**Navy Set to Begin New Era in 2009**

Despite having 10 starters and 12 letterwinners back from last year's team, Dave Brandt isn't putting much stock on the experience he has coming back.

That's because he knows what he wants to do with the Navy men's soccer program and how to get there.

"Experience is highly overrated. It is nice to have a few guys you can count on that have both elements of game experience and the ability to do what we eventually want to do," said Brandt. "We are just trying to get the guys to think differently about the game, the program and their soccer experiences here — all things that I approach differently than probably everyone else, and its something we want to change here. And its going to be different for a lot of guys. They have responded very, very well to what we want to do here."

Despite taking over the position in late December, Brandt says the transition has been smooth and that the team has adjusted well to the change.

"I think its gone well. It feels like I have been here awhile and we have some things in place that we feel are prerequisites to what we want to do. Now, we have to take some important next steps which are directly in front of us," said Brandt. "The important thing to me is to get the wheel turning in the right direction. We are turning, but its not turning as fast as we would eventually like. The important thing is that it is turning in the right direction and that is a start. Their attitude has been fantastic. There is a lot of work ahead, but they are excited and ready to work and get better."

For Navy to show signs of success on the field, Brandt is hoping to become more balanced, starting offensively.

"Clearly the team has had more success defensively than offensively in the past. I think things have changed, and we will be more balanced this year," said Brandt. "I don't like to differentiate, however, between positions. We are a team and everyone plays defense and everyone plays offense. The whole team is integrated."

**Forwards**

Leading the charge up front will be seniors Andrew Garcia and Chris Marino, sophomore Wes Powell and junior Mike Porcelli. Garcia went scoreless a year ago, but has scored four goals in his career, including three as a sophomore.

Porcelli was Navy's leading scorer a year ago with eight points (4 g, 0 a) and was the only Navy player to score a goal in the season's last 13 games.

Marino ranked second on the team last year with five points (2 g, 1 a), scoring in three straight games from Aug. 31 - Sept. 7.

Powell scored an overtime game-winner last year against Adelphi in the UMBC / adidas Kickoff Classic and started 16 games a year ago.

Freshmen Eric Wootten, Michael Uyehara, Luke Goldsborough and Michael Rakoczy are all players that are coming off prolific high school careers and will figure into the offense.

**Midfielders**

"I think we have a good group returning and potentially a very good freshman group," said Brandt. "We have some that can double up as attack. Its a versatile group that can play on both ends of the field."

Returnees Mark Garcia, Sam Lepley and Kyle Behbehani all have experience in the midfield and can play Brandt's style. Powell can also move back from forward to the midfield position.

Garcia is Navy's active career leader in points (15) and assists (9) and looks to have a big year in the midfield. Lepley started all 18 games a year ago, scoring three points (1 g, 1 a). Behbehani has been plagued by injuries in his three years, but is finally healthy and should contribute this year.

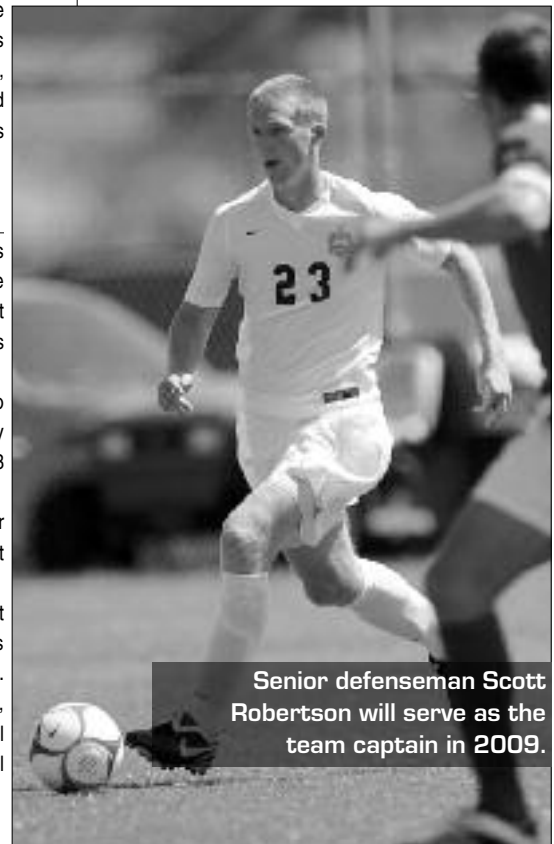
Freshmen Eric Skogerboe, David Jackson and Rakoczy, who is an attacking midfielder, are three freshmen right away that will see time.

**Defensemnen**

"I think that this is an area where we have a veteran group that has had some success," said Brandt. "Its fair to say that this team has had more trouble scoring and putting the whole thing together than they have had on the defensive end. I think we are in a good situation back there."

Team captain Scott Robertson, Matt Tapajcik, Matt Biesecker and Alex Foskett all saw action last year and will contribute heavily this year.

There are also some freshmen that can help out and develop at the same time, although Brandt did not mention anyone specifically.

**Goalkeepers**

Tyler Bristol came out of spring practice as the No. 1 goalkeeper among returnees.

Bristol played in five games last year and recorded 17 saves against just three goals for a save percentage of .850. However, Bristol is the only goalkeeper on the squad to see action, playing in just the five games during his career.

Junior Will Craven and freshman Max Renaldo will be pushing Bristol for minutes in goal.

**Freshmen**

Brandt expects the freshmen class to play a significant role in the team's success during the upcoming year. He will carry 15 freshmen on the roster and he hopes they will be able to contribute immediately.

"I would say its a group that will be important for this program over the next four years," said Brandt. "I am not sure how quick they will impact, but they will definitely get a chance this year to contribute right away."

**The Schedule**

Coach Brandt's first year will be a challenge in more ways than one, as he has crafted out a difficult schedule that features five teams that played in the NCAA Tournament a year ago, including the defending NCAA Champion, Maryland. The Mids will also face NCAA Tournament teams Penn, Loyola (Md.), Duke and Colgate, as well as a very balanced Patriot League slate.

"I would prefer to play a tough schedule. Ultimately, if you want to succeed as a program, you are going to run into those teams at some point," said Brandt. "We don't want to run and hide from those teams. We are going to stand up and play good teams and hopefully produce some fair results."

With Brandt entering his first year at Navy, he steps into the fire into the Patriot League, which figures to have one of the most competitive conference races in years.

However, instead of worrying on the Patriot League, Brandt intends to focus on his team instead.

"I don't know if I have an opinion on the league,

because I haven't really seen anyone play," said Brandt. "We have enough to worry about in our own house. We are going to do what we do, focus on that and see what happens in the league schedule."

**The Final Word**

Brandt doesn't really set any goals and his only expectations are that his team works hard and focuses on the task at hand.

"One of the things that defines the way I coach is that there is a vision for what it is supposed to look like. On the field, there is a vision for how its supposed to look in terms of style and system and our players should know what exactly that means," said Brandt. "There is a vision what their four-year experience and this season is supposed to look like away from wins and losses as well. That is enough to concentrate on. That is what the expectation is — focusing on the vision and what it should look like on and off the field. At the end of the day, we will see where we are."

Naval Academy Director of Athletics Chet Gladchuk announced on Dec. 23, that Dave Brandt, the all-time winningest coach in NCAA history at any level, has been named the head men's soccer coach at the Naval Academy. Brandt comes to Navy from Messiah College, where he compiled a remarkable 246-25-12 (.888) record in 12 seasons, winning six NCAA Division III National Championships.

"Dave Brandt brings to the Naval Academy his energy, work ethic, a dedication to his student-athletes, strong personal, professional and academic values and a proven track record for winning that is extraordinary," said Gladchuk. "His accomplishments as a leader and educator of men are benchmarks for soccer coaches at any level. We are extremely proud that Dave and his wonderful family will join us at the Naval Academy for what we know will be a highly successful tenure in Annapolis."

"My family and I are certainly excited for the opportunity and challenge of coaching men's soccer at the Naval Academy," said Brandt. "The quality, purpose, and values that the Academy stands for have everything to do with why I was interested in the first place, and why I hope to be an asset to them in fulfilling their mission on many different levels."

Since taking over the Messiah College soccer team in 1997, no one in the country can match Brandt's accomplishments. He ranks as the winningest coach in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .888 and his squads won NCAA Division III National Championships in 2000, 2002, 2004, 2005, 2006 and 2008 and were National Runners-Up in 2002 and 2007. His 2005 squad posted a 24-0-0 record; one of just six undefeated and untied seasons in all divisions since 1972. He is the one of two men's soccer coaches in the country at any level to have won six national titles.

Brandt has won four National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Coach of the Year awards (2000, 2002, 2004 and 2008) and was the fastest coach in NCAA men's soccer history to reach the 200-win mark.

"Dave Brandt is clearly among the very top coaches in the country at any level," said Jeff Tipping, the National Soccer Coaches Association of America Director of

#### Coaching.

A renowned recruiter, Brandt won at Messiah with a mix of highly regarded superstars and unheralded players that flew under the radar. He was able to land several players that drew major Division I interest, including high school All-American and Ohio's High School Player of the Year, Kai Kaisguran, who he landed away from national power Akron in 2004. Kaisguran was a four-time All-American at Messiah and currently plays for Major League Soccer's Chicago Fire. In addition, he recruited Hayden Woodworth, who selected Messiah over Penn State in 1999, and Patrick Lenehan, who opted to attend Messiah over Notre Dame in 2004. To date, Brandt has had eight players play in the professional ranks.

Under Brandt, Messiah had 18 All-America selections and five National Player of the Year recipients in just 12

years.

However, Brandt's greatest success comes in the way he develops players. Several players who were not highly regarded at any level have gone on to stardom. David McClellan became the National Player of the Year in 2005 and has been the United Soccer League's Player of the Week with the Harrisburg City Islanders six times, after drawing no interest from any Division I school. Chris Boyles became a first-team All-American at Messiah after receiving no interest from any school at any level, and would go on to play professionally for the USL's Charlotte Eagles. A fantastic athlete, Boyles is now the 11th-ranked decathlete in the world. Current Messiah player, J.D. Binger, received very little recruiting interest in high school, but ended last year as a two-time first-team All-American and had several MLS clubs interested in drafting him.

Messiah stepped up to battle several Division I teams in the last four years and the results were impressive. During the last four years, Messiah defeated Delaware twice and tied Penn and Maryland in preseason exhibitions. Brandt stated a goal when he arrived for Messiah to be the "best place in the country to play college soccer". He developed the program to get players to play for four years, to graduate and become family for life. At Messiah, there was massive alumni involvement and tradition. His influence was found at the ticket gate as well, as the Falcons averaged a Division III-best 1,678 fans per game at home in 2008, a total that would have ranked Messiah 15th in Division I.

Brandt's soccer teachings are based on a compelling vision for teamwork, principled thought and action and an expected outcome of making the whole greater than the sum of the parts. His playing style emphasizes "possession emphasizing penetration" that requires positional discipline and high technical requirement. His Messiah teams led the nation in attendance regularly, thanks in large part to the fact he plays a style that is fast, athletic, skillful, exciting and fun to watch.

Brandt's knowledge of the game has been met with high regard, as 1,000 coaches at the NSCAA national convention in 2007 attended his presentation on "Technical Precision in Training for Championship Performance in the Match," and he has his NSCAA Advanced National Diploma. In addition, he has had 10 years of club coaching experience and currently coaches the LDC United Boys Under-14 team. During the summer, he ran three weeks of camps on campus for approximately 1,100 campers per summer. Every session has been filled by the beginning of May since 2002.

"Coach Brandt's session at the 2007 national convention was met with rave reviews," said Tipping. "He is a special coach and ought to be at the top level."

Brandt received his Bachelors of Science degree in Business Administration from Messiah College in 1985. He received his masters of education degree in athletic administration from Temple University in 1990.

Brandt and his wife, Diane, have a daughter, Alexandria (16) and son, Danny (13). The family resides in Annapolis.

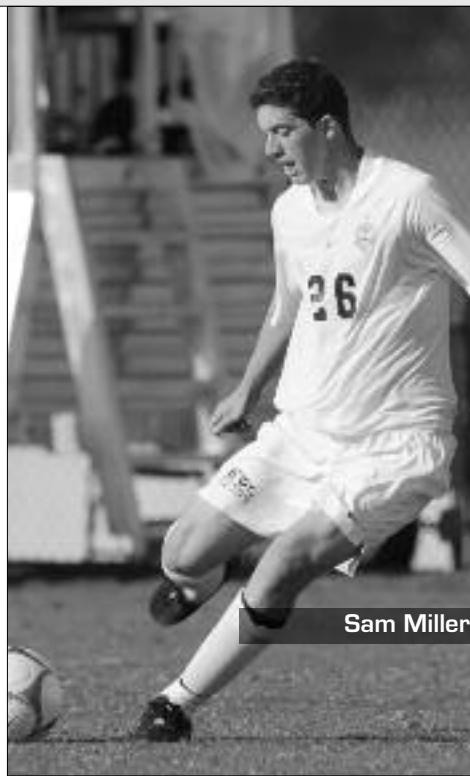

## Navy Enjoys Hot Start to 2008

The Mids started the season 3-1-1 and were ranked 10th in the NSCAA Middle Atlantic regional rankings on Sept. 16, 2008. It marked the fourth straight year that Navy had at least three wins in the season's first five games.

## Mids Find Overtime Success

Navy accomplished something never before done in the annals of Navy soccer history this year. The Midshipmen won three straight games from Sept. 5 to Sept. 12 in extra sessions, including a pair in double overtime. All three wins came in the final minute of the respective overtime session (Adelphi - 100th minute; Lipscomb - 110th minute; Saint Joseph's - 110th minute).

Navy's three wins and seven overtime games were the second most in school history, behind just the 2001 team (five overtime wins in eight games).

Navy went 3-1-3 in overtime games in 2008, but just 1-10-0 in regulation-length games.

# THE PATRIOT LEAGUE

In its second decade of combining academic and athletic excellence, the Patriot League sponsors championships in 23 men and women's sports. Initially started as an NCAA Division I-AA football conference in 1986, the Patriot League became an all-sport conference in 1990 and includes American, Army, Bucknell, Colgate, Holy Cross, Lafayette, Lehigh and Navy as full members, and Fordham and Georgetown as associate members. These institutions are among the oldest and most prestigious in the nation and their alumni have, and continue to play leadership roles in shaping our country.

Since 1998, the Patriot League has ranked first each year among all Division I conferences awarding athletic aid in the NCAA Graduation Rate Report. The League finished at the top spot with 96 percent of its teams reporting a graduation rate of 85 percent or higher in the most recent data. In addition, 76 Patriot League teams earned NCAA Academic Performance Program Public Recognition Awards after posting academic progress rate scores in the top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sports.

The Patriot League's mission is simple, to provide successful competitive athletic experiences while maintaining high academic standards, and to prepare its student-athletes to be leaders in society.

During the 2008-09 academic year, Patriot League student-athletes and teams have accomplished the following:

- 14 student-athletes earned *ESPN The Magazine*/CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, including first-team selections Lizzie Barnes and Kelly Zahalka from Navy. Zahalka was also named to the *USA Today* First-Team All-Academic squad and earned both a Truman and Marshall Scholarship.
- 61 student-athletes were recognized as *ESPN The Magazine*/CoSIDA Academic All-District recipients, with 45 on the first team including Jason Hill from the Navy tennis program.
- Navy's Lizzie Barnes was one of six Division I women's soccer players to receive an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship and was the third-straight and fifth Navy recipient of the Patriot League Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year award.
- Navy's Erica Ziel became the fourth female student-athlete to earn the Patriot League Scholar-Athlete award in Cross Country, Indoor and Outdoor Track & Field in the same academic year.
- Navy junior Adam Meyer received All-America honors by finishing in fifth place in the consolation final at the 2009 NCAA Men's Swimming and Diving Championship. Erik Hunter and Jonathan Galinski also represented Navy at the event.
- Navy juniors Thuy-Mi Dinh and Tara Chapmon competed at the NCAA Women's Swimming and Diving Championship.
- Three Patriot League men's basketball players were named NABC All-District selections, the most for the league since 1995, including Navy's Kaleo Kina.
- Four Patriot League men's lacrosse players were selected to the USILA All-America team, including Navy's Tim Paul and Andy Tormey who garnered honorable mention accolades.

# SUCCESS IN THE CLASSROOM

## MAJORS

Naval Academy students can select one of 43 different majors within 19 fields of study, grouped into three divisions: Engineering and Weapons (aerospace engineering, electrical engineering, general engineering, mechanical engineering, Naval architecture, ocean engineering), Math and Science (chemistry, computer science, general science, information technology, mathematics, oceanography, physics, quantitative economics) and Humanities and Social Science (economics, English, history and political science). In addition to graduating with a Bachelor's of Science, students can attain a minor in one of seven different languages.

## SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

Midshipmen annually compete for several prestigious scholarships. Since Navy's first Rhodes Scholar, E. Van Meter ('28), 45 Academy graduates have received the Rhodes Scholarship (12 since 2001), with former baseball player Trevor Thompson ('05) among the most recent awardees. Twenty-three grads have been awarded Marshall Scholarships, including 13 since 2000. Swimming standout Kelly Zahalka ('09) received both a Truman and Marshall Scholarship while at the Academy.

## ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

Midshipmen student-athletes have earned CoSIDA Academic All-America honors 69 times over the years, garnering 36 awards since 2000. The 2008-09 honorees included first-team honorees Lizzie Barnes (women's soccer) and Kelly Zahalka (women's swimming), as well as third-team selections Nathan Durham (men's swimming) and Mark Van Orden (men's track & field).

## 2008-09 GRADUATION SUCCESS RATE

For the fourth straight year, the Naval Academy remains at the head of the class for graduating NCAA student-athletes. Navy graduated 100 percent of its athletes in 11 of 19 NCAA sports reported on with no sport graduating less than 95 percent.

# 2008-09 NAVY ATHLETICS

The 2008-09 year once again brought tremendous success on and off the field to Navy's athletic programs. Navy finished second in the Patriot League Presidents' Cup despite having four fewer sports and numerous teams won league and national honors en route to a winning percentage of nearly 70 percent in all competitions. Eleven teams won conference championships, eight teams competed in the NCAA Championships and 19 athletes garnered All-American status. In addition, Navy won the Star-Game series with Army for the 13th consecutive year, winning almost two-thirds of all Star Games with its service-academy rival.

Listed below are some facts from the 2008-09 athletic year:

- The Midshipmen had 19 All-Americans, including four first-team honorees. Wrestler Joe Baker earned his second straight All-American accolade and was joined by sophomore teammate Bryce Sadoris on the victory stand, being the only sport at Navy with a pair of first-team All-Americans.
- Thirteen different Midshipmen won conference athlete of the year recognition, including junior swimmers Tara Chapmon and Adam Meyer on the women's and men's side, respectively. Two Navy women's soccer players (Lizzie Barnes and Shelly Moeller) earned Athlete of the Year honors and sophomore Angela Myers was named the Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year in women's basketball. Michael Mulvey was honored as the CWPA Eastern Player of the Year (water polo), marking the third straight year a Navy player won the award.
- Ten athletes were named Academic All-Americans and 10 Midshipmen were selected as the Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year.
- Eight Navy coaches were named as conference Coach of the Year, including cross country coaches Al Cantello and Karen Boyle. Men's basketball coach Billy Lange was named a finalist for the prestigious Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award.
- Six Midshipmen were honored as Conference Rookies of the Year, including ECAC Football Bowl Subdivision Freshman of the Year, Jabaree Tuani.
- All 24 of Navy's NCAA sponsored varsity sports were above the national average in the Academic Progress report released by the NCAA. Navy had five teams with perfect scores.
- Two athletes, women's soccer member Lizzie Barnes and lacrosse team member Andy Tormey, were finalists for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. Barnes added an NCAA post-graduate scholarship to her resume.

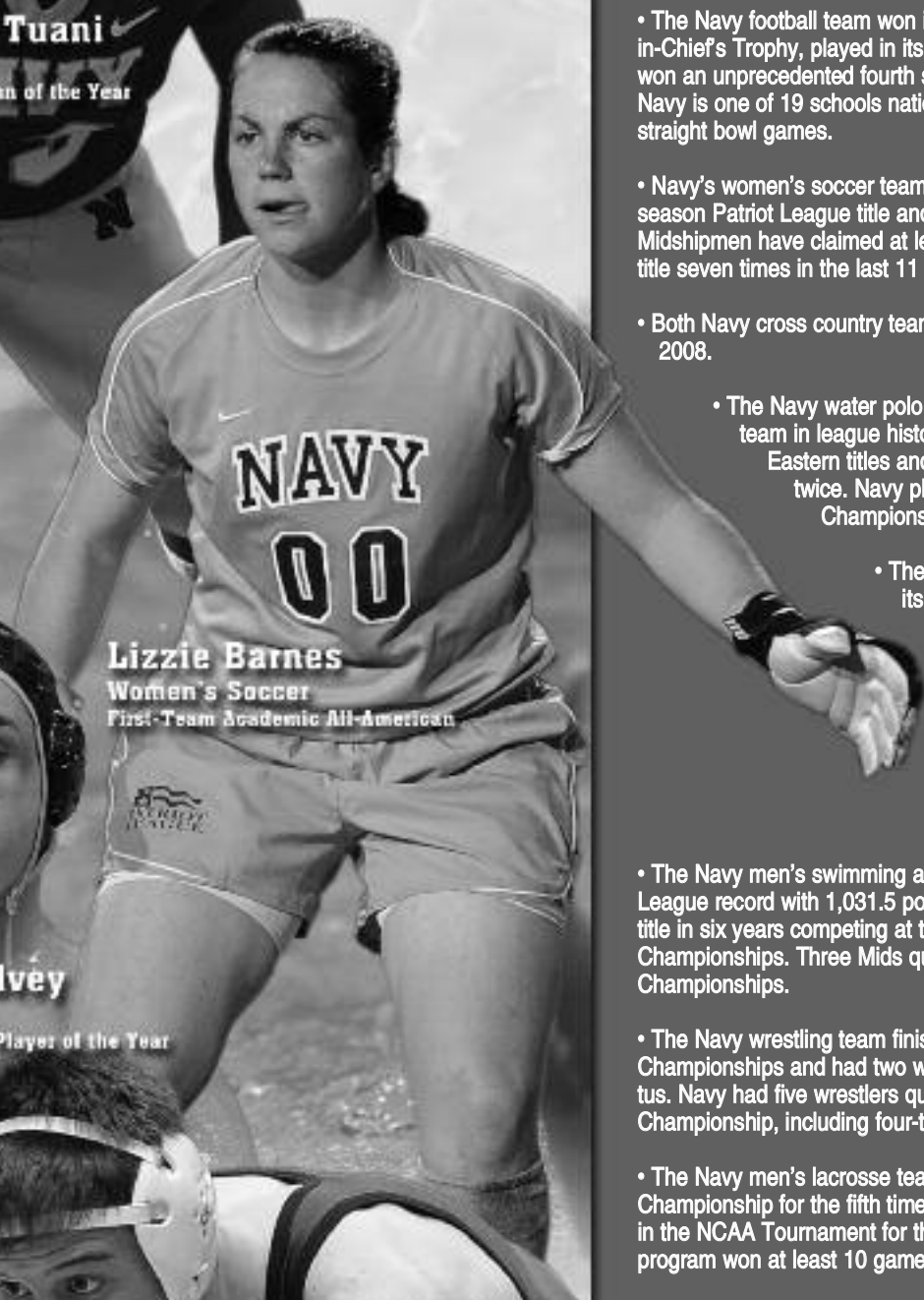

- The Navy football team won its sixth straight Commander-in-Chief's Trophy, played in its sixth straight bowl game and won an unprecedented fourth straight NCAA rushing title. Navy is one of 19 schools nationally to have played in six straight bowl games.
- Navy's women's soccer team won its third outright regular-season Patriot League title and first since 2001. The Midshipmen have claimed at least a share of the conference title seven times in the last 11 years.
- Both Navy cross country teams won Patriot League titles in 2008.
- The Navy water polo team became just the sixth team in league history to win three straight Eastern titles and is the first program to do it twice. Navy played in its third straight NCAA Championship.
- The Navy rifle team competed in its 18th straight NCAA Championship, the third-longest streak in NCAA history. The team finished second in the air rifle discipline for the second straight season and won a school-record 17 matches in 2008-09.
- The Navy men's swimming and diving team set a Patriot League record with 1,031.5 points and won its sixth league title in six years competing at the Patriot League Championships. Three Mids qualified for the NCAA Championships.
- The Navy wrestling team finished 25th at the NCAA Championships and had two wrestlers earn All-America status. Navy had five wrestlers qualify for the NCAA Championship, including four-time qualifier Joe Baker.
- The Navy men's lacrosse team won the Patriot League Championship for the fifth time in six years and participated in the NCAA Tournament for the sixth straight season. The program won at least 10 games for the sixth straight year.
- The Navy men's tennis team has won three straight Patriot League Tournament titles and will enter next spring having won 20 straight matches against Patriot League opponents.

## MEN'S BASKETBALL

Anchored by Chris Harris' 17-point performance, Navy went on a 22-2 run over a five-minute, 34-second span in the second half, then held off an Army rally to grab a 59-54 decision in front of a sold-out raucous crowd of 5,710 fans at Alumni Hall. The win was Navy's seventh straight in the Star Game.

## WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY

Navy's Katie Rentz led all runners across the finish line to guide the Mids to a convincing 15-48 win against Army. The 33-point margin of victory was the largest in series history.

## FOOTBALL

Senior slot back Shun White and senior fullback Eric Kettani combined for 273 yards rushing and three touchdowns, while the Navy defense held the Army offense to 154 yards of total offense as Navy blasted Army for the seventh-straight year, 34-0, in front of a sold-out crowd of 69,144 at Lincoln Financial Field in Philadelphia.

## GOLF

In perhaps the most exciting Army-Navy golf match in series history, Navy senior Ryan Wielgus sank a 15-foot putt for birdie on the first playoff hole to lead the Midshipmen to a sudden death victory (5.5 - 5.5) over Army in the annual Star Match. Winners of nine of the last 11 Star Matches, the Mids have won three in a row against the Black Knights.

## GYMNASTICS

Andrew Faulk placed first in the all-around and won another event to help lead the Mids to a 330.05-318.3 victory at Army. The win marked Navy's third N-Star in the last four years.

## MEN'S LACROSSE

Smartlink Player of the Game Tommy Phelan helped stymie the Army attack with a career-high tying 16-save effort, while junior Brendan Connors scored three goals and added a pair of assists to help lead Navy to an 8-4 victory over Army in the Day of Rivals event played at M&T Bank Stadium in Baltimore, Md. Navy has now won 14 of the last 15 contests in the series, including 11 of the last 12 Star Games.

## RIFLE

Led by Lisa Kunzelman's school-record-tying effort in the air rifle, Navy defeated Army in the Star Meet, 5782-5776, at West Point's Tronsrue Marksmanship Center. Kunzelman racked up 595 points in the air rifle to match the school record held by Matt Albright against Alaska-Fairbanks in 2005.

## SPRINT FOOTBALL

Defensive back James Campbell intercepted three passes to lead the Mids to a 24-0 win over Army. It was Navy's 10th-straight win over Army - the longest streak in series history.

## WOMEN'S SWIMMING

Tara Chapmon set three meet records in helping the women's swimming & diving team post a 211-84 victory over Army. Navy has won 20 in a row against the Black Knights.

## MEN'S SWIMMING

Adam Meyer posted NCAA 'B' cut qualifying times in winning the 200 fly and 200 IM during Navy's 214.5-85.5 victory over Army. The Navy men have claimed 18 consecutive wins over the Black Knights.

## TENNIS

Navy's Class of 2009 — Jason Hill, Nate Nelms and Johnny Waters — became Navy's first class to win four N-Stars in tennis in 18 years with its 5-2 win over the Black Knights. Navy has defeated Army in seven consecutive matches.

## WOMEN'S INDOOR TRACK & FIELD

Navy's 4x800-meter relay team delivered a first-place time in the final and deciding event to propel the Midshipmen to their fourth consecutive indoor N-Star in a thrilling 92-88 victory at Army.

## WOMEN'S OUTDOOR TRACK & FIELD

Senior Debbi Choi and junior Amy Watson each won a pair of events as the Navy women's track team produced a dominant 116-87 victory to put the finishing touches on the program's seventh indoor and outdoor track Star Meet sweep of Army.

## WRESTLING

Senior 133-pound wrestler Joe Baker capped off his career having never lost to Army, as he and his teammates combined to win seven of the first eight bouts of the annual Star Match en route to a 26-9 victory over Army at West Point.

# UNITED STATES NAVAL ACADEMY

## ANNAPOLIS

The City of Annapolis has been home to the Naval Academy for all but four years since the founding of the school in 1845 on the grounds of what originally was the Army's Fort Severn. The Academy moved its location to Newport, Rhode Island, from 1861-1865 during the Civil War.

## BRIGADE OF MIDSHIPMEN

The 4,300-member student body at the Naval Academy is called the Brigade of Midshipmen.

## MARINE CORPS

Graduates enter the Marine Corps with a rank of Second Lieutenant. Those officers entering the Marine Corps have the choice of service selecting one of the following fields ...

- Aviation -- air command and control, anti-air warfare, aviation maintenance, aviation supply, pilot, naval flight officer
- Ground -- armor, artillery, communications (information systems), engineering, financial management, infantry, logistics, military police

## NAVY

With the selection to go into the Navy, graduates are commissioned as Ensigns. Graduates of the Naval Academy entering the Navy have the following service options available to them ...

- Aviation -- flight officer, pilot
- Nuclear Propulsion -- ships, submarines
- Restricted Line and Staff Corps -- civil engineering, cryptology, intelligence, maintenance, medicine, meteorology/oceanography, supply
- Special Operations -- explosive ordnance disposal, explosive ordnance management, mine countermeasures, operational diving and salvage
- Navy SEALs
- Surface Warfare -- conventional, nuclear powered
- Submarines

# NAVAL ACADEMY TRADITIONS

## ANCHORS AWEIGH

"Anchors Aweigh" was written by Lt. Charles Zimmerman, musical director of the Naval Academy, in 1906, with the lyrics provided by Alfred H. Miles '06 as a fight song for the 1907 graduating class. The song made its debut at the 1906 Army-Navy game and when the Mids won, the song became traditional at the contest.

Stand Navy down the field,  
Sails set to the sky,  
We'll never change our course,  
So Army you steer shy.  
Roll up the score, Navy,  
Anchors Aweigh,  
Sail Navy down the field,  
And sink the Army,  
sink the Army Grey

## BILL THE GOAT

The first recorded use of a goat as the mascot for Navy teams was in 1893 when an animal named El Cid (the Chief) was presented to the Brigade by officers of the USS New York. El Cid helped Navy to a 6-4 win over Army that year and a goat became the permanent mascot of the Academy in 1904.

## BLUE & GOLD

The USNA alma mater was written in 1923 by Cmdr. Roy DeS. Horn, USN (Ret.) with music composed by J.W. Crosley. Following every home athletic competition, the athletes face their fans with their hands on their hearts and sing the following words:

Now, colleges from sea to sea  
May sing of colors true;  
But who has better right than we  
To hoist a symbol hue?  
For sailors brave in battle fair,  
Since fighting days of old,  
Have proved the sailor's right to wear  
The Navy Blue and Gold

On Nov. 9, 2001, the United States Naval Academy dedicated the new Glenn Warner Soccer Facility prior to the Navy men's soccer game against Bucknell.

The \$4.5 million Glenn Warner Soccer Facility is a prime example of one of the Naval Academy's latest accomplishments, while raising the bar of excellence.

One of the finest college soccer facilities in the nation, the Glenn Warner Soccer Facility was financed entirely by private contributions, designed by the architectural firm of Cochran, Stephenson & Donkervoet and constructed by Whiting-Turner, Inc. The 16,300-square-foot facility houses the Naval Academy's men's and women's varsity soccer teams.

The facility is named after Navy's legendary men's coach Glenn Warner, who guided the Midshipmen to nine NCAA Tournament appearances, four Final Four appearances, one national championship, 28 winning seasons and a record of 243-65-31 during his 30-year tenure. In a stretch from 1962-67, Warner's teams put together a string of 48 regular-season victories without a defeat (70-6-3) and qualified for five-straight NCAA Tournaments. Warner, who produced 26 All-Americans, was recently inducted into the Soccer Hall of Fame and is a recipient of soccer's top award, The Honor Award.

The cornerstone of the project is the Anders Hall of Honor, made possible by Maj. General William A. Anders,

and family, in appreciation of Warner and to recognize the leadership, character and commitment of former Naval Academy soccer players.

The Anders Hall of Honor features 13 trophy cases and display areas of cherry cabinetry that depict Navy's storied soccer history and tradition. From former Navy soccer players who achieved excellence in military service and leadership, to past Navy All-Americans and team captains, the "Hall of Honor" pays tribute to former Midshipmen and their military, civilian and athletic accomplishments. Designed by Murphy & Orr Exhibits, the 60-foot diameter lobby also features Navy's five men's soccer National Championships (1931, '43, '44, '45, '64). Warner's one and only unbeaten squad captured the 1964 National Championship. The floor of the lobby is terrazzo and features a 15-foot Naval Academy crest in the center. The Anders Hall of Honor gives the coaching staff a place to meet, greet and entertain recruits and midshipmen candidates, while experiencing the rich tradition of Navy soccer.

The home team wing highlights Navy's commitment to soccer and the future with two spacious team locker rooms, coaches offices and locker rooms, a fully-equipped training room, laundry and equipment rooms. The 1,300-square-foot men's and women's team locker rooms are equipped with custom-made wooden lockers for each athlete, a video projector and screen for viewing and analyzing of practice and game film. The 375-square-foot training room contains training tables, modern whirlpool, ultrasound and physical therapy equipment, and provides Navy's scholar-athletes with the most complete and advanced treatment in the country. Five equipment storage spaces provide 600-square feet for storage space and laundry service.

The visiting team wing of 4,300-square feet contains two spacious locker rooms, officials' locker room, ticket office, public restrooms and a concessions area.

The facility has a 120-yards by 75-yards flat bermudagrass playing surface and a modern drainage system, allowing the field to withstand heavy rain. A state-of-the-art, scoreboard, funded by the Class of 1983, was erected at one end of the field. The stadium seats approximately 2,500 fans and provides fans with optimal viewing with room for further expansion.
