## FOUR DOWNS

- The Nicholls State University football team wraps up head coach Tommy Rybacki's inaugural season with a trip across the Mississippi for the annual River Bell Classic against Southeastern. The Colonels are looking for their fifth league win and a sweep of the Louisiana Southland programs while the Lions are fighting for a possible playoff spot. Kickoff is scheduled for 6 p.m. and the game will air on ESPN+.

- The River Bell Classic is the true definition of a rivalry as the all-time series is as close as it could possibly be with Southeastern holding an 18-17 advantage following a last-second win in Thibodaux to close out the 2024 season. The win marked the fourth straight at Guidry Stadium for the Lions and the Colonels will be looking for their fourth-straight victory road win as well in the series. Following a loss in Hammond in 2017, Nicholls returned to Strawberry Stadium in '19 and won a 28-27 thriller in the championship bout against SLU. The Colonels then won 45-42 in a shootout in '21, and in '23, outlasted the Lions, 21-17, to claim their first undefeated Southland season.

- Nicholls secured a perfect 4-0 mark at home in league play after knocking off Northwestern State, 26-21, in its Guidry Stadium finale. The Colonels had a great start in the rivalry matchup thanks to two Shane Lee touchdown runs, but the Demons responded in a big way and took a 21-19 lead into the break. The Colonels shut out NSU the rest of the way, allowing just 85 yards in the second half, and Lee's third touchdown run gave Nicholls the lead with seven minutes to go. The Demons threatened to steal a victory in the final minute but Laurence Sullivan Jr. picked off a pass at the goal line off a Ty Marsh deflection to secure the win. Although it was Senior Day, Lee, a redshirt freshman, stole the show with 134 yards rushing and three touchdowns.

- Southeastern heads into the Classic coming off a hard-fought 10-7 victory on the road at UIW. Points were at a premium in the matchup as there were four missed field goals, including the Lions blocking the potential game-tying try by UIW in the final seconds. The Lions feature the third-highest scoring offense in the league at 32.9 points per game, but their defense has fueled been one of the best in the nation as well, ranking seventh in yards allowed and 12th in points allowed.

... even up the all-time series at 18-18 and improve the Colonels' record in Hammond to 10-7.  
... secure a four-game road winning streak in the series for a second time (1981, '83, '85, 2005).  
... give Nicholls a sweep against the Louisiana Southland schools. The Colonels last went 3-0 vs. Southeastern, McNeese and Northwestern State in the championship 2019 season. Nicholls beat SLU and McNeese in 2023 but the win over NSU was via forfeit.

## BY THE NUMBERS

**3**

Safety Ty Marsh has three career interception returns for touchdowns in his two seasons, tying the program's record held by longtime Baltimore Raven Lardarius Webb. Marsh started the year off with a pick-6 against UIW and had another in the win over McNeese. Marsh recorded his first last season at Sacramento State.

**4**

Laurence Sullivan Jr. ended the game against Northwestern State with his fourth interception of the season, which is tied for first in the SLC. Sullivan had a two-pick game earlier this season against HCU.

**15**

The Colonel defense has 15 interceptions -- four by Laurence Sullivan Jr., who leads the Southland, three by Ethan Lee and Anthony Rogers, two by Ty Marsh, and one each from Hayden Shaheen, Aidan McCowan, and Travin Moore. Nicholls ranks 3rd in the FCS and ranked third in the nation last season with 19.

**21**

For the third straight year, the Colonels are looking to finish in the Top 10 of the FCS in turnovers gained. Nicholls has 21 gained this year and ranks 4th in the FCS.

**100**

The Colonels' top two tacklers, Jake Dalmado (89) and Hayden Shaheen (88), are looking to become the first duo to record 100 tackles each since 2019 (Kevin Moore, III & Laryon James).

**91**

The Nicholls roster features 91 Louisiana natives, which is the most of any Division I roster this season. The Colonels have held the distinction for most of Tommy Rybacki's tenure on staff.

**123**

Although Nicholls has not had a 100-yard receiver this season, the last Colonel to do so was Scrappy Osby in last year's River Bell Class. Osby had four receptions for 123 yards, scoring on an 84-yard catch against the Lions.

**134**

Redshirt freshman Shane Lee posted his second 100-yard game of the season, rushing for 134 yards on 14 carries against Northwestern State. Lee scored the game's first two touchdowns, including a 59-yard rush, and finished his day with the game-winner with seven minutes to go.

**167.5**

The Nicholls defense is allowing 167.5 yards passing per game, which ranks 10th in the FCS. Twice this season, the defense has allowed less than 100 yards passing.

## LAST MEETING (11-21-2024) SOUTHEASTERN -- 19 NICHOLLS -- 16

### Colonels Fall in River Bell Classic, 19-16

THIBODAUX, La. - The Nicholls State University football team came out on the wrong side of a thrilling River Bell Classic when Southeastern booted a game-winning field goal as time expired as the Colonels suffered a 19-16 loss Thursday night in their season finale at Manning Field at John L. Guidry Stadium.

With the loss, Nicholls ended the season with a 4-8 overall record while falling to 2-5 in the Southland. SLU (7-5, 6-1 SLC) kept the winning streak for the road team in the series going with their fourth straight win in Thibodaux, grabbing an 18-17 advantage in the all-time series.

Nicholls outgained Southeastern in total offensive yards, 382-301, but the game's lone turnover proved to be costly. With the score tied at 16-16 with five minutes remaining, the Colonels picked up a first down on 4th-and-1 at the Lion 34, but on the next play, KK Reno intercepted a tipped ball to set up the game-winning drive.

The Lion offense came up clutch down the stretch by moving the chains three times on third down, then had a 10-yard run on 3rd-and-15 to put Riley Callaghan in field goal range with 2 seconds remaining. He was able to drill his fourth and longest field goal of the night from 40 yards to keep SLU's playoff hopes alive.

Pat McQuaide accounted for both of the Colonels' touchdowns, throwing for 298 yards on 19 of 32. Redshirt sophomore Scrapy Osby had a career night with 123 yards receiving on four receptions, and senior Terry Matthews closed out his solid season with 83 yards on four catches.

Nicholls was held to under 100 yards rushing for the third straight game, totaling 75 yards on 30 carries. Collin Guggenheim wrapped up his career with 53 yards rushing, solidifying himself as the No. 2 all-time rusher in program history with 3,282 yards for his career.

Keontae Williams paced the defense with eight tackles and a forced fumble, while Eli Ennis and Rasheed Lovelace added seven stops each. Nicholls limited the Southland's leading rusher Antonio Martin Jr. to 64 yards and set a new team record in the process, allowing just 83.9 yards rushing per game for the season.

Southeastern had the momentum early, scoring on a short field goal on the opening drive. Darius Lewis then put the Lions ahead 10-0 after a 1-yard touchdown grab from Eli Sawyer. Lewis, who led SLU with 95 yards on nine receptions, set up the short TD with a 33-yard catch on the play before.

Nicholls answered with its own long reception when Matthews scampered 52 yards to the Lion 9. Then on third down, McQuaide escaped the pass rush and scrambled to pick up his second rushing touchdown of the season, making the score 10-7 late in the first quarter.

In the second, the teams traded field goals with Ray Vallee connecting on a 33-yarder for Nicholls to put the score at 13-10 with two minutes remaining. But SLU added another short field goal before time expired.

A scoreless third was highlighted by a fourth-down stop by the Colonels. Facing a 4th-and-1 at the Nicholls 11, SLU's Martin was stuffed at the line for no gain, keeping the score 16-10.

Early in the fourth, senior Zack Bernard had a sack on third down but SLU's Alec Mahler saw his punt downed at the 1-yard line. Four plays later, McQuaide found Osby streaking down the middle of the field for an 84-yard touchdown pass -- the longest play for the Colonels this season. But another gaffe on special teams came into play when Vallee's extra point attempt hit off the upright, keeping the score tied at 16-16.

Nicholls forced a three-and-out before its 10-play drive ended with the interception.

### LEE EARNS HONORABLE MENTION

Redshirt freshman running back Shane Lee received FCS National Freshman of the Week honorable mention after his performance last week in the win over Northwestern State.

- Lee rushed for a career-high 134 yards on 14 carries and added three rushing touchdowns.

- In six league games, Lee is averaging 75.0 yards rushing and 6.5 yards per carry.

### EAN AT QB

Transfer quarterback Deuce Hogan had started the first seven games but left the SFA contest with an injury. Although it was late in a decisive game, Ean Rodrigue saw his first significant time and was 8 of 9 for 88 yards and a touchdown.

- With Hogan sidelined, Rodrigue made the start against McNeese and threw for 161 yards and one touchdown while rushing for 77 yards and a TD.

- The following week against HCU, Rodrigue put together another strong performance. He completed 17 of 22 passes for 174 yards and two TDs, and rushed for 89 yards and one touchdown.

- Although Rodrigue was limited on the ground at UTRGV, he finished with a career high 192 yards passing and threw a touchdown pass.

- In the win against NSU, Rodrigue threw for 156 yards and a touchdown but threw his first pick of the season.

### "SHA"OWING OUT

Veteran linebacker Hayden Shaheen has continued to put up big numbers, ranking second on the defense with 8.0 tackles per game.

- Shaheen has 288 tackles for his career and notched double figures three times this year, including a personal best 12 against West Georgia.

- The Baton Rouge native has 88 stops on the year which is a new personal best.

### A HEALTHY SERVING OF BROCK-LEE

The running back duo Miequle Brock Jr. and Shane Lee has been an integral part of the Colonels' offense this season.

- A redshirt freshman, Lee ranks third in league play with 75.0 yards per game and has six touchdowns. Brock ranks 11th at 42.3 yards with one touchdown.

- Nicholls has the third best rushing offense in SLC play at 165.3 yards per outing.

### MOVE THOSE CHAINS

After seven games, Nicholls ranked 124th out of 126 teams in the FCS when it came to third-down conversions. But in the last three home games, the team converted 26 of 42 third downs (61.9%).

### MARSH NAMED POW

Senior safety Ty Marsh was named Southland Conference Defensive Player of the Week following the win over McNeese.

- Marsh sparked the Colonels' defensive effort in the 31-7 victory, totaling four tackles, an interception for a touchdown, and one sack.

- With Nicholls leading 10-7 in the third quarter, Marsh tallied his second pick-6 of the season with a 45-yard return.
- In 23 career games for the Colonels, Marsh has four interceptions and has returned three for touchdowns. His three TD returns is tied for the program career mark with Hall of Famer Lardarius Webb.

### FRESH FACES

Nicholls has had several freshman earn significant playing time this season.

- Redshirt freshman Shane Lee has been a primary running back the last two-thirds of the season, averaging 6.0 yards per carry and 70.4 yards with seven total touchdowns.

- Cornerback Anthony Rogers has started all season for one of the league's top passing defenses, totaling four breakups and three interceptions.

- Punter Pharrell Harewood is averaging over 40 yards a punt and is first in the SLC in 50-yard punts and fourth in punts inside the 20.

### GROUNDING

While Nicholls sported one of the best rushing defenses in the FCS last season, the Colonels currently rank 10th in the nation with 167.5 passing yards allowed per game.

- Nicholls had limited the opposing offenses to fewer than 200 yards in the first five games, including two games of 63 and 72 yards allowed.

- Lamar and UTRGV are the two opponents to have more than 200 yards in SLC play.

- Two newcomers to the defense have played a big part -- sophomore transfer Aidan McCowan and redshirt freshman Anthony Rogers. McCowan has one pick while Rogers has totaled four breakups and three interceptions.

### DALMADO MAKIN' MOVES

Former running back Jake Dalmado made the switch to defense in the 2024 spring and moved to linebacker.

- In two seasons in the backfield, Dalmado had a solid showing with 131 yards on 22 carries, averaging 6.0 yards per carry.

- He emerged as one of the top defenders in the SLC last season, racking up 9.0 sacks with seven coming in two weeks. Dalmado was named SLC Defensive Player of the Week after totaling 10 tackles with 3.0 sacks and a fumble recovery in the win over Northwestern State, then had another 10 tackles with 4.0 sacks and a safety versus McNeese to win the honor for a second straight week.

- This season, Dalmado ranks eighth in the SLC in tackles (8.1) and leads the Colonels with 3.5 sacks, 2 forced fumbles and 2 fumble recoveries.

- Dalmado excelled in his first season at linebacker, earning All-Southland First Team last year while being a two-time SLC Defensive Player of the Week and national honorable mention. Dalmado led the Southland with 9.0 sacks and was third with 12.5 tackles for loss, totaling 41 tackles on the year. He racked up an FCS-high 4.0 sacks with a safety in the win over McNeese, and logged 3.0 sacks in the shutout victory against Northwestern State.

# LAGNIAPPES PART II

## CORRALING THE COWBOYS

McNeese has had the upper hand in the all-time series with a 32-18 advantage, but the win Saturday for Nicholls was the fifth straight. It is the first time that the Colonels have had a five-game winning streak in the series.

- The Colonels had only won four in a row one other time from 1985-88.

- Since Tommy Rybacki joined the coaching staff, Nicholls dropped the first two to McNeese but have won seven of the last nine meetings.

## BROCK HONORED

Running back Miequle Brock Jr. was named Southland Conference Offensive Player of the Week after the first full weekend of play.

- Brock scored both of the Colonels' touchdowns at Troy and totaled over 100 yards of offense to help Nicholls lead in the fourth quarter against the Trojans. He gave Nicholls a 10-0 lead on a 3-yard touchdown run in the second quarter and after halftime, caught a short pass and raced 58 yards for his second TD of the night.

- Brock finished the game with six receptions for 87 yards and rushed for 34 yards on seven carries.

## TEAM OF THE WEEK

With the 20-6 win over preseason favorite and Top 5 ranked UIW, the NCAA named the Colonels the FCS Team of the Week.

- Although its a rare feat for an unranked team to knock off a team in the Top 5 of the polls, it was the second time in the last three years that an unranked Nicholls squad beat UIW when the Cardinals were ranked 5 or higher.

- No SLC Players of the Week were named for Week 0.

## LOU-WE-SIANA

Nicholls has continued to represent Louisiana year-after-year with homegrown talent and this season is no different as the 2025 roster features 91 players from Louisiana.

- Most come from a 50-mile radius which includes New Orleans, Baton Rouge, and the River Parishes.

- The Colonels have had the most Louisianans in Division I football over the past few seasons.

## ROOKIES OF THE YEAR

The Colonels have secured the last three Southland Freshman of the Year awards.

- In 2024, Miequle Brock Jr. did not play in the first few games but ended up ranking second in the SLC with 113.0 all-purpose yards. He totaled 479 yards rushing with three scores and added another 213 yards and two touchdowns receiving. Brock scored on 66- and 68-yard rushes and found the end zone on an 80-yard catch-and-run as well.

- In 2023, nose tackle Rasheed Lovelace earned SLC Freshman of the Year honor after totaling 25 tackles with 2.5 for loss and 0.5 sacks. Lovelace was named a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award, which honors the nation's top freshman.

- Linebacker Eli Ennis won the award in 2022, joining Broderick Cole (2004), LeJuan Walker (2001), Josh Son (2000) and Darryl Pounds (1991) as winners of the rookie honor.

- Brock, Lovelace and Ennis are the first players from the same school to earn the award consecutively since McNeese from 1991-93. In the '91 season, Colonel Daryl Pounds shared the award with Cowboy Eric Acheson.

## TWINNING

The Colonels feature two sets of twins on the 2025 roster. Jacob and Josh Johnson are in their third year with the program while Southern Miss transfers Kamron and Kyron Barnes joined the team this summer. All four are linemen with the Barnes duo and Jacob playing on the offensive line while Josh is on defense.

## COMPLETE 180

The Colonels had one of the most impressive turnarounds in the FCS in the 2010s. From 2011-14, Nicholls won a total of six games, with four being non-Division I, and a 0-12 season in '14 capped the tenure.

- Tim Rebowe was introduced as head coach a day after the '14 finale, which was the program's largest margin of defeat in Southland play in team history (59-point deficit). The loss also extended the Colonels' losing streak to 18 games, but Rebowe led his squad to a win over HCU in Year 1 to end the streak at 23.

- After guiding the Colonels to a winning conference record in 2016 at 5-4, the first since 2005, Nicholls earned an at-large berth in the 2017 FCS playoffs with an 8-3 campaign.

- The Colonels finished the regular season in '18 with another 8-3 record, which included a win over Power 5 Kansas, and the program's second SLC title.

- The Colonels went 9-5 in 2019 and another 7-2 mark in conference was good enough for back-to-back Southland championships.

- Another championship came to Thibodaux in 2023 when Nicholls went undefeated in Southland play for the first time in school history.

- Current head coach Tommy Rybacki helped fuel the resurgence as he was the defensive coordinator for all 10 years under Coach Rebowe.

## PRESEASON POLL

Nicholls was picked fifth in the Southland Preseason Poll. UIW was projected to repeat as champions and received 15 first-place votes.

In addition to the Mannings, every year some of the most elite NCAA quarterbacks act as camp counselors. In the 2018 NFL Draft, all five quarterbacks selected in the first round were Manning Camp alums. The 2024 draft featured camp alum, Heisman winner Jayden Daniels.

Tommy Rybacki is in his 11th season with the Nicholls State University football program and first as head coach. He is the 11th head coach in school history!

Rybacki takes over the program after leading the defense to a record-breaking campaign. Nicholls finished the 2024 regular season ranked 12th in total defense while setting a new school single-season record in rushing yards allowed with 83.9, which ranked fourth in the nation. The defense also had 29 turnovers gained, third best in the FCS, helped by 19 interceptions which ranked third as well.

In the 2023 championship season, the Colonel defense dominated league play by allowing just 16.0 points per game. Rybacki's unit led the Southland in rushing defense (124.8 ypg) and interceptions (16), which ranked 32nd and eighth, respectively, in the FCS. The defense also ranked 10th in the nation in turnovers (24) and 18th in red zone defense.

For the 2021 spring season, Rybacki's defense ranked second in Southland games in total defense and second in rushing yards allowed. The defense had a dominating performance in the league opener by shutting out Lamar in a 55-0 victory. The Colonels limited LU to only 91 yards of total offense and did not allow the Cardinals past the 50-yard line.

The Colonel defense finished in the top half of the league in the 2019 championship season, ranking fourth in scoring (27.2) and fifth in total yards (406.1) and rushing defense (143.3). Nicholls had its best showing on that side of the ball in the Southland-opening 34-14 win over No. 10 Central Arkansas. The defense allowed 250 yards and a lone touchdown before the Bears found the end zone on a long pass in the final seconds.

In his first four years, Rybacki transformed the defense into one of the best in the Southland. The Colonels not only led the conference in scoring defense (21.8 ppg) and rushing yards allowed (105.4 ypg) in 2018, but the defense ranked nationally in those categories at 21st and 11th, respectively. Nicholls also tied for third in the FCS in tackles for loss (106) and fourth in sacks (40).

The Colonel defense held four opponents to two touchdowns or fewer in 2018, capped with a shutout against Southeastern Louisiana in the regular season finale. It was the first time since 2007 that Nicholls held a conference opponent scoreless.

In 2017, the defense ranked third in points allowed (25.2), total yards, and passing defense, and was fourth in rushing. The Colonels held two opponents to less than 100 yards rushing, and two to under 100 yards passing. Nicholls was also among the league leaders in sacks, racking up 34 to rank third in the SLC.

From his first to second season, the defense improved in points allowed, total defense and rushing defense. The most drastic change from 2015 was the rush defense, which improved from 10th in the SLC to fourth-best in 2016 at 141 yards allowed. The unit also led the Southland in interceptions in '16, hauling in a league-best 15 INTs.

In his first year at Nicholls, the defense made tremendous strides after ranking near the bottom of the FCS over the past few years. The Colonels ended the year ranked sixth in the league in total defense, seventh in scoring defense and also proved to be one of the league's toughest squads to throw against, allowing an SLC-best 178.2 passing yards per game. Nicholls totaled 12 sacks in Rybacki's first campaign, which was just one less than the team recorded in the previous two seasons.

Under his guidance, the linebackers have garnered a total of six All-Southland honors. Four were via Allen Pittman, who earned one first-team and three-second team selections from 2016-19. Evan Veron was a first-team recipient in 2018 after recording 7.0 sacks with 22 tackles for loss. Veron's performance was only topped by defensive lineman Sully Laiche's 2019 campaign. Laiche totaled 12 sacks and 22.5 TFLs en route to earning several all-American honors while being a top 3 finalist for the Buck Buchanan Awards, which is given to the top defensive player in the FCS.

Rybacki, a native of Huntsville, Ala., joined the Colonel staff after coaching one season at Southland Conference member Central Arkansas in 2014. At UCA, Rybacki's cornerbacks contributed to 16 interceptions, which ranked second in the Southland.

Before coaching at UCA, Rybacki spent three seasons alongside Tim Rebowee at Louisiana as a graduate assistant. He coached the outside linebackers in his first two seasons (2011-12) before working with the secondary in 2013. While at UL, the Ragin' Cajuns won three straight New Orleans Bowl championships and were crowned co-champions of the Sun Belt in 2013.

A linebacker at Jacksonville State, Rybacki began his coaching career at his alma mater. He first served as a student assistant at JSU before coaching the cornerbacks in 2009-10. During his two years as cornerbacks coach, the Gamecocks posted a record of 17-6, which included a win over FBS Ole Miss and a berth in the FCS Playoffs.

Rybacki received a bachelor's degree in history from Jacksonville State in 2008. He went on to earn a master of public administration/athletic administration from JSU in 2009.
