Pride on the Court (basketball) - This is definitely a much larger program. We partnered with the Yonkers school district and Nike's "BETRUE" campaign for a two-day event. On the first day, we brought Chris Mosier, an American transgender advocate and triathlete, as a guest speaker. He spoke to collegiate and high school basketball teams, as well as representatives from all GSA clubs from within the Yonkers school district, about his journey and the importance of acceptance and being an ally. The second day featured "Pride" competitions for both collegiate and high school teams. The intent was for admissions were donated to GLESN; however, plans were hampered by inclement weather that caused the high school games to be relocated.
