The Aggies take on East Carolina at 3:00 pm (MT) on Friday before facing Illinois, Saturday at 4:00 p.m. NM State finishes up the tournament, Sunday, Feb. 24 against Ohio at 11:00 a.m.

**ABOUT THE AGGIES:** The Aggies opened the season with a 2-2 record at home against Wisconsin-Milwaukee. NM State won the season-opener 4-3 before falling 11-0 in game two on opening day. The Aggies then lost 13-8 in game three before rebounding to win the series finale 16-8. Senior Bobby Lecount leads the league with eight RBI after going 6-of-13 at the dish against UW-Milwaukee. He started the season picking up at least one hit in each of the four games played last week. Junior catcher Tanner Rust hit .333 over the four games and collected two RBI, two walks, three doubles, six hits and six runs scored. Senior starting pitcher Adam Mott went 8.0 innings and struck out seven batters while giving up only two walks, all while facing 33 batters in the first game of the year.

NM State is hoping for a successful repeat of last year with 35 wins and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. Head coach Rocky Ward is looking for new leadership after losing key players from last season's team. The Aggies have to replace right-hand pitcher and closer Scott Coffman, school record holder for saves in a season and career, along with shortstop Zach Voight. Ward believes that athletic-wise and physically, the team has not lost anything from last season's team.

Ward hopes that returning shortstop Parker Hipp and outfielder Kyle Phillips will lead the team in 2013 along with pitcher Adam Mott and Las Cruces native Michael Orms-eth. NM State also has strong and developing newcomers in freshman Kent Blackstone, who is predicted to start at second base, while junior transfer Quinnton Mack looks to be a starter in the outfield.

## **THIS WEEK'S OPPONENTS:**

**East Carolina:** The Aggies will go up against East Carolina, Illinois and Ohio this weekend as part of the Keith LeClaire Classic, hosted by East Carolina. The Aggies will take on their host East Carolina on Feb. 22. The Pirates went 36-24-1 in 2012 and made their way into the NCAA Tournament. East Carolina is coached by Billy Godwin, who enters his eighth season as head coach of the Pirates. Godwin has earned a record of 253-162-1 as the head coach of the Pirates. East Carolina enters the weekend at 0-2 after losing a pair of games to Virginia.

This game will mark the first-ever meeting between the two schools.

**Illinois:** The Aggies will take on the Fighting Illini, Feb. 23, in their second game of the Keith LeClaire Classic. The Illini head into the weekend with a record of 1-2 after dropping two games to Tennessee Tech. Illinois is coached by Dan Hartleb, who is in his eighth season as the Illini head coach. Hartleb has been on the Illini staff for the past 23 seasons, including his eight as head coach. Hartleb is currently tied for sixth for most wins in school history with 209 victories.

The Aggies and Illini met twice in 1996 and split the series 1-1.

**Ohio:** The Aggies will face the Ohio Bobcats in their final game in the Keith LeClaire Classic. The Bobcats went 28-29 last season under coach Joe Carbone who left the team after 24 years of being the head coach and earning a 689-611 record. Rob Smith, who becomes the ninth coach in program history, now coaches Ohio.

The Bobcats enter the weekend 0-2 after losing to Belmont and Valparaiso. Smith loses several pitchers who helped the team keep a 3.73 team ERA, which was good for second in the MAC. He will welcome back the top three hitters from last season, led by first baseman Jake Madsen.

This will be the first meeting between the two schools.

**RECORD WATCH:** As a senior, Parker Hipp is close to putting his name at the top of the NM State record books in multiple categories. Early into the season, Hipp is 45 games away from leading the games played career record (207). If Hipp puts up 48 more runs this season, he will break the career record of 192. In career hits, Hipp will need to post 59 for the career record. Fifty-one singles is all Hipp needs to put his name at the top of the record books over Henry Apodaca, who set the record 32 years ago. Hipp only needs 15 doubles for career record. At a 122 base on balls, Hipp will have to be walked 21 times this season to break the career record of 143. Hipp is only seven sacrifice flies from breaking that career record and 63 RBI from becoming the leader in RBI.

**TAKE YOUR BASE:** The Aggies drew 34 walks last week against UW-Milwaukee while limiting the Panthers to 21 walks. The Aggies have started strong in drawing walks this season as they continue to be patient at the plate.

Last season the Aggies were ranked second in the nation with 347 walks. Tanner Waite led the nation in walks with 69 and Parker Hipp also walked 57 times and was ranked sixth in the nation.

**NM STATE PROBABLE STARTING**

**PITCHERS:** Adam Mott is expected to take the mound for the Aggies against East Carolina, while left-hand pitcher Christopher Bradley is expected to start against Illinois. Runtior righty Michael Ormseth will go up against Ohio in the final game of the tournament.

Mott got the start in the season-opener against UW-Milwaukee, throwing for 8.0 innings, while striking out seven batters in a no-decision. He heads into the weekend with a 3.38 ERA.

Although Bradley is 0-1 on the year, he leads the team with a 1.80 ERA as he threw 5.0 innings last week against Wisconsin-Milwaukee. He allowed just four walks, while striking out seven batters in a loss to the Panthers. Ormesth struck out eight batters and walked two in a 13-8 loss to UWM on Saturday, Feb. 16.

Mott was a first team All-WAC selection last season and finished with a 6-3 record. He recorded 78 strikeouts and led Aggie pitchers with a .276 opponent's batting average. Mott was undefeated at 4-0 and had a 3.96 ERA at home last season.

Christopher Bradley is a newcomer to the Aggies and played at Galvin College in Gilroy, Calif. last season. The coaching staff is happy with Bradley's improvement and development and is excited about what he can bring to the mound for the Aggies.

Ormseth led the Aggies' pitching staff last season with eight wins in 13 starts for the Aggies. He ended with an 8-2 record in 2012. Ormseth pitched extremely well in Presley Askew Field where he finished with a 6-1 record in nine starts. He also recorded two-thirds of his 62 strikeouts in front of the Aggie crowd.

**WAC PRESEASON POLL:** New Mexico State baseball was selected to finish third in the 2013 Western Athletic Conference regular season, in the coaches' preseason poll behind Dallas Baptist and Texas State, the WAC announced.

The Aggies received 60 points in the voting that was done by the 10 WAC baseball coaches after a 35-24 season (11-7 WAC), which resulted in the 2012 WAC regular season co-champion title and an at-large bid to the NCAA tournament. Dallas Baptist, who joined the WAC this year, was picked to win the league with 80 points and eight first place votes after a 41-19 season. Surpassing the Aggies for the second spot is Texas State who received 65 points and one first place vote.

**PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN:** Senior short stop Parker Hipp of the New Mexico State baseball team was recently named to the 2013 Louisville Slugger Pre-Season All-American baseball team, selected by Collegiate Baseball newspaper. Hipp was a third team selection after hitting .349 with 51 runs scored and 49 RBI last year.

He was first on the team in on-base percentage (.488) as he helped the Aggies win a share of the 2012 Western Athletic Conference title.

Hipp also posted 17 doubles, one triple and one home run on the year while he led the team defensively with 148 assists. The middle-infielder was also in on the most double-plays (30) in 2012 as he finished the year making nice plays in the Aggies' NCAA Tournament appearance. Hipp was a second team All-WAC selection last year as he hit .328 (21-of-64) in league play with four doubles and 17 RBI.

**COLLEGE SPORTS MADNESS PRE-SEASON TEAMS:** CollegeSportsMadness.com recently announced its baseball preseason all-conference teams and All-American teams with New Mexico State well represented. Senior right-hand pitcher Adam Mott and senior short stop Parker Hipp were named first team members on the preseason team, while infielder Tanner Rust and outfielder Kyle Phillips earned second team honors.

Parker Hipp earned CollegeSportsMadness.com All-American honors as he was named to the fourth team.

**LOOKING AHEAD:** The Aggies will remain on the road after the Keith LeClaire Classic and travel to Raleigh, N.C., where they will meet North Carolina State for mid-week two-game series on Feb. 26-27. This will mark the first meeting between the two schools. The Wolfpack are coming off a successful 2012 campaign where they earned a 43-20 record and earned a trip to the NCAA Super Regional round before falling to Florida. The game can be heard in Las Cruces on the radio on KSNM AM 570 with coverage starting at 6 p.m. (Tape Delay).

The Aggies will stay on the road after their mid-week series with NC State and travel to Winston-Salem, N.C., where they'll take on Wake Forest for a weekend series on March 1-3. Wake Forest and the Aggies met for the first time in 2012 where the Aggies won three of the four games played. The game can be heard in Las Cruces on KSNM AM 570 live on Friday and Saturday. Sunday's game will be joined in progress at 12 p.m.

 17th Season  
 Oklahoma State, 1988



Head coach Rocky Ward heads into his 17th season at the helm of the NM State baseball team. Ward guided the Aggie squad for the 14th season in 2012 as the head coach. On two other occasions, 2001 and 2002, Ward shared the head coaching duties with his father, Gary. During his 16 seasons as part of the Aggie program, Ward's teams have set or tied 68 team records and set or tied 51 individual records.

Before Ward, NM State baseball was not considered a program with a winning tradition. That has changed, however, in the 16 years Ward has been part of the Aggie team. Ward, NM State's all-time winningest baseball coach, has worked diligently each season to improve the team's status, both locally and nationally. The 2012 season was no exception.

In one of the best seasons in recent NM State baseball history, Ward led the 2012 Aggie squad to a 35-24 overall record, including a two-game sweep in Tucson of eventual national champion, Arizona. The Aggies were the only team to win a series against the Wildcats all season long. The 2012 season was the fourth consecutive 30-plus win season for NM State. The Aggies also finished with a share of the WAC regular season title with an 11-7 conference record. Ward and his squad were rewarded at the end of the season by earning an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament, their first appearance in the tournament since 2003.

Under Ward's direction, the Aggie offense finished in the top 10 nationally in six different categories, including finishing second in the nation in walks with 347. Senior Tanner Waite led the nation in walks per game and was also tied for most total walks. Waite was one of five Aggie players to earn first-team All-WAC honors after the season. The Chicago White Sox drafted two of those players, senior shortstop Zach Voight and junior catcher Zac Fisher, during the 2012 MLB draft. NM State also had two players make the second team All-WAC and six players earn an Academic All-WAC honor.

On a personal level, Ward became the first NM State baseball coach to reach the 400-win milestone. He reached 400 wins on May 16, 2012, when the Aggies defeated CSU Bakersfield, 5-3, in Bakersfield, Calif. Ward finished the 2012 season with a total of 403 career wins.

The 2011 season was also a banner year for NM State and Ward, who had become the Aggies' all-time winningest coach the previous season. The Aggies finished the season with a 34-24 record, marking their third consecutive season with at least 30 wins. Ward finished the season with 368 career wins in his Aggie coaching career.

NM State won the 2011 NCAA Division I batting average title with a combined .337 batting average on the season. Twelve Aggie players finished with a batting average above .300, including eight starters who finished with a batting average above .325. The Aggies also led the nation in slugging percentage (.474), were third in total runs (495), third in walks (333), had a 10-win pitcher for the first time since 1995 and had five players who earned All-WAC honors.

Ward entered the 2010 season just two wins short of Jim Kwasny who tallied 300 wins from 1969-82. Ward surpassed Kwasny on the all-time wins list when the Aggies defeated Akron, 8-3, in game one of a doubleheader, Saturday, Feb. 27, 2010. The Aggies won 36 games in 2010, giving Ward's team 80 wins over two seasons. The 14 conference wins NM State posted in 2010 were second-most in team history,

one win short of the 2009 total. The Aggies established two significant winning streaks during the season, which helped the team obtain a national ranking. The first was a 12-game win streak that went from March 20-April 9. The second was a 10-game win streak that went from April 18-May 2.

Ward's 2010 team did not go unnoticed by its conference. The Aggies earned five WAC Hitter of the Week honors with senior Leo Aguirre earning the honor twice. Wade Reynoso, Ben Harty and Nate Shaver each earned the honor once, while junior Dan Reid was the only Aggie pitcher to earn WAC Pitcher of the Week Honors.

Along with all the weekly honors, the Aggies also picked up a few post-season awards. Aguirre, along with shortstop Ryan Aguayo, earned All-WAC honors. Aguirre was named to the first team, while Aguayo was a second team honoree. Probably the most impressive accomplishments, especially with a 60-game season, was having 12 baseball players being named to the 2009-10 Academic All-WAC teams.

Ward had one of the best seasons of his Aggie career in 2009 as his team won the most games in program history, made it to the WAC Tournament finals and broke two home run records. The 44 games the Aggies won in 2009 broke the record that was held by the 2003 NM State baseball team the won 43 games while a part of the Sun Belt Conference. With its winning ways, NM State went into the WAC tournament as the No. 4 seed and eventually ousted No. 1 seed San Jose State and No. 2 seed Louisiana Tech before falling to Fresno State in the championship series, losing 9-7 and 5-3. The Aggies did place three players on the all-tournament team including senior outfielder Richard Stout, junior infielder Mike Sodders and junior right-hand pitcher DJ Simon.

Ward's 2009 Aggie squad led the nation in on-base percentage (.469), slugging percentage (.599), runs (688), RBIs (628), total bases (1,310) and walks (416). NM State got off to 26-3 start, which helped to get the Aggies into the national polls at No. 24. It was the best start in program history. NM State hadn't had such an impressive start since the 1990 team went 19-3 to open the season.

The 2009 Aggies started the season with 487 wins at Presley Askew Field and on March 14, NM State picked up win No. 500 at Presley Askew Field with a 19-5 victory over visiting Northern Colorado.

With all of the success that season, Ward had two players placed on All-America teams. Shortstop Bryan Marquez was named to six different All-American teams while catcher Jeff Farnham was also named to an All-American team.

The 2008 seasons saw Ward and the Aggies have one of their best offensive seasons in school history. NM State led the WAC with 100 home runs and made it to the WAC tournament for the first time in school history after posting a 15-17 conference record, the best record for the Aggies since joining the WAC. Four players hit double-digit home runs including Joseph Scaperotta (23), Franky Busani (16), Marcus Quade (11) and Chris Auten (10). Scaperotta led the WAC in home runs, RBIs (82) and total bases (160). The offensive production by the Aggies was rewarded at the end of the year as six players were named to the All-WAC teams. Scaperotta earned first-team honors as an outfielder; Joe Leghorn was named first-team for his play at catcher, while Tyler Hardt earned first-team as a designated hitter. Right-handed pitchers Tyler Sturdevant and Heath Goin, along with shortstop Richard Stout, all made the second team.

2012 WAC Baseball Champion,  
2002, 2003, 2012 NCAA Tournament

Only the 2003 NM State baseball team had as many all-conference selections as the Aggies did in 2008. That year there were three first team and three second team All-Sun Belt Conference selections. Goin and Sturdevant were the first pitchers to be selected to an all-conference team since Dustin Cameron was selected to second team All-Sun Belt Conference in 2003. For the second consecutive season, Richard Stout led the team and conference in stolen bases with 20. He posted 26 in 2007. First baseman Chris Auten finished the 2008 season with a 21-game hitting streak, which carried over into the next season. He also led the Aggies with 24 doubles and had the most multiple hit games with 26. The 21-game hitting streak was the longest hitting streak in the WAC in 2008. Auten also led the conference in hits per game with 1.53.

Although the 2007 season was filled with plenty of ups and downs, there were plenty of highlights for Ward. First of all, he became the second-winningest coach in school history with 226 wins. He surpassed Elliot Avent (1989-96), May 14, 2007, when the Aggies beat Texas Tech, 5-4. Under Ward, catcher Joe Leghorn hit for the cycle against Sacramento State, March 18, 2007, while utility player Marcus Quade set a new hitting streak record going 33 straight games with a hit. Stout's 26 steals led the team and the conference in 2007 and also got him into the top-10 single-season record book as an Aggie for steals.

From 2001-06, the Aggies posted a combined record of 174-120, the most wins in a five-year span in the history of Aggie baseball. The Aggies set school records for most Division I wins in a season three years in a row - 29 in 2001, 34 in 2002 and 41 in 2003

Ward's 2006 team saw two players pick up preseason awards. Second baseman Jason Long and first baseman Luke Hopkins were both named to the Preseason All-WAC Team. In addition, Hopkins was named a 2006 second team preseason All-American and was listed on the Wallace Award Watch List, an honor awarded each year to the national college baseball player of the year. At the season's conclusion, center fielder Vince Rodden was named to the second-team All-WAC as he led the conference in stolen bases (33), stolen bases per game (0.61), plate appearances per game (4.94) and was second in walks (48). Serving as the Aggies' most powerful weapon at the plate, Hopkins also scattered his name in the record books after completing his second full season with NM State.

In single season records, Luke finished 2006 with the highest on-base percentage in school history (.548), tied for fifth in walks (53) and fifth in slugging percentage (.799). He led the nation in walks per game (1.2), was third in the nation in RBIs per game (1.48), seventh in slugging percentage, 10th in home runs per game (0.36) and 24th in batting average (.403). Injuries took a major toll on the Aggies throughout the year, as six players were lost for all or part of the season. One of the biggest losses was Tyler Sturdevant, who in only five appearances from the mound struck out 29 batters in 28 innings and had one complete game before falling victim to an arm injury. Six other Aggies sustained injuries, including Hopkins.

Despite the injuries, NM State did manage to post a record-setting game in their 17th test of the season as they pounded the Northern Iowa Panthers 37-11 on March 4. Heading into the series, the Panthers had a national RPI ranking of six and were undefeated at 6-0.

In the series opener, the Aggies looked like they were on their way to a win as they led 11-9 heading into the final inning. UNI then exploded for six runs on five hits in the top of the ninth and shut NMSU down in the bottom half to steal the win in the comeback effort. That was just the motivation the Aggies needed to exact revenge on the visiting squad as they hammered out their 37 runs on 22 hits the following day. In the win, NM State also set two school records, one of which had stood for 26 years. The 37 runs scored was the most in school history, eclipsing the record set when NM State beat Western New Mexico 35-0 back in 1981. The Aggies also set the record for most RBI in a game (33), surpassing the old mark of 32 set in 2005 against Chicago State.

Ward went into the 2005 season with four consecutive winning seasons in five years and NCAA Tournament appearances in 2002 and 2003. NMSU had never made a postseason appearance before 2002 and had never posted four straight winning seasons.

During the 2005 season, the Aggies had another successful year despite finishing with an overall record of 28-29. Ward's Aggies finished ranked in the top 10 in the country in three categories while finishing in the top 20 in a third. As a team, the Aggies finished second in the nation in home runs per game (1.56) with 89 total, third in scoring (9.3 runs/game), sixth in slugging percentage (.522) and 16th in batting average (.320). Several Aggies also made their mark in individual statistics as Mark Aranda led the nation in RBIs per game (1.57) and Hopkins finished closely behind in fourth (1.41). Aranda also finished second in home runs per game (.41) and third in slugging percentage (.767) while Hopkins ranked 38th in batting average (.392) and in slugging percentage (.679) as a freshman. Following the season, Aranda signed as a free agent with the Florida Marlins.

In an early season series against Chicago State, the Aggies set a new school record for runs scored in a four-game series as they plated 94 runs to sweep the series. The Aggies also defeated their rivals from the north, the New Mexico Lobos, three straight times, a feat that had not been accomplished since the 2001 season. The Aggies also proved to be a dominating force on their own diamond as they finished the season with a home record of 22 wins and only seven losses.

In 2004 the Aggies hit 115 home runs, setting a school and Sun Belt Conference record. Six different players hit at least 10 home runs that season, another school record. For the second consecutive season, the Aggies led the nation in home runs. The team also finished fifth in runs scored. All the records, however, were not set at the plate. NM State set a school record for best fielding percentage with a mark of .968. The Aggies finished 12-12 in conference play, the first time in school history the team finished .500 or better in league play in back-to-back seasons. Billy Becher became the first player in NCAA Division I history to lead the country in home runs and runs batted in per game in consecutive seasons. Becher finished the season with a .329 average, 19 doubles, 25 home runs and 90 RBI.

In 2003, the Aggies set school records for most wins in a season (43), most home wins in a season (31), best home winning percentage in a season (.912) and extended a school record home winning streak against non-conference opponents to 40. The Aggies had three players -- Becher, Alex Borgo and Brad Ditter -- earn first-team All-Sun Belt Conference honors while Becher and Ditter were taken in the Major League Baseball free agent draft.

In 2002, Ward helped lead NM State baseball to its first ever NCAA Tournament appearance and a Sun Belt Conference championship. Four players off that team were taken in the Major League Baseball free agent draft. Corey Harrington, Ryan Kenning, Gabe Veloz and Erik Winegarden all continued their careers after leading the Aggies to a spectacular season.

In 2001, the Aggies posted its first winning record since 1996 with a record of 32-23. In the season finale, NM State won two of three games versus Louisiana-Lafayette, who was a 2000 College World Series Final Four team.

In 2000, the Aggies finished 11th in the nation in doubles and led the Big West Conference, while ranking 21st nationally in scoring.

In 1999 Chris Barski, Luke Sullivan, Corey Richardson and Chris Weekly were all taken in the draft, which represented the most Aggies ever drafted in one year.

In 1998, the Aggies ranked fifth in the country in batting with its .351 team average and scored 10.35 runs per game to rank third in the country.

In 1997, Ward led the Aggies to a two-game sweep of the then No. 1 Texas Tech Red Raiders by scores of 12-11 and 19-17.

Ward came to Las Cruces from Kansas State, where he served two years as the hitting and infield coach and recruiting coordinator for the Wildcats from 1995-96. Prior to Kansas State, Ward spent the 1994 fall season as the top assistant coach at the University of Indianapolis. He served as the interim administrative assistant at Oklahoma State in the spring of 1994 before moving to Indianapolis.

A 1988 graduate of Oklahoma State, Ward played third base and catcher for the Cowboys from 1986 to 1988. The 1987 team finished as the runner-up at the College World Series, losing to Stanford in the championship game. The 1988 team ended its campaign with an amazing 61-8 record and was ranked No. 1 in the nation by Baseball America for a record 12 consecutive weeks. Ward was a two-time Phillips 66 Academic All-Big Eight selection during his three-year playing career at OSU.

He began his collegiate playing career at Connors State College in Warner, Okla., where he helped the squad to a 72-13 record in 1984. Ward transferred to Western Oklahoma State University in 1985.

In 1989, Ward created the Mid-America II Baseball Schools. Each year, he hosts a variety of camps that teach and fine-tune the baseball skills of America's youth. From 1988 through 1994, he served as the marketing director and an instructor for the Mid-America Baseball School.

Ward earned his bachelor's degree from Oklahoma State in 1988 and his master's at the University of Central Oklahoma in 1992. He spent some of his childhood growing up in Las Cruces while his father was working towards his master's degree at NM State. Ward is married to the former Jennifer Whitaker. The couple has three daughters, Emily (21), twin girls Malia (11) and Jorie (11), and two sons, Garrett (15) and Bradan (14).
