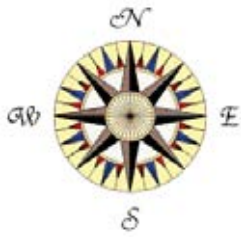

ABOUT NICHOLS



Nichols College is a small, independent, co-educational, business administration and liberal arts college founded in 1815. Located on a picturesque New England country campus in Dudley, Massachusetts, Nichols is 20 minutes south of Worcester and an hour from major metropolitan cities Boston, Providence and Hartford.

The College offers the Bachelor of Science in Business Administration (B.S., B.A.), Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) degrees and an MBA program. Business concentrations include accounting, business communication, criminal justice management, economics, finance, general business, human resource management, management information systems, marketing and sport management. Liberal arts majors include english, history, mathematics, psychology, and Educator Preparation for grades five through 12.

Three-quarters of the 950 students live on campus in one of five residence halls. The newest residence hall, Remillard Hall which opened in the fall of 2000, features a cluster concept of housing for all students. The facility contains three floors, and offers a variety of room structures: singles for resident assistants and special need students, and doubles with a bath to be shared by each four beds or two rooms. The hall also contains common study rooms on each floor, a game and vending room, laundry and trash rooms and a resident apartment.

On Homecoming Weekend of 2005, the new addition to the athletic facilities was officially named after Nichols legendary athletic director and coach – Mike Vendetti.

The facility serves a minimum of six intercollegiate athletic teams: football, men's and women's lacrosse and field hockey. An all-weather 400-meter eight lane rubber track surrounds the turf playing surface. New lighting has made the facility available for extended scheduling and student recreation needs, while two 1,500-seat bleachers and a state-of-the-art

ADA compliant press box with a public address system has made it enjoyable for fans of the Bison to enjoy the games.

In the fall of 2000 a new performance gymnasium opened at Nichols as well. The facility is the home of the men's and women's varsity basketball teams and contains a suspended jogging track. It also features two racquetball courts, one squash court, two fitness rooms, and an atrium foyer with an indoor climbing wall, four new varsity locker rooms, and a multipurpose function room.

The College is proud of its faculty members, 76 percent of whom have earned the doctorate or the highest appropriate degree in their fields. Moreover, members of the business faculty bring to the classroom years of on-the-job experience in business and industry, providing both theoretical and practical aspects of a balanced education.

President Debra M. Townsley, Ph.D.

Dr. Townsley was inaugurated as the sixth president – and the first woman president – of Nichols College in 1998. Previously, she served as the College’s dean of academic affairs.

As president, Dr. Townsley oversees a student body of more than 1,400 full-time and part-time students who are enrolled in Nichols’ undergraduate, graduate and certificate programs, and an alumni body of more than 8,400. More than 96 percent of its students achieve gainful employment in their field of study within six months of graduation. Under Townsley’s leadership, Nichols is preparing for the new millennium through a master plan for the campus, building initiatives, and practically oriented programs. From 1987 until her appointment as academic dean at Nichols in 1997, Townsley was director of undergraduate and graduate management studies at St. Michael’s College in Vermont.

Dr. Townsley earned an associate’s degree from Northern Virginia Community College and a Bachelor of Science degree in marketing and management at American University in Washington, D.C. Following graduation, she served as a marketing support representative at IBM, where she was named Marketing Support Representative of the Year. While completing a Master of Business Administration at George Washington University, she joined Booz, Allen & Hamilton as a senior consultant and project manager. In 1988, she was appointed visiting scholar in occupational safety and public health at the Harvard University School of Public Health. Townsley earned a Master of Arts degree in psychology, and a Ph.D. in organizational psychology from University of Vermont, where she focused her dissertation on “An Interdependent and Reciprocal Model for the Followership-Leadership Exchange.”



Charlyn Robert - Director of Athletics

Charlyn Robert was named Director of Athletics at Nichols College on November 9, 1998. A graduate of the State University of New York at Cortland with a Bachelor of Science in Physical Education and also a graduate of the University of Massachusetts - Amherst with a Master of Science Degree in Sport Management Administration, she was a four year player and captain in field hockey and lacrosse in college.

Robert coached field hockey at Union College (NY) from 1983-96. She was named the New York Collegiate Female Coach of the Year in 1989.

Robert has served as the NCAA Division III Field Hockey Chair. She currently is a member of the NCAA Division III Women’s Lacrosse Championship Committee, the ECAC Field Hockey

Committee, Chairperson for the Colleges of Worcester Consortium Directors of Athletics Committee as well as for The Commonwealth Coast Conference women’s basketball committee.

HEAD COACH WILLIAM CARVEN



Carven is the sixth head coach in Nichols College football history since the school became a four-year institution in 1959. A 1994 alumnus of Nichols, Carven returns for his ninth season at the helm.

A 2002 inductee into the Nichols College Athletic Hall of Fame, Carven has compiled a career record of 39-37. After his arrival in 1999 in which he was the youngest head football coach in the NCAA, Carven had five straight winning seasons from 1999-2003. Carven's win streak was second only to the Bison teams of the 1970's which captured winning records for nine straight seasons.

In Carven's first season at the helm, the Bison went 6-3 and finished 5-3 in New England Football Conference play. The team ended the year as the 10th seed in the ECAC Division III New England Football Poll. Carven was named the Worcester Area Football Coach of the Year as he led Nichols to its first winning season since 1992, when Carven himself was the Bisons' starting quarterback. Nichols saw increased success in Carven's second year as the Bison finished third in the Boyd Division of the NEFC with a 4-2 record and an overall record of 7-3, the programs most wins since 1992. The team received a bid to play in the ECAC Northeast Championship for the first time in school history as well that year.

In 2001, Carven led Nichols to unprecedented success as it went 5-0, won the Boyd Division and received an automatic bid in the NEFC Championship. It was the first time in two decades the football team advanced to post-season play. Nichols maintained winning records in both 2002 and 2003, giving Carven five straight winning seasons. 2004 marked the first year Carven did not maintain a winning record as the Bison went 4-6 overall in a year of highs and lows. In 2005, several key injuries plagued Nichols throughout the year as it finished with a 0-9 record. Last season, Nichols was named the tenth most improved team in the nation as it finished the year 5-4 overall. Carven's younger brother, quarterback Michael Carven, was named the Boyd Division Offensive Player of the Year. In eight years, Carven has coached 41 Conference All-Stars and two Golden Helmet Award Winners.

A four-year football and lacrosse player at Nichols, Carven was the quarterback for the Bison from 1990-93. He owns the school records for both the highest pass completion percentage in a season (56.6% in 1992) and a career (53.6%). He was an All-New England Honorable Mention and a Second-Team All-ECFC player in 1992. Carven captained the football team as well as the lacrosse team his senior year.

After receiving his degree in Psychology in 1994, Carven spent the next football season as an assistant coach at Xaverian Brothers High School in Westwood, MA. The Hawks proceeded to win the Massachusetts Division I Super Bowl Championship. In 1995, Carven moved on to Plymouth State College. He was the receivers coach on a team that posted a 9-1 record en route to winning the Freedom Football Conference and earning a NCAA playoff bid.

Carven returned to the Bison program in 1996, serving for two seasons as the quarterbacks and receivers coach. In 1998 he moved up to offensive coordinator and served as the team's recruiting coordinator before being named the head coach in 1999. In 2001, Carven was named Assistant Athletic Director in addition to his coaching duties at Nichols.

Matt Chapman- Offensive Line Coach/Recruiting Coordinator

Chapman returns to Nichols College for his fifth season as the offensive line coach and head of recruiting for the football program. In the spring, he will be entering his third season as an assistant coach with the men's lacrosse program.

A 2004 graduate of Nichols College, Chapman earned a Bachelor of Science in Economics and is working towards his MBA. A native of Falmouth (MA), Chapman played two seasons at Nichols College before knee injuries cut his career short. He was a member of the 2001 Bison team which captured the Boyd Division Championship.



Andrew Croteau- Defensive Backs Coach

Croteau begins his second year with the Bison football program and his first year working with the defensive backs. In his first season at Nichols, he mainly worked with the running backs.

Croteau previously worked a number of positions at his alma mater, the University of Massachusetts-Amherst. While at UMass, Croteau was a member of the 2003 Atlantic Ten Championship football team. In the spring of 2005, he worked an independent study at UMass as a personal trainer in Genetics and Muscle Hypertrophy Research.



Scott Ferguson- Defensive Line Coach

Ferguson enters his second season with the Bison. No stranger to the New England Football Conference, Ferguson played for Worcester State College. In his first season at Worcester State in 1997, the Lancers were Co-NEFC Champions and advanced to the ECAC Playoffs. As a senior in 2000, Ferguson was a Second Team All-NEFC selection.



Kevin Gilmartin- Wide Receivers Coach

Gilmartin enters his first season as an assistant coach with the Nichols football team. He will primarily work with the wide receivers. Gilmartin comes to Nichols from Nipmuc High School where he was the head football coach in 2005 and 2006. Prior to that, he was an assistant coach at Hamilton College for five years. Gilmartin also served as the head lacrosse coach at Hamilton from 1998-2000. He began his coaching career at Hofstra University in 1994, where he was a running backs and special teams coach for two seasons. Gilmartin is a 1994 graduate of Williams College and has a three-year old daughter, Lainey



Mike Landers- Linebackers Coach/Defensive Coordinator

Landers enters his third season with the Bison football program as its defensive coordinator and linebacker coach. Prior to coming to Nichols he spent one season at Wesleyan College as a linebacker coach. Landers was an assistant coach at Stonehill College from 1998-2003 as well. He was the wide receivers coach and then became the linebacker coach.

A native of Brockton, MA, Landers was a defensive back at Georgia Tech for two years. He then transferred to Bridgewater State College, where he earned a degree in Communications in 2000. Landers works in the off-season as a camp counselor at the All-Division Football Camp in Rhode Island.



Stephen Tirrell- Running Backs Coach

Steve Tirrell enters his first season as an assistant coach for the Bison after spending three seasons at UMass as defensive line and special teams coach from 2004-06. Last season, he helped guide the Minutemen to the NCAA Division I-AA National Championship game. Tirrell came to UMass from Northeastern University, where he worked for four seasons under Don Brown.

Prior to his time at Northeastern, Tirrell served as an assistant at Brown University for four seasons. He spent two years as the defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator (1998-1999) on Phil Estes' staff, after serving under Mark Whipple for two seasons as assistant defensive line coach and special teams coordinator (1996-1997). He previously served as an assistant at his alma mater, Plymouth State College from 1989-1995. Tirrell is a 1989 graduate of Plymouth State.

Three-year letterwinner...Started all nine games as a junior in 2006...Named a Second Team All-Worcester Area All-Star...Fourth on the team with 44 total tackles...Led the team with 18 tackles for a loss of 66 yards...Posted a team-high six sacks for a loss of 35 yards...Recorded one interception, one fumble recovery and one forced fumble...Had a season-high of eight tackles in two games...Recorded five solo tackles, including four for a loss, 1.5 sacks and a forced fumble against Endicott on 9/30/06.

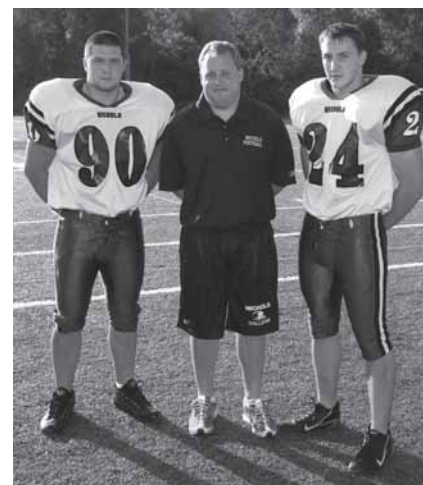

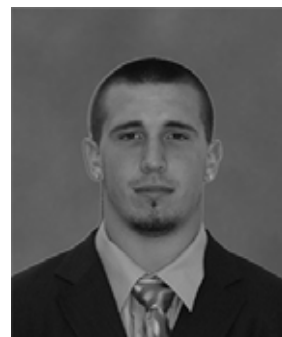

2006 SEASON IN REVIEW

Head Coach William Carven led the Bison to a 5-4 overall and 4-3 mark in the NEFC Boyd Division in 2006. Nichols had a total of seven players earn All-NEFC honors along with two Rookies of the Year and one Player of the Year.

Quarterback/punter Michael Carven G'07 was named the NEFC Boyd Division Offensive Player of the Year and earned First Team accolades as both a quarterback and punter. Anthony Pillari '10 was named the Boyd Division Offensive Rookie of the Year while Bill Hassett '10 picked up Co-Defensive Rookie of the Year honors.

Bryan Meuse '07 and Rob McDonagh '07 both earned First Team Defensive honors while David McLean '09 earned Second Team Defensive accolades. Offensive linemen John Mascolo '07 and Brandt Genga '10 earned Second Team Offensive honors as did tight end Joshua Harris '09.

The Bison led all of Division III in punting with a 36.61 yards per punt average. Nichols offensive line did its job in protecting Carven as it ranked first in the NEFC in sacks against with just eight on the year. On the flip side, the Bison defense racked up 24 sacks, good for second overall in the conference.

Several players were ranked nationally in individual categories throughout the season, including defensive end Brendan Bonn '08 who was ninth in the country in tackles for loss with 2.0 per game. McLean ranked 20th in all of Division III in passes defended, averaging 1.6 per game. Pillari was 22nd in the nation with a 13.0 punt return average while Carven ranked 25th in punting with a 38.5 average. Meuse was 18th in the country in solo tackles with 6.4 per contest.

Nichols started off the season with a bang, downing Framingham State, 31-12, in its first-ever game under the lights on Friday, Sept. 8. Carven threw for 222 yards, including a 26-yard touchdown pass to Darren Zow '08 to lead the Bison to their first win since Oct. 23, 2004.

The team followed up with a frustrating 16-13 loss at Worcester State on Friday, Sept. 15. Another stellar offensive outing got Nichols back on the winning track the following week as it defeated MIT 33-19. The Bison racked up 402 yards of total offense, led by Carven's 223 passing yards, which gave him the school career passing yardage record. Carven hooked up with Harris for two touchdown catches, one for 43 yards, the other 24 yards.

In a game where both defenses not did allow a single touchdown, the Endicott Gulls pulled out a 7-3 victory over Nichols on Sept. 30. The Gulls scored the only touchdown of the game off a fumble in the second quarter. The Bison scored on their very first drive of the game, a 35 yard field goal, but Endicott shutdown Nichols offense on its next 12 drives.

Pillari ran for 112 yards as Nichols edged out Salve Regina, 21-14, on Oct. 7. The win lifted the Bison to 3-2 overall and 2-1 in the Boyd Division. Carven ran in the winning touchdown from one yard out midway through the final quarter following a 37 yard completion to Harris.

Pillari ran for 142 yards to lead the Bison to a thrilling 19-14 Homecoming victory over Plymouth State on Oct. 14. The win was Nichols first over Plymouth State since 1979. The Nichols defense was dominant in the second half, allowing Plymouth State just 46 yards of offense. The Bison batted away three passes and recorded a sack in the Panthers last drive. Shane West '07 was named the NEFC Defensive Player of the Week for his performance as he batted down two of the three passes on that final drive.

In a key Boyd Division match-up, the Bison could not stop the running ability of the conference's top rusher in a 28-14 loss to UMass-Dartmouth on Oct. 21. Nichols played the Corsairs even up through halftime but could not generate the offense it needed in the second as it was outscored 21-7.

Playing through heavy rain and wind, Nichols dropped a 37-13 decision at undefeated Curry on Oct. 28. The driving rain and win coupled with Curry's defense held Nichols to just 60 yards of offense, including zero passing yards as the Bison attempted just ten passes all game.

Nichols capped off the year on a strong note, cruising past Western New England College, 26-13, on Nov. 4, giving the Bison their first winning season since 2003. Both Carven and McLean earned NEFC Weekly honors as Carven ran for three touchdowns and threw for another while McLean recorded three interceptions inside the red zone in the fourth quarter.

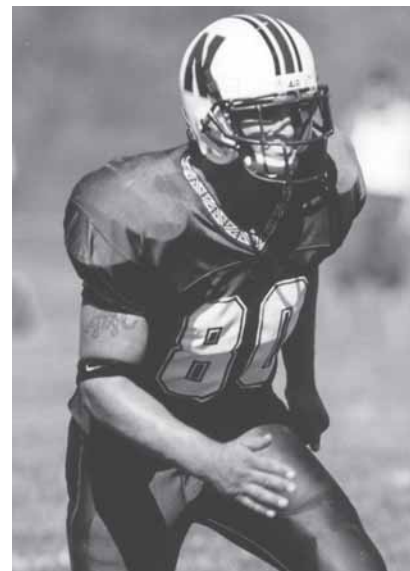

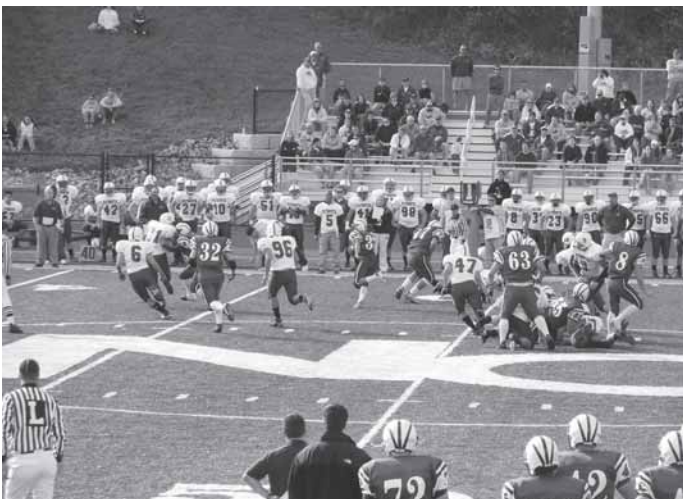

MICHAEL J. VENDETTI FIELD

Once known as the Bison Bowl, Nichols College now plays all of its home football, field hockey, men’s lacrosse and women’s lacrosse games as well as some of its soccer matches on the newly resurfaced Michael J. Vendetti Field. This multi-purpse athletic stadium includes an eight-lane rubberized quarter-mile track surrounding a turf field surface. Vendetti Field also features a premium sound system, Musco lighting and a Fair-Play scoreboard and message board. To faciliate media coverage, there is a press box complete with internet access and a roof-top video deck.



The field is named in honor of Nichols College Hall of Fame member, Michael J. Vendetti. Vendetti led the football team to five New England Football Conference Championships in the 70’s as head coach. He coached football and track from 1962 to 1985. Vendetti also served as Director of Athletics from 1980-1985 and was instrumental in the addition of women’s athletics at Nichols.

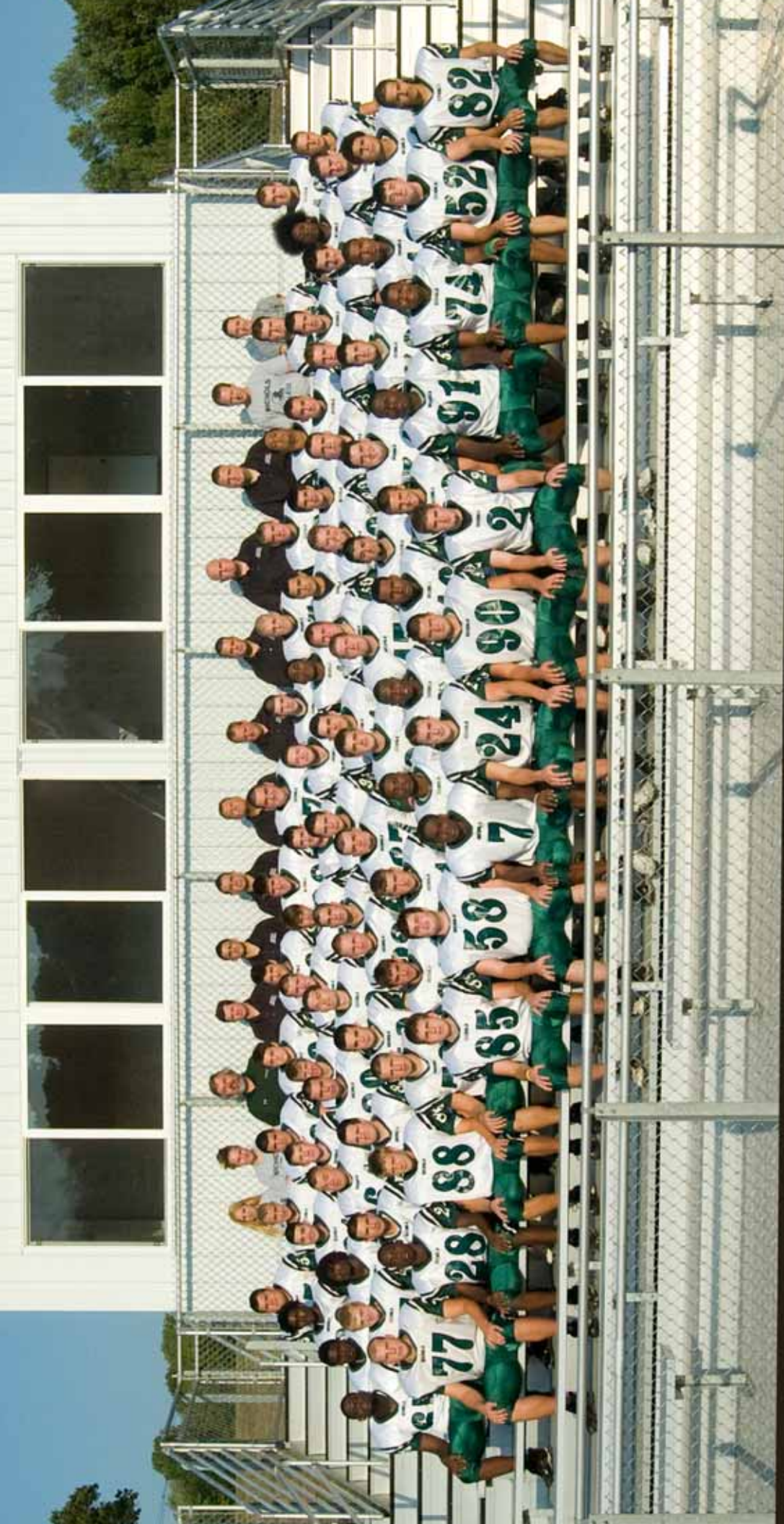
