Coaching Staff

Rob Friedrich

Head Coach • 11th Season • 21st Year at Navy • Rutgers '97

Rob Friedrich enters his eleventh season as head coach of the heavyweight rowing team in 2022-23. In total, he's served on coaching staffs at Navy since 2001-02. In November of 2021, he was named the Tom & Candy Knudson Director of Navy Rowing.



As Navy Heavyweight Head Coach (2012-Pres.)

Has coached the varsity boats in head-to-head competitions to a career record of 59-38 ...

2022 - Navy got back to a more regular schedule in 2022 as cup racing returned amongst the Mids and their rivals ... Competitive throughout the campaign, Navy collected four wins over ranked opposition and finished the year No. 14 in the last IRA Top-25 Coaches Poll ... In the postseason, the Mids finished eighth at the Eastern Sprints and 12th at the IRA National Championship in the team standings ... The program was represented at the 2022 USRowing Selection Camp by Billy Duffy ('23) and John McNicholas ('25) ... Senior Griffin Dunne was selected as the 2021 USRowing Under-23 Co-Male National Team Athlete of the Year. ... **2021** - Ranked inside the top-12 of the national coaches' poll for the entire regular season, the Mids closed out its 2021 slate at the IRA National Championships with top-10 results by their first, second and third varsity eights, as well as by their varsity four. Navy's quality and depth helped it finish sixth overall in the Ten Eyck team point standings ... Griffin Dunne and Will Geib represented the United States at the the 2021 Under-23 World Rowing Championships. Dunne and the M8+ finished second in the world, while Geib and the M4+ earned a bronze for their third place result. ... **2020** - Navy was ranked 13th in the nation in the Preseason IRA/USRowing Coaches' Poll before the season was cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic in mid-March ... 2020 graduates Andrew Knoll and Jake Klosowski were selected to participate in the U.S. U-23 Men's National Team Selection Camp (it was eventually cancelled) ... **2019** - Friedrich and the Mids had a strong regular season with eight wins. That success carried over to the postseason as the program placed ninth at the Eastern Sprints and 11th at the IRA National Championship ... In the summer, he led the United States Armed Forces team at the 2019 Henley Royal Regatta in the King's Cup competition; the mixed gender team with athletes from all three Navy crew programs won the King's Cup as the top crew of military athletes, knocking off Germany in the finals... Additionally, Andrew Knoll spent his second straight summer with the U.S. Rowing team, this time collecting silver at the Under-23 World Rowing Championships ... **2018** - Friedrich continued leading Navy to a spot in the upper echelon of the nation's rowing scene as the program's top boat won six regular season races before finishing 13th at the IRA National Championships ... Amongst their trophy competitions, the Mids won the Oliver T. Carr Bowl at the George Washington Invitational and the Stevenson Cup over Columbia ... Sophomore Andrew Knoll led the list of individual Midshipmen accolades as he raced for the United States' 4- at the 2018 Under-23 World Rowing Championships in Poland ... **2017** - In his fifth season at the helm of the Mids, led the team to six regular season wins with a perfect showing at the Goes Trophy competition versus Syracuse and Cornell highlighting the spring; the clean sweep of V8 through 4V8 action gave the Mids the Stag Cup, as well ... The program finished 13th overall in the Ten Eyck standings at the IRA National Championships ... **2016** - Led Navy to a perfect 8-0 competitive mark at the George Washington Invitational as the Mids once again took home the Oliver T. Carr Bowl ... Finished his fourth campaign with Navy's first varsity crew ranking 10th at the IRA National Championships and ninth overall in the Ten Eyck team standings ... Mentored three U.S. Men's U-23 National Team Selection Camp participants in Tim Tracey, Julian Hagberg and David Sands ... **2015** - After beginning the spring season at the historic San Diego Crew Classic, Friedrich's varsity eight crew earned a seventh place

standing at the EARC Sprints followed by a ninth-place ranking at the IRA National Championships ... As a team at the IRAs, Navy finished 11th overall in the Ten Eyck standings ... Aided Tim Tracy and Julian Hagberg as the duo competed at the 2015 U-23 World Rowing Championships ... **2014** - Finished campaign with an 11th place team finish at the IRA National Championships and a seventh place standing at the Eastern Sprints Four boats at the IRAs finished in the top-nine ... **2013** - Capped the season with a seventh place finish at the EARC Sprints and a ninth in the IRA National Championships. Ninth at the IRAs was Navy's best finish since 2005.

As Navy Heavyweight Senior Associate Head Coach (2008-12)

In four seasons as senior associate head coach, Friedrich coached the freshman boats to a combined 66-10 record ... After posting 5-3 and 12-2 regular-season records, respectively during his first two years, the freshman boats combined to go 16-1 in 2011 and 26-2 in 2012 ... Guided the top freshman boat to a fourth-place finish at the 2011 EARC Championships, which was the highest placing for a Navy plebe crew in 15 seasons.

As Navy Lightweight Head Coach (2001-08)

Selected as the EARC Coach of the Year in 2004. Also garnered Navy Spring Coach-of-the-Year honors in 2002 and 2004 ... During his seven years as the Navy head lightweight coach, the varsity boat posted a combined 12-2 in its races for the Callow Cup (Penn) and Haines Trophy (Harvard) ... The program had compiled a 2-8 record in those same races during the six years prior to Friedrich's arrival ... **2008** - Navy finished second during the grand finals of the IRA National Championship ... The Midshipmen placed third in points at the Eastern Sprints and finished the regular with a 5-1 record ... **2007** - The Mids repeated as the team points champion at the Eastern Sprints, while the varsity boat placed fourth overall at the event and sixth at the IRA Championship ... **2006** - Navy won the program's first team points title at the Eastern Sprints as each Navy entry placed first or second in its respective grand final. The varsity boat placed sixth at the IRA Regatta ... **2005** - His varsity crew posted a 6-1 record during the regular season, placed fourth at the Eastern Sprints and finished in sixth place at the IRAs ... **2004** - The varsity boat capped off an undefeated regular season by winning the Eastern Sprints and the IRA National Championship, winning the former event for the first time in 42 years. The crew would go on to reach the semifinal round of the Henley Royal Regatta ... **2003** - The Mids totaled three medals at the Eastern Sprints, with both freshman boats winning a gold medal for the first time in school history ... **2002** - Both freshman boats finished the regular season undefeated, the second varsity crew won the Eastern Sprints and the varsity boat placed second by one foot in the IRA Grand Final. Varsity boat defeated Harvard for the first time in 21 years. The varsity boat placed seventh at the IRA Regatta.

As Rutgers Lightweight Head Coach

Was the head coach of the lightweight program at Rutgers for three years ... Selected as the EARC Coach of the Year as his varsity boat won a silver medal at the IRAs and his second varsity boat placed second at the Eastern Sprints ... In 2000, the program won the Platt Cup over Princeton and Cornell for the first time in 13 years ... After earning a No. 1 ranking during the regular season, ended the year by competing at the Henley Royal Regatta.

Rowing Experience

Served as the captain of the Rutgers team as a senior and was twice named as the program's most valuable athlete ... Won a gold medal at the C.R.A.S.H.-B World Indoor Rowing Championship ... Spent two years training with the U.S. National Team. Placed fifth in the lightweight four at the Nation's Cup in Milan, Italy.

Coaching Staff

Ethan Shoemaker

Ast. Coach/Recruiting Coord. • Second Season • Marietta College '12

Announced to the Navy staff in August of 2021, Ethan Shoemaker comes to Annapolis after a four-year stint at Stetson University, where he served as an assistant coach and leader of the Hatters' men's program. A year into his time with the Mids, Shoemaker was elevated to top assistant and recruiting coordinator in September of 2022.



During his time at Stetson, Shoemaker helped the squad earn its first-ever medal at the 2018 Dad Vail Regatta with a silver in the men's varsity four, as well as its first appearance at the IRA National Championships. At the 2019 national regatta, the Hatters' V4+ placed fifth overall in its respective event. This past May, Stetson's first and second varsity eight crews reached the grand finals of the Dad Vail Regatta for the first time. In addition to his work on the water, Shoemaker was the recruiting coordinator for the men's team.

Prior to Stetson, Shoemaker was the head coach at the Space Coast Crew Club from 2012 through 2017, as well as held roles with the 2013 Penn AC Junior Gold Summer Rowing Program and the 2012 USRowing Youth National Team Development Camp.

He is a 2012 graduate from Marietta College and was a four-year member of the varsity rowing team. Shoemaker, the program's captain as a senior in 2011-12, earned a degree in history with a minor in psychology. Additionally, he earned a certificate of leadership studies from Marietta.

Steve Fluhr

Boatman • Second Season • Florida Institute of Technology '83

Fluhr will be serving as the boatman for the Navy heavyweight, lightweight and women's rowing programs. Joining the Navy staff in August of 2021, Fluhr is an accomplished member of the rowing community for over 30 years, Fluhr brings experience in national, collegiate, interscholastic, prep and camp environments. Most recently, Fluhr was the head rowing coach at the Hun School of Princeton. Collegiately, he was director of rowing at the Florida Institute of Technology from 1988 to 1990 and Trinity College in Connecticut from 1990 to 2003.



A 1983 graduate from the Florida Institute of Technology, Fluhr has aided the USRowing Association as a regional coordinator (Southeast), as well as a coach of the 1988 U.S. Heavyweight Men's Pre-Elite U-23 Team and 1987 U.S. Men's National Team.

Alex Kincaid

Assistant Coach • First Season • Washington College '19

Kincaid joined the heavyweight coaching staff in September of 2022. A talented competitor and coach from the Maryland-D.C. area, Kincaid served as a coxswain for four years with the heavyweight team at Washington College before joining the coaching ranks as a rowing coach with DeMatha Catholic High School and most recently as the head coach at Catholic University.



Kincaid immediately jumped into the realm of coaching following his graduation from Washington College in 2019 as an assistant coach with the Catholic University and DeMatha Catholic High School programs in the fall of 2019. While at Catholic, he supported both the men's and women's teams. When coaching at DeMatha, he coached the varsity men and developed a coaching rotation to maximize the strengths of the team's coaches and advance the skills of the athletes, as well as structured a training plan for the varsity and novice programs for the fall, winter and spring seasons.

In January of 2020, he was elevated to coach of the men's rowing team at Catholic. During his three seasons at the helm of the Cardinals, Kincaid helped his squad navigate two seasons that were severely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic before leading the program to new heights during the 2021-22 season as they raced at the Head of the Charles for the first time, as well as placed third at the 2022 Knecht Cup and sixth at the 2022 Mid-Atlantic Rowing Conference Championship. Kincaid and Catholic concluded their 2022 campaign with their first-ever berth to the IRA National Championships as the varsity four garnered a spot in that respective classification. Under his guidance, Declan Waters earned a nod on the 2022 IRCA All-American Second Team.

As a collegiate competitor, Kincaid was a two-year team captain and 2019 All-Mid-Atlantic Rowing Conference (MARC) selection at Washington College. He was also a two-time team MVP selection. Additionally, Kincaid was a three-time Academic All-MARC selection and recipient of the 2018 Elizabeth "Bo" Blanchard Memorial Sportmanship Award.

During his high school career at DeMatha, Kincaid was a two-year varsity team captain and earned All-Met honorable mention accolades.

He graduated from Washington College in 2019 with a B.A. in Philosophy and later attained a Master's of Science in Leadership and Management in 2022.

Navy Heavyweight Rowing History

One of the oldest sports at the Naval Academy, the crew program began 150 years ago when intramural crews raced in craft similar to whale boats during the 1869 academic year.

A gale carried the Navy boathouse and equipment away in 1877 and it wasn't until 1892 that the sport resurfaced at the Academy under the leadership of future noted American author Winston Churchill. In 1893, Navy purchased its first eight-oared shell from contributions made by the Brigade of Midshipmen. A year later, a new boathouse was built and two new eights added.

Navy began to row against outside competition again in 1897, beating Pennsylvania in a three-length victory over a three-mile course.

The crews were given a new boathouse at the mouth of Dorsey Creek in 1899 at a site not far from the present Navy rowing facilities. For the next two decades, there was a buildup of intercollegiate competition that was broken by World War I. In 1907, Navy made its first appearance in the Poughkeepsie Regatta, today's IRA, finishing third.

For five years around the turn of the century, Navy had a new coach each year, including the well-known Jim Ten Eyck. Finally in 1904, some stability was infused when Richard A. Glendon took over and laid the groundwork for Navy's winning heritage.

When World War I ended in 1919, Glendon had more men out for the sport than he could seat in shells. Thus, he was able to come up with his strongest eight, recording an undefeated season. A year later, Navy lost only to Syracuse but rebounded to defeat the Orangemen in the National Regatta in Worcester, Mass., thus earning the right to represent the United States in the 1920 Olympics in Belgium.

Navy rowed to the Olympic Gold Medal by driving past Great Britain in the final 500 meters. The Midshipmen who rowed in the boat were the toast of the Brigade and in 1921 and '22, Navy won the Poughkeepsie Regatta.

A year later, young Dick Glendon took over for his father as Navy crew coach and the Midshipmen responded with an undefeated season, but were second at Poughkeepsie to a Western crew, Washington. The younger Glendon directed Navy to another unbeaten season in 1925 and its third varsity championship in five years at Poughkeepsie. After the season, he departed for Columbia.

Navy crews for the next several years were thwarted in their endeavors, just missing wins in several key races, but winning at Poughkeepsie in 1931. In 1932, Buck Walsh stepped in as head coach and the Midshipmen once more were among the eastern powers, winning the IRA in 1938.

The war years of the 1940s were lean for Navy crew and saw several opponents drop the sport and the cancellation of the Poughkeepsie Regatta for four years. There was one spark when in 1947, the Mids were the Poughkeepsie winners. In 1950, Walsh passed away, and the reins of Navy's crew program being handed to his close coaching associate, Russell "Rusty" Callow.

Callow became a popular figure at the Academy. After winning only one race in 1951, his varsity crew went unbeaten in 1952, '53 and '54. The 1952 eight was the U.S. Olympic crew and went on to claim a gold medal in Helsinki, Finland. During those three seasons, the Navy crews won 23 consecutive collegiate races (29 races overall) and three-straight IRA Varsity Eight Championships.

In 1960, Callow was succeeded by Louis Lindsay. His crew that year finished second at the IRA, but a week later reversed its placing and beat California to win the Olympic Trials and the right for a Naval Academy eight to once again represent the United States in the Olympics. Navy and the University of California are the only two rowing organizations to have been the U. S. eight-oared representative three times in the Olympic Games.

In the 1960s, Navy continued to vie for national honors under Paul Quinn, who had taken over from Lindsay. The Mids won the Eastern Sprints in 1961 and the Varsity Challenge Cup at the IRAs in 1965.

In 1969, Carl Ullrich became the mentor at The Boathouse. The man who later would become Assistant Director of Athletics at Navy, Director of Athletics at Army and Executive Director of the Patriot League, guided the Midshipmen

to the Eastern Sprints title in 1971.

In 1974, one of Ullrich's former plebe coaches, Rick Clothier, returned to the Academy as head coach.

During Clothier's tenure as head coach of the Midshipmen, he achieved a career mark of 216-101-2 (.680), competing against some of the best teams in collegiate rowing. His overall record in over 40 years as a Division I head coach is 256-102-2 (.714), which includes five years at his alma mater, the University of Washington, prior to taking over the Navy program.

Among his many coaching accomplishments, Clothier oversaw the program's return to the Intercollegiate Rowing Association (IRA) National Championships in 1980 with an upset win in the Varsity Eight event. His crews went on to win seven Ten Eyck Trophies (overall team champions), three Varsity Challenge Cup titles (varsity national champions) and five Kennedy Trophy Cups (second varsity national champions).

In 32 years at the IRA, Clothier's Navy crews won 28 IRA championships. Additionally, he coached Navy to four consecutive gold medal wins at the prestigious Head of the Charles Regatta, the only collegiate crew to ever accomplish that goal.

In addition, over 30 Navy oarsmen since 1980 have been members of United States national teams representing their school and country in world-wide competitions, including the Olympic and Pan American games.

After 11 combined years as a successful head coach of the lightweight team and as an associate head coach with the heavyweights, Rob Friedrich was chosen to replace Clothier prior to the 2012-13 school year.

In February of 2019, the program celebrated the 150th year of Navy Crew with an expansive banquet with speakers from all decades dating back to the 1950's and all three teams, the heavies, lightweights and women. Alumni, families and dignitaries filled Bancroft Hall to relive the history of Navy Crew.

During the summer of 2019, Hubbard Hall was involved in the historic King's Cup competition at the Henley Royal Regatta. Racing under the banner of the United States Armed Forces team, members from Navy's heavyweight, lightweight and women's programs joined up for the mixed gender event involving active duty and future officers of the military. In recognition of the 100th Anniversary of the first-ever King's Cup, the original six nations of Australia, Canada, France, New Zealand, the United Kingdom and the United States, in addition to Germany and the Netherlands raced in a knock-out format over the final three days of the regatta. At the conclusion of the competition, Navy finished atop the standings as the Mids knocked off the team from Germany in the finals. Friedrich was selected to lead the contingent of Navy rowers.

In the fall of 2021, Navy received a historic commitment to name the director of rowing position. On November 20, the Navy Rowing program received a leadership gift commitment from longtime loyal supporters, Tom '67 and Candy Knudson that will impact all three programs in perpetuity. Knudson captained the 1967 heavyweight team and competed as a member of the 1965 National Champion Varsity Eight. Rob Friedrich became the first Tom and Candy Knudson Director of Navy Rowing.

The USRowing organization named Griffin Dunne as its 2021 Under-23 National Team Co-Male Athlete of the Year for his efforts with the men's eight at the 2021 World Rowing Under-23 Championship.
