A&T Prepares for Exciting Homecoming

Aggies looking for first Homecoming win in eight years

- North Carolina A&T is playing its 31st homecoming at Aggie Stadium. The Aggies are 14-16 since homecoming moved to Aggie Stadium. N.C. A&T has lost its last seven homecomings. The Aggies have lost those games by an average of 15.9 points. The last time the Aggies played Delaware State for homecoming was in 2005 when the Hornets defeated N.C. A&T 23-13. The Aggies are 5-10 in their last 15 homecoming matchups. Their last homecoming win was a 27-7 victory over Howard.
- N.C. A&T's last 2-0 start in the MEAC occurred in 2003. Twelve times since joining the MEAC in 1971, the Aggies have started the conference season 2-0. During those seasons, they are averaging nine wins, and they have only finished under .500 once when starting 2-0 in the conference. On four different occasions, a 2-0 start has led to a MEAC Championship.
- The Aggies have the second best defense in the nation after holding their third opponent of the season to under 35 yards rushing. N.C. A&T leads the conference in total defense by giving up just 253 yards per game. Last season, the Aggies defense was ranked 105th out of 117 schools.
- North Carolina A&T has held its last two opponents to under 250 yards of total offense. The last time the Aggies held two consecutive opponents to under 250 yards of offense was in 2000 when the Aggies held Norfolk State to 133 yards and Morgan State to 120 yards of offense in back-to-back weeks.
- The Aggies have held three different opponents to under 50 yards rushing. The last time that happened was in 1999 when the Aggies held N.C. Central, Winston-Salem State and Howard to under 50 yards rushing during the season.

A Glance at Today's Game

Delaware State visits Aggie Stadium for the first time since 2007. The last time Delaware State was scheduled to come to N.C. A&T, the Hornets had to forfeit because of a previously scheduled game with the University of Michigan. During their last trip to Aggie Stadium, the Hornets defeated N.C. A&T 27-0. The loss would be the genesis for what was a 27-game losing streak for the Aggies. Today, the roles are reversed. The Aggies come in on a two-game winning streak, while the Hornets are trying to stop a four-game losing skid. The Hornets have a familiar face on the sideline in head coach Kermit Blount. Blount coached at nearby Winston-Salem State for 16 seasons. He was 3-9 against N.C. A&T. The Aggies will be looking for their first homecoming win in eight years. N.C. A&T hasn't allowed a touchdown in its last eight quarters played.

The Last Time Against DSU

All-MEAC receiver Justin Wilson caught two touchdown passes to lead Delaware State to a 31-26 win over N.C. A&T at Alumni Stadium. Jaashawn Jones had 144 yards and a touchdown on 30 carries for the Hornets. Wilson made three grabs for 77 yards. Mike Mayhew led the Aggies with 132 yards rushing and a touchdown. Wallace Miles contributed offensively with 86 yards receiving on five receptions. Torrian Warren added five receptions for 71 yards and a touchdown.

Next Week's Game

The Aggies begin what will be a brutal four-game road stretch that starts with a visit to Howard University to play the Bison on its homecoming at 1 p.m. Like N.C. A&T, Howard has a new head coach. And like N.C. A&T, the Bison is one of the most improved teams in the MEAC. Howard, led by first-year head coach Gary Harrell, is coming off of an impressive 29-28 win over Florida A&M in which the Bison scored all 29 of its points in the fourth quarter. The Aggies have won the last three matchups against the Bison.

Delaware State's Last Game

Norfolk 38, DSU 21

October 8, 2011 -- Price Stadium

Norfolk, Va. -- Chris Walley threw two touchdowns and ran for another as Norfolk State defeated Delaware State 48-31 on Saturday for the Spartans' fourth straight win.

Walley, who finished with a career-high 327 yards, connected with Victor Hairston in the first quarter, then found receiver Xavier Boyce from 18 yards out to give Norfolk State (5-1, 3-0 Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference) a 31-7 lead late in the third quarter. Boyce finished with 10 catches for 124 yards.

Takeem Hedgeman paced the Spartans' ground game, recording career highs in both rushing yards (132) and touchdowns (two). Hedgeman scored the game's opening touchdown on a 58-yard run and capped off scoring with a 5-yard touchdown with 3:01 to play.

Delaware State (2-4, 0-3) threw the ball well, as Nick Elko had 339 passing yards and two touchdowns, but the Hornets struggled to move the ball on the ground, managing only 28 yards on 25 carries.

The Not So New Look Defense

Many of the same players who made up the Aggies 2010 defense are for the most part the same players who comprise the Aggies 2011 defense. Even in the positions where there are replacements, the size of the player is all that different. Yet, the 2011 Aggies have the No. 2 defense in the nation. Their last two opponents have combined for 38 yards rushing and six points. Last season this time, the Aggies had the 98th ranked defense nationally. The improvement on defense can perhaps be contributed to the fact the Aggies are a year older, a year stronger and a year faster. Another key factor could be linebackers Brandon Hover and D'Vonte Grant, who have turned into outstanding playmakers.

Mayhew Continues to Make Moves

North Carolina A&T running back Mike Mayhew has rushed for a combined 350 yards in his last two games. Those two performances move him over the 2,000 yard mark for his career, making him the ninth Aggie to accomplish this feat. If he averages 119 yards per game this season, he will become the Aggies all-time leading rusher. Mayhew has also carried the ball a combined 55 times over the last two games. Mayhew has 432 career carries over 26 games played. Last season, he broke the Aggies single-season carries record with 221. He is 140 carries shy of breaking Stoney Polite's carries record. Mayhew is ninth on the Aggies all-time rushing list. Saturday also marked his eighth career 100-yard game putting him five behind all-time leader Maurice Hicks.

Grant Makes Jerry Rice Watch List

The Sports Network announced on Thursday its selections for the Jerry Rice Award Watch List. North Carolina A&T redshirt freshman linebacker D'Vonte Grant was one of 15 players from the Football Championship Subdivision to be placed on the list. The Rice Award, presented by The Sports Network, honors the outstanding freshman in the FCS. A national panel of sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries will select the award winner after the regular season. The award is sponsored by Fathead.com. Grant (5-10, 190, Charlotte, N.C.) has started all three games for the Aggies and leads the team in tackles with 32. He recorded seven tackles and had one tackle for loss in the Aggies win over Morgan State. Grant is the second Aggie to make an award watch list this year. Running back Mike Mayhew was selected to the Walter Payton Award Watch List during the preseason.

Breaking Ties From the Past

North Carolina A&T's win over Bethune-Cookman on Saturday will hopefully go a long way in breaking a disturbing trend the Aggies have had against MEAC opponents. Going into this season, the Aggies had losing streaks of five or more games against Morgan State, S.C. State, Bethune-Cookman, Hampton and Florida A&M. Two weeks ago the Aggies broke a five-game losing streak to Morgan State, and the win over Bethune-Cookman broke a seven-game losing streak to the Wildcats.

It doesn't happen often

North Carolina A&T wide receiver Wallace Miles made four receptions on Saturday to give him 128 for his career. He is second on the Aggies all-time receptions list, 44 catches behind Herbert Harbison. Miles went without a catch at Morgan State on Oct. 1. It marked just the second time in his 37-game career he went without a catch. Miles only other game without a catch occurred on Sept. 19, 2009 when the Hampton Pirates held him to zero catches. During his career, Miles put together a streak of 21 consecutive games with at least one reception made. Miles leads the MEAC in receiving yards per game at 89.6.

Ferrell wins National Player of the Week Award

Against Morgan State, senior cornerback Justin Ferrell blocked two field goals, broke up three passes and an interception. His day on special teams earned him the College Sports Network National Special Teams Player of the Week honor. Ferrell also earned MEAC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. He was a first-team All-MEAC return man in 2010.

NOTING THE BETHUNE-COOKMAN GAME

- North Carolina A&T's defense has become awfully stingy lately. The Aggies have held their last two opponents to a combined 38 yards rushing. It is the best two-game performance for the Aggies since holding N.C. Central to 11 yards and Winston-Salem State to 26 yards in consecutive weeks in 1997. The defensive performances were the lowest two-game total the Aggies have allowed since shutting out Norfolk State and holding Morgan State to six points back in 2000.
- The North Carolina A&T defense forced four turnovers on Saturday. It was the most turnovers forced since forcing Winston-Salem State into four turnovers on Sept. 4, 2010.
- The Aggies held Bethune-Cookman to five yards rushing and 108 yards of total offense. The last time the Aggies held a conference opponent to fewer yards was on Oct. 13, 2001 when Florida A&M rushed for minus-21 yards against during homecoming.
- N.C. A&T running back Mike Mayhew finished the day with 29 carries. It marked the fifth time in Mayhew's 26-game career that he has carried the ball more than 25 times in a game.
- N.C. A&T running back Mike Mayhew and running back Dominique Drake combined to rush for 210 yards rushing. Drake needed seven more yards to top the 100-yard plateau. If Drake could have finished the task, it would have marked the first time since 1991 when Reggie Shuford and Mike Basnight both went over 100 yards rushing.
- Jose Garcia-Camacho hit two field goals on Saturday. It marked the first time since Sept. 5, 2009 that the Aggies hit two field goals in one game.

Coach Broadway In the Conference North Carolina A&T head coach Rod Broadway has the Aggies off to a 2-0 start in the MEAC. It is the Aggies first 2-0 start in the MEAC since 2003. Broadway has a reputation of beating his conference opposition. Broadway was 32-4 against SWAC opponents during his four-year stay at Grambling. At N.C. Central, he was 28-4 against CIAA opponents. Against conference foes for his career, he is an amazing 62-8.

Aggie Players of the Week

Aggies junior defensive end Tony Mashburn (6-0, 230, Tallahassee, Fla.) played a big part in holding Bethune-Cookman to five yards rushing last Saturday in the Aggies 22-3 win. Mashburn recorded seven tackles, made three tackles for 12 yards loss, recovered two fumbles and forced another. Mashburn's efforts earned MEAC Defensive Player of the Week honors. Mashburn earned the Aggies first weekly defensive honor since Jarrell Her-ring picked up the honor during Week One of the 2009 season. Jose Garcia-Camacho also earned a weekly honor from the conference. Garcia-Camacho connected on 24 and 29-yard field goals and was named MEAC Special Teams Player of the Week.

- During his career at Grambling, Broadway also showed he had a hankering for winning important games. He went 3-1 against archrival Southern. • Broadway was 33-11 at N.C. Central.
- He won back-to-back CIAA titles in 2005 and 06. The team also back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Division II Playoffs.
- During his stint at N.C. Central, Broadway also put together a 16-game regular-season winning streak and led the Eagles to their first-ever victory over a SWAC opponent with a win over Southern in 2006.

Sophomore quarterback Lewis Kindle threw for 341 yards and four touchdowns, as North Carolina A&T started off the Rod Broadway era in style, beating Virginia University of Lynchburg 38-7 on Saturday afternoon.

Broadway won his first game as the Aggies head coach after a coming over from Grambling.

After a scoreless first quarter, Kindle found Ricky Lewis on a 58-yard touchdown to put A&T (1-0) up 7-0.

In the third quarter, with the Aggies up 10-0, Kindle connected with Wallace Miles on a 52-yard scoring strike and to Lewis again on a 34-yard touchdown.

The Dragons (0-1), playing in their first football game in over 70 years, recovered six A&T fumbles, but was only able to score on one of them. Quarterback Delonte Williams hooked up with Duray Crawford on an 11-yard touchdown.

Kindle closed out the scoring with a 65-yard score to Larry Raper. His passing total was good for fourth on the all-time A&T list for a single game.

The Aggies had two receivers reach the 100-yard plateau, as Miles had 152 yards on seven catches, while Lewis added 100 yards on three grabs.

BOONE - For 2 ½ quarters on Saturday, it didn't look as if North Carolina A&T was outmanned against third-ranked Appalachian State. But a second quarter blocked punt and an interception thrown deep in ASU territory gave the Mountaineers the edge they needed in a 58-6 win over the Aggies at Kidd Brewer Stadium.

"You can't make mistakes like we made against a good football team like that," said N.C. A&T head coach Rod Broadway. "We had a chance to put some points on the board and at least make the game look

closer, but it got away from us because we're not quite good enough to close that gap."

Operating with 35 fewer scholarship athletes than ASU, N.C. A&T had some good moments. But the Aggies' good moments were often offset by miscues. The Mountaineers were able to jump out to a 14-0 lead in the first 10 minutes of the ballgame.

But special teams put the Aggies in position to answer the ASU early start as D'Vonte Grant recovered a muffed punt at the ASU 37-yard line. Two plays into the drive, a false start penalty turned a 3rd-and-4 into a 3rd-and-9. The Aggies couldn't convert the longer third down play, forcing them to punt.

ASU's Phillip Strickland raced through the middle of the Aggies' protection to block Skyler Thomas' punt, setting up the Mountaineers at the 50. Nine players later Cedric Baker Boney charged in from two yards out to make it a 21-0 game.

"That was a big turning point for us," said Broadway. "We're thinking at that point we have two snaps to get a first down. Instead, we get the penalty, we have to move back and they block the punt."

Despite their misfortunes, the Aggies wouldn't let the Mountaineers rest. Aggies quarterback Lewis Kindle opened the second half with a 31-yard completion to Wallace Miles. Three plays later, the two Westlake High School grads hooked up for a 40-yard touchdown pass to cut ASU's lead to 21-6. ASU added another touchdown on a Brian Quick 9-yard reception from DeAndre Pressley. Again, the Aggies kept the pressure on. Ricky Lewis took a direct snap and sprinted 24 yards to the ASU 24. On the next play, however, Kindle was flushed out of the pocket and tried to make a play downfield. His pass was intercepted by Troy Sanders at the 5-yard line and returned 27 yards. This time, the Aggies couldn't overcome the momentum shift.

"They're going to give us a heckuva game next year," said Bennett. "You're talking about a man who is well respected in the coaching profession when you look at what he did at North Carolina Central and Grambling. He was playing with half of his scholarships today, and look at how tough they played us."

The combination of quarterback Aramis Hillary and receiver Matt Hazel gave the Aggies trouble all afternoon. Hillary threw for 255 yards and three touchdowns, while Hazel caught six passes for 92 yards and two touchdowns. They helped Chanticleers score the game's first 24 points.

But it was the Chanticleers special teams that spearheaded their final scoring drive of the first half. A blocked punt by Dushawn Davis gave the Chanticleers a short field. Travis Smalls completed a six-play, 43-yard drive by scoring on a 3-yard touchdown to give Coastal a 17-0 halftime lead.

Out of the locker room, Coastal scored again as Hillary found Marcus Whitener out of the backfield for a 10-yard touchdown pass.

"We knew what they wanted to do on offense, we just couldn't get off the field on third down," said D'Vonte Graham, N.C. A&T's sophomore linebacker who had a career-best 12 tackles on Saturday. "We gave them a short field a couple of times and that really hurt us too."

The Aggies didn't need a short field for their next drive. They answered the Chanticleers opening drive of the second half by putting together an impressive 17-play, 76-yard drive that devoured eight minutes off the clock. It ended with a 6-yard touchdown pass from Lewis Kindle to Miles.

North Carolina A&T used a stingy defense, three blocked field goals and big running plays from Mike Mayhew to earn a 24-3 conference win over Morgan State at Hughes Stadium on Saturday.

The Aggies defense held Morgan State to 33 yards rushing, while Mayhew finished with a career-high 233 yards rushing and one touchdown. It was their first win over Morgan State in six years and their first win at Hughes Stadium since 2003. The win also marked the Aggies (2-2, 1-0 MEAC) first road win since beating Howard in Washington, D.C., two years ago.

"All wins our big wins at this stage in our program," said N.C. A&T head coach Rod Broadway. "This is the first time in a long time we've defeated Morgan, so it's going to be a nice bus ride home. But we've got to continue to get better. We missed out on a lot of opportunities today."

In a twist of irony, Morgan State's inability to take advantage of opportunities to score touchdowns early allowed N.C. A&T to gain some confidence defensively. On the game's first play, a Lewis Kindle interception gave the Bears (2-3, 1-1) the ball at the Aggies 16-yard line.

The Bears minus-10-yard drive was highlighted by a Travis Crosby sack. Ervin Gonzalez booted a 43-yard field goal to give the Bears a 3-0 lead. Morgan State's good field position would be a trend that would continue throughout the first quarter. Three of the Bears first four drives started in Aggies territory. The one drive that did not start in Aggies territory, started at the Bears 48 after a Kindle fumble.

Each MSU good fortune was met with an Aggies rebuff. Mayhew finally turned the field position in N.C. A&T's favor late in the first quarter. A 12-yard run helped the N.C. A&T move the ball from in front of its own goal line. Mayhew then sprinted down the sideline for a 78-yard touchdown run, the longest of his career.

"Once I got off the bus today, I was feeling it," said Mayhew. "I was in that zone. My offensive line stepped up today. (Offensive line coach Keith Wagner) told us all week it was time for a 100-yard game. We've been slacking the first three games, so I'm glad we got it going today."

Saturday marked Mayhew's second career 200-yard performance. His showing also put him 17 yards shy of the 2,000-yard mark for his career. But it was the Aggies defense that allowed the Aggies to keep a comfortable lead. After stopping the Bears on 4th-and-1 from the Aggies 47 to open the second quarter, Jose Garcia-Camacho hit a 35-yard field goal to give the Aggies a 10-3 lead. Morgan State answered by putting together its best drive of the game, a 9-play, 50-yard march that led to a 41-yard field goal attempt. But a bobbled snap led to Terence Webb blocking the kick. With the Aggies defense playing so well, the game was put away on a 47-yard touchdown pass from Kindle to Larry Raper to close out the first half.

GREENSBORO - All of sudden the tailgate food outside of Aggie Stadium tastes a little better. The Blue and Gold Marching Machine sounds a little crisper. And the Aggies locker room, well in a word, it was "raucous."

Why? Surprise, Surprise! The North Carolina A&T football team is 2-0 in the MEAC after defeating the defending MEAC Co-Champion Bethune-Cookman Wildcats 22-3 Saturday afternoon. It was the Aggies first win over the Wildcats since 2003. Three points are the fewest points the Wildcats have ever scored against N.C. A&T in the 35-game series.

Saturday also marked the first time the Aggies have held opponents to under seven points in consecutive weeks since shutting out Norfolk State and holding Morgan State to six points in back-to-back weeks in 2000.

But what perhaps is most impressive is that a year after posting 461 rushing yards against the Aggies, the B-CU run game was held to five on Saturday. The Aggies (3-2, 2-0 MEAC) are a half game back of Norfolk State for the conference lead.

"We knew Bethune-Cookman had speed," said senior N.C. A&T defensive back Justin Ferrell. "But the coaches preached we have to run to the football. The D-Line did an awesome job of penetrating. It was a total team effort."

Bethune-Cookman, who came into the game ranked as the No. 2 team in black college football, had trouble establishing any type of offensive rhythm. Bethune-Cookman (2-3, 1-2) came into the game with the No. 1 rushing offense in the conference after compiling 219 rushing yards against Division I Miami last week. The Wildcats' longest drive on Saturday was 34 yards as the Aggies forced five turnovers. B-CU had four drives that ended with negative yardage, and the struggles started early. The Wildcats had to run their first play from scrimmage at their own 9-yard line after Courtney Keith fumbled the kickoff. In what was an obvious mix up, B-CU quarterback Jamarr Robinson tossed a lateral to no one. It resulted in the ball rolling out of the back of the end zone for an Aggies two-point safety.

B-CU's only score of the game was set up by a Lewis Kindie interception in the first quarter. Ryan Davis returned the pick 27 yards to the Aggies 26. The Aggies defense held the Wildcats to just one yard on the drive as Sven Hurd booted a 42-yard field goal to give the Wildcats a 3-2 lead. The Aggies quickly responded with an 11-play, 59-yard drive that ended in a 29-yard field goal by Jose Garcia-Camacho. On the Wildcats' ensuing drive, they managed to convert a 3rd-and-27 as Jackie Wilson completed a 38-yard pass to Mauri Francois. But on 4th-and-2 from the Aggies 33, Brandon Young collided with Wildcats running back Anthony Jordan, stopping him for a 1-yard gain.
