FGCU GRABS PRESEASON TOP SPOT; GOODWIN & AMINU COLLECT INDIVIDUAL HONORS

LAKEPOINT, GA -- After winning back-to-back ASUN Conference Men's Basketball Championship titles, FGCU was voted the favorites to three-peat in the Preseason Coaches & Media Polls. Lipscomb, which finished second during the regular season last year, was voted second in both polls, while North Florida followed the Bisons in third.

FGCU senior guard Brandon Goodwin was the unanimous selection for Preseason Player of the Year by the league's head coaches. He was a unanimous ASUN Newcomer of the Year last season and capped off his incredible year with ASUN Championship MVP honors after leading the Eagles to their third ASUN Men's Basketball Championship crown. Goodwin scored 18.2 PPG last season.

North Florida's Wajid Aminu took home the ASUN Preseason Defensive Player of the Year award. The reigning ASUN Freshman of the Year had 36 blocks last season, 20 of them coming in conference play. That mark set a new UNF freshman single-season record. He also corralled 6.5 rebounds per game.

NJIT rounded out the final selection by the league's head coaches and media poll.

A victory would also match a career-best winning streak for head coach Brian Kennedy, whose team also won three in a row last season from Dec. 22 - Jan. 4, 2016 (Dean College, at Stony Brook, Brown). The last Highlanders' winning streak of greater than three was a five-game surge during the 2015-16 season, when they scored victories against Kennesaw State (2), Lipscomb, Stetson and FGCU from Jan. 30 through Feb. 13 under Jim Engles.

MUSIC CITY MIRACLE!:

NJIT had an improbable comeback victory on Saturday at Lipscomb, erasing a 10-point deficit with 3:35 left to play. The Highlanders scored the final 14 points of the game for a 81-77 win. Sophomore Anthony Tarke scored nine points in the run -- including the go-ahead triple with 51 seconds remaining to give NJIT its first lead of the second half. Tarke tied his career-high with 27 points while setting a career-high five treys. Junior Abdul Lewis also scored 27 points -- his career high -- while notching game-highs in rebounds (13), assists (5) and blocks (4). The last of his career-high-tying four swats came on a game-tying shot attempt by Kenny Cooper with just 11 seconds remaining. The win snapped the Highlanders' four-game skid to the Bisons.

AB-NORMAL WEEK:

On Monday, junior Abdul Lewis was named ASUN Player of the Week for Jan. 29 through Feb. 4 -- becomes the second Highlanders player to earn weekly honors this season. It also marked the first time in his career he received the award. Aside from his monster performance at Lipscomb on Saturday, the Newark native paced NJIT with 20 points while grabbing a team-high-tying eight boards in a 74-71 home victory over Kennesaw State on Monday... Overall, Lewis stuffed the stat sheet over the pair of games, averaging 23.5 points, 10.5 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 3.0 blocks per game. He also shot a very efficient 68.0-percent (17-for-25) from the floor and a perfect 2-for-2 from beyond the arc... Earlier this season, sophomore Antony Tarke became the first Highlander to earn ASUN Player of the Week honors when he averaged 19.0 ppg, 5.0 rpg, 3.0 apg and 1.5 spg over a pair of contests from Dec. 11-17

THOU SHALT STEAL!:

NJIT ranks 15th in the nation and first the ASUN in steals per game at 8.3 -- a total that is 0.8 spg higher than the second best mark in the conference held by Jacksonville (7.5)... The Highlanders boast five players in the Top 18 of the ASUN in spg, as freshman Zach Cooks leads the team and ranks seventh (1.6), sophomore Anthony Tarke sits 11th (1.3), juniors Reilly Walsh and Diandre Wilson are tied for 14th (1.2) and sophomore Shyquan Gibbs rounds out the group at 18th (1.0).

DEFENSE WINS...:

With their 66-60 win at Kennesaw State on Jan. 24, the Highlanders made it four-straight game in holding opponents under 70 points. Last Thursday (Jan. 18), NJIT posted a 91-59 home win over North Florida -- becoming just the third team this season to hold the ASUN's top scoring offense (80.2) to under 60 points (Missouri, LSU)... NJIT ranks second in the ASUN in scoring defense, allowing 72.3 points per game (FGCU leads at 68.9 ppg)... The Highlanders' efforts have also included holding high-scoring Drexel (79.0) to 53 points on Nov. 25, LIU Brooklyn (82.9) to 69 points on Nov. 28, UMass Lowell (83.1) to 65 on Dec. 3 and FGCU (79.2) to 68 on Jan. 13... Last year, NJIT finished second in the ASUN at 74.8 ppg.

TARKE DIRTY TO ME!:

Sophomore **Anthony Tarke** has been on a scoring barrage, tallying a career-high 27 points twice over his last four games (Jan. 24 at KSU; Feb. 3 at LU) -- during which time he's averaging 23.0 ppg (92). He's now reached the 20-point plateau seven times this season... Further, Tarke has led (or co-led) NJIT in scoring in 12 of the last 18 contests -- and 13 times overall. During these last 18 affairs, he's averaging **17.4** ppg (314) and **6.7** rpg (120)... At Rutgers (Dec. 12), the Gaithersburg, Md., native recorded game-highs in both points (19) and rebounds (12) for his first double-double of the season and fourth of his career... *Going back to last season, Tarke has led NJIT in scoring in 16 of the last 27 (59.3%) games, averaging 16.0 ppg (431) in the span.*

- He currently ranks 7th in the ASUN in ppg (15.7); 4th in conference play (18.0).
- He also sits 8th in rpg (6.1), 8th in bpg (0.8), 11th in spg (1.3), 23rd in apg (1.8).
- He was named ASUN Player of the Week for Dec. 11-17, averaging 19.0 ppg, 5.0 rpg, 3.0 apg in 2 G.
- The preseason All-ASUN selection and member of the 2017 ASUN All-Freshman finished his first NCAA campaign ranked sixth in the ASUN in FG% (.522), ninth in spg (1.1), tied for ninth in o-rpg (1.6) 18th in rpg (4.7) and 24th in ppg (9.9).
- His total of 307 points was the most by an NJIT freshman since Damon Lynn scored 500 points in 2013-14. Tarke also led all freshmen in scoring in ASUN conference play at 12.5 ppg.

AB-NORMAL!:

Junior **Abdul Lewis** was named *NJHoops.com* Division-I Player of the Week on Jan. 22 and ASUN Player of the Week on Feb. 5 -- when he averaged 23.5 ppg, 10.5 rpg, 4.0 apg and 3.0 bpg over two contests from Jan. 29 through Feb. 4. He also shot a very efficient 68.0-percent (17-for-25) from the floor and a 2-for-2 from deep.

- Over his last five games, he's averaging 17.0 ppg (85), 9.2 rpg (46) and 2.4 bpg (12), shooting .674 (31-for-46) from the floor.
- Earlier this season, Lewis had another monster performance against LIU Brooklyn on Nov. 28 in which he posted game-highs in points (23) and rebounds (18) while dishing out a team-high four assists. The Newark native was one point shy of his career-high scoring output set at Florida Gulf Coast on Jan. 21, 2017, and one rebound short of his NJIT single-game record of 19 set Jan. 19, 2017 at Stetson.
- Lewis ranks second the ASUN in rpg (8.3) a figure that ranks **77th** in Division-I. He leads the conference in offensive rpg (3.0), which ranks **52nd** in the nation.
- He also sits 17th among all active D-I players in career rebounding average at **8.4** rpg. He has led (or co-led) NJIT in rebounds in 13 of his 22 games this season.
- The junior also ranks fourth in the ASUN in bpg (1.0), sixth in FG% (.525), 15th in apg (2.0) and 19th in ppg (11.5)... He's averaging 14.7 ppg in ASUN play.
- The 6'10" big also ranks second in the conference -- and **99th** in the nation -- in double-doubles (6) after starting his season with 12 points and a game-high 12 rebounds against Wagner (Nov. 11) and 10 points and a game-high 15 rebounds against Lafayette (Nov. 14)... He logged five double-doubles in his first year at NJIT in 2016-17, one short of Tim Coleman's team-high
- Going back to last season, the South Alabama transfer is averaging 12.5 ppg (426) and 8.9 rpg (303) over his last 34 contests.
 - Last year, Lewis also set the NJIT single-season rebounding record (264).

WHAT'S COOKIN'?:

Zach Cooks is averaging 8.0 ppg this season — a figure that ranks fifth among all ASUN freshmen. He also ranks fifth in NJIT program history for freshmen scoring.

- During ASUN play, he is averaging 10.0 ppg (90) while shooting .466 FG (27-for-58) and a spectacular .586 3FG (17-for-29) from deep -- which leads the league.
- For the season, the Lawrenceville, Ga., native ranks third in the ASUN in 3FG% (.455), seventh in spg (1.6), t16th in apg (2.0) and 35th in ppg (8.0).

DON'T FORGET ABOUT 'DRE:

Junior **Diandre Wilson** led NJIT in scoring with a career-high 23 points at Buffalo on Dec. 28. He has led the Highlanders in points in three of the last 11 affairs and in four overall this season. Over his past 14 contests, the junior is averaging **10.4** ppg (146) while shooting **.429** (24-for-56) from deep. Twice this season, he scored 10+ points in four-straight games (Nov. 22-30; Dec. 12-28).

- The transfer from Mott C.C. (Flint, Mich.) currently ranks sixth in the ASUN in 3FG% (.412), t14th in spg (1.2) and 24th in ppg (10.6).
 - In his college career, he is averaging 17.9 ppg between Mott (NJCAA) and NJIT.
- It took just two games for Wilson make his presence felt at the D-I level, as he scored a game-high 20 points versus Lafayette on Nov. 14 -- shooting an impressive 7-for-9 from the floor, 3-for-4 from deep.
 - The Fort Lauderdale native scored 1,253 career points in two seasons at Mott.
- Last year, he ranked 11th in the nation with 22.3 ppg en route to being honored as a NJCAA All-American First-Team selection. Wilson scored in double-figures in 29 games and posted six 30-plus-point efforts in guiding Mott to a 25-7 record and a trip to the NJCAA District 10 Tournament semifinals.
- As a freshman in 2015-16, he led the nation in free throw attempts (290) and ranked 19th in scoring (19.5 ppg).

ONCE BITTEN, TWICE SHY!:

Sophomore **Shyquan Gibbs** committed one turnover against Colgate on Dec. 12 -- snapping a streak of five-consecutive games without a TO from Nov. 28 through

- Dec. 9. During the remarkable streak, the point guard played 123 minutes and handed out 10 assists. Still, over the past 19 games, he's recorded 39 assists with just 16 turnovers in 428 minutes -- an average of one TO every 26.8 minutes.
- Gibbs currently ranks sixth in the ASUN in assists-to-turnover ratio (2.0), 18th in spg (1.0) and 21st in apg (1.9).
- He would rank fourth in the ASUN in three-point field-goal percentage (.450; 18-for-40) if he had enough attempts to qualify (KSU's Masterson leads at .495).

F-U-N vs. U-N-F:

Last Thursday (Jan. 18), NJIT enjoyed a 91-59 home defeat of UNF. The 32-point margin of victory was the Highlanders' largest in an ASUN contest and their biggest win over a Division-I opponent since a 94-51 rout of Longwood University on Feb. 25, 2012. Eleven different players scored for NJIT, which finished with 25 assists—the team's highest output against a Division-I opponent this season. In fact, starters combined to shoot 20-for-29 (.690) FG, 8-9 (.889) 3FG. The Highlanders finished at 52.9-percent (37-for-70) from the floor and for the game and 50.0-percent (11-for-22) from beyond the arc.

#PROTECTTHEWEC:

After calling Fleisher Athletic Center "home" for the past 50 years, NJIT has a new court in the state-of-the-art Wellness and Events Center (WEC) beginning with the 2017-18 season -- and have started 11-4... The WEC is a three story, 220,000-square-foot building that features a 3,500-seat basketball arena that compares favorably with many Division-I mid-major facilities throughout the country. The design of the \$102 M building features a number of flexible spaces that can be quickly configured to support the numerous and varied missions of the university community. Designed and engineered by AECOM and built by Torcon, the exterior design reinforces the university's position as a leader in engineering and technology education, featuring a 52-foot-high glass wall on the north facade that offers an excellent view of the adjacent athletic field as well as NJIT's academic campus. Previously, the Highlanders played in Fleisher Athletic Center since 1967 and posted an 8-4 record there last season and an 87-60 mark during its Division-I era.

Forward **San Antonio Brinson** (Augusta, Ga.) in a 6-foot-8, 200-pounder arrives at NJIT as one of the highest-rated recruits in program history after attending South Kent School (CT)... **Zach Cooks** (Lawrenceville, Ga.), who figures to handle a share of the point guard duties, displayed both excellent ball-handling and play-making abilities while at Berkmar High School in Eilburn, Ga... **Shawndale Jones** (Pittsburgh, Pa.) is a 6-3 combo guard who athleticism shined not only on the hardwood, but also on the gridiron as a WR/CB at The Kiski School in Saltsburg, Pa. In its recap of all ASUN early signings, *Hoopseen.com* commented that Jones "could be the steal of the class"... Guard **David Kachelries** (Emmaus, Pa.), described as playing with an incredibly high motor, finished his high school career as Emmaus' all-time leading scorer with 1,910 points.

THREE MORE HIGHLANDERS GO PRO:

Three members of NJIT's Class of 2017 are playing basketball professionally. Guard **Damon Lynn** (Hillside, NJ) was signed by BC Šiauliai of the Lithuanian Basketball League (LVL). Meanwhile, guards **Tim Coleman** (Union, NJ) and **Rob Ukawuba** (East Brunswick, NJ) both signed in the National Basketball League of Canada.

HIGHLANDERS SIGN KJELL DE GRAAF FOR 2018:

NJIT men's basketball head coach Brian Kennedy announced that Kjell De Graaf has signed a national letter of intent to attend NJIT and play basketball for the Highlanders beginning in the fall of 2018.

De Graaf, a 6-foot-10 native of Rotterdam, Netherlands, is currently playing for the Canarias Basketball Academy in Gran Canaria, Spain. This season, he is averaging 14.5 points per game and 7.2 rebounds per game while shooting 45-percent from three-point territory for the Elite A Team.

"We are very excited to have Kjell join our family here at NJIT," said Kennedy. "He is regarded as one of the highest rated scholar-athletes in all of Europe and plays at the prestigious school, The Academy in Spain/Gran Canaria."

The Academy, considered the top prep school in Europe both academically and athletically, has sent over 80 players to Division-I schools in recent years.

A very good student, De Graaf is interested in NJIT's Honors Program and in studying either chemical engineering or biomedical engineering. He is currently a post-graduate student after spending his first two years of high school at The Thornbecke Voortgezet Ondrewijsin (Holland) and his last two at The Canterbury School (Gran Canaria, Spain).

De Graaf has also played on the Netherlands Junior National Team since he was 14 years old and was a member of the 14u European Championship team in 2013. He committed to NJIT after also considering Fordham, New Mexico, Old Dominion, Bucknell and Gonzaga.

NJIT is coming off an 81-77 come-from-behind victory at Lipscomb on Saturday, while the Eagles pulled away in the second half en route to an 80-55 win over Jack-

The Highlanders have won three of their last four overall and are 10-4 at the WEC this season.

This is a matchup of the top two scoring defenses in the ASUN as FGCU allows 68.9 ppg this year to lead the league and NJIT ranks second at 72.3 ppg.

All-Time Series

FGCU leads the all-time series by a 4-1 count after capturing a 68-54 victory on Jan. 13 in Fort Myers.

The Highlanders hung with the Eagles for all 40 minutes, but fell short as FGCU held the visitors to just 26 points and 29.0% shooting (9-of-31) from the floor in the second half.

Florida Gulf Coast led 36-28 at halftime in the first meeting between the two teams.

Freshman guard Zach Cooks paced NJIT with 12 points on 3-of-4 shooting from downtown, while classmate Shawndale Jones came through with 11 points of his

Senior guard Brandon Goodwin had a game-high 21 points and 10 rebounds to lead the way offensively for the Eagles, while junior guard Zach Johnson chipped in 19 points, six rebounds and four assists.

In the last meeting in Newark on Feb. 16, 2017, FGCU outscored the Highlanders by a 43-31 margin in the second half as part of an 80-73 victory.

In the 80-55 win at Jacksonville on Saturday, the Eagles outscored the Dolphins by a 47-30 margin in the second half after holding an eight point edge at halftime.

FGCU shot 54.3% (19-of-35) from the floor in the final 20 minutes.

Johnson had a game-high 25 points on 10-of-16 shooting to lead the Eagles, while Goodwin added 24 and junior guard Dinero Mercurius chipped in with 11.

Head coach Joe Dooley's squad has now won 11 straight dating back to an 80-60 loss at Rhode Island on Dec. 27.

The Eagles are one of 12 teams in the country that are undefeated in league play (Vermont-America East, Cincinnati-AAC, Rhode Island-Atlantic 10, Virginia-ACC, Montana-Big Sky, Purdue-Big Ten, Penn-Ivy League, East Tennessee State-Southern, Louisiana-Sun Belt, Saint Mary's-West Coast, New Mexico State-WAC).

2017-18 NJIT MEN'S BASKETBALL SEASON PREVIEW

After calling Fleisher Athletic Center "home" for the past 50 seasons, the NJIT men's basketball team will officially become a tenant of the state-of-the-art Wellness and Events Center (WEC) for its 2017-18 season opener on Nov. 11.

Not only will the Highlanders be revealing this brand new arena when they play host to Wagner, they will also be unveiling a much different look on the floor.

"2017-18 presents a new era for NJIT basketball," said NJIT Head Coach Brian Kennedy. "We have graduated arguably the top class in the school's history head-lined by All-American Damon Lynn and All-ASUN player Tim Coleman. They have been replaced by a solid recruiting class that will be called on to contribute right away along with our returning players."

The Highlanders lost four senior starters from last season, including the program's all-time leading scorer (Lynn) and all-time leading rebounder (Coleman). They also bid adieu to a venue in which the team posted an 8-4 record last season and an 87-60 mark during its Division-I era.

Just as it was not an easy process to erect the WEC, it will not be easy to replace Lynn's 2,153 career points or Coleman's 762 career rebounds. Yet, the key for the 2017-18 NJIT Highlanders men's basketball team may be summed up in one word: depth.

The Highlanders' high hopes heading into the 2016-17 season took a large hit when Lynn tore his Achilles just four games into conference play. Despite an impressive 8-8 start through a grueling non-conference schedule, NJIT finished 11-19 overall and seventh in the ASUN.

If there could be a "silver lining" to Lynn's absence, it came in the form of valu-

able, on-the-job experience for several key newcomers.

Two of those newcomers, junior Abdul Lewis (Newark, NJ) and sophomore Anthony Tarke (Gaithersburg, MD) were both impressive enough in their NJIT debuts to garner preseason All-ASUN honors this October. Another, freshman Shyquan Gibbs (Hillside, NJ), took over as the starting point guard for the last 12 games of the season and received a significant education in nearly 32 minutes per game during the span.

Added to the mix this season is the highest-rated recruiting class in the history of the program consisting of San Antonio Brinson (Augusta, GA), Zach Cooks (Lawrenceville, GA), David Kachelries (Emmaus, PA) and Shawndale Jones (Pittsburgh, PA).

In addition, the program added a high-scoring junior college transfer in Di-

andre Wilson (Fort Lauderdale, FL), who ranked 11th in the nation while averaging 22.3 point per game as a sophomore at Mott Community College in St. Flint, Mich., in 2016-17.

"We will definitely have one of the youngest teams in Division-I basketball this year," said Kennedy, whose roster features just one senior compared to seven underclassmen. "But we will be talented and will play a deep roster led by Abdul Lewis and Anthony Tarke, who are both entering their second year with the program."

FRONTCOURT

With a pair of preseason All-ASUN selections, NJIT could have one of the best front-courts in the conference. In fact, Lewis and Tarke were two of just three forwards to receive such honors.

Lewis, a 6-foot-10 product of Newark East Side High School, lived up to expectations in his first season at NJIT after transferring from University of South Alabama. He finished the season averaging 9.7 ppg and 8.5 rebounds per game while setting program records for single-season rebounds (264) and single-game rebounds (19). A two-time ASUN Newcomer of Week as a sophomore, Lewis' growth was evidenced by the fact he averaged 13.4 ppg and 8.5 rpg over 14 games in ASUN play.

Tarke, the first-ever Highlander selected to the postseason ASUN All-Freshman Team, became the focus of the offense following the Lynn injury. Over his last 14 games, he averaged 14.0 ppg while shooting .565 (74-for-131 FG). Among ASUN freshman, Tarke ranked second in per-game averages for points (9.9), rebounds (4.7), steals (1.1) and blocks (0.5). He finished with 307 points, the highest scoring total by an NJIT freshman since Lynn in 2013-14 (500).

Junior Mohamad Bendary (Jersey City, NJ) continues to show improvement while providing size (6'9") off the bench. The St. Anthony's product scored 16

points over the final two games last season. Additionally, athletic sophomore Taj Price (Newark, NJ) will look to provide more depth in the low post.

The recruiting class as well as the frontcourt received a significant boost with the April signing of freshman San Antonio Brinson. The 6-foot-8, 200-pound forward arrived at NJIT as one of the highest-rated recruits in program history after attending South Kent School (CT).

BACKCOURT

Lynn's injury last year left a big void in the backcourt. Perhaps the biggest beneficiary was point guard Shyquan Gibbs, a product of Bob Hurley's legendary program. The St. Anthony High School (Jersey City, NJ) valedictorian finished his first collegiate season ranked 12th in the ASUN in assists-to-turnover ratio (1.6) and 25th in steals per game (0.7). More impressively, he averaged 6.8 ppg while shooting .457 (22-for-48 FG) over his last nine affairs.

Versatile junior Reilly Walsh (Staten Island, NY) proved last season that he could also facilitate the offense. The 2017 ASUN All-Academic selection averaged 8.0 ppg over his last three affairs and poured in a career-high 15 points in the final game of the season in the quarterfinal round of the ASUN tournament at Lipscomb.

NJIT also features a pair of accomplished long-range shooters. Senior Chris Jenkins (Hillside, NJ) has placed in the top 13 in the ASUN in three-pointers per game during each of his first two seasons at NJIT after transferring from Hofstra University. Although injured a majority of last season, junior Donovan Greer (Houston,

TX) scored 11 points in his Highlanders debut at Lipscomb on Feb. 4 after averaging 8.8 ppg as freshman at San Jacinto College-Central (Pasadena, TX) in 2015-16.

Junior Diandre Wilson provides another scoring threat in Coach Kennedy's arsenal, as the NJCAA All-American first-team honoree scored 1,253 career points in two seasons at Mott CC.

The three freshmen guards are expected to carve their way into the rotation.

Zach Cooks figures to handle a share of the point guard duties. He displayed both excellent ball-handling and playmaking abilities while at Berkmar High School in Lilburn, Ga.

Shawndale Jones is a 6-3 combo

guard who athleticism shined not only on the hardwood, but also on the gridiron as a WR/CB at The Kiski School in

Saltsburg, Pa. In its recap of all ASUN early signings, *Hoopseen.com* commented that Jones "could be the steal of the class."

David Kachelries, described as playing with an incredibly high motor, finished his high school career as Emmaus' all-time leading scorer with 1,910 points.

OUTLOOK

Last year, NJIT got a glimpse of the future in the final two games of the regular season. After initially struggling to adjust on the fly following Lynn's injury, the Highlanders reinvented their identity in time to post impressive, back-to-back wins against Stetson and USC Upstate.

This crash course provided valuable experience for a youthful roster that features just one senior and just 40 combined starts at NJIT from its upperclassmen.

Another positive factor could be a home-court advantage developed in the new, 3,500-seat basketball arena that will compare favorably with many mid-major facilities throughout the country. After traveling for 11 of their 16 non-conference contests a year ago, the Highlanders play nine of 15 non-conference games at the WEC this season.

Still, the young squad will be put to task early with another challenging schedule that features road games at West Virginia, Seton Hall, Rutgers and Buffalo and home tilts against the likes of Drexel, LIU Brooklyn and Iona.

How the Highlanders fare in the ASUN after being selected eighth in the preseason coaches and media poll will largely depend on the pace of their learning curve in advance of the conference opener on Jan. 6 against USC Upstate.

"I'm excited about the make-up of our roster and the opening of the WEC provides tremendous opportunities for our students and athletes here at NJIT," said Kennedy. "We have significant challenges ahead of us this season, but we certainly have the building blocks in place for the future as we continue to grow the program."

rian Kennedy, 51 was introduced as the 11th head men's basketball coach in program history on April 15, 2016, after serving as the NJIT's top assistant under Jim Engles for four seasons (2012-16).

Coach Kennedy, whose involvement with the sport of basketball literally covers his entire life, is the son of the late Bob Kennedy, a former college and high school coach and the nephew of Pat Kennedy, who was a Division I head coach for 31 years at Iona, Florida State, DePaul, Montana, and Towson.

The Kennedy family business, the Hoop Group, began in the Trenton, NJ, CYO in 1963 with summer basketball camps and moved in 1969 to Cherry Valley, PA, and the Pocono Invitational began.

In 1991, the Hoop Group acquired the Eastern Invitational camp and renamed it the Hoop Group Elite Camp. A few years later, the Hoop Group began running grassroots tournaments and the subsequent years have seen numerous alumni go on to play in the NBA, including Kobe Bryant, Amar'e Stoudemire 2010 #1 overall pick John Wall, 2011 #1 pick Kyrie Irving and 13 other first-round picks that year.

Numerous legendary coaches have lectured at the camp, including the late Jim Valvano and Hall of Famers Lou Carnesecca, Rollie Massimino, Hoop Group Skills Camp Director Bob Hurley, Bob Knight, and Herb Magee.

Brian Kennedy, who played at both Princeton and Monmouth (1990 graduate), took over the family business after graduating from Monmouth in 1990 and was President and co-founder when it was rebranded from the Pocono Invitational to the Hoop Group and became the largest basketball instructional organization in the world.

He entered the college coaching ranks in 1997 as an assistant coach at DePaul

on the staff headed by his uncle Pat. There, he was part of one of major college basketball's great turnarounds, as the Blue Demons, who won fewer than five games the year before he arrived, made the NIT quarterfinals in 1999 and then the NCAA Tournament in 2000 as a team ranked in the Top 25.

"BK" as he is known to his many friends, was involved in all aspects of the DePaul program and was a leader in efforts that brought in a group named as the nation's top recruiting class in 1998 by The Sporting News.

Among the players he helped bring to DePaul five future NBA players: Quentin Richardson, Bobby Simmons, Steven Hunter, Paul McPherson, and Andre Brown.

He stepped aside from coaching from 2002 through 2009, when he worked on Wall Street in the financial sector.

He returned to the Hoop Group as Athletic Director, serving in that capacity from 2009 until 2012, when he joined the staff at NJIT.

In his first year as an assistant, the Highlanders captured their first Division I league title when they were regular season champions of the old Great left to right): Tim Coleman, Damon Lynn and Rob Ukawuba

As with DePaul in his first turn as a college coach, Kennedy spearheaded the recruiting efforts for NJIT and he faced a major task in his first recruiting year, with all three double-figure scorers from the 2012-13 Great West champions graduating in May 2013.

Kennedy's first recruiting class (Class of 2017) has gone down as the best to

date in the history of the program were vital to the Highlanders men's basketball reaching unprecedented success.

The extremely inexperienced 2013-14 team finished with a 13-16 record. But over the three seasons, the squads won a combined 52 games -- including 20 win seasons in 2014-15 (21-12) and in 2015-16 (20-15). In fact, in each of those two seasons, the Highlanders advanced to the semifinals of the national CollegeInsider. com Postseason Tournament (CIT).

> In addition, the Highlanders won their first-ever game over a ranked opponent when they upset #17/#16 Michigan in December 2014 and scored their first-ever win over a BIG EAST Conference opponent when they topped St. John's in December 2015.

> Two members of that first recruiting class put their names all over the NJIT record books. Damon Lynn, who was picked second-team all-state (all groups) by the Star-Ledger as a senior at Union Catholic High School, became the program's all-time leading scorer on Nov. 11, 2016, and finished his career with 2,153 points. He currently ranks fifth in Division-I history with 434 career three-pointers.

Tim Coleman came in the same class, entering NJIT after graduating from St. Anthony High School in Jersey City, NJ, where he played for Naismith Memorial Hall of Fame coach Bob Hurley. At St. Anthony, Coleman was a contributor on teams that won New Jersey state Tournament of Champions crowns following his sophomore and junior seasons.

Coleman carried that success into his NJIT career, as he finished as the program's all-time leading rebounder (762) and fourth all-time scorer (1,462). He departed the NCAA ranks as the only active Division-I player with at least 1,400 points, 750 rebounds, 225

assists (244), 150 steals (154) and 135 blocks (135).

Coleman and Rob Ukawuba, also part of BK's inaugural recruiting class, are now both playing professionally in the National Basketball League of Canada.

Brian Kennedy is the proud father of four children: daughters Taylor, Tatum, and Kelly; and son Brian, Jr.

JEFF RAFFERTY

SPRINGFIELD'97 | 2ND SEASON AT NJIT

J eff Rafferty joined the NJIT staff after serving nine years at the University of Delaware -- where he earned the title of Associate Head Coach for the 2013-14 season... The 1997 graduate of Springfield College enjoyed one of his highlight seasons

in 2013-14, when the Blue Hens finished 25-10, tying for the second-most wins in program history, and made the 2014 NCAA Tournament as the #13 seed in the East Regional...Rafferty's work in helping to build the UD program was recognized by FOXSports.com as one of the Top 10 Mid-Major Assistant Coaches in the country in 2008 and by RecruitDirt.com as the top assistant coach in the CAA in 2012... Prior, he was an assistant coach at the University of New Hampshire and for four years as the top assistant at UMass Lowell (then Division II). In his time at UML, the River Hawks were a combined 94-30 and made back-to-back trips to the D-II national Elite Eight in 2003 and 2004... He coached in NCAA Division III at Union College (2000-01) and at his alma mater, Springfield, which was a combined 40-17 and reached the Division III Sweet Sixteen in his second season on staff. He began his coaching career with an internship with the NBA's Boston Celtics and coached in 1997-98 at one-time NJIT opponent Texas Pan American.

Stephen Sauers joined NJIT in August 2017 with 25 years of coaching experience at the Division-I level. A 1990 graduate of University of Albany, Sauers spent the last two seasons as head coach for Canarias Basketball Academy in Gran Canarias.

Spain, after two seasons as top assistant at UC-Riverside (2013-15). Sauers played basketball for his father -- Hall of Fame Coach Richard "Doc" Sauers -- at Albany, where he was a two-year starter, captain and team MVP as a senior. He helped lead the Great Danes to a four-year record of 77-34 and a trip to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen (1990). He then started his coaching career at Marist as a Graduate Assistant Coach (1990-91), and moved up the ladder to Assistant Coach (1993-96), Senior Assistant Coach (1996-01) and Associate Head Coach (2001-04). He left the Red Foxes to serve as head coach at United States Military Academy Prep School in 2004-05, guiding the team to a school-best 16 wins. After a stint with the Hoop Group, he returned to the college ranks as Director of Basketball Operations and Basketball Camps for Seton Hall for two seasons (2006-08). He later returned to Pirates as Interim Assistant Coach and Director of Basketball Operations from 2010-13 after a stint as an Assistant Coach at Iona College (2008-10).

Kim Waiters enters his third season in his first full-time college coaching position after joining NJIT as an assistant in July 2015... In his two seasons in Newark, the Highlanders have gone 41-27 with back-to-back appearances in the semifinals of

the CIT... Waiters got involved with coaching when he was an undergraduate at Robert Morris (PA) University, working as a student assistant... After graduating in 2011 with a bachelor's of Business Management, Waiters became the Director of Skills Camps at the Pocono Invitational, a prestigious overnight camp that began operation in 1963... From the Pocono Invitational, Waiters headed to The Hoop Group, the largest basketball instruction organization in the world. He directed 10 Premier Grassroots AAU team tournaments and 16 high school events featuring premier teams from Pennsylvania, New Jersey, New York and Maryland. "Kim is an outstanding person who has the potential to be one of the top young basketball coaches in the country," said former NJIT Head Coach Jim Engles. 
