- Mizzou swept No. 4 Tennessee last March to open its conference home slate and has claimed three of its last five home-opening SEC series since 2018.
- The Tigers have taken their last two home series with Kentucky, winning two of three contests against the Wildcats in both 2022 and 2019.

Lunceford worked 3.2 innings, allowing three earned runs while fanning four in a no-decision at Cal Poly (Feb. 17) ... scattered three runs on five hits over 4.0 innings at UCSD (Feb. 24) ... earned his first win of 2024 with 5.0 shutout innings vs. Purdue Fort Wayne (March 10) ... made an immediate impact in his rookie campaign with the Tigers, logging three wins and 68 strikeouts in 54.0 innings spanning 13 appearances (11 starts) ... led all SEC freshman hurlers in innings and strikeouts ... ranked 56th nationally in strikeouts per 9.0 IP with a season mark of 11.33, which was good for ninth overall in the SEC and fifth nationally among all Division I freshman hurlers.

MIZZOU MOMENT

March 22, 1996...Mizzou opened its 1996 Big Eight Conference home slate with an 11-6 victory over Nebraska at Simmons Field, highlighting a nine-game win streak that would ultimately catapult the Tigers to a regular-season conference crown.

The Tigers, who registered a 39-win campaign en route to an NCAA Midwest Regional berth, pounded out 13 hits in the series opener against the Huskers. On the mound, First-Team All-Big Eight selection **Jeremy Callier** improved to 4-1 on the season, helping pave the way to a series sweep of the Huskers.

Following the home sweep of Nebraska, Mizzou would go on to take four of its next five games against Kansas, cruising to a 20-8 conference season that completed a 'worst-to-first' finish in its final season of Big Eight play. In just his second year at the helm, **Tim Jamieson** was honored as Big Eight Coach of the Year. Additionally, **Aaron Jaworowski** earned All-America honors after leading the nation in RBIs per game (1.74).

FOLLOW THE ACTION

- This weekend's games will be broadcast live via the **SEC Network** (Sunday) and **SEC Network+** (Friday/Saturday).
- Every Missouri baseball game in 2024 will be produced by the **Tiger Radio Network** and streamed live via the **Varsity Network** app, with **Tex Little** and **Matt Michaels** once again handling broadcast duties.
- Fans can follow the Tigers online by visiting **MUTigers.com**, or through social media via X (**@MizzouBaseball**), Instagram (**@Missouri_Baseball**) and Facebook (**MizzouBaseball**).

SERIES HISTORY

- Mizzou and Kentucky will meet for the 31st time to open the series Friday.
- The Wildcats hold an 18-13 advantage over the Tigers, despite Mizzou winning two of the three meetings in Columbia the last time UK paid Taylor Stadium a visit in 2022.
- Mizzou holds an 8-7 edge over the Wildcats in Columbia.
- Last year, the Wildcats swept the Tigers in a three-game set in Lexington (March 31-April 2), outscoring Mizzou by a 25-3 margin in the series.
- In the two clubs' 2022 series, the Tigers won the final two games, totaling 19 runs over the two victories.

SCOUTING MISSOURI

- Missouri posted a 30-24 regular-season finish last spring, including a 10-20 SEC mark.
- Kerrick Jackson** was named the 15th head coach in Mizzou history in June, returning to Columbia to lead a program for which he served as an assistant coach from 2011-15 under Mizzou Hall of Fame head coach (and current pitching coach) **Tim Jamieson**.
- The Tigers return three regular starters from last season, led by senior INF **Trevor Austin**, who batted .311 with eight homers and 10 steals to help bolster the MU offense.
- Senior INF **Matt Garcia** turned in a solid debut season with the Tigers, providing clutch hitting and lock-down defense on the MU infield.
- Additionally, junior INF **Justin Colon** returns for Mizzou and earning significant playing time at shortstop over each of his first two seasons in Columbia.
- MU should also receive a lift from sophomore INF **Jackson Lovich** and junior OF **Juju Stevens**, who each made key contributions in limited duty in 2023.
- Several newcomers could also make early contributions, including junior INF **Danny Corona**, who helped Wake Forest to a 2023 College World Series berth, C **Jedier Hernandez**, a standout behind the plate for Seton Hall the last two seasons, and sophomore OF **Jeric Curtis**, a Texas Tech transfer who brings significant speed to the Tiger outfield and batting order.
- On the mound, sophomore RHP **Logan Lunceford** is back to help anchor Mizzou's weekend rotation after posting 68 strikeouts to lead all SEC freshman hurlers last spring.
- Junior LHP **Javyn Pimental** also contributed mightily to the Tigers' mound efforts in 2023, making eight starts for the Tigers.
- Mizzou should also benefit from the potential return of a pair of veterans who missed significant time last spring; LHP **Ian Lohse** and RHP **Carter Rustad** missed significant portions of 2023 due to injury following promising starts to the campaign.

MIZZOU BY THE NUMBERS

- Missouri is coming off a 30-win campaign last spring, which marked the 20th time the Tigers reached the 30-win plateau in the last 30 seasons, as well as the 35th time overall.
- 1B **Jackson Lovich** leads the Tigers with 20 RBIs and a .342 batting mark. The sophomore saw his career-best 13-game hit streak come to an end last Saturday at No. 1 Arkansas.
- Lovich reached base safely via a hit or walk in the Tigers' first 18 contests of the season before that streak ended last Saturday as well.
- During the course of his 13-game hit streak, Lovich batted .388 (19-for-49).
- LHP **Daniel Wissler** has allowed two runs of fewer in all three of his starts this season, including March 12 at KU, allowing two earned runs and three hits over his 4.0 frames.
- INF **Matt Garcia** has a pair of multi-hit games since returning from injury March 2.
- OF **Tucker Moore** has hits in 10 of his last 14 games and has reached safely in 15 of his 19 games as a Tiger.
- LHP **Javyn Pimental** has fanned at least five batters in three of his four outings to date, including a career-best nine punchouts vs. Purdue Fort Wayne (March 9).
- Pimental was lights-out vs. No. 1 Arkansas last Saturday, holding the Hogs hitless through four innings and striking out four in 5.0 shutout innings.
- INF **Justin Colon** registered his first four-hit game as a Tiger vs. Northern Kentucky (March 3). The junior also posted career bests for runs scored (4) and RBIs (5) vs. NKU.
- INF **Trevor Austin** leads the club with seven home runs after binging on Purdue Fort Wayne pitching with four round-trippers in four games, March 8-10.
- Austin has enjoyed a solid month of March, hitting .333 (14-for-37) with four homers and 12 RBIs. He has also reached base safely in 12 consecutive March contests.
- OF **Jackson Beaman** has been lethal at the plate over the same stretch as well, batting .348 (8-for-23) with three homers, 13 RBIs and a club-leading .556 on-base percentage.
- LHP **Ryan Magdic** has proven to be a valuable weapon out of the bullpen, logging three scoreless two-inning outings to date. The graduate transfer has struck out at least three hitters in four of his six appearances.
- RHP **Charlie Miller** has been equally as dominant from the right side, recording six scoreless appearances and four hitless outings in nine total games.
- C **Jedier Hernandez** has gunned down three would-be base-stealers on the season, while hitting a team-best .429 in the month of March.
- RHP **Ben Pedersen** logged three consecutive scoreless relief outings as part of his return from a two-year absence due to injuries. The 6-foot-6 Minnesota native notched his first collegiate save in MU's 10-inning victory over Kansas on March 12.
- OF/DH **Thomas Curry** enjoyed a debut to remember in Missouri's season-opening series at Cal Poly (Feb. 16-17), as the freshman paced all Mizzou hitters with his .444 average, while homering and driving in four runs.
- RHP **Carter Rustad** notched career victory No. 15 March 9 with 6.0 strong innings in MU's win over PFW.
- RHP **Jacob Peaden** ranks third in the SEC in saves (3) and fourth in games finished (6).
- The Tigers rank seventh in the conference in stolen bases (26), led by OF **Jeric Curtis'** six steals.
- Curtis was the Tigers' top hitter last week, going 3-for-9 with hits in each of his three games.

SCOUTING KENTUCKY

- Under eighth-year head coach **Nick Mingione**, the Wildcats enter the weekend with an 18-3 overall mark, as well as a 3-0 start to SEC play after sweeping Georgia at home to open conference play last weekend.
- Checking in at No. 25 in this week's NCBWA and coaches polls, the Wildcats bring one of the top pitching staffs in the SEC into the series, led by the duo of RHP **Mason Moore** (4-0, 2.28 ERA) and LHP **Dom Niman** (4-1, 3.51 ERA).
- UK pitching ranks fifth in the SEC with its 3.66 team ERA, while Moore and Niman share the top spot on the conference's leaderboard for victories. The Wildcats have allowed the third-fewest hits (137) and the third-lowest batting average (.208) among all SEC staffs.
- At the plate, UK has relied heavily on the trio of **Nick Lopez** (.426 BA), **Emilien Pitre** (.378) and **Ryan Walders Schmidt** (.486 OBP) to shoulder the offensive load.
- Lopez ranks third in the SEC in hitting and second in doubles (9), while Pitre paces the club in RBIs (24) and steals (11).
- As a team, the Wildcats have stolen 49 bases (in 56 attempts) to rank second in the SEC.

PRIMETIME PIMENTAL

- Junior LHP **Javyn Pimental** has been one of the Tigers' key linchpins on the mound through the first five weeks of the season, bringing a team-leading 2.04 ERA into the weekend.
- Last Saturday, Pimental held No. 1 Arkansas hitless through four innings and posted 5.0 scoreless frames overall before yielding to his bullpen.
- The Hawaii native has fanned 21 batters in 17.2 innings spanning four total appearances.
- In his last three appearances (two starts), Pimental has surrendered just one earned run while striking out 16 batters over 14.0 innings, good for an ERA of 0.64.
- Over the same stretch dating back to March 1, the lefty has limited the opposition to a .170 batting average.

MIZZOU MILESTONES

- Several Tigers have reached or are approaching significant career milestones this season.
- INF **Danny Corona** recorded the 100th hit of his collegiate career in Tuesday's contest vs. Kansas at Kauffman Stadium.
- INF **Trevor Austin** and INF **Matt Garcia** share the clubs' top spot on its active leaderboard for career hits, each entering Friday's game with 130 hits.
- Austin ranks fourth all-time at Mizzou in HBP (37) to go along with his 23 career homers, which is nine shy of cracking the Tigers' all-time top 10 list.

DIGGING THE LONG BALL

- Mizzou's offense has picked up right where it left off last spring, clubbing 26 home runs through its first 21 contests.
- Eleven different Tigers have homered in the first 21 games, continuing a recent trend that was evident in 2023, when 14 different Tigers hit at least one homer.
- The Tigers are 7-7 when hitting at least one home run and 2-5 when they fail to go deep.
- 2B **Trevor Austin** and 1B **Jackson Lovich** have powered the early attack for MU. Austin clubbed three homers in four games at the Tony Gwynn Legacy series (Feb. 22-24), then pounded four balls out of the yard in MU's four-game series with PFW (March 8-10).
- Lovich blasted his sixth homer of the season Tuesday vs. Kansas at Kauffman Stadium.
- Austin has produced a pair of two-homer games, first in a 6-3 win over CSUB (Feb. 22), as well as the Tigers' 11-1 victory over PFW on March 9.
- Two Tigers — SS **Drew Culbertson** and OF **Isaiah Frost** — hit their first collegiate home runs as part of a three-homer barrage by the Tigers in the second inning vs. CSUB.
- In their last 34 games (since April 29, 2023), 19 different Tigers have combined to hit 59 homers.
- In their last 16 games at Taylor Stadium, the Tigers have gone deep 42 times.
- MU clubbed 79 homers in 2023, which represented the program's top total since the 1998 squad blasted a school-record 110 bombs.
- Mizzou reached the 75-home run plateau on just four previous occasions — 1998, 1988, 1986 and 1985.

HOME COOKIN'

- Mizzou has found the friendly confines of Taylor Stadium to its liking over a recent surge spanning the last seven home games of the 2023 campaign and its first nine home contests of the new season.
- Since May 2 of last year, the Tigers have hit .335 as a team while homering 42 times and averaging 11.0 runs.
- Over the same stretch, Mizzou has scored in double-digits nine times and registered at least 10 hits 10 times in going 10-6 at Taylor.
- 2B **Trevor Austin** has been the key linchpin in the Tigers' power surge at Taylor, clubbing seven of MU's 42 home runs over the 16-game span.

MAKING HAY IN MARCH

- Mizzou has historically enjoyed strong results in the month of March, particularly at home.
- The Tigers have gone a combined 206-73 at Taylor Stadium in the month of March since 2000, posting a .500 or better home record in 23 of those 24 seasons.
- Last spring, the Tigers won 10 of their 11 March home games.

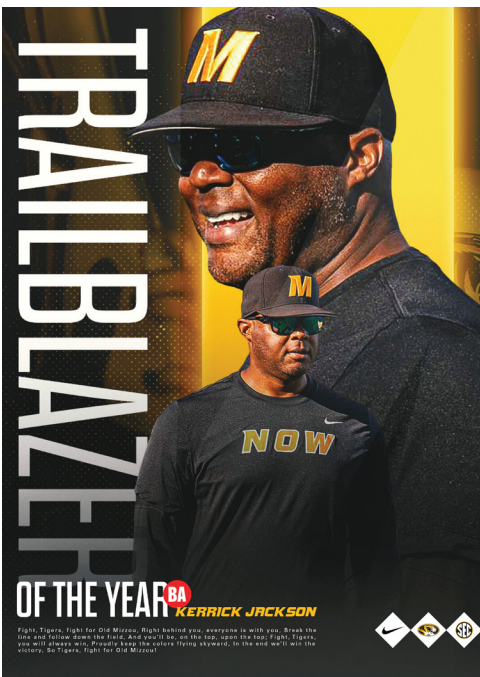

A HUB FOR MID-MISSOURI

- The University of Missouri generates \$5 billion in economic impact for the state of Missouri.
- The larger University of Missouri System, comprised of four universities, generated \$6.5 billion in economic impact on the Show Me State.
- The University of Missouri supports nearly 50,000 direct and indirect jobs, both full and part time, in the state.
- Mizzou Athletics generated \$319.1 million in economic impact over the last fiscal year.
- The Tigers support and sustain 3,591 jobs annually.
- Mizzou Athletics has generated \$15.9 million in state and local taxes.



TIGER TRAILBLAZER

- **Kerrick Jackson** has already enjoyed a personal moment of 'NOW' as the St. Louis product became the first Black head coach in SEC history with his appointment to the Tigers' top job.
- Jackson also picked up a significant honor from *Baseball America* in December, earning the publication's 2023 Trailblazer of the Year honor.
- Jackson has left his mark in just four seasons as a Division I head coach, including leading Southern to the 2019 Southwestern Athletic Conference crown and an NCAA Regional berth, as well as guiding Memphis to its first winning season in six years last spring.
- Additionally, Jackson has impacted the college baseball landscape through his work on the American Baseball Coaches Association's Diversity in Baseball Committee, a body for which he has served as chairman since its creation in 2018. The council works to improve diversity in the coaching ranks through a professional development program and an increased focus on youth baseball.

RUSTAD RISING

- RHP **Carter Rustad** has been one of the Tigers' most consistent hurlers, turning in four starts in which he has allowed three earned runs or less to start the year.
- Rustad has registered wins in three of his five starts, hiking his career win total to 15, including his nine victories at San Diego (2020-21).
- Against Purdue Fort Wayne (March 10), the Kansas City product eclipsed his Mizzou career high with eight strikeouts while allowing just one unearned run

on four hits over 6.0 innings. His strikeout total was just one shy of his overall career best (9 on March 7, 2020).

- The right-hander was lights-out in Mizzou's first win of the season, a 3-1 decision over Cal Poly (Feb. 16), permitting just one hit over 5.0 shutout innings
- Rustad's total of three wins is tied for 10th in the SEC, while his 15 career wins are tied for seventh among all active league pitchers.

LOVIN' LOVICH

- 1B **Jackson Lovich** saw his career-best 13-game hit come to an end March 16 at No. 1 Arkansas.
- The sophomore from Overland Park, Kan., batted .388 (19-for-49) with four of his five home runs on the season and 15 RBIs during his streak, which ran from February 24 through March 15.
- Lovich has slugged .671 for the season and reached base safely via a hit or walk in the Tigers' first 18 contests (also through March 15).
- He leads the Tigers in multi-hit (8) and multi-RBI (6) games and shares the top spot on the SEC leaderboard for triples (2).

WELCOME MATT

- INF **Matt Garcia** barely missed a beat in his two-week absence due to injury to start the 2024 season, logging a 2-for-3 afternoon in his first start of the year March 5 in Mizzou's win over Lindenwood.
- The Orlando, Fla., product reached base in three of his four trips to the plate, including back-to-back singles and a stolen base.
- Garcia started 37 games on the Tigers infield in his first season with Mizzou last spring and will once again provide a defensive anchor for MU after fielding at a .977 clip in 2023.

FRESH LOOK

- Mizzou has received contributions from up and down its roster, but the Tigers' talented crop of freshmen have been perhaps their most consistent performers.
- MU's four primary freshman position players — SS **Drew Culbertson**, OF **Thomas Curry**, OF **Tucker Moore** and OF **Kaden Peer** — each rank among the Tigers' top offensive contributors.
- Culbertson has logged three multi-hit outings to date, hitting .255 overall while starting 13 games.
- Moore has spent time in the leadoff spot in the MU batting order, recording four multi-hit performances and reaching base safely in 15 of his 19 games.
- Curry has hit three homers and notched four multi-RBI efforts, while drawing 11 walks.
- Peer has heated up as well, registering his first three-hit effort March 10 vs. Purdue Fort Wayne.
- Additionally, C **Mateo Serna** has contributed at the plate, driving in three runs in MU's March 5 victory over Lindenwood. The Florida native has hits in four of his last five games and has made nine starts behind the plate for Mizzou.

NON-CON DOMINATION

- Mizzou has claimed nine nonconference victories over the first four weeks of the season, continuing a string of recent dominance in nonconference play.
- MU logged a 20-3 mark against non-SEC foes last spring, after going 18-3 in nonconference in 2022.
- MU has an overall mark of 47-14 in non-SEC competition since the start of the 2022 season.
- Over the last decade, the Tigers' dominance has been equally as pronounced, with MU winning 100 more nonconference games than it has lost (174-74), good for a .702 winning percentage.

ROAD TO REDEMPTION

- RHP **Miles Garrett** is one of two MU hurlers returning from lengthy absences due to injuries. RHP **Ben Pedersen** also returned from a lengthy absence February 24 with his first mound appearance for the Tigers since May 15, 2021.
- Both Garrett and Pedersen missed all of the 2022 and

2023 seasons due to their injuries.

- Pedersen has been nearly untouchable so far in 2024, logging scoreless outings in three of his five outings. In two of his three appearances at Taylor Stadium, he worked hitless innings, then locked up his first save as a Tiger in last Tuesday's win over Kansas in Lawrence.

TARGET: TREVOR

- 2B **Trevor Austin** has made a habit of reaching base throughout his four-year career with the Tigers, particularly when it comes to serving as a target, logging 37 free bases due to hit by pitches.
- Austin, the SEC's active leader in HBPs, was hit by a pitch four times during Mizzou's initial home stand of the season, running his 2024 total to eight HBPs, which ranks fifth in the SEC.
- As a result, the Jefferson City native has climbed to fourth on Mizzou's career HBP chart, passing **Brock Bond** and **Dane Opel** on March 5 when he was hit by a pitch in the seventh inning of MU's 5-4 victory over Lindenwood.
- Austin is six HBPs away from matching **Jacob Priday's** career total of 43 in the No. 3 position.
- **John McKee** (2004-07) owns the Tigers' all-time mark of 70 HBPs, and **John Hay** (1989-93) ranks second with 51 HBPs.

TIGERS AT THE TURNSTILES

- Mizzou shattered its record for total home attendance last spring, drawing 37,133 fans over 23 dates to eclipse the previous program mark of 31,450 (2008).
- MU finished its 2023 home campaign with its 20th crowd of 1,000 or more fans — and its 17th in a row.
- Mizzou ran its streak of consecutive crowds of 1,000 or more to 21 in a row (until March 5).
- In its 23 home dates at Taylor Stadium, the Tigers drew five crowds of at least 2,000 fans, as well as an average of 1,614 spectators per date, both of which represent high-water marks for the program.
- Last season's attendance growth marked a 43-percent increase in average home attendance from the 2022 season, when MU drew 1,127 fans per home date (and 28,181 for the entire season).

SHOW-ME STATE TO THE SHOW

- Tiger great P **Max Scherzer** claimed his second World Series title with the Texas Rangers' first world championship in a five-game series with Arizona.
- Scherzer became the fourth Tiger to earn multiple World Series championships, adding to his 2019 title with Washington.
- Another former Mizzou stalwart, Rangers special assistant to the G.M. **Ian Kinsler** (2003), also claimed his second World Series ring with the victory, following his first title as an active player with Boston in 2018.
- In all, eight Mizzou baseball alums have won World Series titles as players: in addition to Kinsler (2018) and Scherzer (2019 and 2023), **Homer Summa** (1929 and 1930), **Darold Knowles** (1973 and 1974), **Mike Shannon** (1964 and 1967), **Glenn Wright** (1925), **Charlie James** (1964) and **Tim Laudner** (1987) also claimed Fall Classics.

NOW THAT'S A RALLY

- Mizzou utilized a first-inning rally of historic proportions to log its first home victory of 2024 — a 28-10 rout of Northern Kentucky (March 2).
- The Tigers sent 17 batters to the plate in scoring 14 runs in the first inning, marking their biggest inning since a 17-run rally vs. Texas Tech on April 1, 2005.
- In that 25-0 win over Texas Tech, current Tiger assistant coach **Bryson LeBlanc** factored prominently in the Tigers' key rally, walking twice and scoring before grounding out in a second inning that saw 23 MU hitters come to the plate.

WELCOME WAGON

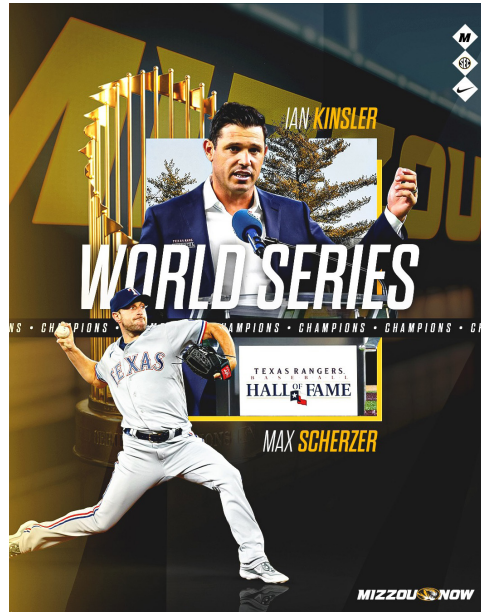
- Nineteen different players have made their Mizzou debuts over the first four weeks of the season.
- In the Tigers season opener at Cal Poly, seven newcomers found their names in the lineup: RHP **Bryce Mayer**, 3B **Danny Corona**, C **Jedier Hernandez**, DH **Thomas Curry**, CF **Jeric Curtis**, SS **Drew Culbertson** and LF **Tucker Moore**.
- On the mound, several new faces contributed to the Tigers' series win, with LHP **Ryan Magdic** and RHP **Jacob Peaden** combining for 4.0 hitless innings of relief in a 3-1 victory, while RHP **Charlie Miller** and C **Mateo Serna** also saw action in game three.
- The followin week, OF **Kaden Peer** made a pair of starts in the outfield, while RHP **Kaden Jacobi**, RHP **Victor Quinn** and RHP **Josh McDevitt** all made their first appearances for the Tigers in San Diego.
- On MU's recently completed home stand, four more newcomers have introduced themselves to the Mizzou faithful: RHP **Miles Garrett** made his debut as a Tiger vs. SEMO, before RHP **Xavier Lovett** and OF **RJ Jimerson** made their first appearances for vs. NKU (March 2) and RHP **Ben Smith** worked an inning in the series finale with Purdue Fort Wayne.

TIGERS IN THE MLB DRAFT

- Four 2023 Missouri baseball standouts continued the Tigers' tradition of professional talent production with their selections in the MLB Draft in July.
- P **Chandler Murphy** was taken by Tampa Bay in the 12th round (363rd overall), before 3B **Luke Mann** was picked by Oakland in the 14th round (406th overall) on the final day of the draft.
- The two selections doubled Mizzou's 2023 crop of draftees to a total of four, joining fourth-round selection P **Austin Troesser** (New York Mets) and P **Zach Franklin** (Chicago White Sox), who were picked on day two of the draft.

IN THE 'NOW'

- New Tiger bench boss **Kerrick Jackson** has undertaken the challenge of revitalizing Missouri's tradition-rich program, part of which has included a re-branding of sorts.
- Casual observers of any number of Mizzou's fall or preseason workouts will undoubtedly have taken note of a new and unique slogan around Taylor Stadium.



Jackson and his staff introduced the **#MizzouNOW** branding — an acronym for No Opportunity Wasted — providing his student-athletes an entirely new way of approaching the game and the way they go about working to achieve their common goal of returning Mizzou to national prominence.

- **#MizzouNOW** was developed with a focus on appreciating the present and working toward taking advantage the opportunities immediately in front of the Tigers.

COMING HOME

- Head coach **Kerrick Jackson** did not have to look far when adding the initial pieces of his Mizzou coaching staff. He selected former Tiger head coach **Tim Jamieson** for his pitching coach, completing a homecoming for the Mizzou Athletics Hall of Famer.
- Jamieson brings 28 years of coaching experience on the Missouri campus into his new role as the Tigers pitching coach.
- In 22 seasons as Mizzou's head baseball coach, Jamieson led the Tigers to 698 wins, trailing only **Gene McArtor** (733) on MU's coaching wins list.
- He coached eight All-Americans at Mizzou and saw 75 of his players drafted, including 19 Major Leaguers.
- Jamieson returns to his hometown of Columbia after serving as pitching coach under Jackson in his lone season at Memphis, where the duo helped lead the Tigers to their first winning season since 2017.
- Prior to his stop at UM, Jamieson spent three seasons (2020-22) as pitching coach at Southern Illinois, helping the Salukis compile a 96-42 record.
- Jamieson garnered 1996 Big 8 Coach of the Year and 2007 Big 12 Co-Coach of the Year honors, as his Missouri teams won 35 games or more nine times during his head coaching career.
- He led Mizzou to seven consecutive NCAA postseason appearances from 2003 to 2009, including the program's first Super Regional berth in 2006. He was also selected to lead USA Baseball's Collegiate National Team as head coach in 2011.
- Jamieson, a graduate of Columbia Rock Bridge High School, is married to a Mizzou graduate, the former Cindy Thornton.

SPEAKING OF HOMECOMINGS...

- Another new Mizzou assistant coach (and former Tiger) is making a return to his old stomping grounds. **Bryson LeBlanc** joined Jamieson on **Kerrick Jackson's** first MU staff after spending five seasons on the coaching staff at UC San Diego.
- LeBlanc, who was named one of D1Baseball.com's picks for its '100 Assistant Coaches Athletic Directors

Should Know' list this past fall, patrolled the MU outfield for Jamieson on the previously mentioned 2006 Regional-winning club.

- He helped guide UC San Diego through its transition to the NCAA Division I level, including a 34-18 campaign last spring that culminated in the program's first Big West Conference title.
- In all, 48 of LeBlanc's former players have been selected in the MLB Draft, including 14 who have been taken in the top 10 rounds. Six of those have advanced to the big leagues.

HALL WORTHY

- Even before his return as a member of the Tigers' new coaching staff, **Tim Jamieson** knew he'd be making a trip to Columbia in 2023 after his selection for induction to the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletics Hall of Fame in late May.
- Jamieson became the fourth former Tiger head baseball coach to be tabbed for Mizzou's highest athletic honor, joining **Don Faurot**, **John 'Hi' Simmons** and **Gene McArtor**.
- Jamieson took the Tigers to a Big Eight Conference championship in 1996, completing a worst-to-first turnaround — the first in Big Eight history — and in 2012 the Tigers won the Big 12 Conference Tournament title.
- Overall, he took nine teams to the NCAA Tournament, including seven straight appearances from 2003-09 and a Super Regional trip in 2006.

TIGERS ON THE TUBE

- Missouri is slated to appear in eight linear broadcasts on the ESPN family of networks over the course of the 2024 season.
- Sunday's series finale will mark the first Mizzou contest featured on the **SEC Network** this spring.
- Mizzou's SEC matchups, including the first two games of the series, and select non-conference games will stream on **SEC Network+**.

KERRICK JACKSON

FIRST YEAR • NEBRASKA '99

A veteran coach with experience at all levels of baseball, **Kerrick Jackson** was tabbed as Missouri's 15th head coach in June 2023.

Since that time, Jackson has undertaken the challenge of revitalizing the Tigers' tradition-rich program. These efforts have included hiring a diverse staff, recruiting a new-look roster and providing his pupils an entirely new way of approaching the game—and the way they go about working to achieve their common goal of returning Mizzou to national prominence.

While the work is well underway, Jackson will officially become the first Black Southeastern Conference head baseball coach to lead his team into action when the Tigers open their 2024 campaign in February. Furthermore, he will be just the fourth Black collegiate coach to guide a Power Five baseball program and the first to do so since the 2021 season.

In recognition of these efforts, *Baseball America* named Jackson its 2023 Trailblazer of the Year in December, capping an already historic year for the new Mizzou coach.

In addition to his success on the diamond as a collegiate coach, including leading Southern University to the 2019 Southwestern Athletic Conference crown and an NCAA Regional berth and guiding the University of Memphis to its first winning season in six years last spring, Jackson continues to serve as a relentless advocate for minorities in college baseball, especially in the coaching ranks. He helped form the American Baseball Coaches Association's Diversity in Baseball Committee and has served as its chairman since its creation in 2018. That body works to improve diversity in the coaching ranks through a professional development program and an increased focus on youth baseball.

Jackson returned to Columbia after having served as a Mizzou assistant from 2011-15. Known as a developer of players, a tireless recruiter, and a strong talent evaluator, Jackson is a well-respected leader in baseball circles, serving on the American Baseball Coaches Association Board of Directors and as chair of their Diversity in Baseball committee.

Prior to his season at Memphis, Jackson was the President of the MLB Draft League from 2020-22, a six-team summer baseball league sponsored by Major League Baseball and featuring a split-season amateur-professional format.

Jackson served as the head coach at Southern University from 2018-20, where he took a nine-win team in 2018 to 32 wins, a conference championship, and the NCAA Tournament the following season, earning SWAC and Louisiana Sports Writers Association Coach of the Year accolades. His 2018 Jaguar team boasted the athletic department's highest men's team GPA and received national recognition for its community service efforts.

Jackson worked for the Boras Corporation as a certified player agent for two years from 2016-17, where he identified prep and college players with the best chance to develop into Major League talent.

He served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Mizzou from 2011-15, working with the Tigers' hitters, outfielders, and infielders. Mizzou made back-to-back trips to the Big 12 Conference Tournament Championship in 2011-12, culminating with the program's first Big 12 title in 2012. The Tigers had multiple nationally-ranked recruiting classes, including 24th in 2012, 12th in 2014 and a consensus Top-30 class in 2015.

Before heading to Missouri, Jackson served as the Midwest Area Scouting Supervisor for the Washington Nationals from 2008-10, overseeing Missouri, Kansas, Arkansas, Iowa, Nebraska and the Dakotas.

His other collegiate coaching stops include assistant stints at St. Louis Community College-Meramec (2008), Nicholls State (2006-07), Jefferson (Mo.) College (2004-05), Coffeyville (Kan.) Community College (2003),



Emporia State (2002) and Fairfield (2001). Jackson also has extensive experience in the summer collegiate leagues, as he has coached in the Cape Cod League and New England Collegiate Baseball League.

Jackson spent two years at St. Louis Community College-Meramec as a student-athlete, where the team finished third at the JUCO World Series in 1995. Following that, he played at Bethune-Cookman University in 1996, leading the squad to its first-ever conference championship and regional appearance. Jackson concluded his playing career at Nebraska in 1997, graduating in 1999 with a bachelor's degree in sociology.

Jackson and his wife, Talia, have two sons, Zion and Lazarus.
