NM State Set to Take on No. 12 BYU in Round One of NCAA Tournament

This week: The New Mexico State volleyball team heads to Provo, Utah to play in the 2012 NCAA Volleyball Tournament taking on No. 12 national seed BYU, Friday, Nov. 30 at 7:30 p.m. (MT) The winner of the match moves onto the second round and plays the winner of the Arizona State-Oklahoma match on Saturday, Dec. 1 at 7 p.m. (MT)

About the Aggies: The Aggies earned a bid to the 2012 NCAA Tournament by winning the WAC Tournament title in San Antonio last week. NM State heads to Provo, Utah with a 22-10 record on the season, while finishing the WAC regular season with a 12-6 record (fourth place). The Aggies are currently hitting .228 as a team while holding opponents to a .174 hitting percentage. Four Aggies played in all 121 sets this season including Meredith Hays, Lauren Loerch, Desiree Scott and Stephanie Ziegler. Four different Aggies marked at least 200 kills including Hays, who heads into the tournament with 480.

NM State runs a 6-2 offense, rotating setters throughout the match, with junior Ciara Brown leading the way with 6.05 assists per set in 109 sets played. Freshman Taylor Livoti has seen action in 96 sets this year and is posting 4.93 assists per set. Sophomore Maggi Jo Keffury has gotten in the lineup in 53 sets this year and averages 4.13 assists per set. Juniors Stephanie Ziegler and Hannah Walker have been taking on the defensive specialist duties this year with Ziegler leading the team posting 3.06 digs per set. Walker is second on the team with 2.89 digs per set. Scott leads the team defensively at the net with 148 total blocks on the year, averaging 1.22 per set. Sophomore Gwen Murphy is closest to Scott with 81 total blocks on the season. The Aggies as a team tally 2.50 blocks per set.

The Aggies are 6-1 when playing on a neutral court this season and 8-5 when playing on an opposing team's court. NM State hits .195 when playing in an opposing team's arena and hits .282 on a neutral court. The Aggies post 12.23 kills per set when playing as the away team compared to averaging 15.08 kills per set in a neutral site.

NM State started the season winning the first five matches of the year before winning only one of the next four matches. The Aggies went into WAC play with a 6-3 record and were victorious in the first conference matches of the year. In a non-conference match, the Aggies fell to I-10 Rival UTEP for the first time in 15 matches on Sept. 29 but defeated their in-state rival, New Mexico by picking up the sweep in Albuquerque on Oct. 23.

NM State lost the last two matches of the regular season before catching fire in the WAC Tournament falling in only one set during the tournament. The Aggies were 2-3 in the month of November, which is very different than the 4-0 record it had in August.

Aggies in the NCAA Tournament:

This will be the sixth appearance for NM State in the NCAA tournament. The Aggies are 1-5 all-time in NCAA tournament matches. Beginning in 2003, NM State qualified for the NCAA tournament in five of the following six seasons (2003-04, 2006-08). Three of the Aggies' births into the NCAA tournament have been at-large bids while the 2012 birth was the third automatic bid for winning the conference tournament. Mike Jordan has been the head coach for all six Aggie tournament-appearance teams and the previous five Aggie teams in the NCAA tournament have all been led by an All-American (honorable mention) player.

The Aggies made their first ever appearance to the NCAA Tournament in 2003. All-American (honorable mention) middle hitter Trinia Cuseo led a team that finished the season with a 30-5 record and went undefeated in Sun Belt Conference play, including winning the Sun Belt Conference tournament and earning an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament. NM State was placed in the Honolulu, Hawai'i, region where they lost in straight sets to BYU during the first round of play. The match also marks the last time NM State and BYU have met on the volleyball court before this week's match.

NM State made its mark in the 2004 NCAA tournament for the second consecutive season. The Aggies finished the season at 30-3 and were once again led by an All-American honoree, outside hitter Stevi Adams. For the second straight season NM State would finish undefeated in Sun Belt Conference play and win the conference tournament to receive the automatic bid into the NCAA tournament. The Aggies traveled to San Diego, Calif., where they lost to the ninth-ranked team in the country, San Diego, in straight sets.

Led by All-American (honorable mention) Kim Oguh, NM State finished the 2006 season with a 33-4 record. The 33 wins still stands today as the school

record for wins in a season. After finishing the season with a No. 23 national ranking, the Aggies earned their first at-large bid into the NCAA tournament. As in 2004, NM State would have to play the host team of the regional during the opening round and lost to Colorado in straight sets in Boulder, Colo.

After receiving a No. 13 national ranking in the AVCA Top 25 poll during the 2007 season, the highest ranking ever for any Aggie athletic team, NM State received its second consecutive at-large bid into the NCAA tournament. The Aggies finished the season with a 26-6 record, with all six losses coming to nationally-ranked teams. Oguh led the team once again as she received her third-consecutive All-American (honorable mention) honor. The Aggies were placed in the Austin, Texas, region of the NCAA tournament where they faced LSU in the first round. NM State would go on to win their first-ever sets in NCAA tournament play but would eventually lose to the Tigers in five sets.

The 2008 season saw NM State earn its third-consecutive at-large bid into the NCAA tournament. Led by All-American (honorable mention) Krystal Torres, NM State's all-time career-digs leader, the Aggies finished with a 26-9 record and a share of the Western Athletic Conference regular season title. The season was highlighted by a win at Hawai'i, which at the time was the sixth-ranked team in the country. NM State traveled to Berkeley, Calif., for the NCAA regional play. Feeding off their close five-set loss to LSU during the previous year's NCAA tournament, the Aggies would go on to defeat St. Mary's College in four sets during the first round. It would be NM State's first-ever NCAA tournament victory. The Aggies would proceed to lose in the following round to host California, the eighth-ranked team in the nation, in four sets.

First & Second Round

NCAA TOURNAMNT PARTICIPANTS (Provo, Utah Site)

Aggies vs. BYU: NM State is 5-27 all-time versus BYU. The teams last met in the 2003 NCAA Tournament. The Aggies fell to BYU in three sets (17-30, 17-30, 27-30).

During the season, BYU beat Colorado State 3-1 (21-25, 25-12, 25-21, 25-16) and Pepperdine 3-1 (25-15, 23-25, 25-22, 25-21), two teams that defeated NM State, both in four sets, at the Colorado State Tournament in early September.

Jennifer Hamson leads the Cougars in kills per set (4.02) and aces per set (0.32). Hamson averages 1.80 digs/set, 1.23 blocks/set and a hitting percentage of .361. Hamson was awarded WCC volleyball Player of the Year.

BYU is the No. 12 seed for the NCAA Tournament with an overall record of 26-3. The Cougars will face NM State in the first round at the Smith Fieldhouse in Provo, Utah.

Aggies vs. Arizona State: NM State is 6-14 all-time versus BYU. The teams last met Sept. 2, 1994 with Arizona State taking the match in three sets (8-15, 3-15, 12-15).

This is the first NCAA Tournament Arizona State has been to since 2006.

Macey Gardner leads the Sun Devils in kills per set (4.46) and points with more than 600 for the season. Gardner averages 2.38 digs/set and 0.40 blocks/set. Gardner is ranked No. 15 in the nation for kills per set.

Arizona State goes into the NCAA Tournament with a 20-13 overall record. The Sun Devils will face Oklahoma in the first round of the tournament at the Smith Fieldhouse in Provo, Utah.

Aggies vs. Oklahoma: NM State is 3-1 all-time versus Oklahoma. The teams last met Sept. 1, 2000 with Oklahoma winning the match in four sets (15-6, 14-16, 6-15, 9-15).

This is the sixth NCAA Tournament in seven years for Oklahoma.

Sallie McLaurin leads the Sooners in kills per set (2.86), hitting percentage (.370) and blocking with 1.41 blocks/set. Oklahoma goes into the NCAA Tournament with a 21-10 overall record. The Sooners will face Arizona State in the first round of the tournament at the Smith Fieldhouse in Provo, Utah on Friday.

Looking Back/WAC Tournament: The New Mexico State Volleyball team took the WAC Tournament title last weekend to get an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.

In the first round, the Aggies swept the Denver Pioneers 25-15, 25-17, 26-24 in the quarterfinals of the Western Athletic Conference Tournament, Monday, Nov. 19 in San Antonio, Texas.

The Aggies hit .389 as a team with only 10 attack errors to handle Denver and head into the semifinals of the tournament. Junior middle hitter Desiree Scott led the way with a .625 hitting percentage posting 10 kills on 16 swings without a single error. Junior outside hitter Lauren Loerch added a match-high 11 kills while hitting .474, which is a season-high for her.

Sophomore Meredith Hays added nine kills and a match-high 13 digs, while junior Ciara Brown and freshman Taylor Livoti split the setting duties as they marked 22 and 21 assists respectively. In the second round of the WAC Tournament, the No. 4 seed NM State upset No. 1 seed Utah State in the semifinals of the 2012 Western Athletic Conference Tournament, Tuesday, Nov. 20 in San Antonio, Texas.

Sophomore Meredith Hays paced the Aggies offensively with a match-high 17 kills as the Crimson Aggies swept USU 25-21, 25-19, 25-16. This was a completely different match than the two regular-season matches as NM State did not allow a single USU player to get more than seven kills.

NM State served the ball tough against USU marking nine service aces with junior Stephanie Ziegler marking a career-high three, while three other players added two each. Utah State tallied only two service aces against the southern Aggies.

Junior middle hitter Desiree Scott added 10 kills against USU while junior Preslie Alexander tallied eight kills on a .615 hitting percentage. Alexander didn't make a single error on 13 swings. NM State as a team posted 47 kills compared to only 26 kills by the UtAgs.

With the Aggies running a 6-2 offense again, junior Ciara Brown marked a match-high 27 assists and freshman Taylor Livoti posting 12. Livoti was great at the service line as she forced USU to pass the ball all over the floor, while also adding two service aces.

In the final round NM State took the 2012 Western Athletic Conference Tournament title by defeating No. 2 seed Idaho, 3-1 (25-20, 20-25, 27-25, 25-19) in the Convocation Center, Wednesday, Nov. 21.

NM State had four players with double-digit kill figures with sophomore Meredith Hays and junior Preslie Alexander marking a team-high 13 kills each. Red shirt freshman Bradley Nash and junior middle hitter Desiree Scott added 11 kills a piece. Hays was named WAC Tournament MVP while Scott and Ziegler were named to the all-tournament team.

The Aggies out-blocked Idaho 10-7 with Alexander leading the way with five block assists. Nash marked her first career double-double as she added 14 digs on the evening and Ziegler had a career-high 27 digs against the Vandals.

Looking Ahead: The 2012 NCAA Tournament runs from Nov. 30 – Dec. 15. After the first two rounds, teams head to regional sites, which include West Lafayette, Ind., Austin, Texas, Omaha, Neb. and Berkeley, Calif. If the Aggies win this weekend, they would head to Omaha, Neb. for the next two rounds, Dec. 7-8.



Aggies in the WAC: The Aggies were seeded No. 4 heading into the WAC Tournament, but took the title after defeating No. 5 seed Denver (25-15, 25-17, 26-24), No. 1 seed Utah State (25-21, 25-19, 25-16) and No. 2 seed Idaho in the championship match (25-20, 20-25, 27-25, 25-19).

During the tournament, NM State out hit their opponents .300 - .207 and averaged 15.80 assists/set compared to their opponents 11.5 assists/set. On the defensive end, the Aggies averaged 17.0 digs/set and 2.30 blocks/set.

Sophomore Meredith Hays lead the Aggies in kills with 3.90/set in the tournament, while Junior Desiree Scott hit well with a .371 hitting percentage and a team high of 1.00 blocks/set. Preslie Alexander tallied .90 blocks/set and finished with a hitting percentage of .393. Ciara Brown averaged 8.00 assists/set and Stephanie Ziegler lead the Aggies in digs with 5.50/set.

For the season, NM State ranks second in the WAC in assists per set (12.50) and kills per set (13.51). The Aggies are No. 3 in hitting percentage (.228) and service aces per set (1.25). In blocks, NM State is ranked fourth with an average of 2.50/set.

Desiree Scott is ranked second in the league in hitting percentage (.377) and third in blocks per set (1.22). Taylor Livoti is No. 2 in service aces with 0.32/set. Meredith Hays ranks third in points (4.51/set) and kills (3.97/set), as well as a fifth place ranking in service aces (0.27/set). In assists, Ciara Brown is ranked eight with 6.05 per set.

Record Watch: Sophomore Meredith Hays has 980 kills on her career and still needs 202 more to jump into the top 10 for kills in a career. Former Aggie Alice Borden is No. 10 on the all-time list with 1,183 kills in her career (2003-06). Hays is averaging 4.19 kills per set on her career which is atop the all-time kills per set list at NM State.

Hays is currently No. 6 on the kills-in-a-season list with 480 this year. She is also No. 2 on that list as she posted 500 kills last year. Former Aggie Kayleigh Giddens holds the record for kills in a season with 542 in 2010, while Hays could possible surpass former Aggie

Angela Lobendahn-Perterson (Utah native) who tallied 494 kills during the 2000 season.

Junior Desiree Scott has 300 career-total blocks heading into this week's play. She needs 19 more total blocks to enter the top 10 at NM State. Former Aggies Kelsey Brennan (2008-11) and Whitney Woods (2007-10) are tied for 10th in career-total blocks with 319.

Scott, who has 148 total blocks this year, is now sitting in the No. 9 spot for total blocks in a season. She surpassed Karen Yelich who posted 147 blocks in 1982 and Kristin Webster who marked 145 total blocks in 2001.

Scott moved into the No. 7 spot for block assists in a season with 121. She needs eight more block assist to tie for fifth on the list with former Aggie All-American (HM) Kim Oguh, who put up 129 block assists in 2007.

If Scott's .377 hitting percentage holds up this year, she will be tied for the No. 3 spot on the season-hitting percentage list, just behind former Aggie middle hitters Amber Simpson and Kristen Webster. Simpson hit .387 in 2006 and Webster hit .385 in 2001.

AGGIE SPOTLIGHT/POSSIBLE STARTERS

Taylor Livoti (setter): Livoti is one of two setters head coach Mike Jordan uses on a regular basis as the Aggies run a 6-2 offense. She averages 4.93 assists per set and could be considered one of the best servers on the team as she has tallied 31 aces this year, which is second best on the team. She marked a career-high 26 assists twice, last doing it on Sept. 9 against Colorado State. Livoti has three double-doubles on the year.

Meredith Hays (outside hitter): Hays was named 2012 WAC Preseason Player of the Year, 2012 WAC Tournament MVP and 2012 first team All-WAC. She needs just 20 kills to reach 1000 on her career and could be the first Aggie to tally at least 500 kills in two different seasons. She is averaging 3.97 kills per set this year, which is down from her 4.19 kill per set career-average.

Preslie Alexander (middle blocker): Alexander is average 1.91 kills per set this season but did well in the WAC Tournament as she averaged 2.70 kills per set in 10 sets played. She has marked double-digit kill figures seven times this season with her career-high coming against Northwestern when she posted 14 kills, Sept. 1. Alexander also has 58 total blocks on the year with nine coming in the WAC Tournament.

Bradley Nash (OPP/middle blocker): Nash tallied her first career double-double as she put up a career-high 11 kills and a career-high 14 digs in the title match of the WAC Tournament versus Idaho. She previously put up 11 kills in a match against Utah State on Nov. 3 as NM State fell 3-1 in Las Cruces.

Ciara Brown (setter): Brown is one of two setters used in the 6-2 offense that head coach Mike Jordan runs. She leads the team with 6.05 assists per set and has tallied at least 15 assists in 27 matches this year. She tallied at least 25 assists 15 different times and marked a career-high 31 assists in the WAC Title match against Idaho, Nov. 21. She also tied her career-high for service aces that day with three.

Nathalie Castellanos (OPP): Castellanos is a native of Vado, N.M. (5 miles south of Las Cruces) and graduated from Gadsden High School where she led her team to two-straight state titles. As a freshman, Castellanos earned a spot on the floor with hustle and hard play. She is averaging 1.39 kills per set and marked a career-high nine kills against rival UTEP. Castellanos has marked at least five kills in 11 matches this year.

Desiree Scott (middle blocker): Scott is a first team All-WAC selection and a WAC Tournament all-tournament team member. She tallied 31 kills (3.10/set) and posted a .371 hitting percentage to go along with 10 total blocks to lead her team to a 2012 WAC title and a spot in the NCAA Tournament. Scott tallied a career-high 19 kills against Texas State, Nov. 8 and has tallied at least 10 kills in 13 matches this year. She is hitting .325 on her career, which is in the top five for hitting percentage in a career at NM State.

WEEK 15 - Nov. 26 - Dec. 2

Lauren Loerch (outside hitter): Loerch is a 2012 All-WAC preseason selection and a second team All-WAC selection. She is averaging 2.55 kills per set and is one of four Aggies to play in all 121 sets this year. She marked a career-high 19 kills against nationally ranked Pepperdine on Sept. 8 and tallied a career-high .474 hitting percentage in the opening match of the WAC Tournament. She also had 11 kills in that match as the Aggies swept Denver.

Stephanie Ziegler (libero): Defensive specialist Stephanie Ziegler has played in all 121 sets this year and is averaging 3.06 digs per set. She is fully recovered from a leg injury she sustained two seasons ago and is now the defensive leader for the team. Ziegler began her career as an outside hitter but has made the transition to defensive specialist. Although, she does take some swings on offense as she has 26 kills on 109 attempts this year.

CSU Ram's Classic All-Tournament Team: Sophomore Meredith Hays was named to 2012 Rams Volleyball Classic All-Tournament team after she averaged 4.45 kills and 2.09 digs per set in three matches. Hays started the weekend with 11 kills as she led the Aggies to their first sweep of the year, defeating FIU on Friday, Sept. 7. Hays then marked 22 kills on a .318 hitting percentage in a 3-1 loss to No. 12 Pepperdine before posting her fourth double-double of the season as she added 13 digs. Hays heads into WAC play averaging 4.60 kills per set which is second in the league, but leads the conference in points per set with 5.31.

Scott on All-Tournament Team: Junior middle hitter Desiree Scott was named to the La Quinta Invitational Tournament after she marked 21 kills (1.75/set), a .389 hitting percentage and 13 total blocks. Six of those blocks were solo.

Scott had a great offensive showing against Cincinnati, Aug. 31 as she tallied eight kills on nine swings without an error for a .889 hitting percentage. In the very next match, against Drake, Scott did work on the defensive side of the net tallying seven total blocks, five of them solo. She also added eight kills to lead the Aggies to their fifth consecutive win of the year.

NIU All-Tournament: Sophomore Meredith Hays was named the NIU Tournament MVP, while juniors Desiree Scott and Preslie Alexander joined her on the all-tournament team. Scott finished the tournament with 18 kills and 16 total blocks while Alexander averaged 2.42 kills per set in 12 sets played. This is Scott's third year with the Aggies, while Alexander is a transfer from Blinn Junior College.

WAC Preseason Poll: The WAC volleyball coaches selected NM State to win the WAC regular season title in 2012. The Aggies received eight of the 10 first-place votes with Idaho earning the other two. The Aggies earned 79 total points, followed by Idaho with 67. UTSA was picked to finish third with 58 points, followed closely by Utah State in fourth with 57 points and Texas State in fifth with 52. Denver was picked sixth with 43 points, while San Jose State was selected seventh with 34 points. UT Arlington, Seattle U and Louisiana Tech rounded out the poll with 27, 18 and 15 points, respectively.

Preseason All-WAC: NM State placed the most players on the preseason All-WAC team with three, including sophomore Meredith Hays as Preseason Player of the Year, while Idaho, UTSA and Utah State had two apiece. Joining Hays on the preseason team are teammates Lauren Loerch and Desiree Scott, Idaho's Alex Sele and Allison Walker, UTSA's McKenzie Adams and Whitney Walls, Utah State's Shay Sorensen and Joselyn White, Denver's Faimie Kingsley, San Jose State's Alex Akana and Texas State's Amari Deardorff.

Hays, was a 2011 first team All-WAC member as a freshman and was also the 2011 Freshman of the Year. She was only the second Aggie ever to earn that honor. She led the WAC and ranked 18th in the nation in both kills per set (4.42) and points per set (4.94). Hays also led the WAC with 500 kills on the season. Scott played in 98 sets as a sophomore last season, ranking second on the team in blocks per set (0.78) and third in total blocks (76). She was a perfect six kills on six attempts during a sweep of Utah State on Oct. 1, 2011.

Loerch, a cousin of former Aggie great Stevi (Adams) Maytubby, comes to NM State as a transfer from California. She

was a part of the 2010 Bear team that reached the NCAA National Championship match against Penn State.

Returning Top Stats Leaders: The Aggies welcome back outside hitter Meredith Hays, who not only led her team but led the WAC with 4.42 kills per set. Red-shirt junior Stephanie Ziegler was third on the team in 2011 with 2.17 kills per set. Unfortunately, NM State lost Kelsi Phillips who led the team in service aces (35) and digs (4.13/set) and will look to some newcomers to replace her. Hays was third on the team last year in digs (2.53/set), while junior Desiree Scott was third in total blocks (76).

Jordan Back for 15th Season: Head coach Mike Jordan enters his 15 year with NM State and heads into the weekend with a 330-148 overall record, and 101-267 in WAC play. He earned WAC Coach of the Year honors in 2005, 2006 and 2008 and also earned Coach of the Year honors twice in the Sun Belt Conference (2003 and 2004).

Jordan is the only NM State volleyball head coach to lead his team to the NCAA Tournament, which he has done five times (2003, 2004, 2006, 2007, 2008). He is also the only Aggie head coach to ever lead his team to a conference title as he led his team to titles in both the Sun Belt Conference and the WAC. NM State is the first team to either share or hold the WAC regular-season title since BYU and Hawai'i shared the Pacific Division title in 1998.

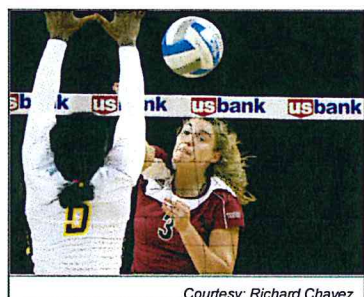

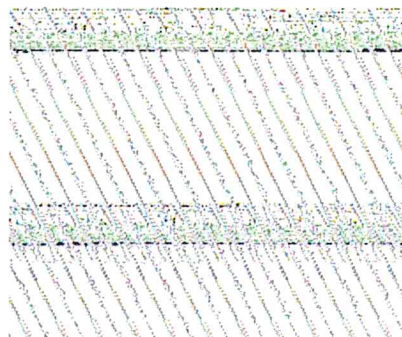

NMSU volleyball hosts tournament this weekend after sweeping to championship last week at Northern Illinois

Volleyball fans will love Labor Day weekend in Las Cruces.

New Mexico State University will host a two-day volleyball extravaganza at the Pan American Center. The four-team, round-robin tournament will feature four respected volleyball teams, including the University of Cincinnati, Northwestern from the Big Ten, Drake University and the Aggies.

The six-game tournament will open at 4 p.m. Friday, Aug. 31, with Drake versus Northwestern. The Aggies play Cincinnati at 7 p.m. Each team will play twice on Saturday starting with Northwestern versus Cincinnati at 10:30 a.m., followed by the Aggies versus Drake at 12:30 p.m. At 4:30 p.m. Saturday, Cincinnati will take on Drake and the Aggies will play Northwestern in the closing game at 7 p.m.

Last weekend, I had the pleasure of joining coach Michael Jordan and the Aggie ladies as they traveled up to the cornfields of DeKalb, Ill., to take on three strong teams, each of which qualified for the 2011 NCAA championship tournament.

Led by sophomore sensation and Western Athletic Conference Pre-season Player of the Year Meredith Hays, the Aggies swept all three matches 3-1 to win the championship. Hays, a powerful 5-11 outside hitter from Hereford, Texas, dominated the tournament as she posted 63 kills and an excellent .348 hitting percentage. She also had 29 digs and three service aces.

Also named to the all-tournament team were junior middle blocker Desiree Scott and newcomer middle blocker and outside hitter Preslie Alexander. Scott a 6-2 junior from Tucson, Ariz., is a two-year letter winner with the Aggies. Alexander, a 6-1 junior, came to the Aggies via Blinn Junior College, where she was a starter for the team that won the 2011 national junior college championship.

Before the opening of the season, Jordan warned fans that while the 2012 Aggies have several strong outside hitters, the big question marks would be who would replace five-time all-WAC setter Jenna DeVries and libero Kelsi Phillips. Jordan also worried about overall defense and team passing.

Those worries dissipated last weekend as newcomers Ciara Brown and Taylor Livoti were solid as they shared the setting duties. Brown, a 5-10 junior transfer from Virginia Commonwealth, handled most of the setting, while Taylor, a 5-8 freshman from Humble, Texas, performed well in her debut.

Stephanie Ziegler, a 5-8 redshirt junior from Tucson, Ariz., who had previously played two years as an outside hitter, was chosen by Jordan as the libero for the NIU tournament where she started and played all three matches. Ziegler is recognized as one of the Aggies' best passers. She performed well throughout the tournament and appeared to gain confidence with each match as she tallied a total of 40 digs.

The Aggie outside hitters are powerful and will be fun to watch this year. In addition to Hays and Alexander, other big-time hitters include 6-0 junior Lauren Loerch, a transfer from California (Berkeley) and 6-0 redshirt freshman Bradley Nash, an outstanding player from Kayenta, Ariz., who was injured in last year's opening game after a great start against Nebraska. Another exciting player is 5-10 freshman left hander Nathalie Castellanos from Anthony, N.M., where she led the Gadsden Panthers to two consecutive Class 5A championships.

Other players to watch include 6-2 middle blocker Gwen Murphy, defensive specialist Hannah Walker, a 5-5 Junior who transferred from Colorado University, and 5-7 senior Madison Hardy from Placerville, Calif.

Aggie volleyball should really be fun to watch this year. Hopefully, a good crowd will welcome the Aggies home, as they strive for their second consecutive tournament victory.

Versatility key for Ziegler

LAS CRUCES — Stephanie Ziegler added a new element to her arsenal in the offseason.

Ziegler, a redshirt junior, started her New Mexico State volleyball career as a hitter up front. Five matches into her junior season, Ziegler had played libero throughout the Aggies' 5-1 start.

Coming off a broken leg that ended her 2010 season, Ziegler was third on the Aggies last year, ranking third in kills with 243.

The return of freshman Bradley Nash up front and Ziegler's knowledge of the

system and versatility makes her an important piece this season.

"At the end of the spring, (Jordan) talked to me and said I had the best passing and that I could be in the lineup as libero," Ziegler said. "I kept working at it. At the start of two-a-days, he told me it's a possibility to play libero, defensive specialist or on the front row and was told to be ready for all three."

Ziegler she said playing a new position has given her a new perspective on the game and forced her to become more vocal on the court.

"I think I had to become more vocal," she said. "I never used to look at blocking but as a defender, that's something new. Seeing the whole floor can also help me as a hitter."

Up next

► The Aggies are at the Colorado State tournament Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

The Aggies were very nearly 6-0, losing to a quality Northwestern club in four sets on Saturday. NMSU had set point in the fourth but couldn't force a fifth set.

Northwestern would have been another quality win to an already impressive preseason.

Now in her fourth year at NMSU, Ziegler says this team has entered the year more focused on picking up quality wins early.

"(Jordan) talks to us about playing in the NCAA Tournament and we know we will get a bid if we win the WAC but you can't rely on that," Ziegler said. "We know in the past that the preseason hasn't been as

good. If we want to win, we have to do it now."

The Aggies have another opportunity for quality wins this weekend at the Colorado State tournament. The Aggies face Pepperdine on Saturday and CSU on Sunday.

"If we go get a win or two this weekend and then do well in conference, I think we would have a RPI that would be really hard to keep us out of the tournament," Jordan said.

Ziegler said the Aggies all want to return to the NCAA Tournament this year. She's proven she's willing to play her role by changing positions.

"I wasn't a good passer when I came here and I've been working more and more on my defense," she said. "I'm trying to be what the team needs."

The New Mexico State volleyball team opens Western Athletic Conference play on the road this week traveling to Seattle University and Idaho. The Aggies were scheduled to take on Seattle at 8 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 13, in Seattle, before heading to Moscow, Idaho, to take on the Vandals at 8 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 15.

After coming off a 23-10 overall record last year and 10-4 record in the WAC, the Aggies were picked to win the WAC in the league pre-season coaches' poll. Sitting at a 6-3 so far this season, the Aggies ran into some tough competition over the weekend at the Rams Volleyball Classic held in Fort Collins, Colo.

kills in 113 sets played and already has 161 this season in 35 sets played.

The Aggies enter conference play with a .231 hitting percentage and average 13.43 kills per set which are both second amongst WAC teams. NMSU is sitting at No. 1 in the WAC in assists at 12.34 per set and service aces with an average of 1.51 per set.

"A major thing we have to focus on is buckling down when the sets are at 22-22 and staying mentally focused to finish those sets strong," Jordan said.

She was forced to become a team player and play her best with girls that she didn't know which made it a challenge that helped her grow as a person, team leader and volleyball player.

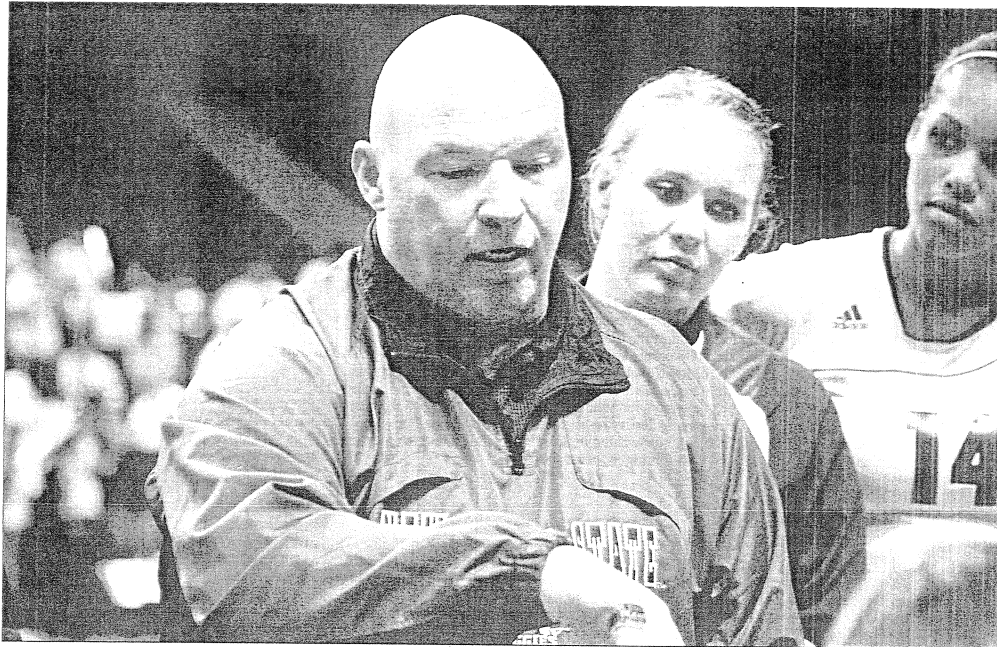
Scott proves that dedication and hard work pays off making this is another award added to her list.

LAS CRUCES — Mike Jordan is in his 15th season as head volleyball coach at New Mexico State University.

During his tenure, Jordan's put together arguably the most consistent athletics program at the school. Holding a 324-143 career record at NMSU, Jordan's teams have made NCAA Tournament appearances from 2003-04 and 2006-08. They opened this year ranked No. 1 in the Western Athletic Conference preseason polls and hold an 8-3 mark thus far on the season (2-0 in league play).

Earlier this week Jordan sat down to talk Aggie volleyball, where the program's been and where it might be headed in the midst of the 2012 campaign.

Sun-News: You and your program have a good relationship with the local community. Talk about it.

Mike Jordan: "I had more than a few people at a Side-Out Club function — boosters — say 'we love getting the know the players.' You could just tell it was important to them. So we started doing little things. Instead of after a game, and a team

leaves and bolts to the locker room, we stay out. Talk, say hello, meet new people. Ingratiate yourself, and they're going to want to come back because they've got a connection. And, who better than 99 percent of our players, who are really fun, nice, polite, social young women? That helped sort of build, I guess a solid core of fans that started to grow."

SN: You've also had a tremendous amount of success with transfer athletes. Talk about that avenue of your program.

MJ: "New Mexico's not a highly populated state. A lot of schools have the suburbs and the city's around them, that sort of thing We don't have a lot of possibilities there I

think the fact that we recruit a lot of kids. We may lose out on them, but if they liked us, if they liked the program and it doesn't work out for them at the place they go, maybe they'll consider us again Most of the transfers we've gotten, we recruited initially and it didn't work out where and they thought 'hey, you know what? Maybe that's a good option for me.'

SN: You've taken athletes and turned many into volleyball players. Is that a common philosophy, a unique one?

MJ: "I think all coaches in all sports will look hard at a great athlete. A Kim Oguh, a Krystal Torres. We have to look at them A lot of those kids like that were under the radar. Kim, for instance, didn't play club volleyball. Krystal only played one year. If they were out on the club scene, playing in big tournaments all the time, I probably wouldn't get em' We're always looking for those diamonds in the rough."

SN: You've coached in three leagues — the Big West, Sun Belt and WAC. Most of the time, you

MJ: "Even though we're the (WAC) favorite I don't think we're that much better than the rest of the teams in the league I think there's some good teams in the league. Anything can happen. I have a lot of respect for a lot of our opponents. The difference in talent between us and these other schools isn't that great Plus, we haven't won it. We were co-champs in '08. We haven't won anything since then, we haven't been to the tournament in three years now I certainly don't feel like we can be sitting back going 'hey, we're the favorite.'"

SN: What do you think the ceiling is for this year's team?

MJ: "I think there's a lot of room for improvement in particular with ball control, passing and defense We've got good arms. More than we've ever had here. We've got the ability to change the lineup I do

see us having the same kind of physical ability that we had in '08 and '07, '06 (NCAA Tournament seasons) We've just got to get better at volleyball It's a high ceiling."

SN: It's a new-look WAC. Who should fans be on the lookout for?

MJ: "I have a ton of respect for Debbie (Buchanan) and what she does at Idaho. They're a veteran team and they've got some really good athletes Utah State, Grayson (DuBose) does a great job They're tall, really good athletes, they play a good system It's why they were able to knock off Hawaii in the conference tournament the year before last The Texas schools, UTSA and Texas State, have a lot of talent."

SN: As a competitor, as a head coach, do you miss having Hawaii around?

MJ: "I do. I do. Not just in our conference, but even nationally they set the bar at a really high level When you get an opportunity to compete with them, if you win — which we were only fortunate enough to do twice it gives you an idea with where you're at on the national scale. Those times where they beat the daylights out of us, we knew we weren't very good, or we were OK And it gave us confidence a lot of times, even if we didn't win, as long as the scores were close and the games were tight."

SN: You're down 2-0 to

Seattle the other night at intermission. What's said to the team there to get them on track? Your team came back to win the match.

MJ: "My message in there was pretty simple: pull your head out of your butt. And, if you do anything, don't even think about volleyball. Just think about competing. Get the fire in your belly to win and beat somebody. And take this personally. Understand, they're not just going to give us points and lay down and die."

SN: Does the volume level of the voice rise?

MJ: "Not all the time. That one for sure Because I was so disappointed. I didn't feel like we were ready to compete. That's frustrating."

SN: Different circumstances cause different reactions.

MJ: "If you're losing to a team because you're not doing something very well like passing, that's something you've got to deal with as a coach When it seems like it's a lack of competitiveness and that the other team wants it more, that's not OK."

SN: You've built a solid, consistent program here. Has it been hard to sustain?

MJ: "The hardest part is getting to that even next level. Where the perennial powers live. That's the challenge of it. I think we're a really good volleyball team We're always a top-50, -60 caliber team But to play with the top-25 teams on a consistent basis is the challenge I think we can stay where we're at. That challenge is there to try and do more. And that's what kind of motivates us all the time."

With company atop WAC, Aggies face big matches

LAS CRUCES — The only sure thing going into this week's set of home matches for the New Mexico State volleyball team is that the Aggies must perform on top of their game.

Head coach Mike Jordan pointed out that his team's recent struggles have come on the road, which is true.

Two mid-September conference wins over Seattle and Idaho were hard-fought and went five sets. The Aggies lost in five at UTEP later in the month, and last

week's defeat at Utah State wasn't necessarily a surprise against a good team on its home floor as much as how it came — in the form of a straight-set sweep.

"We just weren't on our game," sophomore setter Maggi Jo Keffury said of the match. "Around all aspects of the court."

The Aggies — who hold a 12-5 overall record and are 6-1 in WAC play — do have some convincing home performances: a 3-1 win over Louisiana Tech that saw a sluggish start end in victory, along with separate straight-set thumpings of Texas-Arlington and Denver.

Yet they'll have to continue that trend

this week, starting tonight against Texas-San Antonio and followed by a Saturday affair against Texas State. For one, neither club figures to be a pushover. On top of that, Utah State's 7-1 league record adds

another horse in the Western Athletic Conference race to keep pace with.

The schedule doesn't get easier for the Aggies following this week's games. A four-match road trip waits in the wings, with three contests against WAC competition and the other match at in-state rival New Mexico.

"We're pretty much at the midway point now. And if you're looking at winning a regular-season title every match is important," Jordan said. "I certainly don't want to make an assumption that Utah State's going to lose again. We get them here, so we have an opportunity to get something done. Certainly with two pretty solid teams coming in ... we definitely need to take care of business at home."

Jordan pointed to inexperience for some of the Aggies inconsistencies away from Las Cruces. While the team has its share of talent, there is also only one senior on its entire roster.

"There are times we can have two true redshirt freshman on the floor at the same time," Jordan said. "You're going to have some headaches with that."

Some of the above-mentioned matches could point to that fact, along with a few others on the Aggies schedule:

Separate 3-1 losses early to Pepperdine and Colorado State (fine teams in their own right) saw NMSU take 1-0 leads, only to drop three-straight sets in the match.

"Coach has to talk to us — and it's unfortunate he has to — but he talks to us about competitiveness," said outside hitter Meredith Hays. "We lack that a lot of the time. We're OK with certain things. We're OK with losing a set because we have another one to go. That's not OK."

Jordan said he would like his team to find some in-season leadership, pointing to his past NCAA Tournament teams at the school having that quality — "I don't think it's a coincidence," the coach said.

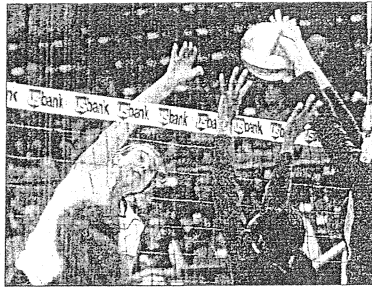
"I hope it's an acquired skill. I've seen some players before go from being a church mouse to being a real vocal leader. I've seen players change. Typically, the best leaders we've had have been vocal from an early age."

The team hopes to continue its growth tonight against UT-SA.

"We take it match-by-match more. But it's good for us to look at the whole picture too," Hays said. "These home matches are very important. It's not just coming away with a win. It's coming away with a clean one."

NMSU travels to play rival UNM today

LAS CRUCES — New Mexico State volleyball coach Mike Jordan isn't panicking.

After all, the Aggies are 14-7 and 7-3 in the Western Athletic Conference and still hold their regular-season destiny in their hands.

But the WAC Tournament is a month away and the Aggies have shown a disturbing trend — an inability to close out matches, like a five-set loss to 6-5 Texas State at home two weeks ago.

"My level of concern is the conference tournament is a month away and we have to make these changes," Jordan said. "It's a gradual process but we need to see more improvement at a faster rate."

Jordan said ball control has led to the Aggies inconsistent play. It has led to passive play, which has cost them close sets. The lack of a true on-the-court leader hasn't helped either.

"It's important, especially when you are not playing well," Jordan said. "With young players, they can get nervous in tough situations and that nervousness can turn into passive play. We have seen that too much."

The Aggies are tied with Idaho for second place behind Utah State with home matches left against both teams.

In order to close the gap however, serve receive and passing have to improve.

"We are just too passive in those areas," Jordan said. "We have to become more aggressive. When we are playing well, we are flying around in those areas."

The Aggies step out of WAC play Tuesday to play rival New Mexico in Albuquerque.

"UNM is a really good ball control team," Jordan said. "They are better at that than we are. We are bigger and more physical than they are, but that is negated if you don't pass well."

Aggies ready for WAC play

NMSU volleyball team to host Louisiana Tech

The New Mexico State University volleyball team returns home for two Western Athletic Conference matches after picking up two tough wins on the road to open WAC play.

The Aggies picked up their first conference win defeating Seattle University in five sets Thursday, Sept. 13. Desiree Scott, who marked a career-high 12 total blocks, led the come-from-behind victory along with Meredith Hays, who tallied a match-high 18 kills.

“Both girls were clutch for us over the weekend,” coach Mike Jordan said. “Desiree really brought us momentum when we were trailing Seattle.”

Junior outside hitter Lauren Loerch also helped the Aggies complete the comeback with 13 kills, three total blocks and an ace. Freshman Taylor Livoti posted 19 assists and split setting duties with junior

Ciara Brown, who posted 18 assists. Setting a match and career high digs at 22, junior libero Hannah Walker stepped up big for the Aggies in Seattle.

“Seattle came out aggressive and punched us right in the mouth,” Jordan said. “I was proud of the way our girls stepped up and overcame adversity.”

After success in Seattle, the Aggies brought momentum into Moscow, Idaho, defeating the Vandals in five sets Saturday, Sept. 15. Led by Hays making a match-high 22 kills and Loerch adding 13 more, the Aggies posted 62 kills as a team – a season high.

“I feel like we had a good weekend, but I feel like we still have a lot more to improve on,” Hays said.

Brown and Livoti combined for 50 assists for the Aggies on Saturday as Walker ended the night with a match-high 16 digs. Hays led the way with four blocks.

Wrapping up the weekend, the Aggies now rank first in the WAC in overall hitting percentage at .232 and dropped to third in kills per set at 12.98. A huge accomplishment for the team was moving up to second in blocks per set at an average of 2.66.

“Our biggest accomplishment of the weekend was understanding the importance of consistent play and preparation, not only between sets but matches as well,” Jordan said.

This week, the Aggies look to focus on defense and passing during practice as well as putting an emphasis on the importance of preparation.

“These two wins were great for us,” Hays said. “Now it’s time to put them in the past, improve on what we need to work on and focus on our upcoming matches.”

The Aggies entered the match against Louisiana Tech Thursday, Sept. 20, with an 8-3 record and 2-0 in conference play. The Aggies play at noon Saturday, Sept. 22, at the Pan Am Center against the University of Texas-Arlington Mavericks, before playing at UTEP at 7 p.m. Wednesday, Sept. 26.

nothing to do with those conference records, it is a test of pride. The Aggies have not lost to the Miners since 2004. Aggie coach Mike Jordan has built a power, his teams going 318-141 into his 15th season at the school. They have made five trips to the NCAA Tournament in the last nine years.

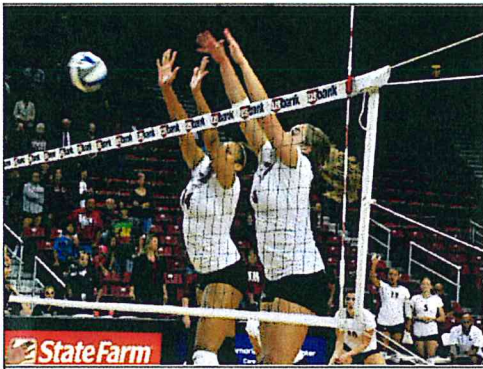

SAN ANTONIO, Texas - Three New Mexico State volleyball players earned 2012 Western Athletic Conference post-season awards, as selected by the league's head coaches, during the WAC Tournament banquet, Sunday, Nov. 18.

Sophomore outside hitter Meredith Hays joined junior middle hitter Desiree Scott on the All-WAC first team, while junior outside hitter Lauren Loerch was named to the second team. Head coach Mike Jordan is proud of the selections and knows that each of the players are deserving of the awards.

"They have each done a lot for us this year," Jordan said. "Although, I am sure they would trade in those awards for a WAC championship. Our team goal is to win this tournament and I know they are excited to get out there and play and to lead the team."

Hays finished the WAC regular season with 248 kills (3.65/set), 12 service aces and 164 digs (2.41/set). Scott led the league with a .420 hitting percentage while putting down 169 kills (2.49/set) and 93 total blocks (1.37/set). Second team selection Loerch posted 186 kills during league play and scored 207.5 points throughout the 2012 conference season.

UTSA junior outside hitter McKenzie Adams was named WAC Player of the Year, while teammate Annie Kunes was named Libero of the Year. Utah State's Elle Brainard captured Freshman of the Year honors, while head coach Grayson DuBose was named WAC Coach of the Year.

Nine of the 10 schools were represented on the teams, led by top-seeded Utah State with four players on the first team and two on the second team. No. 3 seed UTSA had one player on the first team and three on the second team, while Idaho and New Mexico State both had two first-team selections and one second-team pick.

SAN ANTONIO, Texas — The New Mexico State volleyball team (20-10) swept the Denver Pioneer 25-15, 25-17, 26-24 in the quarterfinals of the Western Athletic Conference Tournament on Monday in San Antonio, Texas.

The Aggies hit .389 as a team with only 10 attack errors to handle Denver and

head into the semifinals of the tournament against top-seeded Utah State at 5:30 p.m. today. Junior middle hitter Desiree Scott led the way with a .625 hitting percentage posting 10 kills on 16 swings without a single error. Junior outside hitter Lauren Loerch added a match-high 11 kills while hitting .474, which is a season-high for her.

Sophomore Meredith Hays added nine kills and a match-

high 13 digs, while junior Ciara Brown and freshman Taylor Livoti split the setting duties as they marked 22 and 21 assists respectively.

"We ball handled very well today and our defensive effort was pretty good today," Aggies head coach Mike Jordan said. "We took a lot of good swings and we were low error. It was a good match all-around."

The Aggies started the

match hitting .462 in set one with 19 kills on 39 swings with only one attack error. NMSU fell behind 6-2 in set two but fought back with seven straight points to take a 9-6 lead. The Aggies would not relinquish that lead and went up by as many as six at 21-15 after two consecutive attack errors by Denver. The Aggies concluded the set with three straight kills (one by Scott, two by Hays) to win 25-17.

There were four Aggies with two kills apiece as Loerch led the way posting four kills on four attempts. The Aggies had to hold Denver off in the third set to advance. There were five ties and two lead changes in a set that saw red shirt freshman mark five kills on seven swings.

Today's semifinal match is scheduled to air live on the radio in Las Cruces on 570 KSNM-AM.

Aggie Volleyball Makes WAC Final

SAN ANTONIO, Texas — Meredith Hays had 17 kills as the fourth-seeded New Mexico State Aggies stormed into today's Western Athletic Conference tournament championship match after stunning top-seeded Utah State 3-0 (25-21, 25-19, 25-16) in Tuesday's semifinals.

Preslie Alexander had eight kills and no errors to hit .615; NMSU held Utah State to a .103 hitting percentage and had nine service aces.

The 21-10 Aggies will face No. 2 seed Idaho for the title and the automatic NCAA Tournament berth at 3 p.m. today on ESPNU. The two teams split during the regular season, with Idaho stunning NMSU 3-0 Thursday in the Aggies' home finale.

Aggie volleyball trumps top-seeded Utah St.

New Mexico State squad moves on to WAC title matchup against Idaho; could come away with automatic NCAA berth

One huge win Tuesday, and the New Mexico State volleyball team hopes another awaits today.

NMSU swept Utah State (25-21, 25-19, 25-16) in the semifinals of Tuesday's Western Athletic Conference Tournament and will now face Idaho today at 3 p.m. for the league championship. The winner will get an automatic berth in the 2012 NCAA Tournament.

Tuesday's win was substantial, if for no reason other than the No. 4-seeded Aggies were beaten fairly easily by No. 1 Utah State during the WAC regular season — in two matches no less, with USU winning six of seven sets over NMSU during the year.

Pre-season polls had New Mexico State atop the WAC's projected pre-season standings while Utah State was picked fourth. That their final positions reinforced such prognostications mean little to teams and coach-

es alike, and also indicated that NMSU — which lost three of four matches entering the league tournament — could have a tough time reaching the NCAAs.

"I never thought that we were the typical No. 4 seed. We can play as good as anyone," NMSU head coach Mike Jordan said. "But they handled us pretty easily at times (this year). For us to step up and compete like this, it tells me we're growing up. I'm happy about what I'm seeing thus far."

Jordan said tough serving was the key for his team Tuesday. The Aggies recorded nine aces on the evening which allowed them to neutralize Utah State's strength: Blocking the ball.

Off a quality NMSU serve, the UtAgs couldn't get in gear offensively. In turn, the Aggies had an opportunity to dig well and got quality swings on the ball which forced USU out of its blocking game.

"I was very happy with the way we served," Jordan said. "We were aggressive and Utah State struggled in part because of that. And we played hard defensively."

Today's match against Idaho shouldn't be much different from a motivational standpoint. The Vandals are the No. 3 seed in the tournament and unceremoniously swept NMSU in Las Cruces to wrap up the WAC regular season last week.

Idaho is coming off a semifinals win where they beat host-team Texas-San Antonio in an emotional five-set match Tuesday.

"They're a very good team," Jordan said. "They block well, they're a good-sized team. To beat UT-San Antonio on their home court — it says a lot about (the Vandals) heart. I expect both teams to be fired up to play, and play with confidence."
