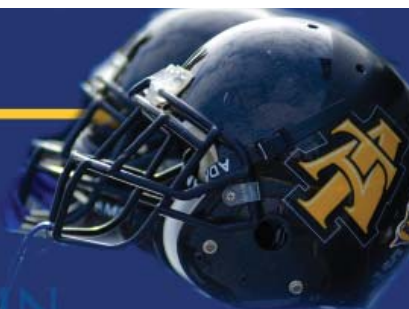

**Records:** North Carolina A&T is 1-1 after a dominant victory over West Virginia State on Saturday. The Aggies have won five straight home games. VU of L is 0-1 after its game against with College of Faith was cancelled. The Dragons lost to Ohio Dominican 57-6 two weeks ago.

**Rankings:** The Aggies are ranked ninth in the newest Boxtorow poll. It is the Aggies first appearance in a poll this season. Virginia University of Lynchburg is not ranked and comes into the game 0-1. **North Carolina A&T Coach Rod Broadway:** Broadway is in his second season with the Aggies and his 10th overall. His record is 74-30 (.712). He is 6-7 as the head coach of North Carolina A&T. He spent four seasons each at N.C. Central and Grambling State.

**Virginia University of Lynchburg Coach Willard Bailey:** Willard Bailey built a powerhouse football program at Virginia Union for 37 seasons before taking over at the upstart VU of L. Bailey is 236-156-7 over his storied career, and he led the Dragons to a 4-6 during their first season in 70 years.

### Oh What A Night

North Carolina A&T scheduled West Virginia State as way of getting a credible home opponent that will present a challenge the Aggies could handle with victory. But not even head coach Rod Broadway could have predicted just how dominant the Aggies were on Saturday night. A&T set a new single-game scoring record by scoring 77 points against the Yellow Jackets. They also tied the school record for touchdowns scored in a game with 11. Seven different Aggies scored, including one defensive touchdown. Five different running backs – Mike Mayhew, Marlowe Wood, Chauncey Burgess, Ricky Lewis and Dominique Drake – scored for the Aggies.

This week, the Aggies face another Division II foe in Virginia University of Lynchburg. The Dragons will visit Aggie Stadium for the second straight season. The Dragons trailed just 10-0 at halftime before quarterback Lewis Kindle ignited the Aggies offense by passing for a career high 341 yards and four touchdowns. A&T won his 85th game at Aggie Stadium on Saturday and look to gain their sixth straight home win.

VU of L is trying to enter NCAA status as a CIAA school. The school's current governing body is the United States Collegiate Athletic Association. The Dragons returned to football last season after a seven-decade layoff. VUL, who comes into a game where the Aggies gave up just 41 yards of total offense to WVSU, registered just 86 yards of total offense against Ohio Dominican. VU of L has one other Division I-FCS team on its schedule in Grambling State University.

### Who's Next...

The Aggies will get a week off before playing Morgan State at home on Sept. 27. It will be a Thursday night game that will be televised live on ESPNU at 7:30 p.m. The Aggies went on the road last season to earn a 24-3 win over the Bears last season. It was their first win over the Bears in six tries. The Aggies are 0-5 on ESPNU.

Coastal Carolina used three A&T turnovers to score 10 points in a 29-13 win. The Aggies started freshman quarterback Kwashaun Quick who was 11-for-23 for 155 yards and a touchdown. Fellow freshman Marquis Gorham made six catches for 48 yards. D'Vonte Grant had a game-high 15 tackles to lead A&T defensively.



The Aggies and West Virginia State will meet for the first time since 1943. The two teams have actually played each other five times with the Aggies leading the series 3-2. The Aggies have been dominant against Division II foes. They have won six straight against DII opponents with their last loss at Aggie Stadium to a DII coming on Nov. 11, 1995.



A&T broke the school's single-game scoring record with a 77-0 win over West Virginia State. A&T compiled 489 yards of offense, while limiting the Yellow Jackets to just 41 yards of offense. Five different Aggie running backs, led Dominique Drake's three, scored touchdowns. Freshman kicker Zach Cimaglia connected on a school-record 10 extra points in the win.



A&T ended a six-game losing streak to Morgan State last season with a 24-3 road win over the Bears. It was the Aggies only road win of the season. The two teams will face each other live on ESPN2 on a Thursday night. It will be the Aggies first televised game since a humbling 67-17 loss to Bethune-Cookman on Oct. 28, 2010.



The contest against Bethune-Cookman will be a tough challenge for the Aggies. They shocked the Wildcats last season with a dominant 22-3 win over the Wildcats at Aggie Stadium. The Aggies held the run-happy Wildcats to just five yards rushing. This time the Aggies will have to travel to Daytona Beach to face the Wildcats on their homecoming.



Howard and A&T are probably two of the most improved teams in the MEAC. Both teams finished 5-6 in 2011 after coming off of 1-10 seasons the previous year. The contests will feature two of the best quarterbacks in the conference in preseason All-MEAC selection Greg McGhee of Howard and A&T's Lewis Kindle.



Success hasn't been the norm for A&T in Dover, Del. The Aggies have not defeated the Hornets up north since 2002. The Aggies looked solid offensively against the Hornets last season as they earned a 42-24 win over the Hornets at Aggie Stadium in 2011. The series between the two teams is tied at 20-20-1.



A&T faces the defending MEAC champions for homecoming. The Aggies ended a seven-game homecoming losing streak last season. The Aggies had a chance to beat the Spartans last season, but dropped two passes in the end zone in the final seconds to come away with a 14-10 loss. The Aggies lead the all-time series 27-11.



Florida A&M has had A&T's number since the two teams started playing another in 1938. The Rattlers lead the all-time series 44-13-3. Nothing has changed recently. The Rattlers have won the last seven meetings even though the last three games have been decided by an average of 4.3 points. The Aggies last win over FAMU at Aggie Stadium came in 2003.



The Aggies would love to end their nasty losing streak against the Bulldogs. A&T is 0-11 in last 11 meetings against the Bulldogs, and their head coach Buddy Pough is 10-0 when facing A&T. S.C. State's 11-game win streak over the Aggies is the longest in the series. A&T's last win over the Bulldogs came in 2000.



One of the best rivalries in the FCS occurs on Nov. 17 as A&T travels to Durham. The two teams have made the rivalry even better with close games that come down to the final seconds. The series tied at five games apiece over the last 10 meetings. A&T's 10-point win over the Eagles last season was its largest margin of victory over NCCU since a 25-0 win in 2003.

### A&T's LAST TIME OUT

North Carolina A&T was dominant in its 77-0 win over West Virginia State, they took a knee 10 times in the fourth quarter, including four knees inside the WVSU 5-yard line. A&T's point total set a school single-game scoring record, and running backs Ricky Lewis,

Dominique Drake and Mike Mayhew combined for 231 yards rushing and six touchdowns on 37 carries. A&T kicker Zach Cimaglia set a school record with 10 extra points, and the Aggies defense held the Yellow Jackets to just 41 yards of offense.

The dominance started with a botched snap on the Yellow Jackets' first punt attempt of the game. It resulted in the Aggies taking over at the Yellow Jackets 1-yard line. It ended with Dominique Drake scoring the first of his career-high three touchdowns. Throughout the course of the game, the Aggies forced five turnovers and blocked a punt and scored a defensive touchdown.

The Yellow Jackets' five turnovers led to 35 A&T points. By halftime, the Aggies already had a 42-0 lead. A Chauncey Burgess touchdown gave the Aggies a 70-0 lead going into the fourth quarter. Dequan Swann's blocked punt to open the fourth quarter gave the Aggies the ball at the WVSU 2.

The Aggies decided to take a knee four times instead of trying to score again. But the Yellow Jackets fumbled the ball two plays later to give the Aggies the ball back at the Yellow Jacket 21. Reserve running back Marlowe Wood ran the ball on five straight plays, including on a 2-yard touchdown run that set the Aggies up to break the scoring record. Cimaglia's extra point gave A&T the mark.

### Noting The WVSU Game

- Ricky Lewis was five rushing yards away from being the only A&T player on the roster with a 100-yard receiving and 100-yard rushing performance. Lewis caught three passes for 100 yards against Virginia University of Lynchburg last season. He had 95 yards rushing on Saturday against WVSU.

- For the fifth straight home game, the Aggies held their opponent to under 35 yards rushing. The last opponent to garner more than 35 yards rushing against the Aggies at home was Coastal Carolina on Sept. 24, 2011.

- Dominique Drake became the first A&T player to rush for three touchdowns since Mike Mayhew did on Oct. 15, 2011 against Delaware State. Larry Raper scored three touchdowns in the same game from the receiving end.

- The last time the Aggies shutout an opponent was nine years ago when they shutout N.C. Central 25-0 on Aug. 31, 2003. Ironically, the head coach for the Eagles at the time was Rod Broadway.

- Lewis Kindle completed 10 of 15 passes on Saturday for a 67 percent completion percentage. It was the highest single-game passing percentage for an Aggies quarterback since Adrian Moye completed 69 percent of his passes against S.C. State on Nov. 20, 2004.

- West Virginia State completed just three passes against A&T. It is the fewest passes completed against the Aggies since Fayetteville State completed just two passes on Oct. 12, 1985.

- The Aggies intercepted three passes in a game for the first time since Nov. 21, 2009 when they picked off three S.C. State passes.

### Kindle Fire

North Carolina A&T quarterback Lewis Kindle missed the entire 2010 season with a torn ACL. He returned in 2011 and had one of the best quarterbacking seasons in school history. Kindle threw for 2,020 yards, becoming just the fourth Aggie in school history to throw for more than 2,000 yards in a season. This season, Kindle has a chance to do something not even the great Alan Hooker accomplished. He could become the first quarterback in school history to have consecutive 2,000-yard passing seasons.

### A March Toward History

A two-time All-MEAC selection and the 2011 Co-MEAC Offensive Player of the Year, Mike Mayhew enters today's game 42 yards shy of becoming North Carolina A&T's all-time leading rusher. For his career, Mayhew is averaging 81.1 yards per game and has 11 100-yard rushing games, so it is conceivable he could have the record, which currently belongs to Maurice Hicks at 2,812 yards, by Game 3.

Mayhew jumped to No. 2 on the all-time list on Saturday with 74-yard performance against West Virginia State. He leaped frog Barry Turner and James White to put himself right behind Maurice Hicks on the all-time list.

### Mayhew Breaks Carries Record

Mike Mayhew has carried the ball 588 times during his career and is now the Aggies all-time leader in carries. He broke Stoney Polite's school record for most carries in a career on Sept. 1, 2012 at Coastal Carolina as his 11 carries took him over the top. Mayhew could put the record out of reach with nine more games to play this season. He was only one of 25 backs with at least 150 carries in the FCS. In 2010, Mayhew carried the ball a school record 221 times. The next year, he outdid himself by breaking his own record with 231 rushing attempts. Mayhew has recorded 25 or more rushing attempts eight times in his career. He averages 131.8 yards in those games.

### The Aggies Deeeefense

The Aggies intercepted three passes in a game for the first time since Nov. 21, 2009 when they picked off three S.C. State passes.

A&T held the Yellow Jackets to 41 yards of offense, eight yards shy of the school record of 33 yards set on Oct. 23, 1999 against Howard University.

### Home Sweet Home

A&T has been dominant at home under head coach Rod Broadway. The Aggies are 5-1 at home under Broadway. In those six games, teams are averaging 199.1 yards in total offense and 33.1 yards on the ground.

The Aggies have won their last five home games by an average of 31 points. The Aggies' longest home winning streak is 11 games starting on Sept. 28, 1995 and lasting until Sept. 26, 1987.

### Shutout Time

North Carolina A&T's shutout was of West Virginia State on Saturday was its first in nine years. It also marked the seventh time the Aggies have shutout an opponent at Aggie Stadium.

But considerable time elapsed between shutout No. 6 and 7. The last time the Aggies shutout an opponent at home was on Sept. 30, 2000 when they defeated Norfolk State 16-0.

### MEAC Preseason Accolades

Proof that the North Carolina A&T football program is starting grow can be shown through the numerous preseason accolades they have received. As expected, senior running back Mike Mayhew has gained the most attention. Mayhew was named the preseason MEAC Offensive Player of the Year in July at the MEAC Preseason Luncheon.

Mayhew's preseason recognition came on the heels of him being named the conference's Co-Offensive Player of the Year at the end of the 2011 season. Mayhew, who is going after his third first-team all-conference recognition, was also named to the preseason All-MEAC team.

Joining Mayhew on the first team were three defensive player in junior linebacker D'Vonte Grant, senior defensive end Tony Mashburn and junior safety Travis Crosby. On the second team, there was one offensive and one defensive player. Right guard Nathan Isles and defensive tackle Brandon Young also earned recognition.

### Other Preseason Honors

Mike Mayhew earned two additional preseason honors. Phil Steele's Magazine named him to its preseason All-MEAC team along with Tony Mashburn. Mashburn led all A&T defensive linemen in tackles and he ranked 11th in the conference in sacks with 5.5.

Mayhew also earned Boxtorow preseason All-American honors. The Boxtorow radio show is aired throughout the country, and the Boxtorow brand provides relentless coverage to HBCU football.

### He's Back

Junior defensive back D'Vonte Graham had a superb 2010 season. He led the MEAC in interceptions before having to sit out for personal reasons. Graham defended 15 passes and intercepted seven two seasons ago. His return his vital because the Aggies loss 2011 All-MEAC cornerback Justin Ferrell to graduation. Graham starts opposite University of Colorado transfer Ayodeji Olatoye at the cornerback position. The formidable duo should cause problems for teams.

### Hitman Crosby

Big things are expected from junior strong safety Travis Crosby. He was picked as a preseason All-MEAC performer and currently leads the Aggies in tackles. Crosby is also fierce in the classroom with a 3.4 GPA in criminal justice.

Crosby says he is grateful for his scholarship because many of the friends he grew up with in Charlotte didn't always make the right choices.

He decided he wanted something more out of life than just hanging out and getting in trouble so he used his athletic abilities to become a scholar student-athlete. He's glad he made the decision he made because some of his friends did not have good outcomes.

### At Home On Broadway

North Carolina A&T head coach Rod Broadway is tough to beat when he plays at home. In four years at N.C. Central, Broadway was 18-5 at O'Kelly-Riddick Stadium. He was even better at Grambling, where he went 15-0 at Grambling's Eddie Robinson Stadium. A year ago, Broadway went 4-1 at Aggie Stadium to give him a 37-6 all-time record when he plays at home as a head coach.

### Noting Virginia University of Lynchburg

- The Dragons had their game against College of Faith cancelled last week. Two weeks ago they were 57-6 losers to Ohio Dominican.
- The Dragons do have an outstanding receiver in DaRay Crawford. Crawford made three catches for 43 yards against Ohio Dominican. Last season against the Aggies, he caught a touchdown pass on three receptions for 17 yards.
- Derron Hall made seven tackles against Ohio Dominican, he had two last season against the Aggies.
- The Aggies held the Dragons to just 80 yards of offense and minus-16 yards rushing. The rushing number set an A&T team record for fewest yards allowed rushing.
- The Aggies will be going for their sixth straight win at home on Saturday. The last time the Aggies came away with six straight home wins was during the 2000 and 2001 seasons.

### Seven Home Games of Fun

For the second time since Aggie Stadium opened in 1981, North Carolina A&T will play seven home games. In fact, the last time the Aggies played seven home games at Aggie Stadium was in 1981 when the Aggies first opened the facility. This season, it could be said that there is another reason why the Aggies have seven home games.

On Sept. 8, the Aggies introduced a new skybox that features a press level, a chancellor level and a terrace level. Within those levels, there are four leased luxury suites, a chancellor suite and a TV/media room. The last time the Aggies played seven games at home, they went 2-5.

### Touchback Zach

North Carolina A&T freshman Zach Cimaglia has already made an impression on the program. The kicker out of Charlotte has made 2 of 3 field goals on the season and is 11-for-11 in extra points. He has also provided the Aggies with excellent field position over the first two games.

He has already recorded four touchbacks on kickoffs this season. In comparison, the Aggies have recorded just 19 touchbacks since 2000. Cimaglia is on pace to surpass that total this season.

### TV Time

ESPNU has not been kind to A&T thus far. The Aggies have not fared well on the network since it started broadcasting MEAC games back in 2005. The Aggies are 0-5 on the network, including three losses to Bethune-Cookman.

The Aggies average margin of defeat on the "U" is 39.4 points. A&T hopes to reverse that trend on Sept. 27 when it takes on Morgan State live from Aggie Stadium on ESPNU at 7:30 p.m.

### Out For The Season

During the first game of the season, North Carolina A&T right guard Timothy Sunkins endured a season-ending injury in the final minutes of the Aggies football game against Coastal Carolina on Sept. 1.

Sunkins was a key member of the Aggies offensive line. After missing last season, expectations were high for the Washington, D.C., native. The Aggies will get veteran lineman Thomas Hearn back, which will help with depth.

### Night, Night

The Aggies will have to get used to playing under the lights this season. Their first five games will end up being under the lights. The Aggies open at Coastal Carolina at 6 p.m., before playing consecutive home games at 6 p.m., at Aggie Stadium. The Aggies then face Morgan State at Aggie Stadium at 7:30 p.m. The game will be televised live on ESPNU. The Aggies travel to Daytona Beach, Fla., to face Bethune-Cookman at 4 p.m. Lights will likely have to be used.

The North Carolina A&T football team had four players earn a spot on the MEAC's All-Academic team. Defensive back Travis Crosby, a criminal justice major, currently has a 3.4 grade point average. Tackle William Ray Robinson is a journalism and mass communications major. He is a sophomore on the field and has a GPA better than 3.0. Fullback Devin Moore, who is also a criminal justice major, also made the list. Wide receiver Julian Alford, who graduated in 2011, rounded out the foursome. Crosby, Robinson and Moore are starters.

### Who Is The Future At Quarterback?

Head coach Rod Broadway and his staff added three new quarterbacks during the offseason to help Lewis Kindle, whose only backup last season was Ricky Lewis.

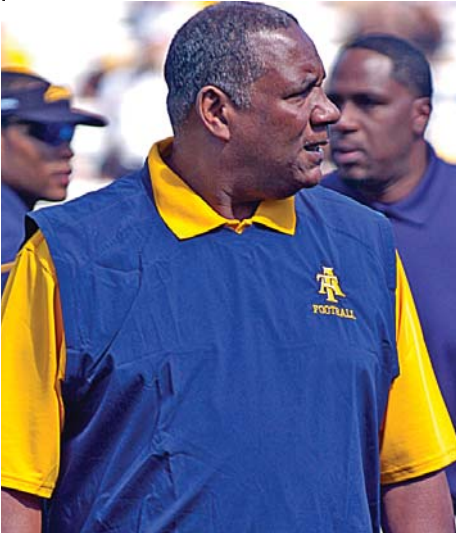

Rod Broadway enters his second season as the head football coach at North Carolina A&T. His first season at the helm produced a lot of excitement about the future of Aggie football.

The Aggies not only had a four-win improvement from their 1-10 season in 2010, but they were also in the thick of the MEAC race midway through the season before a four-game road trip derailed their chances. Also in his first year, Broadway became the first Aggie head coach in school history to produce a 2,000-yard passer, a 1,000-yard rusher and a 1,000-yard receiver.

Mike Mayhew, the Aggies' 1,000-yard back in 2011, was named MEAC Co-Offensive Player of the Year. Wallace Miles, the 1,000-yard receiver, signed an NFL free agent contract with the Detroit Lions. Defensively, linebacker D'Vonte Grant became a Jerry Rice Finalist for best freshman in the Division I Football Championship Subdivision after he led the Aggies in tackles. As a team, the Aggies showed their most significant improvement on the defensive end. They were ranked 114th in FCS rushing defense in 2010. In 2011 under Broadway, they finished seventh nationally and were tops in the MEAC. In 2010, A&T was 89th in FCS total defense. A year later under Broadway, they were eighth.

Broadway came to A&T with an impressive his-



story of winning championships with a brand of football that is exciting offensively and punishing defensively. In his last two head coaching positions - N.C. Central and Grambling State - each school came away with a Black College National Championship.

Broadway has compiled a 73-29 (.716) record over nine years as a head coach. Before taking over the difficult task of rebuilding an Aggies program with just 14 wins in the previous seven seasons before his arrival, Broadway spent four seasons (2007-10) at Grambling State. The Tigers went 35-12 under his stewardship.

The year before he arrived at GSU, the Tigers went 3-8. During his first season there in 2008, the Tigers finished second in the Southwestern Athletic Conference and made an appearance in the SWAC Championship Game. Five players received either All-American or All-SWAC honors, and Broadway was a finalist for the nationally-recognized Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

The impact of Broadway's arrival was seen on both sides of the football. Grambling went from an average defense to one of the fiercest in the country. The Tigers ranked 12th nationally in total defense, eighth in rushing defense and 11th in scoring defense.

Grambling held three of their opponents to fewer than 30 yards, and 10 of their opponents committed three or more turnovers. Offensively, wide receiver Clyde Edwards earned FCS Fabulous 50 All-American honors and running back Frank Warren was named SWAC Freshman of the Year.

Year two led to even more improvements for the GSU program. The Tigers ascended to

the top of the SWAC with a 9-0 record and a 41-9 win over Jackson State in the SWAC Championship Game. GSU's 2008 season also produced an 11-2 overall mark, a No. 24 national ranking in the Sports Network Division I-FCS poll and a Black College National Championship.

Defense was the catalyst for the Tigers' success as they finished the season ranked No. 1 nationally in turnover margin, pass efficiency defense and had a No. 7 ranking in rush defense. In addition, three players earned All-American honors, nine were named All-SWAC and five players earned Louisiana Sports Writers Association recognition. Accolades for Broadway included being named SWAC Coach of the Year and The Pigskin Club of Washington, D.C., Coach of the Year.

In 2009, GSU continued to play well. The Tigers finished 7-4 overall and 5-2 in the SWAC. The Tigers led the nation in punt return yardage and they had the ninth-best scoring offense. The next season resulted in a 9-2 mark that was complemented by an 8-1 SWAC record. The Tigers' rushing attack produced more than 200 yards per game, which ranked 15th nationally.

During his career at GSU, Broadway also

During his career at GSU, Broadway also showed he had a hankering for winning rivalry games. He went 3-1 against archrival Southern.

At Florida, he served as a member of the Steve Spurrier's staff. In 1996, he helped the Gators win an NCAA National Championship.

Broadway's stay also included four SEC Championships and six bowl appearances. The Gators defense led the SEC in sacks four straight seasons (1996-99), and the team set a school record for fewest rushing yards allowed, as offenses produced just 70.7 yards per game.

A 1977 graduate of UNC, Broadway played on the Tar Heels defensive line from 1974-77. He earned the team's Outstanding Freshman award in 1974 as helped the Tar Heels earn a Sun Bowl berth. In 1977, he earned All-ACC honors along with the team's Most Outstanding Senior honor.

He also owns the best winning percentage in program history, even better than legendary GSU head coach Eddie Robinson. Before his stint at GSU, Broadway turned N.C. Central into a Division II national power.

His four-year stint (2003-06) at N.C. Central produced a 33-11 record, back-to-back CIAA titles for the first time in 50 years and the Eagles made two consecutive appearances in the NCAA Division II Playoffs. The 2006 season was the highlight of Broadway's tenure at NCCU.

Broadway led the Eagles to an 11-1 season and the top seed in the NCAA Division II Southeast Region. After fielding the No. 1 rated offense in the CIAA and the 15th ranked defense nationally, individual honors included two players being named Associated Press Little All-Americans.

There were also 12 players named All-CIAA, 10 Eagles earned Daktronics All-Southeast Region recognition and four members from the 2006 team were named SBN All-Americans, including freshman quarterback Stadford Brown, who was also named SBN Player of the Year. During his stint at NCCU, Broadway also put together a 16-game regular-season winning streak and led the Eagles to their first-ever victory over a SWAC opponent with a win over Southern in 2006.

Broadway began his collegiate coaching career at East Carolina University in 1979. His other coaching positions included stays at Duke University (1981-94), the University
