DOG TREATS

- All-time, NIU is 23-8 vs. Kent State, winning 12 of the last 13 matchups dating back to 2002.
- Twenty-one players will be honored prior to the game for Senior Day on Friday.
 Nine of the 21 spent their entire careers at NIU and 14 are listed on the two-deep this week.
- The Huskies are averaging 204.8 rushing yards per game over their last six games.
- NIU is one of 11 teams in the FBS and one of two teams in the MAC to have multiple players with at least 650 rushing yards. Redshirt Senior running back Chavon Wright leads the team with 690 rushing yards while sophomore running back Telly Johnson Jr. has 676 rushing yards on the season.
- Wright leads all active NCAA football players with 78 career rushing touchdowns and is second on career rushing yards with 5,616.
- NIU has rushed for at least 300 yards twice this season and nine times since 2021, most among all MAC teams and tied for sixth most in the FBS.
- Redshirt Senior linebacker Quinn Urwiler is third in the FBS in tackles with 11.7
 per game and has 129 on the season. Urwiler is only the second NIU player to
 reach 125 tackles in a season since 2005.
- Against Western Michigan, NIU limited the Broncos to 32 passing yards, the fewest passing yards allowed by the Huskies since Oct. 7, 2017 vs. Kent State (29) and fourth fewest since 2010.
- The Huskies have not committed a turnover in three games, the longest streak since the 2023 season.
- NIU ranks top 25 in the FBS in fewest penalties per game (15th, 4.45 per game), passing defense (19th, 170.9 yards per game) and turnovers lost (T-14th, 10).
- Junior Wide Receiver DeAree Rogers has a reception in 31 straight games and leads the team in receiving with 494 yards and three touchdown receptions.
- NIU has held 10 of its last 14 opponents to 20 points or less.
- Junior Safety Jasper Beeler recorded his team-leading third interception last week against Western Michigan and ranks third on the team in tackles with 69.
- 2025 marks NIU's final season in the Mid-American Conference before joining the Mountain West in 2026. The Huskies have been a member of the MAC for 38 seasons during two different stints in the league. NIU's five MAC Championship game wins are more than any other current league member.
- Since 2010 NIU is the second-winningest football program among Illinois' seven Division I (FBS and FCS) programs. The Huskies are 121-83 in that stretch for a .593 winning percentage.

Runnin' Huskies...

- Running backs Telly Johnson Jr. and Chavon Wright have been one of the most productive running back pairings in the FBS, combining for 1,366 rushing yards on 332 carries and seven touchdowns.
- Johnson and Wright are one of six running back duos in the FBS to each rush for over 650 yards this season.
- Johnson and Wright can be the first NIU teammates to each run for 700 yards in a season since 2016 (Joel Bouagnon, 885; Jordan Huff, 703).
- Since 2000, NIU has only had three running back pairings that have recorded 700 rushing yards in the same season: Bouagnon / Huff (2016), Garrett Wolfe / A.J. Harris (2004), Thomas Hammock / Michael Turner (2000).
- Wright leads the team in yards (690) and carries (166) while Johnson ranks 28th in the FBS in yards per carry (5.83) with four rushing touchdowns.

- Wright is coming off a 92-yard rushing game on 21 carries against Western Michigan, his third game in the last four with at least 80 rushing yards.
- Wright is closing in on 1,000 career carries, currently sitting at 991 attempts for 5,616 career rushing yards and 78 rushing touchdowns.
- Johnson has 676 rushing yards in his second season with the Huskies and leads the MAC in rushing yards per carry.
- Johnson's four touchdowns this season have been over 40 yards, recording a career-long 80-yard touchdown against Eastern Michigan, a 73-yarder against Maryland, a 53-yarder against Ball State and a 43-yarder last week.
- This season, NIU has rushed for 300 yards twice, coming against Ball State (305) and UMass (318).
- Since 2021, the Huskies have rushed for at least 300 yards in a single game, nine times the most among all MAC teams. Only Air Force (25), Army (22), Navy (14), Liberty (11) and UCF (10) have had more such games in that timeframe.

100 And Counting For Quinn...

- Redshirt-Senior linebacker Quinn Urwiler's
 11.7 tackles per game ranks third in the FBS and has 129 total for the season.
- Urwiler leads the country with 6.00 solo tackles per game and has 66 on the season.
- He has had double-digit tackles nine times in 10 games so far this season. Since 2015, only four players in the MAC have recorded 10 or more tackles 10 times in a single season.
- Urwiler can become the fifth NIU player to post at least 130 tackles in a season since 2000.

DeAree Down The Field...

- Wide Receiver DeAree Rogers upped his season total to 494 receiving yards on 44 receptions last week and ranks top 10 in the MAC in receptions (eighth), yards (ninth) and touchdown receptions (tied-ninth).
- Rogers has had a reception in 31 consecutive games dating back to Sept. 23, 2023 when he had two catches for Lenoir-Rhyne against Carson-Newman.

Senior Day...

- NIU will honor 21 players prior to Friday's game for Senior Day. Nineteen have appeared in a game this season and 10 have started six or more games.
- Nine players being recognized have spent their entire career at NIU.

Air Defense...

- The Huskies have held eight opponents this year to under 200 passing yards.
- NIU is allowing 170.9 passing yards per game which puts the Huskies third in the MAC behind Toledo and Western Michigan while ranking 19th in the nation in pass defense.
- NIU limited Western Michigan to 32 passing yards last week, the fewest passing yards allowed by the Huskies since Oct. 7, 2017 vs. Kent State (29).
- It was only the fifth time since 2010 in which the Huskies held an opponent to fewer than 50 passing yards:

32 vs. Western Michigan (Nov. 18, 2025)

34 vs. Ball State (Oct. 05, 2019) 29 vs. Kent State (Oct. 7, 2017)

8 at Army (Sept. 15, 2012)

11 at Eastern Michigan (Nov. 26, 2010)

How Bout Those DBs...

- Junior safety Jasper Beeler is coming off a career-high 13-tackle game against Western Michigan and also recorded an interception. He's the first NIU player to record 10 or more tackles and an interception in a single game since 2022 (Devin Lafayette).
- Beeler is third on the team in tackles with 69 (35 solo) and has a team-high three interceptions along with a forced fumble.
- Junior cornerback Jacob Finley had a career-high 14 tackles against UMass, the most by an NIU defensive back this season. Last week, Finley added two pass break ups and five tackles.
- Redshirt senior Muhammed Jammeh is just behind Beeler with 59 tackles, including 32 solo stops and a pair of INTs.
- NIU is one of three teams in the MAC with multiple players with 50 or more tackles and at least two interceptions this season.

Underclass Highlights...

- The Huskies have had notable performances from underclassmen this season and have 18 freshmen or sophomores make multiple starts.
- Redshirt freshman wide receiver Rickey Taylor Jr. recorded his first career touchdown reception last week against Western Michigan and has 50 or more receiving yards in two of his four games played since Oct. 25.
- Redshirt freshman running back Elijah Porter scored on a 67-yard touchdown reception at UMass, the longest passing play of the season for NIU.
- Redshirt sophomore linebacker Filip Maciorowski is second on the team in tackles with 84 (10th in the MAC) and had career-high 13 vs. San Diego State. Over the last three games, Maciorowski has 28 tackles and three tackles for loss.
- Redshirt sophomore defensive tackle Mark Hensley has made 11 starts this season with 28 tackles and 4.5 tackles for loss.
- Redshirt freshman defensive end Lance Ingold recorded seven tackles against Mississippi State and had his first career full sack and forced fumble against UMass.
- Freshman defensive back James Finley IV posted back-to-back games with an interception this season.

Hang With Them...

- The Huskies have had a bit of a penchant for close games during Hammock's tenure.
 Of the 80 games coached by Hammock, 44 have been decided by one score (eight points or less). In NIU's 2021 MAC Championship season the Huskies were 7-3 in one-score games.
- Sixteen of the last 23 games played by NIU have had a scoring margin of 14 points or less. NIU is 12-9 in games coached by Thomas Hammock decided by three points or less.

Here's Coach Hammock

- Huskie alum and 2022 NIU Athletics Hall of Fame inductee Thomas Hammock is in his seventh season at the helm of the NIU program in 2025. Hammock became the first NIU head coach to lead the Huskies to two bowl wins with NIU's 28-20 double overtime victory over Fresno State in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl. He guided the Huskies to the 2021 MAC Championship, and in 2023 led NIU to its first bowl win since 2011 with a 21-19 victory over Arkansas State in the Camellia Bowl.
- In terms of tenure in the MAC, Hammock ranks fourth behind Chris Creighton (Eastern Michigan) and Chuck Martin (Miami) who are in their 12th seasons, and Jason Candle of Toledo in his 10th season.

From The MAC To The Mountain West

- NIU was picked to finish fifth in the MAC Preseason Poll, 17 points ahead of sixth-place Bowling Green. The Huskies take on the top three teams in the preseason poll Toledo, Miami and Ohio in their final season in the league. The Huskies open MAC play on Oct. 4 against Miami in NIU's 118th Homecoming game and go to Ohio on Oct. 18 and Toledo on Nov. 5.
- On January 7, 2025 NIU announced it had accepted an invitation to join the Mountain West Conference as a football-only member beginning with the 2026 football season. NIU will join Air Force, Hawai'i, Nevada, New Mexico, San Jose State, UNLV, UTEP and Wyoming as members of the Mountain West. The Huskies have been a member of the Mid-American Conference for 38 seasons during two different stints in the league. NIU originally competed in the MAC from 1975-1985, then rejoined the conference in 1997. The Huskies have won six MAC championships with the most recent coming in 2021.

Nuggets And Tidbits...

- Redshirt Junior quarterback Jalen Macon rushed for three touchdowns and threw for another, becoming the fifth NIU quarterback to run for at least three rushing touchdowns and have at least one passing touchdown in a single game since 2010, joining Rocky Lombardi (2021), Anthony Maddie (2016), Jordan Lynch (2012-13) and Chandler Harnish (2011).
- Macon is one of eight FBS quarterbacks this season to rush for at least three touchdowns and throw for a passing touchdown in a single game.
- Redshirt senior kicker Andrew Glass made his two field goal attempts last week and is now 10-12 on field goal attempts and 16-17 on PATs. His 65 career field goals are tied for fifth-most among all active players.

HUSKIE BOWL FACTS: NIU played in its 12th bowl game in the last 16 seasons in 2023, dating back to the 2008 Independence Bowl. The Camellia Bowl marked the Huskies' 15th bowl as a FBS team (since 1969) and 20th all-time. The Huskies appeared in a MAC-record eight consecutive bowl games from 2008-15. NIU's 12 bowl appearances since 2008 and 14 since 2003 lead the MAC. The Huskies' modern bowl history began at the 1983 California Bowl when the MAC Champions defeated Cal State Fullerton. NIU has won at least six games 18 times since 2000, but were not selected for a bowl in 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003 (with 10 wins!) and

2005 (despite playing in the MAC Championship game).

THOSE WHO STAY...:

Former NIU head coach Joe Novak posted a sign on the wall of his team's locker room when he took over the program in 1996. It read "Those Who Stay Will Be Champions." Over the last 14 years, promise that has been fulfilled as every freshman class since 2008 has left NIU with at least one MAC Championship ring.

HUSKIES IN THE MAC: In 38 seasons as a member of the Mid-American Conference, the Huskies are 169-122-2 all-time. The Huskies own a winning percentage of .635 (134-77) versus MAC foes since re-joining the league in 1997. Since 2010, NIU is 78-32 (.709) against the MAC with three undefeated campaigns, two one-loss seasons and eight division championships, including a run of sixstraight (2010-15). NIU originally competed in the MAC from 1975-85.

MAC MVPS: Dating back to 2006, Huskie players have won eight of the last 18

"THE HARD WAY"

"The Hard Way" has been a mantra for NIU Football long before hashtags or Twitter/X. The slogan has been embraced by Huskie players and coaches alike since 1996 when it was first introduced at NIU by a junior college transfer named Kenneth Williams during preseason camp. The Hard Way describes the hard work, sacrifice and determination required to get the job done no matter the obstacle. It describes a culture of toughness. The hashtag evolved from a song/chant that is sung in the Huskie locker room following victories.

MAC Vern Smith Leadership Awards, which annually goes to the Most Valuable Player in the Mid-American Conference as voted by MAC head coaches. No other league team has had more than three players honored with the Vern Smith Award.

ADDED TO THE BONEYARD:

With its 16-14 victory over Notre Dame on September 7, NIU added its 19th Boneyard Win all-time. "Boneyard Wins" date back to 1983 and are defined as wins over teams from "power" leagues, as well as independents like Notre Dame and (formerly) BYU. NIU has added three bones to the yard in the last four seasons under Thomas Hammock.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION: In the past 14 seasons, five Huskies have earned first or second team All-America recognition from a major outlet seven times, with Jordan Lynch and Sutton Smith collecting the honor in multiple years. In the 40 years prior (1969-2009), three NIU players earned first or second team All-America honors four times.

LEADER OF THE MAC: NIU cur-

NIU Head Coach Thomas Hammock

In six seasons as head coach at Northern Illinois University, Thomas Hammock has successfully guided the Huskies to the 2021 Mid-American Conference Championship, back-to-back bowl victories and three "Boneyard Wins, including arguably the biggest win in school history in 2024. On September 7, 2024, Hammock's Huskies defeated fifth-ranked Notre Dame, 16-14, in South Bend, Indiana marking the first win by NIU, and the first win by a MAC school, over a Top 5 team.

The New Jersey native who originally came to NIU from Fort Wayne, Indiana, is the first African-American head coach in NIU football history and the first alumnus to lead the Huskies as a FBS program. In his third season as head coach in 2021, Hammock led the second-youngest team in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) to a 9-5 record and the Mid-American Conference Championship after the Huskies went winless (0-6) during the COVID-shortened 2020 campaign. NIU became the first FBS team to win its conference championship game one year after going winless. Hammock was named the MAC Coach of the Year and was one of 13 finalists for the FWAA's Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award, becoming just the fourth coach from a MAC school to be named a finalist for the honor.



Hammock began his coaching career at Wisconsin, where he spent two seasons as a graduate assistant, followed by two seasons as an assistant at NIU under Huskie Hall of Famer Joe Novak (2005-06). He was an assistant at Minnesota and Wisconsin before joining the Ravens in 2014.

In his five seasons as the running backs coach for the Ravens, Baltimore's rushing attack finish in the top 11 in the NFL three times, including in 2018 when the Ravens had the second-best rushing offense in the league. The Ravens made the playoffs twice during his time in Baltimore.

Hammock helped mentor running back Justin Forsett to his first career Pro Bowl in 2014 as he rushed for a career-high 1,266 yards, fifth-most in the NFL. Baltimore fullback Kyle Juszczyk was selected to the Pro Bowl for the first time in 2016 after leading the NFL in catches (37) and receiving yards (266) by a fullback.

Prior to his five seasons in Baltimore, Hammock spent three years at Wisconsin as running backs coach and assistant head coach. In 2011, the Badgers ranked 11th nationally in rushing, while Montee Ball led the nation in rushing yards (1,923) and broke the NCAA single-season touchdown record with 39. Ball was a consensus first team All-American and a Heisman Trophy finalist as the Badgers finished 11-3 and played in the Rose Bowl.

The following season, Wisconsin again ranked among the nation's elite rushing teams, Ball became the NCAA's all-time leader in rushing scores and won the Doak Walker Award as the nation's top running back.

Hammock returned to DeKalb as an assistant coach in 2005-06. In his first season, NIU Hall of Famer Garrett Wolfe rushed for 1,580 yards and 16 touchdowns in just nine games as NIU won the MAC West Division and appeared in the MAC Championship Game for the first time.

During the 2006 campaign, Wolfe rushed for an NCAA-best 1,928 yards as the Huskies reached the Poinsettia Bowl. Hammock helped Wolfe earn All-America and first team All-MAC honors in both 2005 and 2006. Wolfe was also the Vern Smith Leadership Award winner as the MAC's Most Valuable Player in 2006.

Hammock spent the 2007-10 seasons as the running backs coach at the University of Minnesota, helping the Golden Gophers to the Insight Bowl in both 2008 and 2009. Hammock was named the co-offensive coordinator at Minnesota for the 2010 season and the Gophers moved up 26 spots nationally in rushing and 34 spots in total offense.

Hammock earned his bachelor's degree in marketing from NIU in December 2002, and a master's in educational leadership and policy analysis from Wisconsin in 2004. He and his wife, Cheynnitha, also a NIU alum, have a daughter, Tierra, and a son, Thomas Douglas.

GAME 1: NIU 19, HOLY CROSS 17

August 30 | 2:30 pm (CT) | ESPN+ DeKalb, III. | Huskie Stadium | 10,569

The NIU defense held Holy Cross to just 217 yards of total offense as the Huskies outlasted the Holy Cross Crusaders, 19-17, at Huskie Stadium in the season opener for both teams.

NIU (1-0) allowed just 62 rushing yards to the Crusaders and held Holy Cross to 3-for-12 on third down. Quinn Urwiler recorded a team-high 10 tackles, Muhammed Jammeh made seven while Ty Myles had six, including 1.5 tackles for loss.

Holy Cross (0-1) took its first lead of the game with 10:34 to play in the fourth quarter as Cal Swanson connected with Blake Youngblood for a 16-yard touchdown pass to give the Crusaders a 10-6 lead.

On the ensuing kickoff, the Huskies went back in front as redshirt-freshman Dev'ion Reynolds returned the kick 96 yards for a touchdown as NIU took a 12-10 lead. After the Huskie defense forced a three-and-out, the fifth of six NIU would record

in the contest, the Huskie offense went 61 yards in eight plays to go in front, 19-10.

DeAree Rogers had a 22-yard end around on the drive and Jaylen Poe had a 21-yard run to put the Huskies on the Holy Cross 2-yard line. One play later, Chavon Wright scored from a direct snap to put the Huskies in front by two scores with 4:15 remaining.

Wright finished with a game-high 77 yards rushing on 11 carries.

Holy Cross responded with a kick return touchdown of its own on the following play as Alijah Cason went 97 yards for the score, cutting the NIU lead to 19-17.

The Crusaders got the ball back with 2:17 to play following an NIU punt, but the Huskie defense came up big again, forcing Holy Cross into a fourth-and-four that resulted in an incomplete pass as the Huskies claimed the season opening victory.

Josh Holst was 12-of-18 for 101 yards passing while Rogers caught a game-high seven passes for 73 yards.

The drive resulted in just a field goal, however, as the game was tied at three with 3:22 left in the second quarter.

The Huskies came back with a 12-play, 71-yard drive, culminating in a 39-yard field goal by Glass just before halftime as NIU took a 6-3 lead into the intermission.

NIÚ maintained its lead through a scoreless third quarter and into the fourth before Holy Cross took its lone, brief, lead of the contest.

The Northern Illinois University football team was within four points of the Maryland Terrapins into the fourth quarter at SECU Stadium, but a late Maryland touchdown gave the Terrapins a 20-9 win.

Running Backs Chavon Wright and Telly Johnson Jr. combined for 176 of NIU's 180 rushing yards. Wright led all players with 90 yards on 27 carries. Johnson had 86 yards on 10 carries including a 74-yard touchdown int he third quarter. Linebacker Quinn Urwiler led the Huskies' defense for the second straight game with 10 tackles. Filip Maciorowski added six tackles with a half-tackle for loss.

After trading punts to start the game, Maryland (2-0) got on the board with 4:30 to go in the first quarter on a 36-yard field goal by Sean O'Haire. Quarterback Malik Washington hit Dorian Fleming on a 48-yard pass to get the Terrapins to the NIU 22 yardline, but the NIU defense held strong to force the kick.

NIU (1-1) drove the ball to its own 45 yardline early in the second quarter, but were stopped on a fake punt run by Urwiler. The Terrapins then drove 47 yards in six plays, scoring on a 12-yard touchdown from Washington to Fleming to go up 10-0 with 8:46 to play until halftime.

The Huskies responded on their next drive. NIU went 75 yards in 19 plays, taking 8:37 off the clock. An Andrew Glass 20-yard field goal made the score 10-3 with 0:03 left in the half. Quarterback Josh Holst was 4-for-4 passing on the drive for 36 yards. He found DeAree Rogers on a third and nine for 11 yards and George Dimopoulos for eight yards on a fourth and two to keep the drive alive.

Maryland (2-0) extended its lead on its first drive of the third quarter. The Terrapins drove to the NIU 11 yardline but were kept out of the end zone on an incomplete pass on third and 10. O'Haire made a 29-yard field goal to make the score 13-3 with 7:52 to play in the quarter. Johnson Jr. got NIU back in the game with a 74-yard touchdown run on the ensuing possession, the longest rush of his career, to get NIU within four at 13-9 with 6:22 to go in the third. NIU went for a two-point conversion but was not successful.

The Terrapins drove ball to the NIU seven yardline on its next drive, but Washington fumbled the ball and Jalonnie Williams fell on it for NIU with 1:24 to go in the third. However, NIU was unable to capitalize on the turnover and punted from deep in their own territory. Washington threw his second touchdown pass of the game with 9:20 to play, finding Shaleak Knotts from 12 yards out to make the score 20-9.

The Northern Illinois University football team trailed the Mississippi State Bull-dogs 14-10 at the half on Saturday at Davis Wade Stadium, but the hosts outscored NIU 24-0 in the second half to pull away for a 38-10 victory.

The Huskies were outgained 452-267 in the game with Mississippi State rushing for 292 yards. Josh Holst threw for a season-high 135 yards on 14-for-23 passing. DeAree Rogers caught six passes for 84 yards and his first NIU touchdown. Defensively Quinn Urwiler led all players with a career-high 14 tackles. Jasper Beeler added 10 tackles including a half-sack.

NIU (1-2) took the ball to start the game and scored on the opening drive. The Huskies drove 63-yards on 10 plays, highlighted by a 32-yard run by Telly Johnson Jr. to get the Huskies into Mississippi State territory. NIU's drive stalled at the Bulldogs' 12 yardline, where Andrew Glass made a 30-yard field goal to give NIU a 3-0 lead.

Mississippi State (4-0) drove 75 yards on its opening drive to go up 7-3 on a 10-yard end around by Brenen Thompson. The Bulldogs had to convert a 4th and one at the NIU 40 to keep its drive alive. NIU converted with its best field position early in the second quarter. The Huskies got the ball on a short Mississippi State punt at the Bulldogs' 27 yardline. Two plays later, Holst found Rogers in the end zone for a 21-yard touchdown pass to give NIU a 10-7 lead with 14:53 to go until halftime. Mississippi State answered with an eight-play drive capped by a one-yard touchdown pass from Blake Shapen to tight end Seydu Traore to go up 14-10 at the 11:31 mark, a lead the hosts took into halftime.

The Bulldogs extended their lead on the first drive of the second half. Mississippi State drove 75 yards in six plays, including a 45-yard pass from Shapen to Jordan Mosely, to score on a one-yard touchdown run by Davon Booth to go up 21-10 with 12:55 to go in the third. The Huskies were able to drive the football down to the Bulldogs 20 yardline on their next possession. On 3rd and 11, Holst threw a pass to the end zone that was intercepted by Isaac Smith. Mississippi State turned that turnover into three points on a Kyle Ferrie 48-yard field goal to go up 24-10. The Bulldogs tacked on two touchdowns in the fourth quarter.

GAME 4: SAN DIEGO STATE 6, NIU 3

Quinn Urwiler and Filip Maciorowski combined for 29 tackles on Saturday as the NIU defense kept the San Diego State Aztecs out of the end zone all day only for the visitors to win 6-3 on a last-second 25-yard field at Huskie Stadium.

Both of NIU's starting linebackers set career-highs in tackles Saturday. Urwiler led all players with 16 tackles, 10 of which were solo, and 2.5 tackles for loss. Maciorowski added a career-high 13 with a sack, 1.5 tackles for loss and a pass breakup. Redshirt-Senior safety Muhammad Jammeh had his second interception of the season with Jasper Beeler picking off his first pass of the season.

On the opening drive of the contest, NIU (1-3) used nearly eight minutes to go 62 yards in 16 plays, capped by a 31-yard field goal from Andrew Glass. The Huskies converted a pair of third downs and a fourth down on Chavon Wright rush on the drive as they took a 3-0 lead midway through the opening quarter. Quarterback Josh Holst gained 32 yards on five carries on the drive.

San Diego State (3-1) answered with a long drive of its own that ended in a field goal. The Aztecs went 63 yards in 13 plays, taking just over seven minutes, culminating in a 30-yard field goal from Gabriel Plasencia on the first play of the second quarter to tie the game 3-3. After a three-and-out by the NIU offense, the Aztecs drove into NIU territory to the Huskies' 46 yardline. On fourth down and one, Montrel Canion and Dasean Dixon stopped San Diego State running back Christian Washington to force a turnover on downs. The Aztecs outgained NIU 136-74 but those sides went into the halftime locker room tied at 3-3.

Jammeh provided a spark to start the second half. On the second play of the third quarter the safety intercepted Aztecs quarterback Jayden Denegal and the Huskies took over from their own 27. NIU's offense did not take advantage, going three plays and out and punting. The two defenses combined to allow 82 yards in the quarter as the game stayed deadlocked 3-3.

The two sides traded punts until San Diego State got the ball at its own 44 with 1:44 to play in regulation. Aztecs running back Lucky Sutton ran the ball five times to get the ball down to the NIU 11 yardline. A penalty set up San Diego State for a field goal try from the six yardline with 0:02 left. Plasencia knocked it through to give the Aztecs the 6-3 win.

San Diego State outgained NIU 266-179 in the game. The Huskies held the Aztecs 115 passing yards marking the 30th straight game NIU has held its opponent under 300 yards. Telly Johnson Jr. led the Huskies with 53 rushing yards. DeAree Rogers had five receptions for 51 yards. It was his third game with at least five receptions.

The Northern Illinois University football team built a 14-0 lead in the first quarter Saturday afternoon against the Miami RedHawks at Huskie Stadium, but the visitors rattled off 25 unanswered points to win 25-14 and retain the Mallory Cup.

NIU's (1-4) starting backfield of freshmen Brady Davidson and Lazaro Rogers combined for 185 yards of total offense on Saturday. Rogers got the Huskies out to a very fast start, scoring on NIU's first play from scrimmage. After the NIU defense forced Miami to punt from the Huskies' 37 yardline, Rogers took a handoff 76 yards to the end zone to put NIU up 7-0 with 10:18 to play in the opening quarter.

The Huskies forced a three-and-out on Miami's next possession and took over at their own 35 yardline. Davidson completed his first five passes of the drive, getting NIU into Miami territory on an eight-yard pass to DeAree Rogers. Chavon Wright kept the drive alive with a fourth down conversion at the Miami 39, running for three yards on fourth-and-one. On third-and-eight from the Miami 17 Davidson found a wide open Jake Appleget in the end zone for a touchdown pass that put NIU up 14-0 with 3:23 to play in the first.

Miami (2-3) answered with a 1-yard touchdown run on the first play of the second quarter. D'Shawntae Jones scored to cap a 7-play, 75-yard drive for the RedHawks that cut the NIU lead to 14-7. The RedHawks added a 41-yard field goal from Dom Dzioban with 4:51 to play in the second quarter as NIU took a 14-10 lead into halftime.

The Huskies got the ball to start the second half but an interception gave Miami a short field starting at the Huskie 28-yard line. The NIU defense held the RedHawks to a 45-yard field goal by Dzioban to hang on to a 14-13 lead with 13:30 to play in the third quarter. Two minutes later Miami's Jermaine Agee then blocked a Huskie punt out of the back of the end zone for a safety as the RedHawks took their first lead of the contest, 15-14.

On the ensuing Miami drive, quarterback Dequan Finn connected with Deion Colzie for an eight-yard touchdown on third and goal to give Miami a 22-14 lead midway through the third. The RedHawks went 50 yards in five plays on the drive, which included a 21-yard scramble by Finn the first play from midfield.

The NIU offense was held to 47 yards in the second half. Miami tacked on a field goal late in the fourth quarter to make the final score 25-14.

Saturday's game was the Mid-American Conference opener for both teams. The RedHawks outgained NIU 367-220 and had 22 first downs to the Huskies' 11. Lazaro Rogers led all players with 98 rushing yards. Davidson threw for 106 yards, a touchdown and an interception in his first career start.

The Northern Illinois University football team rushed for a season-high 238 yards on Oct. 11 but the Eastern Michigan Eagles outscored the Huskies 10-0 in the fourth quarter to come away with a 16-10 victory at Rynearson Stadium.

Sophomore running back Telly Johnson Jr. rushed for a career-high 159 yards on 12 carries, including an 80-yard touchdown run to highlight his third career 100-yard rushing game. Defensively Jasper Beeler led NIU with a career-high 11 tackles. Roy Williams and Muhammad Jammeh each had a career-high nine tackles with Williams adding a tackle for loss.

Down 6-3 at halftime, NIU (1-5, 0-2 MAC) had a chance to wrest the momentum away from the Eagles early in the third quarter. A six-yard touchdown pass from Kim to tight end Josh Long capped a nine-play, 64-yard drive that gave the Eagles a 13-10 lead with 8:31 remaining. The Eagles then got a turnover as Davidson was intercepted by Bryce Llewellyn who ran the ball back to the NIU 15 with 7:48 to go. The Huskies held Eastern Michigan to a 28-yard field goal from Rudy Kessinger to stay within a touchdown at 16-10 with 5:40 left.

The Huskies had a chance to tie the game with 2:18 to go, getting the ball at their own 20 yardline after a touchback on a punt. On third-and-six from the 24 Davidson found DeAree Rogers for a 17-yard pass to move the chains to the 41 yardline. NIU got an extra five yards on an EMU delay of game penalty. Davidson made another big throw on fourth-and-four from the EMU 48, connecting with Givens for a 21-yard reception to the 27 yardline with under a minute to go in the game. However, the drive stalled their as four straight incompletions led to a turnover on downs and one Eastern Michigan kneel down to end the game.

GAME 7: OHIO 48, NIU 21

The Northern Illinois University football team could not overcome the Ohio Bobcats' rushing attack Saturday afternoon in a 48-21 loss at Peden Stadium.

Ohio (4-3, 2-1 MAC) ran for 333 yards and had over 500 yards of total offense on the day. The Huskies' 21 points were a season-high on 293 yards of offense.

NIÚ (1-6, 0-3 MAC) threw for a season-high 161 yards on Saturday as Josh Holst had two touchdown passes. Holst was 21-for-29 passing in the game, the second-most completions in his career. Junior wide receiver DeAree Rogers tied a season-high with seven receptions and had a season-high 107 yards.

The Bobcats took control early, forcing NIU into a three-and-out on its first possession. Chase Hendricks then returned a punt 53 yards to the NIU 14 yardline and two plays later Sieh Bangura scored on a two-yard touchdown run to put the Bobcats up 7-0 2:13 into the game. Ohio took a 14-0 lead with 4:53 to go in the first quarter when quarterback Parker Navarro's nine-yard touchdown run capped an 11-play, 91-yard drive. Bangura made it 21-0 early in the second quarter, scoring his second rushing touchdown with 12:13 to go.

Dev'ion Reynolds gave the Huskies a spark with a 67-yard kickoff return to the Ohio 20 yardline. After a third-down conversion on a 10-yard reception by Jake Appleget, Holst hit redshirt-freshman Devon Akers for a seven-yard touchdown pass on Akers' first career reception at the 10:08 mark. The Huskies then went for a two-point conversion and got the points on a Holst screen pass to George Dimopoulos to make the score 21-8. The NIU defense got two stops late in the quarter, forcing an Ohio punt from the Huskies' 36 and getting an interception as freshman James Finley IV picked off Navarro in the end zone with 0:11 left in the first half.

The Bobcats took a 27-8 lead early in the third quarter on a 66-yard Duncan Brune touchdown run, but missed the extra point. Ohio led 34-8 when Holst threw his second touchdown pass of the game, a 50-yard strike up the sideline to Rogers that made the score 34-14 with 6:04 to play in the quarter. The pass was the longest of the season for NIU.

Ohio responded with a one-yard Bangura touchdown run on the first play of the fourth quarter to go up 41-14. NIU then drove 75 yards on eight plays with Chavon Wright punching in a one-yard touchdown run to make it 41-21 with 12:08 to play in the game. Holst combined with Rogers on two passes for 41 yards, including a 22-yard throw to the Ohio one yardline, and also ran for 24 yards.

The Northern Illinois University football team rushed for over 300 yards and forced three turnovers on defense to reclaim the Bronze Stalk trophy in a 21-7 win over the Ball State Cardinals at Huskie Stadium.

Chavon Wright led all players with a season-high 166 rushing yards on 37 carries. Telly Johnson Jr. also rushed for 100 yards and a touchdown. Quarterback Josh Holst ran for a touchdown and also threw a touchdown pass to DeAree Rogers.

NIU (2-6, 1-3 MAC) broke a 7-7 tie on its first drive of the second half. The Huskies converted a fourth-and-one from the NIU 31 on a two-yard run by Wright to keep the drive alive. Holst found Rogers for 22 yards on a third-and-nine to get into Ball State territory. Wright added an 18-yard run to get the Huskies to the red zone. Holst capped the 15-play, 78-yard drive with a seven-yard touchdown run to make the score 14-7 with 7:26 to go in the third quarter.

The Huskies' defense got the ball back with 3:45 to play in the third when James Finley intercepted a Kiael Kelly pass at the NIU seven yardline. NIU ran the ball six straight times to get the ball to the 34, but a Nathan Voorhis sack forced a punt. Jake Ference booted the football to the Ball State 37 yardline where Joedrick Lewis muffed the punt. Marc Pretto fell on the loose ball and the Huskies got the ball back at the 33. Four plays later Holst threw a 14-yard touchdown pass to Rogers to put the Huskies up by 14, 21-7, with 13:59 to play.

Ball State (3-5, 2-2) had a chance to get back in the game, driving down to the NIU four yardline with 5:00 to go. On second-and-goal, Jay'shon Thomas sacked Kelly to set up third-and-goal from the 13. Jasper Beeler intercepted Kelly in the end zone to get NIU the ball back with under 4:00 to go.

NIU scored on it's opening possession after forcing a Ball State three-and-out to start the game. On the third play of the drive Johnson ran 53 yards for his third touchdown of the season to give the Huskies a 7-0 lead with 11:41 to play in the first quarter. The NIU defense held Ball State without a first down on the Cardinals' first three possessions. Ball State tied the game early in the second quarter when Kelly connected with Drew Cassens on a one-yard touchdown pass with 13:30 to go until halftime.

The Huskies outgained Ball State 370-275 with 305 yards on the ground. NIU was 9-for-16 on third down while holding the Cardinals to 6-for-15. Quinn Urwiler led all players with 14 tackles. Thomas had two of NIU's four sacks in the game, the first two of his career. Mark Hensley had seven tackles and a sack. Filip Maciorowski also had a sack, a forced fumble and four tackles.

The Northern Illinois University football team was held to three points and 203 yards of offense in a 42-3 loss to the Toledo Rockets at the Glass Bowl Wednesday night.

The Rockets entered the game ranking third in the nation in total defense, fourth in passing defense and 10th in scoring defense. NIU threw for 141 yards in the game with redshirt-freshman Rickey Taylor Jr. catching three passes for a career-high 69 yards.

Toledo (5-4, 3-2 MAC) got off to a fast start when Trayvon Rudolph returned the opening kickoff 96 yards for a touchdown, giving the Rockets a 7-0 lead. The Huskies got on the board with a 12-play, 42-yard drive that culminated in a 50-yard Andrew Glass field goal, his longest of the season, to make the score 7-3. Josh Holst converted a 3rd-and-9 with a 14-yard pass to DeAree Rogers to the Toledo 49. NIU nearly had the drive stall at midfield before a Toledo penalty on 4th-and-3 kept the drive alive.

After trading punts twice, the Rockets extended their lead early in the second quarter. A 23-yard pass from quarterback Tucker Gleason to Terrell Crosby Jr. got Toledo to the NIU two yardline. Gleason punched it in with a two-yard touchdown run to give the Rockets a 14-3 lead with 11:01 to go in the half. The Huskies went three plays and out on their following possession. Toledo went up 21-3 on a nine-play, 68-yard drive in 4:23 culminating in a Chip Trayanum five-yard touchdown run. The Rockets tacked on one more touchdown in the first half to take a 28-3 halftime lead.

NIU (2-7, 1-4 MAC) had a chance to get on the board to start the second half. A 41-yard pass from Holst to Taylor Jr. got the Huskies to the Toledo 20 yardline. Glass tried a 43-yard field goal but missed to end a 49-yard drive that took 3:23 off the clock. Toledo's Kenji Christian scored two touchdowns in the second half to make the final score 42-3.

The Rockets amassed 443 yards of total offense and were 9-for-14 on third down while holding NIU to 2-for-16. Gleason threw for 309 yards and two touchdowns, snapping NIU's 34-game streak of holding its opponent under 300 yards passing.

Quinn Urwiler had double digit tackles for the eighth time this season, leading all players with 13. Filip Maciorowski added 11 tackles and a tackle for loss.

The Northern Illinois University football team scored a season-high 45 points and rushed for 318 yards in a 45-3 victory at McGuirk Alumni Stadium against the Massachusetts Minutemen Wednesday night.

Quarterback Jalen Macon made his first start at NIU and accounted for four touchdowns. Macon rushed for a game-high 98 yards and three touchdowns, adding 73 passing yards and a touchdown. He is the first NIU quarterback since Rocky Lombardi in the 2021 Mid-American Conference championship game to have three rushing touchdowns in a game. Chavon Wright added 86 yards on 12 carries with a touchdown.

NIU got off to a fast start as freshman linebacker Kimar Nelson blocked a punt from midfield, giving the Huskies the ball at the UMass 25 with 12:17 left in the first quarter. Andrew Glass made a 37-yard field goal to give the Huskies a 3-0 lead at the 10:41 mark. The Huskies went up 10-0 with 4:53 to go when Macon ran in a 13-yard touchdown, capping an 11-play, 66-yard drive that took 5:06 off the clock. Macon had 29 rushing yards on the drive with Wright adding 31, including a 22-yard run that got the Huskies to the UMass 32 yardline.

UMass drove down to the NIU 21 on its next drive, highlighted by a 21-yard pass from AJ Hairston to Brandon Hood. The Minutemen had 4th-and-2 from the NIU 21 and went for it on the first play of the second quarter. Hairston's pass fell incomplete and the Huskies took the ball over on downs. NIU took advantage of the turnover and hit it's longest pass play of the year to go up 17-0. On 2nd-and-8 from the NIU 33 Macon hit Elijah Porter over the middle for a 67-yard touchdown with 11:42 to go in the first half, Porter's first career score and Macon's first passing touchdown as a Huskie.

The Huskies scored two more touchdowns in the first half. The first came after a 49-yard UMass field goal miss. NIU drove x yards on 10 plays with Wright punching in a one-yard touchdown run to make the score 24-0 with 2:29 to play in the half. On the Minutemen's ensuing possession Lance Ingold (Rochester, Ill./Rochester) sacked Brandon Rose, forcing a fumble that Dasean Dixon recovered at the UMass 13 yardline with 2:00 to go. Macon ran the ball twice on the drive, one carry for 12 yards and the second for a one-yard touchdown run to put NIU ahead 31-0.

NIÚ quickly went up 38-0 in the third quarter. The Huskies drove 73 yards in six plays with Macon scoring his third touchdown of the night on a 36-yard run at the 12:05 mark. The Huskies defense forced another turnover on downs on the Minutemen's next possession as Filip Maciorowski stopped Hairston short on fourth down to give NIU the ball at its own 48 yardline. Two plays later, Brady Davidson found Gary Givens in the end zone for a 31-yard touchdown reception to make the score 45-0 with 8:16 to go in the third. UMass got on the board with 6:13 to play in the game. Derek Morris capped a 12-play, 73-yard drive with a 44-yard field goal to make the final score 45-3.

GAME 11: WESTERN MICHIGAN 35, NIU 19

The Northern Illinois University football team got out to a 13-0 lead early in the second quarter on Nov. 18 at Huskie Stadium against Western Michigan, but the Broncos ran away with a 35-19 win in NIU's final midweek MACtion game.

The two teams combined for 535 rushing yards on the night with Western Michigan outgaining NIU 361-174. Chavon Wright rushed for 92 yards on 21 carries. Telly Johnson Jr. had 42 yards on six carries. Defensively, Jasper Beeler had 13 tackles and an interception. Quinn Urwiler added 11 tackles, his 10th game this season with double-digit stops.

NIU (3-8, 2-5 MAC) marched 75 yards in eight plays on the first drive of the game, capped by a 43-yard touchdown run from Johnson. The Huskies picked up all 75 yards on the ground as Wright had six carries for 32 yards on the drive before Johnson broke loose for the score with 11:21 to play in the first quarter.

The Huskies then forced a Western Michigan turnover on their first offensive play from scrimmage as a pass attempt was tipped by Jacob Finley (Birmingham, Ala./Hoover) and picked off by Beeler at the Broncos 19 yardline. NIU converted the turnover into points as Andrew Glass connected on a 39-yard field goal to give NIU a 10-0 lead less than six minutes into the opening quarter.

On the opening drive of the second quarter, Glass added a 41-yard field goal as the Huskies extended their lead to 13-0 with 11:45 to go until halftime.

Western Michigan (7-4, 6-1 MAC) converted good field position into its first points of the game as an 18-yard touchdown run from quarterback Broc Lowry with 6:13 to play in the half. The Broncos had taken over on the 50-yard line following a Huskie punt and need just two plays to find the end zone.

Following a turnover on downs by NIU, the Broncos again had good field position at the NIU 39 and Western Michigan took the lead in the final minute of the half as Jalen Buckley scored from eight yards out with 40 seconds left to give Western Michigan a 14-13 advantage at the half.

Western Michigan made it touchdowns on three consecutive drives as they opened the second half with a 12-play, 89-yard drive, finished off by an 8-yard touchdown run from Lowry as the Broncos led 21-13 with 8:11 left in the third quarter. NIU's two drives in the third quarter both resulted in punts.

Buckley scored his second touchdown of the contest early in the fourth quarter as Western Michigan took a 28-13 lead, capping a 15-play, 76-yard drive as the Broncos went in front by two scores with 9:46 left to play. Two minutes later, a special teams miscue gave Western Michigan the ball at the Huskie 5-yard line. Lowry scored his third touchdown of the game two plays later.

Brady Davidson led the Huskies on a 10-play, 75-yard drive to get NIU within 16, 35-19, with 4:25 to go in the game. The freshman quarterback connected with Rickey Taylor Jr. (Chicago, Ill./Brother Rice) from 18 yards out in the corner of the end zone for the touchdown, his first as a Huskie.
