Postgame interviews will be held on the Glenn Warner Soccer Facility field approximately 10 minutes after the match ends. Please notify Chris Forman (at the scorer's table at midfield) of any interview requests during or immediately after the game.

### Photographers

Photographers may shoot from anywhere along the sidelines of the soccer field, excluding the designated team bench areas and the scorer's table area. On the endlines, photographers are allowed only in the area between the sidelines and the edges of the penalty box.

### Television

The Sept. 2 contest with Air Force will be aired on a tape-delayed basis by College Sports Television (CSTV). Check Navysports.com and cstv.com for listings.

### Player Interviews

All interviews with Navy players should be arranged through the Navy sports information office by calling 410-293-8774. Requests should be made at least one day in advance. Interviews may also be scheduled prior to the Midshipmen's regularly-scheduled practices during the season, and during a student-athlete's free time during the day. **PLAYERS' NUMBERS WILL NOT BE GIVEN OUT AT ANY TIME.**

### **The Midshipmen**

Coming off last year's disappointing 5-9-2 record, head coach Rich Miranda and the Midshipmen look to rebound in 2007. Despite losing six starters to graduation, Miranda feels the pieces are in place to surge to the upper division of the Patriot League. The reason for the optimism is a talented group of underclassmen and strong senior leadership, highlighted by team captain Will Riordon. The Mids were devastated a year ago with injuries, but with the majority of the team healthy entering preseason camp, Miranda likes the makeup and chemistry of this year's squad.

"I would like to think we are a little more talented than last year's team, and I feel that the team chemistry is better, which I think will make us a better team," said Miranda, as he enters his third year in charge. "Our spring season was outstanding in terms of developing that chemistry. We gave them a program to follow over the summer and I have confidence that the guys have stuck to that. They are a very tight group and know the deal. They don't want to let each other down."

### **The Forwards**

Miranda has a host of forwards that could step up and take the reigns of the offense. Unlike last year, there is not one dynamic scorer (McKenzie Plank scored eight of Navy's 18 goals), but a group ready to prove themselves.

"We aren't going to have the guy that scores 10 goals this year, but we have a good group of players that will get three, four goals each," said Miranda. "It will definitely be a team effort on the offensive end."

Leading the way will be senior Doug DeVuono. DeVuono, who starred on the Navy club team before it was dropped two years ago, hasn't scored in his Navy career, but had an outstanding spring season and finds himself in the right spot at the right time more often than not.

Helping out will be senior Travis King, who is Navy's current career-leading goal scorer with six goals on just 17 shots, and junior Adam Pennington, a big, strong player who spent the previous two years on the defensive unit.

Sophomore Andrew Garcia also figures to be in the mix after a promising freshman campaign. Miranda feels that if he can score early in the season and develop confidence, he has the potential to explode onto the scene.

A pair of freshmen may also bolster the Navy offense in Raphael Asenime and Mike Porcelli. Asenime is a big, athletic player that Miranda feels needs to be on the field. Porcelli played for a very successful club team and has the potential to help significantly.

### **The Midfielders**

A mix of senior leadership and experience combined with young talent and excitement figures to make the midfield unit one of Navy's strengths this year.

Seniors Eric Gorden, Justin Waskey and Ryan Trespalacios have appeared in 95 games at the position and will give Miranda the leadership that he likes there.

Gorden had an outstanding spring in which Miranda called him the team's best player during that time. He has the potential to be the "set-up" guy or point guard and can play all over the field. Waskey has been a solid player in his three years, but Miranda is looking for more offensive

production than in years past for the Georgetown, Ky., native. Trespalacios has been injured for the majority of the last two years, but when healthy, scored a pair of goals in just 10 games as a freshman.

Meanwhile, three talented sophomores and two freshmen figure to aid the unit.

Cash Elston was off to a fantastic freshman season when a broken leg sidelined him just five games into the season. Elston has the potential to be a dominant player at the position, but showed signs of tentativeness in the spring.

"It will be interesting to see how he bounces back," said Miranda. "He was a little timid in the spring, but if he can come back early with some confidence from the injury and trust that it is healed, he could be an outstanding player this year."

Mark Garcia was a pleasant surprise for Miranda last year, and has the ability to go one-on-one with defenders and beat them downfield.

Chris Marino was one of the best players on the team late last year as a freshman, and Miranda feels now is the time for him to step up his offensive game.

Freshmen Sam Lepley and Josh Pike also figure to be in the mix, mostly in a reserve role.

### **The Defensemen**

Despite losing three of four defensive starters to graduation last year, Miranda feels this unit may be the team's strength.

"We feel that we have a very consistent, steady and reliable group this year," said Miranda. "They won't blow you away with great plays, but they make the right plays and don't make many mistakes."

Leading the way will be the centerbacks — senior team captain Will Riordon and sophomore Scott Robertson. Miranda says that the two players "grew accustomed to each other in the spring, play very similar games and even look alike," referring to both players' reddish hair.

On the sides, six other players, including a pair of freshmen, could step up and contribute. The likely candidate on the left side is senior Anthony Parker, who has moved back from midfield. He was forced to play the position late last year due to injury and played well enough to stay in the back. Miranda notes that Parker is very good in the air and could be dangerous on the offensive end as well on corner kicks and set pieces.

On the right side, three players will likely be fighting for that final spot. Senior Brett Copare had a solid spring, but will be pushed by sophomores Matt Tapajcik and Chris Schneider. The latter two need to develop some consistency, but could become key figures this year.

A pair of freshmen, Alex Foskett and Andy Hampson, will also contribute.

### **The Goalkeepers**

Despite having three experienced goalkeepers on the roster, this position is a big question mark. The reason being is that injuries decimated this position a year ago.

"In my 20 years, I have never seen anything like that as far as goalie injuries," said Miranda. "We need to first of all, get healthy and then have someone step up and take control of the position. Defensively, we would be much better if we knew who our goalie was every game."

Seniors Thomas Jenkins and Evan Barnes both saw action last year, before injuries cut their seasons short. Jenkins, who was the starter as a sophomore in 2005, opened the year in goal, but was able to only play in the first two games of the year. During his sophomore year, Jenkins recorded a 1.22 GAA and a 4-2-1 record. Jenkins suffered a setback this summer, but will be ready to go in the fall.

Barnes stepped in and started the next 11 games, before suffering a season-ending injury. Barnes recorded a 1.28 GAA and a .746 save percentage while recording a 3-6-2 mark and two shutouts.

Lastly, junior Nolan Grebb started the last three games of the year, posting a 1.89 GAA and a .684 save percentage. Grebb's lone win came in a 1-0 shutout at Patriot League preseason favorite American on Oct. 24.

"The position is really up for grabs," said Miranda. "We are just looking for someone to step up and take control."

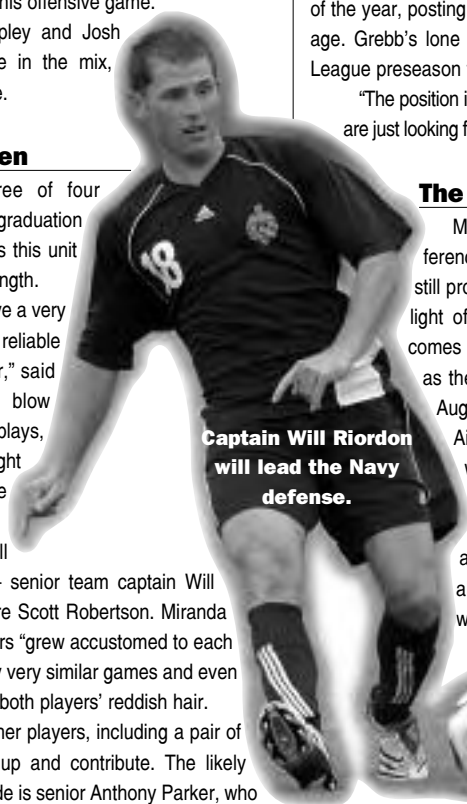
### **The Schedule**

Miranda has toned down the out-of-conference schedule a bit from last year, but it still provides a very stiff challenge. The highlight of the non-conference home schedule comes on the opening weekend of the year, as the Mids host Temple and Air Force on Aug. 31 and Sept. 2. The contest against Air Force, which will be aired by CSTV, will be Navy's first home game against the Falcons since the 1983 season and the first meeting with the Falcons anywhere since 1993. The Mids will also visit Florida for a pair of games and will travel to West Virginia to face the Mountaineers. West Virginia was the Big East Champion and the No. 6 national seed in the NCAA Tournament a year ago.

This year's schedule marks the first time since 1983 that Navy will host both Air Force and Army in the same season, as the Mids host the Black Knights on Nov. 10.

In the Patriot League, Miranda says that Lehigh and Bucknell will be the teams to beat.

"For us to be successful, we have to have success early and gain some confidence. We have to get off to a good start entering the Patriot League," said Miranda. "The race is wide open. There are a ton of one-goal games in this league and the team that scores first typically wins. All the games are competitive and there is a lot of parity in the Patriot League. We hope that we can reverse some of those one-goal games from a year ago and be there in the end."

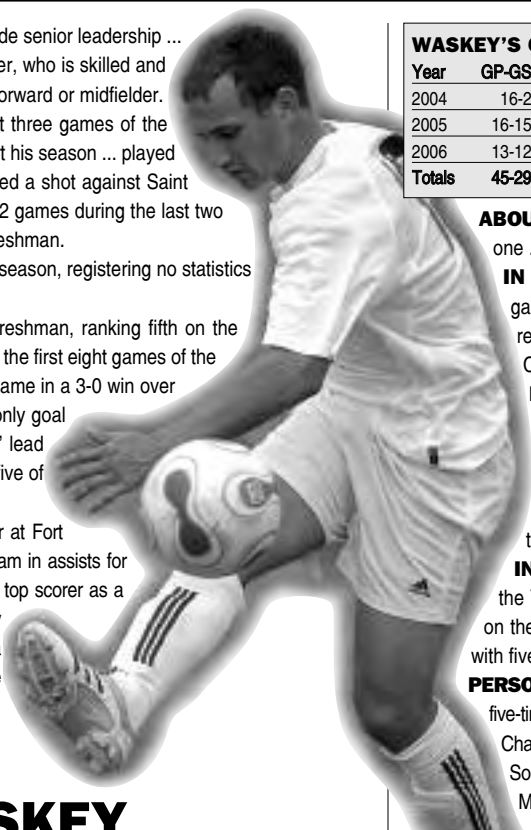

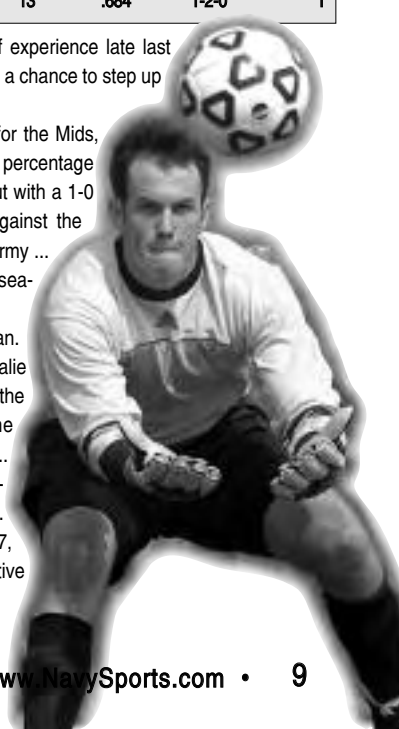

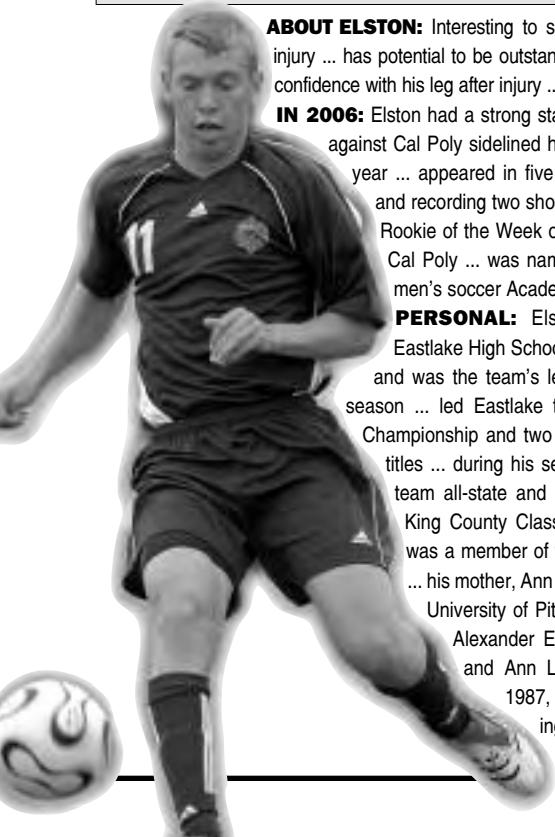

# RICH MIRANDA

**HEAD COACH - THIRD YEAR - WILLIAM & MARY (1985)**

Rich Miranda begins his third year as the head coach of the Navy soccer program and is looking to continue the turnaround in 2007.

Last year, the Mids struggled with injuries en route to a 5-9-2 overall record. In all, 12 players missed at least two games with varying injuries, and the team played zero games with its full compliment of players. The Mids were competitive in almost every game, losing five of the games by one goal, including three in double-overtime.

However, the season did have its highlights. A pair of Mids, Addy Strasdas and McKenzie Plank, garnered first- and second-team All-Patriot League honors respectively in 2006, the Mids recorded impressive wins over Gonzaga and Cal Poly and Navy posted its first Patriot League road win since the 2001 season with a 1-0 victory over defending league champ American.

In 2005, Miranda guided Navy to one of the top turnarounds in the country, improving 4.5 games from the 2004 season (3-10-4) and recording an 8-6-2 record. The improvement was the 15th-best improvement in NCAA soccer in 2005 and earned Miranda Navy's first Patriot League Coach of the Year accolade.

The Mids accomplished the turnaround with an explosive offense, scoring 27 goals for an average of 1.69 goals per game, Navy's highest per-game average since 2000 (1.81 goals per game). Navy had scored a combined 22 goals in the previous two seasons. In 2004, the Mids scored 12 goals, giving Navy a 15-goal jump from one year to the next — the second-largest jump in school history. Lastly, the Mids scored four goals in a game three times in 2005. The last time Navy had scored four goals that many times in a season came in 1994.

Navy's defense was also one of the league's best in 2005, recording five shutouts and allowing just 16 goals, second only to Lehigh's 11 goals allowed.

In the Patriot League preseason poll released a few days before the 2005 season started, the Mids were picked eighth by a near-unanimous decision, despite returning 10 starters. Going into the final day of the season, Navy had a shot to qualify for the Patriot League Tournament. A 2-2 tie on the final day of the regular season with Bucknell gave Navy an 8-6-2 record, its first winning season since 2001.

The fans also noticed Navy's remarkable turnaround. The Mids averaged 646 fans in their seven home games, ranking 43rd nationally. Of teams that didn't appear in the NCAA Tournament, Navy boasted the 15th-best average attendance.

Miranda has also excelled in the homes of recruits, boasting a pair of solid recruiting classes, landing several players that turned down high-profile soccer schools to attend Navy.

Miranda took over the reigns after head coach Dr. Greg Myers stepped down in January of 2004. As a long-time

assistant under Myers, Miranda learned from one of the best and was named the program's fourth head coach in its 86-year history.

Miranda's most recent position was that of assistant men's soccer coach at Navy. Under the direction of Greg Myers, Miranda held that position for 14 years. He helped coach the Mids to a 113-106-24 record during that span, including the 1991 Patriot League regular-season title. During that timeframe, Navy advanced to seven Patriot League Tournaments with three appearances in the finals. Since 1991, Navy has had 42 players earn All-Patriot League honors, including five players that won either Offensive or Defensive Player of the Year or Rookie of the Year accolades.

In the summer of 2005, Miranda, along with assistant coach Patrick Kennedy, guided the Maryland State Olympic Development Program (U-16 Team) to its first regional Championship at the U.S. Youth Soccer Regional Championships held at Rider University in June. The team won the championship in double overtime on penalty kicks over the New York East State Team.

Miranda earned his bachelor's degree in business management from William & Mary in 1985 and his master's degree in sports management from Richmond in 1990.

Miranda spent a year as an assistant soccer coach at William & Mary and two seasons as an assistant at Richmond during the 1986 and 1987 seasons. He has been an active participant in the Olympic Development Program for youth soccer in the local area since 1989.

During his collegiate career at William & Mary, Miranda was a four-year letterwinner for the Tribe. He earned first team All-Colonial Athletic Association honors and first team All-South Region honors, as well as the Tribe's Rookie of the Year during his freshman campaign. Miranda also competed on the international level, including England's Tottenham Hotspurs, Canada's Under-18 National Team and the Toronto Blizzard Reserves from the North American Soccer League (NASL).

"I learned a great deal about the game from a legend of the game itself," said Miranda. "It is a distinguished honor to represent such a respected institute of higher learning as the men's head soccer coach. I look forward to aligning the goals of the soccer program with the goals of the NAAA which will, in turn, create the winning tradition that Navy has enjoyed during its history of athletic competition. Go Navy!"

## **PATRICK KENNEDY**

**ASSISTANT COACH - SEVENTH YEAR AT NAVY - NAVY (1996)**

Patrick Kennedy enters his third year as an assistant coach for the Navy soccer program after spending the previous four years as a volunteer assistant coach. An outstanding recruiter, Kennedy has helped improve the talent level of the Navy soccer program over the last two seasons.

Kennedy has been a member of the Navy coaching staff for the last six years. As a volunteer coach for four years, Kennedy worked full-time in Washington D.C., for Naval Criminal Investigative Service. Before working in the government sector, he served seven years on active duty in the United States Navy and was stationed in San Diego, Washington, D.C., and overseas. While serving in the military, he was selected to play with the All-Navy and All-Armed Services teams and represented the U.S. Armed Forces Team in Cairo, Egypt, at the World Military Games in 2000 and 2002. His last duty station was the Office of Naval Intelligence in Suitland, Md., before resigning his active duty commission as a Lieutenant in 2002.

Kennedy started his coaching career in youth select soccer in San Diego in 1997, where he coached the Villa Soccer Club. He has coached at a number of elite summer camps including Hubert Volgelsinger Soccer Academy, Virginia Tech and Navy. In 2005, he received his "A" coaching license through the United States Soccer Foundation. This past May 2007, Kennedy received an International Advanced

Professional Coaching certification from Charles University in Prague, Czech Republic. This program was a 3-week advanced coaching course and included stays with Czech National Youth Teams, and professional teams AC Sparta, and Bohemians Club teams.

Kennedy continues to coach the Maryland State Olympic Development Program (U-16 & U-17 Teams). He and Coach Rich Miranda led the Maryland U-16 State Team to its first ever Regional Finalist at the US Youth Soccer Olympic Development Regional Championships held at Kirkwood, Delaware this past June.

Kennedy comes from a long line of soccer influences, as his father was the head coach at Belmont Abbey College before starting the men's soccer program at Wake Forest University from 1979-1987. His uncle, Matt Kennedy, was a professional goalkeeper and played in the now-defunct Major Indoor Soccer League (MISL) and the National American Soccer League (NASL). He coaches for the Concord Fire youth select teams in Atlanta, Georgia and conducts clinics and soccer camps around the country.

Kennedy continues to play competitive soccer on a premier men's team in Northern Virginia Soccer League. Kennedy resides in Alexandria, Va., and is currently pursuing his master's degree at the George Washington University in Engineering Management with a focus in Crisis and Emergency management.



## **MARK GOWER**

**ASSISTANT COACH - NINTH YEAR AT NAVY - MARYLAND (1987)**

Mark Gower returns for his ninth season as an assistant coach to Rich Miranda, working primarily with Navy's goalkeepers.

Under Gower's tutelage, former standout Brian Steckroth earned All-America honors in 2001, Navy's first All-American in 26 years. Steckroth posted a career goals-against average of 0.97, breaking the Patriot League career record. He also guided Frank DiFilippo to second-

team All-Patriot League honors in 2004, while posting a 0.97 GAA and 97 saves, the second-highest total in school history. Two years ago, current senior Thomas Jenkins came on in the middle of the year and recorded one of the top seasons ever by a Navy sophomore goalkeeper. Three of Navy's four goalkeepers last year suffered an injury at some point during the year, but the group still recorded a .734 save percentage and a 1.48 GAA.

Prior to arriving in Annapolis, Gower spent five seasons as an assistant coach with the Georgetown women's team

(1994-98). Gower entered the coaching ranks as an assistant coach at Suitland High School (1990-92), taking over the head coaching duties in 1993. Suitland made the playoffs in all four of his seasons after missing the postseason for 30 consecutive years. He has been coaching goalkeepers since he began club coaching in 1986.

Gower, a 1987 graduate of Maryland, recently earned a master's degree in counseling psychology at Bowie State.



In its second decade of combining academic and athletic excellence, the Patriot League sponsors 23 sports – 11 for men and 12 for women. Initially started as a NCAA Division I-AA football conference in 1986, the Patriot League became an all-sport conference in 1990 and includes American, Army, Bucknell, Colgate, Holy Cross, Lafayette, Lehigh and Navy as full members, and Fordham and Georgetown as associate members in football. These institutions are among the oldest and most prestigious in the nation and their alumni have, and continue to play leadership roles in shaping our country.

Since 1998, the Patriot League has ranked first each year among all Division I conferences awarding athletic aid in the NCAA Graduation Success Rate report. In addition, the Patriot League finished as one of the nation's leaders in the NCAA Academic Progress Report (APR) among all Division I conferences awarding athletic aid. The APR is used to measure academic eligibility, retention and graduation of student-athletes.

Patriot League student-athletes and teams continue to enjoy success at the national level, with opening round victories coming in several NCAA Championships, including wins in men's basketball during the 2005 and 2006 seasons, a championship game appearance in both football and men's lacrosse, and a sixth-place individual finish at the NCAA Cross Country Championship.

The Patriot League's mission is simple, to provide successful competitive athletic experiences while maintaining high academic standards, and to prepare its student-athletes to be leaders in society.

During the 2006-07 year, Patriot League student-athletes and teams accomplished the following:

- Fourteen Patriot League student-athletes were named *ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-Americans, including Navy's **Lizzie Barnes** (women's soccer), **Kari Weniger** (women's soccer), **Chris Renninger** (golf), **Kelly Zahalka** (women's swimming and diving), **Michael Niemi** (men's cross country/track and field) and **Kirsten Andrews** (women's cross country/track and field).
- The Patriot League had two teams win a game in the NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament for the first time in its history (Bucknell and Lehigh), with 2006 being the second year it sent multiple teams to the postseason.
- **Navy women's soccer** owned the longest winning streak among NCAA Division I schools, posting 19-straight victories, and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time in program history.
- **Navy goalkeeper Lizzie Barnes** posted the seventh-longest shutout streak in NCAA women's soccer history.
- The Patriot League had two post-season participants in the sport of women's basketball for the first time since 2002 with Holy Cross playing in the NCAA Tournament and Bucknell in the WNIT.
- Holy Cross' **Keith Simmons** was named All-America Honorable Mention by the Associated Press in the sport of men's basketball.
- **Navy's Paul Harris** earned All-America status after finishing sixth in the 800 meters at the NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championship.
- Four different men's lacrosse teams spent time in the national polls, including Army, Bucknell, Colgate and **Navy**. Navy ended the year ranked a Patriot League-best eighth in the nation.
- Three Patriot League student-athletes were chosen in the Major League Lacrosse Draft including **Navy's Billy Looney** (first round, fifth pick), Colgate's **Colin Hulme** (second round, 16th pick) and **Navy's Ian Dingman** (third round, 30th pick). Looney became the highest drafted Patriot League student-athlete into MLL.
- Four Patriot League student-athletes were named USILA All-Americans including **Navy's Billy Looney** on the first team and **Navy's Jordan DiNola** and Colgate's **Colin Hulme** and **Brandon Corp** as Honorable Mention selections.
- Five Patriot League student-athletes were selected in the MLB draft including Army's **Nick Hill** and **Milan Dinga**, Bucknell's **Jason Buursma** and **Navy's Mitch Harris** and **Jonathan Johnston**.
- **Navy's Kevin Teague** became the first male diver in Patriot League history to win four consecutive 1-meter and 3-meter Patriot League Championship titles and to be named Patriot League Diver of the Meet four times.

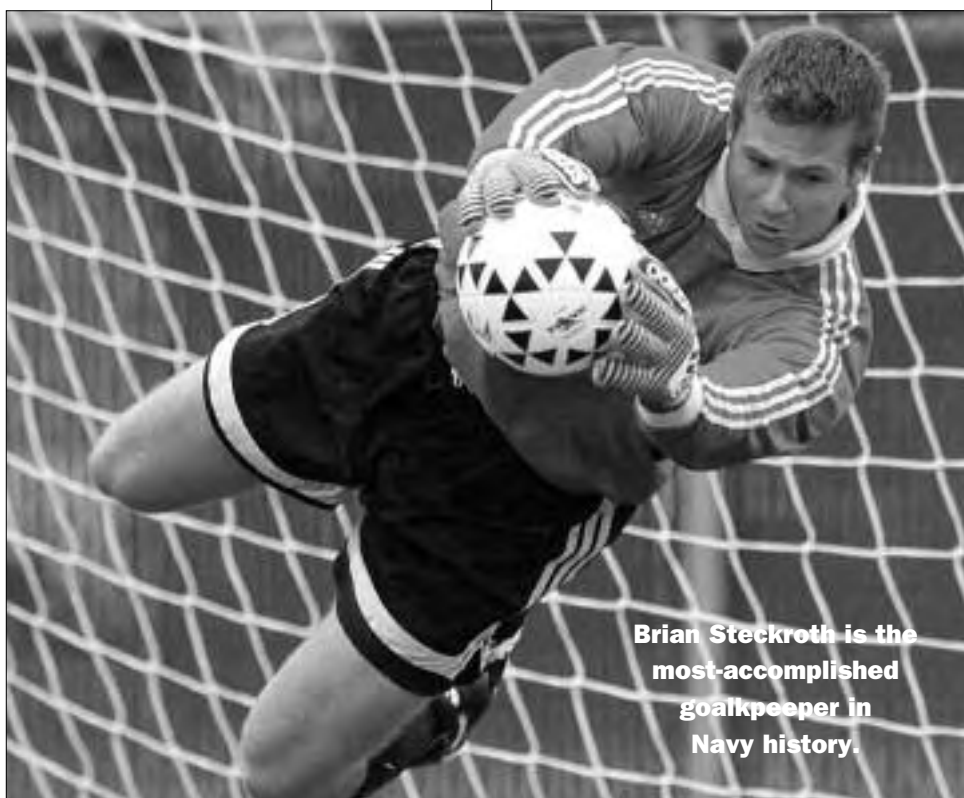

# The United States NAVAL ACADEMY

## ANNAPOLIS

The City of Annapolis has been home to the Naval Academy for all but four years since the founding of the school in 1845 on the grounds of what originally was the Army's Fort Severn. The Academy moved its location to Newport, Rhode Island, from 1861-1865 during the Civil War.

## ANCHORS AWEIGH

"Anchors Aweigh" was written by Lt. Charles Zimmerman, musical director of the Naval Academy, in 1906, with the lyrics provided by Alfred H. Miles '06 as a fight song for the 1907 graduating class. The song made its debut at the 1906 Army-Navy game and when the Mids won, the song became traditional at the contest.

Stand Navy down the field,  
Sails set to the sky,  
We'll never change our course,  
So Army you steer shy.  
Roll up the score, Navy,  
Anchors Aweigh,  
Sail Navy down the field,  
And sink the Army,

## BANCROFT HALL

Named after the former Secretary of the Navy (1845-46) and founder of the Naval Academy George Bancroft, Bancroft Hall serves as the dormitory for the entire Brigade of Midshipmen. Its 33 acres of floor space and nearly five miles of hallways makes it one of the largest dorms in the world.

## BRIGADE OF MIDSHIPMEN

The 4,200-member student body at the Naval Academy is called the Brigade of Midshipmen.

The Brigade is organized into ...

- 2 regiments
- 6 battalions
- 30 companies

## BILL THE GOAT

The first recorded use of a goat as the mascot for Navy teams was in 1893 when an animal named El Cid (the Chief) was presented to the Brigade by officers of the USS New York. El Cid helped Navy to a 6-4 win over Army that year and a goat became the permanent mascot of the Academy in 1904.

## BLUE & GOLD

Now, colleges from sea to sea

## CLASS RANKS

First-year students at the Naval Academy are referred to as "plebes" during their initial or "Fourth Class" year in school, while sophomores at Navy, members of the "Third Class," are called "youngsters." Juniors at the school are designated as "Second Class," with seniors called "Firsties" in reference to their "First Class" year.

## CO-ED

Women were first admitted to the Naval Academy during the summer of 1976. Today, women comprise roughly 15 percent of the student body.

## COMMISSIONED OFFICERS

When a student graduates from the Naval Academy, they have the option to enter either the Navy or the Marine Corps as an officer. If they choose to join the Navy, they are commissioned as Ensigns, while those entering the Marine Corps are given the rank of Second Lieutenant.

## JOHN PAUL JONES

The crypt of John Paul Jones, considered America's first naval leader and hero, is located below the Naval Academy Chapel.

The native of Scotland was born in 1747, and travelled to the colonies to assist America during the Revolutionary War. His ship never lost a battle as he reached a rank of captain in the Continental Navy.

Jones died in 1792 in Paris, France, and was buried there. His remains were returned to the United States in 1905 and he was interred at the Naval Academy eight years later.

## MARINE CORPS

Those officers entering the Marine Corps have the choice of service selecting one of the following fields ...

- Aviation -- air command and control, anti-air warfare, aviation maintenance, aviation supply, pilot, naval flight officer.
- Ground -- armor, artillery, communications (information systems), engineering, financial management, infantry\*, logistics, military police



## MIDSHIPMAN

The original 17th Century meaning of the word "midshipmen" designated those men who stood watch "amidships", or in the middle portion of a ship. The middle "s" was later dropped to give the current form of the word.

Midshipmen were originally young boys who were apprenticed to sea captains to learn the trade.

In the early days of the Navy, midshipmen were trained aboard ship until they were commissioned as ensigns.

## NAVY

Graduates of the Naval Academy entering the Navy have the following service options available to them ...

- Aviation -- flight officer, pilot
- Nuclear Propulsion -- ships, submarines
- Restricted Line and Staff Corps -- civil engineering, cryptology, intelligence, maintenance, medicine, meteorology/oceanography, supply
- Special Operations -- explosive ordinance disposal, explosive ordinance management, mine countermeasures, operational diving and salvage,
- Navy SEALs
- Surface Warfare -- conventional, nuclear powered
- Submarines



## NICKNAME

The official nickname for all of Navy's athletic teams is Midshipmen. "Mids" is an appropriate nickname, while "Middie" is inappropriate.

## N-STAR

Members of varsity teams who qualify for the varsity letter receive an N-Star for their letter sweaters if they participate in a victory over Army in any sport-designated Star Game.

The varsity N and corresponding N-Star were initiated during the early 1890s.

## SCHOOL COLORS

Each class at the Naval Academy produced their own set of class colors until 1892 when Navy Blue and Gold were established as the official colors for the entire Naval Academy.

## SUMMER TRAINING

Summers remain a busy and challenging time of year for midshipmen. Their initial tenure at the Naval Academy begins around July 1 prior to the start of the freshman year at the school with "Plebe Summer." Instead of taking academic classes, plebes receive military indoctrination and learn basic seamanship and sailing.

The summer following plebe year is spent aboard various ships to gain knowledge and experience of the workings of the Navy. Included in this time is a three-week cruise aboard either a 44-foot Naval Academy sailboat or a Yard Patrol craft traveling on the East Coast.

Portions of the summer before the start of a second-class year is spent visiting bases of both the Navy and the Marine Corps. That leads up to the next summer when midshipmen join an operational unit of the Navy or Marine Corps for several weeks. In addition, rising firsties also begin to accept leadership roles at either the Naval Academy for plebe summer, the Naval Academy Prep School (Newport, R.I.) or aboard a yard patrol or sailing cruise.

## TECUMSEH

Tecumseh is the Native American figurehead which has been facing Bancroft Hall since 1866.

The statue originally was the figurehead of the USS Delaware and named after Tamanend, a Delaware chief. The name was later changed to Tecumseh after a Shawnee chieftain who lived from 1768-1813.

The original wooden statue was replaced after 50 years by the current bronze version.

Tecumseh is painted prior to football games and during Commissioning Week he is adorned with the shoulder boards of a Navy ensign on one side and that of a Marine Corps second lieutenant on the other.

## THE YARD

"The Yard" is another name for the grounds of the Naval Academy. Originally just 10 acres, The Yard has grown to a size of 338 acres.



# Success IN THE CLASSROOM

## MAJORS

Students at the Naval Academy can select one of 43 different majors within the following 19 fields of study:

### Division of Engineering & Weapons

Aerospace Engineering, Electrical Engineering, General Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Naval Architecture, Ocean Engineering, Systems Engineering

### Division of Math & Science

Chemistry, Computer Science, General Science, Information Technology, Math, Oceanography, Physics, Quantitative Economics

### Division of Humanities & Social Science

Economics, English, History, Political Science

In addition to graduating with a Bachelor's of Science, students can also attain a minor in one of seven different languages.

## GRADUATE SCHOOL

There are no graduate school classes offered at the Naval Academy, but opportunities for midshipmen to attain a postgraduate degree at a civilian school or university are available. The ability to attend medical school, as former Navy football player **Terrence Anderson '00** did, is another option.

In addition to furthering their education at schools across the country, students at the Naval Academy annually are in competition for one of the prestigious Rhodes Scholarships to study at the University of Oxford in England.

Since Navy's first Rhodes Scholar, E. Van Meter '28, a total of 43 Naval Academy graduates have received the Rhodes Scholarship, including 10 over the last six years. Among Navy's recent recipients is former baseball player **Trevor Thompson '05**.

## COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

Naval Academy student-athletes have been selected as an Academic All-American by the College Sports Information Directors of America 44 times over the years, with Mids garnering 18 awards since 2000.

The list of recent honorees includes two-time Academic All-American **Courtney Davidson** (women's basketball, 2003 & '04), first-team recipient **Trevor Thompson** (baseball, 2005), and third-team honorees Sean Blackman (gymnastics, 2006) and Kirsten Andrews (cross country/track & field, 2006).

Navy student-athletes garnered a pair of Academic All-America awards last season with women's soccer players Lizzie Barnes (first team) and **Kari Weniger** (second team) earning recognition.

## ACADEMIC PROGRESS RATES

The APR is the fulcrum upon which the entire academic-reform structure rests. Developed as a more real-time assessment of teams' academic performance than the six-year graduation-rate calculation provides, the APR awards two points each term to student-athletes who meet academic-eligibility standards and who remain with the institution. A team's APR is the total points earned by the team at a given time divided by the total points possible.

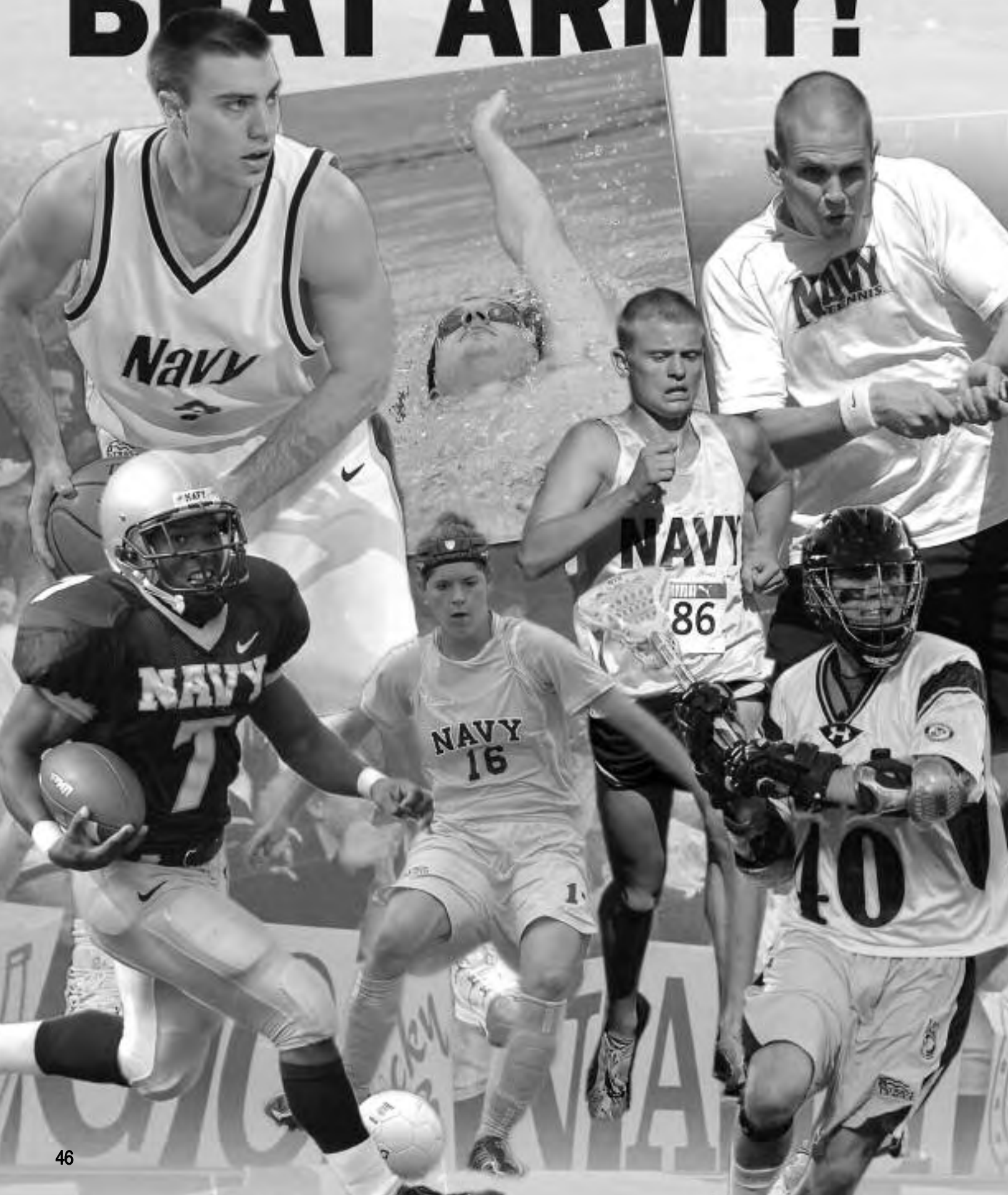

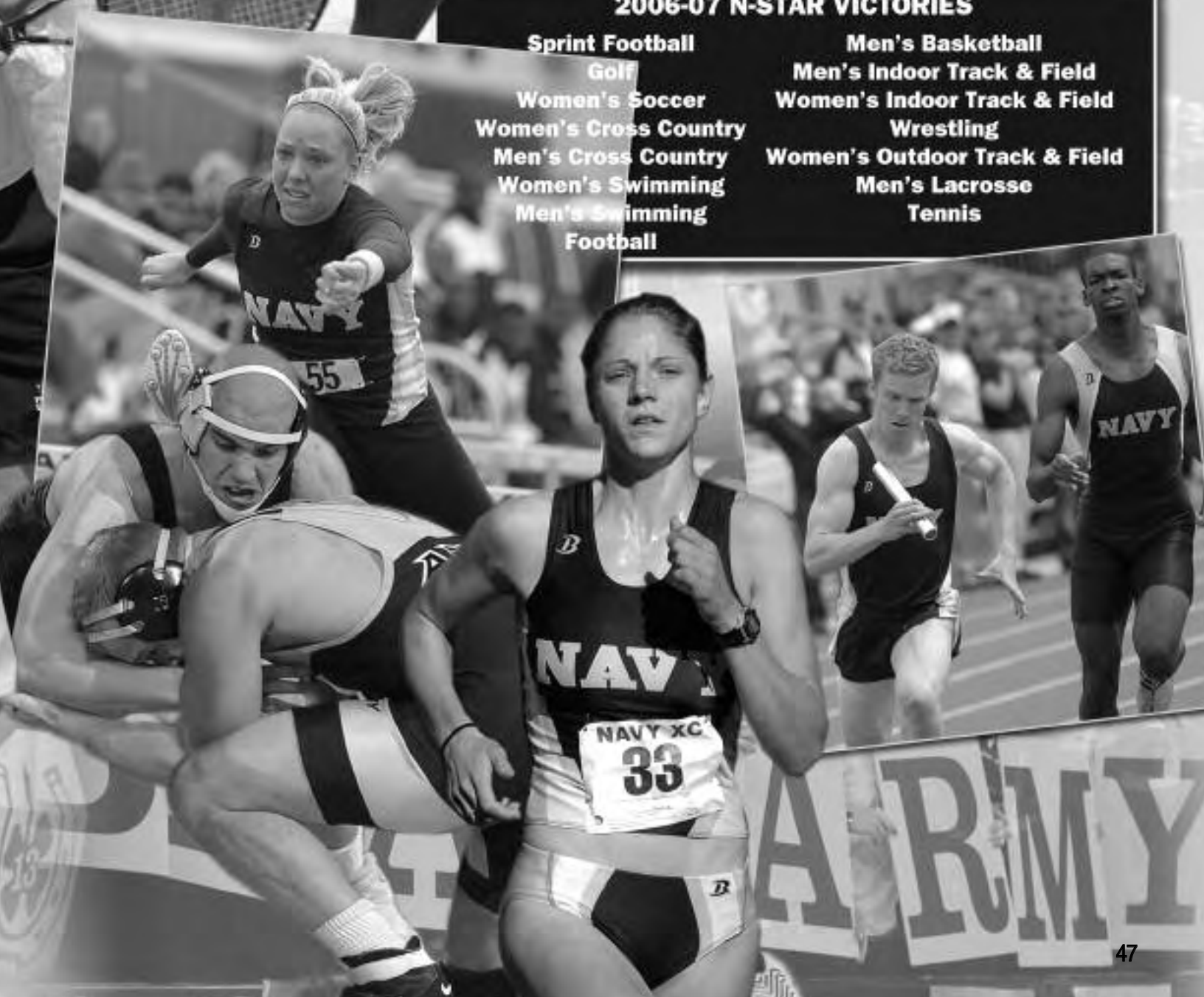

On Nov. 9, 2001, the United States Naval Academy dedicated the new Glenn Warner Soccer Facility prior to the Navy men's soccer game against Bucknell.

The \$4.5 million Glenn Warner Soccer Facility is a prime example of one of the Naval Academy's latest accomplishments, while raising the bar of excellence.

One of the finest college soccer facilities in the nation, the Glenn Warner Soccer Facility was financed entirely by private contributions, designed by the architectural firm of Cochran, Stephenson & Donkervoet and constructed by Whiting-Turner, Inc. The 16,300-square-foot facility houses the Naval Academy's men's and women's varsity soccer teams.

The facility is named after Navy's legendary men's coach Glenn Warner, who guided the Midshipmen to nine NCAA Tournament appearances, four Final Four appearances, one national championship, 28 winning seasons and a record of 243-65-31 during his 30-year tenure. In a stretch from 1962-67, Warner's teams put together a string of 48 regular-season victories without a defeat (70-6-3) and qualified for five-straight NCAA Tournaments. Warner, who produced 26 All-Americans, was recently inducted into the Soccer Hall of Fame and is a recipient of soccer's top award, The Honor Award.

The cornerstone of the project is the Anders Hall of Honor, made possible by Maj. General William A. Anders, USAFR, and family, in appreciation of Warner and to recognize the leadership, character and commitment of former Naval Academy soccer players.

The Anders Hall of Honor features 13 trophy cases and display areas of cherry cabinetry that depict Navy's storied soccer history and tradition. From former Navy soccer players who achieved excellence in military service and leadership, to past Navy All-Americans and team captains, the "Hall of Honor" pays tribute to former Midshipmen and their military, civilian and athletic accomplishments. Designed by Murphy & Orr Exhibits, the 60-foot diameter lobby also features Navy's five men's soccer National Championships (1931, '43, '44, '45, '64). Warner's one and only unbeaten squad captured the 1964 National Championship. The floor of the lobby is terrazzo and features a 15-foot Naval Academy crest in the center. The Anders Hall of Honor gives the coaching staff a place to meet, greet and entertain recruits and midshipmen candidates, while

experiencing the rich tradition of Navy soccer.

The home team wing highlights Navy's commitment to soccer and the future with two spacious team locker rooms, coaches offices and locker rooms, a fully-equipped training room, laundry and equipment rooms. The 1,300-square-foot men's and women's team locker rooms are equipped with custom-made wooden lockers for each athlete, a video projector and screen for viewing and analyzing of practice and game film. The 375-square-foot training room contains training tables, modern whirlpool, ultrasound and physical therapy equipment, and provides Navy's scholar-athletes with the most complete and advanced treatment in the country. Five equipment storage spaces provide 600-square feet for storage space and laundry service.

The visiting team wing of 4,300-square feet contains two spacious locker rooms, officials' locker room, ticket office, public restrooms and a concessions area.

The facility has a 120-yards by 75-yards flat bermuda-grass playing surface and a modern drainage system, allowing the field to withstand heavy rain. A state-of-the-art, scoreboard, funded by the Class of 1983, was erected at one end of the field. The stadium seats approximately 2,500 fans and provides fans with optimal viewing with room for further expansion.
