GAME NOTES

NO. 7 SEEDED SOFTBALL TO HOST 2024 NCAA COLUMBIA REGIONAL THIS WEEKEND

- The No. 7 seed University of Missouri softball team (43-15) will host the 2024 NCAA Columbia Regional this weekend at the Mizzou Softball Stadium.
- After making a run to the championship game of the 2024 SEC Tournament, the Tigers earned the No. 7 overall national seed and will welcome Washington, Indiana, and Omaha.
- Mizzou will open the Regional Friday against Omaha at 4:30 p.m., CT, after Indiana and Washington face off at 2 p.m., CT.
- This weekend's Regional will be broadcasted on ESPN+ with Chuckie Kempf and Monica Abbott on the call.
- Mizzou will host a Regional for the third time in four seasons as the Tigers last hosted in 2022. Overall, Missouri will compete in its 17th-straight NCAA Tournament (27 total regional appearances) this season.
- The Tigers will look to reach the Women's College World Series for the seventh time in program history. Mizzou's last appearance came in 2011 when the Tigers were No. 9 overall seed.
- Mizzou was ranked 10th in the USA Today/NFCA Coaches Poll and ninth in the ESPN.com/USA Softball Poll this week. Mizzou first appeared in the National Polls following week one on Feb. 13. The Tigers are also sixth in RPI and 11th for toughest schedule.
- Missouri ranked fourth in the NCAA in 2024 with an average attendance of 2,520. Mizzou has sent the single-game attendance record and single-weekend attendance record twice this season including most recently against Florida (9,565 weekend attendance, April 12-14, 3,607 single game, April 13).

OMAHA SERIES HISTORY

- Mizzou leads the all-time series with Omaha, 2-0.
- The Tigers last faced Omaha April 11, 2018, earning a 6-0 win.
- In the meeting prior, Mizzou overcame the Mavericks, 7-4, on April 19, 2017.
- Former Mizzou first baseman Emma Raabe (2019-22) is an assistant
- coach for Omaha. Raabe appeared in 167 games (138 starts) with Mizzou. She posted a career year with 11 doubles, nine home runs and 33 RBI while batting .269 with 28 walks for an OBP of .400 as a junior in 2021.

REST OF COLUMBIA REGIONAL SERIES HISTORY

- Washington leads the all-time series against Mizzou 8-6.
- Head coach Larissa Anderson 1-1 in her career against the Huskies.
- The two teams last faced off in 2022, with Mizzou run-ruling the No. 5 ranked Huskies, 10-0, at the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic in Cathedral City, California.
- Mizzou Hall of Famer Teresa Wilson coached Washington from 1993-2003 (532-198-1 (.728).
- Mizzou holds a 10-5 lead in the alltime series with Indiana.
- Missouri last faced the Hoosiers, March 18, 2001, a 4-2 Tigers win.

NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

- Mizzou will host a Regional for the third time in four seasons as the Tigers last hosted in 2022. It will mark the 13th Regional in Columbia for Missouri.
- Overall, Missouri will compete in its 17th-straight NCAA Tournament (27 total regional appearances) this season. The Tigers are 54-32 in Regionals.
- Mizzou went to the 2023 NCAA Norman Regional, going 1-2 with a win over California.
- Mizzou last hosted Regionals in 2022, going 2-2 in a field against Missouri State and Arizona.
- The Tigers last advanced through their home Regionals in 2021, going 3-0. That season the Tigers fell to James Madison in Super Regionals.
- The Tigers will look to reach the Women's College World Series for the seventh time in program history. Mizzou's last appearance came in 2011 when the Tigers were No. 9 overall seed.
- Head coach Larissa Anderson will appear in her fifth Regional at Mizzou (third time hosting at MU). She is 9-6 in Regionals with the Tigers. Overall, it will be Anderson's seventh career Regional.

<u>ALL-SEC TIGERS</u> ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

- Seniors Maddie Gallagher, Laurin Krings, and Jenna Laird were named to the 2024 SEC All-Tournament Team.
- For Laird and Krings, it marked their second career appearance on the All-Tournament Team as the duo also appeared on the list in 2022. The honor marked the first career postseason SEC (playing) honor for Gallagher.
- Laird has now earned eight SEC postseason honors (four-time All-SEC player) while it was the second career postseason SEC honor for Krings who was also named to the 2024 SEC All-Defensive Team.
- Laird led Mizzou at the 2024 SEC Tournament, batting .429 with four runs, two doubles, two stolen bases and a .571 slugging percentage.
- Gallagher chipped in three RBI with two runs, a double and a homer while slugging .583. She was also named to the 2024 SEC Community Service Team.
- Krings went 1-1 over three starts (12.2 innings), striking out three with a 1.66 ERA.

ALL-SEC SECOND TEAM

- Jenna Laird, Alex Honnold and Abby Hay were named to the All-SEC Second Team.
- Laird was named to her thirdstraight All-SEC Second Team (fourtime All-SEC player). The Tigers leadoff hitter from East Meadow, New York, hit .282 during the SEC season, with 22 hits, 14 runs, eight RBI, four doubles and five stolen bases.
- Honnold was selected to her second-straight All-SEC Second Team. She was second on Mizzou during conference play, hitting .288 with 21 hits, 13 runs, 11 RBI, five doubles and two homers. She also compiled a .438 slugging percentage (.376 on-base percentage) with six stolen bases.
- Hay, a freshman from Columbia, Missouri, was named to her first career All-SEC Team. She paced the Tigers in SEC play, batting .318 with 14 hits, nine RBI, six runs and three home runs. Hay also slugged .591 (.423 onbase percentage).

SEC ALL-DEFENSIVE TEAM

NOTES


- Pitcher Laurin Krings and right fielder Kayley Lenger nabbed spots on the SEC All-Defensive Team. It marked their first career SEC All-Defensive Teams.
- Krings, a senior pitcher from Loveland, Colorado, registered a 1.000 fielding percentage in SEC play (22 assists, three putouts, zero errors).
- Lenger, a sophomore right fielder from Liberty, Missouri, posted a fielding percentage of 1.000 during SEC play this season (45 putouts, zero errors).
- With the trio of All-SEC Second Team performers, Missouri's five selections are the most All-SEC selections (Second Team and All-Defensive) since eight in 2021 (also had three All-SEC selections and two SEC All-Defensive Team picks that season).

1500 PROGRAM WINS

- Mizzou is three wins away from 1,500 in program history (1497-815, 42 seasons).
- The Tigers will become the 15th program in NCAA history to reach 1.500 wins.
- Missouri will also become the second SEC school to reach 1,500 wins after Texas A&M (1,890 wins).

2024 SEC TOURNAMENT RECAP

- Mizzou went 3-1 at the 2024 SEC Tournament, advancing to the Championship Final.
- The Tigers opened their stay at Auburn, Alabama, with a 3-1 win over Ole Miss on Wednesday. Laurin Krings was efficient in the circle, allowing just one earned run on three hits to go with a walk on 79 pitches.
- Leadoff batter Jenna Laird paced the Tigers at the dish, going 2-for-3 with a run, a walk, and a stolen base against Ole Miss.
- Alex Honnold notched with a two-run double to right center before an RBI base hit from Abby Hay. The double marked Honnold's 21st of the season as she continues to improve on the Mizzou single-season record.
- Mizzou secured a spot in the 2024 SEC Tournament Semifinals Friday, edging fourth seeded No. 16/13 Arkansas. 3-1.
- Jenna Laird paced Mizzou at the plate with a 2-for-4 outing with two runs, a double and an RBI.
- Cierra Harrison pitched five innings for the win, allowing just one earned run on four hits with a pair of strikeouts. She improved to 14-3 in 2024.
- Harrison was relieved for Marissa McCann in the bottom of the sixth with two on and no outs. After letting up a single to load the bases, McCann retired the Razorbacks with an infield fly before consecutive strikeouts to deny the threat.
- Closer Taylor Pannell finished the job, picking up her NCAA-leading 14th save of the season. She is one save away from tying the NCAA single-season record.

Stefania Abruscato (April 16) Marissa McCann (April 2) Marissa McCann (March 26) Maddie Gallagher knocked a walkoff sacrifice fly in the eighth inning to propel the fifth seeded Tigers to the 2024 SEC Tournament Championship game, as Mizzou overcame eighth seeded No. 10/9 LSU, 2-1, in extra innings.

NOTES

- Gallagher was responsible for both of Mizzou's runs Friday, blasted a deep fly to right field to score Laird. Gallagher tallied her team-leading ninth multi-RBI game to help the Tigers walk-off LSU. She blasted her career-best third round tripper of the campaign (five career home runs).
- Taylor Pannell, the NCAA saves leader, closed out the final 1.1 innings for the victory. She improved to 3-1 in 2024 and picked up her second win in her last four appearances.
- Mizzou then fell to second seeded No. 8/7 Florida, 6-1, Saturday afternoon at Jane B. Moore Field in the 2024 SEC Tournament Championship game.
- Julia Crenshaw paced Mizzou Saturday, going 2-for-3 with a double.
- Mizzou made its third SEC Tournament Championship appearance in program history (2024, 2022, 2013) Saturday and second appearance in three seasons.
- Missouri is now 11-10 overall at the SEC Tournament (7-3 in the past three tournaments).

QUICK HITTERS

- The Tigers head into the SEC Tournament with a 43-15 record (13-11 SEC).
- Missouri has surpassed both its overall win (35) total and SEC win total (7) from 2023.
- Mizzou's current winning percentage (.741) currently stands as the program's best in the SEC era. The Tigers' previous best season winning percentage in their SEC era was in 2021 (42-17, .712).
- Overall, Mizzou is one win away from breaking into the top-10 in program history for single-season wins (44, 1988 and 2005). The .741 winning percentage in 2024 ranks 10th overall in the Mizzou record books.
- The Tigers 43 wins in 2024 are the most for head coach Larissa Anderson at Mizzou. Anderson has registered 40-plus wins twice, previously posting a 42-17 record in 2021.
- Missouri's 13 SEC wins in the 2024 campaign are the most since 15 in 2021.
- Mizzou was ranked 10th in the USA Today/NFCA Coaches Poll and ninth in the ESPN.com/USA Softball Poll this week. Mizzou first appeared in the National Polls following week one on Feb. 13.
- Jenna Laird (64 hits, 52 runs, 12 doubles, 18 stolen bases) paces Mizzou with a .350 batting average in the leadoff slot. Laird and Alex Honnold rank sixth in the SEC with 64 hits in 2024. Laird's 18 stolen bases ranks fifth in the SEC.
- Alex Honnold is second on Mizzou, hitting .348 with an SEC-leading, Mizzou-record 21 doubles (sixth in NCAA) in 2024. She also has notched 64 hits, 35 RBI, five homers, two triples for a .565 slugging percentage.
- Freshman Abby Hay is third on Mizzou with a .310 batting average (22 hits, three doubles, three homers, 15 RBI, .507 SLG%).

NOTES

- Jenna Laird paces Mizzou with 21 multi-hit games while Maddie Gallagher tops the team with nine multi-RBI games.
- Jenna Laird has appeared in 238 consecutive games (all starts) which is a Mizzou program record (Hatti Moore, 236 games, 2018-22).
- Alex Honnold's total career-doubles sits at 50, which is tied for fifth in Mizzou program history with Emily Crane (2013-16).
- Alex Honnold ranks second on the Tigers with 17 multi-hit games. She ranks sixth in the SEC for hits [64].
- Kayley Lenger, Abby Hay, and Julia Crenshaw have reached base in seven-straight games. Maddie Gallagher has reached base in five straight while Jenna Laird is on a four-game hitting streak.
- Laurin Krings has 53 career wins which ranks tenth in Mizzou program history for wins.
- Laurin Krings ranks in the top-10 in Mizzou program history for appearances (129, eighth), innings pitched (562.1, ninth), strikeouts (567, sixth) and wins (53, 10th).
- In 2024, Laurin Krings ranks 10th in the SEC with 146.0 innings pitched. She is also 11th with a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.11 and 13th for strikeouts (115).
- Freshman pitcher Marissa Mc-Cann ranks eighth in the SEC with a 1.84 ERA followed by Cierra Harrison (2.06, 13th). Harrison is also 10th in the league with three shutouts and 11th for wins (14).
- Kayley Lenger is first in the SEC with 19 HBP (fifth in the NCAA).
- Closer Taylor Pannell ranks first in both the SEC and in the nation with 14 saves in 2024. She is also the NCAA active leader in the category with 20. Pannell is one save away from matching the NCAA single season record of 15 (Taylor Bauman, FGCU, and Mallory Aldred, Canisius) after surpassing Kacey Marshall's Mizzou record (12 saves in 1994) and the SEC record (Kellie Wilkerson, MSU, 14, 2002).
- Kara Daly paces Mizzou with seven home runs in 2024. The junior third

baseman surpassed 100 career RBI (103) over the South Carolina series.

- Jenna Laird ranks in the top 10 in Mizzou program history for career batting average (.352, fifth), at bats (766, third), hits (270, fourth), doubles (48, sixth), runs (194, fourth) and stolen bases (82, sixth).
- The one-two punch of Laurin Krings and Cierra Harrison have combined for 27 wins in the circle with 13-8 and 14-3 records, respectively. They rank 11th and 14th, respectively in the SEC for wins. The duo has also gone the distance in the circle 12 times (eight and four complete games, respectively).
- Lilly Whitten (5-0, 1.18 ERA), Marissa McCann (8-3, two saves, 1.84 ERA) and Taylor Pannell (3-1, 14 saves, 0.72 ERA) have also picked up wins for Mizzou in 2024.
- Jenna Laird is six runs away from 200 in her career.
- Alex Honnold surpassed 200 career hits at Mizzou over the 2024 SEC Tournament.
- Head coach Larissa Anderson registered her 200th win at the helm of Mizzou (212-112) during the midweek at Drake (4/10). In her sixth season at Missouri, Anderson holds a career record of 342-185-1 over 10 career seasons.

2023 RECAP

- Mizzou made its 16th-straight NCAA Tournament appearance in 2023.
- The Tigers finished the 2023 season with a 35-26 mark, including a 7-17 in SEC play. With its 2023 record, Missouri has registered 35 wins in four of the last five seasons (2020 COVID-19 shortened season was the only time the Tigers didn't meet the threshold in that span).
- During the 2023 campaign, Missouri totaled 51 home runs, while logging 75 doubles to go with 310 runs as a team.
- On the dirt, Mizzou tallied a .978 fielding percentage. The clip ranks second in program history, after the Tigers' surpassed their previous .976 fielding percentage from 2022.

A new era in Mizzou Softball began in the Summer of 2018, as Larissa Anderson was named the 10th head coach to lead the tradition-rich Tiger program on Saturday, May 26, 2018.

As Anderson enters year six in Mid-Missouri that new era has already gotten off to a successful start, and her ability to change the culture of the program in such a short time was a big reason why. Anderson has led Mizzou to a 169-97 record over her five seasons and owns a career record of 299-170-1 as a head coach.

In her short time at the helm of the Tigers, Anderson has steered Missouri to 169 victories, one NCAA Super Regional and two regional final appearances. In 2021, Mizzou hosted a regional and super regional for the first time since 2013 and again hosted a regional in 2022.

Anderson finished her first season in the Black & Gold with a 35-25 record, the most wins for the Tigers in a single season since 2016, when they won 42 games. Anderson's squad was also stellar in her first season as part of the always elite Southeastern Conference, as the Tigers' 12 wins during SEC play, which resulted in a tie for fourth place, were the most conference victories for Mizzou since 2016. The season ended with the Tigers' 13th straight regional appearance, as Anderson's Tigers earned a spot in the Los Angeles Regional, where they went 3-2, pushing host No. 2 UCLA to a winner-take-all game seven.

Her biggest test would come during the 2020 season. With Mizzou Softball's postseason ban being upheld three months prior to the season, Anderson's steady leadership guided the Tigers through what would be a turbulent year. Despite the postseason ban, Mizzou lost zero players to transfer, and entered the season with its roster intact.

Mizzou's postseason ban would prove to be only a minor blip in a season that was ultimately canceled after 26 games due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Tigers made the most of those 26 games, finishing with a 19-7 record, and being one of only two teams to be undefeated in SEC play. Mizzou ended the season ranked 25th in the NFCA Coaches' Poll – its first time finishing the season ranked since 2016 – while Cayla Kessinger was named to Softball America's All-America team.

Anderson returned Mizzou Softball to the national stage in 2021. With an experienced roster but a young pitching staff, she led the Tigers to a 42-17 record and a Super Regional appearance. Mizzou hosted an NCAA Regional and Super Regional for the first time since 2013. The 2021 team finished among the program's best statistically in fielding percentage (1st), home runs (1st), RBI (2nd), doubles (T-6th), and runs scored (3rd).

In the postseason, Mizzou pitching led the nation in ERA at 1.37 over six games. Two Tiger pitchers, Jordan Weber and Laurin Krings combined to allow only two hits and no runs over three games at the Columbia Regional. Freshman shortstop Jenna Laird earned SEC Freshman of the Year honors while senior outfielder Brooke Wilmes was recognized as an NFCA Third Team All-American. Anderson led the Tigers to a No. 13 final ranking in the NFCA Coaches' Poll and a No. 14 ranking in the USA Softball poll, the program's highest final rankings since 2015.

Mizzou's memorable 2022 season saw them host an NCAA Regional for the second-consecutive year and made the Southeastern Conference Tournament Championship game for the second time in program history. The Tigers notched a 38-22 mark and went 12-11 during SEC play. Mizzou's pitching staff posted a 2.81 ERA including a 1.00 ERA in the postseason.

In the inaugural year of the Rawlings Gold Glove Award, presented by the National Fastpitch Coaches Association, Jenna Laird and Casidy Chaumont earned the award at shortstop and left field, respectively.

Laird, a 2022 Softball All-SEC Second Team player, finished the year with a .975 fielding percentage, while turning 10 double plays and did not make an error during SEC play.

Chaumont, an All-SEC Defensive Team Selection, has appeared on SportsCenter's Top Ten Plays four times over her career at Mizzou. After beginning her career as an infielder at Louisiana, she converted to the outfield at the start of the 2021 season and finished with a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage. Chaumont has thrown out five runners on the basepaths from left field over her two seasons in the Black and Gold.

Kimberly Wert and Brooke Wilmes were each named First Team All-SEC performers in 2022. Jordan Weber, Jenna Laird, Wert and Wilmes were each tabbed to the National Fastpitch Coaches Association Southeast All-Region team. Weber led the Tigers to the SEC Tournament final with a pair of shutouts against No. 17/20 Auburn and No. 13/10 Tennessee. She became the first Mizzou pitcher to record three wins in a single SEC series when she earned the victory in all three games against Kentucky.

Mizzou is coming off a 2023 season that saw the Tigers reach a 16th straight NCAA Regional, finishing the season with a 35-26 record and going 7-17 against SEC foes. The pitching staff proved efficient yet again, registering a cumulative ERA of 3.33, including a strikeout/walk ratio of 2.66.

Alex Honnold became the 26th All-American in program history (31 total All-American honors) after earning Second-Team honors from the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA).

A Top 25 Finalist for 2023 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year, Honnold led Mizzou and ranked top six in the SEC for on-base percentage (.539), slugging percentage (.779), runs (52), batting average (.396), and triples (three). Her slugging percentage in 2023 ranked fourth all-time in program history. Honnold also earned NFCA Southeast All-Region honors and was named to the All-SEC Second Team.

Jenna Laird joined Honnold in representing the Tigers on the All-SEC Team, her sixth postseason honor at Mizzou and third-straight appearance on the All-SEC Team. The leadoff hitter paced the Tigers in SEC play with a .291 batting average to go with 14 runs, three doubles, five RBI, .371 on-base percentage, and a .329 slugging percentage.

Anderson joined Mizzou after a 17-year run at Hofstra, the final four as the head coach.



In four seasons at Hofstra, Anderson fashioned a 130-73-1 (.640) record with a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances, two Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) titles and four winning seasons. She picked up her 100th career win with the Pride's 7-2 win over Boston University, March 17, 2018, and posted seven career wins over nationally-ranked opponents, including three in 2018—a 1-0 victory over then-No. 13 Florida State on March 2 and a pair at No. 22 James Madison to claim the CAA Tournament crown.

The 2018 campaign was a historic one for Hofstra Softball, as Anderson led the 24th-ranked Pride to a 41-14 record, the CAA Tournament title and the NCAA Columbia Regional. Hofstra earned an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament by defeating CAA regular-season champion and 22nd-ranked James Madison, 7-4, to claim its 12th CAA title in the sport since joining the league in 2002 and returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2015.

Anderson's 2018 squad reached the 40-win mark for the 11th time in program history (and first since a school-record 46 wins in 2013), while setting school records for runs scored (334), home runs (70) and RBI (315). Hofstra owned an RPI of 19 against the nation's 29th-toughest schedule in 2018. Hofstra also garnered a league-high eight CAA postseason honors headlined by Sarah Cornell's selection as the CAA Pitcher of the Year—the Pride's 10th such honor all-time and first since 2013, all of which were tutored by Anderson.

In 2017, Hofstra returned to the CAA championship game, as the program registered its 28th-straight winning season (27-23) and earned the No. 2 seed in the CAA Tournament. Anderson picked up her first win over a Top 10 opponent as head coach with a 5-2 victory over No. 10 James Madison. Under Anderson's direction, Cornell was named first-team NFCA All-Northeast Region as a rookie, while also earning a spot on the All-CAA second team and All-Rookie team.

The Pride posted another winning record in her second season (24-22) and had six student-athletes earn CAA postseason honors and two garner NFCA All-Northeast Region recognition.

In her first season as the storied program's head coach in 2015, Anderson led Hofstra to the CAA championship and an NCAA Tournament berth, guiding Hofstra to a 38-14-1 record and a spot in the NCAA Gainesville Regional. Anderson and her assistants were named the NFCA Northeast Region's Coaching Staff of the Year after Hofstra posted a collective 2.05 ERA, smashed 56 home runs and out-scored opponents, 277-129.

Anderson has been part of eight NFCA Regional Coaching Staff of the Year award winners, including seven as an assistant or associate head coach and one as the head coach. In 17 seasons at Hofstra, she helped the Pride to a 610-267-2 (.695) record). Before taking over as head coach from Hall of Famer Bill Edwards, Anderson spent 13 seasons on the Hofstra staff as an assistant, including the last 10 as the associate head coach, helping the program to 10 NCAA Tournament appearances and 10 CAA titles. As associate head coach, she helped Hofstra win 24 NCAA Tournament games and make six appearances in the regional finals.

Under Anderson's guidance, Hofstra hurlers won nine CAA Pitcher of the Year awards in 10 seasons, including four consecutive wins by Olivia Galati from 2010-13 and three from Kayleigh Lotti from 2007-09. Galati was twice named an All-America by the NFCA and was the program's first-ever first-team pick in 2012 after leading Division I with a 0.95 ERA and a 34-7 record. Anderson helped guide Galati to a NCAA-best 40 wins and 22 shutouts in 2013.

A hallmark of the Hofstra Softball program during Anderson's tenure was the Pride's stellar defense. From 2008-13, Hofstra consistently ranked among the nation's elite in fielding percentage as the Pride was among the Top 20 nationally in five of those seasons. Hofstra ranked first in Division I in fielding percentage during the 2011 season and was fourth in 2008 and 2010, and 16th in 2012 and 2013. Her 2018 team currently ranks sixth nationally with an .979 mark.

An active NFCA member, she chaired its Ethics Committee from 2009-13, and currently serves as its Fourth Vice President on the NFCA executive board and as a member of the NFCA Recruiting Committee and the NFCA Hall of Fame Committee. Anderson is currently the Vice President of the Awards Committee. She was elected NFCA President on Oct. 25, 2022, and was one of eight members who were voted to the NFCA's Board of Directors for 2023. Anderson will officially begin her three-year term on January 1, 2023.

Prior to joining the Hofstra staff, Anderson served as an assistant coach for two seasons at LIU Post, where she helped the Pioneers to a combined 75-33 record, including a school-record 42 wins during the 2000 season. She assisted in all facets of the program at LIU Post and was in charge of coaching the pitchers and catchers. Her efforts helped the Pioneers to the 13th-best team earned run average in Division II (1.11) in 2001. She was also part of a C.W. Post staff that received the Northeast Region Division II Coaching Staff of the Year award from the NFCA in 2000.

Anderson spent one season as an assistant coach at Gannon University in 1998, after being named a regional All-American outfielder in 1997. She graduated from Gannon in 1997 with a bachelor's of science degree in therapeutic recreation.

She is married to former Hofstra Baseball Coach Patrick Anderson, who manages the St. Louis Cardinals' Class A affiliate in Peoria, Illinois.
