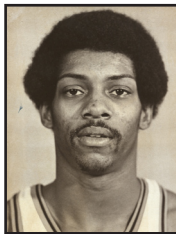
Jim Bradley, F-C, 1971-72, 1972-73

Jim Bradley was simply before his time. A small forward in a center's body. Yes, the dynamic Bradley could do it all, run, pass, shoot and defend. One of just four unanimous all-century selections at NIU, Bradley earned All-America recognition during his sophomore and junior seasons, including the 1971-72 season in which he led Northern Illinois to a 21-4 overall record and an appearance in the Associated Press Top 20 rankings. Ranked among the school's top 20 career scorers with 1,134 tallies in just two seasons, Bradley averaged a remarkable 23.1 points for his career and owns the top two rebounding seasons in school history, 426 boards in 1972-73 and 398 in 1971-72. His 16.8 rebounds a game over his career is also tops in school lore. For his efforts, Bradley earned third-team All-America recognition from *Basketball Weekly* and honorable mention honors from UPI as a junior (1972-73), and fourth team honors from *Basketball News* and honorable mention recognition from the *Sporting News* in 1971-72.



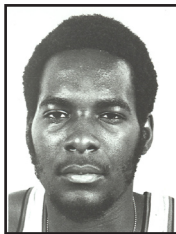
Billy Harris, G, 1972-73

A dynamic perimeter performer who ranks among NIU leaders in points (1,331) including a remarkable 603 tallies during the 1972-73 season. Harris, teaming with fellow All-American Jim Bradley, led NIU on a tear during the 1971-72 season, guiding the Huskies to a 21-4 overall record including a dominant 85-71 win over then No. 5 Indiana and head coach Bob Knight in Evans Fieldhouse. A First-Team All-Midwestern Conference selection during that 1971-72 season, Harris poured in 17.8 points a game and followed that with an unbelievable 24.1 point scoring average as a senior (1972-73). Also a member of the NIU All-Century team, Harris earned honorable mention honors from *Basketball Weekly* during that senior season, becoming the second Huskie All-America award winner in school history.



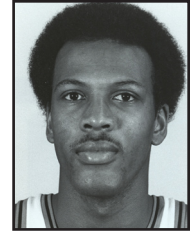
Matt Hicks, F, 1975-76, 1976-77

One of the most decorated Huskies, Matt Hicks was a two-time All-America selection who won Mid-American Conference Player of the Year honors in 1976-77 and was an all-league honoree in 1975-76. The first player in MAC history to lead the league in scoring and rebounding for two consecutive seasons, "The Great" Matt Hicks was a man among boys in the post despite standing just 6-foot-4 in stature. A member of the Huskie All-Century Team, Hicks was a two-time honorable mention All-America choice by the Associated Press (1975-77) and earned Special Mention consideration from the *Sporting News* in 1975-77 and Converse in 1976-77. Seventh in school history with 1,513 points, Hicks is also among the school's leading rebounders.



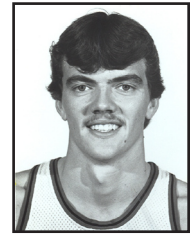
Paul Dawkins, F, 1978-79

Very few could light up the Chick Evans Field House scoreboard like "Doctor D". Paul Dawkins earned Special Mention All-America recognition from the *Sporting News* in 1978-79 after finishing No. 5 nationally in scoring with an incredible 26.7 ppg. A future draftee by the Utah Jazz, Dawkins ripped the nets for 30 points eight times during his senior season in which he scored a school record 695 points. One of those 30-plus point games, a 47-point outburst at Western Michigan (2-28-79) ranks third in single-game scoring at NIU. A Northern Illinois All-Century team member, Dawkins was a three-time All-Mid-American Conference pick, earning first team honors during his junior and senior campaigns.



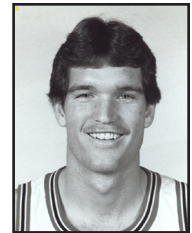
Allen Rayhorn, C, 1981-82

The catalyst for Northern Illinois' first trip to the NCAA Tournament, Allen Rayhorn was known more for his methodical, hard-nosed style of play than his flair. One of just 14 1,000-point, 1,000-rebound performers in Mid-American Conference history, Rayhorn was a "rock" for John McDougal's squads of the early 1980's. Selected to the MAC first team three times during his career, Rayhorn also earned All-MAC Tournament honors each of those years and was the MAC Postseason Tournament MVP in 1982 after leading NIU to the "Big Dance". The NIU Player of the Decade (1980's), Rayhorn is also the school record holder with 199 career blocked shots. A draft pick of the Seattle SuperSonics following his collegiate playing days, Rayhorn set 16 school records during his time in DeKalb and was a unanimous selection to the NIU All-Century squad.



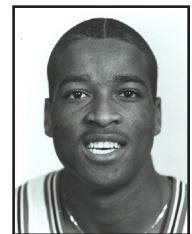
Tim Dillon, F-C, 1982-83, 1983-84

A two-time honorable mention All-America selection by the Associated Press, Tim "The Marshal" Dillon was a dominant inside force for Northern Illinois during his four seasons (1980-84) as a hoops letterwinner. NIU's first Academic All-American, Dillon twice earned First Team All-MAC honors on the hardwood and completed his career as a first team All-District IV pick as a senior after averaging 21.2 points to lead the Mid-American Conference. Also a Special Mention pick by the *Sporting News*, Dillon was named to the NIU All-Century team after helping the Huskies to the 1980-81 regular-season crown as a true freshman. Fourth in career field goals (650), Dillon finished his NIU tenure sixth in career scoring (1,559) including 573 points as a senior, the sixth-highest single-season point total in school lore.



Kenny Battle, F, 1984-85, 1985-86

His Northern Illinois tenure lasted just two seasons, but the high-flying, "slamboyant" Kenny Battle made the most of those two winters in DeKalb. Named a *Sporting News* honorable mention All-American as a freshman and sophomore, Battle led all NCAA freshmen in scoring average (20.1) in 1984-85 and set the school and Mid-American Conference freshman scoring record with 544 points. The youngest player in the MAC to reach 1,000 career points, Battle was a one-man wrecking crew for the Huskies, turning in a school record 93 dunks in his 54 career games. Battle finished his collegiate career at the University of Illinois, leading the 1988-89 "Flyin' Illini" to the Final Four in Seattle, WA, before becoming a first round pick of the Detroit Pistons.
