Navy Football Itinerary...

The Navy football team will be off from Dec. 5-7 and will resume practice on Dec. 8. The team will practice daily from Dec. 8-17 (practice times TBA), except for Sunday, Dec. 11. Head football coach Paul Johnson, assistant coaches and players will be available for interviews each day after practice. Please call Assistant Athletic Director Scott Strasemeier (410/293-8775-Work or 443/336-9023-Cell) at least 24 hours in advance to arrange an interview. A transcript of Johnson's daily press conference with the local media will be available at www.navyports.com(.)

The team will depart Annapolis for San Diego on Dec. 18. The team headquarters is the Manchester Grand Hyatt (619/232-1234).

The Midshipmen will practice at the University of San Diego (9500 Gilman Drive, La Jolla, Calif.) Dec. 18-20. Navy's practices at USD are closed to the public, but open to the media if they make previous arrangements with Scott Strasemeier (443/336-9023). Practice times are to be determined. TV may shoot the first 20 minutes of practice. Players and coaches will be available for interviews following practice each day while at USD. Navy's practice on Dec. 21 at Qualcomm Stadium will be closed.

There will also be media opportunities on Tuesday, Dec. 20, when the team visits Sea World and the San Diego Children's Hospital (time TBA) and on Wednesday, Dec. 21, when the two coaches will hold a press conference on the USS Midway at 10:30 a.m. (players will not be available at the press conference).

Navy Accepts Bid To Poinsettia Bowl...

Naval Academy Director of Athletics Chet Gladchuk announced Nov. 21 that the Naval Academy had accepted an invitation to play in the inaugural San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl Thursday, December 22 at 7:30 p.m. (PST) at Qualcomm Stadium in San Diego, California. The bid also came with a bonus as the Mids will have the opportunity to play in the Poinsettia Bowl in 2008, 2009 or 2010 if Navy is bowl eligible (Navy can pick the year).

"Blue sky, 72 degrees, palm trees and sunshine in December works for us," said Gladchuk. "A beautiful setting in a Navy city in one of the finest football venues in the country has everyone excited. We have had discussions with the Poinsettia Bowl executives for quite a while and their attention to detail and enthusiasm for our team and fans leads one to believe that this will be our finest bowl experience yet. Three bowl games in a row is historic for the Academy and our congratulations to Coach Johnson, his staff and our players for reaffirming that Navy is one of the finest football programs in the nation."

"What better way to kick off San Diego's newest bowl game than to have the United States Naval Academy as one of the teams," said Poinsettia Bowl President Doug Sawyer. "We couldn't be happier that the Naval Academy has accepted our invitation."

"What better way to kick off a new bowl game in San Diego than to have Navy play in it," said Poinsettia Bowl Chairman Doug Sawyer. "The Naval Academy has one of the most tradition-rich college football programs in the country, and we're so pleased the Midshipmen will be bringing their traditions and exciting football team to our community."

"I'm excited the team has achieved one of their goals, to have a chance to go to a bowl game, and I'm excited to be going to San Diego," said Navy head coach Paul Johnson. "I was lucky enough when I coached in Hawaii to play there in the Holiday Bowl. It's a great city and I'm sure the kids will have a great time. We are excited about it."

The bowl bid is a landmark achievement for the football program as it marks the first time in school history that Navy has gone to three-straight bowl games.

Working Press...

« Admittance to the Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium press box is limited to the WORKING PRESS ONLY. The press box is located on the west side of the stadium. Beverages and a buffet are available two hours before kickoff and at halftime.

Telephones...

« There are eight courtesy phone lines and high-speed internet connections available in the press box.

Radio...

« There are two radio booths in the NMCMS press box. One booth is reserved for the Navy Football Network; the visiting team is assigned the other broadcast space. Six credentials will be allotted to each broadcast crew, plus one for each spotter.

Opponent stations should indicate when requesting credentials whether or not they will require the services of a Navy spotter. Visiting radio stations may purchase the use of up to three phone lines already installed by contacting Eric Ruden, Sr. Associate Athletic Director for External Relations at 410-293-8748.

Television...

« All of Navy's home games will be televised live by CSTV.

Photographers...

« Still and newsreel photographers with hand-held equipment may work the sidelines between the 25-yard line and the goal line in both directions. Sideline credentials are normally issued to photographers representing daily newspapers, wire services, magazines and television stations or networks. As a general rule, each properly accredited sideline photographer will be entitled to one caption write and one messenger.

Postgame Interviews...

« Navy head coach Paul Johnson and selected players will be available 10 minutes after the game in the tent set up outside the home team locker room. The Navy locker room is closed to the media. The visiting coach and players will be available at the visitors' press tent outside the visitors' locker room.

Press Conferences...

« Head Coach Paul Johnson will conduct a post-practice interview session, Monday-Wednesday, at approximately 6:00 p.m. All players and assistant coaches will also be available at that time. Coach Johnson will be available via the phone Monday-Thursday from 2-3:00 p.m. Please contact SID Scott Strasemeier with your interview request at least one day in advance.

Player Interviews...

« All player phone interviews must be arranged through Strasemeier at least one day in advance. Players will do phone interviews during the day (Monday-Thursday) if their class schedule permits. Players will also be available after practice, Monday-Wednesday.

Hall Box Office. Tickets are \$45 for club seats and \$35 for field seats. Fans not able to attend the game can purchase tickets to send a midshipman for \$35.

"We strongly encourage Navy fans to buy their bowl tickets from the Athletic Association. Our goal is 20,000 tickets sold so it is very important for this year and for future bowl games that your purchase counts towards our allotment. If you can't make it to the game, we ask that Navy fans buy two tickets for our midshipmen to attend the game. The donation is 100 percent tax deductible."

The Navy Midshipmen (7-4) travel to San Diego, Calif. to take on the Colorado State Rams (6-5) in the inaugural San Diego Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl, Thursday, Dec. 22, at Qualcomm Stadium (70,561). The Poinsettia Bowl will kick off at 7:30 p.m. (10:30 EST) and will be nationally televised by ESPN2. Navy is making a school-record third-consecutive bowl appearance.

The Poinsettia Bowl can be heard on the Navy Radio Network, which includes WBAL in Baltimore (1090 AM), Sportstalk 980 in Washington, D.C. (980 AM), and WNAV in Annapolis (1430 AM), as well as nationally on Sirius Satellite Radio (Channel TBA) or around the world at www.navysports.com, www.wbal.com, www.sportstalk980.com and www.wnav.com. Armed Forces Radio will carry the game live to our troops stationed around the world.

Bob Socci and Omar Nelson will call the action beginning with the Navy Football Pregame Show at 6:30 p.m. (9:30 EST)

Pete Medhurst and Joe Miller will get things started with the Navy Tailgate Show on 1430 WNAV and www.wnav.com at 5:30 p.m. (8:30 p.m. EST).

Monarch Sports Radio will broadcast the game live nationally.

Mids Blow Out Army For Fourth-Straight Year...

Senior quarterback **Lamar Owens (Savannah, Ga.)** rushed for 99 yards and three touchdowns, while sophomore fullback **Adam Ballard (Lewisville, Texas)** rumbled for 192 yards and two touchdowns as Navy trounced Army for the fourth-consecutive year, 42-23, in front of a sold out crowd at Lincoln Financial Field (69,322). The win gives Navy the series lead, 50-49-7, for the first time since 1991.

The Navy offense, which scored on six-straight possessions, set two Army-Navy game records as the Mids rushed for 490 yards and ran up 531 yards of total offense on a defense that came in ranked 23rd in the nation.

The game turned late in the second quarter with Navy leading 14-10. **Rob Caldwell (Jr./St. John, Ind.)** and **Keenan Little (Jr./Boiling Springs, N.C.)** dropped Army running back Carlton Jones for no gain on a third-and-one play from the Army 40 and forced a West Point punt.

The Mids took the ball over at their own 34-yard line with 1:15 left and promptly moved down the field in eight plays with Owens capping the drive off with a one-yard dive to make the score 21-10.

Army got the ball to start the second half and Caldwell once again stopped Jones for no gain on third and one and forced an Army punt.

The Mids moved right down the field, marching 75 yards on seven plays with Ballard putting the nail in Army's coffin with a 28-yard touchdown run.

Ballard would later answer an Army touchdown with a 67-yard touchdown run on the first play from scrimmage to make the score 42-17.

Reggie Campbell (So./Sanford, Fla.) and **Marco Nelson (Sr./Scottsdale, Ariz.)** didn't let Owens and Ballard have all the fun, as Campbell rushed for 60 yards and a touchdown on three carries, while Nelson rushed for 77 yards on seven carries.

Jake Biles (Sr./Lorena, Texas) led the Navy defense with 13 tackles, while Little and Caldwell recorded 10 tackles each. **David Mahoney (Jr./Fort Myers, Fla.)** had three tackles for a loss.

Owens was named the Philadelphia Sports Writers Association Most Valuable Player for his efforts, marking the fourth-consecutive year that a Navy player has taken home the honor.

Scouting Colorado State...

The Rams are making their ninth bowl appearance in the past 12 seasons and the 11th in school history. The Rams earned their sixth bowl trip in the last seven years with a 6-5 record and a 5-3 mark in the Mountain West Conference.

The Rams are averaging 26.5 points per game, 119.9 rushing yards per contest, 273.2 passing yards per game and 393.1 yards of total offense per game. Quarterback Justin Holland has completed 209 of his 336 pass attempts (62 percent) for 2,804 yards and 20 touchdowns. Holland's favorite target is David Anderson, who caught 77 passes for 1,095 yards and eight touchdowns. Kyle Bell has had an outstanding year running the football, rushing for 1,166 yards and nine touchdowns on 254 carries.

Defensively, the Rams are giving up 28.9 points per game, 200.6 yards per game on the ground, 211.6 yards per game through the air and 412.3 yards of total offense per contest.

Travis Garcia leads the defense with 82 tackles, five tackles for a loss and three sacks. Courtney Jones and Jesse Nading have recorded 10 tackles for a loss apiece, while Nading has four sacks.

Series History...

This will be the first meeting between Navy and Colorado State.

Bowl History...

This will be Navy's 12th bowl game appearance overall and a school-record third-straight postseason appearance.

Last year, quarterback Aaron Polanco accounted for four touchdowns and 237 yards of total offense as Navy defeated New Mexico, 34-19, in the Emerald Bowl. Navy wrapped up the victory over the Lobos with an NCAA record 26-play, 94-yard, 14:24 drive that was capped off by a Geoff Blumenfeld 22-yard field goal. The victory gave Navy a school-record tying 10 wins for the season and marked just the fifth bowl victory in school history.

Navy is 5-5-1 all-time in bowl games and owns a 1-0 mark in bowl games played in San Diego, as the Mids upset BYU, 23-16, in the first Holiday Bowl on Dec. 22, 1978.

Seniors Make History...

Navy's four-straight wins over Army makes the Navy seniors just the fourth class in school history to go 4-0 (joining 1963, 1964 and 1977) and the seventh class to go undefeated (in 1943, 1944 and 1945 Midshipmen graduated in just three years because of World War II) against Army. The senior class also posted a 7-1 record against Service Academy teams, which is the best mark in school history since Navy started playing both Air Force and Army every year (1972).

One Win Away From Even More History...

A victory over Colorado State in the Poinsettia Bowl would give Navy 18 wins over a two-year period (Navy went 10-2 last year), tying the school record for wins over a two-year span. Navy won 18 games in 1905-06, 1906-07, 1907-08. Navy's 25 wins over the last three years are the most since 1906-08 when the Mids won 26.

Johnson Dominant Against Service Academy Teams...

Navy head football coach Paul Johnson is 7-1 (.875) as a head coach against service academy teams (3-1 against Air Force and 4-0 against Army), the best start for a head coach in school history against the other two service academies. Johnson is just the third coach in school history to win his first four games against Army, joining legendary head coaches Wayne Hardin (won his first five, 1959-63) and George Welsh (won his first four, 1973-76). No Navy coach has beaten Army in the dominant fashion that Johnson has, as the Mids have outscored the Black Knights, 186-54 (46.5-13.5), during his tenure.

Killer B's...

Navy's fullbacks, or B-Backs as they are called in the Navy offense, have run over Army the last three years, rushing for 523 yards (174.3 yards per contest) and five touchdowns on 73 carries (7.2 yards per carry).

300 The Number...

The Mids have won 17-consecutive games when rushing for 300-plus yards with their last loss coming against Rutgers on Sept. 27, 2003.

Johnson Tough With Time...

Paul Johnson has posted a 12-5 record (.706) as Navy's head coach when having more than one week to prepare.

In 2002, the Mids posted a 2-2 record, defeating SMU and Army and losing to Northwestern and Notre Dame.

In 2003, Navy was 4-1, defeating VMI, Eastern Michigan, Central Michigan and Army and losing to Texas Tech in the Houston Bowl.

In 2004, the Mids were 4-1 (defeating Duke, Rutgers, Army and New Mexico and losing to Notre Dame) when having more than one week to prepare.

This year, Johnson is 2-1, losing to Maryland and beating Duke and Army.

Service Selection...

On Nov. 15, Navy's 18 seniors found out what they will be doing after graduation. In four years, the seniors have been part of a renaissance in Navy football as the Mids have posted a 26-21 (.553) record, will go to three-straight bowl games, won a bowl game, and won two-consecutive Commander-In-Chief's Trophies (Navy can win a third by beating Army). It is the first class to graduate with a winning record since the Class of 1999 graduated with a 24-22 (.521) mark.

Owens Putting Up Big Numbers...

Senior quarterback **Lamar Owens** (Savannah, Ga.), who entered the season with 129-career rushing yards, rushed for 122 yards on 19 carries in his first-career start against Maryland. With the effort, Owens became just the 14th Navy quarterback to rush for over 100 yards in a game (54th time overall). He also joined Chris McCoy (26 carries for 273 yards on Sept. 9, 1995 at SMU) and Brian Madden (34 carries for 168 yards on Oct. 30, 1999 at Notre Dame) as the only Navy quarterbacks to rush for over 100 yards in their first-career start.

He also rushed for 106 yards and a touchdown against Duke and 110 yards and a touchdown on 22 carries against Kent State, making him just the seventh quarterback in school history to rush for 100 yards in a game on three or more occasions in a career.

Owens, who has been getting into the end zone with regularity of late, scoring nine rushing touchdowns over the last four games, ranks third in the country in rushing yards by a quarterback, averaging 75.5 yards per contest.

Owens can also hurt you through the air as he is averaging a school record 10.3 yards per pass attempt this season, throwing for 1,155 yards on just 112 attempts, and averaging a school record 19.9 yards per pass completion on his 58 completions. He also owns the career mark for average yards per attempt, averaging 10.19 yards (1,193 yards on 117 attempts).

Owens has amassed 1,985 yards of total offense (830 rushing and 1,155 passing) on just

307 plays this year. His 6.5 yards per play ranks him fourth in school history for average yards per play for a season and his 5.94 average yards per play for a career (2,080 yards in 350 plays) ranks first in the school annals.

Owens needs just 127 yards of total offense against Colorado State to pass Aaron Polanco for fifth on the Navy list for total offense in a season.

Tale Of Two Halves...

The Navy offense has been up and down on the first drive of the game, yet sensational on the first drive of the second half. The Mids have scored three touchdowns, thrown four interceptions and lost a fumble on the first drive of the game (five of Navy's 18 turnovers have come on the first drive). Navy has scored on the first drive of the second half in eight of the 11 games (six touchdowns and two field goals).

Navy Ranked No. 1 In The Nation In Rushing...

Navy enters the Poinsettia Bowl ranked No. 1 in the country in rushing offense, averaging 305.18 yards per game. The Mids have never finished lower than third in the country in rushing during Paul Johnson's tenure at the Academy. Last year, the Mids finished third in the nation, averaging 289.50 yards per contest, while in 2003 the Mids led the nation in rushing, averaging a school-record 323.2 yards per game. In 2002, Johnson's first year at Navy, the Mids finished third in the nation in rushing, averaging 270.8 yards per contest.

Navy is averaging a school-record 5.6 yards per rush this year.

Caldwell 10th In The Nation In Tackles Per Game

Junior linebacker **Rob Caldwell (St. John, Ind.)** ranks 10th in the nation in tackles per game, averaging 11.5 per contest. Caldwell, who entered the season with 15-career tackles, has recorded 126 tackles this season. He has been in double figures in eight-of-11 games.

If Caldwell finishes the season as the team's leading tackler (he leads by 22 tackles with one game remaining), it will mark the fourth-consecutive year and sixth time in the last 14 years that a player from Indiana has led Navy in tackles. Safety **Josh Smith (Attica, Ind.)** led Navy in tackles in each of the last three years, and **Javier Zuluaga (Indianapolis, Ind.)** led Navy in tackles in 1992 and 1993. Caldwell would also be the first linebacker to lead Navy in tackles since Clint Bruce in 1995 and 1996.

Caldwell's 21 tackles against Air Force are tied for the sixth most in the country this year and the most by a Navy player since Smith had 21 against Connecticut in 2002.

Score First!...

Navy is 4-0 when scoring first this year and 3-4 when the opposition scores first. The Mids have won 11-consecutive games when scoring first, with the last loss coming in 2003 on Homecoming to Delaware.

The Red Zone...

Navy has scored 38 of the 47 times (.809) it has reached the red zone, including 31 touchdowns (.660). Navy's opponents have scored on 34 of their 43 opportunities in the red zone (.791) with 27 going for touchdowns (.627%).

On A Roll...

Navy is 25-11 (.694) over the last three years after posting a 3-30 (.091) record the previous three years. The Mids are 14-2 (.875) at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium over the last three years, after losing 14 straight at home the previous three years.

Navy Tough On Punt Returners...

The Mids, led by their diminutive gunners sophomore **Reggie Campbell (5-6, Sanford, Fla.)** and senior **Marco Nelson (5-7, Scottsdale, Ariz.)**, have been tough against opposing punt returners, allowing just 4.86 yards per return. The 4.86 yard average is the 8th-best average in the country.

Disciplined Football...

Navy is back near the top of the national rankings for fewest penalties per game and fewest yards penalized per game, ranking fourth in fewest penalties (4.45 per contest) and fifth in yards penalized (35.91 per game). Last year, Navy finished second in the country for the fewest amount of penalties per game (4.17) and fifth in fewest yards penalized per game (35.83).

Plebes Getting Experience...

Navy has played 17 true freshmen this year (the Naval Academy does not red-shirt), which is second most in the country. Arkansas leads the country with 18 true freshmen having seen time.

Go For It!...

Navy is 12th in the nation in fourth down efficiency, converting 17 of 26 opportunities (.654). Navy's 26 attempts are tied for the fourth most in the country.

Ballard Comes Up Big In First-Two Starts...

Sophomore fullback **Adam Ballard (Lewisville, Texas)** came up big in his first-two career starts, rushing for 168 yards and a touchdown on 29 carries against Temple and 192 yards and two touchdowns on 19 carries against Army. His 360 yards rushing is a school record for most yards rushing by a player in his first-two career starts. The previous record was 339 yards by Chris McCoy in 1995. Ballard's 192 yards rushing against Army were the most by a Navy player since Nov. 10, 2001, when Brian Madden rushed for 201 yards in Navy's 42-28 loss at Tulane. It's the most yards by a Navy player in an Army-Navy game since Dec. 6, 1997, when Chris McCoy rushed for 205 yards in Navy's 39-7 victory.

Forgotten Man...

While sophomore kicker **Joey Bullen (St. Simons Island, Ga.)** has been outstanding on extra-points this year, he has been a forgotten man when it comes to field goals. Navy has attempted just one field goal in the last five games, a 25-yard attempt against Temple which Bullen made.

Bullen Automatic...

Navy sophomore kicker **Joey Bullen (St. Simon's Island, Ga.)** is 46 for 46 on extra-points this year. His 46 made extra-points is a Navy single-season record, while his 46 consecutive extra-points is tied for second all-time. Bullen's 70 total points ranks as the fifth most in a season at Navy by a kicker.

Whittaker Out For The Year

Freshman slot back **Karlos Whittaker (North Chicago, Ill.)**, who scored a Navy freshman record six touchdowns this year, is out for the season with a torn ACL and MCL in his left knee. Whittaker injured his knee in the second quarter of the Temple game.

Before his injury, Whittaker was having a sensational freshman campaign. His six touchdowns are tied for the 21st most in the country by a freshman this year and he was averaging a touchdown once every 6.2 carries.

Earlier this year, Whittaker scored in six-consecutive games, the longest scoring streak by a Navy player since Brian Madden scored a touchdown in eight-consecutive games from 1999-2001 (Madden missed all of the 2000 season and the first three games of the 2001 season with a knee injury), before being shut out in the Tulane game.

HE became just the second freshman in school history (Alton Grizzard was the other) to rush for over 100 yards in a game when he rushed for 110 yards and a touchdown on just seven carries against Stanford. Grizzard rushed for 225 yards on 23 carries in 1987 against Penn.

Whittaker had also started to become quite a threat on kickoff returns, averaging 25.6 yards per return, which is the fourth-best mark in school history for a single season and third best for a career. His 52-yard kickoff return against Rice was the longest by a Navy player since Aaron Weedo returned a kickoff 53 yards against Army in 2002.

In Paul We Trust...

Navy football has struggled mightily over the last 21 years, compiling an overall record of 85-161 (.346). The Mids, however, have not struggled when Paul Johnson has been calling the plays.

Johnson has been at Navy for six of those 21 years (two years as a coordinator and four as a head coach), and in those six years, the Mids are 40-30 (.571) and have appeared in three bowl games (this year will be the fourth), winning two. The Mids are 25-11 (.694) over the last three years and have won 23 of the last 32 contests (.719).

NCAA First...

Senior slot back **Marco Nelson (Scottsdale, Ariz.)** is the first player in NCAA history to return a fumble for a touchdown, score a rushing touchdown and catch a touchdown pass in the same game as he accomplished this feat in Navy's 41-38 loss to Stanford. Nelson returned a fumbled punt 19 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter, scored on a one-yard run with 5:33 remaining in the second quarter and then caught a 54-yard touchddown pass from Lamar Owens in the fourth quarter (12:38).

Tomlinson Records Back-To-Back 100-Yard Receiving Games...

Junior wide receiver **Jason Tomlinson (Arlington, Texas)** turned in back-to-back big games for the Midshipmen, catching four passes for a then career-high 114 yards and a touchdown against Air Force and catching five passes for a career-high 115 yards against Kent State. He is the first Navy player to top 100 yards receiving in back-to-back games since Ryan Read in 1998.

His touchdown against the Falcons came on a 61-yard toss from **Lamar Owens (Sr./Savannah, Ga.)**. It was the longest reception in Tomlinson's career and the longest play by Navy since last year's Emerald Bowl when Aaron Polanco hit Corey Dryden with a 61-yard touchdown pass against New Mexico.

Tomlinson is averaging 17.3 yards per catch for his career, with 50 receptions for 865 yards. It's the fifth-best receiving average in school history.

The Mids have gone 94 games without returning a kickoff for a touchdown, the eighth-longest streak in the country. Navy last returned a kickoff for a touchdown on Nov. 15, 1997, when Matt Nelson took a lateral and ran 58 yards for a touchdown in Navy's 52-24 victory over Colgate.

Green Named ESPN The Magazine First-Team Academic All-District...

Senior center **Marshall Green (Baton Rouge, La.)** has been named to the *ESPN The Magazine* First-Team Academic All-District II team by the College Sports Information Directors of America. Green, who carries a 3.33 GPA in chemistry, will now be eligible for Academic All-America honors. Green was also recently accepted into dental school at the University of Maryland.

A's Make Plays...

Navy's slot backs, or A-Backs as they are called in the offense, have been big-play contributors in both the rushing and passing game this year. As a unit, the A-backs have rushed for 1,190 yards and 14 touchdowns on just 144 carries (8.3 yards per carry) and have caught 26 passes for 565 yards and two touchdowns (21.7 yards per reception). All told, the slot backs have gained 1,755 yards and scored 16 touchdowns on 170 touches (10.3 yards per touch).

Mr. October...

Sophomore slot back **Reggie Campbell (So./Sanford, Fla.)** was Navy's Mr. October. Against Duke, Campbell ran the ball three times for 50 yards, including a career-long 52-yarder that set up Navy's go-ahead touchdown in the third quarter.

He had a huge game against Air Force, carrying the ball three times for 46 yards, including a game-tying 40-yard burst with just over two minutes remaining, and had three catches for 47 yards. He accounted for 69 yards on Navy's game-tying drive.

Campbell had another strong game against Kent State, running eight times for 31 yards and catching two passes for 59 yards, including a career-long 44-yard catch.

After a quiet game against Rice (20 yards rushing on four carries), Campbell came back against Rutgers and carried the ball four times for 69 yards and a touchdown. His touchdown run was a spectacular 60-yard run off an option pitch and was the longest run of his career, the longest run by a Navy player this year and the second-longest play by a Navy player this year.

Lots Of Yards...

Navy amassed 532 yards of total offense against Kent State, the 23rd-most yards in school history and the most since Nov. 20, 2004 when Navy produced 613 yards against Rutgers. The Mids ran up 531 yards, the 25th-most yards in school history and the most ever in an Army-Navy game, in the Mids rout of Army.

Ground Attack...

Navy's 490 yards rushing against Army are the most in the history of the Army-Navy game and ranks fifth all-time in the school record books. The 490 yards rushing are the most by Navy since 2003 when the Mids rushed for 530 yards against Central Michigan.

Hall Out For The Year...

Junior fullback **Matt Hall (Cape Coral, Fla.)**, who was Navy's second leading rusher with 493 yards and six touchdowns, is out for the year after tearing his ACL and MCL in the Notre Dame game. Hall injured his left knee on his first carry of the game, a 10-yard gain.

Rossi Added To Rimington Trophy List...

Navy center **James Rossi (Jr./Buda, Texas)** has been added to the watch list for the Rimington Trophy, which is given to the nation's top center. Rossi, who has started all 11 games for the Midshipmen, has helped pave the way for the nation's top-ranked ground game.

Cardiac Kids...

Each of Navy's first-five games this year were decided by seven points or less. It's the first time since 1928, when the Mids lost to Davis & Elkins (2-0), Boston College (6-0) and Notre Dame (7-0) and beat Duke (6-0) and Penn (6-0), in which the first-five games were decided by seven points or less. The 1916 team also opened the season by playing five-straight games that were decided by seven points or less (they went 3-1-1).

Slow Start; Fast Finish...

Navy got off to an 0-2 start for the first time since 2001, which was the last year of the Charlie Weatherbie era. The Mids finished that season 0-10. The 0-2 start marked the 19th time in school history that Navy started 0-2. Navy bounced back from the 0-2 start to finish with a winning record marking just the third time in school history and first time since 1928 that a Navy football team has started 0-2 and finished with a winning record.

Fans Flock To Navy-Marine Corps...

Navy finished the home season averaging a school record 33,013 fans. The previous record was 31,996 during the 1999 four-game home slate. This season also marks just the second time in school history in which all home game crowds eclipsed 30,000.

Navy's 248 yards through the air against Stanford are the most passing yards by a Navy team since Oct. 26, 2002, when Navy threw for 329 yards in a 51-30 loss to Tulane. Navy produced more yards through the air (248) than on the ground (235) for the first time since its 21-17 loss to Delaware on Nov. 1, 2003. The Mids are 0-3 under Paul Johnson when they accumulate more yards passing than rushing in a game.

Little Steps Up...

Junior safety **Keenan Little (Boiling Spring, N.C.)**, who recorded 10 tackles in 2003 and 12 tackles last year, has been in on 69 tackles this year and has picked off two passes, broken up a team-high seven passes and forced a fumble.

Navy Football Team Ranks Second In NCAA's Academic Progress Rate Among Division I-A Schools...

The Naval Academy athletic program is ranked the best in the country among the 117 schools with Division I-A football programs in the Academic Performance Rate (APR). Navy is No. 7 overall out of 328 Division I institutions and first among the three service academies.

The APR is the fulcrum upon which the entire academic-reform structure rests. Developed as a more real-time assessment of teams' academic performance than the six-year graduation-rate calculation provides, the APR awards two points each term to student-athletes who meet academic-eligibility standards and who remain with the institution. A team's APR is the total points earned by the team at a given time divided by the total points possible.

The Naval Academy had 10 sports programs ranked first with an APR rank of 1,000, meaning every student-athlete on their respective roster remained at the Naval Academy and was also eligible to compete or graduate. Those programs are: men's cross country, golf, men's gymnastics, men's soccer, men's tennis, men's indoor track, men's outdoor track, women's crew, women's swimming and rifle.

The Navy football team had the second-highest APR score in the country with a 992, just two points behind first-place Stanford, and had the highest score among teams ranked in the final top-25 poll.

Each of Navy's 23 varsity sports that are sponsored by the NCAA is above the national average.

(www.cstv.com), the first 24-hour college sports network, has secured the exclusive television rights to all home and select neutral site Navy football games (excluding Notre Dame and Army), as well as other Navy men's and women's athletic events, original programming and documentaries centered around the storied Navy athletic program starting next fall. The long-term multi-media agreement includes internet streaming, broadband and video-on-demand rights and high definition rights starting in 2006. A major part of the agreement was that all home football games would be played on Saturday.

CSTV's first Navy football telecast was Saturday, Sept. 3 against Maryland at M&T Bank Stadium in Baltimore. It was the first meeting between the two schools in 40 years.

CSTV Networks, which was recently purchased by CBS, is a multi-media company that consists of the first-ever 24-hour college sports television network, College Sports TV; the leading college sports online network, CSTV.com; and the first ever 24-hour college sports radio network, SIRIUS College Sports Radio. Through its numerous platforms, CSTV provides more live college sports games, events, news, information, analysis and broadband content, and reaches more college sports fans, than any other company.

College Sports TV, voted the No. 1 emerging cable network among operators in a 2003 Beta research study, televises regular season and championship event coverage from over 35 men's and women's sports across every major collegiate athletic conference, as well as many NCAA and NAIA Championships.

College Sports TV has agreements with distributors that represent more than 65 million homes nationwide, including the top six national distributors: Comcast, DirecTV, Time Warner, Charter, Cox and Adelphia.

Naval Academy Installs FieldTurf At Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium...

FieldTurf is the new turf at Navy's Jack Stephens Field at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. The installation was finished on Aug. 15. The new surface debuted when Navy played host to Stanford in the Midshipmen's home opener on Sept. 10.

FieldTurf is currently in use in more than 20 NCAA Division I-A football stadiums including Nebraska, Michigan, Wisconsin, Oregon, Washington, Kansas State, Boston College and Missouri.

In addition to its growing popularity in the college ranks, FieldTurf has already established itself as the turf of choice in the National Football League. Twenty of the NFL's 32 teams currently use FieldTurf at their stadiums and/or their practice facilities. Also, three Major League Baseball teams will use FieldTurf at their stadiums in 2005. FieldTurf was also the first artificial turf product approved by FIFA (soccer's world governing body) for World Cup play.

WBAL joins Sportstalk 980 in the D.C. area and 1430 WNAV in Annapolis to give Navy the strongest radio network of any college team in the Northeast. Bob Socci and Omar Nelson will return to call the action on the Navy Football Radio Network and will be joined by legendary author and sportswriter John Feinstein for pregame commentary.

In addition to airing every Navy football game, which will include a 60-minute pregame show and a 30-minute postgame show, WBAL will also air a 30-minute call-in show with Navy head football coach Paul Johnson, a weekly segment with Johnson during morning drive time, three to five men's basketball games and a weekly five-minute segment during WBAL's evening call-in show with Steve Davis that will focus on all Navy athletics.

WBAL Radio, which is also the voice of the Baltimore Orioles, is Maryland's dominant and most powerful radio station. Since 1925, generations of Marylanders have turned to WBAL Radio for news, weather, thought-provoking discussions and sports. As Maryland's only 50,000-watt AM station, WBAL's signal travels substantially further than any other station in the state.

The station's news/talk format is both a source of information and entertainment. WBAL Radio also employs the largest news staff of any radio station in the state, providing in-depth reports on local and regional issues. According to the Arbitron ratings service, WBAL Radio is consistently one of Maryland's most listened-to radio stations.

Navy jumped out to a 14-3 lead in the first quarter as senior quarterback Lamar Owens (Savannah, Ga.) led the Mids on 80 and 50-yard scoring drives on Navy's first two possessions.

Matt Hall (Jr./Cape Coral, Fla.) capped off the 12-play, 80-yard scoring drive with a three-yard touchdown run to give Navy a 7-3 lead. After a Jake Biles (Sr./Lorena, Texas) interception gave the offense the ball on the 50, the Mids promptly drove down the field in six plays with Marco Nelson (Sr./Scottsdale, Ariz.) scoring from seven yards out on an option pitch to give Navy a 14-3 lead.

Navy had an opportunity to put the game away the next time it had the ball as Greg Sudderth picked off a Hollenbach pass and returned it to the Maryland 46. The Mids moved the ball down to the 14 yard line where, facing third-and-one, drew a delay of game penalty. Navy head coach Paul Johnson elected to go for it on fourth and two and Owens was stopped for a one yard game.

The Navy defense held tough most of the day, holding the Terps to just three field goals through the first three quarters. Maryland finally broke through on their first possession of the fourth quarter when Mario Merrills scored from 12 yards out to give the Terps a 15-14 lead.

Navy, however, would answer. Owens re-entered the game after missing two series with a right hand cramp and promptly led the Mids on a eight-play, 66-yard scoring drive that was capped off by a six-yard touchdown run by Hall. The Mids, now up by five, had to go for two and didn't convert.

Maryland would come roaring back and drove the ball down to the Navy 33 before a holding penalty pushed them back to the 43. The call appeared to be the break Navy needed as the Mids got the Terps in a fourth-and-eight situation from the Navy 31. Hollenbach hit Lance Ball with a swing pass in the flat and Navy had two defenders in the area, but neither Greg Thrasher (So./Carrollton, Texas) nor Tyler Tidwell (Jr./Edmond, Okla.) could bring him down before he crossed the first down marker. Hollenbach hit Weatherly on the next play to make it 23-20.

Navy had one more chance to pull the game out when on first and 10 from its own 25 Nelson got behind the Maryland secondary on a wheel route. Owens was just short on his throw and Nelson was unable to make the grab.

Owens led the Navy offense with 122 yards rushing on 19 carries. He completed five of his 11 pass attempts for 97 yards. Hall rushed for 68 yards and two touchdowns. Jason Tomlinson (Jr./Arlington, Texas) caught three passes for 72 yards. Junior linebacker Rob Caldwell (St. John, Ind.) led the Navy defense with 13 tackles and a forced fumble. Keenan Little (Jr./Boiling Springs, N.C.) and Biles recorded nine tackles apiece. Biles also had an interception. David Mahoney (Jr./Fort Myers, Fla.) had six tackles, three tackles for a loss and a sack.

Game #2 — Stanford 41, Navy 38

Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium • Sept. 10, 2005

Stanford quarterback Trent Edwards threw for 235 yards and one touchdown as he helped lead the Cardinal to a wild, 41-38, victory over Navy in front of 35,670 fans at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.

The game was a see-saw affair that saw neither team lead by more than 14 points. Stanford jumped out to a 7-0 lead on its first possession as Edwards hit Evan Moore on a 17-yard fade route.

Navy tied it with 2:34 left in the first when Marco Nelson (Sr./Scottsdale, Ariz.) returned a fumbled punt for 19 yards and a touchdown. The tie score lasted all of 12 seconds as T.J. Rushing returned the ensuing kickoff 93 yards for a touchdown.

The Mids, however, battled back to take the lead as freshman Karlos Whittaker (North Chicago, Ill.) scored on an electrifying 44-yard touchdown run to tie the score and then Nelson scored his second

touchdown of the day on a one-yard jaunt to give Navy a 21-14 advantage.

Stanford came back to tie the score in the second quarter and threatened to take the lead before the half.

The Cardinal tied the game on a two-yard touchdown run by Nick Frank that capped off a 14-play, 78-yard drive. Navy drove the ball right back down the field to the Stanford 38-yard line, but on first down, Udeme Udofia picked off an errant Lamar Owens (Sr./Savannah, Ga.) pass to give Stanford the ball back with 55 seconds left in the half.

The Cardinal moved all the way down to the Navy one-yard line where on first-and-goal with seven seconds left Stanford coach Walt Harris elected to go for it instead of kicking the field goal. Navy safety Greg Sudderth (So./Lilburn, Ga.) stopped Edwards at the one-yard line and stripped the ball away from him to end the half.

The momentum built by Navy's goal-line stand to end the first half was immediately washed away at the beginning of the third quarter as the Cardinal took the opening kick-off and marched right down the field to score on a three-yard touchdown run by Anthony Kimble to make it 28-21.

Navy came back to within four on the next possession when Joey Bullen (So./St. Simons Island, Ga.) kicked a 39-yard field goal to narrow Stanford's lead to 28-24.

Stanford threatened to pull away halfway through the third quarter on a 46-yard touchdown run off a reverse by Gerren Crochet and then tacked on a 40-yard field goal by Michael Sgroi on the second play of the fourth quarter to take a 38-24 lead.

The battling band of Midshipmen refused to quit, however, as Navy quickly answered with a six-play, 83-yard scoring drive that was capped off by a 54-yard touchdown pass from Owens to Nelson.

The Navy defense was able to hold Stanford to a field goal on the next possession, though the Cardinal was able to melt away a valuable 5:25 off the clock while increasing their lead to 41-31.

Owens threw an interception on Navy's next possession, giving Stanford the ball on the Navy 38-yard line. The defense stepped up and forced three incomplete passes as Stanford took just 26 seconds off the clock.

Back-up quarterback Brian Hampton (Scott Air Force Base, Ill.) came off the bench in relief of Owens, who left the game for the second week in a row with cramps, and led the Mids on an impressive 16-play, 80-yard scoring drive in 4:18. Sophomore full-back Adam Ballard (Lewisville, Texas) capped the drive with his first-career rushing touchdown from four yards out to cut the Stanford lead to three points.

After a failed on-side kick gave the ball to Stanford at the Navy 48-yard line, the Cardinal ran the ball on three straight plays, forcing three Navy timeouts, and then punted the ball down to the Navy 15-yard line with 1:37 left. The Mids couldn't manage a first down, falling to 0-2 for the first time since 2001.

Owens completed 12 of his 18 pass attempts for 193 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions. Whittaker became just the second freshman in school history to rush for 100 yards as he racked up 110 yards and a touchdown on just seven carries. Nelson had four catches for 98 yards and a touchdown and also rushed for 34 yards and a touchdown on seven carries.

Junior linebacker Rob Caldwell (St. John, Ind.) paced the Navy defense with a career-high 14 tackles and a sack. Jeremy McGown (Houston, Texas) added eight tackles, while Jake Biles (Sr./Lorena, Texas) chipped in with seven stops.

Though thge two teams were tied at seven at the half, the Blue Devils controlled the football for most of the opening stanza. Navy ran just 21 first-half plays and had the ball for 10:35, while the Devils ran 40 plays and had the ball for 19:25. Navy's only touchdown in the first half was a 33-yard strike from Lamar Owens (Sr./Savannah, Ga.) to Tyree Barnes (Fr./Norfolk, Va.).

Duke took a 10-7 lead early in the third quarter on a 43-yard field goal by Joe Surgan, but the Mids answered with two touchdowns in nine plays as Karlos Whittaker (Fr./North Chicago, Ill.) capped an eight-play, 85-yad drive with a five-yard touchdown run and then, after the defense forced a Duke punt, Matt Hall (Jr./Cape Coral, Fla.) scored on the first play from scrimmage when he rumbled up the middle and then cut left for a 47-yard touchdown run to give the Mids a 21-10 lead.

After the Navy defense forced a three-and-out, the Mids had a chance to put the game away, but Reggie Campbell (So./Sanford, Fla.) fumbled the handoff from Owens on Navy's first play, giving the ball back to Duke at the Navy 15. The defense, however, stiffened and held the Blue Devils to a field goal to make the score 21-13.

Duke got the ball back at its own 34-yard line after the offense went three-and-out and Eric Shuey (Sr./Hacienda Heights, Calif.) shanked a punt that went just 32 yards. The Blue Devils drove down to the Navy 10-yard line where on fourth-and-one tailback Requan Boyette fumbled the ball, which was recovered well short of the first down by Navy linebacker Rob Caldwell (Jr./St. John, Ind.). Not only did the officials rule there wasn't a fumble, but the spot of the ball gave Duke a first down after several looks at the chains. Three plays later, Zach Asack scored from six yards out on the quarterback draw to cut the Navy lead to two and then Asack hit Eron Riley in the corner of the end zone for two points to tie the game at 21.

The Mids, however, were not to be denied. After Whittaker returned the kickoff to the 33-yard line, Owens ran for 52 yards down the left sideline on the first play from scrimmage. Four plays later, Owens scored from two yards out to give Navy a 28-21 lead.

The Blue Devils would drive the ball back down the field, but Mike Schneider's pass from the Navy 24-yard line was broken up by David Mahoney (Jr./Fort Myers, Fla.) in the end zone.

Navy rushed for 326 yards and threw for 87 yards for a total of 413 yards. Navy averaged 9.3 yards per rush, 9.7 yards per pass attempt and 9.4 yards per play. Duke rushed for 179 yards and passed for 152 yards for 331 yards of total offense. The Blue Devils averaged 3.1 yards per carry, 5.6 yards per pass and 3.9 yards per play.

Owens led the Navy ground attack with 106 yards and a touchdown on 13 carries, while Hall had 66 yards and a touchdown on eight carries. Owens completed four of his nine pass attempts for 87 yards with one touchdown and one interception. Barnes had two catches for 65 yards and his first-career touchdown. Caldwell led the Navy defense with 14 tackles, three tackles for a loss and a sack. Jake Biles (Sr./Lorena, Texas) and DuJuan Price (Jr./Austin, Texas) added 11 tackles apiece.

Game #4 — Navy 27, Air Force 24

Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium • Oct. 8, 2005

Joey Bullen's (So./St. Simon's Island, Ga.) 46-yard field goal with four-tenths of a second remaining gave Navy a thrilling 27-24 comeback victory over Air Force and the inside track to its third-straight Commander-In-Chief's Trophy.

Navy trailed the Falcons, 24-17, with 4:26 left in the game when the Mids started their miraculous comeback. The comeback started slowly as the Mids were forced to go for it on fourth-and-one from its own 29 with 3:02 left. Senior quarterback **Lamar Owens (Savannah, Ga.)** picked up the first down on a quarterback sneak, giving the Mids new life. After an incomplete pass on first down, Owens found the smallest

player on the field, 5-6 **Reggie Campbell (So./Sanford, Fla.)** over the middle for 29 yards down to the Air Force 40-yard line. On the very next play, Campbell took an option pitch from Owens and roared down the left sideline for a 40-yard touchdown that tied the game at 24. It was Campbell's first-career rushing touchdown.

With the Brigade of Midshipmen going crazy in the stands, the Navy defense did what it had done the entire second half, stop the Air Force offense cold. Air Force managed to take just 1:37 off the clock on three plays and Falcon punter Donny Heaton shanked a punt for nine yards giving the ball back to Navy at the Air Force 35 with 45 seconds left.

After two **Matt Hall (Jr./Cape Coral, Fla.)** rushes netted just four yards the Mids called their final timeout with 29 seconds left. Navy head coach Paul Johnson contemplated sending Bullen out for a 49-yard field goal, but decided to run one more play. After a three-yard rush by Owens got the ball down to the 28-yard line, Navy rushed the field goal unit in and Bullen calmly nailed the kick right down the middle to give Navy its third-consecutive win over the Falcons.

Owens directed the Mids to 388 yards of total offense, including 266 yards of total offense in the second half. He completed eight of his 12 passes for 171 yards with one touchdown and one interception and rushed for 64 yards on 20 carries. Hall was the leading rusher for the Mids with 65 yards on 20 carries, while **Jason Tomlinson (Jr./Arlington, Texas)** caught four passes for 114 yards and one touchdowns. Tomlinson was named the Ben Martin Most Valuable Player by the media.

The Navy defense was sensational in the second half, holding Air Force to 92 yards total offense in the second stanza and just one first down in the fourth quarter. Junior linebacker **Rob Caldwell (St. John, Ind.)** continued to post an insane amount of tackles, recording a career-high 21 stops. Junior defensive end **John Chan (Pleasant Hill, Calif.)** recorded a career-high 10 tackles and a sack, while junior outside linebacker **David Mahoney (Fort Myers, Fla.)** had seven tackles and two sacks.

Navy committed four turnovers and gave up a 65-yard touchdown pass, but still came away with their third-consecutive victory thanks to an offense that rolled up 532 yards of total offense and didn't punt all day.

The Mids jumped out to a 14-0 lead as **Adam Ballard (So./Lewisville, Texas)** scored on a four-yard run and **Brian Hampton (Jr./Scott Air Force Base, Ill.)**, who replaced Owens for a series at

quarterback, scored on a two-yard run that capped off a 16-play, 75-yard drive.

The Mids, however, let the Golden Flashes right back into the game after Hampton's touchdown, as Michael Machen hit Najah Pruden with a 65-yard touchdown pass on the first play from scrimmage to make it 14-7. The game was a dogfight the rest of the way as Navy would not lead by more than seven points until **Joey Bullen (So./St. Simons Island, Ga.)** nailed a 22-yard field goal with 7:34 remaining that gave Navy a 34-24 lead.

Owens led the Navy rushing attack with 110 yards and a touchdown on 22 carries. **Marco Nelson (Sr./Scottsdale, Ariz.)** added 57 yards on seven carries and Ballard chipped in 55 yards and a touchdown on nine carries.

Owens completed six of his 10 pass attempts for 169 yards. He threw two costly interceptions to start the game that cost Navy points. **Jason Tomlinson (Jr./Arlington, Texas)** continues to put up big numbers as Navy's wide receiver, catching five passes for 115 yards.

Sophomore **Greg Thrasher (Carrollton, Texas)** led the Navy defense with nine tackles and his first-career interception. Senior **Jeremy Chase (Norfolk, Va.)** recorded eight tackles and two sacks, while **Greg Sudderth (So./Lilburn, Ga.)** picked off his second pass of the season.

Jake Biles (Sr./Lorena, Texas) added 11 tackles, **Rob Caldwell (Jr./St. John, Ind.)** had 10 stops and **David Mahoney (Jr./Fort Myers, Fla.)** recorded nine tackles, three tackles for a loss, a sack, a fumble recovery and a pass break up, as the defense played its best game since shutting out Tulsa last year.

Offensively, the Mids were led by junior fullback **Matt Hall (Cape Coral, Fla.)**, who rushed

for 91 yards and two touchdowns on six carries. **Brian Hampton (Jr./Scott Air Force Base, Ill.)**, **Trey Hines (Jr./Douglasville, Ga.)** and **Karlos Whittaker (Fr./North Chicago, Ill.)** also scored touchdowns for the Midshipmen. Whittaker's touchdown run in the third quarter was his fifth of the year, the most in school history by a freshman.

Notes From the Rice Game

- The Mids did not turn the ball over for the first time all season.
- **Trey Hines (Jr./Douglasville, Ga.)** garnered his first-career start and carried the ball three times in the opening drive after carrying the ball just three times in the first five games. He finished the night with 39 yards rushing on six carries. Hines' 11-yard touchdown run with 10:23 remaining in the fourth quarter marked his first TD since last year's 29-26 win over Vanderbilt.
- Four of Navy's seven scoring drives against the Owls were under one minute.
- Navy topped the 300-yard rushing barrier for the third time this season with 301 yards, 34 yards over the season average. The Mids' 66 yards through the air are the fewest since 1st year's Tulane contest (Nov. 6) in which Navy threw for just 50 yards. Navy finished the game with 367 yards of total offense, the second-lowest output of the season (343 against Maryland).
- Thanks to **Matt Hall's (Jr./Cape Coral, Fla.)** 31-yard touchdown run in the first quarter, Navy put points on the scoreboard first for the second-consecutive game.
- Junior quarterback **Brian Hampton (Scott Air Force Base, Ill.)**, who entered the Rice game with 34 yards rushing on 16 carries, produced 40 yards on back-to-back carries in the second quarter, including a career-long 24-yard run. He finished the game with 46 yards on five carries with one touchdown.
- Junior linebacker **Tyler Tidwell (Edmond, Okla.)** recorded career-highs in tackles (eight), tackles for a loss (four), sacks (two) and forced his first-career fumble. Senior linebacker **Jake Biles (Lorena, Texas)** paced the Mids with a career-high tying 11 tackles. Junior linebacker **Rob Caldwell (St. John, Ind.)** recorded double-figure tackles (10 vs Rice) for the fifth time in six games this year. Outside linebacker **David Mahoney (Jr./Fort Myers, Fla.)** posted a season-high nine tackles and recovered his first-career fumble. Senior outside linebacker **Jason Monts (Midlothian, Va.)** produced a career-high eight tackles. Junior safety **Keenan Little (Boiling Springs, N.C.)** forced a fumble for the first time in his career. **Andrew Tattersall (Jr./Fern Park, Fla.)** recovered his first fumble of his career.
- Freshman **Ketric Buffin (Rowlett, Texas)** made his first-collegiate start in just his second collegiate appearance.
- Freshman kicker **Matt Harmon (Taylors, S.C.)** scored his first-career point on an extra-point kick with 59 seconds left in the game.

The Mids fell behind 14-0 in the first half thanks to an interception by **Lamar Owens (Sr./Savannah, Ga.)**, the fifth he has thrown this year on Navy's opening drive, and a 32-yard punt by **Eric Shuey (Sr./Hacienda Heights, Calif.)** that set up two short Scarlet Knight scoring drives.

The Mids cut the lead to 14-7 on a spectacular 60-yard touchdown run by **Reggie Campbell (So./Sanford, Fla.)** down the left sideline that was helped by great downfield blocking by wide

receiver **O.J. Washington (So./Tacoma, Wash.)**.

Navy got the ball back after Jeremy Ito missed a 32-yard field goal on Rutgers' next possession, but **Trey Hines (Jr./Douglasville, Ga.)** fumbled the ball back to the Scarlet Knights on the first play from scrimmage. Seven plays later, Ray Rice scored from three yards out to put Rutgers back up by 14.

The Mids mounted their most impressive drive of the game to start the second half, rumbling 74 yards on 15 plays. Freshman sensation **Karlos Whittaker (North Chicago, Ill.)** scored from nine yards out to make the score 21-14.

On Rutgers' next possession, the game could have turned in Navy's favor had the replay official not overturned a fumble that was recovered by Navy (the officials on the field called it a fumble). On third-and-two from the Navy 34, Rutgers quarterback Ryan Hart completed a pass to Brian Leonard. Navy outside linebacker **David Mahoney (Jr./Fort Myers, Fla.)** came from behind Leonard and knocked the ball out of his hands just as Leonard's knee hit the ground. The replays showed the ball came out simultaneously with Leonard's knee hitting the ground. Without irrefutable evidence to the contrary, Navy should have been able to keep the ball, but the replay official ruled that Leonard was down and gave the ball back to Rutgers. Seven plays later, Ito kicked an 18-yard field goal, after the Navy defense held the Scarlet Knights on three plays from inside the two-yard line, to put Rutgers back up by 10 points.

Navy pulled to within three points with 8:24 remaining in the game when Owens capped a 10-play, 65-yard drive with an eight-yard touchdown pass to **Marco Nelson (Sr./Scottsdale, Ariz.)** on third-and-goal from the seven.

On Rutgers' next possession, the Navy defense let the Scarlet Knights move easily back down the field. On second-and-nine from the Navy 16, Hart's pass was intercepted in the end zone by **Jake Biles (Sr./Lorena, Ariz.)**. The ACC officiating crew ruled an incomplete pass on the play, but the Navy defense and coaching staff were sure that would be overruled by the Big East replay official. Though on the replay the ball was clearly intercepted, it was ruled incomplete. Two plays later, Rutgers scored on a two-yard touchdown run by Rice to put the game away.

Campbell rushed for 69 yards and a touchdown on just four carries to lead the Navy ground attack. Owens completed nine of his 20 pass attempts for 124 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions. **Jason Tomlinson (Jr./Arlington, Texas)** led the Navy receiving corps with five catches for 61 yards.

Biles led the Navy defense with a career-high 14 tackles. Mahoney added 13 tackles and a tackle for a loss, while **Rob Caldwell (Jr./St. John, Ind.)** chipped in with 11 tackles and a forced fumble. **Andrew Tattersall (Jr./Fern Park, Fla.)**, who entered the game with two sacks in his career, recorded three sacks in the first half against the Scarlet Knights.

*The 10-point loss was Navy's largest this season. The Mids lost by three points to Maryland (23-20) and Stanford (41-38).

*Senior linebacker Jake Biles (Lorena, Texas) recorded a career-high 14 tackles.

The Mids played the Irish even outside of the final 8:37 of the second quarter when Notre Dame scored 21-unanswered points thanks to a failed fourth down, a fumble and a short punt.

The Mids had several impressive drives in the game, including a 16-play, 68-yard, 7:45 drive on their initial possession of the game. The drive ended on a nine-yard touchdown run by **Adam Ballard (So./Lewisville, Texas)** that tied the score at seven.

The scoring drive was the longest drive by Navy this year in time and tied for the longest drive in plays, while it was the longest drive against Notre Dame in time and plays.

Senior quarterback **Lamar Owens (Savannah, Ga.)** capped off another impressive drive to start the second half when he scored from one yard out, as the Mids marched 80 yards in 12 plays taking 6:12 off the clock.

Reserve quarterback **Brian Hampton (Jr./Scott Air Force Base, Ill.)** led an impressive drive in the fourth quarter as the Mids marched 78 yards in 13 plays over 5:31 and capped it off with a 17-yard touchdown pass to **Tyree Barnes (Fr./Hampton, Va.)**

Owens led the Navy offense with 62 yards rushing and a touchdown on 26 carries, while completing three of his seven pass attempts for 58 yards. Freshman slot back **Karlos Whittaker (North Chicago, Ill.)** had an impressive day running the football, rushing for 50 yards on seven carries and returning six kickoffs for 159 yards.

The Navy defense was led by junior linebacker **Rob Caldwell (St. John, Ind.)**, who was in on a team-high 14 tackles, and senior linebacker **Jack Biles (Lorena, Texas)**, who recorded 11 stops. Safety **Dujuan Price (Jr./Dallas, Texas)** intercepted his first pass of the season, stopping a string of 130-straight passes by Quinn without and interception, which is a school record for the Irish.

Notes From The Notre Dame Game

- Notre Dame extended its winning streak to 42-straight games over the Midshipmen. The Irish own a 69-9-1 series lead, including a 26-3 advantage in games played at Notre Dame Stadium.

Senior quarterback **Lamar Owens (Savannah, Ga.)** rushed for 99 yards and three touchdowns, while sophomore fullback **Adam Ballard (Lewisville, Texas)** rumbled for 192 yards and two touchdowns as Navy trounced Army

for the fourth-consecutive year, 42-23, in front of a sold out crowd at Lincoln Financial Field (69,322). The win gives Navy the series lead, 50-49-7, for the first time since 1991.

The Navy offense, which scored on six-straight possessions, set two Army-Navy game records as the Mids rushed for 490 yards and ran up 531 yards of total offense on a defense that came in ranked 23rd in the nation.

The game turned late in the second quarter with Navy leading 14-10. **Rob Caldwell (Jr./St. John, Ind.)** and **Keenan Little (Jr./Boiling Springs, N.C.)** dropped Army running back Carlton Jones for no gain on a third-and-one play from the Army 40 and forced a West Point punt.

The Mids took the ball over at their own 34-yard line with 1:15 left and promptly moved down the field in eight plays with Owens capping the drive off with a one-yard dive to make the score 21-10.

Army got the ball to start the second half and Caldwell once again stopped Jones for no gain on third and one and forced an Army punt.

The Mids moved right down the field, marching 75 yards on seven plays with Ballard putting the nail in Army's coffin with a 28-yard touchdown run.

Ballard would later answer an Army touchdown with a 67-yard touchdown run on the first play from scrimmage to make the score 42-17.

Reggie Campbell (So./Sanford, Fla.) and **Marco Nelson (Sr./Scottsdale, Ariz.)** didn't let Owens and Ballard have all the fun, as Campbell rushed for 60 yards and a touchdown on three carries, while Nelson rushed for 77 yards on seven carries.

Jake Biles (Sr./Lorena, Texas) led the Navy defense with 13 tackles, while Little and Caldwell recorded 10 tackles each. **David Mahoney (Jr./Fort Myers, Fla.)** had three tackles for a loss.

Owens was named the Philadelphia Sports Writers Association Most Valuable Player for his efforts, marking the fourth-consecutive year that a Navy player has taken home the honor.

Notes from the Army Game:

- The Mids cruised to their fourth-consecutive victory over Army, defeating the Black Knights 42-23 in today's contest ... the win gives Navy a 50-49-7 series advantage, its first lead in the series since 1991.
- Senior quarterback **Lamar Owens** was named the Philadelphia Sports Writers Association Most Valuable Player ... it's the fourth-consecutive year in which a Navy player has won the award ... Owens is the first Navy QB to receive the award since 2002 when Craig Candeto was named the MVP.
- The Mids have outscored the Black Knights, 186-54, over the last four meetings.
- In the last three Army-Navy games, Navy's starting fullbacks (Kyle Eckel and Adam Ballard) have rushed for 523 yards and five touchdowns on 73 carries (7.2 yards per carry).
- Navy's Class of '06 is the first class to post a 4-0 record against Army since the Class of '77 ... it is the sixth class to turn in an undefeated record against Army and the fourth team to post a 4-0 record ... the Class of '43 and Class of '44 had their playing careers cut short due to World War II.
- Navy's 22 first downs by rush tied a school record in an Army-Navy game which was originally set in 1985 and later tied in '97 and '02.
- With a 3-0 lead after the first quarter, Army's lead marked its first over the Mids since the 2001 contest.
- Navy has outscored Army, 49-14, in the second quarter of the last two

games (28-7 in 2004, 21-7 in 2005).

• With a 28-yard touchdown run by **Adam Ballard**, at 10:17 in the third quarter, the Mids scored for the eighth time this season on the first drive of the second half.

• Navy has produced six touchdown drives of under a minute this season, including **Adam Ballard's** 67-yard TD at 14:51 in the fourth quarter in which 16 seconds elapsed.
