1953: The Delta Devils play their first game in the history of the school on September 19, falling to the Tigers of Jackson College 6-7. Cleophers Hatcher coached the Delta Devils to a 2-4 record and retired following the season. Hatcher was responsible for the Delta Devils' nickname, which has endured through the years. The Delta Devils get their first victory by defeating Philander Smith, 20-12.

1954: Ulysses "Killer" McPherson becomes the second head coach of the Delta Devils and rolls to a 6-3 overall record. The Delta Devils played the Braves of Alcorn College for the first meeting between the soon-to-be long-time rivals. The Delta Devils also defeated Jackson State College for the first time, a feat that would take 30 seasons to repeat.

Ulysses S. McPherson, known as "Killer" becomes the head coach of the Delta Devils and guides Mississippi Vocational College to within a game of claiming their first conference championship. MVS was a member of the South Central Athletic Conference. (SCAC). The Delta Devils avenged their first loss in history by taming the Tigers of Jackson College 19-8. McPherson, one of the most successful coaches in the history of the school's football program, guides the Delta Devils to their first winning season (5-3-1), en route to four straight winning seasons and three SCAC titles.

1955: MVC wins its first SCAC championship under McPherson, sharing the title with Jackson College. The Delta Devils compile a 7-2 record as McPherson helps shape MVC into a dynasty.

1957: MVC claimed its third straight SCAC under coach U.S. McPherson. McPherson's final contest on the sidelines for the Delta Devils ended in a 1919 tie with Wiley College. McPherson finished his career with a 25-10-2 career record. His .675 winning percentage was the highest percentage for a MVSU head coach.

1958: Leroy Smith was hired before the fall of 1958 to guide the Delta Devils. The team failed to win a conference championship for the first time in three seasons, ending the year with the second-ever losing season.

1959: John A. Bell took over the program before the '59 season, winning 2-3-1 in his inaugural season. Ironically, the two wins were enough to finish the season tied for the SCAC championship.

1960: Berley Pruitt, Rodney Buford and Ostuda Lane were all voted to the All-SCAC team.

1961: First-year coach Doug Porter became the fifth head coach at Mississippi Vocational College. The

The Delta Devils ended a four-game losing streak on homecoming, knocking off South Carolina State 13-8 in the season finale. The Delta Devils ended their third straight losing season with a 2-4 record.

1962: Lewis Thompson was honored as an All-American for his efforts for the Delta Devils. MVC finished the year with an overall record of 2-4.

1963: In Porter's third season at the helm, MVSC reclaimed the SCAC championship by finishing the season with a 6-3 season. The Delta Devils began and ended on a three game losing streak. Running back William Bell and lineman Clinton Vasser helped the Delta Devils win the SCAC championship and earn a membership on the Pittsburgh Courier All-America team.

1964: Porter guided the Delta Devils to their second winning season in his fourth season. MVSC's Clinton Vasser was back on the Pittsburgh Courier All-American team for the second straight year.

1965: Two costly losses kept the Delta Devils from claiming their fifth SCAC championship. Vasser was again named to the Pittsburgh Courier All-America team. Quarterback Eunice McGee was also named to the All-American team.

1966: Curtis Maddox, a former Delta Devil standout replaced Porter as the MVSC point man and finished his initial season with a 2-9 record. Wide receiver David McDaniels led the NAIA in receiving yards with 1,170 for the year.

1967: A 14-7 defeat to Jackson State marked the last game of Maddox years as the Delta Devils head coach. Offensive tackle Fred Freeman becomes the first Delta Devil draft choice, taken by the New York Giants in the ninth round.

1968: Ending his career on a stellar 1,000 yard rushing year, running back Jeff Stenciel was drafted by the Atlanta Falcons in the 10th round. William Glossom and his Delta Devils were roughly initiated into their inaugural season in the Southwestern Athletic Conference, finishing the year with a 1-7 record.

1969: Glossom ends his two-year stint as the head coach for MVSC with a 2-7 record in 1969. Tight end Harry Key becomes the third straight Delta Devil draft choice after being selected by the Pittsburgh Steelers in the 17th round of the 1970 draft.

1970: Sammie Price's selection to the Pittsburgh Courier All-American team, was a bright spot of first-year head coach Davis Weathersby's first season. The Delta Devils finished the year with a 1-8 record.

1971: Linebacker Ted Washington was drafted in the 17th round by the Kansas City Chiefs following the 1971 season. The Delta Devils ended a five-season losing streak, finishing 5-5-1.

1972: Felix Wicks was named to the All-NAIA squad after the Delta Devils finished the 1972 season with a 5-5 record.

1975: Although the Delta Devils finished the season with a 5-5 record, the talent on the team was enough for the NFL to call up three Delta Devils in the 1976 draft following the season. Quarterback Purnell Dickinson, wide receiver Ricky Feacher and defensive back Melvin Morgan were all taken in the draft in rounds seven, 10 and 11 respectively.

1977: Weathersby would coach the Delta Devils to a 12-10 victory over Alcorn State in his final game at the helm of the program. He wrapped up his tenure with MVSU with a 32-45-1 record.

1978: James T. Thomas became the ninth head coach for the Delta Devils preceding the 1978 season and in his first year guided MVSU to a 6-4-1 record, ending a 12-year drought of winning seasons.

1980: The Gunslinger's Era began at MVSU when Archie Cooley took over for Thomas in 1980. Cooley guided his first squad to a 4-4-1 record.

1983: Behind the pass and catch combination of the Willie "Satellite" Totten and Jerry "World" Rice, the Delta Devils posted a 7-2-1 record, the school's most wins since the 1965 season. The Satellite Express was born and the Rice and Totten combination, along

with notable teammates Joe Johnson and Carl Byrum would carry the Delta Devils into the national spotlight.

1984: The Delta Devils posted the school's most wins ever (9), defeated Jackson State for the first time since the 1954 season, knocked off Southern and Grambling as well (the only season MVSU has defeated JSU, GSU and SU) and played before its largest crowd ever, all in the most memorable season played. 64,000 fans would attend the showdown between MVSU and Alcorn State in Jackson's Veteran's Memorial Stadium. Following the season Rice became the first Delta Devil to be drafted in the first round of the NFL draft.

1985: Totten would end his record-setting career by holding over 50 records at the end of the 1985 season. Totten led MVSU to a 7-2 record as a senior. Following the season, Carl Byrum was selected by the Buffalo Bills in the fifth round and Joe Thomas was drafted by the Denver Broncos in the ninth round of the NFL draft.

1987: Cooley resigned after the 1986 season after recording the most wins as the Delta Devils point man. Ken Pettiford was hired to take over the program after Cooley's departure. SWAC Hall-of-Famer Vincent "Undertaker" Brown was taken by the New England Patriots in the 1988 draft.

1990: Following a 1-9 season under Pettiford, Larry Dorsey stepped into his first year as the head coach of the Delta Devils, the 12th head coach in the school's history.

1991: Dorsey guides MVSU to its first winning season since the 1985 season finishing the year with a 6-4-1 record. Ashley Ambrose, the Delta Devils most recent draft choice, was taken in the second round of the 1992 NFL draft following the season.

1994: The Delta Devils upset Jackson State 18-16, for its first win over the Tigers since 1984.

1996: After starting the season with an 0-4 record, the Delta Devils would win their final seven contests and Larry Dorsey was named SWAC Co-Coach of

1999: Latraia Jones was named the Delta Devils head coach after Dorsey coached his final game at the MVSU helm. Junior running back Corey Holmes would rush for 1,692 yards and the SWAC's Offensive Most Valuable Player.

2000: Despite a 2-9 season, Holmes again rushed to the league's Offensive Most Valuable Player honors. Holmes amassed 2,897 rushing yards, surpassing Carl Byrum as the Delta Devils' career rushing leader.

2001: The Delta Devils endured the lowest point of the program's history. A 0-11 record marked the first ever winless season.

December 21, 2001: Willie "Satellite" Totten is announced as the school's fourteenth head coach, becoming just the second MVSU graduate to coach the Delta Devils.

2002: Willie "Satellite" Totten returns to the Delta Devils sideline as the head coach. In his inaugural season, the beloved coach helps alumni forget about the dismal season from a year ago by posting a 5-6 record and third place finish in the SWAC Eastern Division. The five wins are the most wins in a season, since the 1997 season.

2003: The Delta Devils 50th year celebration was less than glorious as they suffered through a 2-9 season. Inconsistencies, instability, injuries and inexperience echoed in afterthought. Inconsistency and instability at the quarterback position, coupled with injuries to key personnel resulting in inexperienced players being thrown into the fire proved to much for the Delta Devils to overcome. Jarrette Prout, LB, led the SWAC in tackles and was named first team All-SWAC.

2004: A extremely young Delta Devils team showed the maturity that Coach Totten had been looking for. Although it was not reflected in their 3-8 record, it showed as a ninth ranked offense moved up to fourth and an eighth ranked defense also moved up

to fourth in the conference. Aries Nelson, QB, was named SWAC Newcomer of the Year; Tyler Knight, LB, was named second team All-SWAC.

April 21, 2005: John F. Hanson, chairman of The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame, announced that Willie Totten was selected for enshrinement as part of the 2005 Class of the College Football Hall of Fame on August 13th.

November 12, 2005: Delta Devils first game ever televised on ESPNU. Valley defeats Alabama State 38-33 to post first winning season in nine years. Receiver Tyrone Timmons named SWAC Offensive Player of the Week. Linebacker Tyler Knight named SWAC Defensive Player of the Week.

December 12, 2005: Linebacker Tyler Knight, SWAC Defensive Player of the Year, named I-AA Sports Network second team All-America. Also named All-America by SBN (1st team) and Football Gazette (1st team).

April 30, 2005: The field at Rice-Totten Stadium renamed after Charles "Chuck" Prophet, Charles "Chuck" Prophet Field.

May 9, 2006: National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame announced that Jerry Rice was selected for enshrinement as part of the 2006 Class of the College Football Hall of Fame.

April 29, 2006: The football fieldhouse, "Devils Den" renamed after Ashley Ambrose, Ashley Ambrose Devils Den.

June 20, 2007: Longtime Athletic Director/Sports Information Director Charles "Chuck" Prophet passes away.

October 18, 2008: MVSU orchestrates a 58-yard, 22-second drive to lead Mississippi Valley State to a come-from-behind 22-20 homecoming victory over the Tigers of Savannah State

November 8, 2008: QB Paul Roberts guides the Delta Devils over highly-touted signal caller Bobby

Reid and Texas Southern in a 58-44 shootout. The two teams combined for nearly 1,100 yards of offense (869 combined passing yards) and 102 points. The back-and-forth struggle was decided in the final period through the air and on the ground.

2009: MVSU finishes the season with a 3-8 record with wins over Alabama State, Texas College and Lincoln (Mo.). Three MVSU players were named Second Team All-SWAC (OL Robert Olgetree, DL Jared Green and LB Rory Malone).

Dec. 1, 2009: Head Coach Willie Totten resigns, ending his seven-year tenure.

Jan. 11, 2010: North Alabama Defensive Coordinator Karl Morgan is named head coach.

2010: MVSU was forced to play its three home games at Greenville-Weston High while renovations were being made to the visitors side of Rice-Totten Stadium. MVSU finished the season with a 0-10 record, going winless for the second time in school history. Valley fell 27-9 to Alcorn State at Soldier Field in Chicago on Sept. 18.

2011: Karl Morgan gets his first victory as head coach following a 12-9 win over Texas Southern. Delta Devils finish the season 1-10. Wide receiver Paul Cox signed an undrafted free agent deal with the Pittsburgh Steelers, but is eventually cut prior to the regular season.

2012: The Delta Devils finished the season 5-6 after winning its final three games of the season. MVSU defeated both Southern and Grambling State in the same season for the first time since 1984. Valley hung up to defeat Southern 6-0, on Sept. 13, on ESPNU. The Delta Devils finished the season with the fourth-best (1st in the SWAC) in the FCS. The Delta Devils gave up an average of just 279.18 yards per game. Meanwhile, a record number of players (6) under head coach Karl Morgan were named All-SWAC. Junior defensive tackle Robert Simpson was named First Team All-SWAC, Third Team FCS All-American and Boxtorow Honorable Mention All-American. Morgan was named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award,

which is awarded to the top coach in FCS.

August 12, 2012: Former MVSU basketball standout and Valley Hall of Famer Ashley Robinson returns to serve as Athletic Director, replacing Interim Athletic Director Donald Ray Sims.

April 25, 2013: MVSU sophomore placekicker Kevin Monzon dies in a car accident on Highway 82 in Leflore County, Miss. MVSU linebacker Marcus Thompson was also seriously injured and flown to Jackson. Offensive lineman Kevin James and defensive lineman Joseph Hardnett were also in the automobile, but were treated for minor injuries at the Greenwood-Leflore Hospital.
