The NAIA has long been a leader in positive change regarding inclusion in sports. For example, it was the first athletics association to sponsor both men's and women's championships and it was the first collegiate athletics association to invite Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) into membership. Included in the NAIA strategic plan (2021-24) was a diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) pillar focused on supporting member institutions with their DEI initiatives.

The Conference Commissioners Association (CCA) and the Council of Presidents (COP) recognized and supported the need for expanded efforts in the area of DEI. Multiple programs within the NAIA like the CCA Respect, Inclusivity, Support and Education (RISE) and the Leadership, Diversity and Inclusion (LDI) group already focused on DEI initiatives.

To streamline their work, the NAIA announced in October 2021 that the COP voted to combine the

CCA RISE and LDI groups into a more broadly focused committee, which became the NAIA RISE Committee. The NAIA RISE Committee aims to increase DEI awareness, governance, representation and promotion of career opportunities within the NAIA. A couple of the programs currently supported by the NAIA RISE Committee include the Governance and Leadership Academy and Senior Woman Leader (SWL) development. Each program seeks to support member institutions and conferences in their pursuit of creating and/or maintaining an inclusive culture on their campus.

The NAIA does not require member institutions to participate in the programs, but highly encourages it due to the benefits gained from taking part. For example, the design of the NAIA Governance and Leadership Academy provides minorities and women participants training on NAIA governance issues and strategic initiatives, an introduction to NAIA committee work, prepares them for NAIA committee service, and positions them for opportunities to advance their careers within the NAIA. Any person that is in a working

capacity (i.e., administrator, staff, coach with administrator duties, graduate assistant, etc.) within the athletics department, regardless of title, and is a minority or female can be nominated by their institution and selected by their conference to attend (with the exception of undergraduate students).

Another example of these benefits includes support and resources for the Senior Woman Leader (SWL) role. The NAIA legislation states that by August 1, 2023, each member institution must have an SWL designated on their campus. The NAIA RISE Committee can help with education and training for this role. The SWL subcommittee has held monthly lunch and learns, developed an SWL Facebook community, and established a partnership with Women Leaders in College Sports to provide resources, strategic planning, and best practices for member institutions on implementing the SWL role

Through the RISE program, the NAIA has and will continue to provide an avenue for membership to participate in training and programming aimed at influencing positive change and support for member institutions and conferences.
