ARMY HEADS TO AMERICA'S GAME WITH BOWL HOPES ON THE LINE



- While the annual clash between the service-academy rivals means enough on its own, Army has added incentive in this season's game, the 110th meeting in the series. The Black Knights enter this year's edition with a 5-6 record, meaning a win over the Midshipmen would guarantee them a spot in the 2009 EagleBank Bowl opposite Temple. Army has not been to the postseason since the 1996 Independence Bowl.
- Army has won two straight games to keep their bowl hopes alive. Both games required a fourth-quarter comeback. The Black Knights trailed VMI 17-16 before scoring the game-winning points with less than nine minutes to go. In its last game, Army was down at North Texas, 13-10, before reaching the end zone with under two minutes to go.

- In addition to trying to keep their winning streak alive, the Black Knights will be trying to stop a seven-game losing streak to their arch rivals from Annapolis. Navy's current winning streak is the longest run of success either academy has had in the history of the series. Army will also be trying to stop an eight-game losing streak in Commander In Chief Trophy games.
- Freshman QB **Trent Steelman** is on track to become only the second plebe to start for the Black Knights versus Navy. Now senior Carson Williams started against the Mids in 2006, becoming the first Army rookie signal caller to start in the series. Steelman had his best rushing game of the season last time out at North Texas on Nov. 21 with a career-best 132 rushing yards on 23 carries. Steelman is Army's leading rusher with 690 yards this season. When he takes the first snap versus the Mids, he will also become the first Army quarterback, regardless of class, to start 12 games in a season.

- Clinch the Black Knights' first bowl berth since the 1996 Independence Bowl.
- Extend Army's winning streak to three games, its longest since 2005.
- Snap the Black Knights seven-game losing streak to Navy.
- End Army's eight-game losing streak in CIC games.
- Give the Black Knights their highest win total since the 1996 team went 10-2.
- Mark the first time Army has won three games away from West Point since the 1996 squad won four such outings.
- End the Mids' 14-game winning streak in CIC games.
- Be the 642nd win in the 120 seasons of Army football (641-455-51; .581).

SCOUTING THE MIDSHIPMEN

- Ken Niumatalolo is in his second full season as the Mids head coach and his 11th season on the staff in Annapolis. He has guided Navy to back-to-back eight-win seasons and two bowl appearances in his two seasons. Following the Army game, the Midshipmen will play in the Texas Bowl.
- Navy is playing 13 games this season thanks to its trip to Hawai'i on Nov. 28. The Mids had their two-game winning streak snapped with a 24-17 loss in Honolulu. Navy led 17-10 in the first half, but the Warriors tied the game just before the half and scored the only points of the second half on a touchdown pass in the third quarter. Hawai'i outgained the Mids, 428-336, including 366 yards passing. Navy rushed for 248 yards paced by quarterback Ricky Dobbs' 127 yards. Dobbs also completed 5-of-9 passes for 88 yards.
- The Navy offense features the nation's third-ranked rushing attack at 279.67 yards per game. The Mids have six players that have rushed for at least 200 yards. Dobbs is the squad's top rusher with 924 yards and a team-leading 23 touchdowns. Vince Murray is right on his heels with 884 yards and six scores. Dobbs has also completed 44 of his 84 passing attempts for 840 yards and four touchdowns against only two interceptions. Mario Washington is the Mids' top receiver with nine catches for 165 yards. Navy has four players averaging at least 20.0 yards per catch.
- The Navy defense is ranked in the top half of the NCAA statistics in total defense, rushing defense and scoring defense. The Mids are allowing 345.83 total yards (44th), 127.92 (41st) rushing yards and 21.33 points per game (33rd). Ross Pospisil leads the team with 91 total tackles and 48 solo stops. Tony Haberer and Tyler Simmons are second on the list with 69 and 63 stops, respectively. Pospisil and Haberer also lead the Mids with 6.0 tackles for loss each. Craig Schaefer has a team-high 5.0 sacks, while Wyatt Middleton leads the team with three interceptions.
- Punter Kyle Delahooke is the Mids' special teams leader, averaging 43.51 yards per boot which ranks 19th in the nation. As a team, Navy is 16th in the country in net punting at 38.04 yards per kick. Joe Buckley is 9 for 12 on field goal tries, including a 50-yarder. Mario Washington is the Mids' main punt returner with 12 attempts for 85 yards, while Gee Gee Greene has handled most of the kickoff returns with 33 for 607 yards.

THE ARMY-NAVY SERIES

- While Army enjoyed the upper hand against Navy during the majority of the decade of the 1990s, Navy has turned the tide in recent years. The Midshipmen have captured 10 of the last 12 meetings, including the past seven, to grab a 53-49-7 advantage in the classic rivalry. The Mids current seven-game winning streak is the longest in the series by either academy.
- Hard-fought Army victories were commonplace in the 1990s, with the Black Knights prevailing in seven of those 10 matchups. Those seven Army victories came by a TOTAL of just 24 points, with an amazing six-game stretch of Cadet wins decided by a TOTAL of only 14 points. The point differential over the course of the 109-game series stands at a rather microscopic 295 points (an average of 2.7 points per game). That figure stood at 92 entering the 2002 contest, but Navy has outscored Army 274-71 the last seven years. The Mids blasted Army 58-12 in 2002, setting a series-record scoring total in the process, then followed with 34-6, 42-13, 42-23, 26-14, 38-3 and 34-0 victories the past five years.

MARK YOUR CALENDARS

- The 2009 contest is the first in the 10-year agreement that CBS Sports announced last year, extending its broadcast rights to one of the greatest rivalries in all of sports, the annual Army-Navy football game, through the 2018 season. As part of the new agreement, the game is being played on the second Saturday in December to conclude college football's regular season.
- Future dates include Dec. 11, 2010, Dec. 10, 2011, Dec. 8, 2012, Dec. 14, 2013, Dec. 13, 2014, Dec. 12, 2015, Dec. 10, 2016, Dec. 9, 2017 and Dec. 8, 2018.

USAA BECOMES PRESENTING SPONSOR

- The United States Military Academy and United States Naval Academy announced in July that financial services leader USAA has signed a 10-year agreement to be the presenting sponsor of the annual Army-Navy football game. USAA is among the premier providers of banking products, insurance, investments, and financial planning to current and former members of the U.S. military and their families - including the Cadets and Midshipmen from the two academies.

SATURDAY'S UNIFORM PATCH



The Black Knights will be wearing the patch of the **United States Corps of Cadets** when they take the field versus Navy. The United States Corps of Cadets comprises over 4,000 men and women pursuing an undergraduate education and a commission in the United States Army. They are organized into 32 cadet companies, which are grouped into battalions (four companies each), regiments (two battalions each), and the Corps (four regiments).

ARMY-NAVY MISCELLANY

- The Army-Navy series has been tied on 13 occasions (five times since 1979). The most recent tie prior to 2005 came entering the 1992 pairing (43-43-7).
- Until winning in 1980 to break a 37-37-6 stalemate, Navy had not led in the series standing since 1921, after just the 24th meeting between the academies. Prior to its current advantage (53-49-7), Navy last held a lead in the series following its 24-3 victory in 1991.
- Army-Navy games have been contested annually since 1930 when the series resumed following a two-year layoff.
- In 1996, Bill Clinton became the first sitting United States President since Gerald Ford in 1974 to attend the Army-Navy Classic. Ford had been the most recent U.S. President since John F. Kennedy in 1962. President George W. Bush attended the 2001, 2004 and 2008 games in Philadelphia.
- Nine of the last 21 meetings between Army and Navy have been decided by five points or less. Six of the last 20 pairings have been decided by two points or less. Eight of the last 20 have been decided in the game's final minute.
- Navy's current seven-game winning streak versus Army is the longest in the history of the series. Teams have boasted five-game winning streaks on five different occasions (two by Army, three by Navy). Army authored its most recent five-game series winning streak, defeating Navy five straight times from 1992 through 1996. The Black Knights captured those five contests by a TOTAL of 10 points.
- The Mids have won the last seven encounters in very convincing fashion, outscoring Army 274-71 in those showings. Navy posted the series' most lopsided back-to-back victories in 2002 and 2003, winning those contests by a total of 74 points.
- The Army-Navy rivalry became just the 12th Division I-A series to join the "Century Club" when the teams battled for the 100th time in 1999.

CIC TROPHY HISTORY

- To help commemorate the Trophy's 25th birthday, President Bill Clinton was on hand at "The Vet" in 1996 to present the Black Knights with the glimmering silver Trophy following their come-from-behind victory. It marked the first time that a standing President attended an Army-Navy clash since Gerald Ford looked on in 1974 to see Navy defeat Army 19-0.
- Former President George W. Bush witnessed the Army-Navy game three times during his two terms in office, venturing to Philadelphia in 2002, 2004 and 2008.
- The Trophy is named in honor of the President of the United States as commander in chief of the armed forces. The three-sided structure, which weighs 170 pounds and stands 2 1/2 feet tall, is engraved with the seal of each academy and displays a reproduction of each school's mascot. The year in which the Trophy is won is engraved on the appropriate academy's side.
- The idea for the establishment of an interservice football trophy originated with the late Gen. George B. Simler, commander of the Air Training Command and a former Air Force Academy athletic director. The 1972 season was seen as an appropriate time to consider such an idea since it also marked the first season of the round-robin competition among the three teams.
- Simler proposed the idea to the USAFA Association of Graduates early in 1972. The Association, in turn, proposed the project to the alumni associations at West Point and Annapolis as suitable for joint sponsorship by the three institutions. Following formal adoption of the project, designs for the Trophy were sought from manufacturers.

THE LAST MEETING - NAVY 34, ARMY 0; DEC. 6, 2008

PHILADELPHIA, Pa. — Army's Collin Mooney set the Academy's single-season rushing record but Navy's Shun White and Eric Kettani each ran for more than 100 yards and a touchdown as the Midshipmen beat the Black Knights, 34-0, at a sold out Lincoln Financial Field.

Mooney carried 17 times for 54 yards. His increased his season total to 1,339 yards and passed Mike Mayweather's 1990 record by a yard.

For the first time in 2008, Navy had two 100-yard rushers and White and Kettani helped the Midshipmen rush for 373 yards. White carried 13 times for 148 yards, including a 65-yard touchdown in the first quarter, and also caught a touchdown pass while Kettani registered 24 carries for 125 yards and a third-quarter touchdown. Quarterback Kaipo Kaheaku-Enhada completed three of 10 passes for 62 yards and the 18-yard touchdown to White while rushing for 48 yards.

Mooney led the Army rushing game with 54 yards while Wesley McMahan carried four times for 38 yards. Quarterback Chip Bowden connected on nine of 16 passes for 52 yards with one interception that was returned for a touchdown. He also rushed for six yards. Jameson Maehler had three catches for 20 yards while Joe LeForte posted three catches for 19 yards. Jameson Carter, Mooney and Dace also had receptions.

Army senior linebacker Frank Scappaticci registered a career-high 15 tackles and had one of three tackles for loss. Linebacker Stephen Anderson had 10 tackles while defensive ends Josh McNary and Victor Ugenyi each had eight.

In front of 69,144 fans that included President George W. Bush, Navy scored in each quarter to win its seventh straight game against Army.

White opened the scoring on Navy's first possession, breaking off a 65-yard run down the visiting sidelines. The first of Matt Harmon's four PAT's gave Navy an early lead it would never relinquish. Harmon kicked a 23-yard field goal late in the first quarter and White hauled in a 25-yard scoring toss from Kaheaku-Enhada with 3:18 remaining in the first half. Kettani extended the advantage with a five-yard run in the third quarter, before Harmon kicked his second field, from 26 yards out. Ram Vela closed the scoring when he returned an interception for a 68-yard touchdown with 31 seconds remaining in the game.

FAMILIAR FACES

- Despite the fact that Army head coach Rich Ellerson will be coaching in his first Army-Navy game, there will be no need for an introduction to Navy head coach Ken Niumatalolo during pre-game warmups. During Ellerson's stint as Hawai'i's defensive coordinator from 1987-91, Niumatalolo lettered three times at quarterback for the Warriors.
- Ellerson became familiar with the triple-option offense during his time on the Warriors' staff when former Navy, and current Georgia Tech, head coach Paul Johnson served as the offensive coordinator. Niumatalolo served as an assistant under Johnson before becoming head coach.
- In addition, Army associate head coach Gene McKeehan, who works with the offensive guards and centers, served as an assistant on the Navy staff from 1995-2000. McKeehan was the Mids' assistant head coach and worked with the offensive line.

ARMY-NAVY HEAD COACHING DEBUTS

- Army head coach Rich Ellerson will be trying to stop a recent trend when he takes the field for the first time as the Black Knights' leader versus Navy. The last Army head coach to win their first game against the Mids was Tom Cahill in 1966.
- Since Cahill, Black Knight coaches have gone 0-9 in their first Army-Navy games.

ARMY AT LINCOLN FINANCIAL FIELD

- The annual Army-Navy tilt will be the Black Knights' second game of the season at Philadelphia's Lincoln Financial Field. Army lost a 27-13 decision to Temple on Oct. 17.
- The Black Knights have never won in the facility. Army is 0-5 in the previous Army-Navy games played at Lincoln Financial Field.
- Army's last win in the City of Philadelphia was in 2001. That game was the last Army-Navy tilt contested at Veteran's Stadium.
- Lincoln Financial Field is slated to host the annual classic in 2010, 2012, 2013, 2015 and 2017. The game will be played in Washington, D.C. in 2011 and Baltimore, Md. in 2014 and 2016.

SHAKE THE RUST OFF

- When the Black Knights take the field to face Navy it will be their first game since a victory at North Texas on Nov. 21. The 21 days between games is the Black Knights' longest layoff since waiting 24 days to play the Independence Bowl in 1996.
- The last time Army had two off weeks before facing the Mids was during the 1994 campaign. The Black Knights lost to Boston University, 21-12 on Nov. 12 before defeating Navy on Dec. 3, 22-20.

TWO NEW VENUES ON TAP FOR 2010

Army and Notre Dame – two staples of the national sports scene when they met 21 times between 1925 and 1946 at the original Yankee Stadium, the home of the New York Yankees – will renew that historic collegiate rivalry for the 50th time on Nov. 20, 2010, when the Black Knights and Fighting Irish battle in the first football game to be played at the new Yankee Stadium. NBC Sports is expected to televise the Army-Notre Dame game on a national basis in prime time.

In addition to facing Notre Dame, the Black Knights announced the "Army at Yankee Stadium Series." The three-game slate will include games against Rutgers on Nov. 12, 2011, Air Force on Nov. 3, 2012, and Boston College on Nov. 8, 2014. Army will serve as the home team for all three of those contests with CBS College Sports Network televising the games to a national audience.

In addition Army will face Rutgers on Oct. 16, 2010 at the new Meadowlands Stadium that will become the home of the New York Giants and New York Jets next season. Army has played at the Meadowlands 17 times previously, but not since 2002. Four Army-Navy football classics have been contested at Giants Stadium.

ARMY BRANCHES

The Army seniors recently learned what branch of the U.S. Army they will be assigned to after graduation. Below is a description of each of those branches.

AIR DEFENSE ARTILLERY - Officers lead, train, and employ Air Defense forces in support of military operations, primarily against enemy aircraft and missile attacks.

ADJUTANT GENERAL - The Adjutant General officer's job is to plan, develop, and direct systems for managing the Army's personnel, administrative, and Army band systems.

ARMOR - The job of this branch is to command, direct and control armored and/or combined arms organizations during mobile land combat operations.

AVIATION - The role of an officer in this branch is to direct and coordinate the employment of Army Aviation units in support of land combat operations.

CHEMICAL CORPS - In the Chemical Corps, Officers support the Army by providing expertise concerning all aspects of chemical, biological, and nuclear defense and chemical operations to commanders and staffs at all levels.

ENGINEERS - The Engineers train and lead troops in topographic, construction engineering operations, facilities maintenance, civil works programs, and lead engineer troops in infantry combat operations.

FIELD ARTILLERY - In Field Artillery, officers coordinate for and employ Field Artillery and target acquisition means in support of military operations.

FINANCE - Finance provides the essential professional analysis of financial data necessary for the efficient use of the Army's money, material, and personnel resources.

INFANTRY - To lead, train, and employ infantry and combined arms forces in military operations on land.

MEDICAL SERVICES - Medical Services officers provide administrative management and support of the Army's health services systems.

MILITARY INTELLIGENCE - In this branch officers manage and direct all facets of intelligence planning and operations at the tactical, operational, and strategic levels of war.

MILITARY POLICE - To train and lead combat-ready Military Police forces that can expedite the battlefield movement of critical Army resources and achieve tactical success in rear area operations. In the peacetime garrison environment, plan and supervise the disciplines of law enforcement, crime prevention, criminal investigation, physical security and confinement.

ORDNANCE - Ordnance officers develop, produce, acquire and support weapon systems, ammunition, missiles, and ground mobility material during peace and war in order to provide combat power for the U.S. Army.

QUARTERMASTER - A Quartermaster officer plans and directs the activities of Army units and organizations engaged in the acquisition, receipt, storage, preservation, and issue of equipment, repair parts, construction material, subsistence, petroleum products, water, and other general supplies.

SIGNAL CORPS - Providing rapid and reliable information systems to support command and control of the Army's combat forces during both peace and war is the job of a Signal Corps officer.

TRANSPORTATION - Transportation officers procure, provide, arrange or manage all surface transportation assets required to support and sustain the Armed Forces in peace and war.

MOMENTUM ON THEIR SIDE

- Entering the annual contest with Navy, Army has won its last two games. It is only the second time since 1987 that the Black Knights have entered the Navy game on a winning streak. The 2005 team won its last four games before squaring off with the Mids.
- The Black Knights' win at North Texas on Nov. 21 marked only the second time since 1996 that Army won its game immediately prior to facing Navy.
- The last 10 times that Army has entered its annual rivalry game following a win, the Black Knights have gone 7-3 versus the Mids.

TRYING TO END THE DROUGHT

- Army will take the field on Dec. 12 having gone two straight games against Navy without a touchdown. The Black Knights lost the 2007 game, 38-3, and the 2008 game, 34-0.
- The Black Knights' last touchdown against the Mids came with two seconds remaining in the 2006 game.

THE POINT IS ...

- Army's 17-13 win at North Texas marked the Black Knights' third win of the season when scoring fewer than 24 points. In fact, eight of Army's last 14 victories have come without putting up more than 22 points on the scoreboard.
- Despite the recent success in low-scoring games, Army is 7-75 since the start of 1996 in games where they score less than 20 points.
- The Black Knights posted 27 points in their season opener at Eastern Michigan. It was the most points Army scored in a season opener since the 1996 season – the last time the Black Knights were victorious in a season debut (37-20 over Ohio).
- The victory improved Army's record to 7-3 in its last 10 games when scoring at least 27 points.
- Army has scored an equal amount of points in the first and second halves, but opponents have picked up the pace after halftime. Army is outscoring its opponents in both the first (50-48) and second (39-37) quarters, but is being outscored 51-33 in the third quarter and 110-56 in the fourth quarter.
- Army scored 10 points in the loss at Iowa State to snap a three-game run of at least 19 points, its longest streak of contests decided in regulation since a five-game stretch to end the 2005 season. Army has not averaged 20.0 points per game since the 2005 season (220 points in 11 games).

ACHIEVING THE END (ZONE) RESULT

- Through the first 11 games of the 2009 season Army has scored 13 rushing touchdowns, including all four of its scores at Eastern Michigan. It was the third time in the last two seasons that the Black Knights scored four rushing touchdowns in a game. Army is 2-1 in those three games, defeating the Eagles and Tulane and losing at Rice. Since the start of the 2000 season, Army has run for at least four touchdowns nine times. The Black Knights are 7-2 in those games. The loss at Rice last season was the first when scoring at least four rushing touchdowns since losing to Air Force on Nov. 9, 2002.
- On the flip side, Army has lost its last 11 games, including at Temple, when not scoring at least one rushing touchdown.
- The Black Knights' offense has not scored more than two touchdowns in a game since the season-opener at Eastern Michigan.

FANTASTIC FINISHES

- Six of Army's last nine games have had the winning points scored in the fourth quarter or overtime. (See chart below.)
- Duke outscored the Black Knights 21-6 in the fourth quarter to break open a 14-13 game and take the 16-point victory. It was the largest fourth-quarter scoring deficit for the Black Knights since Rice held a 17-0 advantage in the final stanza on Sept. 30, 2006.
- Two of Duke's three fourth-quarter touchdowns were scored by the Blue Devils' defense. Eastern Michigan, Temple and Air Force (all in 2009) are the only teams to score two offensive touchdowns in the final period versus the Black Knights in the last 18 outings.
- Army has either come from behind or broken a tie in the fourth quarter in six of its last seven victories.

ON THE MARGIN

- Army's 13-point victory at Eastern Michigan was a rare double-digit win for the Black Knights. Nine of Army's last 11 wins against Football Bowl Subdivision opponents, including its last FBS win against North Texas, have been decided by a touchdown or less. Four of those wins have been in overtime.
- Army's 31-point victory at Tulane last season represented the Black Knights' largest margin of victory since a 62-7 win against VMI on Oct. 7, 2006. It was Army's most lopsided victory against a Football Bowl Subdivision opponent since a 49-7 victory against Boston College on Oct. 21, 1995.
- On the flip side, 16 of Army's last 24 losses have been by at least 10 points. Eleven of those 16 double-digit losses have been by at least 20 points.

IN A RUSH

- Through the first 11 games, Army is averaging 212.1 rushing yards per game, the 14th-best average in the nation.
- Army has rushed for at least 200 yards 13 times in its last 23 games since going to the triple option offense in 2008. The Black Knights ran for 186 yards in their win over VMI. It is the only time since the start of the 2008 season that Army won a game in which it did not rush for at least 200 yards.
- The Black Knights rushed for exactly 300 yards in the season-opening win at Eastern Michigan. It was the 149th time in Academy history the Black Knights reached the 300-yard mark in a game.
- Army has run for at least 300 yards four times in the last two seasons. The Black Knights had four 300-yard rushing games total between 1999-2007. Army switched from a wishbone attack to a pro-style offense in 2000.
- Since the 1996 season, Army is 21-7 when rushing for at least 300 yards.

GROUND GAME IS THE BEST OPTION

- Fans should get to their seats as soon as possible on Dec. 12 because the game figures to go by quickly. Army and Navy are two of four teams in the nation to average 50.0-or-more rushing attempts per game. Army has run at least 40 times in each of its 11 games for a total of 553. The Black Knights have rushed the ball 50-or-more times in 12 of the last 23 games. Air Force has 743 rushing attempts in 12 games. Navy has run it 701 times in 12 outings, while Georgia Tech has 751 rushing attempts in 13 games. All four teams utilize the triple option.
- The Black Knights ran a total of 81 offensive plays versus Duke. It was the most snaps since also running 81 plays against Tulsa on Nov. 17, 2007. Army has run at least 80 offensive plays just 11 times since the start of the 2003 season (78 games).

PASSING GAME KEYS WIN OVER VMI

- Army had its best day throwing the ball since the 2007 when it threw for 174 yards in the win over VMI. Freshman QB **Trent Steelman** was 11 of 14 for 174 yards and a touchdown. Both his completion and yardage total were career highs, while the one touchdown tied a career best. Steelman's 174-yard passing total marked the most aerial yards by an Army player since Carson Williams threw for 328 yards versus Tulsa on Nov. 7, 2007. It also marked Army's highest team passing total since that contest (328).
- Army threw a season-high 26 passes in the loss at Iowa State. It was the most pass attempts since a 26-for-38 day in the 2007 Tulsa game.
- In the loss to Iowa State, junior QB **Chip Bowden** became the third Army signal caller to throw a touchdown pass this season (Trent Steelman & Carson Williams). The last time the Black Knights had three players register a touchdown throw in the same season was 2004. Zac Dahman led the team with nine scoring passes, while Reggie Nevels had two and Matt Silva had one.
- The Black Knights' five touchdown passes in 11 games surpasses last year's 12-game total. Army had its three-game streak with at least one touchdown pass stopped against Tulane. It was the first time since weeks 5-7 of the 2007 season that Army threw at least one touchdown pass in three straight games.

THE BALL AND CHAINS

- After converting only 6-of-37 (16.2 percent) third-down opportunities in the three previous games, Army was 7 of 12 on third down in the win against VMI. It was the first time the Black Knights moved the chains on more than 50 percent of its third downs since last season's game at Texas A&M, a stretch of 17 games. Army has been below the 40-percent mark on third down in 15 of its last 23 games.
- Even with its success against the Keydets, Army has moved the chains on only 31 of its last 113 attempts on third down (27.4 percent) in the last eight games.
- After failing to convert eight straight 3rd-and-short (3 yards or less) against Temple and Rutgers, the Black Knights have been successful on their last seven tries. Army has now converted 22 of its 36 3rd-and-short opportunities.
- For the season Army is converting at a 29.9 percent rate (47-157). The Black Knights were successful on 37.8 percent of its third downs last season. Both marks are up from 26 percent in 2007.

HALF AND HALF

- Army has been tied or ahead at halftime in seven of its 11 games this season. Army's run of three consecutive halftime leads to start the season marked the first time since the 1996 season that the Black Knights went into the locker room with a lead in at least three consecutive games.
- Army led VMI at intermission, 10-0. The Black Knights are now 12-7 in its last 19 games when leading at halftime, including a 10-3 mark in its last 13 games when leading at the break.
- Army trailed North Texas at halftime, 7-3, but came back to win the game. It was only the ninth time since the start of the 2002 season that Army won a game when it was either tied or trailing at halftime (9-66).
- After registering only three victories when trailing at the half from 2002-06 (59 games), the Black Knights have had four second-half comebacks in the last 34 contests since the start of the 2007 campaign.

WINNING WHERE IT COUNTS

- North Texas outgained the Black Knights, 447-287, but Army scored a 17-13 victory over the Mean Green. Opponents have had a yardage advantage in seven of Army's last 11 wins. Conversely, Army had more yardage than Temple, but still suffered a loss. The Black Knights have held a total offense advantage in two of their six losses this season (Duke, Temple) and outrushed Air Force.

THE CURE FOR YELLOW FEVER

- In the four games since tying the Academy record with 14 penalties in the loss at Temple, the Black Knights have committed only 13 penalties. The 14 flags for 100 yards versus Temple tied the Academy record originally set on Oct. 6, 1962 at Michigan. That game in Ann Arbor also resulted in an Army-record 137 penalty yards.
- The game at Temple marked the 12th time in Academy history that the Black Knights were penalized at least 100 yards in a game. It was the 23rd time Army was flagged at least 10 times in one game.
- Army was penalized 11 times for 82 yards in the season opener at Eastern Michigan. It is the first time since 2002 that the Black Knights have accumulated at least 10 penalties in a game twice in the same season.
- Taking away the EMU and Temple games, Army has committed only 35 penalties for 305 yards in the other eight games (3.5 for 30.5 yards).

SEEING RED

- Army has come away with points on 10 of its last 11 trips into the red zone. While Army has been proficient in scoring in the red zone, reaching the end zone has been the issue. In the last nine games, Army has reached the end zone only 12 times in 25 red-zone chances (48.0 percent).
- Overall, Army is 26 for 32 (81.3 percent) in the red zone this season with 16 touchdowns. The Black Knights are tied for 68th in the nation. Army has scored points on 45 of its last 53 trips into the red zone (84.9).
- Defensively, Army has forced opponents into similar frustration. In the last 22 games, the Black Knights have limited opponents to 32 touchdowns in 64 red-zone trips (50.0 percent).
- Through 11 games in 2009, the Black Knights are tied for the 29th-best red zone defense at 0.77 (23 for 30).

THE MAGIC NUMBER

- Army won its ninth straight game when holding an opponent to 14 points or less in its win at North Texas. The last time the Black Knights allowed 14-or-fewer points and lost was Sept. 2, 2006 in a 14-6 loss at Arkansas State. Since 2000, Army is 13-2 when holding opponents to no more than 14 points.
- Army allowed 35 points in the loss to Rutgers, dropping the Black Knights to 16-101 since 1996 when allowing opponents to score 18-or-more points. In that same span, Army is 26-6 when the opponent tallies 17 or less.

PICK 'EM

- Army intercepted Ball State quarterbacks Kelly Page and Tanner Justice a total of four times in the Sept. 19 victory. The last of those picks resulted in an 18-yard touchdown return by junior FS **Donovan Travis** that provided the winning points. It was Travis' second interception of the game. It was the first time the Black Knights intercepted four passes in a game since Oct. 24, 1995 in a 49-7 win over Boston College.
- Led by Travis' four interceptions this season, Army has picked off opposing passers 12 times. The Black Knights had seven interceptions all of last season.
- Army has a total of 22 takeaways in 2009, tied for 43rd in the nation. The Black Knights turned its opponent over a total of 16 times last year.

TURNOVER TRACKING

- One of the head coach Rich Ellerson's five keys to victory is winning the turnover battle, and that tenet has played out in the first 11 weeks of the season. Army's win over VMI was the first time this season the Black Knights won a game in which they had a negative turnover margin

- Since the start of 2006, the Black Knights have posted a 8-2 record when winning the turnover battle. On the flip side, Army is 5-22 when on the wrong end of the turnover margin and 1-8 when the turnover margin is even.
- After not recording a takeaway at Air Force, Army is now 1-8 in its last nine games without forcing an opponent turnover.

AT A LOSS

- Army's 6.27 tackles for loss ranks tied for 41st in the nation. The Black Knights had a season-high 12 tackles for loss at Air Force. Army's 2.09 sacks per game are 48th in the nation. The Black Knights have two five-sack games this season (6 at Eastern Michigan & 5 at Temple).
- Army's six sacks at EMU is tied for the second most in Academy history. Sacks began being tracked during the 1983 season. The Black Knights' single-game record is seven sacks against Dartmouth on Sept. 24, 1983.

DOUBLE EAGLE SPREADS ITS WINGS

- Army ranks 17th in the nation in total defense, giving up 309.91 yards per game. Army has limited opponents to less than 300 yards in five of its 11 games.
- The Black Knights are ranked 66th in the nation in rushing defense at 148.73 yards per game, including surrendering a season-high 328 yards to VMI.
- Army held Air Force to 160 yards rushing, 115 yards than their season average entering the game.
- The Black Knights allowed just 40 rushing yards in the win at Eastern Michigan, marking Army's fewest rushing yards allowed since giving up 26 yards on the ground to Tulane on Nov. 16, 2002.
- The Black Knights have allowed fewer than 100 rushing yards 12 times since the start of the 2000 season.

- After playing just one overtime game between 1996 and 2005, Army has had six games go to an extra session in its last 41 outings.
- Army scored a 16-13 win in OT versus Vanderbilt on Oct. 10, 2009 to run its all-time overtime record to 6-1 overall and 5-0 at Michie Stadium.
- Army has played at least one overtime game in each of the last four seasons.
- Buffalo (2008) and Louisville (1999) are the only two teams to score versus the Black Knights in overtime. The Cardinals are the lone team to have reached the end zone after regulation.

GET OFF THE FIELD

- For the season, Army is 67th in the nation, allowing opponents to convert 39.73 percent on third down (58-146).
- Just like on offense, first and second downs are huge keys to success on third down. In the first 11 games, the Black Knights have allowed their opponents to convert only 20 third downs when the line to make has been at least seven yards away (20-80). On the flip side, Army's opponents have converted 25 of 33 tries with three-or-fewer yards to go.
- The Rutgers game was the exemption that proved the rule. Army stopped the Scarlet Knights on two of three 3rd-and-shorts, while allowing Rutgers to convert 4-of-10 3rd-and-longs.
- Dating back to last season, Army has won the first and second down battles quite frequently. In the last 17 games, One hundred sixty-seven (167) of the opponents' 217 third-down snaps (77.0 percent) have been with at least four yards to go for a first down.

STARTING POINT

- Another of Army head coach Rich Ellerson's points of emphasis is winning the field position battle. The Black Knights had one of their better days in the win against Vanderbilt. On 12 possessions in regulation, Army's average drive start was its own 36-yard line. The Commodores' average start was their own 18-yard line. Vanderbilt started all six of their first-half drives inside its own 20-yard line.
- In its five victories, Army's average drive start is its own 34-yard line. It's opponents average starting position in those games is its own 27-yard line.
- On the other hand, in the six losses, Army's average starting point is its own 29-yard line, while its opponents have started at their own 36-yard line. Temple's average drive start of its own 44 was the best by an opponent this season. The Owls started inside the Army 25-yard line on its two fourth-quarter touchdown drives.

FIRST-TIME STARTERS

- The Black Knights added another name to the first-time starter list against VMI when freshman LB **Kyler Martin** started at Mike linebacker in place of an injured Stephen Anderson.
- Offensively, freshman **Trent Steelman** (QB), sophomore **Mike McDermott** (LT), junior **Anees Merzi** (LG), junior **Zach Peterson** (C), junior **Seth Reed** (RG) and sophomore **CeDarius Williams** (FB) all were with the first unit for the first time in their careers in the opener. Junior FB **Kingsley Ehie** made his starting debut against Duke, while sophomore OG **Joe Bailey** made his first start against Ball State. Sophomore OT **Brad Kelly** made his first career start at Iowa State. Freshman SB **Malcolm Brown** and senior OG **Fritz Bentler** started for the first time against Vanderbilt.
- On defense, three Black Knights took the first snap for the first time at Eastern Michigan — sophomore **Andrew Rodriguez** (whip), sophomore **Steve Erzinger** (rover) and junior **Donnie Dixon** (strong safety). Senior DE **Brad Marren** made his first start opposite the Blue Devils, while junior DB **Desmond Lamb** made his first career start at Iowa State. Sophomore DT **Christopher Swain** was a first-time starter at Air Force.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW

- Not only were nine of the 22 starters making their debut in the starting lineup, but a total of 24 players saw their first collegiate action at Eastern Michigan. In total, 33 players have played in their first college game this season.
- Seven of the nine first-time starters versus Eastern Michigan were playing in their first game. Only Erzinger and Dixon had garnered varsity action prior to 2009.

DUO NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

The Army football team continued its long tradition of excellence on the gridiron and in the classroom as the Black Knights placed two members on the ESPN The Magazine Football Academic All-District 1 team for the University Division as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA).

Junior defensive back **Jordan Trimble** and sophomore whip linebacker **Andrew Rodriguez** represent Army on this year's District 1 squad.

A Dean's List member during each of his semesters at West Point, Trimble boasts a 3.72 cumulative grade point average while majoring in Systems Engineering. Rodriguez has also landed on West Point's Dean's List during each of his first two semesters at the Academy, boasting a 4.00 cumulative grade point average.

CHANGE IS IN THE AIR

- One of the hallmarks of Army head coach Rich Ellerson's brief tenure with the Black Knights is his willingness to move players out of their comfort zone in order to put them in the best position to succeed. That philosophy meant many position changes for players during spring practice and during preseason camp.
- The move that has received the most attention is senior WR Alejandro Villanueva. Villanueva, who stands 6-10, was the tallest offensive lineman in the nation last season. He started all 12 games at left tackle for the Black Knights, but after being moved to guard during the first week of spring drills began his transformation into a wideout shortly into the spring session. Saturday will be Villanueva's receiving debut, however, he did catch three touchdown passes in Army's two live scrimmages last spring.

ANDERSON, UGENYI AND VILLANUEVA NAMED CAPTAINS

- Senior WR **Alejandro Villanueva**, senior DT **Victor Ugenyi** and junior LB **Stephen Anderson** have been selected by their teammates as Army Football's team captains for the 2009 season. Villanueva will represent the offense, Ugenyi the defense and Anderson the special teams.
- Villanueva started all 12 games at left tackle last season, but garnered national attention during spring practice when he was moved to wide receiver. The 6-10 Villanueva enters the season as one of the Black Knights' starting wideouts.
- Ugenyi also made a move during spring drills, switching from end to tackle in Army's revamped defense. Ugenyi has made 21 starts during his career, including all 12 games last season. He racked up 36 tackles, including 6.0 tackles for loss and 4.0 sacks, during his junior season.
- Anderson is the first junior to be selected as a team captain since Aaron Alexander and Greg Washington in 2003. During that era, head coach Todd Berry had the team vote for two players to serve as captains during the season and then held another vote to select two additional captains for the Army-Navy game. All four players were then listed as that campaign's team captains. Both Alexander and Washington were chosen prior to the 2003 service-academy clash.
- Anderson started the final 10 games of his sophomore season and finished second on the squad with 82 total tackles. He led the Black Knights' linebacking corps with 11.0 tackles for loss and also registered two quarterback sacks. He tied the Academy record with five forced fumbles, leading the nation in fumbles caused per game (0.5).

ARMY HONORS TWO FOOTBALL GREATS IN 2009

The Army Athletic Association is honoring a pair of Black Knight legends in 2009. The first ceremony took place on Sept. 19 when 1947 Outland Trophy winner Joe Steffy had his No. 61 game jersey retired-Felix "Doc" Blanchard, the 1945 Heisman Trophy winner, had his No. 35 retired on Oct. 10 when Army hosted Vanderbilt.

"We are extremely excited to honor two of the legendary figures in Army football history," said Army Director of Athletics Kevin Anderson. "Holding days in their honor is long overdue and we are looking forward to providing proper tributes to their tremendous accomplishments."

As part of the Joe Steffy and Felix "Doc" Blanchard celebrations, both greats had bobblehead dolls created in their likeness for distribution to the first 5,000 fans at the respective games.

Blanchard's jersey will be the fourth number hung from the rafters in Army history, joining 1946 Heisman winner Glenn Davis and 1958 Heisman Trophy honoree Pete Dawkins.

MAN OF STEEL



TRENT STEELMAN

• Freshman QB **Trent Steelman** started his 11th straight game in the win over VMI, extending his record for starts by an Army freshman quarterback. It is the longest starting streak by an Army quarterback to start a season since Zach Dahman started all 11 games in 2005.

• In addition to his record for starts, Steelman also now owns the Academy record for victories by a freshman quarterback. The victory over North Texas was his fifth win as Army's starting signal caller. Jerryl Bennett was the last rookie in the modern era (since 1944) to win as many as two games as Army's starting quarterback in 1978.

• Steelman has been Army's leading rusher in five of the last seven games. He had a career-high 132 yards and a touchdown at North Texas. It was his second 100-yard game in three weeks, the first two 100-yard rushing games by an Army freshman quarterback. Steelman's 42-yard touchdown run at Air Force was Army's longest touchdown run in 2009. His 55-yard run at North Texas was a season long and set up his game-winning two-yard score two plays later.

• Steelman leads the team with 690 rushing yards on a team-high 191 carries. He also paces the squad with five rushing touchdowns. The last quarterback to lead the Black Knights in rushing was Johnny Goff in 1997. The last plebe to top the Army rushing ledger was Carlton Jones in 2002.

• In the passing game, Steelman is 47 for 90 (.522) for 560 yards, three touchdowns and one interception. He set career highs with 11 completions, 174 yards and the score opposite VMI.

• Army's win at Eastern Michigan stopped an eight-game losing streak with a freshman starting under center for the Black Knights. Before Steelman, the last freshman to start and win a game for the Black Knights was Bryan McWilliams on Oct. 31, 1987 versus Temple (17-7). McWilliams started that game, but was injured in the first quarter. Fellow plebe Otto Leone took over and guided Army to victory.

• In the opener at Eastern Michigan, Steelman became the 17th plebe to start at quarterback for the Black Knights and only the seventh since 1951. Two other players, John Daly and Elmer Oliphant started in their first year at the Academy, but had previous football experience at Harvard and Purdue, respectively.

MEALY EATS UP YARDAGE VERSUS VMI



PATRICK MEALY

• Junior **Patrick Mealy** had his second 100-yard rushing game of the season with a career-high 136 yards and a score against VMI. He scored the game-winning touchdown with 8:58 left in the fourth quarter. Mealy's first 100-yard effort of the season was the season opener at Eastern Michigan.

• Mealy is Army's second-leading rusher with 625 yards (56.8/game). Mealy has gained the second-most yards despite ranking third on the team with 97 rushing attempts. His 6.4 yards per carry leads the team, and he has a team-leading 16 rushes of at least 10 yards.

• Mealy's 625 yards through 11 games already represents a career-high. He had 302 yards in 10 games as a plebe in 2007 and ran for 97 yards in nine games last season. Mealy's 1,024 career yards make him the 46th player in Academy history to run for at least 1,000 yards in their career.

• Mealy recorded his first 100-yard rushing game in the opener at Eastern Michigan with 109 yards and a touchdown on only five carries.

• In the opener at Eastern Michigan, Mealy broke off a 75-yard run, and versus Duke he went on a 55-yard jaunt. Both runs set up Army touchdowns. Mealy's 75-yard run is the 11th longest in Army history.

• Mealy averaged 21.8 yards per carry against Eastern Michigan. It was the third-highest rushing average in a 100-yard rushing game in Army history. Rollie Stichweh holds the Academy record with 37.3 yards per carry against The Citadel on Sept. 19, 1964.

• Mealy's five carries are tied for the second-fewest attempts in an Army 100-yard rushing game. Stichweh rushed for 149 yards on four carries against the Citadel, while Eugene Filipiski needed just five carries to reach 118 yards against Pennsylvania on Nov. 4, 1950.

KING ME



KINGSLEY EHIE

• Junior FB **Kingsley Ehie** ranks third on the team and is the leading rusher from the fullback spot with 445 yards (40.5/game). He is tied for third on the team with two rushing scores. Ehie was Army's top rusher versus Rutgers with 56 yards on eight carries.

• Ehie had the best game of his career in his first extended action at Eastern Michigan. He recorded a career-high 75 yards and two touchdowns. Entering the season opener, Ehie had a total of 1 carry for five yards in his career.

• Ehie ran 10 times for 68 yards and both touchdowns in the final 15 minutes at Eastern Michigan. He accounted for more than one-third of Army's 184 fourth-quarter rushing yards.

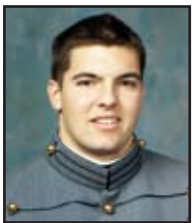
BACKUP QB DONE FOR THE SEASON



CHIP BOWDEN

- Junior QB **Chip Bowden** suffered a season-ending knee injury in the loss at Air Force while covering a punt. Bowen ran 19 times for 59 yards and completed 9-of-26 passes for 106 yards and a score this season. He took the majority of the snaps at Iowa State on Sept. 26. Bowden finished the night 8 for 21 through the air with 87 yards, a touchdown and an interception. He also rushed a team-high 13 times for 42 yards. Both his passing attempts and passing yardage totals were career bests.
- Bowden started the final nine games of 2008, posting a 3-6 record as Army's starter. He was second on the team in rushing with 572 yards and a touchdown on 194 carries. He completed 31-of-72 passes for 282 yards and a pair of scores.

EXPERIMENT YIELDING POSITIVE RESULTS



ALEJANDRO VILLANUEVA

- Senior WR **Alejandro Villanueva** was converted from a starting offensive lineman last season to a wide receiver. So far the results for the 6-10 wideout have paid dividends for the Black Knights. Villanueva has been on the receiving end of all five of Army's touchdown passes this season, including one in the win over VMI.
- Villanueva posted career-high numbers in the win against the Keydets with seven catches for 119 yards. It was Army's first 100-yard receiving day since Jeremy Trimble had 167 yards against Tulsa on Nov. 7, 2007.
- Villanueva leads the team with 29 catches, 460 yards and five touchdowns. His reception, yardage and touchdown totals are all already more than any Black Knight player had last season. Jameson Carter was Army's leading receiver last season with 11 catches for 157 yards.
- Twenty-four of Villanueva's 29 receptions have accounted for first downs or touchdowns, including all seven against VMI. He is averaging 15.9 yards per catch. Last year's team leader in that category, Jameson Carter, averaged 13.1 yards per reception.

HUNTER GATHERING RECEPTIONS



DAMION HUNTER

- Senior WR **Damion Hunter** had a career-high five catch day in the win over Vanderbilt.
- Hunter is second on the team with 25 receptions for 159 yards through 11 games. Hunter's reception total is already a career high. He caught 11 passes last season. His 25 catches this season is eight more than his career total entering the season.
- Hunter's 42 career catches puts him in 34th place on the Black Knights' career ledger.
- Hunter is also the Black Knights' all-purpose leader with 887 yards. In addition to his receiving yards, Hunter is Army's kick-return leader with 712 yards. He was also the Black Knights' punt returner in the first four games, accumulating 14 yards. He has two rushing attempts for two yards.
- With one game left on the docket, Hunter is ninth on the Army single-season kickoff return yardage ledger. His 36 returns in 2009 is seventh on the Black Knights' single-season list.

OFFENSIVE LINE FINDING CONTINUITY

- Army used its fourth different starting lineup along the offensive line in the win over Vanderbilt and have stuck with it each of the last six games. Senior OG **Fritz Bentler** made his offensive debut in the game at left guard. A converted defensive lineman, Bentler suffered a broken leg in preseason practice that kept him out of the first five games. The other switch came at left tackle. Junior **Anees Merzi** made his first start at left tackle. He started the first two games of the season at left guard.
- All of the different combinations have come on the left side. Center **Zach Peterson**, right guard **Seth Reed** and right tackle **Jason Johnson** have started all 11 games.
- Not only is Army in its first season under head coach Rich Ellerson's triple-option offense, but it is also playing with a young group up front. Entering the season, Johnson was the only offensive lineman with any starting experience.

- Army has had eight different players start along the front line this season. In addition to the aforementioned players, sophomore **Mike McDermott** has started four games at left tackle, sophomore **Brad Kelly** has started once at left tackle and sophomore **Joe Bailey** has started three games at left guard.

NEW FACE IN THE END ZONE

- Freshman SB **Lonnie Liggins** scored his first career touchdown in the loss to Rutgers. Liggins' only carry of the game covered 17 yards and accounted for the Black Knights' lone touchdown of the season.
- Liggins almost doubled his yardage total on his touchdown run. Entering the game, the rookie had seven carries for 18 yards. In six games played, he has rushed nine times for 43 yards and the one score.

JONESING FOR A PUNT RETURN



JOSH JONES

- Sophomore **Josh Jones** took over as Army's primary punt returner against Tulane. Jones was back deep in the opener at Eastern Michigan when the Black Knights utilized dual safeties.
- For the season, Jones has a team-high 14 returns for 95 yards.
- Jones has accounted for all four of the Black Knights' punt returns that have gone for more than 10 yards. He had a 13-yard return and a 15-yard return versus Tulane and a season-long 19-yard return opposite Vanderbilt.
- Jones, who was moved from quarterback to defensive back in the spring, got his first taste of returning punts in the last two games of 2008 versus Rutgers and Navy. Jones returned three punts against the Midshipmen.

PUNTING OF THE BULLS



JONATHAN BULLS

- Junior P **Jonathan Bulls** tied his career high with four punts inside the 20-yard line at Air Force. He nearly had a fifth, but the ball squirted out of the hands of an Army coverage man at the 1-yard line and rolled into the end zone. Bulls punted a career-high 10 times against the Falcons.
- Bulls had his six-game streak with at least one punt inside the 20-yard line was stopped at Temple. He has a total of 23 kicks downed inside the opposition's 20-yard line.
- Bulls is averaging 39.4 yards on 66 kicks this season. He had a career-high 65-yard punt in the win over Ball State.
- Bulls also served as the holder on Army's PAT/FG team in the opener at Eastern Michigan. He is the holder for backup placekicker Matthew Campbell.

ANDERSON OUT FOR 2009



STEPHEN ANDERSON

- Junior Mike linebacker **Stephen Anderson**, is still Army's leading tackler with 83 total tackles despite suffering a season-ending knee injury at Air Force. Anderson had a career-high 16 stops before being injured.

- Anderson, who tied for the national lead with 0.5 fumbles forced per game last season, has also racked up 9.0 tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks, two pass breakups, a fumble recovery and a forced fumble.
- Anderson had started 18 straight games for the Black Knights. Since taking over the starting role, he averaged 9.1 tackles per game. He has eight double-digit tackle games in that span.

SUPER SOPHS



ANDREW RODRIGUEZ

- Entering the season, Army had to replace two of its starting linebackers, and through the first 11 games it appears it has found a pair of keepers. Sophomore whip LB **Andrew Rodriguez** and sophomore rover LB **Steve Erzinger** are ranked second and fourth, respectively, on Army's tackle list. Rodriguez has 70 stops, while Erzinger has 60 tackles.
- Rodriguez had a career-high 14 tackles at Air Force. It was his second double-digit performance of the season after a 13-tackle day against Vanderbilt.



STEVE ERZINGER

- Perhaps the biggest play of his young career came in the overtime session when he stripped Vandy running back Warren Norman at the 1-yard line, resulting in a touchback that set up the game-winning field goal.
- Thirty-seven of Erzinger's 57 tackles have been solo stops. He has made 7.5 tackles for loss, including a pair of assisted sacks.

SHRADER SHREDS MEAN GREEN

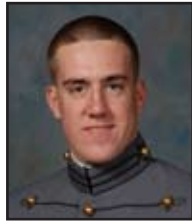


TY SHRADER

- Freshman DB **Ty Shrader** made his collegiate debut at North Texas a memorable one.
- Shrader made three tackles, recovered a fumble and intercepted a pass against the Mean Green.

- His interception thwarted North Texas' final comeback attempt. After Trent Steelman's touchdown run put Army on top with less than two minutes to go, the Mean Green moved the ball out near midfield before Shrader intercepted a pass on the sideline with 1:31 left.

KICKING HIS WAY INTO THE RECORD BOOK



ALEX CARLTON

- Sophomore K Alex Carlton had his third three-field goal game of the season in the win over VMI. Carlton also kicked three field goals against Tulane and Vanderbilt. His last field goal opposite the Commodores was the game-winner in overtime.
- Prior to the Tulane game, Army had not had a player kick three field goals in a game since the 1999 season.
- Carlton's 51-yard field goal in the win over Vandy was the first 50-plus yard field goal by an Army player since Kurt Heiss knocked one through from 52 yards against Navy on Dec. 3, 1994.
- Carlton is 17 for 21 on field goal tries and 13 for 13 on PATs since taking over the placekicking duties against Duke. He is 6 for 7 on field goal attempts from longer than 40 yards.

- Carlton's 17 field goals rank second on the Army single-season list. He is only one shy of tying J. Parker's Academy record of 18 set in 1996. Carlton is ninth on the Army career field goal ledger.
- Carlton ranks fifth in the nation with 1.71 field goals per game. The Air Force game snapped a string of seven straight with at least one field goal. Carlton did not have an attempt against the Falcons.

WHAT A (QUARTERBACK) RUSH



JOSH McNARY

- Junior DE **Josh McNary** had the most productive day rushing the quarterback in Army history against Temple. McNary registered an Academy-record four sacks versus the Owls.
- McNary's performance not only was a single-game record, but also vaulted him to the top spot on the Army single-season and career quarterback sacks ledgers. McNary's 12.5 sacks this season passed the old mark of seven set by Clarence Holmes (1991), Zac Hurst (1999) and Jim Slomka (1993). His career total of 18 sacks is now more than Cameron Craig's previous mark of 13.5

- McNary ranks third in the nation in sacks per game (1.14) and is second in the nation in tackles for loss per game (2.05). His 22.5 stops behind the line of scrimmage ranks third on the single-season ledger.
- Since moving from linebacker to defensive end at Texas A&M last season, McNary has 31.0 tackles for loss and 17 quarterback sacks in 19 games.

VICTOR UGENYI

- Senior DT **Victor Ugenyi** had his 20-game starting streak ended at Air Force due to an injury suffered against Rutgers. Ugenyi did play versus the Falcons.
- Ugenyi has been a regular visitor in opposing backfields this season. The converted defensive end has 8.0 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks through the first 110 games at his new position.
- Ugenyi raked tied for fifth place on the Army career list. He is only one quarterback takedown shy of moving into a fourth-place tie.
- Ugenyi has started a team-high 31 games in his four seasons at West Point.

PRIMARY PLAYMAKER IN THE SECONDARY



DONOVAN TRAVIS

- Junior FS **Donovan Travis** made a career-high 12 tackles, including 11 solo stops in the win over VMI. Travis ranks third on the team with 68 tackles this season.
- Travis added to his team-leading interception total with a pick in the win against Vanderbilt. Travis now has four interceptions on the season. He made one in the opener against Eastern Michigan and added two in the win over Ball State.
- It's not only the quantity of Travis' interceptions, but also the quality. Against Ball State, Travis' second interception was a pick-six in the fourth quarter that provided the winning margin in Army's 24-17 victory. In the Vanderbilt game, Travis' interception put Army in position to kick a field goal that snapped a 10-10 tie in the fourth quarter.
- Travis is tied for 36th in nation with 0.36 interceptions per game.

- Travis has started 17 consecutive games which is tied the second-longest streak in the Army secondary. He trails only senior CB **Mario Hill**, who has not missed a game in the last two seasons, starting a team-high 23 straight games.

West Point's leadership took a major step towards restoring its football program to national prominence by luring one of the top coaches in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) ranks, **Rich Ellerson**, to lead the Black Knights' in late December 2008.

One of the nation's true triple-option experts, Ellerson agreed to become Army's 36th head football coach on Dec. 26, 2008.

Ellerson is a veteran of nearly 30 years of coaching on the collegiate ranks, including the last eight as head coach at Cal Poly. Not regarded as a traditional FCS power prior to Ellerson's arrival in

2001, Cal Poly finished each of the last four years ranked in the Top 25 of national FCS polls. The Mustangs won at least seven games during each of the past six seasons and spent the majority of the 2008 season ranked in the top 10 of both the FCS Coaches Top 25 Poll and The Sports Network Division I-AA Poll. Before Ellerson's arrival, the Mustangs had not fashioned a winning season since 1997 and had enjoyed only three winning years since 1990.

Ellerson was named NCAA Division I-AA Independents Coach of the Year in 2003 and a year later was honored as Great West Football Conference Coach of the Year as well as AFCA Region 5 Coach of the Year.

Prior to his selection as Cal Poly's 15th head football coach on Dec. 6, 2000, Ellerson served as the defensive coordinator at Arizona, holding that title from 1997 to 2000. Ellerson assumed duties as the Wildcats' assistant head coach, while overseeing Arizona's defensive line and special teams during his first stay in the desert from 1992 to 1995. It was at that time that he first became associated with legendary former Army head coach Jim Young, who had retired as the Black Knights' mentor following the 1990 season and assumed a volunteer role on Dick Tomey's UA staff. Ellerson also assisted then-Army head coach Bob Sutton in installing his "Desert Swarm" defense at West Point, a stop unit that helped carry the Black Knights to a 10-2 record and a berth in the Independence Bowl in 1996.

Under Ellerson's direction, the Mustangs won 18 of their last 30 games on the road and 30 of their last 36 home contests. They posted six shutouts during Ellerson's eight years as head coach and did not get shut out during that same time. In all, nine Mustangs earned Sports Network All-America honors, including several players twice, and three earned Walter Camp Football Foundation All-America honors under Ellerson.

While Ellerson has built a solid reputation as an innovative offensive mind, he garnered national acclaim as a defensive trend-setter last decade at the University of Arizona when he created the pressure, gap-control "Desert Swarm" defensive scheme.

Ellerson left Arizona briefly, accepting his first head coaching assignment at Southern Utah University in 1996. He returned to Arizona as the Wildcats' defensive coordinator one year later after helping Southern Utah to a 4-7 record and a national rushing title during his only year in control of the Thunderbirds. Southern Utah managed just two victories the previous season.

During his initial stay in Tucson, Ellerson served as an assistant to defensive coordinator Larry MacDuff. The Wildcats' defensive system ranked second nationally against the run in 1992 and 1993. Arizona ranked in the top 10 nationally in total defense during all four of those years. He also helped improve Arizona's special teams play and coached placekicker Steve McLaughlin to the Lou Groza Award in 1994.

He capped his second Tucson tenure in 2000 by helping the Wildcats to a No. 8 national ranking in rushing defense (88.5 yards per game). The Wildcats also ranked second in the Pac 10 Conference in total defense (317.5) and takeaways (33). Among the players Ellerson tutored at Arizona were future NFL stalwarts Ted Bruschi and Chris McAllister. The Wildcats combined to earn five postseason bowl berths during his two stints at Arizona (spanning eight years).

Ellerson spent four years as a member of the University of Hawaii's football program during his undergraduate days, splitting time between the center and linebacker positions. He graduated from UH in 1977 and began his coaching career at his alma mater as a graduate assistant during Tomey's first season as head coach in 1977.

The Tucson, Ariz., native went on to serve one-year stints as secondary coach at Arizona Western College in 1978, linebackers and special teams coach at the University of Idaho in 1979, and defensive line and special teams mentor at Cal State Fullerton in 1980. He returned to Hawaii for the second of his three coaching stints, tutoring the Warriors' defensive line, outside linebackers and special teams from 1981 to 1983.

Ellerson moved on to the professional ranks for the next three years, heading to the Canadian Football League. He served as defensive line coach for the British Columbia Lions from 1984 to 1985, helping to lead the Lions to a Grey Cup championship in 1985. He became defensive coordinator for the Calgary Stampeders in 1986 before accepting a similar role at Hawaii during a third assignment with his alma mater.

As defensive coordinator at Hawaii from 1987 to 1991, Ellerson was teamed with a young triple-option guru named Paul Johnson, who served as the Warriors' offensive coordinator at the time. Johnson would go on to experience highly successful head coaching terms at Georgia Southern, Navy and, most recently, Georgia Tech. Ken Niumatalolo, currently serving as head coach at Navy, lettered three times at quarterback (1987-89), and Ivin Jasper, presently the Mids' offensive coordinator, lettered three times at quarterback and slotback (1991-93) for Hawaii during that time.

The son of a career U.S. Army officer, Ellerson possesses strong ties to West Point. While his father, Col. (Ret.) Geoffrey Ellerson, graduated from the Military Academy in 1935, his oldest brother, Maj. Gen. (Ret.) John, lettered for three years on Army's football team and served as team captain in 1962. His other brother, Col. (Ret.) Geoffrey D. Ellerson Jr., also graduated from West Point.

Ellerson was born on Jan. 1, 1954, in Yokohama, Japan, while his father was stationed there.

He and his wife, Dawn, have four children: Sean, 30, Shea, 26, Leta, 23, and Andrew, 16.
