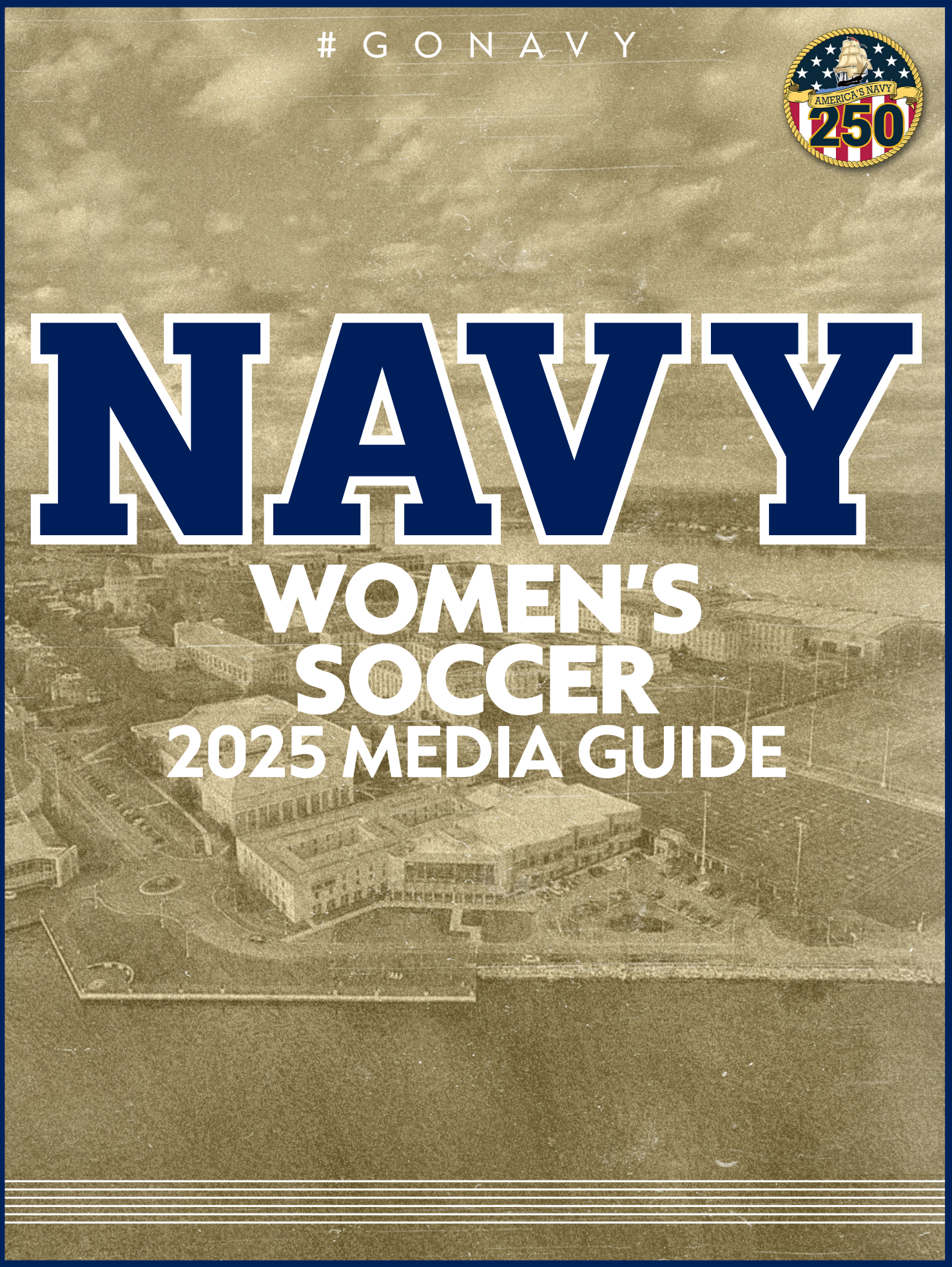

## COACHING STAFF

### CARIN GABARRA HEAD COACH

Carin Gabarra is a proven winner.

Not only was she a success as a forward on the UC-Santa Barbara soccer team and later in her career playing for the United States National Team, but Gabarra has also demonstrated the golden touch when leading others by example.

It is the gift of leadership, which has led her to become one of the household names within the collegiate coaching ranks. Not because she was an eight-time All-American (four in high school and four at UC-Santa Barbara), and not because she was a member of the 1996 Olympic gold-medal winning U.S. National Team, but because she has developed the Navy soccer program from ground level to one of the Mid-Atlantic Region's most competitive teams.

Since taking over the Navy program in 1993, she has taken the Midshipmen from a club-level organization to a team who has claimed at least a share of the Patriot League regular-season title 10 times, made five NCAA Tournament appearances, and produced 21 consecutive winning seasons from 1995 through 2015. In total she's had 26 total winning seasons in her 32 years at the helm of the Midshipmen.

Gabarra is the Patriot League's all-time wins leader and joined an elite group of coaches when she won her 300th career game during the 2015 season.



### BUILDING FROM THE BEGINNING

Gabarra arrived at Navy in 1993, and led the Mids to a 2-5 mark in their first season as a varsity sport. In the process, Navy gained valuable experience before beginning Patriot League competition in 1994.

The Mids showed great progress in their inaugural season, as they missed a league tournament berth by just one game. The improvement continued in '95 with Navy boasting a record of 10-7-1 while making their first Patriot League Tournament appearance. The team's success didn't stop there. The '96 squad produced an 11-6-2 record, finished fourth in the league and made its first postseason tournament appearance with a game against Monmouth in the ECAC Tournament. Gabarra guided the 1997 team to a 10-8 record and a third-place finish in the Patriot League. Six Mids earned All-Patriot League recognition, including Defensive Player of the Year and Academic All-America honoree, Nicole Aunapu.

The 1998 season fulfilled the dreams of many, as Gabarra led the Mids to 17 wins, 14 shutouts and Navy's first regular-season conference title. An unprecedented nine Mids earned all-league honors, including eight first-teamers. Justine Fisher earned rookie-of-the-year accolades, while Aunapu was dubbed Defensive Player of the Year for the second-straight season. Aunapu was just the sixth player in league history to earn First-Team All-Patriot League recognition all four years and concluded her career as a two-time Academic All-American.

In 1999, Navy again made a run at the Patriot League crown, as the Mids shared the regular-season title with a 5-1 league mark. While making a return trip to the conference championship game, six Mids were tabbed all-league, including Fisher who became the first Mid to be honored as the Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year.

The year 2000 brought Fisher her third all-league honor, as the Mids posted a 10-9-2 record and earned a bid to the league tournament for the sixth-consecutive season. Meanwhile, two rookies showed a glimmer of greatness to come in Amelia Sheveland, who tied the school record for goals in a game with four, and Stacy Finley, who made 17 starts while playing virtually every position.

Just one win shy of the school record, the 2001 team found success as it claimed a share of the Patriot League regular-season title with a 16-5-1 overall mark and 6-1 league record. Fisher became Navy's all-time leading scorer, while Gabarra claimed her 100th-career win all in one eventful day -- Oct. 28, 2001, against George Mason. Finley earned the offensive player-of-the-year title, Kate Macfarlane was deemed the defensive player of the year and Xochitl Piedra shared the top rookie honor. Meanwhile, Fisher and Kate Macfarlane both were Academic All-Americans.

Navy posted the program's first undefeated regular season at 16-0-4, before American upset the Mids in the Patriot League Tournament to leave the only blemish on the Mids' 2002 record. Navy was the only Div. I school that finished the 2002 season without a loss in regular-season play. Finley garnered her second-straight Patriot League Offensive Player-of-the-Year award after setting single-season school records with 45 points and 19 goals. Defensively, Kim Bonafede was among the top three nationally in GAA. Nadia Sheikh was

a first-team all star after assuming the school's all-time assist lead in the final game of her career.

In 2003, Navy claimed its first Patriot League Tournament title and became the first Naval Academy women's team in any sport to earn a bid to play in the NCAA Tournament. En route to their 17-5-1 record, the Mids owned the nation's longest regular-season unbeaten streak (35 games) before dropping a one-goal decision to eventual national champion North Carolina. Over 6,500 fans witnessed the game, breaking the NCAA single-game attendance record. Stacy Finley was named First-Team All-Patriot League after becoming the Mids' all-time leader in career scoring, goals scored and shots taken. Classmate Amelia Sheveland garnered Patriot League Tournament MVP recognition, finishing her career as Navy's fourth leading scorer all-time.

The year 2004 was one of rebuilding. Navy dropped its first three league games, but responded by winning four straight. Injuries plagued the Mids in 2005, but for junior Meggie Curran, she finally was healthy and it showed. Curran paced the Patriot League with 32 points (9 g, 14 a).

In 2006, the four-member Class of 2007 began and ended their playing careers at the Academy in much the same fashion, by leading the Mids to the NCAA Tournament. A magical season saw Navy win a school-record 21 games, earn its sixth regular-season league crown, claim its second Patriot League Tournament title, and for the first time, advance to the NCAA's Second Round. Nestled in there was Navy's first win over a nationally-ranked program, a 1-0 victory over ninth-ranked Penn State in front of a standing-room only crowd at the Glenn Warner Soccer Facility. Navy won 19-straight games before losing its regular-season finale by a goal.

The Mids led the nation in GAA (.370), shutout percentage (.790) and save percentage (.918), while setting school records in points (219), goals (70), assists (79), shutouts (19), and GAA (.370). Meggie Curran was named the Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year, while also becoming the program's first All-American. Rookie Shelly Moeller was named the co-defensive player of the year and claimed league tournament MVP kudos while playing in front of sophomore keeper Lizzie Barnes, who led the nation and set Patriot League records for GAA (0.29) en route to earning the league's goalkeeper-of-the-year laurel.

The 2007 squad posted a 14-5-4 record and claimed Navy's second NCAA berth in as many years. Behind offensive juggernaut Brigitte Fox and a stout defense, the Mids peaked at just the right time. Navy closed out the year unbeaten in its final 10 matches to earn its third-ever NCAA nod. Fox garnered first-team all-league recognition for a second-straight year after pacing the conference with 16 goals and 35 points. Senior team captain Kari Weniger closed out a fine career by garnering her second Academic All-America honor.

A balanced attack and smothering defense propelled Navy to a 15-win season in 2008, which included an unbeaten league mark (5-0-2) and the program's seventh regular-season Patriot League title. Navy boasted the league's least scored-upon defense for the third year in a row, led by the Patriot League's Defender and Goalkeeper of the Year in Shelly Moeller and Lizzie Barnes. Barnes concluded her storied career as the Patriot League's all-time GAA leader (0.65) and a two-time First-Team Academic All-American.

Navy earned a fourth-straight berth to the Patriot League Tournament in 2009, posting a 14-5-2 record after racing out to an impressive 8-1-1 start. The squad was nearly unbeatable at home with a 7-1-1 mark at the GWSF, which included a 2-0 win over Army in the Star Game. The Army-Navy rivalry brought 2,627 fans to the facility, a new record. In her first year as a starter, Beth Reed was named Patriot League Goalkeeper of the Year. In addition, Reed was chosen as the CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Women's Soccer Academic All-American of the Year. Reed became the first Navy student-athlete to receive the top academic honor for one's sport. Classmate Shelly Moeller earned NSCAA/addidas Scholar All-America honors.

The Mids produced their 17th straight winning season in 2010 with a 9-8-3 mark. In 2011, Navy returned to Patriot League Tournament and advanced to its ninth league title game. Navy earned three All-Patriot League selections and Kate Herren and Ashlynn Soellner were both selected to the All-Mid-Atlantic Region Team.

Gabarra earned her third Patriot League Coach of the Year honor after Navy sported a 20-game unbeaten streak en route to a 19-2-1 record in 2012. The Mids won the Patriot League Regular Season title with a 6-0-1 mark but fell in the league title game. Defender Jade Seabrook anchored the Patriot League's top defense and the sophomore became the first Navy player to receive NSCAA All-America honors after being named to the third team. Goalkeeper Elizabeth Hoerner was named to the NSCAA Scholar All-America First Team and was the Patriot League's Goalkeeper of the Year and the Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Navy recorded its 19th straight winning season in 2013 with a 16-5 mark and 8-1-0 league record to garner its eighth regular-season title. Morgan Dankanich, Jade Seabrook and Elizabeth Hoerner were named Patriot League Offensive, Defensive and Goalkeeper of the Year. Seabrook was also named a Third Team NSCAA All-American for the second

consecutive year.

For the 20th consecutive season, the Midshipmen finished with a winning record of 12-4-5 overall and a 6-1-2 league mark. Jade Seabrook was named as the Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year for the third straight season as well as the First Team NSCAA Mid-Atlantic Region. Navy tallied eight players on the all-league squad, which included Rachel Hunter and Seabrook on the first team and Morgan Dankanich, Julie Schumacher and Clare MacAdam on the second.

Despite a young and inexperienced group, Navy tallied its 21st straight winning season in 2015 with an 11-7-4 mark and a 3-2-4 league record. The Mids earned four honorees to the all-league squad, which included Clare MacAdam (1st), Lexi Ricketts (1st), Lizzy Rullan (2nd) and Dayton Wetherby (3rd). Navy advanced to the Patriot League Semifinals following a 6-0 win over American in the quarterfinals.

In 2016, Mids posted a 9-11-2 mark and a 4-4-1 record in Patriot League play. The latter number helped Navy reach the conference postseason tournament for the 19th time in program history. Always in the fight, eight of the Mids' 22 games during the campaign went to overtime. In the postseason awards announcement, five Mids were honored with Natalie Dzhandzhapanyan (2nd) highlighting the quintet.

In her 25th season of action with the Mids, Gabarra led the team to 16-4-1 record and 8-0-1 run of play in Patriot League competition in 2017. That record in league play gave Navy the regular season title and top seed in the Patriot League Tournament where the team defeated Colgate 3-0 in the semifinals before falling to Bucknell, 3-2 in the finals. A dangerous and well-rounded team in 2017, Navy averaged 2.1 goals per game to rank 25th nationally, while its defense posted 13 shutouts (.619 shutout percentage) to rank 12th across the NCAA DI landscape. Individually, Navy had eight players recognized on All-Patriot League teams with Ash Fairow (Offensive P.O.Y.), Meghan Hegarty (Midfielder.O.Y.) and Sydney Fortson (Goalkeeper.O.Y.) all garnering top honors. For the Mids' success, Gabarra was named the 2017 Patriot League Coach of the Year.

Overcoming the loss of 2017 Offensive Player of the Year Ash Fairow to a preseason injury, Gabarra and the Mids quickly re-grouped for a solid 11-6-3 campaign in 2018. In contention for the Patriot League regular season title until the last weekend of play, Navy went 7-2 in league action to rank third overall and reach the program's 21st league tournament. A young team, all five of the Mids' All-Patriot League players were either juniors or freshmen. Junior back Alex Jackson was honored as the PL Defensive Player of the Year.

The team regained its spot in the NCAA Tournament in the Fall of 2019 as the Mids went 16-3-3 on their way to winning the Patriot League Championship. Atop the Patriot League standings in the regular season with a 6-1-2 mark, Navy advanced via penalty kicks in the semifinals before coming from behind to knock off Army in the Patriot League Finals by a score of 2-1. In their first berth in the NCAA Tournament since 2007, the Mids battled the N.C. State Wolfpack in Raleigh for over 55 minutes of scoreless action before the hosts found the back of the net and the eventual victory. Navy's success came from throughout of its roster as nine different players earned Patriot League awards led by Alex Jackson and Kaitlynn Johns, who were respectively named the Patriot League Defensive Player and Rookie of the Year.

In a disjointed two-part 2020-21 schedule, Gabarra and the Mids posted a 4-4-3 overall mark and a 3-1-1 record in Patriot League play. With the COVID-19 pandemic looming throughout the fall and spring semesters, a young Midshipmen team challenged ACC opposition in the fall before hitting its stride in late March on its way to a 4-0-3 conclusion to its season. As part of that undefeated streak, Navy won a Patriot League Semifinal matchup over Loyola before edging Colgate in the Patriot League Finals via a penalty kick shootout. The championship was the second in a row for the Mids and the fifth in program history. Less than two weeks later, the Mids battled into penalty kicks once again in the First Round of the NCAA Championship as they tied the New Mexico Lobos 1-1 in regulation before falling in the shootout. For Navy's success in overcoming the pitfalls for the COVID-impacted regular season and finishing first in the Patriot League South Division, Gabarra was selected as the 2020-21 Patriot League Coach of the Year. She was joined in the league's major awards announcement by Victoria Tran and Chloe Dawson, who were named the Patriot League Midfielder and Rookie of the Year, respectively.

The 2021 team was streaky over the first half of the season and found itself even at 5-5-1 through the end of September. With their youthful roster settling into their roles and getting up to speed in the collegiate game, Navy closed the regular season without a loss over its final eight games (6-0-2) and earned the second seed in the Patriot League Tournament. The Patriot League semifinal between Navy and Bucknell was scoreless for over 93 minutes before the Bison earned the walk-off golden goal victory. Freshman Alexa Riddle made an immediate impact for the Mids as she led the Patriot League in points (23) as she scored nine goals with five assists on her way to earning the league's Rookie of the Year award along with All-North Region honors. Additionally, senior Victoria Tran garnered

her fourth career All-Patriot League award.

The Mids' run of making the Patriot League Tournament continued in 2022 as the team went 8-8-3 and garnered the fifth seed in the year-end event. Bolstered by four All-Patriot League honorees, Navy found itself consistently in the mix with 10 games decided by one or less goals, including a 1-0 win over 2022 NCAA Tournament combatant, FDU. Additionally, the team kicked off league play with a dominant 4-0 win over Bucknell, who eventually earned the conference's AQ bid into the NCAA Tournament.

In 2023, the Mids' season was filled with highs and heartbreak as the team started the season 4-1-3 in non-conference play, including ties against St. John's and Maryland. Once the schedule turned to Patriot League action, Navy started off with a 1-0 win over Lehigh before dropping three straight contests by a combined four goals with a setback to BU in the 85th minute capping the run. Another late game goal in the 83rd minute spelled trouble for the Mids versus American before the team rallied down the stretch with back-to-back shutouts of Holy Cross and Lafayette. Unfortunately, for Navy it ended up one point out of sixth place and a spot in the Patriot League Tournament. Overall, Gabarra and the Mids finished 9-7-3 overall and saw Katie Herrmann and Alexa Riddle garner All-PL Second Team nods.

The 2024 campaign saw Gabarra and the Mids reach the Patriot League Tournament for the 26th time with a 3-4-2 mark in conference play. Known for its offense, Navy registered 1.6 goals per game to rank second in the Patriot League during the season. Upperclassmen Marlee Heaven (Jr., 6 goals), Alexa Riddle (Sr., 5 goals) and Amanda Graziano (Sr., 4 goals, 6 assists) led the charge. For her standout season, Riddle garnered her fourth All-Patriot League playing honor in four years with a spot on the All-PL First Team. She became just the ninth player in program history to earn four all-league honors.

### A STAR IN THE MAKING

A native of Palos Verdes, Calif., Gabarra graduated from California at Santa Barbara in 1987 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in business management. A standout forward for the Gaucho soccer team, she became the NCAA's all-time leading scorer with 102 goals and 60 assists. She held that post until 1993 when fellow Olympian Mia Hamm broke the record. Gabarra was a four-time All-America honoree and UC-Santa Barbara's Woman Athlete of the Decade in 1987, as well as Scholastic Athlete of the Year. In October of 1991, she was inducted into the UC-Santa Barbara Athletic Hall of Fame. She remains the record holder in every individual offensive category at Santa Barbara -- goals in a game, season and career; assists in a season and career; most points in a season and career; shots in a season and career; and games played in a career.

A standout at Palos Verdes High School, as well, she led the nation in scoring from 1980-83 by netting 226 goals and garnered high school All-America accolades four times.

### COACHING ROOTS

Gabarra began her coaching career in 1987 as the head coach at Westmont College in Santa Barbara. There she guided the Warriors to a 6-10-0 record. She moved on to Harvard in 1988, serving as an assistant.

### PRIDE OF THE UNITED STATES

While coaching at Harvard, Gabarra continued competing on the international level where she led the U.S. to its first-ever Women's World Championship (later named Women's World Cup) title in 1991 by scoring six goals and was the recipient of the "Golden Ball," presented to the outstanding player of the championship. She garnered United States Soccer's Female Athlete-of-the-Year honors in 1992, after winning the award for the first time in 1987. She was also tagged the 1987 and '92 United States Olympic Committee Player of the Year. Gabarra recorded 117 international caps from 1987-1996 and scored 53 goals.

Though retired from professional soccer, Gabarra was named to the Stars of the Century Team in the summer of 1999. The roll call includes the best 11 players in the history of women's soccer in the United States -- Gabarra, Michelle Akers, Brandi Chastain, Joy Fawcett, Julie Foudy, Mia Hamm, April Heinrichs, Kristine Lilly, Tiffeny Milbrett, Carla Overbeck, and Briana Scurry. Gabarra and her 1996 gold medal-winning teammates were inducted into the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame in 2004.

The first U.S. player to be named MVP of the Women's World Cup, Gabarra, along with former New York Cosmos superstar Giorgio Chinaglia, were inducted at the National Soccer Hall of Fame in Oneonta, N.Y. on Oct. 28, 2000. She was just the second woman player to be inducted, as former World Cup teammate April Heinrichs was the first enshrined in 1998.

In addition to her coaching duties at Navy, Gabarra is active with the Olympic Development Programs that scout prospective national team players and is a member of the U.S. Soccer Athlete Advisory Council. She serves on the Athlete Advisory Board Project 2012 and is a member of the U.S. Olympic Committee Athlete Advisory Council.

Gabarra has also served on the U.S. Soccer Technical Committee since 2006 and chairs the U.S. Soccer's Girl's Player Development Task Force. Additionally, Gabarra is a member of the Maryland Physical Fitness Council. She is also an honorary member of Habitat for Humanity: Women Building a Legacy. She was recently named to the National Soccer Hall of Fame's Eligibility & Awards Working Committee. Gabarra is also an active member of the Washington, DC-based Athletes for Hope foundation.

In 2011, Gabarra joined Dr. Jill Biden and Chelsea Clinton on the official U.S. Delegation on Air Force Two to the Women's World Cup Final in Germany. In 2012, Gabarra received the United States Sports Academy's Distinguished Service Award.

Gabarra was selected as the recipient of the 2017 Women's Soccer Award of Excellence. Established in 1999 to recognize those who have brought honor and distinction to women's soccer, Gabarra joins the likes of Michelle Akers, April Heinrichs, Kristine Lilly, Tony DiCiccio and Anson Dorrance as elite members of the women's soccer community, who have previously been bestowed this accolade.

### THE GABARRAS

In 1992, the former Carin Jennings married Jim Gabarra. No stranger to the soccer world, Jim was a member of the U.S. National Team from 1986-89, earning 14 caps, and played for the Olympic Team in '88. A former captain of the U.S. Indoor National Team, he competed in the '89, '92 and '96 Futbol World Championships. Jim was the head coach for the Washington Freedom from 2000-2010 and led the franchise to a WUSA Championship in '03. He'd later move on to coach the Sky Blue FC and Washington Spirit teams in the National Women's Soccer League.

The couple have three children, Tyler, Abigail and Talia, and reside in Arnold. Both Tyler (North Carolina State '20) and Talia (UCF '23) played collegiate soccer.

### ROB BLANCK

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH

Beginning his 31st season in 2025, Rob Blanck has been alongside head coach Carin Gabarra from nearly day one in building Navy's women's soccer program. Blanck came to the Academy in 1995, two years after Navy elevated to varsity status.

Blanck knows nothing other than success, having been a member of the Williams College varsity soccer team that produced a winning record all four years in which he played, while in his 32 years as a coach, 29 of his teams have posted winning records. Blanck has played a key role in all aspects of the Navy women's soccer program during his tenure.

Blanck's background as an All-America goalkeeper has been a key element in developing Navy's corps of goalkeepers. Under his tutelage, Navy has produced seven all-league keepers -- three-time honoree Amy Hakola, two-time selection Sarah Wilson, 2001 Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year Kate Macfarlane, three-time all-leaguer Kim Bonafede, two-time Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year and the conference's career GAA leader Lizzie Barnes, 2009 Patriot League Goalkeeper of the Year Beth Reed, 2012 Patriot League Goalkeeper of the Year Elizabeth Hoerner, two-time honoree Dayton Wetherby and 2017 Patriot League Goalkeeper of the Year Sydney Fortson, a three-time honoree.

Barnes, the most decorated netminder in program history, led the nation and set program records for GAA (0.29) and save percentage (.933) in 2006, while posting 13 shutouts - also a Navy record. She graduated as the Navy career leader in GAA (0.65), a career mark which stands 20th all-time in NCAA history. She also holds the school shutout record with 29. In addition to her athletic exploits, Barnes was one of three Navy student-athletes ever to twice earn First Team Academic All-America kudos.

Reed stepped in to replace Barnes in 2009 and promptly was honored as the league's top goalkeeper. Reed ranked 10th in the nation in save percentage and was a part of a goalkeeping unit that produced 11 shutouts. Over the last seven seasons, Blanck's influence has been evident as Navy has only had a goals-against-average over 1.00 for one season. Navy's defensive unit also allowed just nine goals in the entire 2006 season and just eight in 2002.

The Mids' defensive prowess has never been more evident than in recent years. Navy owned the top-ranked Patriot League's defensive unit in three-consecutive seasons (2007-09), posting an 0.63 GAA while allowing only 45 goals with 42 shutouts.

In 2011, Navy posted nine shutouts and had a goals-against average of just 0.90. The 2012 squad led the Patriot League in goals-against average (0.91) and shutouts (nine).

The Mids' 2017 defensive corps held its opposition in check throughout the season to the tune of 13 shutouts and three other contests with only one goal allowed. Navy's 0.619 shutout percentage ranked No. 12 in the NCAA Division I ranks.

Navy's defensive effort in 2018 was stout once again as the Mids allowed just 19 goals over 20 games for a 0.92 goals against average. Navy's opponents were held to one or fewer goals in 15 contests and two or less scores in 19 of 20 games, while recording just 3.95 shots on goal per game, the lowest mark in the Patriot League.

As the team fought its way back into the NCAA Tournament as Patriot League Champions in 2019, Blanck's defensive corps was stout again as Navy went 16-3-3 with a 6-1-2 mark in Patriot League conference play. As a unit, the Mids' defense shut out their opposition 13 times over 22 games and allowed just two goals in nine Patriot League regular season contests. Teams were only able to get 2.77 shots on Navy's goal per game. Nationally, Navy's 0.523 goal against average was 13th-lowest in the NCAA DI ranks.

Navy repeated as conference champions the following season in a COVID-19 impact campaign. After playing three ACC opponents in the fall, the Mids hit their stride in an abbreviated spring season and closed with a 4-0-3 streak over their final seven games, including a victory in the Patriot League Semifinals and a shootout decision over Colgate in the Patriot League Championship to give the team its fifth postseason league title. Navy also forced a penalty kick shootout in the first round of the 2020-21 NCAA Championship tournament, but fell to New Mexico, 4-2. As a unit, Navy's defense held opponents to one or less goals in each of the final seven games of the season.

Navy's 2021 team was once again at or near the top of most of the defensive metrics in the Patriot League. Fostering growth in a young roster, the Mids' defense allowed one or fewer goals in each of the final nine contests of the season, including clean sheets versus Patriot League foes Loyola, American and Holy Cross.



The Mids' 2022 squad was spearheaded by defense and Blanck's acumen as the team allowed just 0.95 goals per game and turned in eight shutouts over 19 contests. Navy was tested throughout the 2022 campaign with 10 games being decided by one or fewer goals.

Navy continued its winning ways in 2023 with a 9-7-3 record. Blanck's expertise with scouting opponents and defense was leaned on significantly as the Mids saw 11 of its 19 games decided by one goal or less, including ties against St. John's and Maryland and a one-goal decision versus Virginia Tech. Overall, Navy's defense posted six clean sheets and a 1.05 goals against average.

With Blanck once again directing the defensive effort in 2024, the Mids found their way back to the Patriot League Tournament while playing with a freshman goalkeeper in Natasha Stramrood, as Navy's defense posted four clean sheets and held opponents to one goal on eight other occasions. Blanck's defenders were also a key part in Navy being bestowed with the Team Ethics and Sportsmanship Bronze Award by the United Soccer Coaches organization, as the Mids collected just 10 yellow cards over their 21 games.

Blanck was also instrumental in recruiting Justine Fisher, a four-time All-Patriot League selection, as well in developing Nicole Aunapu, the first Navy women's soccer player to garner all-league kudos all four years. In the summer of 2003, Blanck was selected to coach the United States in the CISM World Military Games in Germany. He guided the team, which included three former Naval Academy standouts -- Cristina Esposito ('98), Tara Refo ('00), and Sarah Wilson ('01), to a bronze medal with a pair of wins over neighboring Canada.

Prior to his arrival in Annapolis, Blanck served as an assistant coach at Boston College -- working three years as the top assistant with the women's soccer team, while doubling as a men's assistant for two of those seasons. While in Chestnut Hill, he helped guide the Eagles to a winning record and postseason play for three straight years, while Boston College appeared in the national rankings, reaching as high as No. 18.

A native of Weston, Mass., Blanck graduated from Williams College in 1989, where he captained the soccer team to two regional titles and earned First-Team All-America honors after setting four national goalkeeping records. Blanck compiled a 46-4-0 record as a college goalkeeper. He also played baseball and received the Fox Award (in honor of a Navy pilot killed in the Korean War) for recognition of achievements of character and sportsmanship.

Prior to coaching full time, Blanck worked for the Boston Red Sox for two years and completed his Master's Degree in sports management at the University of Massachusetts. He received a second master's in business administration from Babson College. Blanck has received his NSCAA advanced national diploma and his USFF "A" coaching license. He has also served on the staff for the Maryland Olympic Development Program for seven years.

Blanck and his wife, Kristin are the parents of two sons, Caden, and Anderson.

### MIKE MELTON

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH

Melton joined the Navy Women's Soccer program in January of 2019 with a plethora of Division I collegiate coaching experience under his belt. He begins his seventh season on staff ahead of the team's 2025 campaign. He was promoted to the position of Associate Head Coach in June of 2021.

In his first season with the Mids in 2019, Melton helped the team reach the NCAA Tournament for its first postseason berth since 2007. Working primarily with Navy's defense and goalkeepers, Melton guided the backline to a dominant campaign that saw the Mids post 13 shutouts and give up just 12 total goals over 22 games for an 0.52 goals against average that ranked 13th overall in NCAA Division I. Specifically in Patriot League play, Navy gave up only two goals in nine regular season contests. Individually, goalie Sydney Fortson earned a spot on the All-Patriot League First Team for going 13-3-3 with an 0.60 GAA and 10 solo shutouts.

Melton and the Mids followed up that excellent debut season with a strong effort during the COVID-impacted 2020-21 season. After playing three non-conference games in the fall versus ACC opponents, Navy came back in the spring and dropped just one game in the entire eight-game schedule. In the 2020-21 Patriot League Tournament, Navy defeated Loyola in the semifinals, 1-0, before grabbing the championship trophy for the second straight year with a 4-1 advantage in penalty kicks over Colgate. In the NCAA Tournament,

the Mids went head-to-head with a high-scoring New Mexico Lobos club and tied 1-1 in regulation before falling in PKs, 4-2.

In its 4-4-3 season, Navy and Melton saw four Midshipmen student-athletes earn All-Patriot League playing honors, including freshman defender Chloe Dawson, who was named the 2020-21 Patriot League Rookie of the Year. Additionally, freshman goalkeeper Mattie Gallagher was selected as the league's goalie or rookie of the week on three separate occasions. Under Melton's guidance, Gallagher played in 10 of Navy's 11 games in 2020-21 and posted a 0.80 goals against average with a .840 save percentage to go along with three solo shutouts. She played all 803:14 minutes of Navy's action during the 2021 portion of the season, of which every game was a one-goal decision.

The youthful Mids' roster continued maturing under Melton's guidance in 2021 and posted an 11-6-3 record and 6-2-1 mark in league play. A hot stretch of action down the stretch saw Navy go 6-0-2 with one or fewer goals allowed in each of the final eight regular season games. The sophomore duo of Chloe Dawson and Mattie Gallagher were at the forefront of this effort and both were rewarded with Second Team All-Patriot League honors.

Gallagher continued her growth under Melton's tutelage and once again was named to the All-Patriot League Team as a third team honoree in 2022. Led by Gallagher, Navy's goalkeeper union posted a 0.95 goals against average, while turning aside 83 percent of all shots on goal; both statistics ranked third in the Patriot League. With a Patriot League postseason berth on the line in late October, Gallagher backstopped the Mids' to a dramatic 1-0 shutout win at Lafayette on the strength of a career-best 10 saves.

Melton's work with Navy's goalkeeping unit continued to show through in 2023 as Gallagher rounded out her career with 70 more saves for a 4.12 per game ratio; good for third-best in the Patriot League. Behind Gallagher's effort as the starter, the Mids' union combined for a 1.05 goals against average and .792 save percentage to go along with six shutouts. For her career with Melton by her side, Gallagher finished with 278 saves, 16 solo shutouts and a 1.07 goals against average. Her save total ranks second all-time, while her clean sheet total leaves her fifth all-time in program history.

2024 gave Melton a new task, as he helped develop freshman goalkeeper Natasha Stramrood into the Team MVP once the rookie grabbed the starting nod in week two and never looked back. Backstopped by Stramrood, Navy returned to the Patriot League Tournament and posted four shutouts on the campaign, while limiting the opposition to one goal in eight other contests. Appearing in all 21 games, Stramrood made 19 starts, posted three individual shutouts and grabbed 94 total saves, a mark that ranked 40th nationally and fourth among DI freshmen.

Prior to Navy, Melton built up a strong coaching resume at the Division I ranks as he was most recently on staff at Mercer University in Macon, Ga.. While an assistant with the Bears during the 2017 and 2018 seasons, Melton served as the program's recruiting coordinator and assistant camp director while also overseeing academic progress and player development, including video scouting analysis and on-the-field training sessions. In competition, Melton and the Bears collected 19 victories over his two seasons on staff and saw six players earned postseason SoCon awards.

In addition to his time at Mercer, Melton was involved as the southeast scout for the U.S. youth women's national teams, with main focus on the U14 and U16 age groups. Along with his duties with the national team, Melton was involved with the Region III ODP and served as the head coach of the 2002 Georgia State ODP Team. He was heavily involved in coaching education and currently holds a USSF "A" license. Additionally, Melton is an instructor of USSF "E" and "D" licenses.

Before Mercer, Melton was on staff at Xavier University, where he spent three seasons as an assistant coach for the Musketeers from 2014 through 2016. As part of his responsibilities with Xavier, Melton served as the recruiting coordinator for Xavier. He also oversaw academic progress as the team recorded a GPA of 3.5 or higher for five semesters.

Melton's first stop in the SoCon Conference came in 2013 when he was an assistant coach Samford University. Melton helped lead the Bulldogs to a 13-6-2 record. He assisted in on-field training, creating scouting reports and overseeing team travel. Melton also served as a staff coach at Birmingham United Soccer Association.

Prior to his time at Samford, Melton was a graduate assistant coach at Ole Miss for two seasons, with main duties of video analysis and camp coordinator. While in graduate school, Melton was also the varsity boy's soccer coach at Oxford High School for two seasons, helping guide the team to a 2013 5A State Championship. As an undergrad, Melton served as the women's soccer video coordinator at Ole Miss from 2009-2011.

Melton earned a bachelor's degree in applied science from the University of Mississippi in 2011 and a masters in recreation administration in 2013. Melton and his wife Lauren currently reside in Annapolis and are proud parents to their daughter Morgan.

## NATASHA MUNRO

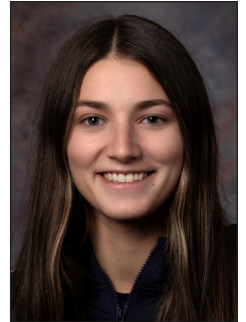
ASSISTANT COACH

Munro joined the women's soccer staff as an assistant in January of 2025 following the completion of her playing career at UMBC.

A three-year captain for the Retrievers, Munro was selected to the All-America East Second Team in 2024 after leading the squad in scoring with six goals and 14 points over 17 games as a forward. For her career as a forward for UMBC, she appeared in 53 games and tallied 24 points with 11 goals and two assists.

Munro holds two degrees from UMBC as she graduated with a bachelor of arts degree in psychology with a minor in health, wellness and aging in 2023 before later earning a masters in entrepreneurship, innovation and leader in December of 2024.

Away from the playing field, she has served as an assistant coach for the Maryland Rush 13G program, as well as provided coaching as part of the Navy Women's Soccer camps during the summers of 2022, 2023 and 2024. Munro also has obtained her Grassroots Soccer Coaching License from the U.S. Soccer Federation.

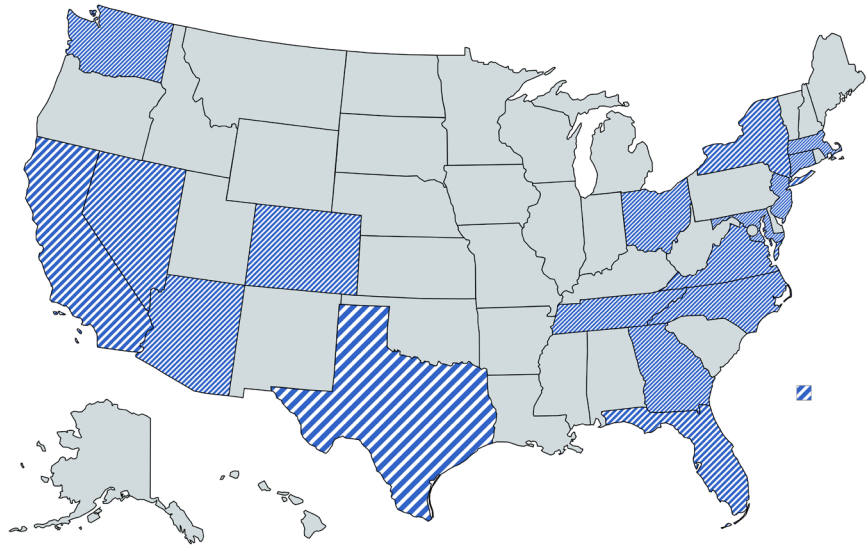

## SEASON PREVIEW

### EXPERIENCED EARNED IN 2024 LOOKS TO PAY DIVIDENDS FOR MIDS IN 2025

While saying goodbye to the small, but influential Class of 2025 that consisted of Emma Frommelt (M), Amanda Graziano (M), Tatum Kelly (D), Alexa Riddle (F) and Rylee Rives (M), the Navy women's soccer team has great expectations this fall as it returns 15 letterwinners, including seven starters. A leading factor in the Mids' potential this season will be the continued growth of its sophomore and junior classes as both earned valuable reps in 2024 and occupied key roles for the team.

The base for the 2025 team is strong as Navy returns 65 percent of its goal scoring and 61 percent of its total assists. Backed by the duo of sophomore Natasha Stramrood and senior Talley Applewhite, the Mids' goalkeeping ranks are back at 100 percent from 2024.

### A POSITION-BY-POSITION BREAKDOWN OF THE 2025 ROSTER

#### FORWARDS

The senior class will be well represented in Navy's forward corps in 2025. The trio of Mimi Abusham, Marlee Heaven and Isabella Romano combined to score nine goals and add five assists last season. Abusham has provided the Mids with creative playmaking with five goals and seven assists during her first three years of competition. The California native was on her way to her most productive season with four helps in just eight games before suffering a season-ending injury in the team's non-conference matchup versus Ohio State. Heaven's game revolves around finding the back of the net as she's scored 11 goals with a season-best six coming last fall, including three of the game-winning variety. Romano has been a consistent threat both setting up and knocking home goals during her career with Navy as she's scored 10 goals and assisted on seven others. Chiara Cosenza highlights the Mids' junior class as she broke through in 2024 with appearances in all 21 games and tallied four goals with two assists. Navy was an undefeated 4-0 in games that Cosenza scored in last season. A steady influence for the Mids' forward contingent off the bench throughout the season, fellow junior Hannah Mulholland saw time in all 21 games and was on the field for 745 minutes in 2024. She added one goal and one assist. The third member of the Class of 2027 in the forward crew is Madison Whitworth. A go-to source of energy on and off the bench, Whitworth appeared in six games last fall with four of those coming versus Patriot League foes. Sophomore Emily Clay will be looking to complete her comeback from an offseason injury that kept her off the field in 2024. Freshman Sona Gonzales joins the Navy family from Nevada and the Las Vegas Heat Surf program of the ECNL.

#### MIDFIELDERS

Youth and potential rules Navy's midfield ranks in 2025 with six of its seven members being underclassmen. Mori Sokoloff promises to provide the program strong leadership with three years of experience with the

Mids. Ande Swan immediately left her mark in her debut season with 1,554 minutes of action as the Mids' starting defensive midfielder from day one. Strong up-and-down the field, Swan added three assists on offense, while rarely leaving the field and her mark on defense. Fellow sophomore, Mackenzie Morrow was active in her first season with 20 games played and 577 minutes of action. She left her mark on the box score versus Marist when she assisted on Amanda Graziano's game-winning goal. The third sophomore in the Navy's midfield rotation is Lizzie Emerson. In limited time in 2024, Emerson tallied two goals and an assist in five games. The Mids' coaching staff re-stocked the midfield with three incoming plebes this season, Jessica Black, Faith Graziano and Katia Katsari-Hoefer. All three newcomers join the program after showcasing a nose for the goal during their high school careers as Black was the leading high school forward for the state of Colorado as a senior in the spring of 2025, while Graziano competed in the 2023 High School All-American Game and Katsari-Hoefer was recognized as one of Virginia's Top-50 forwards in 2023

#### DEFENSE

The senior duo of team captain Jordan Townsend and Emma Romano will lead the Mids' defensive effort in 2025. Townsend played in and started 20 games for Navy last fall as a central defender, while Romano saw action in all 21 contests and made 20 starts. Romano was a bit more active in the team's offensive plan as she'd join rushes up the wing, adding a pair of assists and taking 15 total shots. The junior class is represented by the trio of Ali Barrow, Lucy Gaines and ClaraJane Williams. All three players provided quality work for the team in reserve roles led by Williams' 13 appearances and 526 minutes of action before sustaining an injury during the second half of the season. Gaines left her mark in 12 games with four starts and aided the team's offense with a pair of goals and an assist, while Barrow played in nine games, including five Patriot League conference contests. The sophomore duo of Kayana Adlam and Lauren Toms provided vibrant flashes of a fruitful future with the Mids during their debut season in 2024. Adlam offered Navy a versatile skillset that saw her in action on both offense and defense depending on the needs of the team at the time. Suited up in all 21 games, she made five starts and added a goal and an assist over 1,000 minutes of playing time. Toms made an immediate impact as she broke camp as a member of the Starting XI and earned Patriot League Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 23 after notching the game-winning goal in Navy's victory over Lehigh. Four newcomers to the program are in line to see potential time on defense this fall. The group of Emmalea Sidorsky, Jane Ambrozy, Helen Bonner and Lizzie Fetterman bring varied skills, athleticism, size and playing background to the 2025 roster. Sidorsky hails from Florida and Bonner from Virginia, while Ambrozy and Fetterman will give the Mids a taste of Ohio in their backfield.

#### GOALKEEPERS

Navy's "goalkeeper union" returns in full strength in the form of senior Talley Applewhite, junior Cadence Tordai and sophomore Natasha Stramrood. A highly touted freshman recruit in 2024, Stramrood fought

her way into the starting lineup by game three and never relinquished the role as she back-stopped the Mids for the final 19 games of the season. She was kept active and was up to the task as she was tested with seven shots on goal in five separate contests, including in the Patriot League Tournament in hostile territory at Army. Stramrood completed her debut campaign with 94 total saves and three solo shutouts. Applewhite will continue to provide veteran leadership and strong support to the union in 2025. As a junior last season, Applewhite appeared in seven games and started the first two for the Mids. In her 221 minutes of action, she made nine saves and posted a 2.03 goals against average. Tordai continued to bolster the unit's depth and helped the trio complete a combined shutout of Wilson College on August 27.

## 2024 SEASON IN REVIEW

- Navy's non-conference slate saw the Mids go 6-5 with victories over Sacred Heart, FDU, Wilson College, Marist, VMI and Penn. Additionally, the Mids challenged themselves against Big Ten foes Maryland and an Ohio State club that reached the round of 16 of the 2024 NCAA Tournament.
- Placed sixth in the Patriot League standings during the regular season with a 3-4-2 mark (11 points). The Mids were one point shy of grabbing the fourth-seed in the Patriot League Tournament. Navy fell in its quarterfinal matchup at Army by a score of 1-0 as the Black Knights scored in the 84th minute.
- Navy's senior class of Emma Frommelt, Amanda Graziano, team captain Tatum Kelly, Alexa Riddle and Rylee Rives concluded their four-year career with three Patriot League Tournament appearances and 37 wins to go along with 11 ties.
- Riddle garnered her fourth All-Patriot League playing honor in four years as she completed her career with a spot on the 2024 All-PL First Team. For her career, she earned first team nods in 2021 and 2024, as well as a second team nod in 2023 and a third team spot in 2022. Riddle is just the ninth player in program history to earn four all-league honors. She began her career as the 2021 Patriot League Rookie of the Year.
- Riddle was selected to the 2024 Academic All-Patriot League Team. The honor was the second of her career. Additionally, she was recognized on the 2024 CSC Academic All-District Team.
- Four different players collected Patriot League weekly awards: Riddle was the Offensive Player of the Week on Aug. 26, while Rives was the Midfielder of the Week on the same date. Freshman Lauren Toms picked up Defensive Player of the Week honors on Sept. 23 before junior Marlee Heaven was selected as the conference's Offensive Player of the Week on Oct. 28.
- Rives was named to the TopDrawerSoccer Team of the Week (Aug. 19-26) as one of the nation's top-11 players for her efforts against Sacred Heart and FDU; she scored a combined three goals, including the game-winner versus the Pioneers and two against the Knights.
- Seven student-athletes garnered inclusion on the 2024 Patriot League Academic Honor Roll: Frommelt, Riddle, Rives, junior Mori Sokoloff, sophomores Ali Barrow and Cadence Tordai and freshman Lizzie Emerson.
- 17 of Navy's 23 field players that saw action in 2024 registered at least one point. Four players finished with 10 or more points: Graziano (4g, 6a, 14p), Riddle (5g, 3a, 13p), Heaven (6g, 12p) and sophomore Chiara Cosenza (4g, 2a, 10p)
- Graziano's campaign started off fast with points in six of Navy's first 10 games (4 goals, 3 assists). She left her mark in conference play with a record-tying three assist outing versus Loyola on Sept. 25.
- Riddle posted the 20th hat trick in program history in that same game against Loyola in a matter of just 31 minutes in the first half. The hat trick was the first for a Navy player against a Patriot League opponent since Nov. 3, 2017 when Ash Fairrow deposited three goals versus Colgate in the PL Tournament.
- Graziano ranked third in the Patriot League with six assists and ninth with 14 points.
- Heaven netted game-winning goals against VMI (Sept. 8), Penn (Sept. 12) and Holy Cross (Oct. 25). Those three GWGs ranked fourth in the Patriot League, while her six total goals were tied for seventh.
- Freshman goalkeeper Natasha Stramrood earned Team MVP honors after grabbing the starting GK role in week two and never looking back. Appearing in all 21 games, she made 19 starts and posted three shutouts for an overall line of 1.54 goals against average and .770 save percentage over 1639 minutes of action. In Patriot League play, she had clean sheets against Lehigh, Holy Cross and Lafayette, while allowing single goals versus Boston, Bucknell, American and at Army in the Patriot League Tournament quarterfinals. Her 94 total saves ranked 40th nationally in NCAA Division I; fourth among DI freshmen GKs.
- All-time over 73 appearances and 4,926 minutes of action, Riddle finished with 19 career goals, 11 assists, 49 points and 159 shots. She just missed becoming the 22nd player in program history to reach the 50-point plateau. Her shot total ranks 10th all-time.
- As a team, Navy ranked second in the Patriot League in goals scored (1.6 per game). Nationally, that scoring average was 101st best in NCAA Division I.
- The program was bestowed the Team Ethics and Sportsmanship Bronze Award by the United Soccer Coaches organization. Navy was one of just 32 total collegiate teams (men/women) across the DI, DII, DIII, NAIA and 2-year divisions to have yellow cards per game average between .31 and .50 per contest. The Mids had 10 yellows over 21 games (48%).

## MEMORIAL AWARDS

### ENS. STACY M. FINLEY MOST VALUABLE PLAYER

On March 24, 2005, the Navy women's soccer program lost a member of our family with the passing of Stacy Finley. Stacy enriched the lives of many through her gift of humor, her infectious laugh, her big grin and that favorite yellow pinny. A truly unselfish player, teammate and friend, she often spoke of the team's achievements and shied away from her own personal success despite being one of the most decorated players in school history.

Honored three times as an all-league player, she was twice named the Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year and twice named to the National Soccer Coaches Association of America Mid-Atlantic Region team. She graduated as Navy's record holder in career points, goals and shots and owns single-season records in points, goals, assists and shots. In addition to her many honors on the field, she was a leader in the Hall and was honored multiple times for her academic achievements.

Stacy graduated from the Naval Academy in 2004 with a degree in quantitative economics. Upon graduation, she was commissioned an Ensign into the United States Navy where she had planned a career in the supply corps.



### LT. CMDR. CHRISTINE WEEKS, M.D. MEMORIAL AWARD

On June 20, 2012, the Navy women's soccer family lost one of its own with the passing of Christine Weeks following a lengthy fight against cancer.

The mere mention of Christine's name brings a smile across the faces of those who knew her. She lived her life through an undeniable drive, determination, grace and unselfishness.

As a teammate to her Naval Academy sisters, she embodied the spirit of competition through hard work, perseverance and desire. ### ARMY-NAVY

Army-Navy is one of the most storied rivalries in all of collegiate and professional athletics. It dates back to Nov. 29, 1890, when the two military institutions squared off in football with Navy taking the inaugural meeting, 24-0.

While the annual Army-Navy football game is revered by many as one of the premier college football games, it is just one of the many athletic competitions contested on a yearly basis between the two schools.

Twenty-four of Navy's 36 varsity sports battle Army each year in Star Competitions - predetermined contests between Army and Navy with the winner receiving a gold star to affix near the "N" for his/her letter sweater for each such victory. There is only one Star Competition per sport irregardless of the number of times the two programs face-off during a given season.

Navy currently leads the all-time women's soccer series 18-16-4 and is 15-11-4 in Star Games. **The two teams will meet in Chester, Pa. this season on October 10.**

## NAVY SOCCER TIMELINE

**1992** — Navy Director of Athletics Jack Lengyel announces women's soccer will be added as a varsity sport for the 1993 season.

**July 1993** — Carin Gabarra is hired as Navy's inaugural head women's soccer coach.

**Sept. 4, 1993** — Navy plays its inaugural match, a 2-0 home loss at the hands of in-state foe Loyola.

**Sept. 9, 1993** — Senior Julie Treanor scores three of Navy's four goals as the Mids earn the program's first win with a 4-0 shutout at Johns Hopkins.

**Oct. 17, 1993** — Julie Treanor feeds Patt DeSpain for the 24th-minute winner, as Navy captures its first win over a Division I program, a 1-0 victory at Georgetown.

**Sept. 10, 1994** — Navy plays its first game as a member of the Patriot League, a 4-1 loss at Holy Cross.

**Sept. 17, 1994** — The Midshipmen earn their first Patriot League win in a 5-0 victory over Fordham.

**Oct. 29, 1994** — Navy ends its first full season of Division I action with a 7-9-2 mark.

**November 1994** — Amy Hakola, Cori Thornton and Ty Westinghouse become Navy's first award winners, all garnering All-Patriot League recognition.

**Nov. 4, 1995** — Navy makes its first appearance in the Patriot League Tournament and goes on to post a 2-0 opening round victory at Bucknell to earn the program's first championship game appearance.

**December 1995** — Nicole Aunapu and Cori Thornton receive NSCAA Third-Team All-Mid-Atlantic Region recognition ... they are Navy's first all-region honorees.

**November 1996** — Carin Gabarra is named the Patriot League Coach of the Year after leading the Mids to an 11-6-2 record during its fourth Division I season.

**November 1996** — Michelle Nance produces 20 points (7g, 6 a) to become Navy's first player to be named Patriot League Rookie of the Year.

**Nov. 13, 1996** — Navy makes its first postseason tournament appearance, squaring off against Monmouth in the ECAC Tournament.

**Oct. 30, 1998** — Navy claims its first Star Game victory over Army with a 2-0 win at West Point.

**Oct. 31, 1998** — Behind a 3-0 win over Lehigh, Navy clinches its first Patriot League regular-season title with a 5-0-1 record.

**November 1998** — Nicole Aunapu becomes Navy's first two-time Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year, leading the Mids to 14 shutouts and a 0.56 GAA.

**Nov. 2, 1998** — Navy makes the program's first appearance in the NSCAA poll, debuting at No. 26.

**December 1998** — Nicole Aunapu becomes the first Navy women's soccer player to garner Academic All-America recognition.

**May 1999** — The Vice. Adm. Lawrence Sword for Women, presented to the graduating midshipman to have personally excelled in athletics during her varsity athletic career is awarded to Nicole Aunapu, the first soccer player to earn the prestigious award.

**Oct. 31, 1999** — A key road win at Bucknell gives the Midshipmen their second-consecutive Patriot League regular-season title.

**November 1999** — Justine Fisher paces the league with 38 points (16 g, 6 a) and becomes the Mids' first Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year recipient.

**Summer 1999** — Nicole Aunapu becomes the first Navy student-athlete to be named the state recipient of the NCAA Woman of the Year award.

**Oct. 28, 2000** — Olympian and Navy head coach Carin Gabarra is inducted into the National Soccer Hall of Fame; she is the second woman named to the Hall.

**Oct. 31, 2000** — Nicole Aunapu represents Navy on the Patriot League All-Decade Team.

**Sept. 7, 2001** — Navy turns back Davidson, 4-1, in its first contest played at the Glenn Warner Soccer Facility.

**Oct. 28, 2001** — Justine Fisher becomes Navy's all-time leading scorer (overtook Cori Thornton, later passed by Stacy Finley and Meggie Curran) in leading Navy to a 3-0 win over George Mason ... the win is Carin Gabarra's 100th collegiate win.

**Feb. 12, 2002** — Justine Fisher is drafted in the fourth round by the Washington Freedom, becoming the first Navy women's soccer player drafted into the professional soccer league.

**Sept. 6, 2002** — Navy shuts down Air Force, 2-0 at the Military Academies Classic in St. Louis, posting the program's 100th win.

**Sept. 9, 2002** — Amelia Sheveland scores four goals and adds an assist to set the Navy record for single-game points with nine against Marist in a 8-0 win.

**Nov. 4, 2002** — With its 8-1 win over Robert Morris, Navy finished the regular season unbeaten (16-0-4) for the first time in program history ... Navy was the only Division I team to complete the 2002 regular season undefeated.

**Sept. 26, 2003** — Navy headed into its contest against No. 1-ranked North Carolina owning the nation's longest regular-season unbeaten streak of 35 games between Aug. 30, 2002 and Sept. 25, 2003.

**Sept. 26, 2003** — *A then NCAA-record crowd of 6,527 watch Navy hold top-ranked and eventual national champion North Carolina scoreless for the first 72 minutes at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium, the only Navy women's soccer game to be played at the stadium ... the Tar Heels won, 1-0. (photo)*

**Nov. 9, 2003** — Navy defeats American, 4-1, to earn the program's first Patriot League Tournament title.

**Nov. 14, 2003** — The Mids fall to fifth-seeded Penn State, 5-1, in the first round of the NCAA Tournament ... Navy soccer became the first women's team in any sport at the Academy to earn an NCAA berth ... it also marked the first time a Service Academy women's soccer team would play in the NCAA Tournament.

## NAVY SOCCER TIMELINE

**Spring 2004** — Quinn Rinehart became the first women's soccer player to serve as Brigade Commander ... she was also the first soccer player to garner the Academy's Calvert Award.

**July 1, 2004** — Carin Gabarra and her gold medal winning teammates from the '96 Atlanta Olympics, are inducted into the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame.

**Oct. 16, 2006** — Brigitte Fox became the first player in school history to be named to the Soccer America, Soccer Buzz and Soccer Times Team of the Week in the same week.

**Oct. 16, 2006** — Ten different players score the Mids' program-record 10 goals in a home win over Howard.

**Oct. 23, 2006** — Navy makes its first appearance in program history in the **Soccer Times** poll ... the Mids entered the poll at No. 25.

**Oct. 26, 2006** — Kristen Laraway's 80th-minute winner leads Navy to a 1-0 win over No. 9 Penn State; the program's first win over a ranked team ... a then facility-record 2,412 fans were on hand to support the Mids.

**Oct. 30, 2006** — Navy receives votes in the NSCAA poll for the first time since Nov. 2, 1998.

**Oct. 31, 2006** — Navy receives its highest ranking in the NSCAA Mid-Atlantic Region in program history (later passed in 2009) at No. 5 with a 19-1-0 record.

**Nov. 2, 2006** — Navy swept the five Patriot League major awards for the first time in program history — Meggie Curran as Offensive POY, Shelly Moeller as Co-Defensive POY, Lizzie Barnes as Goalkeeper of the Year, Cassie Barbaresi as Co-Rookie of the Year and Carin Gabarra as Coach of the Year ... Barnes was Navy's first recipient of the goalkeeper of the year award.

**Nov. 3, 2006** — The Mids reach 20 wins for the first time in program history with a 2-0 victory over Lehigh in the Patriot League Tournament Semifinals.

**Nov. 5, 2006** — Shelly Moeller's eighth-minute goal proves to be all Navy needs to defeat Colgate and claim its second Patriot League Tournament title.

**Nov. 6, 2006** — Navy earns its highest national ranking as the No. 11 team in the Soccer America poll ... it is also the highest ranking in Patriot League history.

**Nov. 6, 2006** — Goalkeeper Lizzie Barnes appeared in Sports Illustrated's Faces in the Crowd.

**Nov. 10, 2006** — Navy advances to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history via penalty kicks against No. 20 William & Mary ... it is the first program history that a Navy game is decided by penalty kicks.

**Dec. 3, 2006** — Lizzie Barnes finished the year as the nation's leader in goals-against average (.292) and save percentage (.933).

**Dec. 3, 2006** — Navy finished 2006 ranked No. 1 in the nation in goals-against average (.372), shutout percentage (.790) and save percentage (.918). The Mids also finished the season ranked No. 17 in the NCAA's RPI.

**Dec. 8, 2006** — Meggie Curran and Shelly Moeller earn NSCAA First-Team All-Region honors, becoming the first Navy players named to the first team.

**Dec. 20, 2006** — Shelly Moeller and Cassie Barbaresi become Navy's first players to be named Freshman All-Americans (Soccer Buzz).

**Dec. 21, 2006** — Meggie Curran is named a Third-Team Soccer Buzz All-America selection, Navy's first player named to an All-America team by any organization or media outlet.

**Nov. 5, 2007** — More than 1,000 Midshipmen flooded the gates to cheer on the women's soccer team to a 2-0 Star Game win over Army ... the victory completed the program's second unbeaten home season (9-0-1).

**Nov. 9, 2007** — Brigitte Fox scored twice, accounting for all the scoring in a 2-0 shutout of American in the Patriot League Semifinals. Fox, who earned First-Team All-Patriot League honors for a second-straight year, finished with a league-best 35 points on 16 goals, including six game-winners.

**Nov. 11, 2007** — Freshman Carissa Youker booted in the game-winner in the 42nd minute to lead Navy to its second Patriot League Tournament title and NCAA appearance in as many seasons.

**Sept. 4, 2008** — Lizzie Barnes made four saves in a 1-0 shutout at VMI, passing Kim Bonafede to set a new program record with her 23rd shutout. She would go on to keep eight clean sheets on the year, ending her sterling four-year career with 29 shutouts.

**Oct. 4, 2008** — Carin Gabarra joined an elite group of coaches with her 200th career victory in a 1-0 win over Bucknell.

**Nov. 1, 2008** — Team captain Julie Reynolds' lone goal of the year proves to be the difference in a 1-0 win at Colgate ... the victory gave Navy its seventh regular season league crown since 1998 ... the victory was also Navy's 200th in program history.

**Nov. 6, 2008** — Lizzie Barnes and Shelly Moeller respectively earned Patriot League Goalkeeper and Defensive Player of the Year awards, each claiming the honor for the second time in their careers ... Barnes is the only conference keeper to earn the laurel twice, while Moeller joined Nicole Aunapu as one of only three players to twice earn the league's top defensive honor.

**Nov. 6, 2008** — *Lizzie Barnes was named the Patriot League Women's Soccer Scholar-Athlete of the Year. It was the first time since 2001 that a Navy player earned the league's top academic honor. (photo)*

**Nov. 7, 2008** — Freshman Kate Herren scored her first career game-winner just 5:52 into the first overtime

period to send the Midshipmen to the conference final for the third consecutive season. Herren's 'Golden Goal' gave Navy its school-record fourth overtime win.

**Nov. 7, 2008** — Navy's eight-member senior class, its largest senior class in program history, matched the Class of 2005's record of 60 wins.

**Nov. 18, 2008** — Lizzie Barnes, Navy's all-time shutout leader, was named a First-Team Academic All-American for the second time in her career ... she joined Nicole Aunapu, who earned similar laurels in 1997 and '98, as one of just three Academy student-athletes to earn first-team honors twice.

**Summer 2008** — Lizzie Barnes was recognized as the conference's top female scholar-athlete. She is the third Navy soccer player to receive the overall scholar award. Navy women's soccer has produced more Scholar-Athletes of the Year than any other program in the Patriot League (men's or women's).

**Sept. 9, 2009** — After making 19 saves and posting a pair of shutouts against Dayton and Miami (Fla.), Beth Reed was recognized as national player of the week by CollegeSoccer360.com.

**Sept. 9, 2009** — Starting the year with a 5-0-1 record, Navy vaulted to No. 3 in the NSCAA Mid-Atlantic Region Poll, its highest ever ranking in the poll.

**Oct. 9, 2009** — In front of a facility record 2,627 fans, Navy blanked the visiting Black Knights, 2-0 in the annual Star Game. It was the largest crowd in the nine-year history of the Glenn Warner Soccer Facility, (men's or women's) and the largest crowd in the history of the Army-Navy series.

**Oct. 9, 2009** — The Star Game victory was Navy's 10th of the year, giving the Mids double-figure wins for the 15th consecutive season (1995-Present).

- Oct. 11, 2009** — Navy's four-member Class of 2010 (Jen Grijalva, Shelly Moeller, Beth Reed, Brittany White) set a school record for most wins by a senior class with the program's 61st win during their tenure with the team's 2-0 home shutout of Holy Cross.
- Nov. 3, 2009** — In her first season as a starter, Beth Reed was named the Patriot League Goalkeeper of the Year. It was the second-straight year a Navy player was recognized as the conference's top keeper.

- July 6, 2010** — Beth Reed is selected as the Patriot League Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Reed becomes the fourth Navy women's soccer player to be tabbed as the conference's top female student-athlete.
- Oct. 8, 2010** — Army and Navy square off on the Fox Soccer Channel in the NSCAA College Game of the Week. Army won the game, 1-0, at West Point.
- Nov. 2, 2010** — Carissa Youker earns All-Patriot League honors for the third consecutive season.
- Oct. 21, 2011** — Navy overcomes a two-goal deficit to defeat Army, 3-2, to claim the N-Star. The Mids reeled off three second-half goals and Morgan Dankanich scored the game-winner in the 88th minute.
- Oct. 25, 2011** — Morgan Dankanich is named the ECAC Women's Soccer Player of the Week after scoring game-winning goals in three straight games.
- Nov. 4, 2011** — Navy defeats Lafayette, 3-2, in the Patriot League semifinals to advance to its ninth Patriot League championship game.
- Sept. 9, 2012** — Carin Gabarra wins her 250th career game over Towson, 2-1, to claim the Navy Invitational.
- Oct. 7, 2012** — Kaylie Davidson scores in overtime against Lehigh as Navy wins its 15th-straight game.
- Oct. 27, 2012** — Navy concludes conference play with an unbeaten mark of 6-0-1 and claims its seventh outright or shared regular season title.
- Nov. 1, 2012** — Elizabeth Hoerner is named the Patriot League Goalkeeper of the Year and the Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Jade Seabrook named the PL Defensive Player of the Year and Carin Gabarra named the PL Coach of the Year.
- Nov. 2, 2012** — Paloma Perez scores a hat trick in Navy's 4-1 win over Lehigh in the Patriot League Semifinals, becoming the first conference player to score a hat trick in a tournament game since 1993. Navy advanced to a 10th league title game.
- Nov. 5, 2012** — Navy receives votes in the final Soccer Times poll of the regular season.
- Dec. 3, 2012** — Jade Seabrook becomes the first Navy player to earn NSCAA All-America honors when she is named to the third team.
- Dec. 14, 2012** — Elizabeth Hoerner is named to the NSCAA Scholar All-America First Team.
- Jan. 7, 2013** — Navy earns the NSCAA Team Ethics Award for having zero red cards and just two yellow cards during the 2012 season.
- Jan. 22, 2013** — Elizabeth Hoerner is named to the NSCAA Scholar All-East Region First Team.
- Aug. 20, 2013** — Elizabeth Hoerner and Jade Seabrook were placed on the Hermann Trophy Watch List.
- Oct. 11, 2013** — Navy tallies its 10th-straight win and extend its scoreless streak to 705:52.
- Oct. 14, 2013** — Penn snaps Navy's 10-game winning streak in overtime, 1-0. The Mids scoreless streak ends at 740:22, which was the 22nd best streak in NCAA history.
- Oct. 27, 2013** — Ashlynn Soellner leads Navy past Loyola, 2-0, with two goals on senior day. Navy's win clinched its eighth regular-season league title in program history. The shutout marked Navy's eighth in league play and 14th overall.
- Nov. 4, 2013** — Navy garnered three major Patriot League awards. Morgan Dankanich was named Offensive Player of the Year, Jade Seabrook was named Defense Player of the Year and Elizabeth Hoerner was tabbed Goalkeeper of the Year.
- Nov. 7, 2013** — Elizabeth Hoerner was named Patriot League Women's Soccer Scholar-Athlete of the Year for the second consecutive season.
- Nov. 8, 2013** — Morgan Dankanich paces Navy past American, 2-0, with two goals to advance to the Patriot League championship title game for the third-straight year.
- Nov. 26, 2013** — Elizabeth Hoerner garners CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team honors.
- Dec. 4, 2013** — Navy places four to the NSCAA All-Mid-Atlantic Region Squad.
- Dec. 6, 2013** — Jade Seabrook earns Third Team NSCAA All-America laurels for the second-straight season. Elizabeth Hoerner garnered senior CLASS Award honors.
- Dec. 18, 2013** — Elizabeth Hoerner repeats as NSCAA Scholar All-American.
- June 10, 2014** — Elizabeth Hoerner caps off her academic career at the Naval Academy by receiving an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship.
- Oct. 27, 2015** — Carin Gabarra wins her 300th career match over Hampton, 10-0, at the Glenn Warner Soccer Facility.
- Sept. 28, 2016** — Program records 300th victory with 3-0 road win over Lehigh.
- Oct. 30, 2017** — After 15 regular season wins and an 8-0-1 record in league play, Navy earned four major Patriot League awards: Ash Fairow (Player of the Year), Meghan Hegarty (Midfielder), Sydney Fortson (Goalkeeper) and Carin Gabarra (Coach).
- Nov. 3, 2017** — In front of the third-largest crowd for a women's soccer game in the history of the Glenn Warner Soccer Facility (2,418), Ash Fairow nets a hat trick to lead Navy to a 3-0 shutout over Colgate in the Patriot League Semifinals. The hat trick was just the third in PL Tournament history.
- Dec. 7, 2017** — Meghan Hegarty is named a First-Team Academic All-American and the Division I Women's Soccer Academic All-American of the Year by CoSIDA. Hegarty is the second Navy student-athlete ever to receive the top Academic All-America award for one's sport.
- May 24, 2018** — Meghan Hegarty is awarded the Thompson Trophy Cup, as the midshipman, who has done the most during the year to promote athletics at the Naval Academy. Hegarty is the first female to win the award since 2013, the first women's soccer player to win the award and just the sixth female to win the award in school history.
- Oct. 12, 2018** — Navy pulled off a dramatic 2-1 victory over Army in the 2018 Star Game. Trailing 1-0 with less than eight minutes to play in regulation, the Mids received goals from Cadie Higginson and Eleanor Pratt. Higginson netted Navy's game-tying goal in the 83rd minute before Pratt curled in the game-winner with just 44 seconds left to complete the comeback over the Black Knights in front of 2,200-plus fans.
- Oct. 29, 2018** — Alex Jackson was named the 2018 Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year. She was the fifth different Navy player to win this award and ninth total recipient.
- June 11, 2019** — Nicole Aunapu Mann enters CoSIDA Academic All-America Hall of Fame. The 1999 USNA grad was one of four inductees in the Hall of Fame Class of 2019. As of 2019, only 150 former student-athletes had been selected to the Hall of Fame.

**Sept. 27, 2019** — Carolyn Mang notches the go-ahead goal for the Mids in the 74th minute as Navy knocks off Army in the 2019 Star Game, 1-0.

**Nov. 6, 2019** — Alex Jackson repeats as the Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year. She is joined by Kaitlynn Johns (Rookie of the Year) and Sydney Fortson (W.Soccer Scholar-Athlete of the Year) as major award winners.

**Nov. 10, 2019** — After advancing to the PL Finals following penalty kicks in the semifinals, Navy came from behind with goals in the 61st minute by Carolyn Mang and 79th by Victoria Tran to defeat Army, 2-1 and qualify for the NCAA Tournament for the program's first league title since 2007. (photo)

**Nov. 15, 2019** — Navy takes on North Carolina State in Raleigh in the first round of the 2019 NCAA Tournament. The Mids previously earned tournament bids in 2003, 2006 and 2007. Tied 0-0 through 54 minutes, the Wolfpack scored three goals in the final 36 minutes to win 3-0.

**Dec. 5, 2019** — Sydney Fortson is selected as the 2019 Senior CLASS Award Winner. She's the first recipient in program history and just third in Navy Athletics history ... Cadie Higginson (First Team) and Victoria Tran (Third Team) garner CoSIDA Academic All-American honors.

**Feb. 20, 2020** — Alex Jackson began preseason training camp activities with the Washington Spirit of the NWSL.

**Feb. 28, 2021** — Navy and Colgate faced off in Annapolis for the first NCAA-sanctioned spring contest in the Mids' history after the COVID-19 pandemic forced a unique split-season format. The Raiders edged the Mids, 2-1 in double overtime.

**April 3, 2021** — Program records 350th victory with a 2-1 home win over Lehigh. The victory also helped Navy claim the Patriot League South divisional title.

**April 13, 2021** — Victoria Tran (Midfielder), Chloe Dawson (Rookie) and Carin Gabarra (Coach) collect three of the Patriot League's major playing awards. Additionally, Tran collected the league's Scholar-Athlete of the Year for women's soccer.

**April 17, 2021** — Navy repeats as Patriot League champions after tying Colgate in regulation and knocking off the Raiders in penalty kicks, 4-1. Kristina Dzhandzhapanyan named MVP after netting the Mids' lone goal in the 1-1 tie.

**April 27, 2021** — Navy and New Mexico met in Wilson, N.C. in the first round of the 2020-21 NCAA Tournament. Molly Gillcrist scored 29 seconds into the game, that eventually closed with a 1-1 score through double overtime. In penalty kicks, the Lobos converted four of their five opportunities to advance over the Mids, 4-2.

**Oct. 29, 2021** — Alexa Riddle is honored as the Patriot League Rookie of the Year. Victoria Tran joined her on the All-PL First Team to collect her fourth career All-League honor. Tran also repeated as the PL WSoc Scholar-Athlete of the Year.



**Nov. 10, 2022** — Victoria Tran ('22) was announced as one of nine finalists for the 2022 NCAA Woman of the Year Award. She'd later appear at the 2023 NCAA Convention in San Antonio. She's the first PL student-athlete to ever advance to the finals.

**Dec. 6, 2022** — Chloe Dawson garners Collegiate Sports Communicators (fka CoSIDA) First Team Academic All-America honors.

**Jan. 10, 2024** — Nicole Aunapu Mann is one of six former NCAA student-athletes recognized with the NCAA Silver Anniversary Award as part of the 2024 NCAA Convention. The award acknowledges former student-athletes for their outstanding collegiate and professional achievements in conjunction with the 25th anniversary of the conclusion of their collegiate athletic careers.

**Nov. 1, 2024** — Alexa Riddle collects her fourth career All-Patriot League honor with a spot on the 2024 All-PL First Team. She's just the ninth player in program history to achieve four All-PL nods.

On Nov. 9, 2001, the United States Naval Academy dedicated the new Glenn Warner Soccer Facility prior to the Navy men's soccer game against Bucknell.

The \$4.5 million Glenn Warner Soccer Facility is a prime example of one of the Naval Academy's latest accomplishments, while raising the bar of excellence.

One of the finest college soccer facilities in the nation, the Glenn Warner Soccer Facility was financed entirely by private contributions, designed by the architectural firm of Cochran, Stephenson & Donkervoet and constructed by Whiting-Turner, Inc. The 16,300-square-foot facility houses the Naval Academy's men's and women's varsity soccer teams.

The facility is named after Navy's legendary men's coach Glenn Warner, who guided the Midshipmen to nine NCAA Tournament appearances, four Final Four appearances, one national championship, 28 winning seasons and a record of 243-65-31 during his 30-year tenure. In a stretch from 1962-67, Warner's teams put together a string of 48 regular-season victories without a defeat (70-6-3) and qualified for five-straight NCAA Tournaments. Warner, who produced 26 All-Americans,

was inducted into the Soccer Hall of Fame and is a recipient of soccer's top award, The Honor Award.

The cornerstone of the project is the Anders Hall of Honor, made possible by Maj. General William A. Anders, USAFR, and family, in appreciation of Warner and to recognize the leadership, character and commitment of former Naval Academy soccer players.

The Anders Hall of Honor features 13 trophy cases and display areas of cherry cabinetry that depict Navy's storied soccer history and tradition. From former Navy soccer players who achieved excellence in military service and leadership, to past Navy All-Americans and team captains, the "Hall of Honor" pays tribute to former Midshipmen and their military, civilian and athletic accomplishments. Designed by Murphy & Orr Exhibits, the 60-foot diameter lobby also features Navy's five men's soccer National Championships (1931, '43, '44, '45, '64). Warner's one and only unbeaten squad captured the 1964 National Championship. The floor of the lobby is terrazzo and features a 15-foot Naval Academy crest in the center. The Anders Hall of Honor gives the coaching staff a place to meet, greet and entertain

recruits and midshipmen candidates, while experiencing the rich tradition of Navy soccer.

The home team wing highlights Navy's commitment to soccer and the future with two spacious team locker rooms, coaches offices and locker rooms, a fully-equipped training room, laundry and equipment rooms. The 1,300-square-foot men's and women's team locker rooms are equipped with custom-made wooden lockers for each athlete, a video projector and screen for viewing and analyzing of practice and game film. The 375-square-foot training room contains training tables, modern whirlpool, ultrasound and physical therapy equipment, and provides Navy's scholar-athletes with the most complete and advanced treatment in the country. Five equipment storage spaces provide 600-square feet for storage space and laundry service.

The visiting team wing of 4,300-square feet contains two spacious locker rooms, officials' locker room, ticket office, public restrooms and a concessions area.

The facility has a 120-yards by 75-yards flat bermuda-grass playing surface and a modern drainage system, allowing the field to withstand heavy rain. A state-of-the-art, scoreboard, funded by the Class of 1983, was erected at one end of the field. The stadium seats approximately 2,500 fans and provides fans with optimal viewing with room for further expansion.

Prior to the 2011 season, a 30-foot long, eight-foot deep press box was added to the top of the Glenn Warner bleachers. The press box is split into two booths and can accommodate up to 12 media members and game operations employees. The smaller of the two booths in the press box will be used for television, radio and Navy broadcasts on the ESPN+. The roof of the press box is enclosed by railings and will be used for team filming.

## PATRIOT LEAGUE

Now in its fourth decade as an all-sport conference combining academic and athletic excellence, the Patriot League sponsors championships in 24 men's and women's sports. Initially beginning as an NCAA Division I-AA football conference in 1986, the Patriot League became an all-sport conference in 1990 and now includes American, Army West Point, Boston University, Bucknell, Colgate, Holy Cross, Lafayette, Lehigh, Loyola Maryland and Navy as full members. Fordham, Georgetown, MIT, Richmond, Villanova (football 2026) and William & Mary (football 2026) are associate members. These institutions are among the oldest and most prestigious in the nation, while their alumni continue to play leadership roles in shaping our country.

The Patriot League's mission is simple: to provide successful competitive athletic experiences while maintaining high academic standards and preparing its student-athletes to be leaders in society. During the 2024-25 academic year, Patriot League student-athletes and teams accomplished the following:

- ★ The League's 96 percent graduation success rate (GSR) is the second-best mark in the nation, finishing in the top three each year since the rating was released in 2013. All 10 member schools registered totals of 92 percent or higher, exceeding the record-high national GSR of 90 percent. In addition, the League's 87 percent Federal Graduation Rate (FGR) is the national leader for the 12th consecutive year.
- ★ The Patriot League continues to lead the 32 NCAA Division I conferences in Academic Progress Rate (APR) (996) and retention trends (996) by conference. In the latest data release by the NCAA, the League is tied for first in retention trends and second in eligibility trends by conference. The League had 179 of its 194 teams score at or above the national average multi-year APR of 984. Eighty-two squads earned a perfect score of 1,000.
- ★ Six student-athletes earned College Sports Communicators (CSC) Academic All-America recognition, including first-team accolades for Boston University's Vera Sjöberg and Navy's **Tori DiCarlo (Women's Lacrosse)** and **Tenlea Radack (Women's Rowing)**. Second-team honorees include Army West Point's Christian Fournier (Men's Lacrosse) and Meghan Pedrani (Women's Lacrosse) and Navy's **Charlie Kriel (Men's Soccer)** received third-team accolades.
- ★ There were a record 4,047 student-athletes named to the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll in 2024-25. The total marked the first year the League has topped 4,000 honorees and a 171-member improvement from the 2023-24 academic year.
- ★ Loyola Maryland's Patrick Hayburn (Men's Swimming and Diving) and Boston University's Vera Sjöberg (Women's Track and Field) were named the Patriot League Men's and Women's Scholar-Athlete of the Year honorees, respectively.
- ★ Bucknell's Jack Roberto (Men's Soccer), Colgate's Sophia Diehl (Women's Basketball) and Holy Cross' Caleb Kenney (Men's Basketball) each received the 2024-25 Patriot League Award of Outstanding Leadership and Character, recognizing their shared excellence in leadership and service.
- ★ Boston University's Keegan Duffy (Men's Swimming and Diving) and Sophia Souza (Women's Swimming and Diving) were named the League's 2024-25 Sportsmanship Award winners for demonstrating fairness, equality and excellence in academics and athletics.
- ★ Army West Point captured the Patriot League Presidents' Cup following the 2024-25 academic year. The Black Knights led the women's standings, while **Navy** finished atop the men's standings and second overall. It marked the first time since 2004-05 that Army West Point won the Presidents' Cup.
- ★ Twenty-five Patriot League graduates have participated in the Victory Scholarship program, through the Sport Changes Life Foundation (SCLF), allowing them to attend graduate school in Ireland or Northern Ireland. A pair of League basketball student-athletes – Colgate's Zach Light and Lafayette's Naomi Ganpo – were the most recent recipients (2022-23 academic year).
- ★ The Patriot League featured 60 All-America selections during the 2024-25 athletic year with first-team status for Army West Point's Jackson Eicher (Men's Lacrosse), Christian Mazur (Men's Lacrosse), Christian Fournier (Men's Lacrosse), AJ Pilate (Men's Lacrosse) and Johnny Crush (Men's Swimming), Boston University's Vera Sjöberg (Women's Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field) and Foster Malleck (Men's Indoor Track and Field) and Lafayette's Lineke Spaans (Field Hockey) and Saiku White (Football).



- ★ Four Patriot League baseball student-athletes have played on Major League Baseball (MLB) rosters during the 2025 season: Lafayette's David Bednar (Pittsburgh Pirates), who was selected as an MLB All-Star in 2022 and 2023. Army West Point's Jacob Hurtubise (Cincinnati Reds) and Lehigh's Mason Black (San Francisco Giants) and Matt Svanson (St. Louis Cardinals) also spent time on MLB rosters this season.
- ★ Three Patriot League men's basketball student-athletes played on NBA rosters during the 2024-25 season, including Lehigh's C.J. McCollum (New Orleans Pelicans) and Loyola Maryland's Santi Aldama (Memphis Grizzlies) and Cam Spencer (Memphis Grizzlies). McCollum served as the President of the National Basketball Players Association (NBPA) from the 2021-22 season until July 2025. Aldama is a member of the NBPA Board of Directors. Former Bucknell men's basketball student-athlete Charles Lee enters his second season as the head coach of the Charlotte Hornets for the 2025-26 season.
- ★ Four Patriot League soccer student-athletes are playing in the MLS or NWSL. Boston University graduate Dominique Badji (DC United) and Army West Point graduate Zac McGraw (Portland Timbers) are currently playing in the MLS. Boston University graduates Kylie Naderer (Strom) (Orlando Pride) and Loyola Maryland graduate Didi Haračić (Angel City FC) are playing in the NWSL. Naderer helped the Orlando Pride capture the 2024 NWSL Championship.
- ★ Three Patriot League Men's Lacrosse programs finished the 2025 season ranked in Inside Lacrosse's KANE Men's Division I Top 20 Poll, including Army West Point at No. 11, Colgate at No. 14 and Boston University at No. 17.
- ★ Three Patriot League Women's Lacrosse programs, Army West Point, Loyola Maryland and **League champion Navy** received berths in the 2025 NCAA Women's Lacrosse Championship, the most in League history. All three were ranked in the final KANE DI Media Poll, with Navy ranking 18th, Loyola Maryland finishing 19th and Army West Point placing 21st.
- ★ The **Navy women's golf team** finished 11th at the NCAA Women's Golf Regionals in Gold Canyon, Ariz., with Emma Tang tying for 30th out of 77 golfers. The Loyola Maryland men's team placed 12th in the NCAA Men's Golf Auburn Regional, with Mike Crowley placing 20th out of 88 competitors. Holy Cross' Nolan Schuermann placed 49th at the NCAA Men's Golf Amherst Regional.
- ★ Six Patriot League individual student-athletes and one relay team qualified for the NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships. Boston University's Vera Sjöberg (1,500m & 5,000m) became the first dual All-American in League history. The Stockholm native finished as the runner-up in the 5000m, earning First Team All-America honors, while also logging Second Team All-America honors in the 1,500m. Army West Point's Nathan Davis (3,000-meter Steeplechase) was a Second Team All-American, while Emily Fink (Hammer Throw) received Honorable Mention All-America laurels. Bucknell's Evelyn Bliss (Javelin) earned Second Team All-America honors. **Navy's Nathan Kent (400m) and Murphy Smith (10,000m)** each took home second-team recognition, while the **Mids 4x400-meter relay** (Pete DeJonge, Jacques Guillaume, David Walker, Kent) earned Honorable Mention All-America honor
