FIRST FIVE

- The No. 12 Nicholls State University football team will play its second consecutive game at home when the Colonels host rival Northwestern State on Saturday, Oct. 12 on Manning Field at John L. Guidry Stadium. The Colonels will aim for their first 3-0 start in the Southland under head coach Tim Rebowe push their home winning streak to eight in a row. The game will air on Cox Sports TV and will be available online outside of CST territory on ESPN+.
- Nicholls is coming off its best showing of the season in its 34-14 win over then-ranked No. 10/11 Central Arkansas in the home debut last weekend. The Colonels pitched another firsthalf shutout on their home turf with a 20-0 lead against the Bears and led 34-7 in the waning seconds. The victory snapped an eight-game losing skid against UCA and was the third win over a ranked team since the beginning of last year. Nicholls has won 12 consecutive regular season games in Thibodaux dating back to the start of 2017 and the only loss at Guidry was the '17 playoff game.
- Northwestern State will be the second straight team Nicholls has faced coming off a bye week. The Demons come to Thibodaux searching for the first win of 2019 after suffering two losses in Southland play - HBU and Southeastern Louisiana, and three nonconference setbacks. Their most impressive showing was at nationally-ranked FBS power LSU in Week 3 where the Demons led 7-3 after the first quarter and trailed just 24-14 at the break.
- · Nicholls and Northwestern State are set for their 47th matchup all-time with the Demons holding a 28-18 advantage. Despite the losing record, Nicholls has cut into the deficit with three consecutive wins over the Demons. After dropping the first matchup in Coach Rebowe's inaugural season, Nicholls won at NSU in '16 (31-14), at home in '17 (14-10), and last year in Natchitoches (28-10). The Colonels have never won four in a row against the Demons in the all-time series
- Although no teams in the Southland Conference have played more than three league games, only two programs have yet to suffer a loss - Sam Houston State (3-0) and Nicholls (2-0). Four SLC teams are currently ranked in both polls, with Nicholls leading the way at No. 12. Last week's opponent, Central Arkansas, dropped to No. 16 while Sam Houston State (24/25) and Southeastern Louisiana (25/23) round out the Southland ranked teams.

A WIN OVER NORTHWESTERN ST. WOULD...

- ... give Nicholls a 3-0 start in the Southland for the first time in school history. (The 2003 team started 3-0 but its wins were forfeited, including a victory over Northwestern St.)
- ... be the fourth straight win in the series against Northwestern State another first.
- ... give the 2016 class its second four-game sweep of a Southland opponent. The seniors went 4-0 against SFA and are 3-0 against Northwestern State, UIW, HBU, and Lamar.
- ... give Nicholls its 13th consecutive regular-season win at home.
- ... improve Rebowe's record to 17-6 in Thibodaux.
- ... give the Colonels their 25th league win under Rebowe and up his record to 22-8 in last four vears in the Southland.

BY THE NUMBERS

With his 57th career touchdown pass in the win against UCA, Chase Fourcade is now just two away from setting a new program career record. Already the all-time leader in passing yards, Fourcade is aiming to break another one of Doug Hudson's records - 58 TD passes.

100

Junior wide receiver Dai'Jean Dixon reached a career milestone as well with his 100th reception in the win over Central Arkansas. Dixon was nearly unstoppable in the first half, racking up a career-high 140 yards on five receptions before the break. Although he did not play after the intermission due to an injury, he secured his second 100-yard game of the season.

110

The 2019 roster consists of 116 players, and 110 are Louisiana natives. When Tim Rebowe was hired after the 2014 season, he wanted to put an emphasis on recruiting locally. Not only are the student-athletes from the Pelican State, but the majority are from a 50-mile radius which includes New Orleans, Baton Rouge, and the River Parishes. The Colonels have had the most Louisianans in Division I football by a wide margin over the past few seasons.

2,000

Dontrell Taylor nearly eclipsed 1,000 rushing yards last season and now has his sights on 2,000 for his career. With 1,909 yards rushing, Taylor needs 91 to become only the eighth Colonel to reach the mark.

10,000

QB Chase Fourcade entered the season ranked 10th in the Southland Conference for career total offense and now is just the seventh player in conference history to reach 10,000 yards for a career. Fourcade needed 220 entering last week's matchup with UCA and eclipsed the mark by halftime with 221 yards passing and 45 yards on the ground.

- · Northwestern State is coming off a bye week and comes to Thibodaux seeking its first win of the season. The Demons are 0-2 in the SLC with losses to HBU and Southeastern Louisiana.
- · NSU is led by quarterback Shelton Eppler. After five games, Eppler ranks 16th in the FCS with 281.8 yards passing per game, and is second in the nation with an average of 30.6 completions.
- · Wide receiver Quan Shorts has a pair of 100yard games this season, including 110 yards and two touchdowns on 11 receptions in the last game against Southeastern Louisiana. Shorts is third in the country with 9.3 receptions per game, and is also 11th with five TD catches
- · Brad Laird is in his second season as head coach of the Demons. Last year, NSU won three of its last four games and finished with a 5-6 overall record to close out his inaugural campaign.

LAST MEETING (10-6-18) NICHOLLS 28 NORTHWESTERN STATE 10

NATCHITOCHES, La. – The No. 12 Nicholls State University football team used a familiar formula - running the ball and a stout performance by the defense - to pick up a 28-10 victory over Northwestern State Saturday night at Turpin Stadium.

The win for the Colonels (4-2, 3-1 SLC) was the third straight on the year, and third consecutive over the rival Demons (2-3, 1-2

SLC). Nicholls had only one three-game winning streak in the series - which came in the team's first three matchups from 1973-75.

Nicholls rushed for 299 yards with a healthy 5.4 yards per carry, and dipped below the 300-mark after kneeling for the victory. Dontrell Taylor recorded his fifth career 100-yard game and first of the season - rushing 11 times for 103 yards. Freshman Julien Gums had 66 yards and the game-clinching touchdown run late in the fourth, while Kendall Bussey added 53 yards and Kyran Irvin totaled 49. Quarterback Chase Fourcade tacked on 30 yards and a touchdown. All five ball carriers had either 10 or 11 carries.

Nursing a 14-10 lead at the break, the defense pitched a shutout in the final two quarters for the second time in three games. In last

week's win over Lamar, the Colonels allowed only a field goal in the second half before a turnover led to a short-field touchdown.

The Colonel defense, which headed into the game ranked fourth in the FCS with 20 sacks, had only one sack, but it was a crucial one. Nicholls led 21-10 for most of the second half after an early 1-yard Bussey touchdown run, but with the Demons driving into Colonel

territory with four minutes to go, Sully Laiche sacked Shelton Eppler and forced a fumble, leading to a recovery by Ronald Ollie.

Nicholls then closed out the game with its freshman back. Fresh off a 152-yard debut last weekend, Gums broke away for a 43-yard run before scoring from 2 yards out via the wildcat formation, Lorran Fonseca's extra point was good to make the final, 28-10.

The Demons accounted for just 62 yards on the ground, and Eppler tossed for 218 yards but had two interceptions. Northwestern

State had chances early with three drives deep in Colonel territory but came away with only three points.

Northwestern State scored on a field goal to start the game but missed on a 40-yarder on the next possession. Despite a Winston Jones' 71-yard punt that was downed at the 1 flipping the field for the Colonels, the NSU defense kept the pressure on with an interception by Hayden Bourgeois at midfield.

Northwestern State moved the ball to the Colonel 3 on the ensuing drive, but Austin Dickerson snatched a pass in the corner of the

end zone to keep the deficit at 3-0 before the end of the quarter.

Fourcade and Damion Jeanpiere, Jr. connected for a 50-yard reception, and Nicholls grabbed a 7-3 lead on a 5-yard touchdown catch by Dai Jean Dixon. The teams traded touchdowns on the next two drives, with the home team taking a 10-7 lead on a 12-yard Stadford Anderson run. Nicholls answered with a 12-play, 87-yard scoring drive, capped on a 3-yard keeper by Fourcade for a 14-10 advantage.

Nicholls received to start the third and Joel Dullary set the tone with a 40-yard return. On the second play of the drive. Taylor reeled off a 36-yard rush and Bussey finished it off for a 21-10 lead.

For the rest of the third, neither team had much success on offense until a late drive by the Demons. But on 4th-and-6 from the Colonel 34, Khristian Mims recorded one of the Colonels' seven pass breakups to end the scoring threat.

Nicholls had two opportunities to add to the lead in the fourth, but Fonseca was short on a 48-yard try and had another blocked.

Evan Veron had another stellar day for the defense. Although the junior did not record a sack, he racked up 3.5 tackles for loss Laryon James led the team with seven tackles, and Ollie added 1.5 tackles for loss. Kevin Johnson had the second pick of the night for the Colonels late in the fourth.

Fourcade finished 8 of 17 passing for 118 yards and was sacked three times. Jeanpiere had 60 yards on two receptions, and Arron McKenney finished with 37 yards on a pair of catches.

THE REAL N-S-U

The rivalry between Nicholls and Northwestern State features a wooden "N-S-U" trophy, which has resided in Thibodaux for the last three seasons. Although the series stretches back to 1973, the trophy was created by the student government leaders and became up for grabs starting in 1993. The series has been back and fourth since the trophy was introduced, with neither team winning more than three consecutive games. The Demons did win six straight on the field from 1997-2002, but their 2000 win was forfeited. The Colonels also had a win erased in 2003.

THE GUIDRY GRIS-GRIS

Along with the Colonels winning 12 consecutive regular season games at home and 12 of its last 13 in Guidry Stadium, Nicholls has jumped out to a hot start in the last five games. The defense has allowed just two touchdowns and 17 total points in the first halves, while the offense has scored 140 points. Including the season opener, the Colonels have posted first-half shutouts in the last three Southland home games.

NO MAS!!

With the win over Central Arkansas, the Colonels have officially put to rest every losing streak against Southland Conference opponents. UCA had won eight straight against Nicholls including wins against head coach Tim Rebowe's squads in 2015 and '16, but after a two-year break, the Colonels' 34-14 win last weekend ended the drought. Last season, Nicholls snapped an 11-game skid against Sam Houston State. The other losing streaks that ended under Coach Rebowe were eight games against Stephen F. Austin (stopped in '16) and McNeese ('17), five games vs. Lamar ('15) and four vs. Southeastern Louisiana ('15).

LAGNIAPPES PART II

IN THE RANKINGS

The Colonels enter the week as the No. 12 team in the nation according to both Top 25 polls. Nicholls reached as high as No. 9 in the coaches poll this season before sliding down after a loss to FBS Texas State. The Colonels were ranked in each poll last season and reached as high as No. 10. Before the 2017 season, Nicholls had not been nationally ranked since 2007.

HOME SWEET HOME

One of the team goals under Tim Rebowe has been to go undefeated at home. The Colonels completed the feat last year in dominating fashion, winning six games in John L. Guidry Stadium for the first time in school history. In the six wins, the Colonels outscored the opposition, 265-99. Nicholls was 5-0 in the regular season at home in 2017 as well, but fell in the playoff game to South Dakota. Overall, the Colonels have won 12 of their last 13 games in Thibodaux.

AIN'T GOT NO HOME

Nicholls spent the first month of the season on the road and with its Week 2 bye, made its home debut in Week 6. The Colonels were one of only three teams in the FCS which hadn't played a home game this season (excluding the Ivy League, which started on Sept. 21). Bethune-Cookman had its home game against Southeastern Louisiana on Sept. 7 canceled due to Hurricane Dorian, and Grambling had three road games and a neutral contest so far. BCU played at home last weekend while Grambling's first game is set for this Saturday.

THE CHASE FILE

Quarterback Chase Fourcade is one of the highest rated recruits to come to Nicholls. He received FBS offers from Arkansas State, ULM, and even turned down a late offer from Maryland to come play for the Colonels.

Fourcade started as a true freshman and led Nicholls to a near upset of No. 9 Georgia in the '16 opener. He has since gone on to become the program's all-time leading passer and is the first Colonel to earn Southland Player of the Year.

Nicholls has posted a 21-8 record in conference during Fourcade's three-plus seasons. In comparison, the program won a total of 14 Southland games from 2006-2014.

He is also chasing program records in touchdowns, needing two TD passes to break the school record and six rushing TDs to set a new mark.

Last weekend, Fourcade surpassed 10,000 yards of total offense for his career, becoming just the seventh player in Southland Conference history to reach the milestone.

Fourcade comes from a football family, with his father, Keith, and uncle, John, both playing at Ole Miss. John was a quarterback for the Rebels and broke Archie Manning's record for career passing yards. He went on to play professionally, including four seasons with the New Orleans Saints. Keith, a linebacker, also spent one season with the Saints.

THE RETURN OF SULLY

A key player missing from the Colonel lineup was defensive tackle Sully Laiche. He missed fall camp with a back injury and sat out the first two games before making his debut in Week 4 at Stephen F. Austin. After playing limited snaps at SFA, Laiche has started the last two games and the defensive numbers have vastly improved. Against Texas State and UCA, the Colonel defense is allowing averages of 341 yards of total offense and 19 points. A Buck Buchanan Watch List recipient, Laiche had a sack in each of the last two games and has 27.5 for his career which is 0.5 behind the FCS active career leader (Cameron Gill, Wagner).

ALL DAI'JEAN

Wideout Dai'Jean Dixon finds himself ranked 11th in the FCS with 96.2 yards receiving per game. Dixon is coming off a career-high 140 yards on five receptions against UCA - all in the first half. Earlier this season, he had a then career-high 126 yards on seven receptions at Prairie View, and totaled 92 yards on five catches at K-State. His two TDs at PVAM tied his career best, and would have had his third TD catch, a 59-yarder, at SFA but it was negated due to a penalty. Dixon also reached a personal milestone by surpassing 100 career receptions in the game against UCA. A junior, Dixon already ranks seventh on the all-time receiving list.

THE 'PITT'MAN IN THE MIDDLE

Senior linebacker Allen Pittman has been a mainstay in the middle of the Colonel defense, earning All-Southland Second Team in all three of his seasons. Pittman was a one-man wrecking crew in 2016 and '17 with 95 and 80 tackles, and had a career-high 19 as a freshman at Central Arkansas. In 2017 at Texas A&M, Pittman racked up a season-high 16 stops. He started his senior season with an 11-tackle game against K-State and followed up with a huge outing against Prairie View, totaling 9 tackles, 1.5 TFLs, one fumble recovery, one forced fumble, and the first sack of the year for the defense which sealed the win on the road. He had another impressive game against UCA with seven tackles, 2 TFL, and a fumble recovery. Pittman leads the team in tackles this year and ranks fifth in the Southland with 8.8 per game.

WHEN FOURCADE SCORES, COLONELS SOAR

Quarterback Chase Fourcade has rushed for 28 touchdowns in his three-plus seasons and has found the end zone in 18 different games. When Chase rushes for a score, Nicholls is 15-3 in those games. Two of the losses came in his freshman season (Sam Houston and SLU), and the last was in the 2018 playoff game at Eastern Washington. Fourcade has rushed for a TD in all three of the Colonels' wins this season.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

Nicholls was the heavy favorite to repeat as Southland Conference champions as the coaches and SIDs of the league gave the Colonels the maximum possible first-place votes with 20. Nicholls also had a league-high 11 players named to the All-Southland preseason teams, including eight on first team. Quarterback Chase Fourcade and defensive lineman Sully Laiche were also named to the player of the year watch lists.

FACILITY UPGRADE

On June 12, Nicholls State University Athletics announced the largest gift in the institution's history will be used to fund the expansion of Barker Hall to include a football operations center at the south end zone of John L. Guidry Stadium. The football program, which shares Barker Hall with baseball and athletics administration, will move into the football operations center, which will include a new locker room, players' lounge, team meeting room with stadium-style seating, training room, equipment room, coaches' and staff offices, position and group meeting rooms, catering kitchen, and showcase lobby. The \$6.5 million project is scheduled to be completed before the 2020 season.

RIG WINS

The Colonels not only have been winning conference games over the last few seasons, but they've been doing so in convincing fashion. In 2018, Nicholls recorded three of the program's five largest margins of victory in Southland competition, including the second biggest - the 44-0 win over Southeastern Louisiana. In 2017, the team's 41-14 win at Lamar also ranks in the top 5. Nicholls was seconds away from a 27-point win against UCA before the Bears scored in the final 10 seconds. LAGNIAPPES PART III

KEEPING IT 100

Since Tim Rebowe took over the program, the Colonels have enjoyed success when a player has reached the century mark in rushing yards. Nicholls has had a 100-yard rusher in 22 games in Rebowe's four-plus seasons and it has resulted in 18 victories. The only loss for the Colonels when two players have rushed for 100 was in 2015 against Northwestern State.

3 TDS FOR GUMS

Sophomore Julien Gums found the end zone three times in the win at Stephen F. Austin, which was his personal best in just 11 career games. Gums rushed for 135 yards on 22 carries for his third career 100-yard effort. The three rushing touchdowns was the first in a single game since 2013 when Marcus Washington crossed the goal line three times against Northwestern State.

COMPLETE 180

The Colonels have had one of the most impressive turnarounds in the FCS over the last few years. From 2011-14, Nicholls won six games, with four being non-Division L and a 0-12 season in '14 capped the tenure Tim Rebowe was introduced as head coach a day after the '14 finale, which was the program's largest margin of defeat in Southland play in team history (59-point deficit). The loss also extended the Colonels' losing streak to 18 games, but Rebowe led his squad to a win over Houston Baptist in Year 1 to end the streak at 23. After guiding the Colonels to a winning conference record in 2016 at 5-4, the first since 2005, Nicholls earned an at-large berth in the 2017 FCS playoffs with an 8-3 campaign. The Colonels finished the regular season in '18 with another 8-3 record, which included a win over Power 5 Kansas and the program's second SLC title.

TAYLOR MADE

Running back Dontrell Taylor came up just short on rushing for 1,000 yards in his junior season despite averaging a team-record 7.2 yards per carry. Taylor also tied the school mark with five 100-yard games in a single season, but could have had an even better year statistically had the Colonels not won handily in several games. Along with missing a game with an injury, Taylor did not play in the fourth quarter when the Colonels blew out the opposition. He closed out his season with 100-yard games in both playoff matchups.

COLONELS VS. THE FBS

Since 2000, the Colonels have a 4-30 record against FBS teams but have been more competitive as of late. Following two blowouts in Coach Rebowe's first season in 2015, the Colonels nearly notched a pair of wins in '16. As a 55-point underdog, Nicholls led at No. 9 Georgia in the third quarter before eventually falling, 26-24. Two weeks later, South Alabama scored in the final minute in regulation to force overtime and after the teams traded touchdowns in the extra period, the Colonels went for the win on a 2-point try but was stopped short on the rush. In 2017, the Colonels tied Texas A&M in the fourth quarter before the Aggies answered with the go-ahead touchdown.

Last season, Nicholls ended its nine-game drought against the FBS with a 26-23 win in overtime at Kansas. The victory was the first for the program against a Power 5 school. The previous wins were against Arkansas State ('01), Rice ('07), and Western Michigan ('13).

THE MANNING CAMP

Over the summer, Nicholls State University hosted the Manning Passing Academy for the 15th consecutive year. The four-day camp, put on by the Manning family - Archie and his sons, Cooper, Eli and Peyton - brought in close to 1,200 high school campers from all over the country. In addition to the Mannings, every year some of the most elite NCAA quarterbacks act as camp counselors. Current NFL starting quarterbacks that were recently counselors include Kirk Cousins, Andy Dalton, Marcus Mariota and Dak Prescott. The Colonels' own Chase Fourcade served as a counselor the past three summers. In the 2018 NFL Draft, all five quarterbacks selected in the first round were Manning Camp alums.

WEBB HANGS UP THE CLEATS

Former Colonel great Lardarius Webb officially retired from the NFL this summer after spending his entire career with the Baltimore Ravens. A first-ballot Nicholls Athletics Hall of Fame inductee, Webb is the last Colonel to be drafted in the NFL as he was picked in the third round (88th) by the Ravens in the 2009 draft. Webb had a storied career at Nicholls, earning All-American honors in both of his seasons as he racked up nearly 40 individual awards in '07 and '08. He went on to help the Ravens to a championship in 2013.

For away games, Nicholls will follow host SID procedures in how they handle post game interviews. With five minutes remaining in the game, Nicholls will poll the media as to who they want to interview after the game. The Nicholls locker room is closed to all media members.

Interviews with Nicholls coaches and Colonel student-athletes can be conducted after practice on TUESDAY AND WEDNESDAY ONLY. All interviews MUST be conducted on the practice field. The Nicholls locker room and training room are OFF LIMITS to members of the media at all times.

Tim Rebowe is in his fifth season as head coach of the Nicholls State University football team. In only four years, Rebowe has revamped a program that had a 23-game losing streak into a top 25 team.

After earning an at-large berth into the playoffs in 2017, the Colonels left no doubt in their postseason fate in '18 after winning the Southland Conference championship and

receiving the league's automatic berth into the playoffs. Nicholls went 7-2 in league play for the second straight season to claim the program's first title since 2005.

The Colonels hosted a first-round playoff game for the second time in as many years, but this time, Nicholls came away victorious with a 49-30 win over San Diego. A loss in the next round to national runner-up Eastern Washington ended the campaign and Nicholls finished with a 9-4 record. The nine wins were the second most in program history.

Another highlight of 2018 was an overtime victory at FBS Kansas in the season opener. After coming up short against FBS programs Georgia, Texas A&M, and South Alabama, Rebowe's Colonels notched the program's first win over a Power 5 opponent with a 26-23 win over the Jayhawks.

The 2018 Colonels featured 15 All-Southland selections, including the program's first Southland Player of the Year - quarterback Chase Fourcade. Rebowe also received recognition for his outstanding work, being named Louisiana Sports Writers Association co-Coach of the Year, which was his second state honor in three years.

Nicholls not only ranked among the best in the Southland in offense and defense, but the Colonels also posted impressive numbers in the FCS. The Red and Gray ranked 12th in the nation in rushing offense and total offense, and had the 11th-rated rush defense to go along with ranking 21st in points allowed.

With a season-opening win at Kansas and a victory over preseason favorite Sam Houston State in the opening month, Nicholls maintained its preseason Top 25 ranking and reached as high as No. 10 in the polls. The Colonels were ranked in every poll for the season, finishing at No. 14 in both major polls.

Year 3 of Rebowe's tenure saw the program reach new heights. Nicholls finished the regular season with an 8-3 overall record and an all-time best 7-2 mark in the Southland Conference. The team was ranked for the first time since 2007, and the Colonels hosted an FCS playoff game – a first in program history.

Although the Colonels came up short in their postseason game against South Dakota, they finished ranked in the top 25 in both polls. Along with the rankings and playoff game, highlights for the season included the program's most wins since 1996 and the six-game winning streak was the longest in 31 years.

Rebowe's 2017 campaign did not go unnoticed by the national and local media. He was named a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, which is given to the FCS top head coach, and finished ninth in the voting. He was then recognized as the top coach in the state as the Louisiana Sports Writers Association named him LSWA Coach of the Year.

Rebowe completely changed the culture in his first year, ending a program-record losing streak and led Nicholls to a pair of road victories in Southland play. In 2016, the Colonels recorded their first winning campaign in the SLC since 2005 and finished tied for fourth place. Before Rebowe arrived, Nicholls had finished last in the league for four consecutive seasons.

Despite going 0-2 out of the league in 2016, the Colonels made their presence known early on with impressive showings against FBS opponents. Nicholls shocked the country in the opening weekend by nearly knocking off No. 9 Georgia in a 26-24 decision. Just two weeks later, the Colonels lost a heartbreaker in overtime at South Alabama, 41-40. The Colonels threatened again in '17 to take down an FBS program, Texas A&M, but after tying the game in the fourth quarter Nicholls came up short, 24-14.

Rebowe vowed to build the program by recruiting local talent, and his first three recruiting classes consisted of 58 Louisiana natives out of a total of 64 signees. In his first signing class, Rebowe welcomed 26 student-athletes, all from the Pelican State and the majority coming from within a 100-mile radius of Thibodaux. The 2016 recruiting class was donned by some as the best in the program's history, and several true freshmen made a significant impact in that year's success.

Rebowe, a 56-year old native of Norco, La., was named head football coach on Nov. 21, 2014, becoming the 10th in the program's history. Rebowe, who coached at Louisiana–Lafayette as an assistant for 11 seasons and was a former assistant coach at Nicholls for six years, not only brought a wealth of experience coaching at the collegiate level but has strong ties to the state of Louisiana having coached within the borders his entire career.

Rebowe helped lead the Ragin' Cajun program to four consecutive New Orleans Bowl victories and a conference championship under head coach Mark Hudspeth. During his tenure at ULL, Rebowe served as the safeties coach (2004-07, 2011-14) and linebackers coach (2008-10).

In 2014, ULL's defense ranked first in the Sun Belt in rushing yards allowed and red zone defense, while ranking second in points allowed. The defense finished with seven interceptions on the year, including two by cornerback Corey Trim, who was named All-Sun Belt Second Team Defense. Under Rebowe's tutelage in 2013, the Cajuns tied for the conference lead with 14 interceptions. Two years prior, his safeties combined for five interceptions, with three returned for touchdowns.

Rebowe's group had a stellar year in his first season as defensive backs coach in 2004 as the defense ranked 11th in the nation in passing yards allowed. Both of his starting safeties that year, C.C. Brown and Antwain Spann, would go on to the NFL. The following season, the pass defense finished 23rd in the nation in yards allowed.

As a linebackers coach, Rebowe guided the team's leading tackler in all three seasons and also had two players earn All-Sun Belt recognition.

In 1995, Rebowe took his first collegiate job, joining Darren Barbier's staff at Nicholls. From '95-'99, he served as defensive backs coach and special teams coordinator before coaching the receivers in 2000. Rebowe was part of the biggest turnaround in FCS history as the Colonels went 0-11 in '95 before earning a playoff spot the very next season with an 8-4 mark.

Rebowe began his coaching career in 1988 at his alma mater, Destrehan High School. While there, he coached Super Bowl Champion and NFL Hall of Famer Ed Reed.

Following his stint with Nicholls, Rebowe coached the cornerbacks at ULM from 2001-03.

Rebowe earned his bachelor of science in physical education from LSU in 1987. He is married to the former Kim Robichaux, and they have a daughter, Samantha, and a son, Tyler, who graduated from Nicholls in the spring of 2016.

MANHATTAN, Kan. – The Nicholls State University football team fell behind early in the first half at Kansas State before going on to drop the season opener, 49-14, Saturday night in front of 51,189 fans at Bill Snyder Family Stadium.

Kansas State (1-0) scored touchdowns on its first four possessions to take a 28-0 lead before a spirited opening to the third quarter gave Nicholls (0-1) some life. An impressive 5-play, 75-yard scoring drive, capped on a 26-yard touchdown run by Kendall Bussey, put the Colones on the board and then the Nicholls defense stuffed a 4th-and-1 deep in its own territory on the next possession.

But K-State put to rest any chance of a comeback quickly in the fourth with a long touchdown catch and a fumble returned for a score in a span of three plays, taking a 49-7 advantage. Julien Gums added a late touchdown for the Colonels to make the final.

Kansas State rushed for 361 yards, with 210 coming in the first half. All four first-half touchdowns were on the ground by four different players. Nicholls totaled 276 yards of offense as K-State doubled up the Colonels with 573.

Allen Pittman had a busy day for the Red and Gray defense, finishing with 11 tackles. The three-time All-Southland selection also reached double figures in the Colonels' 2017 Big 12 game at Texas A&M where he had 16 stops. Khristian Mims added nine tackles, while Laryon James and Kevin Moore III had eight each.

On offense, Bussey rushed for 54 yards on seven carries and Dai'Jean Dixon had a solid outing with five receptions for 92 yards. Dixon had a 26-yard catch in the third to set up Bussey's touchdown run. With a 41-yard rush late in the fourth, Gums totaled 54 yards on 12 carries.

Chase Fourcade recovered after throwing an interception on his first pass, finishing with 126 yards on 10 of 18. On special teams, Winston Jones averaged 44.2 yards on four punts with two downed inside the 20. Gunnar Jones made both of his extra points in his debut.

For Kansas State, Skylar Thompson threw for 212 yards on 16 of 22 and 1 touchdown. James Gilbert paced the rushing attack with 115 yards on 18 carries.

9/14 @ PRAIRIE VIEW - W, 42-35

PRAIRIE VIEW, Texas – Trailing 21-6 at the half, the No. 11/12 Nicholls State University football team scored 29 unanswered points in the third quarter and went on to hang on for its first win of the year, taking down Prairie View A&M, 42-35, Saturday night at PVAMU Football Stadium.

Nicholls (1-1) scored touchdowns in all four of its drives in the third, with Chase Fourcade playing a hand in all four. The senior quarterback had two rushing touchdowns and hit Dai'Jean Dixon for a pair of TD catches. The big quarter was fueled by three Prairie View A&M (1-2) turnovers.

The Panthers scored early in the fourth on quarterback Jalen Morton's second rushing touchdown of the night, but Nicholls answered again on a Julien Gums 2-yard rush for a 42-28 advantage. PVAMU brought it back to a one-possession game on a 36-yard catch by Tony Mullins and then forced Nicholls to punt with 2:18 remaining. But on 4th-and-5 for their own 41, Morton was sacked by Allen Pittman and the Colonels kneeled twice to run out the clock.

Pittman and Aquindas Steib led the defense with seven tackles each, and Pittman's game-ender was the Colonels' first sack of the season. He also recovered a fumble in the third to help spark the comeback. Freshman Jarius Monroe and safety Kevin Moore III shined in the secondary with each recording an interception. Monroe's came in the first half in the end zone, while Moore ended the Panthers' second drive in the third with a pick at midfield and returned it inside the 5.

Offensively, Fourcade completed 17 of 22 for 224 yards and added 35 yards on the ground. Dixon was his primary target, registering a career-high 126 yards and two touchdowns on seven receptions - good for his fourth career 100-yard game. Kendall Bussey totaled 86 yards on the ground on 18 carries, and Gums finished with 74 yards on 21.

Things looked promising for the Colonels as they jumped out to a 6-0 lead after their first possession of the game. Dion Ray scored on a 15-yard end around to cap the drive, but not much else went right for the Colonels before the break.

Prairie View took the lead in the second on a 23-yard scamper by Morton, then after Gavin Lasseigne missed a 29-yard field goal for the Red and Gray, the Panthers extended their lead on a Morton-to-Mullins connection. PVAMU added one more score before the half on a 39-yard strike to Kalen Riles.

Nicholls came out of the locker room a different team and

Nicholls came out of the locker room a different team and scored on an 11-play, 93-yard drive. Fourcade kept the ball and rushed from five yards out to trim the deficit to 21-13.

rushed from five yards out to trim the deficit to 21-13.

The first PVAMU turnover in the third was courteey of a Moore forced fumble, which gave Nicholls possession at midfield. Six players later, Fourcade tossed a 14-yard TD pass to Dixon. Bussey then ran up the middle for a two-point conversion try to even the score at 21.

Moore's interception put Nicholls at the 3 and Fourcade scored on third down for a 28-21 advantage. On PVAMU's next possession, Morton fumbled the snap and Pittman was there for the recovery. Fourcade and Dixon wasted no time as the Colonels doubled their lead on a 36-yard pass down the sideline for a touchdown.

Nicholls' fourth-quarter scoring drive chewed up 6:29 off the clock. The Colonels had the ball for nearly 40 minutes, rushing 57 times for 241 yards.

Morton paced the home squad with 327 yards passing, 80 yards rushing and five total touchdowns, but also had the two picks and a lost fumble. Mullins finished with 90 yards on five receptions.

9/21 @ STEPHEN F. AUSTIN - W, 48-30

NACOGDOCHES, Texas – The No. 9/13 Nicholls State University football team scored touchdowns on five of its first six drives and rushed for 291 yards in the game to knock off Stephen F. Austin, 48-30, Saturday night at Homer Bryce Stadium.

With the win, Nicholls improved to 2-1 overall and 1-0 in Southland play. The win was the fourth consecutive in the series against Stephen F. Austin (0-4, 0-1 SLC) and the first road-opening league win since 2010.

Sophomore Julien Gums led the rushing attack with his third career 100-yard game and first for the Colonels this season, totaling 135 yards and a career-high three touchdowns on 22 carries. Chase Fourcade scored twice on the ground, tacking on 59 yards rushing and Jeremy Rounds found the end zone for the first time in 2019, adding 72 yards on nine carries.

Fourcade had another efficient outing in the passing game, completing 14 of 18 for 176 yards and a touchdown. His lone TD pass came early in the second quarter to Stefano Guarisco for 14 yards. Guarisco finished with four catches for 51 yards.

The Colonels only trailed once for the night after SFA scored on the game's opening drive. But the Colonels answered with a 21-yard score by Gums and Guarisco snuck to the corner of the end zone for his TD catch for a 14-7 lead.

Nicholls held the Lumberjacks to pair of Storm Ruiz field goals in the red zone in the second quarter before Rounds ended a 75-yard drive with a 4-yard TD run, making the score 21-13. The teams then traded touchdowns with Trae Self finding Xavier Gipson for a 47-yard touchdown catch, and the Colonels countered with a 9-yard rushing touchdown by Gums.


SFA ended the half with another Ruiz field goal, putting the count at 28-23 Colonels.

Nicholls opened the third with another touchdown drive. Fourcade called his own number and ran untouched for a 19-yard score on a draw.

While the Colonels had trouble slowing down SFA's offense, they delivered three game-changing stops in the second half. The defense pitched another shutout in the third quarter, stopping a 4th-and-short try when Kevin Moore III delivered a big hit on a short completion for a turnover on downs, preserving the 35-23 lead.

In the fourth, Kevin Johnson denied a fake punt pass with a tackle short of the line of gain, and with Nicholls leading 35-30 with 6:21 to go, Allen Pittman, who had eight tackles, stuffed a 4th-and-1 on a Cam Arnold draw up the middle.

The Colonels added a 6-yard rushing TD by Fourcade and following a Laryon James interception, Gums made the finale with his third rushing touchdown.

SAN MARCOS, Texas – After being tied at the break, the No. 9/12 Nicholls State University football team allowed three unanswered touchdowns in the second half against Texas State as the Colonels fell to the Bobcats, 24-3, Saturday night on Jim Wacker Field at Bobcat Stadium.

With the loss, Nicholls slipped to 2-2 on the season and dropped its second contest in a row to the former Southland Conference member. Now playing at the FBS level, Texas State (2-3) won the last meeting in 2011 for a two-game streak in the Battle for the Paddle.

The Colonels were held to a season-low 220 yards on offense with just 75 on the ground. The Red and Gray entered the match-up averaging a Southland-best 223.7 yards rushing. Nicholls also went without finding the end zone for the first time since Game 3 of the Tim Rebowe era, a 48-0 loss at Colorado on Sept. 26, 2015.

Chase Fourcade completed 15 of 27 passes for 145 yards, with Dai'Jean Dixon finishing with five receptions for 54 yards. Defensively, Kevin Moore III totaled a career-high 14 tackles while Sully Laiche recorded his first sack of the season.

Gresch Jensen led the Bobcat offense with 253 yards passing and two touchdowns on 22 of 29 attempts. After the teams were deadlocked at 3-3 at the intermission, Jensen capped a lengthy 14-play, 78-yard drive with a 12-yard strike to Micah Hilts to start the third

Two plays into the Colonels' ensuing possession, Fourcade had his pass intercepted and it led to another Bobcat touchdown. Hilts nearly scored again on a 21-yarder to the Colonel 1, then Jensen finished off the drive on a sneak up the middle.

Nicholls answered with one of its best drives of the night, getting three first downs on two completions to Mason Roberts and Dixon, and the other on a Fourcade scramble. But at the Texas State 20, Fourcade was hit by Nikolas Daniels and the ball popped out, resulting in another turnover for the Bobcats. Daniels paced the Texas State defense with nine tackles and a sack.


The final score of the night was a 77-yard pass to Javen Banks a minute into the fourth.

In the first half, points were at a premium with each team trading field goals. Sully Laiche ended the Bobcats' opening drive with a third-down sack, resulting in a Joshua Rowland 36-yard field goal.

Nicholls' picked up a 4th-and-4 conversion in Texas State territory with a 11-yard catch by Dixon right before the end of the first, then had to settle on a 39-yard field goal by Gunnar Jones. The field goal was the first for the Colonels this season.

The Colonels quickly got the ball back when Kairon Brooks intercepted a pass at midfield, but the offense did not pick up a first down and had to punt. The teams each punted twice more to end the first half.

Texas State finished with 362 yards of offense and had 16 first downs to the Colonels' 12. The Bobcat defense limited Nicholls to 2 of 12 on third down



10/5 VS. NO. 10/11 UCA - W, 34-14

THIBODAUX, La. – Playing for the first time at home this season, the No. 15/16 Nicholls State University football team put on an impressive performance against No. 10/11 Central Arkansas with a 34-14 victory Saturday evening on Manning Field at John L. Guidry Stadium.

With the win, Nicholls (3-2, 2-0 SLC) snapped an eight-game losing streak in the series against Central Arkansas (3-2, 1-1 SLC) in the first meeting between the two schools since 2016. The victory also gave the Colonels their 12th win in their last 13 games at Guidry Stadium.

It was a record day for senior quarterback Chase Fourcade, who picked apart the Bear defense for 327 yards and a touchdown on 24 of 29 passing. Already the program leader in total offense, Fourcade, who added 48 yards on the ground and another score, eclipsed the 10,000-yard mark to become just the seventh player in Southland Conference history to reach the milestone.

Julien Gums rushed for 51 yards and tacked on to his team lead in rushing touchdowns with a pair of scores. After Fourcade scored the game's first touchdown, Gums found the end zone twice in the second quarter from 8 and 36 yards out for a 20-0 lead at the break.

The Colonel defense limited UCA to just 98 yards in the first half and had a pair of key turnovers in the opening 30 minutes. After Fourcade fumbled at the goal line on a 98-yard drive, Nicholls got the ball back three plays later on a forced fumble by Khristian Mims. After Gums' seventh rushing touchdown gave Nicholls a 20-0 advantage, Darren Evans ended UCA's best drive in the half with an interception at the 1-yard line.

Although he did not account for any points in the first half, Dai'Jean Dixon hauled in a career-high 140 yards receiving on five receptions before the intermission. The junior from New Orleans surpassed the 100-catch mark for his career and moved two yards shy of taking over sixth place on the program's all-time receiving list with 1,723 yards.

UCA scored on the opening drive of the third quarter on a Lujuan Winningham 4-yard touchdown grab from Breylin Smith to make it 20-7. But the Colonel defense held the dynamic duo in check for the most part, limiting Winningham to only two receptions for 21 yards. He entered the game averaging 132.5 yards receiving, and Smith ended his day over 100 yards shy of his passing average.

Midway in the third, Fourcade found a wide-open Darrion Cook for a 30-yard catch, and on the next play, hit tight end Jordan Talley on a screen. With blockers ahead of him, Talley went 26 yards into the end zone for his third career TD and a 27-7 lead.


UCA gambled on its next possession, going for a fourthand-1 at midfield. Smith dumped off a pass in the flat to Sam Carmargo, who was immediately met by Khristian Mims with a huge hit short of the line of gain. Mims led the Colonels with nine tackles and added two for loss.

With the short field, the Colonels chewed 4:30 off the clock on nine plays and ended the drive with an 8-yard touchdown run by Kendall Bussey, stretching the lead to 34-7.

Later in the fourth, UCA went for it again deep in Colonel territory before Brandon Fontenot stopped the drive with a sack. But the Bears scored on their final possession of the game on a 44-yard pass from Smith to Kylan Robinson with six seconds remaining.

With the 2018 Seniors on hand to receive their championship rings, the defense looked like last year's edition with nine tackles for loss and four sacks against UCA. Sully Laiche had a sack for the second straight game and totaled three TFLs, while Allen Pittman racked up two stops behind the line including one sack. Laryon James also had a sack for the Red and Gray.
