Aggies Improved 'D' Will Get Test

Aggies Bring in the No. 2 Defense in the conference

- North Carolina A&T will see one of the best offenses in the Football Championship Subdivision. The Wildcats have the No. 1 offense in the conference, including the No. 1 rush offense in the league. On the flip side, the Aggies have the No. 2 rush defense in the league after holding Morgan State to 33 yards rushing. Bethune-Cookman will test the Aggies after running for 219 yards against Division I Miami.
- The need for the Aggies to slow down the Wildcats running attack is highlighted by the last four games against B-CU. The Wildcats are averaging 276.3 yards per game over the last four contests against N.C. A&T.
- The Aggies have had a tough time stopping the Wildcats lately. Bethune-Cookman has won the last seven meetings against N.C. A&T. The Wildcats are averaging 45 points per game over that time span. In three of those games, B-CU scored more than 50 points. Three of those big scoring days for B-CU has happened in Daytona Beach, Fla. But the Aggies are just 6-11 against B-CU at Aggie Stadium.
- North Carolina A&T is looking for its first back-to-back wins in the conference since beating Delaware State and Hampton in consecutive weeks (Nov. 8 and 15) in 2003. The two wins clinched the MEAC Championships for the Aggies.
- N.C. A&T's last 2-0 start in the MEAC occurred in 2003. Eleven times since joining the MEAC in 1971, the Aggies have started the conference season 2-0. During those seasons, they are averaging nine wins, and they have only finished under .500 once when starting 2-0 in the conference. On four different occasions, a 2-0 start has led to a MEAC Championship.

A Glance at Today's Game

Once again North Carolina A&T has to play a team coming off of a game against a Division I opponent. The Aggies had to play Appalachian State and Coastal Carolina after they played Virginia Tech and Georgia respectively. This week, the Aggies face a Wildcats team coming off of a 45-14 loss to the University of Miami. The Aggies will try to execute their offense against a B-CU team that surrenders just 277 yards per game to FCS opponents. B-CU's offense has compiled at least 390 yards in each of its four games. The Aggies have held two of their first four opponents to under 50 yards rushing.

The Last Time Against B-CU

Bethune-Cookman racked up 461 yards rushing to defeat the Aggies 67-17 at Municipal Stadium. Isidore Jackson rushed for three touchdowns and had 76 yards rushing on 15 carries. Teammate Eddie Poole added 65 yards receiving and a touchdown. Aggies running back Mike Mayhew had a career game despite the loss as he finished with 211 yards rushing. Ricky Lewis and Dominique Drake each had rushing touchdowns.

Next Week's Game

The Greatest Homecoming on Earth returns to Greensboro. For the university's biggest event of the year – homecoming – North Carolina A&T will invite Delaware State as its guest. The Aggies have not defeated Delaware State on the field since 2003 although they did earn a forfeit win over the Hornets in 2009. The Hornets have a familiar face on the sideline in head coach Kermit Blount. Blount coached at nearby Winston-Salem State for 17 seasons. He was 3-9 against N.C. A&T. The Aggies will be looking for their first homecoming win in eight years.

B-CU's Last Game

Miami 45, B-CU 14

October 1, 2011 -- Sun Life Stadium

Miami Gardens, Fla. -- Lamar Miller ran for 102 yards and two touchdowns, Tommy Streeter caught two scoring passes and Miami used a series of quick scores to shake off a dreadful early start and beat Bethune-Cookman 45-14 on Saturday.

All five of Miami's offensive touchdown drives took under 2 minutes -- two of them checking in at 10 seconds or less. Jacory Harris completed 12 of 17 passes for 175 yards for Miami (2-2).

Bethune-Cookman (2-2) was facing a major-college opponent for the first time in its 86-year history, and took an early 7-0 lead when Jackie Wilson found Eddie Poole with a 1-yard touchdown pass. The Wildcats kept that edge until midway through the second quarter, when Miami got touchdowns from Streeter and Miller to take the lead for good.

The final score said blowout. In actuality, it was anything but. For 22 minutes, Bethune-Cookman seemed like too much for Miami to handle. Bethune-Cookman quarterback Jackie Wilson completed 21 of 31 passes for 180 yards. The Wildcats held nearly a 2-to-1 edge in time of possession and outgained Miami 422-335.

He has also switched from cornerback to safety and back to cornerback again during his career. During that time he has been a first-team All-MEAC performer as a kickoff returner (2010) and he is two-time All-MEAC defensive back, earning first-team honors in 2009 before being placed on the second team as a junior. On Saturday, Ferrell made five tackles, broke up three passes and had an interception.

Caught in the Webb

North Carolina A&T defensive back Terence Webb has maybe finally found a position. In his career, Webb has played wide receiver, safety and quarterback over the first two seasons on the field. Webb even started as the Aggies quarterback to start the 2010 season. But this season he started as the Aggies cornerback and it seems to be where he fits best. Webb has made 12 tackles on the season, and on Saturday he blocked a field goal and broke up a pass. He is tied for the team lead in pass defenses with four.



Grant Makes Jerry Rice Watch List

The Sports Network announced on Thursday its selections for the Jerry Rice Award Watch List. North Carolina A&T redshirt freshman linebacker D'Vonte Grant was one of 15 players from the Football Championship Subdivision to be placed on the list. The Rice Award, presented by The Sports Network, honors the outstanding freshman in the FCS. A national panel of sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries will select the award winner after the regular season. The award is sponsored by Fathead.com. Grant (5-10, 190, Charlotte, N.C.) has started all three games for the Aggies and leads the team in tackles with 32. He recorded seven tackles and had one tackle for loss in the Aggies win over Morgan State. Grant is the second Aggie to make an award watch list this year. Running back Mike Mayhew was selected to the Walter Payton Award Watch List during the preseason.

Breaking Ties From the Past

North Carolina A&T's win over Morgan State on Saturday will hopefully go a long way in breaking a disturbing trend the Aggies have had against MEAC opponents. Going into Saturday's game, the Aggies had losing streaks of five or more games against Morgan State, S.C. State, Bethune-Cookman, Hampton and Florida A&M. N.C. A&T broke a five-game losing streak to the Bears with the win.

Radio Syndication

North Carolina A&T has partnered with Donal Ware Communications to syndicate all of the North Carolina A&T football games this season. In the Greensboro, WNAA 90.1 FM still provides coverage of A&T football. But outside of the Triad, Aggie fans can listen to Aggie Football on eight stations throughout the state. Donal Ware handles the play-by-play, while Eric Curry provides analysis for the broadcast. Among the areas covered in North Carolina are Charlotte, Rocky Mounty, Fayetteville, Raleigh-Durham and Eastern North Carolina.

Mayhew's Getting Closer

North Carolina A&T running back Mike Mayhew became just the second back in school history to rush for more than 200 yards twice in a career, joining Maurice Hicks who went over 200 yards five times. Mayhew's 233-yard performance surpassed his previous career high of 211 yards set at Bethune-Cookman (Oct. 28, 2010) last season. Mayhew needs just 17 yards on Saturday to become the ninth A&T running back to go over 2,000 yards in a career. Mayhew, a Walter Payton Watch List player, leads the conference in rushing. His runs of 78 and 40 yards against Morgan State were the two longest runs of his career. He is seven yards shy of becoming ninth on the Aggies all-time rushing list, surpassing George Ragsdale.

It doesn't happen often

North Carolina A&T wide receiver Wallace Miles went without a catch on Saturday. It marked just the second time in his 36-game career he went without a catch. Miles only other game without a catch occurred on Sept. 19, 2009 when the Hampton Pirates held him to zero catches. Before Saturday, Miles had caught at least one pass in a game for 21 consecutive games. Miles, who came into the game leading the MEAC in receptions and receiving yards per game, still leads the conference in receiving yards per. Miles has made 125 receptions in his career, which moves him into second place all-time behind Harbison. He is 48 receptions shy of becoming the Aggies all-time leading receiver. He is still 721 yards shy of passing Harbison in receiving yardage all-time.

NOTING THE MORGAN STATE GAME

- North Carolina A&T apparently needs a 200-yard rusher to defeat Morgan State. The Aggies earned their first win over the Bears in six years. In doing so, Mike Mayhew ran for 233 yards and a touchdown. The last time the Aggies defeated Morgan State, Brandon Sweeney rushed for 205 yards and four touchdowns.
- Mayhew had a top-10 performance against the Bears. His 233-yard day was the eighth best rushing performance in school history, just one yard ahead of George Ragsdale's 232-yard outing against Morgan State on Nov. 1, 1975.
- North Carolina A&T has looked for other receivers to take the pressure off of Wallace Miles. Coming into Saturday's game, Miles had made 60 percent of all the Aggies receptions. Today, that number 47 percent thanks to four catches by Ricky Lewis and three receptions by Larry Raper.
- North Carolina A&T held Morgan State to under 100 yards rushing on Saturday. It marked the first time the Aggies have held a conference opponent to under 100 yards since holding Howard to 87 on Oct. 24, 2009. Morgan State's rushing output was the lowest an opponent has gone against A&T since Delaware State had 38 yards rushing in a 13-7 loss to A&T in 2003.
- The Aggies have had a different leading tackler in all four games this season. On Saturday, it was Brandon Hover's turn to lead the Aggies in tackles. He finished with a career-high 10, while also returning an interception 31 yards.
- The Aggies held Morgan State to just three points on Saturday. It was the lowest point total for an Aggies opponent since Tennessee State scored three points against the Aggies in the Circle City Classic on Oct. 1, 2005.

- Broadway was the head coach at N.C. Central (2003-06) and Grambling (2007-10) for four seasons each.
- Broadway owns two Black College National Championships.
- Broadway has won three conference championships -- two CIAA and one SWAC.
- Broadway has a .750 winning percentage.
- Has coached on the collegiate level for 33 seasons.
- Broadway compiled a 35-12 record at Grambling, and owns the schools highest winning percentage
- He took a team that was 3-8 in 2006 and took them to the SWAC Championship Game in 2007
- In year two, he led the Tigers to an 11-2 overall record, a 9-0 record in the SWAC and the Tigers won the SWAC Championship Game 41-9 over Jackson State.
- Also in 2008, the team finished ranked 24th nationally and took home the Black College National Championship.
- Broadway was named SWAC and The Pigskin Club of Washington, D.C., Coach of the Year in 2008.
- During his career at Grambling, Broadway also showed he had a hankering for winning important games. He went 3-1 against archrival Southern. • Broadway was 33-11 at N.C. Central.
- He won back-to-back CIAA titles in 2005 and 06. The team also back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Division II Playoffs.
- During his stint at N.C. Central, Broadway also put together a 16-game regular-season winning streak and led the Eagles to their first-ever victory over a SWAC opponent with a win over Southern in 2006.
- At Florida, he served as a member of Steve Spurrier's staff. In 1996, he helped the Gators win a national championship.

Sophomore quarterback Lewis Kindle threw for 341 yards and four touchdowns, as North Carolina A&T started off the Rod Broadway era in style, beating Virginia University of Lynchburg 38-7 on Saturday afternoon.

Broadway won his first game as the Aggies head coach after a coming over from Grambling.

After a scoreless first quarter, Kindle found Ricky Lewis on a 58-yard touchdown to put A&T (1-0) up 7-0.

In the third quarter, with the Aggies up 10-0, Kindle connected with Wallace Miles on a 52-yard scoring strike and to Lewis again on a 34-yard touchdown.

The Dragons (0-1), playing in their first football game in over 70 years, recovered six A&T fumbles, but was only able to score on one of them. Quarterback Delonte Williams hooked up with Duray Crawford on an 11-yard touchdown.

Kindle closed out the scoring with a 65-yard score to Larry Raper. His passing total was good for fourth on the all-time A&T list for a single game.

The Aggies had two receivers reach the 100-yard plateau, as Miles had 152 yards on seven catches, while Lewis added 100 yards on three grabs.

BOONE - For 2 ½ quarters on Saturday, it didn't look as if North Carolina A&T was outmanned against third-ranked Appalachian State. But a second quarter blocked punt and an interception thrown deep in ASU territory gave the Mountaineers the edge they needed in a 58-6 win over the Aggies at Kidd Brewer Stadium.

"You can't make mistakes like we made against a good football team like that," said N.C. A&T head coach Rod Broadway. "We had a chance to put some points on the board and at least make the game look

closer, but it got away from us because we're not quite good enough to close that gap."

Operating with 35 fewer scholarship athletes than ASU, N.C. A&T had some good moments. But the Aggies' good moments were often offset by miscues. The Mountaineers were able to jump out to a 14-0 lead in the first 10 minutes of the ballgame.

But special teams put the Aggies in position to answer the ASU early start as D'Vonte Grant recovered a muffed punt at the ASU 37-yard line. Two plays into the drive, a false start penalty turned a 3rd-and-4 into a 3rd-and-9. The Aggies couldn't convert the longer third down play, forcing them to punt.

ASU's Phillip Strickland raced through the middle of the Aggies' protection to block Skyler Thomas' punt, setting up the Mountaineers at the 50. Nine players later Cedric Baker Boney charged in from two yards out to make it a 21-0 game.

"That was a big turning point for us," said Broadway. "We're thinking at that point we have two snaps to get a first down. Instead, we get the penalty, we have to move back and they block the punt."

Despite their misfortunes, the Aggies wouldn't let the Mountaineers rest. Aggies quarterback Lewis Kindle opened the second half with a 31-yard completion to Wallace Miles. Three plays later, the two Westlake High School grads hooked up for a 40-yard touchdown pass to cut ASU's lead to 21-6. ASU added another touchdown on a Brian Quick 9-yard reception from DeAndre Pressley. Again, the Aggies kept the pressure on. Ricky Lewis took a direct snap and sprinted 24 yards to the ASU 24. On the next play, however, Kindle was flushed out of the pocket and tried to make a play downfield. His pass was intercepted by Troy Sanders at the 5-yard line and returned 27 yards. This time, the Aggies couldn't overcome the momentum shift.

"They're going to give us a heckuva game next year," said Bennett. "You're talking about a man who is well respected in the coaching profession when you look at what he did at North Carolina Central and Grambling. He was playing with half of his scholarships today, and look at how tough they played us."

The combination of quarterback Aramis Hillary and receiver Matt Hazel gave the Aggies trouble all afternoon. Hillary threw for 255 yards and three touchdowns, while Hazel caught six passes for 92 yards and two touchdowns. They helped Chanticleers score the game's first 24 points.

But it was the Chanticleers special teams that spearheaded their final scoring drive of the first half. A blocked punt by Dushawn Davis gave the Chanticleers a short field. Travis Smalls completed a six-play, 43-yard drive by scoring on a 3-yard touchdown to give Coastal a 17-0 halftime lead.

Out of the locker room, Coastal scored again as Hillary found Marcus Whitener out of the backfield for a 10-yard touchdown pass.

"We knew what they wanted to do on offense, we just couldn't get off the field on third down," said D'Vonte Graham, N.C. A&T's sophomore linebacker who had a career-best 12 tackles on Saturday. "We gave them a short field a couple of times and that really hurt us too."

The Aggies didn't need a short field for their next drive. They answered the Chanticleers opening drive of the second half by putting together an impressive 17-play, 76-yard drive that devoured eight minutes off the clock. It ended with a 6-yard touchdown pass from Lewis Kindle to Miles.

North Carolina A&T used a stingy defense, three blocked field goals and big running plays from Mike Mayhew to earn a 24-3 conference win over Morgan State at Hughes Stadium on Saturday.

The Aggies defense held Morgan State to 33 yards rushing, while Mayhew finished with a career-high 233 yards rushing and one touchdown. It was their first win over Morgan State in six years and their first win at Hughes Stadium since 2003. The win also marked the Aggies (2-2, 1-0 MEAC) first road win since beating Howard in Washington, D.C., two years ago.

"All wins our big wins at this stage in our program," said N.C. A&T head coach Rod Broadway. "This is the first time in a long time we've defeated Morgan, so it's going to be a nice bus ride home. But we've got to continue to get better. We missed out on a lot of opportunities today."

In a twist of irony, Morgan State's inability to take advantage of opportunities to score touchdowns early allowed N.C. A&T to gain some confidence defensively. On the game's first play, a Lewis Kindle interception gave the Bears (2-3, 1-1) the ball at the Aggies 16-yard line.

The Bears minus-10-yard drive was highlighted by a Travis Crosby sack. Ervin Gonzalez booted a 43-yard field goal to give the Bears a 3-0 lead. Morgan State's good field position would be a trend that would continue throughout the first quarter. Three of the Bears first four drives started in Aggies territory. The one drive that did not start in Aggies territory, started at the Bears 48 after a Kindle fumble.

Each MSU good fortune was met with an Aggies rebuff. Mayhew finally turned the field position in N.C. A&T's favor late in the first quarter. A 12-yard run helped the N.C. A&T move the ball from in front of its own goal line. Mayhew then sprinted down the sideline for a 78-yard touchdown run, the longest of his career.

"Once I got off the bus today, I was feeling it," said Mayhew. "I was in that zone. My offensive line stepped up today. (Offensive line coach Keith Wagner) told us all week it was time for a 100-yard game. We've been slacking the first three games, so I'm glad we got it going today."

Saturday marked Mayhew's second career 200-yard performance. His showing also put him 17 yards shy of the 2,000-yard mark for his career. But it was the Aggies defense that allowed the Aggies to keep a comfortable lead. After stopping the Bears on 4th-and-1 from the Aggies 47 to open the second quarter, Jose Garcia-Camacho hit a 35-yard field goal to give the Aggies a 10-3 lead. Morgan State answered by putting together its best drive of the game, a 9-play, 50-yard march that led to a 41-yard field goal attempt. But a bobbed snap led to Terence Webb blocking the kick. With the Aggies defense playing so well, the game was put away on a 47-yard touchdown pass from Kindle to Larry Raper to close out the first half.
