

#### THE OPENING TIP

- Northern Arizona hosts Northern Colorado and North Dakota this week in the Walkup Skydome, coming off its first win in over a month last Saturday against Southern Utah.
- The Lumberjacks snapped their eight-game skid with a convincing 72-55 victory over the Thunderbirds on the road. NAU, who claimed victory in Cedar City for the second straight season, picked up its second Big Sky win and carries a 5-18 overall record and 2-10 Big Sky mark into the week.
- NAU had four players score in double-figures against Southern Utah, led by redshirt senior Olivia Lucero who scored an efficient 24 points to up her season average to 16.3 per game - the highest it has been since Dec. 28. Lucero still ranks 10th in the conference in scoring and third in assists at 4.5 per game.
- Junior Tate Tsingine and sophomore Peyton Carroll both scored 10 points off the bench last Saturday to aid the Lumberjacks' cause. Behind their efforts, NAU recorded 26 bench points which marked its second-highest total in a game this season.
- Junior Kaleigh Paplow was one of many 'Jacks to find their shooting stroke as she notched 13 points in addition to eight rebounds, four assists and four steals. Paplow ranks third on the team in scoring (10.8), second in rebounding (7.2) and assists (3.2) and leads NAU with 1.5 steals per game.
- NAU broke 70 points for the first time in eight games, coincidentally last doing so in its last win on Jan. 4. The Lumberjacks are 4-4 this season when scoring at least 70 points and 1-14 when they score less than 70. NAU is averaging 67.4 points per game. The 55 points allowed on Saturday to Southern Utah were the second-fewest this season by NAU.

#### THE NORTHERN COLORADO SCOUT

- Northern Colorado has won four straight, including 75-52 and 71-69 victories over Idaho State and Weber State respectively last week at home, and currently resides in first place of the Big Sky at 10-3 in conference. The Bears, who were the preseason favorite in both the Big Sky Media and Coaches Preseason Polls, are 18-6 overall.
- Savannah Smith is one of two Bears ranked in the top eight of the conference in overall scoring with a team-leading 17.9 points per game. She is averaging 20.6 points per game in conference play, and is fifth in the league with 2.1 steals per game for the season.
- Savannah Scott is eighth in the conference with 17.1 points per game and sits in 10th with a .382 three-point percentage. Scott also owns the Big Sky's second-highest free throw percentage at .879.
- Northern Colorado is averaging 69.4 points per game, which ranks sixth in the Big Sky, while allowing the fourth-fewest points at 64.1 per game. The Bears rank second in the Big Sky in field goal percentage (.445) and are the only team shooting better than 80 percent at the line (.821).

#### THE NORTH DAKOTA SCOUT

- North Dakota started last week with an impressive 80-67 home win over Weber State before falling to Idaho State, 68-55, in its fourth loss in its last five games. The Fighting Hawks were the consensus No. 2 team in the Big Sky preseason polls, but are 4-9 in league play and 11-13 overall.
- Lexi Klabo is a force inside the paint, ranking seventh in the conference with 17.6 points per game in addition to a Big Sky-leading 9.1 rebounds per game. Klabo averages 2.2 blocks per game, second-most in the conference, and is shooting 50.4 percent from the field.
- Fallyn Freije also provides a presence inside with 14.0 points per game, which ranks second on the team behind Klabo. Freije is the Big Sky's fifth-leading rebounder at 8.2 boards per game.
- North Dakota is in the middle of the pack in both scoring offense (67.0) and scoring defense (68.3) while shooting 39.1 percent as a team. The Fighting Hawks rank second behind the 'Jacks in team rebounding at 41.0 per game and are also second in the Big Sky with only 34.4 rebounds per game allowed.

#### **LUCERO ON THE LOOSE**

- With the season winding down, redshirt senior Olivia Lucero has taken her performance to another level over her last six games. Since being held to six points against Idaho State on Jan. 6, Lucero has averaged averaged 18.8 points per game.
- She has been efficient, shooting 45.8 percent overall and 50 percent from three.
- Lucero has also hit the glass, averaging 7.0 rebounds per game. During this span, Lucero has recorded at least six rebounds in five of six games.

#### KHI COMING ALIVE

- Freshman Khiarica Rasheed has also upped her game of late. Over the last five games, Rasheed is averaging 9.4 points and 6.6 rebounds per game while shooting 50 percent from
- Of her 33 rebounds, 18 have been on the offensive glass at an average of 3.6 per game.
- Rasheed has shot 22-for-27 (81.5 percent) at the free throw line over the last five games raising her season percentage from 46.7 percent to 59.7 percent.

#### **STREAK BUSTER**

- Since defeating Weber State on Jan. 4, NAU had dropped eight straight games by an average margin of 15.7 points per game. Six of the eight defeats were by 15 points or more and three were by 20-plus points.
- Over that eight game stretch, the Lumberjacks' field goal percentage was .342 with a threepoint percentage of .263. Conversely, NAU's opponents' field goal percentage is .421 and three-point percentage is .385.
- However, NAU busted its season-long losing streak on Feb. 10 at Southern Utah by busting its recent trends. The Lumberjacks shot 45.2 percent overall and 44.4 percent from behind the arc in the 72-55 win over the Thunderbirds. Defensively, NAU held Southern Utah to just 32.7 percent shooting and 16.7 percent on threes.

#### **WANTED: FASTER STARTS**

- Corresponding with their offensive struggles in conference play, NAU has been slowed by first quarter starts in league games.
- The 'Jacks are shooting just 33.9 percent (62-183) from the field and 20.3 percent (12-59) from three during the first quarter in Big Sky games. Compared to non-conference play, the Lumberjacks shot 44.2 percent overall and 38.2 percent from three in the first quarter.
- NAU has been outscored in the first quarter in nine of 12 conference games, including three times by double-digits, after being outscored just six times in 11 non-conference games.
- Overall, NAU is 2-13 this season when trailing after the first quarter and 1-8 in Big Sky play.

#### **OFFENSE, WHERE ART THOU?**

- The Lumberjacks are 11th in the Big Sky in scoring offense (60.1) and field goal percentage (.354) and last in three-point field goal percentage (.272) in conference play. They are ninth with 5.4 three-pointers made per game.
- NAU's four lowest shooting games of the season have come in conference games. The Lumberjacks shot 23.4 percent on the road at Montana State on Dec. 30, 27.5 percent versus Montana on Jan. 27, 28.3 percent versus Idaho State on Jan. 6 and 30.2 percent at home versus Montana State on Jan. 25.
- Entering conference play, the Lumberjacks had the second-highest scoring offense (75.5), fourth-best field goal percentage (.429) and fourth-best three-point percentage (.351) in the Big Sky.

#### **SCORIN' AND DISHIN'**

- Redshirt senior Olivia Lucero has been a consistent scorer for the Lumberjacks since she first laced it up for the Blue & Gold, but this season she has also been a prolific passer.
- In addition to averaging 16.3 points per game with seven 20-point games, Lucero leads the team with 4.5 assists per game.

#### **McTRIPLE**

- Redshirt senior Kenna McDavis is on record pace to break NAU's single season three-point shooting records. She already ranks seventh in school history with 60 three-pointers.
- Through 22 games played, McDavis is averaging 2.7 three-makes per game. Her three-point shooting average is fifth in the Big Sky.
- No Lumberjack has ever averaged more than 3.0 three-pointers made per game with the current school record held by Amanda Frost at 2.52 during her All-American 2013-14 season.
- At her pace, McDavis would also break Kim Winkfield's school record of 76 three-pointers in 2006-07 before the end of the regular season.

#### **DEFEND THE ARC**

- NAU's success on the scoreboard has been determined behind the arc.
- In NAU's five victories, the Lumberjacks have held their opponents to 21.7 percent three-point shooting with opponents averaging 5.2 makes per game.
- In NAU's 18 losses, opponent three-point shooting leaps up to 38.8 percent at an average of 9.4 made treys.

#### FINISH THE POSSESSION

- At times this season, NAU has been hampered by allowing its opponents to get second and third chances.
- The Lumberjacks' 13.7 offensive rebounds allowed per game are the second-most in the conference and opponents are averaging 13.6 second chance points per game.
- NAU is 2-3 when outscoring its opponents in second chance points and 3-15 when the Lumberjacks are outscored in that column.
- NAU has improved in this regard during conference play though, allowing only 12.1 offensive rebounds per game compared to 15.5 in non-conference play.

#### THE BIG 3

- Redshirt seniors Olivia Lucero and Kenna McDavis and junior Kaleigh Paplow are logging big-time minutes and are carrying the Lumberjacks this season, as expected.
- Lucero leads the conference with 37.1 minutes per game and is 10th with 16.3 points per
- McDavis is tied for 12th in the Big Sky in scoring at 14.7 points per game and is averaging 33.0 minutes per game.
- Paplow is 10th with 34.6 minutes per game and is averaging 10.8 points per game.

#### WILD DOME OPENER

The Lumberjacks scored a gritty first conference win in their first game in the Walkup Skydome on Jan. 4. NAU rallied from a 17-point third guarter deficit to edge Weber State, 76-75, and snapping a six-game losing streak in the process.

- NAU finished the third guarter on a 6-0 run and made 12-of-19 field goals in the fourth guarter to complete the comeback from a 52-37 deficit with four minutes left in the third period.
- The .706 fourth quarter field goal percentage tied NAU's second-best all-time field goal percentage in a guarter. The 'Jacks also matched a season-high with 29 points in the guarter.

#### SLIM MARGIN

- NAU's 3-8 non-conference record was not fully indicative of its play at times before the start of conference.
- The Lumberjacks' average scoring margin of -0.1 in 11 non-conference games indicated that their record could have been closer to .500 - at worst.
- NAU dropped three games by five points or less and five of its eight losses were by sin-
- NAU's three losses by five or fewer points (96-93 to UC Santa Barbara, 88-83 to Rice, 69-67 to Youngstown State) were by a combined 10 points.

#### **LUCERO LOCKS UP POTW**

- Redshirt senior Olivia Lucero was named the Big Sky's Player of the Week on Dec. 12 following her performances against Arizona and Cal Poly. Lucero became the first Lumberjack to receive the honor since Erikka Banks on Jan. 5, 2015.
- She averaged 17.0 points, 7.5 rebounds and 5.5 assists across two games and shot 50 percent from the field, 62.5 percent from three and 91.7 percent from the free throw line.
- Lucero recorded 23 points, eight rebounds and four steals in the victory over Arizona on Dec. 7, and followed that up with 11 points, seven rebounds and seven assists versus Cal Poly on Dec. 9.

#### **WELCOME BACK 'CATS**

- Arizona's return to Flagstaff was not a friendly one as NAU snapped an eight-game losing streak to the Wildcats with an 84-66 victory on Dec. 7. It was Arizona's first visit to Flagstaff
- With the Lumberjacks' convincing victory in the Rolle Activity Center, they posted their first win over their in-state rival from Tucson since 1988. The victory also snapped a 20-game skid to Pac-12 (Pac-10) opponents. NAU last defeated a Pac-12 opponent (Arizona State)
- NAU led by only two at halftime before upping the tempo in the second half. Using its 7,000 foot advantage, the Lumberjacks run and gunned the Wildcats and led by as much as 21 in the fourth quarter.

#### **TUBA CITY: BY THE NUMBERS**

- NAU's 104-49 victory over Antelope Valley on Nov. 27 was an eye-opener, but the numbers go beyond the scoreboard.
- The 55-point margin of victory is the third-largest in school history only trailing NAU's 101-29 victory over Sacramento State on Jan. 19, 2002 and a 95-37 victory over Cal State Northridge on Dec. 2, 1995.
- The 104 points was the second-highest total in school history. NAU scored a school record 109 points in last season's victory over Antelope Valley.
- Six players redshirt senior Kenna McDavis (16), junior Kaleigh Paplow (16), redshirt senior Olivia Lucero (14), freshman Khiarica Rasheed (13), junior Tate Tsingine (10) and freshman Lauren Orndoff (10) - scored in double-figures. All 11 players who appeared in the game got in the scoring column.
- McDavis, Paplow and Rasheed all totaled double-doubles. Redshirt freshman Brianna Le**hew** joined the three players with double-digit rebounds.
- NAU outrebounded Antelope Valley, 70-35, with the 70 rebounds marking the third-most in a game in school history and most since 1982.







#### **MONUMENTAL WIN**

- Head coach Loree Payne will always remember NAU's 62-60 victory over Boise State on Nov. 19, and for good reason. The win was her first at the helm of the Lumberjack program, and it came in impressive fashion.
- NAU trailed Boise State, a 2017 NCAA Tournament qualifier after winning the Mountain West Conference, by 15 with less than eight minutes to play before axing its way back. Redshirt senior Olivia Lucero converted on the game-winning basket with 1.4 seconds left to play.
- The 15-point deficit was the Lumberjacks' largest come-from-behind victory since they overcame a 20-point deficit to Southern Utah on Jan. 13, 2014.
- It was also only NAU's third all-time victory over Boise State in 19 all-time meetings. The Lumberjacks' previous victory over the Broncos was Jan. 21, 1995 when Boise State was still a member of the Big Sky Conference.

#### **NEAR PERFECT OPENER**

- The stage was set for the Lumberjacks, and they delivered quite a show in their first game of the season on Nov. 10. Although NAU fell just shy of a victory, 96-93 to UC Santa Barbara, in head coach Loree Payne's debut, there were a number of highlights.
- The 93 points marked a new school record for points scored in a season opener. The 93 points eclipsed NAU's 90-point output against Yavapai Junior College to start the 1978-79 season.
- NAU's three leading returners, redshirt seniors Olivia Lucero and Kenna McDavis and junior Kaleigh Paplow all notched double-doubles. Lucero led the way with 26 points and a career-high 11 assists while McDavis posted 21 points and 13 rebounds in her first double-double performance. Paplow totaled 16 points and 10 boards. The trio combined to play 114 out of 120 minutes.
- NAU's increased pace was on display as it held a 12-3 advantage in fast break points.
- The Lumberjacks committed the third-fewest turnovers (5) in a game in school history.

#### **KEEPING IT FRESH**

- A trio of freshmen look to be counted on heavily in their first seasons. Kaprice Boston, Lauren Orndoff and Khiarica Rasheed were all part of the opening weekend rotation and showed flashes.
- Orndoff was the only newcomer to start during the opening weekend and averaged 23.0 minutes per game. She averaged 6.0 points and 2.0 rebounds.
- Boston and Rasheed both came off the bench and were the only two players in what was essentially a seven-player rotation. Rasheed averaged 19.0 minutes per game and grabbed six offensive rebounds in two games. Boston was the leading scorer off the bench with 7.5 points per game in 17.5 minutes.

#### IT'S BEEN A WHILE

- Redshirt seniors Olivia Lucero and Kenna McDavis both had efforts that the program had not seen in a number of years during the first weekend of the season.
- Against UC Santa Barbara on Nov. 10, Lucero recorded 11 assists, which was the first double-digit assist game by a Lumberjack since Brittani Lusain had 12 versus CSUN on Dec. 18, 2014.
- McDavis turned it up on the defensive end two days later on Nov. 12 versus Rice, swatting six shots. It was the most blocked shots in a game by a Lumberjack since Ashley Ingle tallied seven on the road at Weber State on Feb. 28, 2008.

#### **NO RUST HERE**

- After missing all but five conference games last season with an injury, redshirt senior Kenna McDavis was back to full health and had a stellar opening weekend.
- Entering the second week of the season, McDavis was third in the Big Sky with both 24.0 points per game and 10.5 rebounds per game. She registered her first two career 20-point games against UC Santa Barbara and Rice, and also notched her first career dou-
- McDavis' 10 three-pointers topped the Big Sky in the first weekend as did her six blocks.

#### **COUNTING ON THE CAPTAINS**

- NAU will be short on depth and experience to start the season, making the trio of redshirt seniors Olivia Lucero and Kenna McDavis and junior Kaleigh Paplow all the more important. The three team captains are the only three players who played significant minutes last season, combining for 1,978 minutes played and 59 games started between them.
- Lucero led the Lumberjacks, and ranked ninth in the conference, in scoring at 14.8 points per game. She logged five 20-point scoring games among her 21 double-digit efforts, while shooting nearly 35 percent from three-point range.
- Paplow's 202 rebounds were tops on the team last season as she averaged 6.7 boards per game. She was a force on the offensive glass, pulling down 2.4 offensive rebounds per game in addition to averaging 8.6 points per game.
- McDavis was a deadly three-point shooter until she got injured and missed nearly all of the Big Sky slate. She missed 13 games in total and wound up averaging 6.6 points per game on 33.3 percent shooting on three-point attempts.

#### **HELLO, MY NAME IS...**

- The Lumberjacks will sport an unfamiliar cast to say the least this season with just six returners on their roster of 16.
- The team has 10 newcomers, half of whom are true freshmen. A sixth is a sophomore walk-on and four are transfers.
- Even half of the team's returners will be unfamiliar to many fans as senior Chelena Betoney, sophomore Peyton Carroll and redshirt freshman Brianna Lehew - logged only 40 combined minutes last season.

#### **LOREE LOWDOWN**

- A renewed sense of optimism surrounds the Lumberjack women's basketball program with the hiring of Loree Payne as head coach. Payne was hired as the 12th head coach in program history on April 7, 2017, replacing last season's interim head coach Robyne Bostick.
- Payne comes to NAU after seven successful seasons in which she guided Puget Sound to a 130-58 overall record. Payne, a two-time Northwest Conference Coach of the Year, was a finalist for the WBCA NCAA Division III National Coach of the Year last season.
- In two of her final three years, she coached Puget Sound to a pair of NCAA Di-

vision III Tournament appearances. Last season, the Loggers posted a 26-3 record, including a perfect 16-0 record in conference play.

Payne previously served as an assistant at Washington, Portland and Northwest Nazarene and was a twotime All-American as a player at Washington.

#### **WE WANNA RUN**

- After her Puget Sound finished last season as the sixth-highest scoring team in Division III at 79.0 points per game, head coach Loree Payne hopes to crank it up a notch with the Lumberjacks with her up-tempo offensive systems.
- NAU is expected to get out and run in transition, utilizing its 7,000 feet elevation to its advantage as much as possible under Payne's direction.
- The benchmark is low in terms of points in transition as NAU averaged just 4.6 fast break points per game last season

#### **INSPIRING NORTHERN ARIZONA**

- On Nov. 27, NAU and Antelope Valley will play a game in Tuba City, a game of significant importance for not only the program, but the entire university.
- As part of the university's continued Native American initiative, and the Athletics Department's commitment to inspiring the entire Northern Arizona region, this will mark the third consecutive year that NAU Basketball will played on Native American land, but the first for the women's basketball team.
- Tuba City, the Navajo Nation's largest community, is also the home of junior Tate Tsingine, adding another layer to this special game. Tsingine, a transfer from Central Arizona College, was an All-State prep player at Tuba City High School.
- Senior Chelena Betoney and sophomore Desirae Gonzalez also have Native American heritage.

#### **CATCH YOU NEXT YEAR**

- The Lumberjacks' practice squad will challenge the team all season with transfers Jacey Bailey and Caitlin Malvar having to redshirt this year.
- Similar to when NAU had to wait through redshirt seniors Olivia Lucero and Kenna McDavis' redshirt seasons, the program will anxiously be looking forward to having Bailey and Malvar eligible next season.
- Both players will be redshirt sophomores in 2018-19. Bailey (Florida Atlantic) is a Division I transfers, while Malvar followed head coach Loree Payne to NAU from Puget Sound.

#### SIGNING ON THE DOTTED LINE

Head coach Loree Payne announced three additions for the 2018-19 season on Nov. 8 during the fall signing period. Sentia Bryant (Mesa, Ariz.), Morgan Gary (Kent, Wash.) and Regan Schenck (Woodinville, Wash.) all signed their National Letters of Intent and will be incoming freshmen next season.

- Bryant will join the Lumberjacks out of Desert Ridge High School. A 6-1 post, Bryant was a nightly double-double waiting to happen as a junior last season, averaging 12.7 points and 12.9 rebounds per game, in addition to 2.8 blocks per game. A 2017 6A All-Region Honorable Mention pick, she shot 46 percent from the field last season and holds her school record with 22 rebounds in a game.
- Gary has starred at Kentridge High School, where she is a two-time First Team All-District selection. Last season, the 5-9 guard averaged 9.8 points, 3.6 rebounds and 2.1 steals per game to help Kentridge win the Washington 4A state championship. She was named to the WIAA 4A Championship Second Team and held a 46 percent field goal percentage.
- Schenck, a 5-7 guard, has enjoyed a record-setting career so far at Woodinville High School in Washington. The school record holder with 447 career assists, Schenck is a three-time KingCo 4A All-Conference player who averaged 10.8 points, 5.9 rebounds, 7.1 assists and 2.4 steals per game as a junior. She competed at the 2016 USA Basketball U17 World Championships Team Trials and led her high school team to the conference championships last

#### FIRST, STABILITY. NEXT, VICTORIES?

- Regardless how this season plays out, NAU will finally have some stability within its program after a rough last couple of years.
- New head coach Loree Payne is the program's third head coach in the last three seasons. Sue Darling, the head coach from 2012-16, was relieved of her duties just prior to last season, forcing Robyne Bostick into the interim role.
- With Payne at the helm, the Lumberjacks hope that success is not far behind. Coaches aside, NAU has not had a winning season in a decade. Over the last 10 seasons, the 'Jacks are only 89-206 with a 54-120 record in the Big Sky. NAU has only three double-digit win seasons in that span.

#### **CLOSE CALLS**

The Lumberjacks' Big Sky record stands at 7-29 over the last two seasons, but all is not lost when looking deeper at the numbers. A few plays here and there, or a few bounces that go in NAU's favor and the Lumberjacks' conference mark would look a whole lot better. Since the start of conference play in 2016, NAU has compiled a 5-15 record in Big Sky games decided by 10 points or less. In games decided by seven points or less, NAU is 2-11.

#### **SEASON OPENING STRUGGLES**

- The Lumberjacks have won just two of their last nine season openers, and overall are just 4-18 in their last 21 season openers.
- Both of their season opening victories since 2007 though have come in the last three years. NAU defeated UC Irvine, 66-35, to open the 2014-15 campaign along with last season's 65-51 victory on the road at UTEP.

## **ROAD WOES**

- The Lumberjacks have to do a better job on the road in order for them to turn their success around. In the last three seasons, NAU is 6-37 in pure road games, not including an 0-4 record in games on a neutral court, bringing its record to 6-41 away from Flagstaff.
- Looking back even further, the 'Jacks are 26-127 away from Flagstaff over the last 10 seasons dating back to the 2006-07 season. Coincidentally, that season is the last time NAU had a winning season, going 20-12 and finishing as the Big Sky tournament runner-up.
- Even more importantly though as it pertains to within the conference, the 'Jacks are just 10-37 on the road in the Big Sky over the last five seasons.

#### **LONG TIME COMING**

- It is not often that NAU is able to lure its in-state rivals to the south up to Flagstaff, but this season the Lumberjacks have a pair of home games against Arizona (Dec. 7) and Grand Canyon (Dec. 14).
- For Arizona, the Wildcats out of the Pac-12 have not played a game at 7,000 feet in two decades. The drought for Grand Canyon is even longer as the Lumberjacks have not hosted the Lopes since 1993.

#### **WE BELIEVE IN US**

- The Big Sky Preseason Polls were not kind to the Lumberjacks, but all that matters is the belief that they have in themselves.
- NAU was voted 11th out of 12 teams in both the Coaches and Media polls coming off a 9-21 season that included a 5-13 conference record.
- The Lumberjacks finished in 10th in the Big Sky last season.

# OVERALL RECORD: 135-76 | RECORD AT NAU: 5-18

A new era of Northern Arizona women's basketball tipped off with the hiring of Loree Payne as the 12th head coach in program history on April 7, 2017.

Payne begins her first season at NAU after seven highly successful seasons at the University of Puget Sound where compiled a 130-58 overall record and a 78-34 record in the Northwest Conference (NWC). A two-time NWC Coach of the Year, she was named a finalist for the WBCA NCAA Division III National Coach of the Year award following her final season. Known for her up-tempo offensive systems, Payne's Puget Sound teams were consistently among the nation's top scoring teams topping out at No. 6 in 2017 at 79.0 points per game.

In Payne's final season at Puget Sound, she guided the Loggers to a school record 26 wins during a 26-3 campaign. Puget Sound captured its first-ever outright regular season NWC championship with a perfect 16-0 record. The 2016-17 season was her second 20-win campaign at Puget Sound as the Loggers never posted a losing record during her seven seasons. Payne also coached the Loggers to two NCAA Division III tournament appearances (2015, 2017) and three straight NWC Tournament championship games (2015-17).

While at Puget Sound, Payne coached 18 players to All-NWC honors including nine to the First Team. In back-to-back seasons, she coached the NWC's Freshman of the Year (Jamie Lange, 2017) and Player of the Year (Emily Sheldon, 2016). Sheldon also earned WBCA All-American Honorable Mention distinction in 2016, and Payne coached three players to D3hoops.com All-West Region honors and Capital One Academic All-District VIII honors.

Prior to arriving at Puget Sound, Payne was an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Washington - her alma mater - from 2007-10. She was responsible in recruiting and developing multiple All-Pac-12 and Pac-12 All-Academic selections, many of whom went on to play professionally overseas. Payne also had stints as an assistant at Portland (2004-07) and Northwest Nazarene (2003-

She jumped right into coaching following a decorated playing career at the Washington where she was a two-time All-Pac-10 First Team selection, District VIII Kodak All-American and Verizon Academic All-District VIII honoree. Payne helped the Huskies reach two NCAA Tournaments, including an Elite 8 appearance in 2001, and one berth in the WNIT. She finished her career as Washington's seventh-leading scorer with 1,675 career points and all-time leader in three-pointers made with 245. A three-year team captain, her name still appears in the school record book in six categories. In 2000 following her freshman year, she was also a member of the USA Women's R. William Jones Cup gold medal team

A native of Havre, Mont. - where she was a 2009 inductee into the Montana High School Association Hall of Fame - Payne earned her bachelor's degree in Psychology from Washington in 2003 and is currently pursuing her master's degree in Counseling at Puget Sound.
