The Game: Today's game will signify a much needed win for the Panthers. This will be the final game of the regulation season of 2022.

Last Time Out: In a crucial match-up on inside of the Simmons Bank Field the Prairie View A&M University football team clawed there way to a 55-24 victory over the University of Arkansas Pine Bluff Golden Lions.

With the win the Panthers improved to 5-5 overall and 5-2 in conference play.

The Panthers dominated the game statistically, racking up 491 total offensive yards, while holding the Golden Lions to 301. PVAMU took advantage of short-field situations set up by some miscues.

UAPB put the first 10 points on the board in the first quarter. The Panthers finally got points on the board after a four-yard run touchdown by Jaden Stewart with 3:45 p.m. left on the clock making the scored 10-7 in favor of the Golden Lions.

PVAMU took a 28-17 lead into the locker room after adding two more scores on three grab and go catches From Trazon Connley to Travion Jones (15 yards), Jailon Howard for 45-yards and Ty Holden for 86-yards. UAPB took advantage of a punt fumble in the Panthers endzone for a final score in the first half.

In addition to the Panthers ability to move the ball offensively, PVAMU also got big plays from special teams and the defense. Keyshawn Johnson led the defensive side of the ball with six team high tackles. A recovered fumble was also key for the defense.

Connley was ruthlessly effective on the day, going 8-for-15 for 193 yards and five touchdowns. Connley spread his eight completions around to seven different receivers. Howard gained the most yardage of any of those receivers, catching one pass for 45 yards and a touchdown.

Freshman Connor Wisham led the rushing attack for the Panthers, carrying 11 times for 69 yards. Chris Herron contributed 60 yards on five totes and a touchdown.

The Panthers continued a steady lead going through the final two quarters taking a 55-24 win.

THE MCDOWELL ERA: Leonard "Bubba" McDowell, was named head coach at PVAMU on Jan. 4, 2022. Although, this will be McDowell's first time at the helm of the Panthers, the former NFL defensive standout will be entering his 11th season as a part of the Prairie View A&M coaching staff to include four seasons as an assistant head coach. He also has coached the Panther cornerbacks in the last three seasons.

McDowell has had several SWAC players to receive either first or second team honors since his stint at PV. Before his departure Drake Cheatum, who had a career season as a Panther, led an ultra-productive secondary having a pick-six and picked off five passes (ranking him 7th in the nation), while defending four more. He led the team on the defense after playing in 11 contest with a total of 82 stops (42 solo, 40 assisted) ranking him 5th in the conference. Posting 5.0-15 tackles for loss/yards. Cheatum earned first team All-SWAC honors for the second straight year.

Along side Cheatum, Darius Campbell was also one of the most active Panthers ranking him among the nation's best pass defenders and was ranked fourth in the SWAC with 14. He was one of PV's top cover men ranking third on the team with 54 stops (29 solo, 25 assisted), earning him SWAC Second Team honors.

PANTHERS WIN WEST, FALL TO JACKSON IN SWAC TITLE GAME:

PVAMU won the SWAC Western Division in fall of 2021. This was the first time for the Panthers since the 2009 season. Prairie View posted a 7-5 overall record and finished 6-2 in league play facing Jackson State in the SWAC Championship game. The Tigers posted a 27-10 win over the Panthers. The marked the first time that the two teams have met in a championship game, as well as the first in two seasons.

PANTHER ATHLETICS RECEIVES 2022 COMMISSIONERS CUP:

For a second consecutive year the Prairie View A&M Athletic program has been recognized by the Southwestern Athletic Conference, for winning the James Frank Cup Award. The Panthers also earned the C.D. Henry Award for the top men's program as well as the Sadie Magee/Barbara Jacket Award representing the women's team honors.

Each year the Commissioner's Cup is awarded to the top institution based on the overall finishes in league sponsored sports, as well as the highest point totals at the conclusion of the athletic season. Prairie View A&M totaled 167 points to claim the James Frank Award.

The Panthers won eight SWAC championships this past athletic year, claiming league titles in the sports of Soccer (tournament), Football (Western Division Title), Bowling (regular season), Men's and Women's Indoor Track and Field, Men's and Women's Outdoor Track and Field, and Softball. Jackson State (150 points) and Alabama State (146.5) claimed second and third place respectively.

The Panthers won the C.D. Henry Award after accumulating 70 points on the men's side. This marked the third-consecutive year in which Prairie View A&M has claimed the male all-sports award. Jackson State (65 points) and Alabama State (62 points) finished in second a third place overall on the men's side.

The Sadie Magee/Barbara Jacket Award saw the Lady Panthers earning 97 points in the women's final standings. Alabama State (95 points) and Jackson State (85 points) finished second and third respectively.

BUBBA MCDOWELL

HEAD COACH 1ST SEASON - MIAMI '89

McDowell was named the head football coach of Prairie View A&M on January 4, of 2022. The former NFL defensive standout is in his 11th season as a part of the Prairie View A&M coaching staff to include four seasons as an assistant head coach. He also coached the Panther corner backs for three seasons.

During the 2019 season, Jaylen Harris asserted himself as one of the most disruptive corner backs in the nation, leading the SWAC in total passes defended and ranking among the top 10 nationally in the category on his way to first-team All-SWAC honors.

In 2018, Ju'Anthony Parker earned first-team All-SWAC and BOXTOROW All-America honors for the second straight year while Harris had a career high in interceptions, and both players had interception returns for touchdowns.

While coaching safeties in 2017, Reggie Stubblefield emerged as the fourth leading tackler on the team (51 stops) while tying for second in interceptions (two), and leading the team in pass breakups (10).

In 2016, Marquice O'Leary was fourth on the team in tackles and third in passes defense.

Running back turned nickel back Arthur Lockett was sixth in tackles, tied for the team lead in interceptions, returning one for touchdown, and ranked second on the team in pass defense.

In 2015, O'Leary earned second-team All-SWAC honors after ranking third on the team in both tackles (51) and pass defense (five) and second in interceptions (two).

In 2014, true freshman defensive back Damond Jackson flourished under McDowell's guidance as he earned a spot on the All-SWAC second team. Jackson finished third on the team with 80 tackles and 5.5 tackles for loss. He also broke up five passes and forced a fumble with one interception.

McDowell was challenged with working with one of the youngest units on the team entering the 2013 season as the majority of players in his unit had limited NCAA playing experience. At the end of the season, a pair of red-shirt freshmen corner backs in Joshua Holley and Foster Brown II finished fourth and fifth, respectively, on the team in tackles while also combining for 10 pass breakups.

McDowell played a big part in the career performance from safety Brian Medlock in 2012 as he earned All-SWAC Second Team Honors at safety during his senior campaign. Medlock led the Panthers with four interceptions in 2012 and finished tied for second in SWAC play in addition to defending a total of eight passes.

Under McDowell's watch, safety Korey Alston also had a big season as he completed his inaugural season at Prairie View A&M with 41 tackles and three pass breakups.

In his first year at PVAMU in 2011, McDowell inherited the youngest unit on the defensive side of the ball as only one player had made a start in a collegiate game. Despite the lack of experience, the Panthers received career highs from all of its safeties as Medlock led the way after finishing fifth on the team in tackles along with four pass breakups.

Born in Georgia and raised in Florida, McDowell was a four-year letterman at the University of Miami and earned a National Championship ring as a starter on the undefeated 1987 squad under former head coach Jimmy Johnson.

McDowell was also recognized by ESPN for his play on the gridiron that season as his knock down of a two-point attempt against longtime rival Florida State was featured as the 11th-best play that defined college football. He graduated with a degree in business management in 1989.

McDowell was drafted by the NFL's Houston Oilers in 1989 and immediately became a starter en route to earning First Team All-Rookie Accolades from Pro Football Weekly and Football News. After a solid rookie year, McDowell played a big part in the Oilers' success on the field as they posted five consecutive winning seasons and five AFC Playoff berths from 1989 to 1993. In 1991, McDowell earned NFL All-Pro Honors and was honored by the Oilers with the "Ed Block Memorial Courage Award" which acknowledged his courage

in the pursuit of professional excellence.

During his final season with the Oilers in 1994, McDowell was selected as the Houston Oilers' NFL Man of the Year for his work in the community. McDowell moved to the state of North Carolina prior to the 1995 season and helped usher in a new era as he played on the inaugural roster of the Carolina Panthers before retiring the next season.

Despite concluding his career in North Carolina, McDowell remained popular in the city of Houston for his work in both the business and community sectors. In 1995, he became one of the first two professional athletes to receive the Human Enrichment of Life "Young African American Achiever" award. During the same year, he became the first athlete ever to receive the Friends of Friends "Positive Influential African American Male" award. In 1996, McDowell earned the first "Warren Moon Athletic and Community Service Award" by Houston's United Negro College Fund which recognized former professional athletes who have excelled in their particular sport while improving the lives of others.

McDowell remained active in a variety of athletic ventures across the Houston area in addition to coaching on the high school level for several years. He has also completed NFL Minority Coaching Internships with the Green Bay Packers, Miami Dolphins and Houston Texans.

McDowell has two sons, Trey and Myles.

2022 PANTHER FOOTBALL PREVIEW

With just a few weeks away from the start of football practice an electricity of revitalized excitement as new head football coach Bubba McDowell, coaching staff and players arrive back to Panther Stadium in August.

A new era begins for the Panther football team as McDowell takes over as the head coach.

McDowell has returned majority of the 2021 coaching staff. The coaches who have returned were a part of the 2021 Western Division Championship title team. PVAMU finished the season with a 7-5 overall record and was 6-2 in conference play.

Fans will see some familiar faces returning to the PVAMU coaching staff. On the offensive side of the ball **Reggie Moore** (Wide Receivers/Offensive Pass Coordinator Coach) is not so much a new face, but he has returned after being away for the program since departing in 2018. Moore returns to the "Hill" after spending two years as a quality control coach for the offense at Colorado. **Ashton Green** (Offensive Line/Recruiting Coordinator Coach) also returns after spending two years on the Alabama State football staff. **Mark Frederick** (Assistant Head/Offensive Coordinator), enters into his fourth season as a part of the coaching staff along with **Marcus Bradley** (Running Backs/Walk-On Coordinator), who returns to the Panthers entering his first season as a full time coach. Prior to his return Bradley spent a year at Benedict College as the Run Game Coordinator/Tight Ends Coach.

On the defensive side of the ball **Todd Middleton** (Defensive Coordinator/Defensive Line Coach), **Alvin Fosselman** (Linebackers/Special Teams Coordinator Coach), **Ryan Burton** (Nickels/Saeties/Video Coordinator Coach), all return as they have been apart of the PVAMU coaching staff for the last three season, this will be their fourth year as a Panther.

Prairie View A&M will return a total of 55 players from last season's squad. 28 defensive players and 27 offensive players. Seven of the defensive players were starters and eight of the offensive returning players started for the Panthers in the fall of 2021. 37 players will not be returning to Prairie View A&M for the 2022 season. There are a total of 38 newcomers joining the PVsquad.

OFFENSE

McDowell's offense will return eight starters with wide receivers **Trejon Spiller** and **Jailon Howard** along with tight end **Donovan White** offensive linemen **Arrington Taylor**, **Gary Walton**, **Chans Jones**, **Jordan Johnson** and **Kolbi Lewis**. Others with starting experience are wide receivers **Colbey Washington** and **Xavier Johnson** (sat out the second half of the season due to injury). Freshman running back **Jaden Stewart** will also return to the Panthers lineup.

Prairie View's offense averaged 388.4 yards, including 2,725 passing, 1,936 rushing yards on 822 plays ranking the Panthers third in the conference.

OFFENSIVE LINE

The Panthers will return a group pf veteran players in **Arrington Taylor**, **Gary Walton**, **Chans Jones**, **Jordan Johnson**, **Kolbi Lewis**, **Jaden Steele** and **Jamal Marshall** which have all spent time on the field.

QUARTERBACKS

Although **Trazon Connley** didn't see much action last season in the five games he played, he will be looked upon to lead the Panthers offense. Connley has been a part of PV's offense since 2018, but will be a red-shirt junior on the field due to NCAA guidelines. He will offer experience, along with a strong passing option and the ability to run with the ball. Last season he went 6-17-1 for 55 yards passing, while adding 108 yards rushing. In addition to Connley, **Chris Scott** who saw action in one game last season will be returning along with **Chris Herron**. The Panthers have added depth in the QB area with the new addition of freshman **CJ (Channing) Dumas**, who will probably be looked upon to get some reps.

RUNNINGBACKS

PVAMU will have a host of experience returning in the backs position. Although a freshman last season **Ja'den Stewart** was the top totter for the Panthers. He averaged 59.5 yards per game for a total of 654 total yards on 132 attempts. **Ahmad Antoine** a forth year veteran will be another back in rotation that is versitale and saw action in nine games averaging 19.0 yards per game for a total of 171 yards on 43 attempts. **Bernad Goodwater** is returing as a fifth year senior after playing in only five games las season with seven carries and 23 total yards. The experienced **Kristian Mosley** is also a veteran back that will most likely receive the call after playing in 10 games for a total 198 yards on 47 carries last season. There are also four new additions.



2022 PANTHER FOOTBALL PREVIEW

WIDERECEIVERS

The wide receivers are fueled with 16 targets. **Xavier Johnson**, will return to the Panthers lineup after being out half of last season with an injury. **Jailon Howard** is a key returner for the Panthers as the redshirt senior served as a kick returner averaging 6.5 yards per game. He had 25 receptions for 543 yards with five TD's. Howard also had a team best of four kick returns for 78 yards. As a freshman **Trejon Spiller** played in 10 games at wide out. He had 15 receptions for 346 yards with four TD's (second best). A number of tested returnees will battle for starting roles, including juniors **Colbey Washington** (11 games | 18 rec | 244 yards | 1 TD) and **Ty Holden** (10 games | 10 rec. | 105 yards). Although Kris Simmons was out the entire season he will look to vie for his starting position. There will be nine new faces joining the Panthers.

TIGHT ENDS

Donovan White will be the most experienced tight end returning to the Panthers sideline. After transferring from Southern the redshirt senior saw action in all 12 games. He had 16 receptions for 198 yards (12.38 avg.) with two TD's. There are three additions to this area.

Coach McDowell on the Offense

"Everyone knows that in order to have a great offense you have to have a leader," said McDowell. "It starts with the quarterback and that's **Conley**. He had an awesome spring game which I really wanted to see how he commands the offense. Being the guy in there consistently, he will play a big role. **Scott** is getting acclimated to the system still. He was getting better as we got deeper into camp. **Dumas** will also be coming in for us as a freshman, and I believe he will make an

an immediate impact. **Dumas** is a guy that is very poise and calm. He's coming off a state title and we are very blessed to get this young man. I think he's going to do well. I know he's going to come in and compete."

"On the line we have Chans Jones returning that can play across the line. We are going to start him off at center. Everyone knows that at the center position you have to make sure that guys are lined up. He's going to do a good job he had a really good spring. "AT" Aaron Taylor will be a veteran coming back. He's going to play a big time role on the field with the o-line. Another big key for us will be to bring back Eric Dunn. If we can get him back into the system at the left tackle spot that will be huge for us."

"We have Stewart coming back to begin his sophomore year at the running back position, along with "AA" Antoine, Mosley and Goodwater. We have a host of guys in the backfield that can run the ball and run it well. All these guys will get a touch."

"We are expecting Kris Simmons back at the wide receiver position after being out with an injury last season. Howard, will be returning and he's a kid that works hard and I think will have a great season. Spiller who had a fantastic year as a true freshman will be back. We have guys that can stretch the field and run their routes. Washington and Holden will also both play a significant role in the wide receivers spot. They both played a lot of minutes last year, but they may have to come in and compete, which I think they will. I am looking for things from all these guys. We are expecting X. Johnson to come back healthy and try to stay healthy he will be that X-factor."

DEFENSE

The defense will return eight starters from 2021. **Logan Jackson, Jamias Presley, Troy James, Bryce Turner, Shahid Reece, Tre'Vion Green, Isaiah Hunt, and Dante Carter** will all return for the 2022 season.

PVAMU's defense will head into the 2022 season with the loss of some impact players.

The defense finished third in the conference allowing 1,660 rushing yards. Fourth with 27 sacks for 159 yards, fifth with 10 INT's for 211 yards and two TD's.

LINEBACKERS

There will be eight returning linebackers. Veteran starter **Tre'Vion Green** is the top returning tackler for the Panthers. The redshirt senior recorded 57 tackles (7.5 for loss for 41 yards), three sacks (22 yards) and two QBH. He had a season high of eight tackles in the championship game versus Jackson State. **Shahid Reece** is another experienced linebacker. The redshirt senior had a season high 54 tackles (6.0 for loss for 17 yards) after appearing in all 12 games. He also had one QB hurry. Redshirt sophomore **Warren Shankle** appeared in nine games in 2021 posting 35 tackles (4.5 for loss for 16 yards), and had 2.0 sacks for a loss of nine yards. Redshirt freshman **Jeremiah Harris** will return (appeared in three games out for the season due to an injury). There are four other experienced linebackers returning such as redshirt junior **Kendon Jones** (appeared in nine games), **Adrian Lacy** (appeared in five games), **Kenneth Steward** (appeared in one game), and **Depriest Taylor** (out for the season due to injury) that will offer the Panthers some defensive stops.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

The secondary lost two standouts and replacing them will be critical, but the Panthers still can return a stable squad. Junior **Bryce Turner** will be the top defender returning for PV appearing in all 12 games in 2021 (54 tackles, 5.0 TFL for 11 yards, nine breakups). Other experience players who will contribute are redshirt junior free safety **Tariq Mulmore**, appeared in 10 games (40 tackles and one break up), graduate student **Jamias Presley** appeared in 12 games (39 tackles, , 1.0 TFL for two yards, 11 passes defended (second on the team), **Logan Jackson** appeared in 11 games returning for his senior season. Transfer from Ball State graduate **Gerald Smith** (appeared in eight games), redshirt junior **Dylan DeCuire** (appeared in nine games), sophomore **Tayvion Haggerty** (appeared in eight games), sophomore **Khaimon Samuel** (appeared in nine games), and redshirt freshman **Travis Pearson** (no appearances).

DEFENSIVE LINEMEN

Moving across the line of scrimmage the defensive line will possible be the Panthers deepest staffing as they are a squad of 16. With the return senior **Troy James** who appeared in all 12 games (43 tackles, including 8.0 for loss for 25 yards), one INT (returned for 27 yards), two QBH and one blocked kick. Sophomore **Jessie Evans** (36 tackles, 6.5 TFL for 15 yards) 2.5 sacks for two yards, two breakups, three QBH's, one recovered fumble and two forced fumbles as a true freshman. Senior **Shelvin Hudson** appeared in 11 games (35 tackles, 6.0 TFL for 35 yards, 1.0 sacks for 18 yards, one fumble recovery and two forced fumbles. Other impact players are **Kevin Victorian** (appeared in 10 games). **Dante Carter** (appeared in 10 games), **Isaiah Hunt** (appeared in four games), **Jamal Marshall** (appeared in four games), and senior **Obi Desmond** (appeared in 10 games).

SPECIAL TEAMS

Prairie View's kicking game is in capable hands, beginning with senior long snapper **Desmond Calloway** along with senior punter **Caleb Darbone**, appeared in 12 games (49 punts, for 1,885 yards with a 38.5 average). The Panthers also return kicker/punter (when needed) senior transfer **Luis Reyes**. Reyes appeared in 12 games (scoring on 32 pat's, and 13 field goals for 71 points for an average of 5.9 per game). He also kicked 64 KO's for 3,483 (13 TBS).

Kick returns will be exciting with the likes of **Howard**, **Holden**, **X. Johnson**, **Goodwater** and **Washington** all returning after showing flashes last year.

THE SCHEDULE

The Panthers will look forward to open the season hosting arch-rival Texas Southern for the Labor Day Classic on Sept. 3. Afterward, Prairie View A&M will head to Abilene Christian for a non-conference battle. (Sept. 10), before they return back to Panther Stadium to return a game with Incarnate Word on Sept 17.

From there, Prairie View A&M will make its way to Hornet Stadium to take on the Hornets of Alabama State. Their next stop will be in Dallas for the State Fair Classic, taking on Grambling State Oct. 1. Then, the Panthers will welcome Southern to The Hill for an Oct. 8 tilt. After a brief respite, the Panthers will take a trip to Beaumont, Texas to face Lamar.

Prairie View A&M will welcome Bethune Cookman to Panther Stadium on Oct. 29 for Homecoming, and Alcorn State, on Nov. 5 to open up the month. The Panthers will wrap up the season on the road with tilts at UAPB (Nov. 12) and Mississippi Valley (Nov. 19).

MCDOWELL ON THE DEFENSE

"The defense line will be fueled by returnees **James**, **Carter**, **Evans**, and **Kevin Victorian** and they will be the core. We will also still be looking to bring in some older guys from the portal."

"The charge will be ran by veteran **L. Jackson** in the secondary, who started as a true freshman. There are a lot of young guys back there. **Presley** will be returning who transferred in from Jacksonville State. He will have to step up, but I believe that he will be that leader. **Haggerty** a sophomore will be looking upon to gain some more experience, along with **Turner** that should have a big year. He's a guy that will knock you out. He can definitely run and cover, but he's going to have to take on a big role with the loss of **Drake Cheatum**.

"**Green** will be a guy that can make it to the next level as a linebacker. He can play inside or out."

"Our special teams is most definitely special. **Darbone** needs to be consistent. The season depends on how well he does in camp and that will make a difference in his season. I think he's one of those kids that can play on the next level as a punter. When he's on he's on. **Reyes** our kicker has to have a big year along with red-shirt kicker **Carlos Villagomez**. They stay ready and work hard they are always kicking. **Goodwater** and **X**, will be two guys that I expect to bring the ball up the middle and score during either a punt or kick return. These guys should have a big year. They can take it the distance when it comes down to it.

"We have to make plays. The key to our success will be kids working together and depending on one another and staying focus. Meaning in the classroom and on the field. If they do that then we can be a pretty solid football team.

PANTHER HISTORY

The first football coach at Prairie View was H.B. Hucles, who began in 1924. Before Hucles's arrival at Prairie View, the school played two games without a coach on record: a 1907 7–0 win against a team from Wylie, Texas and a 1920 7–6 loss to Tuskegee University.

Prairie View's most recognized and celebrated coach was William "Billy" Nicks. Nicks was head coach in 1945–47, assistant coach in 1948–51, and head coach again in 1952–65. His record for 17 years was 127-39-8. He led the Panthers to eight Southwestern Athletic Conference championships and five black college national championships. At the Panthers' peak under Nicks, Eddie Robinson was said to dread playing Prairie View.

Nicks was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1999. Nicks was named the American Football Coaches Association's recipient of the Trailblazer Award. The award was presented posthumously at the AFCA Kickoff Luncheon on Monday, January 7 at the 2008 AFCA Convention in Anaheim, California.

Prairie View is recognized as the first historically Black university to create and play in a post-season bowl game. The Prairie View Bowl was played in Texas from 1929 through 1961.

The Panthers won Black college football national championship titles in 1953, 1954, 1958, 1963, and 1964 and Southwestern Athletic Conference Championships SWAC in 1933, 1951, 1952, 1953, 1954, 1958, 1960, 1963, 1964, and recently in 2009. Notable football players that have achieved success in the National Football League (NFL) are National Football Hall of Fame Inductee Kenny Houston, who played for the Houston Oilers and Washington Redskins and Otis Taylor, who won a World Championship with the Kansas City Chiefs in 1969. On a small note of significance, Charlie "Choo Choo" Brackins, who played from 1952–1955, was the first HBCU alumnus to play quarterback in the NFL.

The end of Jim Crow caused a significant talent drain for all HBCUs. Nicks had been able to stem the tide somewhat by persuading many of the state's black high school coaches to continue sending their players to Prairie View rather than to a predominantly white school. At one point, nearly all of them had played for Nicks, and owed their jobs to him. Usually, a single phone call from Nicks was enough to persuade one of Nicks' former players to send a prospect to "The Hill." He wasn't above threatening to have them fired if they didn't do so. However, Prairie View's fortunes sank rapidly after Nicks retired in 1965. The Panthers would only "officially" finish above .500 twice from 1968 to 1989. This included winless seasons in 1974, 1979, 1983, and 1984 and a 28-game losing streak from 1982 to 1985. They managed a .500 record in 1988 under coach Haney Catchings—their first non-losing season since 1976. However, that win was forfeited after the season due to an ineligible player.

Prairie View bottomed out when it returned to the field for the 1991 season. The team did not have any scholarships because only 150 alumni responded to a request to help raise a scholarship fund. The Panthers did not win a single game until 1998. The 80 consecutive losses spanning parts of nine seasons (including two losses to close the 1989 season) almost doubled Columbia University's 44 straight losses between 1983 and 1988.

The streak finally ended with a 14–12 victory over Langston on September 26, 1998. However, that team only had 15 scholarship players. The road back was difficult; the Panthers only won a total of 23 games between 1998 and 2006.

On November 10, 2007, Prairie View clinched its first winning season since 1976, and only their second since 1967, with a 30–27 victory over traditional power Jackson State University under then head coach Henry Frazier, III.

In 1999 the SWAC moved to a new divisional format with Western Division and Eastern Division champions to play for the SWAC Championship. On November 14, 2009, it clinched its first SWAC Western Division Championship by defeating Alcorn State. The next weekend would see the Panthers go undefeated in the SWAC by defeating Arkansas Pine Bluff and securing an 8–1 record; their only loss during the season was to New Mexico State. They finished the season by winning the SWAC Championship on December 12, defeating Eastern Division Champion Alabama A&M, 30–24, in the SWAC Championship Game. They exited the 2009 SWAC football campaign with an unblemished 9–0 SWAC conference record. They were led by their quarterback, 6 ft 4 in, 225-pound KJ Black, who led all quarterbacks in the SWAC with a passer efficiency rating of 168.1 their SWAC second-leading rusher in Donald Babers that averaged 5.2 yards per carry.

That night, nearly 15,000 spectators saw PVAMU take down Texas Southern 29-25 in another thrilling chapter between these cross-town rivals.

Panther Stadium seats 15,000 and is home to the 55,000-square foot Athletics Administration Building which sits in the

west end of the stadium.

The stadium sits in the former home of the original Blackshear Field that hosted Prairie View A&M's football and track teams from 1948 to 2014.

The Panthers currently hold a 12-6 home record since the opening of Panther Stadium at Blackshear Field. In this venue's still growing history, the Panthers have never had a losing record in a given season.

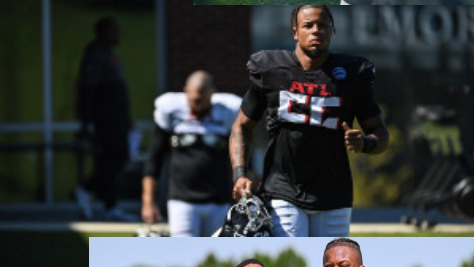

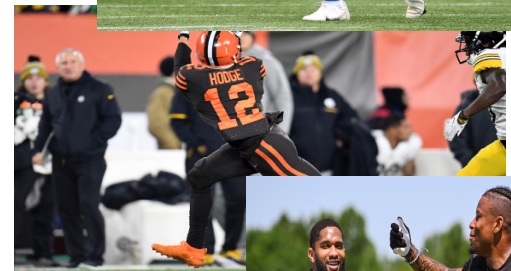
PANTHERS IN THE NFL NOW



Quinton Bell Defensive End Atlanta Falcons - First Year: Bell was the first draft pick from Prairie View A&M since Matthew Teague who was drafted by the Dallas Cowboys in the tenth round and was made the transition from wide receiver to defensive in his final season with the Panthers. In the 2015 season he played in six games and caught two passes for 24 yards. In the 2016 season started three and played in 10 games where he caught nine passes for 138 yards and one touchdown against Rice (10/22) and caught two passes at Jackson St. (10/29) for 28 yards. In his final season as wide receiver he caught 8 passes for 97 yards. In his final year with the Panthers he made the switch defensive end in his final season where he earned 14 solo tackles and 32 tackles for a total 46 tackles in his senior season. He had 7.5 sacks for 38 yards. Bell was drafted by the Oakland Raiders in the seventh round with the 230th overall pick in the 2019 NFL Draft. He was waived on August 31, 2019 and re-signed to the practice squad. He was released on October 15. On November 5, 2019, Bell was signed to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers practice squad. [6] He signed a reserve/future contract with the Buccaneers on December 30, 2019. Bell was waived by the Buccaneers on October 26, 2020, and re-signed to the practice squad two days later.....On February 9, 2021, Bell re-signed with the Buccaneers and was a part of the 2021 Super Bowl LV Championship team.....He was waived on August 22, 2021. Signing with the Atlanta Falcons on September 1, 2021, to the practice squad.....He signed a reserve/future contract with the Falcons on January 10, 2022.



Khadarel Hodge Wide Receiver - Atlanta Falcons First Year: Hodge began his collegiate career as a quarterback at Alcorn State but left after redshirting the 2014 season. Transferred to Hinds Community College in 2015, where he transitioned to wide receiver. He later transferred to Prairie View A&M in 2016 and played three seasons for the Panthers, catching 104 passes for 1,797 yards and 21 touchdowns.
