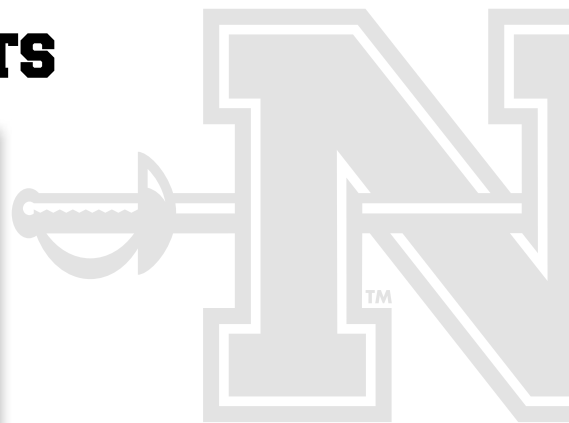

2015 OUTLOOK

STORYLINES

Nicholls will begin a new era under **TIM REBOWE**, who officially became the Colonels' 10th head coach in program history on Nov. 21, 2014. A native of nearby Norco, La., Rebowe came to Nicholls after being an assistant at Louisiana-Lafayette for 11 seasons where he helped lead the Ragin' Cajuns to their current four-game bowl winning-streak. It will mark the second tour at Nicholls for Rebowe as he was an assistant coach for the Colonels from 1995-2000.

The Colonels are coming off their second winless campaign in program history. The team went 0-11 in 1995, but put together one of the best turnarounds in FCS history, going 8-4 in the next season which included an appearance in the FCS Playoffs. Coincidentally, Coach Rebowe was part of the staff in '96 that led the Colonels to the remarkable improvement after going winless in the season prior.

Rebowe will make his head coaching debut at FBS Louisiana-Monroe on Sept. 12. Following his stint at Nicholls, Rebowe served as a cornerbacks coach at ULM from 2001-03. The game against the Warkawks will be the 26th meeting between the two programs, renewing the in-state rivalry for the first time since 2000. ULM has won the last eight against Nicholls, capped by a 27-21 win at home in 2000.

The program will be celebrating its 10-year anniversary of its Southland Conference Championship. In 2005, the Colonels went 5-1 in Southland play which included a win over co-champion Texas State. Nicholls went on to play Furman in the playoffs and was defeated, 14-12.

OFFENSE

The offense returns five starters from last season and seven total when including 2012 starting quarterback **LANDRY KLANN** and 2013 starter **TUSKANI FIGARO**. Preseason First Team All-Southland running back **MICHAEL HENRY** highlights the returnees and is accompanied in the backfield by senior running back **TOBIAS LOFTON** (460 yds rush, 5.4 ypc, 4 TDs).

While the Colonels lose both quarterbacks who logged starts last season, returning to the offense is redshirt junior Tuskani Figaro. Before redshirting last season, Figaro received the majority of the snaps in 2013, going on to pass and rush for over 1,000 yards. Figaro's 1,103 yards rushing yards set the Colonels' single-season mark, and the Lafayette native also matched the team record with five 100-yard rushing games in one season.

For the first time in program history, the Red and Gray will have the luxury of having two 1,000-yard rushers in the same backfield. After Figaro accomplished the feat in 2013, running

back Michael Henry became the third Colonel in program history to surpass 1,000 yards after rushing for 1,005 yards in his junior campaign last season and was named Second Team All-Southland.

The offensive line will be anchored by senior center **BRANDON HOLMES**. Over the course of his career, Holmes, native of Lubbock, Texas, has started nearly 30 games for the Colonels at either guard or center.

DEFENSE

Nicholls enters the season with its third defensive coordinator in as many years. After ranking near the bottom of the FCS in several defensive categories last season, first-year coordinator **TOMMY RYBACKI** will have the task of revamping the defense. Rybacki has familiar ties to the Southland as he comes to Nicholls after coaching one season at Central Arkansas.

The Colonels return five starters from last season's team, including defensive tackle **LAZARUS ONA**, who started all 12 games as a freshman. Three of the starters are linebackers – **GEOFFREY HEBERT**, **RONNIE WALKER** and **KAMERYON BROWN** – and 2013 All-Southland honorable mention safety B.T. Sanders highlights the secondary.

The Colonels return three of their top four tacklers from last season. Linebacker Kameryon Brown is the leading returning tackler with 89 stops in 2014, followed by safety B.T. Sanders (79) and linebacker Ronnie Walker (76). Sanders, a 2013 All-Southland honorable mention recipient, tied defensive back Josh Singleton for the team lead with two interceptions last season, while Walker recorded a team-best five tackles for loss.

SPECIAL TEAMS

The Colonels will need to replace a huge void in their return game with the loss of Keenan Canty, who earned All-Southland honorable mention last season as an all-purpose player. Along with finishing third on the team in receiving, Canty handled all the punt return duties and fielded 55 of the Colonels' 71 kick returns. His highlight of the season came against Lamar where he returned a punt 83 yards for a touchdown en route to being named FCS, Southland and LSWA Special Teams Player of the Week.

Tim Rebowe was named head football coach at Nicholls State University on Nov. 21, 2014.

Rebowe, a 52-year old native of Norco, La., is the 10th head coach in the program's history. Rebowe, who coached at Louisiana-Lafayette as an assistant for 11 seasons and was a former assistant coach at Nicholls for six years, not only brings a wealth of experience coaching at the collegiate level, but has strong ties to the state of Louisiana having coached within the borders his entire career.

Rebowe helped lead the Ragin' Cajun program to four consecutive New Orleans Bowl victories and a conference championship under head coach Mark Hudspeth. During his tenure at ULL, Rebowe has served as the safeties coach (2004-07, 2011-14) and linebackers coach (2008-10).

Last season, ULL's defense ranked first in the Sun Belt in rushing yards allowed and red zone defense, while ranking second in points allowed. The defense finished with seven interceptions on the year, including two by cornerback Corey Trim, who was named All-Sun Belt Second Team Defense.

Under Rebowe's tutelage in 2013, the Cajuns tied for the conference lead with 14 interceptions. Two years prior, his safeties combined for five interceptions, with three returned for touchdowns.

Rebowe's group had a stellar year in his first season as defensive backs coach

Trailing by 10 points at halftime, Nicholls scored two touchdowns in the third quarter to take the lead over Houston Baptist, but the Huskies rallied in front of their home crowd to score 14 unanswered to defeat the Colonels, 31-21.

The outcome was historic for both teams as Nicholls saw its losing streak extend to a program-record 15 games, dropping its record to 0-9 on the year. HBU improved to 2-6 and notched its first Southland victory in team history.

The teams mirrored in other in the statistics, with Nicholls finishing with 373 yards while HBU had 393. The Huskies rushed for 266 yards but needed 66 carries and the Colonels rushed for 187 yards with a 5.5 average per carry.

Michael Henry rushed for 90 yards and two touchdowns for the Colonels, including one on the game's opening drive. Henry's second TD gave Nicholls a 21-17 lead late in the third quarter.

Davin Bovie led Nicholls on defense with 11 tackles while B.T. Sanders added 10.

carried the ball 20 times for a 4.8 yard average while Tobias Lofton had 42 yards on four carries. Hebert, who was sacked four times, completed 16 of 29 pass attempts.

Davin Bovie and Ronnie Walker led the Colonels with 10 tackles each, and Walker added a tackle for loss. Senior Toren Joseph had the Colonels' second interception of the night on UIW's final drive.

Coming off a bye week, Nicholls looked rejuvenated at Northwestern State by scoring a touchdown on their opening drive, but the Demons reeled off five straight touchdowns as the Colonels fell 48-21 at Turpin Stadium.

Michael Henry rushed for a career-high 146 yards on 29 carries and scored the game's first touchdown as he capped the opening drive with a 19-yard TD run.

Beaux Hebert completed 14 of 23 passes for 113 yards and one score, and Kalen Henderson also threw a late 3-yard touchdown pass to tight end Nick Scelfo. Senior Demon Bolt led the team with 33 yards receiving on five catches and his 2-yard touchdown catch in the third ended NSU's run of five consecutive touchdowns.

The Colonel defense had no answer for Demon quarterback Zach Adkins, who threw for five touchdowns and 180 yards on 17 of 20 passes and ran for another. Adkins and the NSU offense tallied 479 yards, with the majority coming on the ground as they finished with 300 yards rushing. The Demons averaged 6.2 yards per carry, led by Daniel Taylor with 80 yards on 11 carries.

The Colonel defense was led by Kameryon Brown with eight tackles, while Lazarus Ona forced a fumble. Cole Frazier picked up the team's second sack of the year.

Michael Henry became the third players in Nicholls football history to rush for 1,000 yards but No. 10 Southeastern Louisiana had no trouble in putting away the Colonels as Nicholls was defeated 62-3 Thursday night at John L. Guidry Stadium.

The loss kept the Colonels winless on the season, dropping their record to 0-12 overall and 0-8 in conference. The Colonels losing streak, dating back to last season, now stands at 18 games.

Henry entered the game with 887 yards rushing and was able to account for 118 yards on 27 carries, giving the Baton Rouge native 1,005 yards for the season. Henry joins teammate Tuskani Figaro, who redshirted in 2014, and Nakia Lumar as the only Colonels to reach the milestone. Figaro set the rushing record in 2013 with 1,103 yards while Lumar rushed for 1,072 in 1996.

Despite Henry's night, Nicholls was held to 279 yards on offense, while Southeastern finished with 633. Senior Kalen Henderson made the start at quarterback for the Colonels, throwing for 57 yards and two interceptions on 8 of 16 passing. Senior Beaux Hebert played in the second half, passing for 100 yards on 4 of 12. Fellow senior Demon Bolt led the receivers with 80 yards on three catches.

Senior Davin Bovie led the Colonel defense with seven tackles, giving him 108 for the season, which is the most since Lee Rogers had 114 in 2000.

THE SOUTHLAND CONFERENCE

Well into its sixth decade of service, the Southland Conference continues to be a model of innovation, stability and consistent achievement as it celebrates the academic and athletic accomplishments of its member institutions and approximately 4,200 student-athletes.

Having commemorated its 50th anniversary in 2013, the Southland Conference has transformed itself into a dynamic and respected consortium of 13 member universities in three states. Beginning with a historic meeting of five institutions in Dallas on March 15, 1963, the Southland Conference set on an extraordinary course that has proven successful well into the 21st Century.

The successful transformation continues, as the Southland Conference welcomed four additional members in 2013: Abilene Christian University, Houston Baptist University, the University of Incarnate Word in San Antonio, and the University of New Orleans.

In addition to its newest members, the Southland also consists of the University of Central Arkansas, Lamar University, McNeese State University, Nicholls State University, Northwestern State University, Sam Houston State University, Southeastern Louisiana University, Stephen F. Austin State University and Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi.

An original Southland member from 1963-73, Abilene Christian rejoined the league as one of the most decorated athletic programs in NCAA history, and the addition of Houston Baptist, UIW and New Orleans gives the Southland a regular competitive presence in the key metropolitan areas of Houston, San Antonio and New Orleans. Southland cities encompass approximately 14 million people, and six of its television markets rank among the top 100 in the U.S.

All told, the membership of the Southland encompasses nearly 140,000 current students and an alumni base of nearly 800,000. Famous alums from current Southland Conference schools include former CBS news anchor Dan Rather (Sam Houston State), NBA executive Joe Dumars (McNeese State), ABC news anchor Robin Roberts (Southeastern Louisiana), Major League Baseball star Wade Miley (Southeastern Louisiana), NBA legend Scottie Pippen (Central Arkansas), and track and field Olympians Kentia Bell (Northwestern State), and Bobby Morrow and Billy Olson (both Abilene Christian).

Other notable alums from current members include Grammy Award-winning musicians Frank Ocean (New Orleans), Don Henley and Rodney Crowell (both Stephen F. Austin), and Ronnie Dunn (Abilene Christian), television personality and actress Ellen DeGeneres (New Orleans), current NFL standouts Lardarius Webb (Nicholls State), Terrence McGee (Northwestern State), and Daniel Manning (Abilene Christian), professional golfers Shawn Stefani and Chris Stroud (both Lamar) and Colin Montgomerie (HBU), award-winning filmmaker Richard Linklater (Sam Houston State), American Idol winner Kris Allen (Central Arkansas), NFL Hall of Famer Jackie Harris (Northwestern State), former NFL standouts Bobby Hebert (Northwestern State), Gary Barbaro (Nicholls State), Wilbert Montgomery (Abilene Christian) and Gary Reasons (Northwestern State), former MLB stars Darryl Hamilton (Nicholls State) and Kevin Millar (Lamar), NCAA football coach Charlie Strong (Central Arkansas), actors John Larroquette (New Orleans), Ricardo Chavira

half of the eight-team bracket, with Stephen F. Austin advancing to the national title match.

Continuing its tradition of innovation, the league launched the Southland Conference Television Network in the fall of 2008 and has broadcast more than 160 events. The network has expanded its reach to roughly 13 million households throughout Texas, Louisiana, Arkansas and Oklahoma in recent years, and has also gained national viewership through ESPN3 and Fox College Sports. In its first seven years, the network has received recognition for its work, earning numerous College Sports Media and Telly Awards.

The Southland Conference, in conjunction with the city of Frisco, Texas, and Hunt Sports Group, also serves as the host to the NCAA Division I Football Championship Game in Frisco, which has been home to the conference headquarters since 2006. The game is played at Frisco's Toyota Stadium, and after a successful three-year run, the partnership was rewarded with a three-year renewal to serve as the national championship host

games in 33 years, winning 56 of the contests.

Historically, the Southland's successful football heritage has sustained itself through numerous membership and classification changes. The Southland joined the NCAA College Division in 1964, and was designated as NCAA Division II in 1973 before joining Division I in 1975. The Southland was an NCAA Division I-A league from 1978-81, before joining the ranks of FCS in 1982, its home ever since.

During its tenure as a Division I and I-A conference, the Southland Conference initiated the startup of the Shreveport, La.-based Independence Bowl in 1976. The Southland representative served as the host team of the bowl until 1980, compiling a 2-3 record in those contests.

The Conference can lay claim to five national championships, including College Division championships through former members Arkansas State (1970, UPI) and Louisiana Tech (1972, National Football Foundation). Louisiana Tech also won the first NCAA-sanctioned national title, winning the Division II playoffs in 1973. Tech followed that with the UPI's Division II national championship in 1974. Louisiana-Monroe won the 1987 Division I-AA national championship.

McNeese State, which has made 15 appearances in the NCAA Division I playoffs, played in the 1997 NCAA Championship game, while Sam Houston State has earned eight trips to the football playoffs, most recently advancing to the 2014 national semifinals. Stephen F. Austin played in the 1989 NCAA title contest and has seven total playoff appearances, including 2009, 2010 and 2014. Northwestern State has advanced to the NCAA playoffs six times, Nicholls State has participated three times in postseason, Southeastern Louisiana played in the 2013 and 2014 NCAA Championships, and Central Arkansas made consecutive playoff appearances in 2011 and 2012. On six occasions, the Southland has placed three teams in the NCAA playoffs.

The Southland has produced 177 first-team football All-Americans during its history and in 2010, Stephen F. Austin quarterback Jeremy Moses became the first player in Southland history to receive the Walter Payton Award, which is presented annually to the most outstanding football player at the FCS level.

The Southland is one of five FCS conferences with at least 200



(UIW) and Jesse Borrego (UIW), and the late NFL coaching legend O.A. "Bum" Phillips (Lamar and Stephen F. Austin).

The Southland sponsors 17 full championship sports, all at the NCAA Division I level. The eight men's sports include baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis, and indoor and outdoor track and field. The women compete for nine championships in basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball. The conference earns automatic qualification to NCAA championships in baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis, and volleyball. The Southland Bowling League, an affiliated Conference sport, originated in 2015, and four of its members filled out

site through the 2015 season. Southland Conference football ranks among the best Football Championship Subdivision leagues in the nation, and enjoys an annual expectation of competing for the national championship with multiple teams advancing to the NCAA playoffs each year. In 2014, three Southland teams – Southeastern Louisiana, Sam Houston State and Stephen F. Austin – all qualified for the NCAA Division I Football Championship, and in 2011 and 2012, Sam Houston advanced to the national championship game. Also, in 2002 and 2003, McNeese State finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in the nation, and advanced to the 2002 national championship contest. The conference has been represented in eight national championship games since the league joined the FCS (formerly I-AA) in 1982. All told, Southland teams have played in 115 Division I playoff

selections (208) in the National Football League draft. There have been 28 Southland players taken in the draft since 2000, including Southeastern Louisiana defensive back Robert Alford, who was picked as the first FCS player in the second round of the 2013 draft. There are more than 15 former Southland players on NFL rosters heading into the 2015 season.

Southland Conference alums in the NFL include Cleveland's Josh McCown (Sam Houston State), who has been in the league for the last 12 seasons, and Baltimore's Lardarius Webb, who is currently the second-longest tenured player with six seasons of experience. Other recent NFL additions from the Southland include New England's Kevin Hughes (Southeastern Louisiana) and Dax Swanson (Sam Houston State), Seattle's Jeremy Lane (Northwestern State), Chicago's Malcolm Bronson (McNeese State), Atlanta's Robert Alford (Southeastern Louisiana) and Washington's Chase Dixon (Central Arkansas).

The Southland has seen former Nicholls State players win Super Bowl rings in recent seasons, as former Colonel Antonio Robinson was a member of the Green Bay Packers' Super Bowl XLV champions. And, Nicholls-ex Webb was a member of the Super Bowl XLVII champion Baltimore Ravens.

Among the former NFL stars from the Southland include Fred Dean, who was inducted to the Professional Football Hall of Fame in 2008 to become the first former Southland Conference player to earn induction in Canton. Other great NFL players from the Southland include Super Bowl XXIX quarterback Stan Humphries, Bill Bergey, Mike Barber, Fred Barnett, Bubby Brister, Ray Brown, Roger Carr, Larry Centers, Bruce Collie, Jackie Harris, Buford Jordan, Tim McKyer, Kavika Pittman, Billy Ryckman, Rickey Sanders, Eugene Seale, Rafael Septien, Terrance Shaw, Leonard Smith, Marcus Spears, Pat Tilley and Marvin Upshaw. Both Dean and Smith are recent inductees to the College Football Hall of Fame.

The Southland Conference has also seen its share of great coaches during its history in Maxie Lambright, Ernie Duplechin, Sam Goodwin, Jack Doland, Bennie Ellender, Bobby Keasler, Larry Lacewell, Bill Davidson, Dennis Franchione, Pat Collins, and Ron Randleman.

In addition to football, the Southland Conference can point to a number of accomplishments in all sports.

Men's basketball has experienced a tremendous amount of success

during the Southland's 52 seasons. The league has sent four teams to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen, as well as a squad to the NIT Final Four. Basketball stars Karl Malone, Joe Dumars, Jeff Foster, Dwight "Bo" Lamar, Andrew Toney and Mike Oliver played in the Southland Conference.

In 2013-14, Stephen F. Austin set numerous Southland records, including marks for victories in a season (32) and consecutive wins overall (29 straight) and in Conference play (23 in a row), and playing as a 12th seed, knocked off fifth-seeded Virginia Commonwealth, 77-75, in the NCAA's Second Round. In 2006, Northwestern State, playing as the No. 14 seed in the NCAA tournament, defeated No. 3 seed Iowa, 64-63, in

Gary Blair, Linda Sharp, James Smith and Linda Harper.

Baseball has emerged as a constant Southland Conference strength with the league earning numerous national rankings and NCAA tournament berths. The Southland consistently ranks among the top-10 conferences in the country. In 2011, 50 of the league's 150 non-conference victories came against the Big 12, Conference USA, Sun Belt and SEC. Major leaguers such as Wade Miley, Paul Goldschmidt, Ben Sheets, Micah Hoffpauir, Hunter Pence, David Segui, Brian Lawrence, Ben Broussard, Chuck Finley, Jerald Clark, and Terry Mathews once played in the Southland.

In 2012, Southeastern Louisiana's



first-round action. The league saw a record five men's basketball teams reach the postseason in 2015.

Coaches such as Billy Tubbs, Mike Vining, Scotty Robertson, Jack Martin, Andy Russo, Bob Marlin, Danny Kaspar, Mike McConathy, Bobby Paschal and Pat Foster have led very successful teams in the Southland.

In women's basketball, the Southland also has its share of tradition with former member Louisiana-Monroe advancing to the 1985 NCAA Women's Final Four, and Stephen F. Austin sustaining itself as one of the most successful programs in the history of the sport. In 2014, the Ladyjacks became the fifth program in NCAA Division I history to record more than 950 wins.

In each of the last six seasons, at least three Southland teams reached the postseason, and in 2013, four women's squads earned postseason berths. A Southland team has played in the WNIT 15 times, including each of the last nine years. Women's basketball all-stars have included Eun Jung Lee, Lisa Ingram, Portia Hill, Deneen Parker, Katrina Price, and Joskeen Garner, and coaches such as

Stefan Lopez became the league's second winner of the national Stopper of the Year Award, which is selected by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers. Sam Houston State's Luke Pihoda won the award in 2007. Only the Big 12 has had more players win this award.

The Southland also fares well each year in the Major League Draft, but for the first time in conference history, two Southland players were selected in the first round of the 2013 draft. Stephen F. Austin shortstop Hunter Dozier was picked eighth by the Kansas City Royals making the Southland player and hitter of the year the league's top draft pick in any sport. Later in the first round, the Texas Rangers selected Oral Roberts right-handed pitcher Alex Gonzalez, Southland pitcher of the year, with the 23rd overall pick. The Southland has had eight first-round picks in its history.

In 2014, Lamar mentor Jim Gilligan became the first Southland coach to reach 1,300 career victories, ranking him sixth-best in the NCAA among active Division I coaches and 14th all-time. He leads an impressive list of coaches who have patrolled

Southland Conference dugouts, including Mark Johnson, Mike Bianco, John Cohen, Mitch Gaspard, Smoke Laval, Butch McBroom, Pat Patterson, David Pierce, Tony Robichaux, Dave Van Horn and Jim Wells.

Softball continues to enjoy success on a national level, beating nationally-ranked opponents every year since 1995, including McNeese State's win at No. 1 Arizona State early in the 2012 season. In 2013, the league had six wins against ranked opponents, including wins by McNeese State at No. 7 Alabama and No. 8 Texas A&M. In NCAA tournament competition, the Southland has racked up 15 wins.

The Southland also has a proud history in volleyball with former member Texas-Arlington representing the conference numerous times in the NCAA tournament, including a run to the NCAA Volleyball Final Four in 1989.

Track and field has also served as a proud asset for the Southland Conference as the league has produced numerous national champions and Olympic medalists. The Southland boasts 28 men and four women student-athletes who have won NCAA track and field national championships, including Stephen F. Austin's Demi Payne, who won the 2015 women's pole vault, Northwestern State's Trecey Rew, who won the women's discus in 2011, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi's Shadrack Songok (men's 10,000-meter run) in 2007 and 2008 and McNeese State's Brad Gebauer (men's pole vault) in 2007. The league has also produced U.S. Olympic track and field medalists Earl Bell, Thomas Hill, Al Joyner, Charles Austin, and Liudmila Litvinova, along with other Olympians. With the addition of 10 more All-Americans in 2012, the league continues to find national success in both indoor and outdoor track and field. In the indoor circuit, the Southland boasts 66 unique all-time All-Americans that have won a combined 11 national championships. Likewise, in the outdoor season, the league has seen 158 different All-Americans, including 128 men and 30 women, who have combined to win 21 national championships.

Golf has traditionally been a strong Southland sport as exemplified by Lamar men's golfer Chris Stroud, who finished third individually at the 2003 NCAA National Championship and has 21 top ten PGA finishes since joining pro tour in 2007. Another Lamar alum, Shawn Stefani, had a pair of top seven finishes on the 2013 PGA tour. The league has sent multiple teams into postseason play

on numerous occasions, including in 2012 when three Southland teams – Lamar, Southeastern Louisiana and Texas-Arlington – competed in the NCAA tournament. Additionally, during the past five seasons the Southland has sent 12 golfers to compete as individuals in regional play with five in 2009, three more in 2010, one each in 2011 and 2012 and two in 2013. Lamar won a pair of NCAA Division II national championships in 1967 and 1968.

In 2005, Lamar's Dawie Van Der Walt finished fourth individually and Lamar tied for 12th place at the NCAA Men's Golf Championship, before the Cardinals tied for ninth in 2006 and tied for third in 2007.

In women's tennis, Southeastern Louisiana won 46 consecutive conference matches during a four-year period that began in 2005, while in men's tennis Texas A&M-Corpus Christi has played in the NCAA tournament seven times in the last nine years.

The conference has increased

sponsorship and championship opportunities for female student-athletes in recent years, adding women's golf and soccer as league sports.

In women's soccer, Stephen F. Austin midfielder Kylie Louw became the first player in conference history to earn All-America honors, when she earned third-team mention by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America. A member of the South Africa Olympic team during the 2012 London Olympics, she also garnered first-team Academic All-America Honors from the College Sports Information Directors of America.

Abilene Christian's Brie Buschman was a first-team Academic All-American in 2013, and Stephen F. Austin's Megan Glick earned the same honor in 2014.

In women's golf, the Southland sent two teams to 2012 NCAA regional play for the first time since the league added the sport in 2002. Lamar has a league-best six Southland championships during that span.

The Southland Conference

has repeatedly demonstrated its commitment to the academic and athletic success of its student-athletes. With the F.L. McDonald Postgraduate Scholarship Award, the league annually honors male and female scholar-athletes with a stipend for postgraduate study. The Scholar-Athlete Award is given to each institution's male and female student-athlete with the highest grade-point average. The Steve McCarty Citizenship Award, initiated in 2005-06 and named after the former Stephen F. Austin athletic director, properly recognizes accomplishments off the court for a male and female student-athlete. Also, student-athletes with grade-point averages above 3.0 are honored on the Southland's annual All-Academic teams and Commissioner's Honor Roll. A total of 856 student-athletes appeared on the honor roll following the 2013 spring semester, and total of 1,553 student-athletes earned a spot on the honor roll at the end of the fall and spring semesters during the 2012-13

academic year.

While successful on the fields and courts, the Southland Conference has repeatedly demonstrated its commitment to the academic and athletic success of its student-athletes.

The conference continues to make great strides in the classroom. During the last decade, no other Division I conference has improved its Academic Progress Rate as well as the Southland Conference has. In fact, in 2009-10, the Southland ranked 10th among the 31 Division I leagues in men's basketball APR. The academic progress the league has shown ultimately leads to higher graduation rates for our student-athletes.

In addition to providing expanding opportunities for student-athletes, the Southland Conference and its member institutions are very involved in various community outreach programs. Many of these programs provide positive life skills training such as academics, citizenship and leadership to school-aged students in Southland communities.

Gary Kinchen was faced with building a football program when he was named Nicholls' first head coach in 1971. In the school's first two intercollegiate seasons, his teams posted a 5-17 record.

Under Kinchen, the Colonels won the first two games ever played in Guidry Stadium, then known simply as Colonel Stadium. Nicholls defeated Ouachita Baptist 12-7 in its home opener then a week later defeated Slippery Rock 18-14.

Nicholls finished its first season with a 3-8 record then went 2-9 the following year.

Kinchen assumed the head coaching duties after two years at Rice (1969-70) where he coached both the offensive and defensive lines.

His coaching career began at Glen Oaks High School in Baton Rouge after letting three years as an offensive lineman at Louisiana State (1961-63).

After two seasons as an assistant coach on the Glen Oaks staff, Kinchen was named the head coach. His coaching career also included stops at Southwestern Louisiana (1966) and Tulane (1967-68).

Bill Clements has the distinction of being the first football coach Nicholls hired in 1971.

Clements was the Colonels' defensive coordinator for three seasons, including the school's final year it fielded a club team in 1971. He was named Nicholls' head coach when Gary Kinchen resigned in 1974.

Under Clements, the Colonels won their first

conference championship, capturing the 1975 Gulf South Conference title. That squad posted an 8-2 overall record and was 7-2 in the GSC.

In seven seasons, Clements' teams posted a 36-38-1 record. His 1979 squad went 8-3.

Prior to being a catalyst in building Nicholls' program, Clements was the defensive coordinator for nine years at Holy Cross High School in New Orleans (1962-70). During his tenure at Holy Cross, the Warriors won a state championship, were the state runners-up twice and captured five district titles.

He also coached a year at his alma mater Tulane for a year after graduating in 1960.

Clements was an offensive and defensive lineman at Tulane and was named the Green Wave's team captain in 1959.

Under Sonny Jackson, Nicholls made its first appearance in the Division I-AA Championships.

In his final season as head coach in 1986, the Colonels

posted a 9-2 regular-season record to earn at at-large bid to the championship.

The Colonels defeated Appalachian State 28-26 in the first round before suffering a 55-31 loss to eventual champion Georgia Southern in the quarterfinals.

Nicholls also won the 1984 Gulf Star Conference championship under Jackson.

In seven seasons at Nicholls, Jackson's career record was 39-28-1.

Jackson received his bachelor's degree from Nicholls in 1963 and began his coaching career at Chauvin High School as an assistant. He was the head coach at Chauvin for nine years and was also the head coach at Central High School in Baton Rouge before joining the Northeast Louisiana staff as an assistant in 1979.

Jackson coached two years at NLU before being named the Colonels' head coach.

Under the leadership of football coach and athletic director Phil Greco, Nicholls was extended an invitation to join the Southland Conference in 1990.

The Colonels began playing in the league in 1991 and won its first conference game, a 15-10 victory over defending champion Northeast Louisiana.

In six seasons, Greco's record at Nicholls was 27-37-2. During his tenure, Nicholls played Division I-A opponents for the first time. The Colonels' road schedule during the late 1980s included games at Akron, Louisiana Tech and a 24-21 loss at Southwestern Louisiana in 1989.

Greco came to Nicholls from Tulane where he was an assistant at his alma mater for two years. He coached the Green Wave running backs in 1985 and in 1986, he handled offensive tackles and tight ends.

He also coached three years at Northeast Louisiana (1981-83) and a year at Southern Mississippi (1984).

After graduating from Tulane in 1970, Greco was an assistant and head coach at F.T. Nicholls High School in New Orleans, an assistant at DeLaSalle and Archbishop Shaw and the head coach at East St. John from 1978-80. His 1980 team won the state championship with a 14-0 record.

Rick Rhoades brought to Nicholls a winning track record and the unique "Stack-I" offense.

The Colonels went 1-9-1 the year prior to Rhoades' arrival before going 3-8 his first year.

The Colonels were 5-6 in Rhoades' only other season at Nicholls in 1994.

Nicholls' "Stack-I" offense accounted for 11 school records the first season and the Colonels were ranked ninth in the nation in rushing the second year using the system.

Rhoades' coaching career included three seasons as head coach at Troy State (1985-87). The Trojans won the 1987 NCAA

Division II national championship. He was also a member of Troy State's 1984 national championship team serving as defensive coordinator (1983-84).

Rhoades went on to be head coach at Southern Illinois (1988). He was an assistant coach under Bill Curry at both Alabama (1989) and Kentucky (1990-92).

Rhoades graduated from Central Missouri State in 1970 and his coaching career began at Mountain Brook High School in Birmingham, Ala., which captured the 1976 state championship. He was the offensive coordinator at North Alabama (1981-82) before joining the Troy State staff.

football history. That team finished 8-4 and Barbier was rewarded with several coaching awards including Southland Football League, Louisiana Sports Writers Association, Schutt Sports/American Football Quarterly I-AA and the 10th Annual Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year awards.

Barbier, 1982 graduate of Nicholls and former second baseman for the Colonels, led the school for four years compiling a 17-28 overall mark.

Prior to Nicholls, Barbier was the head coach at Hahnville High School for six seasons compiling a 64-12 mark (.842). His last season in 1994, Barbier led the Tigers to a 15-0 record and his second 5A state championships. Under his tutelage, the school also notched four straight district titles.

only winning six games. However, in his fourth season the Colonels finished 7-4, the fifth best in school history, broke several records and finished ranked No. 1 in Division I-AA in rushing in the process.

During his five-year tenure as head coach, Daye compiled a 17-38 overall mark and an

8-24 overall Southland Conference record.

Daye's coaching career included three years as a student assistant and a graduate assistant at LSU (1986-88), two seasons as a graduate assistant at Southern Mississippi (1989-90) and eight seasons at Liberty (1991-98), where he was co-defensive coordinator for the final three seasons.

A long time offensive coordinator in the college ranks, Charlie Stubbs became the ninth head coach in Colonel football history on Jan. 5, 2010.

Stubbs joined the Colonels after holding the title of offensive coordinator at numerous universities including Alabama, Tulsa, Oregon State, Louisville and others.

In his first season, Stubbs guided Nicholls to four victories, including all three rivalry games. The Colonels knocked off Texas State in four overtimes in the "Battle of the Paddle" before closing out the season with wins against Northwestern State and Southeastern Louisiana.

In 2013, the Colonels matched Stubbs inaugural season with four wins, highlighted by the Colonels' third-ever win over an FBS team in their four-point victory at Western Michigan. Stubbs resigned due to health issues after three games in 2014, finishing with a career record of 10-38 and 4-24 in the Southland in four-plus seasons as head coach. Steve Axman took over as interim head coach for the remaining nine games.

Nicholls survived a fourth-quarter rally to defeat Appalachian State 28-26 and advance to the quarterfinals of the 1986 NCAA Division I-AA Championship.

Mountaineer place kicker Bjorn Nittmo missed a 42-yard field goal with 13 seconds remaining as the Colonels held on for the win.

Nicholls led 28-19 with 3:24 remaining when Jimbo Windham kicked a 40-yard field goal. The Colonels had driven from their own 25 to the Appalachian State 23 before settling for three points.

The Mountaineers got right back into the hunt on their next possession when Todd Payton hooked up with Doug Beaty for a 76-yard pass down to the Colonel four. Two plays later, John Settle scored on a five-yard touchdown run.

Nittmo's point-after made it 28-26 with 2:13 left to play.

An unsuccessful ASU on-side kick led to the Colonels taking possession at the Mountaineer 43.

After a couple runs by Brian Stropolo, Doug Hudson's third-down pass was picked off by Mountaineer linebacker Cedric Felton at ASU's 42.

Appalachian State moved the ball to the Colonel 25 before Nittmo's kick went wide left. It was the kicker's second miss of the day.

Nicholls found a way to win despite giving up 544 yards of total offense. Settle set Division I-AA playoff records with 37 carries for 236 yards, including 151 in the second half.

Kevin Smoot, who lead the Colonels with 21 carries for 57 yards, had a one-yard touchdown run in the third quarter. After a 21-yard run by Hudson, Melvin Lewis broke off the right side for a touchdown run to give the Colonels a 25-13 lead at the beginning of the fourth period to cap a string of 19 unanswered points for Nicholls.

Quarterback Tracy Ham rambled for 191 yards, including a 55-yard run for the first of three Eagle touchdowns in the first quarter as Georgia Southern defeated Nicholls 55-31.

The win was the Eagles' second playoff victory en route to the school's second straight national championship in 1986.

Nicholls turned the ball over on their first three possessions of the game and Georgia Southern turned the trio of miscues into 21 points. In addition to Ham's first-quarter touchdown run on a fourth-and-one play, Gerald Harris had scoring runs of four and one yard.

The Colonels had a total of seven turnovers with five leading to Georgia Southern scores.

In addition to a pair of touchdown runs, Ham completed 11 of 19 passes for 167 yards.

The Colonels stuck with their game plan as Doug Hudson engineered a six-play, 74-yard scoring drive early in the second quarter. Following a 42-yard pass from Hudson to Alfred Dorsey, Brian Stropolo scored on a 10-yard touchdown run.

Hudson completed 18 of 28 passes for 298 yards but also threw three interceptions during the day.

Montana sophomore quarterback Brian Ah Yat passed for 363 yards and three touchdowns as the Grizzlies defeated Nicholls 48-3 in the first round of the 1996 Division I-AA playoffs.

It was Nicholls' first appearance in the I-AA playoffs since 1986. Montana, the defending national champions, took its first step back to advancing back to the national championship game with the win over the Colonels.

The Colonels knew all about the Grizzlies' high-flying aerial attack but it was the Griz defense which shutdown Nicholls like a Montana blizzard closes down Interstate 90. The Colonels managed just 129 yards of total offense in the game, 64 rushing and 65 passing.

Nicholls' lone score was set up by a 33-yard interception return by Ricky Wilson down to the Montana 9. Adam Diel kicked a 42-yard field goal with 14 seconds left in the first quarter to cut the Grizzlies' lead to 10-3.

Montana scored on consecutive drives in the second quarter to take a 24-3 lead at the half. The Griz had 317 yards of total offense by the end of the first quarter to the Colonels' 32. Montana finished with 545 yards of total offense, including 447 passing.

Nicholls scored the first points of the game. After Furman's Jerome Felton fumbled at the Paladins' 34-yard line, Naton Stewart returned the ball 11 yards. After gaining six yards, Alex Romero kicked a 34-yard field goal with 11:21 left in the first quarter to give the Colonels an early 3-0 lead.

After threatening on several occasions, Nicholls quarterback Yale Vannoy threw a 40-yard pass to Michael Okoronkwo to help setup a 11-yard DeMarko Hutchinson scamper that put Nicholls inside the Paladins 10-yard line. Like it did most of the day, Furman's defense stepped up and forced a field goal attempt. Romero got the call and converted on a 20-yard try to give the Colonels a 6-0 lead with 11:21 remaining in the half.

After exchanging possession, the Paladins gained momentum following two rushes for 30 yards by Cedrick Gipson and an Ingle Martin 17-yard dash that put Furman on the Colonels 33-yard line. Two plays later, Martin hit Justin Stepp for a 29-yard completion in the endzone to give the Paladins a 7-6 lead heading into the locker room.

Furman carried the momentum gained from their last scoring drive into the third quarter. In a drive that saw the Paladins keeping the ball on the ground for all but five yards, Furman drove 57 yards in 15 plays, capped by a one-yard run by Martin to extend their lead to 14-6 with 8:06 remaining in the third quarter.

Determined not to let their championship season end, the Colonels answered with a score of their own. Facing third-and-9 from their 21-yard line, the Paladins Andrew Thacker was called for pass interference, giving Nicholls first-and-10 from their 36-yard line. Following a series of rushes by a trio of Colonels, Vannoy completed a 22-yard pass to Kenly Horton on fourth-and-3 for a Nicholls touchdown with 2:02 remaining in the third quarter. However, the Colonels' two-point attempt failed, giving Furman a two-point advantage at 14-12.

The Colonels were led by senior quarterback Vannoy, who finished the game with 13 carries for 46 yards. He also went 3-for-8 passing for 72 yards and a touchdown. Joseph Tobias averaged 4.5 yards per carry, with 90 yards on 20 attempts.

Toney Edison led Nicholls on the defensive side of the ball with nine tackles, one tackle for a loss, one fumble recovery and one blocked field goal.

HISTORY

In 1956, the Louisiana Legislature separated Nicholls from LSU, and the former junior college became Francis T. Nicholls State College. In 1970, its name changed to Nicholls State University.

The university is named in honor of Francis Redding Tillou Nicholls, a native of Donaldsonville, Louisiana. A West Point graduate and lawyer, Nicholls was a brigadier general in the Civil War, a two-time Louisiana governor and chief justice to the Louisiana Supreme Court. He retired to his Thibodaux home in 1911 and died in 1912.

He taught leadership as an assistant professor at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point and served as a professor of military science and director of the Army Officer Education Program at Vanderbilt University. Murphy continued to build his career in higher education by holding various leadership positions including founding dean of the School of Business at Point Park University in Pittsburgh and founding director of the organizational leadership graduate program and chair of the Walker School of Business at Mercyhurst College in Pennsylvania. Most recently, Murphy was the vice president for academic affairs at Air University in Alabama for eight years before beginning his presidency at Nicholls.

Dr. Bruce T. Murphy became the fifth president of Nicholls State University in January 2014. She was the first woman ever selected to the U.S. Modern Pentathlon Team in 1975 and led the U.S. delegation as the chef de mission for the 2004 Paralympic Games in Athens, Greece.

Improved facilities and added pride are not the only areas where Bernardi has brought about changes to the athletic program. Improving graduation rates and upgrading the academic services provided to athletes has been a goal of the department since Bernardi took over. The commitment to academics has begun to show positive results in the form of higher graduation rates and improved APR (Academic Progress Rates) scores as Colonel athletes are graduating at higher rates than ever before.

Among Louisiana's 11 public universities with Division I athletics, Nicholls had the fourth highest overall graduation success rate in 2013. The graduation success rate report showed that 73 percent of Nicholls student athletes who began college in 2006 earned their degrees within six years, which was an all-time high for Nicholls and a five-point increase over the previous year's rate. Nicholls also ranks fourth overall among 14 Southland Conference universities and ranked first among Southland Conference schools in Louisiana. For women's athletics, the Colonels graduated at an 82 percent clip, which was second-best in the conference. The women's tennis team led the way, graduating 100 percent of its student-athletes.

In addition to his improvements to Nicholls, Bernardi is credited with bringing the Manning Passing Academy to Thibodaux. The football camp, which features Archie, Peyton and Eli Manning,

has brought national attention to the local community. The nationally recognized football camp, which finished its seventh year on the Nicholls State University campus, brings over 1000 young athletes to Nicholls. MPA has become a summer attraction for the locals and provides a substantial economic impact on the region.

Bernardi has been active within the NCAA governance structure having served on numerous NCAA committees. Most recently Bernardi was appointed to the NCAA Division I Council representing the Southland Conference on the 40-member committee that serves as the managing body for NCAA Division I. In addition, Bernardi has served on the Division I Football Championship Committee, the NCAA Division I Committee on Athletics Certification, and the NCAA Division I Football Issues Committee, as well as the NCAA Interpretations Committee and the Division I Leadership Council.

Born and raised in Los Angeles, Calif., Bernardi earned a master's degree in higher education from Oregon State University and an undergraduate degree in public health from California State University, Northridge.

Rob and Linda Bernardi are the parents of two daughters Nadine (Hebert) and Jenna, and grand parents to Emma Hebert. His brother, Gary, is also involved in collegiate athletics serving as an assistant football coach at the University of Colorado.

Rob Bernardi is in his fifteenth year as director of athletics at Nicholls State University, making him the second-longest tenured athletics director in the school's history behind the legendary Ray Didier. Stability, creativity, integrity and progress are the words that best describe Bernardi's tenure at Nicholls.

Since arriving in Thibodaux, Bernardi has reinvigorated Nicholls athletics by transforming the department into a progressive program aimed at increasing funding, improving facilities and enhancing the student-athlete experience. The California native's energy has worn off on coaches, student-athletes and members of the support staff. For his most recent efforts, the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) named Bernardi 2013 Under Armour AD of the Year for the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision. In 2014, he was recognized by the Allstate Sugar Bowl/New Orleans Hall of Fame for his efforts at Nicholls.

Bernardi helped orchestrate the renewal of a self-assessed student fee to help support Colonel athletics, marking the first time in more than two decades that athletics at Nicholls received funding directly from student fees. Not only did he help implement the fee, but he has created enough support to have two additional fees pass, generating a total of over two million dollars. The added funding in conjunction with increased private support has helped rejuvenate athletic facilities and restore a sense of pride in Colonel athletics.

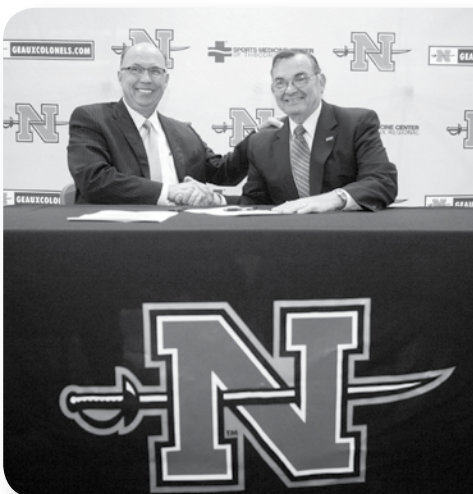

Thibodaux Regional Medical Center, a 180-bed acute care facility, is nationally recognized for providing quality care and outstanding service. In addition to providing inpatient and outpatient care, medical center services offered include heart surgery, medical and radiation oncology, neurology, neurosurgery, orthopedic surgery, sports medicine, pulmonology, rheumatology, women's services, and inpatient and outpatient physical rehabilitation services.

Thibodaux Regional's Sports Medicine Center is the Bayou Region's first comprehensive sports medicine program and utilizes a team of certified athletic trainers, fellowship-trained sports medicine physicians and orthopedic sports medicine trained physical therapists, to effectively manage injuries and safely return athletes to the game. The center also offers injury prevention programs to assist athletes and coaches with the latest tools and techniques to improve athletic conditioning and performance.

JOHN L. GUIDRY STADIUM

John L. Guidry Stadium has been home to the Colonels football team since the school began playing the sport on the intercollegiate level in 1972. The facility is named in honor of former Galliano state representative John L. Guidry who was instrumental in the establishment of Francis T. Nicholls Junior College.

The stadium features a three-level press box on the west side. The second level houses an area for game management staff, radio and coaches' booths and a working press area that was established following a renovation project that was completed prior to the 1999 season. The president's suite and a 30-seat club level, which was also part of the 1999 press box renovation, are located on the third level. A photo deck is located on the roof.

Just prior to the start of the 2010 season, a new scoreboard, complete with graphic animation features as well as a new sound system was installed. In 2012, the west entrance of the stadium was given a facelift which included a new elevator shaft with an ever-present illuminated Nicholls "N", a glass-cased elevator and a Hall of Fame decorated lobby area.

Adjacent to the elevator landing at ground level is the Century Club Room. Members use the building as a hospitality area before home games as well as for various university functions throughout the year.

Guidry Stadium is located adjacent to the Frank Barker Athletic Building, which houses the Nicholls football coaches' offices, locker rooms, the athletic training department and athletic staff. The Nicholls strength and conditioning facility is also located directly behind Barker Hall.

The stadium was officially dedicated on September 16, 1972 as Nicholls defeated Ouachita Baptist 12-7.

Hermon Grissom drilled a 37-yard field goal



in the opening period for the first score in the stadium. Chris "Gator" Gardner caught a 27-yard pass from Lonnie Rogers for the first Colonel touchdown in the stadium as Nicholls came from behind to win.

The facility was originally referred to as Colonel Stadium but was renamed in Guidry's honor Sept. 15, 1973.

In 43 seasons, the Colonels have posted a 110-111-3 record in Guidry Stadium.

In 1975, Nicholls captured the Gulf South Conference championship with an 8-2 record, including a 5-0 mark at home. It was the only time Nicholls had gone undefeated at home until 2005 when the Red and Gray went 4-0 at Guidry Stadium en route to claiming their first Southland Conference Championship. The 1996 Colonels capped the program's 25th anniversary season by going 5-1 at home, which is one of seven one-loss home campaigns.

The five largest crowds to see the Colonels play in the stadium have come against intra-state rival Southern University, including a record 14,125 in the first Jaguar-Colonel

game played in the stadium in 1981.

The stadium underwent an unexpected facelift during the 1992 season after suffering \$150,000 worth of damage during Hurricane Andrew.

The concrete facade between the third-floor glass and the roof was ripped away by strong winds during the storm and falling debris destroyed 52 chair back seats. Glass on the south side of the press box on both the second and third levels was also blown out.

Members of the media had a rare opportunity to enjoy the first three home games in an open-air press box while the stadium was in repair.

Guidry Stadium was originally constructed at a cost of nearly \$2 million.

MEDIA INFORMATION

The Office of Sports Information at Nicholls State University is responsible for the day-to-day publicity efforts of 14 Division I sports. The primary function of the Nicholls Sports Information Office is to service and accommodate the media in its coverage of the entire Colonel Athletic department.

The media relations offices, located in the Student Publications and Printing Building, handles a myriad of press services, including, but not limited to, the issuing of credentials, the publication of media guides, game programs and press notes as well as maintaining statistics and upkeep of the website.

Members of the media relations office will assist you with any day-of-game needs, including player and coach information, in-game statistics and post-game notes and quotes. Journalists and media covering Nicholls Athletics benefit from working in a professional and comfortable environment.

Members of the media relations staff are on call, in an effort to enhance the coverage of Nicholls Athletics.

Please adhere to the following guidelines when covering Colonel football during the 2015 season.

DURING THE WEEK

The Nicholls football team practices one either the practice fields across the parking lot from Guidry Stadium, or in the stadium. Practice will generally take place from 2:30 p.m. to 5 p.m. All practices are open to the media and public with the understanding the strategy, formations, plays and personnel adjustments are to remain private.

Interviews with Nicholls State University Head Coach Tim Rebowe and Colonel student-athletes can be conducted either before or after practice. All interviews **MUST** be conducted on the practice field. The Nicholls locker room and training room are **OFF LIMITS** to members of the media at all times.

Telephone interviews with Rebowe and Colonel student-athletes are also available during the week. Please let Director of Media Relations Jamie Bustos know in advance what

players you wish to interview and the appropriate arrangements will be made. Home telephone numbers of players and coaches **WILL NOT** be released to the media. Rebowe will be available for out-of-town radio and newspaper interviews **ONLY** during the Southland Conference weekly teleconference. Rebowe will take part in the Southland Conference Call on Tuesday mornings.

All student-athlete interviews will be scheduled around classes and other academic commitments.

TUESDAY PRESS CONFERENCES

Nicholls head coach Tim Rebowe will be available in his Barker Hall office on Tuesday's at 1 p.m. to meet with the local media. At this time, Rebowe will review the previous week's game and look forward to what lies ahead. At some point during the press conference, an injury report and updated depth chart will be discussed and made available.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Media credentials for Nicholls home games are issued for working media only. Sports editors and sports directors of accredited media outlets should submit requests for credentials on company letterhead. Requests for season passes should be submitted as early as possible. Media covering single games should submit requests by the Wednesday morning prior to the game. No passes will be issued after Thursday afternoon, **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Media who cover Nicholls opponents on a regular basis may request credentials through opponent's sports information offices or through Nicholls. Nicholls follows the guidelines set forth by the NCAA in issuing credentials. In most instances, the Nicholls Office of Sports Information will fill all legitimate requests for credentials.

VISITING RADIO

There are two courtesy phone lines available for the official radio station of Nicholls opponents. Please inform Jamie Bustos at least one week in advance if you are planning to make use of the phone lines.

PHOTO CREDENTIALS

Photo credentials will be issued only to accredited media outlets—newspaper, television stations and other recognized publications. Nicholls follows NCAA rules regarding sideline photographers.

Photographers are not permitted to photograph in the team area, which is located between the 25-yard lines on both sides of the field. All photographers are required to have proper sideline credentials.

MEDIA PARKING

Media parking at John L. Guidry Stadium is available to all credentialed media. Requests for submitting parking passes should be made when submitting press and/or photo credential requests. The media parking area is located on the west side of the stadium and is accessible from Audubon Drive.

MEDIA WILL CALL

The media will call window is located at the northeast ticket office, which is on the left side of the press box entrance when facing the stadium. Please be prepared to present proper identification when picking up credentials. The media will call window will open 90 minutes prior to kickoff.

PRESS BOX & GAMEDAY SERVICES

The elevator landing to the Guidry Stadium Press Box is adjacent to the Colonel Club room on the west side of the stadium.

Home and visiting radio booths, coaches' boxes and the public address announcer as well as the working press area are located on the second level of the Guidry Stadium press box. The photo deck is located on the fourth level.

Approximately 60 minutes prior to kickoff, a pre-game meal will be served to all credentialed media. Beverages and snacks will be available throughout the entire game as well.

In order to effectively maintain a professional environment, cheering **WILL NOT** be tolerated in the press box. If any member is found cheering at any point during the game, they will be asked to leave the press box.

Pre-game packets, including notes, statistics, flip cards and programs, will be made available upon arrival to the press box. During the game, box scores and other statistical reports will be distributed following each quarter and at halftime. Approximately 20 minutes following the conclusion of the game, full stat books will be made available to the media.

In addition, the Guidry Stadium Press Box will remain open for 60 minutes following the conclusion of the game for media to file stories. An ample supply of phone lines and wireless internet are available for the purposes of sending stories.

MEDIA INFORMATION

POST-GAME PROCEDURES

Both the Nicholls locker room and visiting locker room facilities are located in Barker Hall. The visiting locker room is on the west side of Barker Hall and faces Guidry Stadium while the Colonel dressing rooms are located on the east side of Barker Hall. Policies concerning interviews with visiting coaches and student-athletes will be set by sports information representatives of the visiting institution. The Nicholls locker room is **CLOSED** to the media at all times. At home, Nicholls coach Tim Rebowe and selected student-athletes will be made available for interviews following the NCAA-mandated 10-minute cooling off period. The interviews will take place in the Offensive Meeting Room, located in Barker Hall. **ABSOLUTELY NO INTERVIEWS WILL BE CONDUCTED ON THE FIELD.**

A member of the Nicholls sports information staff will take requests for player interviews with five minutes to play in the contest and will escort media members to the interview room following the game. Statistics will be made available to media members in the Offensive Meeting Room.

On the road, Coach Rebowe and selected student-athletes will meet with the media following the NCAA mandated 10-minute cooling off period in a pre-designated area generally just outside the Colonel dressing room. Again, no interviews will be conducted on the playing field. Please direct all requests to Jamie Bustos.

DRIVING DIRECTIONS

FROM NEW ORLEANS' LOUIS ARMSTRONG INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

1. Start: Exiting Airport onto U.S. Hwy. 61.
2. Right on U.S. 61 North for 3.8 miles.
3. Right onto I-310 South (via Mississippi River Bridge) for 8.6 miles.
4. Right on U.S. Hwy. 90 West (via Houma/Raceland) for 14 miles.
5. Highway splits - Right fork onto La. Hwy. 182 for 3.8 miles.
6. Right on La. Hwy. 1 North for 13.6 miles to Acadia Drive (on Nicholls campus).
7. Left on Audubon for 7/10ths of a mile to Guidry Stadium.

FROM LAFAYETTE, LOUISIANA

1. Start: Intersection I-10 and I-49 in Lafayette.
2. Drive U.S. Hwy. 167 south 2.5 miles until U.S. 167 merges with U.S. Hwy. 90.
3. Continue on U.S. 90 East (U.S. 167 turns southwest-Follow U.S. 90 East).
4. Drive U.S. 90 East through Morgan City. In Morgan City, highway signs will indicate route to New Orleans.
5. Continue on U.S. 90 East until the Thibodaux/Houma exit and take a left towards Thibodaux onto Hwy 24.

6. Drive on Hwy. 24 (road turns into Hwy. 20) for 8.7 miles into city of Thibodaux and La. Hwy. 1.
7. Right on La. 1 South and drive 1 mile to Audubon Drive (corner of Nicholls campus).
8. Right on Audubon for 7/10ths of a mile to Guidry Stadium.

FROM BATON ROUGE, LOUISIANA

1. Start: Intersection I-10 and I-110 in Baton Rouge.
2. Drive I-10 East 4.2 miles and take I-10 East (right) to New Orleans at the split with I-12.
3. Drive I-10 East 22.6 miles to Exit 182 (Sunshine Bridge exit) and exit right onto La. Hwy. 22. Drive .6 mile and turn left on La. Hwy. 70.
4. Drive 9.4 miles crossing Sunshine Bridge (50 cent toll) to La. Hwy. 70 split and take left fork to four-way stop.
5. Drive 6.7 miles and to split in La. Hwy. 70. Get in left lane and take left onto Spur 70 for 2.6 miles until it deadends at La. Hwy. 1.
6. Left on La. Hwy. 1 South for 22.0 miles to Acadia Drive (on Nicholls campus).
7. Right on Audubon for 7/10ths of a mile to Guidry Stadium.
