**Records:** A&T is 6-4 overall and 4-3 in the MEAC as the Aggies head into their rivalry game with N.C. Central on a three-game winning streak. A&T is looking for its first road win of the season. N.C. Central is 6-4 overall and 5-2 in the MEAC. The Eagles were eliminated from the MEAC title race with a loss to FAMU on Saturday.

**Rankings:** N.C. Central was ranked in last week's HBCU Boxtorow poll and the Sheridan Broadcast Network poll of HBCU schools.

**North Carolina A&T Coach Rod Broadway:** Broadway is in his second season with the Aggies and his 10th overall. He has a 79-33 record overall. He is 11-10 as the head coach of North Carolina A&T. He spent four seasons each at N.C. Central and Grambling State. He is 1-0 all-time against N.C. Central, and 4-1 against Henry Frazier coached teams.

**N.C. Central coach Henry Frazier:** Frizier is in his second season as the head man at N.C.. Central. Frazier is 8-13 at NCCU and has a career record of 77-67 in 13 seasons. In his second year, Frazier had the Eagles contending for a MEAC title.

### Broadway, Frazier Have Made A Difference

There are some happy people inside the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference office. When N.C. Central returned to the MEAC, the idea of having North Carolina A&T and the Eagles butt heads in football and basketball each year had to be uplifting.

Then the N.C. Central football program brought in proven-winner Henry Frazier. Months later, the Aggies brought in proven-winner Rod Broadway. There was a little added bonus to all of that. Broadway used to be the head coach at N.C. Central.

In two years, the Frazier and Broadway track records are shining through. Until their 22-21 loss to Florida A&M last week, Frazier had the Eagles competing for a MEAC Championships in just his second year on the job. Meanwhile, the Aggies secured their first winning season in nine years last Saturday with their 17-7 win over S.C. State.

The annual Aggie/Eagle rivalry was only one point away from having significant meaning in terms of a championship this season. One can only believe in the years to come, with Frazier and Broadway at the helms of the two schools, that fireworks are about to spark in this series. From a far, the people at the MEAC must be commended for getting these two heated rivals back in the same conference.

This will be Broadway's first trip back to O'Kelly-Riddick Stadium since leaving the university for Grambling in 2007. Broadway was an impressive 18-5 at the facility, as he led the Eagles to consecutive NCAA Division II playoff appearances in '05 and '06. He will walk back into O'Kelly-Riddick with the No. 2 defense in the nation. The Aggies have gone 14 straight quarters without allowing an offensive touchdown. The game will also feature two of the best punt returners in the conference. NCCU's Geovonie Irvin is averaging 14.7 yards per punt return, while A&T's D'Vonte Graham is averaging 12.4 yards per return.

Coastal Carolina used three A&T turnovers to score 10 points in a 29-13 win. The Aggies started freshman quarterback Kwashaun Quick who was 11-for-23 for 155 yards and a touchdown. Fellow freshman Marquis Gorham made six catches for 48 yards. D'Vonte Grant had a game-high 15 tackles to lead A&T defensively.



A&T broke the school's single-game scoring record with a 77-0 win over West Virginia State. A&T compiled 489 yards of offense, while limiting the Yellow Jackets to just 41 yards of offense. Five different Aggie running backs, led Dominique Drake's three, scored touchdowns. Freshman kicker Zach Cimaglia connected on a school-record 10 extra points in the win.



Freshman kicker Zach Cimaglia connected on four field goals and quarterback Lewis Kindle threw two touchdown passes to lead the Aggies to a 40-7 win over Virginia University of Lynchburg. The Aggies defense recorded its second straight shutout as the Dragons only score came on a 45-yard interception return by Keith Lewis.



MSU receiver Andrew King caught a 32-yard TD pass in the back of the end zone from Robert Council with 10 seconds remaining to lead the Bears to a 21-18 win over A&T at Aggie Stadium. The Aggies missed an extra point and a field goal in the game, which made a huge difference. Running back Mike Mayhew did break the school's rushing record.



North Carolina A&T squandered three outstanding scoring opportunities with two turnovers in the red zone and a missed field goal as Bethune-Cookman came away with a 28-12 win. Junior strong safety Travis Crosby led a list of four Aggies who had double-figure tackles as he finished with 14 stops, 1.5 tackles for loss and he forced a fumble.



North Carolina A&T intercepted three passes and returned two for touchdowns as the Aggies handed Howard its first conference loss of the season with a 38-10 win at Aggie Stadium. Running back Mike Mayhew helped the Aggies offensively as he finished with 138 yards and a touchdown. Ricky Lewis added 76 yards and a touchdown.



Three North Carolina A&T turnovers led to 14 Delaware State points as the Hornets shut out the Aggies 24-0. It was the first shutout of the Aggies in four years. The Aggies played the Hornets evenly on the offensive end, but could not overcome two missed field goals and turnovers.



Freshman Quarterback Kwashaun Quick replaced A&T starter Lewis Kindle to start the second half and sparked the Aggies to a 30-9 homecoming win. It was the Aggies second consecutive homecoming win. After the Aggies trailed 9-7 at the half, Quick led the Aggies on a scoring drive that included him running for a 29-yard TD run.



The Aggies held Florida A&M to just 259 yards of offense in a 16-3 win. The Aggies used a punishing defense, including a 35-yard INT return for a touchdown by D'Vonte Grant to stifle the Rattlers. Running back Mike Mayhew finished with 92 yards rushing as Saturday marked the fourth time this season the Aggies have not surrendered an offensive touchdown.



North Carolina A&T scored two fourth-quarter touchdowns in 16 seconds to earn a 17-7 win over S.C. State. The win secured the Aggies first winning season in nine years. It was also the Aggies first win over S.C. State in 12 years. Mike Mayhew rushed for 141 yards and Ricky Lewis had 82 yards rushing and a touchdown.



One of the best rivalries in the FCS occurs on Nov. 17 as A&T travels to Durham. The two teams have made the rivalry even better with close games that come down to the final seconds. The series tied at five games apiece over the last 10 meetings. A&T's 10-point win over the Eagles last season was its largest margin of victory over NCCU since a 25-0 win in 2003.

### A&T's LAST TIME OUT

North Carolina A&T scored two fourth-quarter touchdowns in 16 seconds to earn a 17-7 win over S.C. State Saturday afternoon at Aggie Stadium. It was A&T's first win over the Bulldogs in 11 years. The win also secured a winning-season for A&T (6-4, 4-3 MEAC), the school's first in nine years.

Running back Mike Mayhew led the way for A&T with 141 yards rushing on 22 carries. Ricky Lewis added 82 yards rushing and a touchdown as the Aggies rushed for 250 yards.

The Aggies, who are ranked second in the nation in total defense, held the Bulldogs to just 166 yards of offense. The Bulldogs (4-6, 3-4 MEAC) only score of the game came on a game-opening 96 yard kickoff return by Jakar Hamilton.

But the Aggies didn't take the lead for the first time until under eight minutes remaining in the game. That is when Lewis ran off-tackle and ran through some tackles to score on a 34-yard touchdown run to give A&T a 10-7 lead. Seconds later, Bulldogs quarterback Richard Cue rolled to his right and toss the ball to Caleb Davis. Davis fumbled the ball, but did not go after it because he thought it was an incomplete pass.

Aggies cornerback believed differently. Graham picked up the ball and ran 10 yards to the end zone. The play was ruled a fumble, giving the Aggies defense a comfortable 10-point cushion.

The A&T defense has now gone 14 straight quarters without giving up an offensive touchdown. In his 11th season, S.C. State head coach Buddy Pough will endure his first losing season.

### Noting The SCSU Game

- The Bulldogs had 166 yards of total offense on Saturday. It was their worst output against the Aggies since compiling 141 yards of offense in 1971.
- S.C. State coach Buddy Pough has never had a losing season at S.C. State, and he's never lost to A&T. Both of those streaks came to an end on Saturday with the Aggies 17-7 win. Pough came into the game 10-0 against A&T.

- The Aggies held S.C. State without an offensive touchdown since 1988. The Aggies have now gone 14 straight quarters without allowing an offensive touchdown.

- Ricky Lewis scored on a 34-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter. It marked the Aggies first offensive touchdown in seven quarters.

- The Aggies have won three straight games despite the fact they have not thrown a touchdown pass in their last five. The Aggies last TD pass came on Oct. 6 when Lewis Kindle connected with freshman Marquis Gorham for a 24-yarder.

### The Remarkable A&T 'D'

The average size of the starting North Carolina A&T defensive line is 6-foot-1, 248 pounds. The average size of A&T's is 5-11, 217 pounds. In other words, the Aggies are not very big on the defensive side of the ball. Despite being small in stature, they have the No. 2 defense in the nation and the No. 1 defense in the MEAC. The Aggies are only allowing 266.0 yards per game, while holding opponents to 106.6 yards per game on the ground. A&T has now gone 14 straight quarters without allowing an offensive touchdown. On four separate occasions this season, the Aggies have not allowed an opponent to score an offensive touchdown. At home, opponents have only scored 47 points against the Aggies defense in seven games. In the process, opponents are averaging 93.3 yards per game on the ground at Aggie Stadium. The Aggies are also No. 1 in the conference in rushing defense and passing efficiency defense.

### Streaks

North Carolina A&T has several streaks going heading into their game against N.C. Central Saturday. The Aggies are on a three-game winning streak. The last time the Aggies finished with a four-game winning streak or better was in 1968 when the Aggies close the season with wins over Winston-Salem State, Morgan State, Florida A&M, Virginia State and N.C. Central.

The Aggies have also gone 14 straight quarters without surrendering an offensive touchdown and the Aggies have not thrown a touchdown pass in five games. The last touchdown pass thrown was a 24-yard completion to Marquis Gorham. The Aggies have only thrown three touchdowns this season as opposed to 15 interceptions thrown. That could end up being the worst touchdown-to-interception ratio in school history.

### Mayhew Mayhem

For the remainder of the 2012 season, Mike Mayhew will play under the moniker of A&T all-time leading rusher. Mayhew broke the record on an 8-yard carry in the second quarter. He almost lost the record with a six-yard loss on the next play. He solidified his mark however, with a 105-yard performance. Against Howard, he broke the school record for 100-yard rushing performances as his 138-yard game gave him the 13th of his career. He now has 14 career 100-yard games. He also became the 12th player in MEAC history to rush for 3,000 yards in a career.

### Mayhew Breaks Carries Record

Mike Mayhew has carried the ball 721 times during his career, making him the Aggies all-time leader in carries. He broke Stoney Polite's school record for most carries in a career on Sept. 1, 2012 at Coastal Carolina as his 11 carries took him over the top.

Mayhew could put the record out of reach with one more game to play this season. He was only one of 25 backs with at least 150 carries in the FCS. In 2010, Mayhew carried the ball a school record 221 times.

The next year, he outdid himself by breaking his own record with 231 rushing attempts. Mayhew has recorded 25 or more rushing attempts eight times in his career. He averages 131.8 yards in those games.

### Legends Speak To The Team

Two distinguished North Carolina A&T graduates and former Aggie football players addressed the football team before A&T's homecoming tilt against Norfolk State. Reverend Jesse Jackson, a famous civil rights activist and a two-time presidential candidate in the 1980's, played quarterback for the Aggies in the early 1960's. He came to prominence during the civil rights movement of the 1960's. Elvin Bethea is a former 15 NFL defensive lineman who played on the Aggies offensive line from 1964-67. Bethea's 15-year NFL career earned him passage to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2003.

Jackson talked about preparation. Think about and understand the opponent long before the game. He also talked about the importance of graduating and making a difference in society. Bethea told the current Aggies they play for a great university. Bethea said to always be better than your opponent.

### At Home On Broadway

North Carolina A&T head coach Rod Broadway is tough to beat when he plays at home.

In four years at N.C. Central, Broadway was 18-5 at O'Kelly-Riddick Stadium. He was even better at Grambling, where he went 15-0 at Grambling's Eddie Robinson Stadium. A year ago, Broadway was 5-1 at Aggie Stadium, and he is 11-2 at home since becoming A&T's head football coach. In total, Broadway is 43-7 all-time when he plays at home as a head coach.

### Hitman Crosby

Big things are expected from junior strong safety Travis Crosby. He was picked as a preseason All-MEAC performer and currently leads the Aggies in tackles.

He has not disappointed. Crosby leads the MEAC in tackles with 8.8 per game. He is also trying to head toward All-American status as a safety. Crosby is also fierce in the classroom with a 3.4 GPA in criminal justice. He is on pace to record 100 tackles this season.

His story is one of triumph. After growing up in a poverty-stricken neighborhood in Charlotte, Crosby decided in the 11th grade he did not want to follow the example of his peers by becoming a drug dealer or a high school dropout. Instead, he used football to earn an athletic scholarship to North Carolina A&T, where he has excelled as a student.

Crosby wants to become a lawyer, so he can help those trapped in the criminal justice system.

### Ricky Lewis Steps In

Ricky Lewis has done almost everything since stepping on A&T's campus after leading nearby Dudley High School to two consecutive state championships. He arrived as a quarterback, where he eventually positioned himself as the quarterback for the wildcat formation. Over time, he became a punt returner and a wide receiver. This season, Lewis is a running back and a pretty good one. Coming into the N.C. Central game, Lewis is averaging 4.4 yards per carry and has scored four touchdowns. He has rushed for more than 80 yards in three different games this season. For his career, he has 1,098 all-purpose yards and has scored nine times (7 rushing, two receiving) in 25 games.

### Scoreboard

Aggie fans can look for some new tradition on the Aggie Stadium video board. Before the start of the fourth quarter, a picture of the Greensboro/A&T Four appears on the video screen. The four men – Joseph McNeil, Franklin McCain, Ezell Blair, Jr. (later known as Jibreel Khazan) and David Richmond – ignited the modern day civil rights movement with their sit-in at the segregated F.W. Woolworth's.

Head coach Rod Broadway wants it to represent the leadership needed going into the fourth quarter. The video board will also display the school's alma mater at the end of the game as the Blue & Gold Marching Machine plays it in front of the football team. Broadway wants the team to learn the school song because he wants them to know about the great history of the school.

### The Fastest Aggies

After missing last season to focus on his academics, it doesn't look like D'Vonte Graham has missed a beat. Graham handles the Aggies kickoff and punt returns as well as man the corner-back island. In many cases, the Aggies depend on Graham to play a lot of 1-on-1 coverage.

He has responded by ranking sixth in the nation in punt returns, while helping the Aggies defense rank No. 2 in the MEAC in pass defense.

Graham uses his remarkable speed to enhance the Aggies defense and special teams. Graham ranks as the fastest Aggie (4.33) along with wide receiver Larry Raper (4.34) and Mike Mayhew (4.50). He's glad he made the decision he made because some of his friends did not have good outcomes.

### The 2014 Class

The one thing that concerns North Carolina A&T head coach is the Aggies' 2014 class. That's because there isn't one. In 2010, the Aggies were not able to pull together a recruiting class because of NCAA sanctions due to a low APR score.

APR scores measure a program's graduation rate. The Aggies have put initiatives in place in order to improve the score, but it will not change the fact the Aggies will lack senior leadership in 2014.

The upside is that in 2015, the Aggies should have an impressive junior and senior class with players such as receivers Marquis Gorham and Darren Bullock.

## Kicking Duties

A&T kicker Zach Cimaglia kicked three field goals against Florida A&M on Nov. 3. He has made 14 field goals this season, which is one shy of the school record held by Yonnick Matthews who had 15 in 2003. He is also three field goal attempts shy of tying Matthews' single-season record of 24. Cimaglia already holds the single-season school record for field goals made by a freshman. The old record was seven by Luther Leak in 1994.

## The Freshmen

The Aggies are relying on numerous freshmen this season, more noticeably on the offensive side of the ball. Freshman receiver Marquis Gorham has led the Aggies in receiving in six out of 10 games in 2012. Gorham broke the Aggies freshman record for receptions made on Nov. 10 against S.C. State as he made his 33rd reception on a 6-yard catch from Lewis Kindle. Gorham broke Willie Wright's 44-year old record of 32 receptions by a freshman. Fellow freshman receiver Darren Bullock has also been instrumental in the Aggies offense. He has played in all 10 games and has caught a pass in all but one of those games. Even quarterback Kwashaun Quick has seen action this season as he was the Aggies Game 1, 9 and 10 starter. Freshman kicker Zach Cimaglia has aided the Aggies in the kicking game by punting, and converting on 14 field goals this season. Redshirt freshman tight end Kevin Francis has also played a significant role. Freshman defensive back Tony McRae has played several roles for the Aggies including, cornerback, safety and kick returner.

## Offensive Linemen Shuffle

North Carolina A&T has not had the same starting lineup along the offensive line all season. Injuries and a lack of depth have left the Aggies shuffling their lineup upfront each week. Left tackle William Robinson III, Left guard Danye Gorrell and center Ronald Canty have started every game. Nathan Isles missed five games. Armon White took over for Isles in the starting lineup versus Delaware State. Tim Sunkins came in as the starting right guard before a season-ending injury forced him to the sideline as Olin Leak then stepped in.

## The Aggies Players of the Week

William Robinson became the latest MEAC Player of the Week. Robinson, the Aggies starting left tackle, earned MEAC Offensive Lineman Player of the Week honors for the week ending Nov. 11. Robinson helped the Aggies compile 401 yards of total offense, while not allowing either Lewis Kindle or Kwashaun Quick to be sacked. The Aggies rushed for 250 yards led by Mike Mayhew's 141 yards.

Robinson joins D'Vonte Graham and Zach Cimaglia as recipients of MEAC weekly accolades during the 2012 season. Cimaglia won MEAC Rookie of the Week for the week ending Sept. 18 after he connected on four field goals in a 40-7 win against Virginia University of Lynchburg.

Graham secured MEAC Special Team Player of the Week honors for the week ending Oct. 28 after he returned a missed field goal 100 yards for a touchdown against Norfolk State during the Aggies 2012 Homecoming contest.

## Graham Is Dual Threat For The Aggies

Graham is fifth in the nation and first in the MEAC in punt return average at 14.6 yards per return. He has one punt return for touchdown this season, and he also handles the Aggies kickoff returns. He is the second Aggie to earn MEAC weekly honors. As a defensive back, he is just as vital. He is tied for the league-lead in interceptions with four and ranks eighth nationally.

## Tackles For Loss

North Carolina A&T loves tackling opponents behind the line of scrimmage. In fact, the MEAC is very good in tackling behind the line of scrimmage. The Aggies are 28th in the nation in tackles for loss but fifth in their own conference. N.C. Central and Norfolk State are 1,2 in the MEAC in tackles for loss.

The Aggies make 7.5 tackles per game behind the line of scrimmage. Eighteen different Aggies have made tackles for loss led by Makari Pugh and Tony Mashburn who have 9.0 tackles for loss in 2012.

### Noting the NCCU Game

• The A&T/Central rivalry has an extra twist with A&T head coach Rod Broadway returning to O'Kelly-Riddick Stadium for the first time since leaving N.C. Central as its head coach in 2006.

• As Central's head coach, Broadway was 1-2 against A&T. He lost to the Aggies 22-0 in 2003 and 16-15 in 2004. But Broadway was successful against the Aggies, 23-22, in 2005. Broadway won two Black College National Championships at N.C. Central.

• Like any rivalry, the games have been close... The average margin of victory in the 83-game series is 13.9 points. On five different occasions the two teams have ended in a tie.

• Three different times in the last 17 meetings, the two rivals have gone into overtime. The game has been decided by less than a touchdown on 35 separate occasions.

• There are have been six games in the series decided by one point. The last six meetings between the two heated rivals has been decided by an average margin of 4.3 points.

• The only years A&T and N.C. Central did not play one another in football were 1926, 1929, 1943, 1944, 1993 and 2006.

• North Carolina A&T head coach Rod Broadway and N.C. Central coach Henry Frazier have done battle before. Broadway was once the coach at Grambling (2007-2010). At the same time, Frazier was the head man at Prairie View A&M. Including last year's A&T/NCCU tilt, Broadway is 4-1 against Frazier.

### Thanks Colorado

Two University of Colorado transfers Makari Pugh and Ayodeji Olatoye have been vital to the Aggies defense this season. Pugh has started twice at outside linebacker and ranks 45th in the nation in tackles for loss per game with 1.67.

Olatoye has made three starts at cornerback for the Aggies. Olatoye has one interception on the season has helped the Aggies rank fifth in the nation in pass defense and first in the MEAC.

Along with D'Vonte Graham and Isaiah Martin, the Aggies have the No. 2 pass defense in the conference.



### Getting It Done In The Classroom Last Spring

The North Carolina A&T saw significant improvement in the classroom during the 2012 spring semester. The Aggies had 22 players record a 3.0 grade point average or better during the 2012 spring semester. The two highest were graduating seniors James Weaks' 3.75 GPA and Julian Alford's 3.77.

Among the standouts on this season's team was left tackle William Robinson who posted a 3.40 GPA during the spring and defensive back Mark Newton who had a 3.75. Kicker Jose Garcia-Camacho posted a 3.44 GPA over the spring.

### Winning Seasons

A&T secured its first winning season in nine years on Saturday with its 17-7 win over S.C. State. It is the Aggies 46th winning season in 89 years of football. If the Aggies are able to beat N.C. Central on Saturday, they would have put together the school's eighth seven-win season. The Aggies eight-season drought without a winning season was the longest in program history. The last time the Aggies had a winning season it came during their 2003 MEAC Championship season.

### Touchdowns

North Carolina A&T has scored 30 touchdowns this season. Seven of those touchdowns were non-offensive. The Aggies have found all sorts of ways to score this season, including a 100-yard missed field goal return by D'Vonte Graham against Norfolk State on Oct. 27. The Aggies have also scored on a blocked punt by Dequan Swann.

Demonta Brown recovered the ball in the end zone. The Aggies have also returned four interceptions for touchdowns, including two by D'Vonte Grant, one by Graham and another

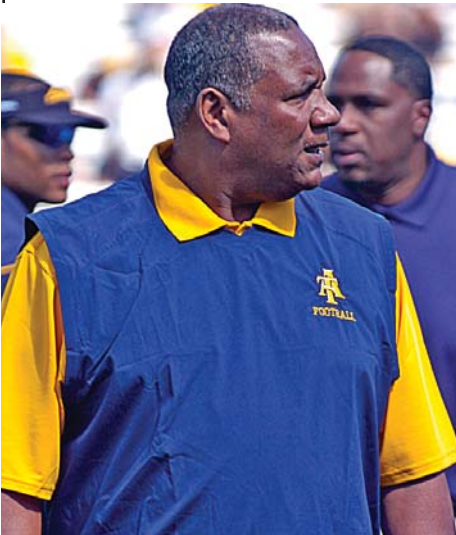

Rod Broadway enters his second season as the head football coach at North Carolina A&T. His first season at the helm produced a lot of excitement about the future of Aggie football.

The Aggies not only had a four-win improvement from their 1-10 season in 2010, but they were also in the thick of the MEAC race midway through the season before a four-game road trip derailed their chances. Also in his first year, Broadway became the first Aggie head coach in school history to produce a 2,000-yard passer, a 1,000-yard rusher and a 1,000-yard receiver.

Mike Mayhew, the Aggies' 1,000-yard back in 2011, was named MEAC Co-Offensive Player of the Year. Wallace Miles, the 1,000-yard receiver, signed an NFL free agent contract with the Detroit Lions. Defensively, linebacker D'Vonte Grant became a Jerry Rice Finalist for best freshman in the Division I Football Championship Subdivision after he led the Aggies in tackles. As a team, the Aggies showed their most significant improvement on the defensive end. They were ranked 114th in FCS rushing defense in 2010. In 2011 under Broadway, they finished seventh nationally and were tops in the MEAC. In 2010, A&T was 89th in FCS total defense. A year later under Broadway, they were eighth.

Broadway came to A&T with an impressive his-



story of winning championships with a brand of football that is exciting offensively and punishing defensively. In his last two head coaching positions - N.C. Central and Grambling State - each school came away with a Black College National Championship.

Broadway has compiled a 77-33 (.770) record over nine years as a head coach. Before taking over the difficult task of rebuilding an Aggies program with just 14 wins in the previous seven seasons before his arrival, Broadway spent four seasons (2007-10) at Grambling State. The Tigers went 35-12 under his stewardship.

The year before he arrived at GSU, the Tigers went 3-8. During his first season there in 2008, the Tigers finished second in the Southwestern Athletic Conference and made an appearance in the SWAC Championship Game. Five players received either All-American or All-SWAC honors, and Broadway was a finalist for the nationally-recognized Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

The impact of Broadway's arrival was seen on both sides of the football. Grambling went from an average defense to one of the fiercest in the country. The Tigers ranked 12th nationally in total defense, eighth in rushing defense and 11th in scoring defense.

Grambling held three of their opponents to fewer than 30 yards, and 10 of their opponents committed three or more turnovers. Offensively, wide receiver Clyde Edwards earned FCS Fabulous 50 All-American honors and running back Frank Warren was named SWAC Freshman of the Year.

Year two led to even more improvements for the GSU program. The Tigers ascended to

the top of the SWAC with a 9-0 record and a 41-9 win over Jackson State in the SWAC Championship Game. GSU's 2008 season also produced an 11-2 overall mark, a No. 24 national ranking in the Sports Network Division I-FCS poll and a Black College National Championship.

Defense was the catalyst for the Tigers' success as they finished the season ranked No. 1 nationally in turnover margin, pass efficiency defense and had a No. 7 ranking in rush defense. In addition, three players earned All-American honors, nine were named All-SWAC and five players earned Louisiana Sports Writers Association recognition. Accolades for Broadway included being named SWAC Coach of the Year and The Pigskin Club of Washington, D.C., Coach of the Year.

In 2009, GSU continued to play well. The Tigers finished 7-4 overall and 5-2 in the SWAC. The Tigers led the nation in punt return yardage and they had the ninth-best scoring offense. The next season resulted in a 9-2 mark that was complemented by an 8-1 SWAC record. The Tigers' rushing attack produced more than 200 yards per game, which ranked 15th nationally.

During his career at GSU, Broadway also showed he had a hankering for winning rivalry games. He went 3-1 against archrival Southern.

in the Peach Bowl.

At Florida, he served as a member of the Steve Spurrier's staff. In 1996, he helped the Gators win an NCAA National Championship.

Broadway's stay also included four SEC Championships and six bowl appearances. The Gators defense led the SEC in sacks four straight seasons (1996-99), and the team set a school record for fewest rushing yards allowed, as offenses produced just 70.7 yards per game.

A 1977 graduate of UNC, Broadway played on the Tar Heels defensive line from 1974-77. He earned the team's Out-

He also owns the best winning percentage in program history, even better than legendary GSU head coach Eddie Robinson.

Before his stint at GSU, Broadway turned N.C. Central into a Division II national power.

His four-year stint (2003-06) at N.C. Central produced a 33-11 record, back-to-back CIAA titles for the first time in 50 years and the Eagles made two consecutive appearances in the NCAA Division II Playoffs. The 2006 season was the highlight of Broadway's tenure at NCCU.

Broadway led the Eagles to an 11-1 season and the top seed in the NCAA Division II Southeast Region. After fielding the No. 1 rated offense in the CIAA and the 15th ranked defense nationally, individual honors included two players being named Associated Press Little All-Americans.

There were also 12 players named All-CIAA, 10 Eagles earned Daktronics All-Southeast Region recognition and four members from the 2006 team were named SBN All-Americans, including freshman quarterback Stadford Brown, who was also named SBN Player of the Year. During his stint at NCCU, Broadway also put together a 16-game regular-season winning streak and led the Eagles to their first-ever victory over a SWAC opponent with a win over Southern in 2006.

Broadway began his collegiate coaching career at East Carolina University in 1979. His other coaching positions

In addition, the Aggies blocked a punt for the second straight week, which resulted in A&T's opening touchdown against the Dragons.

The Dragons only score came on a 45-yard interception return by Keith Lewis. The "pick 6" put the Dragons down 14-7. A&T quarterback Lewis Kindle quickly recovered.

Three plays after helping the Dragons score, Kindle found a wide open Marquis Gorham on a post pattern for a 34-yard touchdown reception to give the Aggies a 21-7 lead. Graham's return gave the Aggies another score before the half. In the second half, Cimaglia took over. Three of Cimaglia's field goals were from 40 yards or more.

Cimaglia even attempted a 53-yard field goal that came up short. Cimaglia's four field goals marked the first time in nine seasons an Aggie has kicked more than three field goals in a game. Kindle threw for 217 yards, two touchdowns and an interception on 16-for-27 passing. Nine different receivers caught passes for the Aggies in the win.

Wildcats defense early has 27-yard and 24-yard completions to freshman Marquis Gorham led to a 6-0 Aggies lead as the latter completion went into the end zone. The extra point was missed.

After falling behind 7-6, the Aggies received another scoring opportunity in the second quarter. Trey Long made catches of 26 and 10 yards to give the Aggies the ball at the B-CU 24-yard line. Three plays later, quarterback Lewis Kindle underthrew a pass to Gorham in the end zone, which allowed Rashad Payne to intercept the pass.

Just before halftime, another break came A&T's way. For the third straight week, the Aggies blocked a punt. Leroy Bradford's block gave the Aggies the ball at the Wildcat 31. The Aggies didn't score a touchdown, but a 38-yard field goal by Zach Cimaglia did help the Aggies cut the lead to 14-9 going into the locker room.

**GREENSBORO** -- North Carolina A&T intercepted three passes and returned two for touchdowns as the Aggies handed Howard its first conference loss of the season with a 38-10 win at Aggie Stadium. The Aggies rushed for a 242 yards against the Bison as senior running back Mike Mayhew finished with 138 yards and a touchdown on 20 carries.

Ricky Lewis added 76 yards and a touchdown. A week after throwing two red zone interceptions, the Aggies were efficient inside the red zone. They scored on all four trips inside the red zone, including three rushing touchdowns. Kicker Zach Cimaglia returned to form as well. He followed two straight weeks of missing extra points with a 5-for-5 performance in PATs and he booted a 31-yard field goal.

overcome two missed field goals and turnovers.

Three turnovers and two missed field goals were too much to overcome as North Carolina A&T lost to Delaware State 24-0 at Alumni Stadium. It was the Aggies fifth straight loss at Alumni Stadium, and it was their first shutout loss in four years. The Aggies did receive some good news defensively as starting free safety Isaiah Martin returned from missing two games due to a knee injury to record 12 tackles. Middle linebacker Tony Clodfelter also had 12 tackles.

But the Aggies could not overcome three turnovers, which led to 14 point Hornet points. After a scoreless first quarter, Delaware State took advantage of a short field and drove 53 yards in eight plays to score on a 1-yard Nagee Jackson touchdown. Two plays into the Aggies' next drive, Leroy Bradford fumbled and the Hornets returned it 22 yards to the Aggies 31-yard line.

North Carolina A&T made a quarterback change to start the second half and rolled to a 30-9 win over Norfolk State during the Aggies 2012 Greatest Homecoming On Earth. A&T quarterback Lewis Kindle started against the Spartans, but was ineffective. Kindle threw three first-half interceptions as the Aggies trailed 9-0 early. The Aggies trailed 9-7 at halftime because D'Vonte Graham returned a Norfolk State missed field goal 100 yards for a touchdown. Meanwhile, the Aggies offense was in the midst of going six straight quarters without a score.

Therefore, to open the second half, the Aggies turned to freshman quarterback Kwashaun Quick to replace Kindle. Quick quickly sparked the Aggies offense as his opening drive resulted in him scoring on a 29-yard touchdown run. The Aggies, who forced six turnovers in the game, then used one of those turnovers to expand their lead. After a NSU fumble, A&T running back Ricky Lewis scored on a 19-yard touchdown run to give A&T a 20-9 lead. A&T dominated defensively from there.

-- North Carolina A&T scored two fourth-quarter touchdowns in 16 seconds to earn a 17-7 win over S.C. State Saturday afternoon at Aggie Stadium. It was A&T's first win over the Bulldogs in 11 years. The win also secured a winning-season for A&T (6-4, 4-3 MEAC), the school's first in nine years.

The Aggies didn't take the lead for the first time until under eight minutes remaining in the game. That is when Lewis ran off-tackle and ran through some tackles to score on a 34-yard touchdown run to give A&T a 10-7 lead. Seconds later, Bulldogs quarterback Richard Cue rolled to his right and toss the ball to Caleb Davis. Davis fumbled the ball, but did not go after it because he thought it was an incomplete pass.

Aggies cornerback believed differently. Graham picked up the ball and ran 10 yards to the end zone. The play was ruled a fumble, giving the Aggies defense a comfortable 10-point cushion. The A&T defense has now gone 14 straight quarters without giving up an offensive touchdown. In his 11th season, S.C. State head coach Buddy Pough will endure his first losing season.
