dukes won two Colonial Athletic Association regular season titles and two CAA Tournament Championships with Camargo on the coaching staff. They also made two NCAA tournament appearances and went 83-38 overall, having surpassed 20 wins in each of the last three seasons.

Prior to James Madison, Camargo served a two-year stint as a volunteer assistant coach at the University of Kansas. Working primarily with the liberos and defensive specialists, the Jayhawks tallied more than 1,900 digs each of his two seasons and averaged 15.9 digs per set.

Camargo also mentored Big 12 digs leader and Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week Brienne Riley. He assisted Kansas Head Coach Ray Bechard to a pair of NCAA Tournament berths and a final AVCA ranking of No. 17 in 2013 (25-8 record).

Before entering the coaching ranks in the United States, Camargo was a member of the coaching staff for the Dominican Republic National Team-Santo Domingo from 2009-12. He worked with the adult and junior national women's teams, including the 2012 Federation of International Volleyball (FIVB) NORCECA Olympic Qualifiers.

With Camargo on staff, the Dominican Republic National Team qualified for the Olympic games for the first time in 16 years.

He helped coach the Dominican Republic to the FIVB Women's Volleyball World Championship, the FIVB/NORCECA Final Four Women's Volleyball Cup, and a first-place finish at the FIVB/NORCECA World Championship Qualifiers. Camargo also helped the team place second at the FIVB Junior Pan American Cup in 2011.

Camargo worked closely with Brenda Castillo, who was awarded Best Libero at the 2012 Summer Olympics after leading the Dominican Republic to a fifth-place finish in London.

Prior to his time with the Dominican Republic National Team, Camargo coached in his home country of Brazil, including a stint in 2009 as the head coach at the University of Sao Paulo.

He received his Bachelor's degree in exercise science with an emphasis in physical education in 2008 from University Paulista in Sao Paulo, Brazil, where he also played competitively.

Match days at Hearnese have an excitement that is unmatched. From pre-match Kids Carnivals, to Marching Mizzou and post-match autograph sessions, an electric atmosphere exists each match at the Hearnese Center.

In 16 of the past 20 seasons, Mizzou has finished in the Top 25 national attendance rankings. In fact, the Tigers have 13, Top 20 national attendance numbers and five, Top 10 totals since the 2000 campaign.

Since 2000, Mizzou ranks Top 5 nationally with 17, Top 25 average attendance rankings. Among Power Five conference programs, only five schools nationally rate higher than the Tigers. Across that same time frame, Mizzou also places Top 5 nationally with 16, Top 25 total attendance rankings, trailing only six Power Five schools.

The program's most highly attended season came in 2013, as the team went 34-0 and claimed Mizzou's first-ever SEC championship. On Nov. 22, 2013 - the SEC clinching match - the Tigers took home the crown in front of a school-record 7,879 fans, the first of two 7,000+ crowds that magical season.

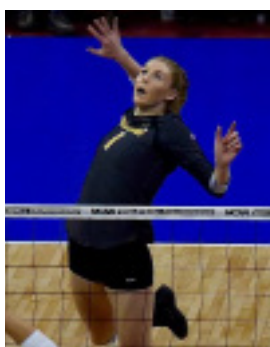

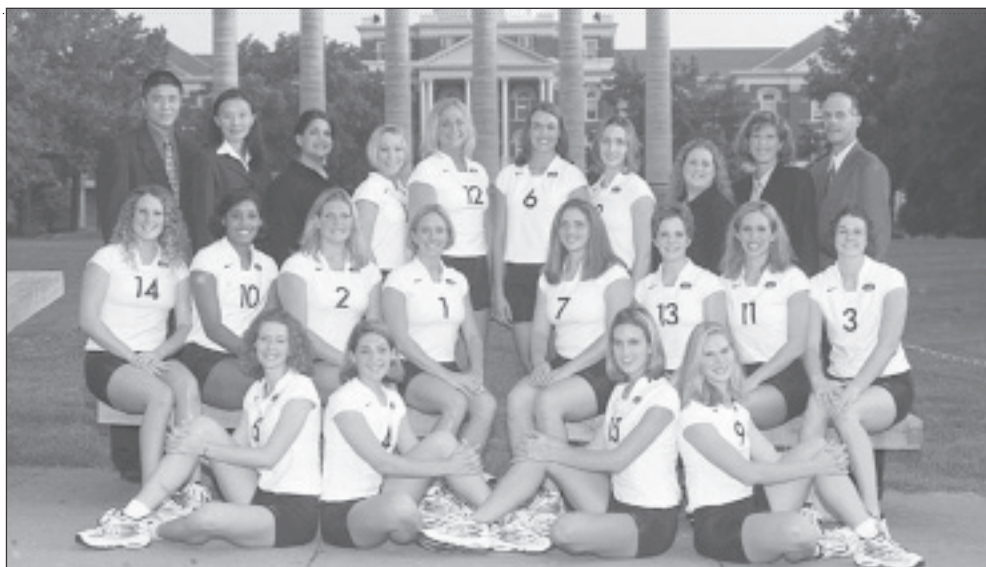

The 2000 season was the first year in the turnaround of the Missouri Volleyball program. The Tigers posted a 24-7 overall record and a 14-6 Big 12 Conference mark. MU traveled to Provo, Utah, for its first-ever NCAA Tournament.

After being picked to finish ninth in the conference, Mizzou managed a second-place showing in the Big 12 and Susan Kreklow was named the league's Coach of the Year.

Lisa Morris was named to the All-Big 12 first team and two Tigers - Christi Myers and Heather Gerber - were honorable mention selections. Those awards were the first conference recognition for MU since the Big 8 became the Big 12.

MU recorded its first-ever wins over Colorado, Texas and Texas Tech in 2000 and had season sweeps over Baylor, Texas, Kansas, Iowa State and Oklahoma.

The Tigers' 10-0 start to the season was their best since 1983.

The 24 wins were the sixth-most wins in school history and included a 13-1 home-court record.

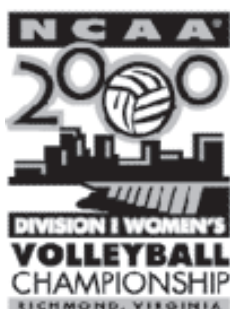

The 2002 season was a year of firsts for the Mizzou Volleyball program as the Tigers recorded their first-ever NCAA Tournament win with a 3-1 victory over Northwestern.

Missouri finished the season with a 26-8 record, the fourth-most wins in school history and the third-straight year with at least 20 wins. MU finished third in the Big 12 Conference with a 14-6 record.

Christi Myers added another first for MU by becoming the first All-American in school history. Myers and Lindsey Hunter were also selected to the All-Central Region team, the first selections in program history.

Hunter broke the school record for assists in a season with 1,690 and averaged 14.08 assists per set, which led the Big 12 Conference and ranked second in the nation.

Myers, Hunter, Mary Lauren Smith and Shen Danru were named to the All-Big 12 Conference teams and Smith earned national recognition by being named AVCA/Sports Imports National Player of the Week on Sept. 30.

As a team, MU set school records for most kills (2,005) and most assists (1,889) in a season. Missouri also finished a program-best 16th in the nation in average attendance.

With the Tigers making their fifth-consecutive NCAA Tournament, Missouri in that time span went from the depths of the nation to a team that is part of the cream-of-the-crop. Missouri was tabbed as host of the first-and second-rounds of the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. The team knocked-off first-round opponent Arkansas before falling to Louisville in second-round action.

The team opened the season by stunning No. 23 Wisconsin on its home floor. The Badgers found their way to the Elite Eight later in the season. The Tigers went on to defeat four Top-25 teams during the season.

For the fourth time in five years, the Tigers won 20 matches overall, including a 14-6 Big 12 season-record (tying a school-record for conference wins) that placed them tied for third with Texas A&M.

Setter Lindsey Hunter led the Big 12 for the third-straight season in assists and was a second-team AVCA All-American. Lisa Boyd led the conference in hitting percentage with a school-record .384. In her first season as a Tiger, Tatum Ailes crushed the school-record in digs per set (4.19). Jessica Vander Kooi earned her first spot on the AVCA All-Central Region team.

A school-record seven Tigers earned Academic All-Big 12 honors.

The quest for the Tigers' sixth-straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament was the most productive and successful in the program's history to date. This Mizzou squad reached the NCAA Regional Final, or Round of Eight, after defeating Hawaii in the Regional Semifinal at Penn State. The Tigers reached the regional rounds for the first time in school history and posted the then-winningest record in school history with a 25-5 mark.

The team set a school-record with 16 Big 12 Conference wins, placing third in a tight race behind Nebraska and Texas.

Mizzou went 7-4 against teams in the Top 25, knocking off four squads in the Top 10 alone. With that type of play, people around the country and in Columbia started to notice more than before. Mizzou surged into the national Top 10 for the first time in school history, peaking at No. 7. Missouri also placed sixth in the national attendance average, landing nearly 2,600 fans per home match. On Oct 5, Mizzou hosted 7,298 fans in a match against No. 1 Nebraska.

Lindsey Hunter completed her senior campaign with more than 6,000 career assists, becoming only the 15th person in NCAA history to accomplish such a feat. She earned AVCA All-America honors for the second-consecutive year, becoming the first Tiger to ever be listed as a first-team member. In addition, Jessica Vander Kooi and Nicole Wilson earned honorable mention All-America honors.

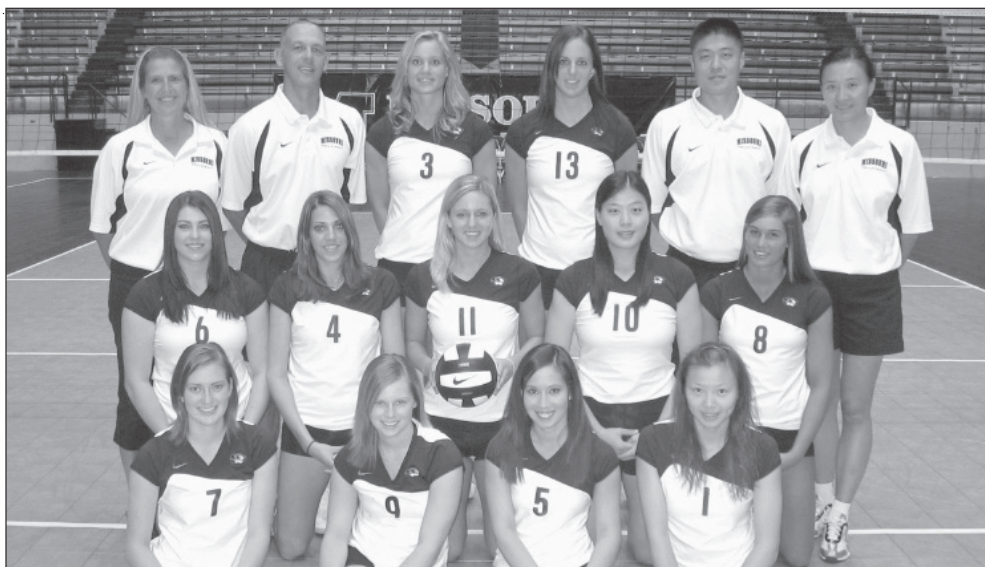

Mizzou Volleyball made its seventh-consecutive NCAA Tournament in 2006, again advancing to the second round for the third-straight year.

The season included many highs and lows, but proved to be an excellent learning experience for all involved. Redshirt freshman Lei Wang completed her first year at the setter position, garnering a good track record considering the difficulty of having to follow two-time All-American Lindsey Hunter.

The Tigers had a stretch of seven-consecutive wins in the first half of the conference season which included a dominate 30-23, 30-23, 30-19, sweep of then-No. 5 Texas.

The trip to Palo Alto, Calif., for the first rounds of the NCAA Tournament proved treacherous with ice and snow delaying Mizzou's departure from St. Louis and the tournament by a day. The Tigers regrouped to sweep Santa Clara in the first round before facing NCAA runner-up Stanford in round two. The Tigers nearly pulled off a five-set thriller that included a massive set-four comeback.

Seniors Nicole Wilson and Jessica Vander Kooi were named to AVCA's honorable mention All-America list.

Missouri reached NCAA Tournament play for the eighth-straight time in 2007 and became one of only 16 teams nationally to have done so each year since 2000.

The Tigers faced sixth-seeded and sixth-ranked Washington in the NCAA Tournament's first round in Seattle and came within four points of pulling the major upset, almost becoming the first unseeded team in tournament history to knock off a seeded team in the first round.

Mizzou juggled lineups and positions throughout the year because of an injury to sophomore outside hitter Julianna Klein, who was Mizzou's leading scorer at the time. The Tigers experimented with a 6-2 offense which had Lei Wang and transfer Luiza Jarocka share time in the setter role with Wang becoming an outside hitter when rotated to the front row.

After starting Big 12 play 0-4, Mizzou rebounded by winning its next five matches and nine of its next 13, losing to only one unranked team. For the balance of the season, MU pulled to a final conference record of 10-10 tying for sixth with Texas A&M in the standings.

The Tigers forced then-No. 2 Nebraska to a five-set showdown in Lincoln on Oct 31, handing the Huskers their first set-loss in Big 12 play at home since 2005.

After a two-year absence, the 2010 Mizzou volleyball team made its second-deepest run into the NCAA Tournament ever, advancing all the way to the Regional Semifinal before being topped by nationally-seeded Duke at the Penn State Regional. Mizzou won 11 of its final 15 matches to secure its spot in the Sweet 16. Mizzou became one of just 22 teams nationally to qualify for the tournament in nine of the last 11 seasons.

The NCAA Tournament appearance was the Tigers' ninth in 11 seasons under the direction of Wayne and Susan Kreklow and the 22 wins by the Tigers were their most since 2005. Also, Paola Ampudia became the program's fifth All-American and three Tigers - Ampudia, Molly Kreklow and Caitlyn Vann - were named to AVCA All-Central Region teams. Ampudia was a first-team honoree while both Kreklow and Vann were honorable mention selections. Kreklow was also the AVCA Central Region Freshman of the Year.

Mizzou also took home a league-best 14 Big 12 Weekly honors in 2010, highlighted by six Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week awards for Vann and five Big 12 Newcomer of the Week awards for Kreklow.

Something to Prove. That was the 2013 team mantra and did the Tigers ever live up to that. With the goal of winning an SEC championship, that Tigers did all that and more, resetting school records for wins, conference wins, consecutive wins, sweeps and hitting all while leading the nation in hitting, kills, assists and win percentage. That led to the program's first-ever conference championship and the school's first-ever SEC title in any sport.

Mizzou finished the regular season with a perfect 34-0 record, becoming the first-ever SEC team to run the table in the regular season. The Tigers also earned the No. 4 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament, hosting the first-and-second rounds at the Hearnes Center.

In all, Mizzou saw four players earn All-America honors - Molly Kreklow, Lisa Henning (first team) and Carly Kan, Whitney Little (honorable mention). Wayne Kreklow earned SEC Coach of the Year and AVCA Southeast Region Coach of the Year honors while Molly Kreklow was dubbed SEC Player of the Year. Carly Kan earned SEC Freshman of the Year honors and AVCA Southeast Region Freshman of the Year.

After a rare subpar season in 2014, head coach Wayne Kreklow rallied the troops in style and returned the Tigers to the NCAA Tournament. Mizzou finished its 2015 campaign with an outstanding 27-6 record, marking the fifth-most wins in a single-season in program history.

The Tigers earned their 12th all-time NCAA Tournament bid in 2015. With their first-round victory over Missouri State (Dec. 3), the Tigers advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the seventh time in school history (all coming under the Kreklows).

Mizzou's final .818 winning percentage (27-6) was the third-highest single-season winning percentage in school history, trailing only the 2013 (.972) and 2005 (.833) Mizzou Volleyball squads.

Mizzou finished with an incredible 358.5 total blocks in 2015, marking the most total blocks in a single-season in program history. Additionally, the Tigers' 495 block assists were the most in a single-season in program history.

The Tigers' .259 season hitting percentage was the eighth-highest team hitting percentage in a single season in Tiger history. Carly Kan, Kira Larson and Alyssa Munlyn were each named to the 2015 All-SEC team for their outstanding seasons. Munlyn was also named to the 2015 SEC All-Freshman team and was tabbed the 2015 SEC Freshman of the Year.

Kan surpassed 1,000 career kills, digs and points this season, becoming just the fifth Tiger in program history to accomplish the feat. Kan's 491 kills in 2015 were the seventh-most in a single-season in Tiger history.

Munlyn tallied the most total blocks (149) in a single season and the most block assists (124) in a single season.

For the second time in four years (joining the Tigers' first-ever SEC crown in 2013), Mizzou Volleyball claimed top honors in the Southeastern Conference with a stellar 16-2 record in league play.

The Tigers earned the No. 15 national seed in the big dance and hosted Northern Illinois and Purdue in their opening two rounds.

After a sweep over the Huskies in round one, Mizzou sought redemption against Purdue in the second round, as the Boilermakers ended the Tigers' magical 2013 campaign in the very same spot of NCAA Tournament play three years ago.

Mizzou came out firing against Purdue inside a loud Hearnese Center, dominating in its three-set triumph. The Tigers' victory secured the program's third all-time trip to the Sweet 16 and first visit since 2010.

Although Mizzou eventually fell to No. 2 national seed Minnesota in Sweet 16 play, the 2016 Tigers will go down as one of the top teams in program history. For the second-consecutive season, Mizzou finished with an exact 27-6 overall record, as the senior class of Alexa Ethridge, Carly Kan, Emily Thater and Julia Towler exited the program as the winningest class in program history (105 victories).

Individual accolades were aplenty this year, as three Tigers were named AVCA All-Americans (Melanie Crow, Alyssa Munlyn and Kan), four Tigers earned AVCA Southeast All-Region honors (Crow, Munlyn, Kan and Kira Larson) and three Tigers were represented on the All-SEC squad (Crow, Kan and Munlyn).

For the second time in his storied career in Mizzou black and gold, head coach Wayne Kreklow was tabbed the SEC Coach of the Year and AVCA Southeast Region Coach of the Year.

For the first time in program history, Mizzou Volleyball tallied back-to-back NCAA Sweet 16 appearances and a Top 20 finish in the AVCA Coaches Poll.

Overall, the Tigers finished with another impressive mark in SEC play, compiling a 13-5 record and finishing among top three in the standings for the fourth time in the past five seasons.

With momentum on its side, Mizzou traveled to Wichita, Kansas, for first and second-round action of the 2017 NCAA Tournament. The underdog Tigers left Charles Koch Arena with back to back upsets over No. 19 Kansas and No. 16 Wichita State en route to their fourth all-time NCAA Sweet 16 trip. Mizzou's victory over the Shockers was even more special for Wayne Kreklow, as he tallied career victory No. 600 in his 18th year of collegiate coaching.

While the Tigers' season came to an end the following week at No. 1 Penn State, the team's memorable campaign will go down as one of the program's all-time greats. Coach Kreklow's 2017 Mizzou squad reset all-time single-season highs in total blocks (377.5) and block assists (547), while also placing top 10 in single-season blocks per set (second - 2.88), solo blocks (seventh - 104), points (T-9th - 2,243.5) and assists (10th - 1,602).

Individual accolades were led by junior MB Alyssa Munlyn, who became the program's third all-time recipient of three AVCA All-America honors. Munlyn and redshirt senior RS Kira Larson garnered AVCA Southeast All-Region honors, while the same duo and freshmen Kayla Caffey and Leketor Member-Meneh were recognized with All-SEC awards following their standout 2017 campaigns.

For the fourth-consecutive year, Mizzou Volleyball advanced to the NCAA Tournament following a trip to the second round in Lincoln, Nebraska. It was the Tigers' fourth-straight season with a visit to at least the second round and fifth occurrence in the past six years (2013, '15-18).

The 2018 campaign was the end of MB Alyssa Munlyn's historic career in Columbia, as she became Mizzou's first-ever four-time AVCA All-American. The Suwanee, Georgia, native left Mid-Missouri as the program's all-time leader in total blocks (634), block assists (516), blocks per set (1.27) and hitting percentage (.388).

OH Kylie Deberg made an instant impact for Mizzou after transferring from Illinois prior to the season. The Hudson, Iowa, native finished with 425 kills, 59 aces and 522.0 points, leading to AVCA All-America honors following the season.

In the offseason and weeks away from the start of 2019 official practice, Mizzou Volleyball legends Wayne Kreklow and Susan Kreklow announced their retirement following a historic 19-year career at the helm of the Tigers.

The duo turned Mizzou into a national powerhouse in women's volleyball, recording 413 wins and 15 trips to the NCAA Tournament over a nearly two-decade run. The Tigers' 2013 SEC championship was Mizzou Athletics' first-ever title after joining its new conference a season before. Three years later, Mizzou once again took top honors in the SEC, en route to its first of two consecutive trips to the Sweet 16.

The Kreklows tallied 12, 20-plus win campaigns over their 19-year run. In comparison, the program only had eight, 20-plus victory seasons in the 26 years prior to their tenure. Wayne and Susan oversaw 22 total AVCA All-Americans, 32 AVCA All-Region honorees and 51 All-Conference selections.

For the fifth-consecutive year and sixth time in seven years, Mizzou Volleyball earned a spot in the NCAA Tournament. With their dominant sweep over Northern Iowa in the first round, the Tigers advanced to at least the second round of the NCAA Tournament in each of their last six trips.

With a 22-8 final record, Mizzou finished its season with 20-plus wins for the 13th time in program history. The Tigers have produced 20-plus wins in five consecutive seasons dating back to 2015, marking the longest-such streak in program history.

Mizzou concluded its 2019 campaign with a fantastic .302 team hitting percentage, marking only the second time in program history that a Tiger squad has collectively hit over .300 (.356 in 2013 season).

Junior OH Kylie Deberg wrapped up one of the top individual seasons in Tiger history, as she finished with 524 kills, 49 aces and 612.5 points. Her 524 kills and 4.72 kills per set were the most in Mizzou single-season history. Additionally, Deberg became only the second Tiger ever with 600-plus points in a season, joining Yvette Buhlig's 626.0 points in 1992.

The Hudson, Iowa, native's 5.52 points per set ranked second in Mizzou single-season history, while her 49 aces ranked tied for seventh. Shortly after the season, Deberg garnered AVCA Second Team All-American honors. She became only the sixth all-time Tiger to garner multiple All-American awards.

Following 10 digs in the Tigers' season finale, redshirt senior L Riley Sents concluded her five-year Mizzou career with 1,310 digs. That ranked sixth all-time individually in program history.

In a pandemic altered season, Mizzou Volleyball earned its sixth-straight NCAA Tournament berth in 2020. The Tigers also made the tournament field, which was narrowed to 48 teams due to the pandemic, for the seventh time in the last eight seasons.

Mizzou finished the season at 16-8 overall and a 15-7 mark in SEC play. The regular season consisted on SEC matches only before all NCAA matches were contested in Omaha, Neb.

The Tigers recorded 13 or more SEC wins for the sixth-consecutive season. Mizzou also advanced to the second round on the NCAA Tournament for a seventh-straight appearance.

Senior Kylie Deberg claimed her third All-America honor as a Tiger, garnering second team recognition. Deberg's recognition made it an 11th-straight season a Mizzou player earned All-America status. Deberg set the school record with 4.76 kills per set and finished her career with a school-record 4.31 kills per set.

Fellow senior Andrea Fuentes capped her stellar Mizzou career by becoming just the seventh Tiger to eclipse 3,000 assists. The setter dished out 3,088 helpers over her four years in Columbia.
