Match Notes

Previous Match: The Aggies posted late runs in the second and third set but were unable to complete the come-from-behind victories as they were swept by The Citadel in Charleston, S.C. on Tuesday night by 25-18, 25-21 and 25-20. Senior Andrea Evans led the team with nine kills, while freshman Te'Borah Hawkins-Hollingsworth hit .375 on the night. Junior Jeana Daniels had a team-best five blocks while freshman Ashley Johnson had a team-best 24 digs.

Against the MEAC: The Aggies are 123-83 in MEAC competition in program history. The Aggies are 3-12 in MEAC Southern Division competition under head coach Hal Clifton, who is entering into his second season with the program in 2012. The Aggies have not been to the MEAC Tournament since 2007. To earn a MEAC Tournament berth, A&T must finish in the top four of the Southern Division. They are currently in fifth place with a 1-4 record.

N.C. Central Eagles Scouting Report: A&T is 2-11 against the Eagles, and fell to N.C. Central at home on Sept 28 in five sets. A&T lost the final set by 16-14. The last time the Aggies defeated N.C. Central was a 3-1 victory at home on Oct. 7, 2008. A&T has lost the last eight matches against N.C. Central. Entering into Friday's game, the Eagles are 5-19 overall and 3-2 in the MEAC (T-2nd). The Eagles are led offensively by freshman Christine Anthony who has 287 kills on the year for an average of 3.59 per set. Sophomore Dayana Arrufat Rondon is averaging 3.05 kills per set. Kalin Russell has 72 blocks on the year, including 23 solo blocks. The Eagles finished last season 5-26 with a 5-5 MEAC record.

Standout Stamnes: Freshman Brooke Stamnes has been a key part of the A&T offense this season. She is first on the team in kills (227) and second in digs (219), and leads the team in service aces (46). Stamnes is averaging 2.27 kills and 2.19 digs per set this season. She is the first A&T player to collect 200 kills and 200 digs since 2009. Stamnes posted a double-double on Aug. 31 against Chicago State with 12 kills and 11 digs. It was the first double-double by an A&T player since Jeana Daniels had 11 kills and 11 digs on Aug. 28, 2010 against UNC Wilmington. Stamnes garnered All-Tournament honors in three consecutive tournaments--the Western Carolina Catamounts Classic, Coppin State Invitational and Spartan-Aggie Invitational. She ended the Coppin State Invitational with a team-best 36 kills, nine service aces, 25 digs and five block assists. She had double-double against Mercer on Sept. 15. She recorded a season-best 18 kills against N.C. Central on Sept. 28. Stamnes tallied a double-double against Radford on Oct. 9 with 15 kills and 10 digs with a season-best .371 hitting percentage. She posted her second-straight double-double on Oct. 12 with 10 kills and 10 digs. She posted a season-best five service aces in the victory at Savannah State on Oct. 14. She tallied her fifth double-double on Oct. 17 against Norfolk State.

Tracking the Aggies

Effective Evans: Senior middle hitter Andrea Evans has had a strong fall. She leads the team with a .258 hitting percentage and 81 total blocks. She is third on the team with 209.5 points. Evans is also third on the team with 150 kills. She was highly efficient in the team's three matches at the Western Carolina Catamounts Classic, recording 17 kills and four errors in 40 total attempts for a team-best .325 hitting percentage. She hit .545 against St. Peter's College and .500 against Northern Kentucky. She had a .714 hitting percentage against Coppin State on Aug. 31. She averaged 1.44 kills and 1.19 digs per set in the Coppin State Invitational. Evans tied a career-high with 9 kills on Sept. 15 against Mercer at the Winthrop Classic Tournament. Evans ended the Winthrop Classic with 14 kills and 13 blocks, and was named to the All-Tournament team. She hit .500 against the N.C. Central Eagles with a new career-high 8 total blocks. She hit a team-best .304 on Oct. 5 against Bethune-Cookman. Evans set a new career high with 10 kills on Oct. 9 against Radford. She tied a career-high with 8 total blocks against S.C. State on Oct. 12.

Freshmen Get In On The Action: The Aggies welcomed seven new freshmen to the team this year, and each has gotten quality playing time this season. Currently, a freshman leads the team in kills (227-Brooke Stamnes), service aces (48--Brooke Stamnes), digs (384--Ashley Johnson) and points (287.5--Brooke Stamnes). The Aggies will look to continue to develop their young squad this season.

Can You Dig It?: Freshman libero Ashley Johnson has been effective for the Aggies this season. She has totaled 384 digs for an average of 3.84 digs per set, along with 13 service aces and 40 assists. In the Western Carolina Catamounts Classic, Johnson collected 33 digs. She posted 29 digs on Aug. 31 against Chicago State. She ended the Coppin State Invitational with 61 digs for an average of 3.81 per set. Johnson finished the Winthrop Classic Tournament with 61 digs, including 29 against Mercer on Sept. 15. She helped the Aggies set a new single-match digs record (106) against Mercer. She set a new season-high with 30 digs against N.C. Central on Sept. 28. She has posted double-digit dig matches 17 times this season. Johnson reached 300 digs on Oct. 7, by collecting seven in the loss to Florida A&M. She is the first A&T player to record 300 digs in a season since 2007, when Krystal Cooper ended the year with 333 and Stacey Malone had 513. Johnson is on pace to break the A&T digs career record (1,454 by Lauren Walker), if she averages 364 digs per season.

Jamming with Jeana: Junior Jeana Daniels has 117 kills on the season and a .221 hitting percentage. She has 54 total blocks for an average of 0.63 per set, along with nine aces and 37 digs. She collected 12 kills and eight blocks in the Western Carolina Catamounts Classic. Daniels totaled 10 kills, and had a .308 hitting percentage on Aug. 31 against Coppin State. She finished the Spartan-Aggie Invitational with eight kills, a service ace and a block. She collected nine kills and 10 blocks in the Winthrop Classic Tournament. She was second on the team with a season-high 13 kills at Campbell on Sept. 22 and she posted a team-best 5 blocks against High Point on Sept. 23. She recorded 14 kills with a .357 hitting percentage, and six digs on Sept. 28 against N.C. Central.

Fox Produces: Junior Chelsea Fox has 478 assists on the year for an average of 5.49 per set. She also has 25 blocks, 119 digs and 17 aces to her credit. She collected 73 assists in 11 sets, for 6.64 assists per match, during the Western Carolina Catamounts Classic. She ended the Coppin State Invitational with 81 assists for an average of 8.10 per set, along with 10 digs and three block assists. Fox played outside hitter in the Winthrop Classic and posted 16 total kills (matching a career best with 7 kills on Sept. 15 against Mercer), along with three aces, 30 digs and six blocks on the weekend. Fox recorded a double-double with 11 digs and 26 assists on Sept. 22 at Campbell. She set a new career-high with 52 assists on Sept. 28 against N.C. Central.

Cranking Out the Kills: Freshman Aleena McDaniel has been an important part of the Aggie offense this season. McDaniel is second

on the team with 171 kills, and has a .086 hitting percentage. She also has 141 digs and 31 aces this fall. She is averaging 2.04 kills and 1.68 digs per set. She led the team in kills in all three matches at the Western Carolina Catamounts Classic. On Aug. 31 against Chicago State, she posted 15 kills. She also collected seven more against Coppin State for 22 on the day. McDaniel ended the Coppin State Invitational with 32 kills, four aces and 14 digs. She posted a double-double with 10 kills and 11 digs at Campbell on Sept. 22. She also led the team in kills against High Point on Sept. 23. She set a new season-best with 16 kills on Sept. 28 against N.C. Central. She recorded a double-double with 11 kills and 15 digs against Bethune-Cookman on Oct. 5. She had four aces in the win against Savannah State on Oct. 14.

Magnificent McRae: Sophomore Aprill McRae has had a solid first-year season. She has 120 kills on the year and is second on the team with 53 total blocks. McRae ended the match against Coppin State on Aug. 31 with 15 kills in 23 attempts for a .652 hitting percentage—which is the second highest percentage in a single match since 2002, and just the sixth time that an A&T player has hit over .600 since 2002. The last time an A&T player recorded a hitting percentage over .600 was when Tatiana Cooper hit .619 on Sept. 3, 2010. McRae collected 28 kills in 60 attempts for a .333 hitting percentage with 12 block assists in the Coppin State Tournament. She hit .500 with 14 kills in 24 attempts on Sept. 22 at Campbell. She had five blocks on Oct. 5.

Improving from 2011: While the Aggies are 1-26 to start the season, they have 22 set victories to their credit, with 5 matches left to play. The Aggies won just eight sets total in 2011 and finished the season 2-27 overall and 2-8 in the MEAC. The Aggies did not win a set until Sept. 27 last season, while they picked up their first win in set one against St. Peter's College in their season opener on Aug. 24. The Aggies have also been able to avoid losing in three consecutive sets in 15 of their 27 matches. In 2011, the Aggies were swept in all but two of their 27 losses. The Aggies also played in their first five-set match since Oct. 1, 2010 on Sept. 1, losing to Bryant. They have played in five five-set matches this season—more than in the last three years combined, and the most since they played six in 2005.

100 is Grand: The Aggies have five players with 100 or more kills on the year—freshman Brooke Stamnes (227), freshman Aleena McDaniel (171), senior Andrea Evans (150), sophomore Aprill McRae (120) and junior Jeana Daniels (117). The last time the Aggies had five or more players with 100+ kills in a season was in 2007, when they had six players with triple-digit kills, including two with more than 320 kills (Aundia Gray and Krystal Cooper). The last time they had anyone with 200+ kills was in 2009.

Hal Clifton became the ninth head coach in the history of the North Carolina A&T volleyball program in August 2011, with the charge to lead the Aggies back to the MEAC dominance the program enjoyed in the late 1990s and early 2000s. In the two years prior to his tenure, the Aggies posted a 4-62 record. Clifton started on the task to rebuild the program with some strong strides in the 2011 season—his first with the Aggies and first as a head coach—and the program looks to see continued growth and development with the Clifton at the helm.

In his first season with the Aggies, Clifton led the team to a 2-27 overall record and a 2-8 MEAC record—which was the most conference wins that A&T has tallied since 2008. The 2011 Aggies were a young squad and had the minimum of six players on the roster to start the season. Clifton developed those players and added others to the team as the season progressed. He saw five players named to the MEAC All-Academic Team in 2011 for their success in the 2010-11 year, and five to the Commissioner's All-Academic team for their success in the 2011-12 year as well.

Heading into the 2012 season, Clifton announced a highly talented recruiting class of eight players to give the team depth and to help rebuild the program by bringing in skilled, enthusiastic and competitive student-athletes. The Aggies look to return to the MEAC Championship Tournament in 2012, which will be their first appearance in the tournament since 2007. The Aggies will be gearing up for a competitive conference season with a strong non-conference schedule and several tournaments in 2012.

Clifton came to A&T after concluding his sixth season as the assistant coach of the Elon Phoenix. He played a major part in turning the Phoenix from a 9-23 team in 2005 to a squad that finished in first place in the Southern Conference north division in 2010 with a 21-14 overall record and an 11-5 mark in the league. It was Elon's first northern division title. He also helped the team to a program-record 23 wins in 2009. He helped coach three all-conference players and three all-freshmen players during his time with the Phoenix. Clifton came to Elon University in August of 2005 from St. Andrews Presbyterian College where he served as the assistant coach for the 2004 season.

At St. Andrews, Clifton helped lead the team to the NCAA Division II Tournament and a regional ranking of seventh. The team tied a school record with 14 conference victories and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history. Clifton coached four all-conference athletes at St. Andrews and one conference freshman of the year.

Before his stint at St. Andrews, Clifton spent three years as the head coach at Jack Britt High School in Fayetteville, N.C. At Jack Britt, he achieved an overall record of 62-20, including a 28-2 season. Clifton was a three-time Mid-Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year and the Cape Fear Region Coach of the Year in 2003. He led Jack Britt to back-to-back conference championships and state tournament appearances in 2002 and 2003. Clifton coached three Mid-Southeastern Conference Players of the Year along with nine all-conference selections.

Clifton also served six seasons as the head coach of the Carolina Region High Performance club team from 2002-2007. In 2003 and 2004, he served as the head coach of the developmental team before becoming the head coach of the youth team in 2005. Clifton also spent three seasons with the Fayetteville Area Volleyball Association as a head coach. His 17-under team won the Carolina Regional Championship and three other tournaments in 2002.

Clifton graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Athletic Training from Appalachian State University in 1994 where he played for the men's volleyball club team. While at Appalachian State, Clifton received the Ron H. "Doc" Kannoy Award for the most outstanding athletic trainer.

He earned his master's degree in exercise and sport science from the University of Florida in 1996. During his time at Florida, Clifton served as the athletic trainer for the World University Volleyball team while they trained and played exhibition matches throughout the state of Florida prior to going to Japan for competition. As an athletic trainer at Florida, Clifton worked with the 1994 Southeastern Conference Champion football team along with the top ranked men's tennis and men's golf programs.

Clifton and his wife, Jennifer, have two children.
