PREGAME

• Texas Southern women's basketball prepares for its final regular season road trip of 2021-22 as they'll face Mississippi Valley State on Saturday at 2 p.m.

• Fourth-year head coach **Cynthia Cooper-Dyke** is back on the TSU sidelines for the third straight season. She led TSU to the SWAC Regular Season Championship for the first time in school history in 2012-13 in addition to a second-place finish in 2019-20. The team made it to the semifinals of the SWAC Tournament (before COVID-19) in 2020 and a quarterfinals appearance in 2021.

• Cooper-Dyke is 12-3 against Mississippi Valley State all-time. TSU is 17-1 against MVSU over the past 18 games with the lone loss on Jan. 23, 2017 in Itta Bena.

• Head coach **Cynthia Cooper-Dyke** is 67-42 all-time in the month of February and 18-7 at TSU.

• TSU has faced off against teams from four conferences in 2021-22. TSU has squared off against teams from the Pac-12 (3), Conference USA, SEC and Big 12. TSU is a de facto

member of the Pac-12 this year with games at Arizona, Colorado and USC.

• **Jada Perry** is coming into her own with five double-doubles over the last seven games. Graduate guard **Ataiya Bridges** has scored 20-plus points in four of the past five games. Sophomore **Andriana Avent** has six games with 30-plus points, including two with 30-plus.

• MVSU is 2-11 in SWAC play and would have to win out in order to even have a chance at the final berth in the SWAC Tournament as only the top eight teams qualify. **Zakiya Mahoney** leads the team with 13.4 points and 4.9 rebounds while **Mikayla Etienne** follows with 11.3 points and 4.1 rebounds.

• TSU is slowly nearing toward a full roster after early injuries. TSU's scoring output has nearly doubled as they average 77.3 points in SWAC play while shooting 43.9 percent.

• TSU was picked to finish sixth while guard **Ataiya Bridges** was named to the 2021-22 Preseason All-SWAC Second Team. The Tigers feature a revamped roster with 12 newcomers and five letterwinners returning.

BRIDGE TO SUCCESS

Graduate guard **Ataiya Bridges** was a big spark off the bench in 2019-20 as she averaged 12.5 points per game. She moved into a starting role in 2020-21 and didn't disappoint as she led TSU with 16.5 points while grabbing 5.2 rebounds and a SWAC-best 3.2 steals.

Bridges has picked up where she left off with four games of 20-plus points and four games with six-plus assists. She's averaging 14.9 points, 4.4 rebounds and 4.5 assists.

FILLING BACK UP

TSU is slowly nearing toward a full roster as TSU has had at least 10 players available over the past two games after a period where there were only seven players available at the start of SWAC.

Since SWAC play began, TSU's scoring output has nearly doubled as they average 77.3 points in SWAC play while shooting 43.9 percent.

AVEN - GER

Andriana Avent has turned into a scoring machine for TSU as the newcomer averages 16.7 points in 17 games played.

She has scored in double figures in 14 consecutive games.

RUNNING LIKE A LEXUS

Guard **Shalexus Aaron** is also having a major impact for TSU as she ranks third in scoring with 12 points and 4.3 rebounds. The USC transfer has scored in double figures in 10 of 16 games.

UPDATED COVID-19 POLICY

The SWAC has announced its updated policy regarding Men's and Women's basketball games that are unable to be played due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.

If an institution has a minimum of seven available student-athletes and one countable coach, it must participate in the scheduled basketball contest. If an institution does not have the requisite number of participants, it may still elect at its own discretion to play the contest.

If a team is unable to compete due to COVID-19 related issues the game will be counted as a forfeit for the purpose of the conference standings resulting in a loss for the team that caused the cancellation and a win for the opposing team.

If two opponents are unable to compete due to COVID-19 issues, both teams shall be deemed to have forfeited and each team will be charged with a loss. Institutions at their discretion, can work with each other and the conference office to reschedule the conference contest.

As per NCAA policy, a COVID-19 related forfeit will not change a team's official won-lost record, nor will it impact statistics or coaching records. It will only count for the purpose of the conference standings.

PAC-12 AND SWAC PARTNERSHIP

The Pac-12 and Southwestern Athletic Conferences announced in October the formation of a basketball educational and scheduling partnership that will feature a first-of-its-kind annual home-and-home series between member institutions.

The men's and women's basketball partnership is aimed at creating both a forum for competition, as well as promotion and education around issues of anti-racism and social justice. The partnership is set to begin in Nov. 2022, with six match-ups for the initial men's cycle determined in the coming weeks while the women's games will be announced at a later date.

BET YOU DIDN'T KNOW

The entire nation had a opportunity to find out about Texas Southern University this fall as the university hosted the third Democratic presidential primary debate on Sept. 12, 2020 inside the H&PE Arena. President **Joe Biden** and Vice President **Kamala Harris** both participated in the event.

- TSU was formally established in 1947 with a mission to establish a credible college for African-American students.

- Texas Southern University (TSU) is one of the nation's largest historically black colleges and universities (HBCUs). TSU provides a first class educational experience, offering over 120 baccalaureate, masters and doctoral degree programs in nine schools and colleges. The University has assets exceeding \$250 million and currently has over 10,800 students enrolled.

- The Thurgood Marshall School of Law, was created as a consequence of a 1946 lawsuit brought by **Heman M. Sweatt**. Under the Texas Constitution, which required separate but equal treatment, Mr. Sweatt was refused admission to the University of Texas School of Law because he was black. As a result, the legislature provided for an interim and separate law school for Negroes.

- **Good Morning America** host and NFL Hall of Famer **Michael Strahan** played at TSU from 1989-92.

GAME 1

The Texas Southern women's basketball team dropped their first official match-up of the season against the DePaul Blue Demons on Tuesday night at Wintrust Arena.

The Tigers took the lead to start the game before the Blue Demons went on a 12-0 run within the first three minutes of the first quarter.

The Blue Demons went on to continue that hot streak shooting 80 percent from the field finishing the quarter with a 35-18 lead. TSU would be held just to nine points in the second quarter while the Blue Demons went on to score 25 in the quarter after going 10-of-18 from field goal range and 50 percent from the three-point line to lead 60-27 at the half.

In the second half, TSU kept fighting and began to put more points on the board scoring 44 points. Though the scoring improved it wouldn't be enough to beat the Blue Demons as they defeated the Tigers 114-71.

The Tigers' leading scorer of the 2020-21 season also led the season opener in points as Ataiya Bridges led TSU in scoring with 27 points, four rebounds, and four steals. Alisa Knight followed with 13 points, three rebounds, and three steals followed by 11 points and seven rebounds from Jada Perry. Ashley Austin dished out six assists along with four rebounds from Niya Mitchell.

GAME 2

ARIZONA 93

TSU 38

Niya Mitchell recorded a double-double but TSU struggled from the field as Arizona handed the Tigers a road loss Monday night.

For the second straight game, TSU got off to a slow start as Arizona led 14-2 before TSU would return to the scoreboard. The deficit would increase to 18 with 3:33 left in the quarter before a pair of late baskets from Jada Perry and Ataiya Bridges as TSU trailed 24-9 entering the second quarter.

TSU scored during the nine-minute mark in the second quarter but went on six-minute scoreless drought as Arizona pushed its

lead to 26 points before TSU would score its next basket after Ariana Taylor's layup. The Wildcats remained hot from the field as they closed out the half ahead 48-15.

The Tigers would hold Arizona to its lowest shooting percentage of the game in the third quarter as the Wildcats only made six buckets. TSU would finally settle into an offensive rhythm in the fourth quarter as they scored 17 points on eight field goals as both teams closed out the contest with game highs in points scored.

GAME 3

RICE 59

TSU 47

11/17/21

Rice would lead from start to finish as TSU women's basketball dropped a 59-47 road decision Wednesday night at Tudor Fieldhouse.

Despite playing with only nine players, TSU put forth its best effort to open the contest as Rice led 5-0 until Jada Perry scored a layup for a 5-2 margin. Niya Mitchell would cut the score to 5-4 after catching an Ashley Austin assist but the Owls would counter with a 7-0 run over the next 3:13 to move ahead 12-4 as they were aided by three TSU turnovers during the run. Another layup from Mitchell would end the run as TSU settled down on both ends of the floor and cut its deficit to 15-9 at the end of the quarter.

TSU would miss its first three shots to open the second quarter and by the time they would return to the scoreboard with 7:10 remaining, the deficit increased 20-11. TSU would get back into the contest with a 6-1 run after baskets from Mitchell, Ariana Taylor and Jala Buster as they trailed 23-17 with 4:05 remaining. Turnovers over the final 4:05 would be TSU's own worst enemy as they committed four during that span which prevented them from drawing closer. Rice would lead 27-17 late in the contest until TSU's Skye Green converted a three-point play the old-fashioned way to cut the margin to 27-20. TSU had one final attempt with the half winding down to cut into the deficit even more but couldn't capitalize on a late scoring opportunity as they trailed 27-20 at the half.

Two quick baskets from Zyan Reynolds and Jala Buster drew TSU to within 29-24 less

than a minute in but Rice took advantage of the free throw line and a layup to move ahead 34-24. Ashley Austin connected with Mitchell on a well-placed assist to get back in the scoring column followed by a free throw from Jada Perry to draw within 34-27. On the ensuing possession however, Rice went inside out and moved back up 37-27 after a three-pointer but TSU would keep battling as they turned up the intensity defensively which sparked a mini 4-2 run which drew them to within 39-33. Unfortunately, Rice would connect on three of its next four shots down the stretch along with a pair of free throws at the end of the quarter which turned the tide of the game en route to a 47-34 Rice lead entering the final quarter.

TSU stepped up its game defensively in the final quarter but couldn't take advantage of it on the offensive end on a consistent basis as Rice managed to hold the Tigers off for the win.

Mitchell finished one rebound short of a double-double with 12 points and nine rebounds while Perry added nine points.

GAME 4

Colorado 79

TSU 47

Texas Southern ran into a hot-shooting Colorado squad as they fell 79-47 Tuesday night in a road contest.

CU jumped out to a 9-0 lead before TSU scored its first points of the night after a basket from Shalexxus Aaron. TSU would get things going offensively as they cut the deficit to 13-8 but CU went on a 7-0 run to close out the half while TSU missed its next four shots as CU led 20-8 at the end of the quarter.

TSU would draw to within seven points twice in the second quarter but CU went on a 7-0 run over a two-minute span to move ahead 29-15 with 6:41 remaining. Back-to-back treys from Aaron and Jada Perry drew the Tigers to within 10 at the 5:45 mark. CU would counter and move up by 14 but Andriana Avent's trey with 3:47 left kept TSU close as they were down 35-25. CU once again would try and pull away but the Tigers kept fighting as back-to-back baskets from Perry once again kept TSU down by 10. The Buffaloes would score the final five

points of the quarter to close the half ahead 44-29.

The Tigers narrowed their gap to 12 in the third quarter after a pair of Ataiya Bridges free throws. However, TSU couldn't capitalize on the momentum as they finished the quarter 1-of-6 while committing six turnovers en route to a 58-39 deficit entering the fourth quarter. CU would continue to pull away in the fourth quarter as TSU would only hit a pair of three-pointers and two free throws.

A big first quarter by Texas A&M led to an early lead they would never relinquish as TSU fell 88-43 Thursday night at Reed Arena.

Coming off a 15-day layup, TSU saw Texas A&M claim a 9-0 first quarter lead before TSU would get on the board after Andriana Avent's three-pointer. The Aggies would answer with six straight to lead 15-3 before Jada Perry's basket as TSU trailed 15-5. Texas A&M would remain hot from the field as they closed out the quarter shooting 60 percent while TSU couldn't match their production with only two more field goals as they trailed 27-11 at the end of the first quarter.

TSU settled into an offensive rhythm to begin the second quarter as they opened with a 9-4 run paced by 4-for-6 shooting from the field while the defense held A&M to only two field goals within the first four minutes. However, the momentum swung back to the Aggies over the final 5:50 as they closed out the quarter on an 18-5 run which was sparked by four three-pointers en route to a 49-25 half-time lead.

The Aggies would maintain a 20-point lead throughout the third quarter as they pulled away for good the remainder of the game.

Shalexus Aaron led TSU with 16 points and four rebounds as she shot 4-of-6 from beyond the arc. Jada Perry had five blocks and eight rebounds while Andriana Avent chipped in with eight points.

Four players scored in double figures for TSU but a big second quarter by LSU was the difference as they fell in a non-conference contest Sunday afternoon at the Maravich Assembly Center.

TSU came out the gates clicking as they were tied at 8-all with LSU fueled behind three-pointers from Shalexus Aaron and Andriana Avent. LSU would counter with a 7-0 run to move ahead 15-8 but TSU would close out the quarter by forcing three turnovers while outscoring LSU 8-3 for a 18-16 deficit.

The odds were against TSU early with only eight players available compared to a full roster from SU. However, the first quarter started out evenly as TSU overcame a rebounding disadvantage on the offensive end (7-1) as they trailed 13-12. Fueled by seven turnovers from TSU, Southern would open the second quarter on an 11-0 run to extend its lead to 24-12. Despite the early setback, the Tigers clamped down on the defensive end over the final 3:55 as they held Southern to 1-of-9 shooting while forcing three turnovers. On the offensive end, Shalexus Aaron and Niya Mitchell combined to score 11 of the next 14 points as they willed TSU back into the contest en route to a 29-26 deficit at the break.

Texas Southern endured a wild roller coaster ride and came up big when needed with the game on the line in the fourth quarter for a 73-66 road win at Grambling State on Wednesday evening.

With a small roster available, TSU had to set the tone early and did just that as they closed out the first quarter with a 12-2 run for an early 16-6 lead. Shelexxus Aaron led the way offensively with nine points in the quarter while the defense forced nine turnovers and held GSU to only three field goals.

Back-to-back layups from Skye Green upped TSU's lead to 20-6 early in the second quarter but Grambling State tried to chip away as they outscored TSU 8-4 over the next 5:25 to draw within eight at 22-14 at the 3:35 mark. However, TSU regrouped and was a perfect 3-for-3 from the field over the next few minutes as they went on a 7-3 surge to claim a 29-17 halftime lead.

TSU came out of the locker room with the same intensity it had at the close of the first

half as they outscored GSU 13-4 over the first 4:50. With the home team not wanting to suffer embarrassment on its own floor, Grambling State's switch came on as they took advantage of seven TSU turnovers which fueled a 19-3 run and a 45-40 TSU lead entering the final quarter.

Grambling State picked up where it left off to open the fourth quarter with a 9-0 run as they claimed a 49-45 lead with 8:07 left. TSU's Jala Buster was fouled on the ensuing possession and hit two free throws to get TSU back on the board. GSU turned the ball over on its next possession and Andriana Avent made them pay with a huge three-pointer to reclaim a 50-49 lead. Two free throws from Alexis Holt gave GSU the lead (51-50) once again but Shelexxus Aaron nailed another three-pointer for a 53-51 margin. GSU would tie it at 53-all again and TSU overcame a turnover to reclaim the lead as Ataiya Bridges hit two free throws for a 55-53 TSU margin as the clock read 5:48. Grambling would miss its next basket and Bridges came up with a big steal and found Jala Buster for a 57-53 advantage. GSU committed a turnover on the next possession and Alicia Knight connected on a big three-pointer to give TSU a 60-53 lead.

From that point, TSU did whatever it took to hold off Grambling State as GSU closed to within three points on two occasions over the next few minutes. TSU would take advantage of the free throw line and kept GSU at bay en route to its first win over GSU since 2020.

Five players scored in double figures led by 14 each from Buster, Aaron and Bridges. Knight added 13 points while Bridges, Aaron and Green recorded eight rebounds each. Bridges also had five steals on the defensive end.

Andriana Avent scored a career-best 35 points as Texas Southern nearly pulled off a big comeback with only seven available players as Arkansas-Pine Bluff won 86-82 Saturday inside the H&PE Arena.

UAPB stormed out to a 9-0 lead and set the tone for what was about to occur before

TSU's first score on a Skye Green offensive putback. The Lions would extend their lead to 11-3 before TSU roared back and outscored UAPB 18-13 over the final 6:53 as Shelexxus Aaron led the charge with 10 points en route to a 24-22 UAPB lead.

The second quarter was another up-and-down affair as UAPB outscored TSU 10-3 to open the quarter as they led 34-25. Andriana Avent nailed a huge trey to end the run which sparked TSU on both ends of the court as they turned a nine-point deficit to a 37-34 deficit with 3:16 remaining. The Texas Southern Lady Tigers rebounded from a tough home opener in a big way with three players recording double-doubles as they handled Mississippi Valley State 100-66 on Monday evening.

The home team wasted little time in seizing control of the game from the start even though they were down to only seven available players once again. The Lady Tigers were ahead for virtually the entire game save for 2:01, which happened early on in the initial quarter. Contrary to their previous game against Arkansas-Pine Bluff, which saw them work from behind, TSU had little trouble repelling MVSU, a team they had bested eight consecutive times dating back to February 2017. This was kick started by a 10-0 run at the 4:53 mark in the opening quarter, at which TSU banked in four made 3-point field goals.

The same string of events happened in the second quarter where the team bumped their lead to as much as 21 points (40-19) at the 3:27 mark. However, MVSU wouldn't go away quietly as they cut the deficit to 15 entering halftime.

MVSU opened the second half the same way it closed as they went on a 14-4 run between the second and third quarters as the margin decreased to 47-39 with 6:31 remaining. By the end of the third quarter, TSU would regain its momentum as they closed out the quarter ahead 71-50 behind the strength of 20 points scored in the paint which fueled a 24-11 surge.

The home team grew their lead once again in the fourth quarter to put the game well out of reach for good. Propped by their shooting, which never steered below 44 percent in each quarter, TSU hit the 100-point mark for the first time this season. It was also the first time since Jan. 6, 2020 that the team reached

the 100-point barrier.

Freshman Alisa Knight led the team which featured a quartet of players with double figures against MVSU. Knight scored 26 points with 10 rebounds while Ataiya Bridges and Shalexxus Aaron enjoyed similar exemplary performances as they scored 22 and 25 points, respectively. Bridges also dished out 10 assists while Aaron grabbed 10 boards. Fresh off scoring 35 against UAPB on Saturday, Andriana Avent scored 12 points and garnered six rebounds, two assists, and two blocks.

The Lady Tigers will hit the road and travel to Mississippi where they will take on Alcorn State for their next game on Saturday, Jan. 15. Tip-off is scheduled for 1 p.m.

The roles reversed in the third quarter as Alcorn State opened with a 13-4 run during the first four minutes. TSU would weather the storm from that point as they regained the lead on three occasions but ASU went on 6-0 run aided by three-point shooting to claim a 49-48 lead entering the final stanza.

The Lady Braves upped their lead to 58-54 midway through the fourth quarter as TSU committed four turnovers during that span. AAMU would get within four on two occasions from that point but TSU regrouped after an AAMU technical foul coupled with a Jada Perry layup as it upped the margin back to 28-22 at the 4:34 mark. en route to a 13-all tie. However, the second quarter was a different story as ASU took advantage of four turnovers and near-perfect shooting (4-of-6) as it fueled a 13-4 run during the first four minutes.

Prairie View A&M jumped out to an early 9-2 lead fueled by the crowd but TSU would regroup after an early timeout as Shalexus Aaron hit a trey followed by Andriana Avent's two free throws for a 9-8 deficit. The Panthers would respond with a 7-0 run to move ahead 16-8 but TSU countered and scored five straight for as Ataiya Bridges' layup brought the score to 16-14 PVAMU. TSU would settle down as the quarter concluded as they outscored PVAMU 7-4 to lead 21-18.

The second quarter was another back-and-forth affair with three ties within the first 6:43. A three-point play by PVAMU off a blocked shot led to a 30-27 deficit which would grow to 32-27. A jumper by Bridges off the glass closed the gap to 32-29 at the 2:17 mark but turnovers would haunt TSU again as PVAMU scored again off a TSU turnover to move ahead 34-29. PVAMU would increase its lead to 36-30 at the 1:46 mark but Aaron once again came big with a trey to cut it to 36-33. The Panthers wouldn't go away easily as they opened the fourth quarter on a 14-3 run to draw within 68-65 with 4:50 on the clock. For the second straight contest, TSU women's basketball rode the strength of a late second half run as Florida native Jada Perry posted a double-double as TSU recorded a 74-57 win at Florida A&M on Saturday which was shown live on NBA TV.

TSU wasted no time in setting the tone with an early 10-0 lead as Shalexus Aaron drained two three-pointers to open the game. However, Florida A&M didn't fold after the early

deficit as Anisja Harris took on TSU herself with 10 consecutive points. She was joined by Tia Bradshaw as the Rattlers claimed an 18-16 first quarter lead.

The three-ball was FAMU's friend early in the second quarter as they opened with a 10-0 run to claim a 28-16 lead before Ataiya Bridges' layup to close the gap to 28-18. FAMU would maintain a double-digit lead over the next two minutes but TSU regrouped and turned up the intensity on both ends. Defensively, TSU shut out FAMU the remainder of the half while TSU made up ground with four free throws to fuel a 9-0 run as they trailed 32-27 at the half.

The third quarter saw TSU regain a 34-33 lead with 7:31 remaining after Ariana Taylor's three-point play. The lead was brief as FAMU scored with 6:42 left but it was evenly played from that point as both teams scored 12 points each as the Rattlers led 45-43 to end the third quarter.

Both teams went back-and-forth as the quarter began but Andriana Avent picked off a pass and Taylor drew a foul down low and made two free throws to trail 50-49 at the 5:40 mark. Thirty seconds later, Bridges found a wide open Alisia Knight for a backdoor layup and TSU forced another FAMU turnover on the ensuing possession. Bridges would hit 1-of-2 free throws and TSU forced another turnover on the ensuing possession which led to an Avent trey and a 55-50 lead. The TSU women's basketball team's three-game winning streak came to an unfortunate end as Bethune-Cookman won a 71-67 back-and-forth affair Monday evening inside Moore Gymnasium.

BCU stormed out to a 13-1 lead within the first 2:33 but TSU would wake up and respond with a 9-2 run led by three points each from Alisa Knight and Shalexus Aaron. Both teams settled down after the early runs and began a see-saw contest as BCU outscored TSU 10-7 the remainder of the way. Turnovers didn't help TSU during that span as they committed four during that span which kept BCU's offense fueled.

TSU turned the intensity up to open the second quarter with a 9-2 run led by Ataiya Bridges' five points while the defense forced four turnovers. Trailing 25-23, TSU and BCU both evened it up as the half ended as BCU claimed a 32-30 halftime lead.

BCU outscored TSU 6-2 to open the third quarter but TSU kept chipping away like an ice block as back-to-back baskets from Jada Perry and Andriana Avent gave TSU a 39-38 lead with 5:58 remaining. TSU would up the margin to 43-38 after a Perry jumper and seemed like they were ready to take control. However, the team would only hit one field goal over the final 5:03 but scored four points from the free throw line as they led 49-47 at the end of the third quarter.

Bethune-Cookman would regain a 51-49 lead with 8:50 left in the final quarter but TSU regained a 53-52 lead after two Avent free throws 30 seconds later. BCU would answer with a trey to move back on top and pushed its lead to eight (67-59) with three minutes left. TSU would come charging back and had a chance to tie late but misfired as BCU sealed the game from the free throw line.

Bridges led TSU with 23 points followed by 11 from Avent and 10 by Perry. Alisa Knight had seven rebounds, four assists and four steals.

Ataiya Bridges scored 34 points while Jada Perry had a double-double as TSU held off Grambling State for a 96-86 win on Saturday afternoon inside the H&PE Arena.

Grambling State jumped out to a 10-2 lead three minutes in as they were nearly flawless from the field. However, the roles would reverse as the first quarter came to a close as Jada Perry and Andriana Avent combined to score 13 points over the final 5:44 as the Lady Tigers shot 8-of-11 from the field to trail 21-20.

Grambling State would open the second quarter with a layup but TSU answered as Ataiya Bridges nailed a three-pointer. With a big crowd on hand and into the game, the team began to feed off the crowd's energy and was hot from the three-point line with three made as they went on a 17-4 run over the next four minutes to lead 37-27. However, Grambling State wouldn't go away and TSU had a case of the turnover bug with three over the next three minutes they went on an 11-5 run to draw within 42-38.

Despite the temporary setback, TSU closed out the half on an 8-2 run as Ataiya Bridges scored five points while forcing a pair of turnovers as TSU went into the half ahead 50-40.

TSU started the second half strong as they outscored GSU 8-1 to claim an 18-point lead (59-41) after Ariana Taylor's three-pointer with 5:50 remaining. Once again, Grambling State would fight back as they went 6-of-8 and 3-for-3 on three-pointers during a 16-5 run to draw within 64-57. Andriana Avent would answer with a big three-pointer to move back ahead by 10 but Alexis Holt scored a layup for GSU to close within eight. Avent and Bridges combined for the final five points as TSU finished the third quarter ahead 72-61.

Four turnovers by TSU fueled Grambling State's latest run as they were perfect from the field midway through the final quarter as TSU's lead was reduced to 78-74 with 5:25 left. Jada Perry came up with a big basket to cut GSU's momentum and TSU continued to hold court over the next few minutes. Ahead 90-82 with 1:47 left, GSU had one late charge

left in them as they outscored TSU 4-3 to close within 92-86 with 46 seconds left.

GSU would miss a layup with 41 seconds left and Bridges was fouled with 33 seconds left. Bridges went 4-of-4 from the line to close out the contest as TSU completed the season sweep.

Bridges led TSU with 34 points and seven assists followed by 23 from Avent and 21 from Perry. Shalexus Aaron added 10 while Perry completed the double-double with 13 boards.

Andriana Avent led four players in double figures as TSU used a fourth quarter surge to defeat Southern 87-77 on Monday night.

TSU jumped out to a 19-9 lead less than six minutes in behind a team effort. A 6-1 run by Southern cut the deficit to 20-15 with 3:11 remaining but TSU turned the heat up to close out the half as Ataiya Bridges scored five points within the final 46 seconds as TSU ended the half ahead 29-16 after a 9-1 surge.

Five turnovers within the first five minutes allowed Southern to creep back into the game as they outscored TSU 13-2 to get within 31-29. Andriana Avent answered with a big three-pointer to give TSU a 34-29 lead and was a one-woman wrecking crew to close out the half as she scored the final eight points. However, Southern was hot from the arc as they hit a trio of three pointers to tie the contest at 42-all at the half.

SU would open the third quarter with a basket and regained a 44-42 lead. They would lead by as much as five but TSU responded and reclaimed a 53-51 lead after Alisia Knight's three-point play the old-fashioned way. SU would regain the lead at the 3:56 mark on a three-pointer and closed out the quarter ahead 63-62.

TSU's Jada Perry opened the fourth quarter with a big basket to move TSU ahead and Knight stole a pass and scored as TSU went ahead 66-63. SU would close to within 66-65 after two free throws but TSU held them off as they forced three turnovers over the next three minutes. One of the most decorated players in the history of women's basketball, Cynthia Cooper-Dyke returns for her fourth season leading the Texas Southern women's basketball program as its head coach.

Faced with the challenges of COVID-19 in 2020-21, Cooper kept TSU competitive despite the lack of non-conference opportunities and the injury bug. Senior guard Ataiya Bridges excelled under Cooper's watch as she emerged from the team's sixth-man the previous season to an all-conference performer who led TSU with 16.5 points per game while grabbing 5.2 rebounds and a SWAC-best 3.2 steals.

Cooper-Dyke made an immediate impact in her return to TSU during the 2019-20 campaign as the team placed second in the SWAC with a 14-4 mark and a 19-10 overall record. TSU advanced past the first round of the SWAC Tournament for the first time since 2018 as she inherited a roster which featured only five returnees. In addition, TSU had one of its best preseason performances in program history with five wins over teams from mid-major conferences. During the month of December, TSU's NCAA RPI rating was 62 and was the fourth-highest RPI in the state of Texas.

Cooper-Dyke served as TSU's head coach during the 2012-13 season before taking the reins at her alma mater, Southern California. She led the Lady Tigers to a 20-12 record and a trip to the postseason Women's NIT in her only season at TSU. She had a 70-57 record in four seasons at USC before stepping down in 2017. Cooper-Dyke provided color commentary for Texas Southern basketball home broadcasts on AT&T Sports Net Houston during the 2017-18 season.

Cooper-Dyke arrived at TSU in 2012 after spending the past two seasons at UNC-Wilmington where she led the Seahawks to two of their most successful campaigns in 2010-11 and 2011-12, guiding the squad to a school-record 24 victories (2010) and its second consecutive postseason appearance with an at-large berth in the 2012 Postseason Women's National Invitation Tournament. During the 2010-11 season UNCW was victorious in its first postseason contest, recording a 63-54 victory over Richmond before falling to Eastern Michigan in the second round.

That same year Cooper-Dyke was named CAA Coach-of-the-Year, marking the third time in her six-year collegiate coaching career that she has earned Coach-of-the-Year accolades. Freshman point guard Alisha Andrews garnered CAA Rookie-of-the-Year honors, while seniors Brittany Blackwell and Martha White were First and Second-Team All-Conference selections, respectively. All three players were named to the league's All-Defensive Team.

Cooper-Dyke also achieved a personal milestone during the 2010-11 season, recording her 100th collegiate coaching victory with an 85-68 triumph at Northeastern on Jan. 23, 2011.

Cooper-Dyke was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on August, 13, 2010. Part of the largest induction class in the Hall of Fame's history, Cooper-Dyke was enshrined along with Karl Malone and Scottie Pippen, longtime LA Lakers owner Dr. Jerry Buss, St. Anthony's (N.J.) high-school coach Bob Hurley, Sr., as well as former players Dennis Johnson, Gus Johnson and international star Maciel "Ubiratan" Pereira, all of whom will be honored posthumously. Also included in the enshrinement ceremony were the 1960 and 1992 US Men's Olympic teams.

The former college great, Olympic gold medalist and Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA) Most Valuable Player was named the ninth head coach in UNCW's history on May 10, 2010 following a successful five-year stint at Prairie View A&M in central Texas.

Cooper-Dyke joined the Prairie View program in May of 2005 and guided the Lady Panthers to their first Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) regular season title, SWAC Tournament crown and NCAA Tournament berth in 2006-07, collecting conference Coach-of-the-Year honors.

PVAMU repeated as SWAC regular season champions in 2008 and 2009 under Cooper-Dyke. The 2008 club made its first appearance in the WNIT and Cooper-Dyke was voted SWAC Coach-of-the-Year for the second time in 2009 after leading the Panthers

to their second NCAA Tournament appearance. Cooper-Dyke was recently voted into the SWAC Hall of Fame as a result of her work at PVAMU.

Born in Chicago but raised in the Watts neighborhood of Los Angeles, Cooper-Dyke was a four-year standout at Southern California, where she sparked the Women of Troy to back-to-back NCAA championships in 1983 and 1984. She later completed her Bachelor's Degree at Prairie View A&M.

Cooper-Dyke collected five medals while representing the United States. She won a gold medal at the 1987 Pan American Games in Indianapolis, captured gold at the 1988 Seoul Olympics, claimed gold at the 1986 and 1990 FIBA World Championships and won bronze at the 1992 Barcelona Olympic Games.

Cooper-Dyke began her professional career overseas and played 10 seasons in Spain and Italy. She returned to the United States in 1997 to play with the Houston Comets of the newly-formed WNBA.

She subsequently led the Comets to four consecutive WNBA championships and was named WNBA Finals MVP four times. Cooper-Dyke was voted the league's MVP in 1997 and 1998 and was a four-time WNBA All-Star before retiring in 2000.

Cooper-Dyke moved into the coaching ranks in 2001 as the head coach of the Phoenix Mercury and spent two seasons on the sidelines before returning to the Comets' playing roster briefly until an injury curtailed her season in 2003. She announced her final retirement prior to the start of the 2004 campaign and finished as Houston's all-time leader in scoring (2,601 points), free throw percentage (.871) and assists (602).

Cooper-Dyke, who was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2010 and the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame in 2009, has also been active beyond the basketball court. In 2000, she published her autobiography, "She Got Game: My Personal Odyssey," chronicling her childhood, basketball career and her mother's battle with breast cancer.
