**ABOUT THE AGGIES:** The New Mexico State baseball team opens Western Athletic Conference play this week heading into the three-game series with Texas State with a 12-10 overall record, while it is 10-2 when playing at home.

The Aggies are hitting .290 as a team with a team-total of 172 runs scored and 21 home runs. NM State faces three right-hand starters this week and is 10-6 when going up against a righty-starter. The Aggies have played in two extra-inning games and are 2-0, defeating UW-Milwaukee 4-3 in the season opener (February 15) and La Salle 12-11 (March 10) in 10 innings. NM State has a good shot at winning Friday and Saturday's night games as it is 5-1 when playing in night games. The Aggies up their batting average to .332 when playing at night with senior Bobby Lecount leading the charge with a .444 batting average during those games.

Junior Tanner Rust leads the Aggie offense with a .375 batting average on the year, while Lecount isn't far behind with a .348 average. Lecount could be considered the power-hitter of the team as he leads the way with four home runs and 28 RBI's.

The Aggie pitching staff currently has a 4.73 ERA heading into the WAC opener compared to the 2012 pitching staff that had a 5.27 ERA heading into conference play. NM State has tallied 192 K's this season, as opposed to the 161 strikeouts posted by its opponents this year. Senior lefty Ryan Beck leads the Aggie starters with a 3.24 ERA and 32 strikeouts, while senior right-hander Adam Mott isn't far behind with a 3.97 ERA and 30 K's. Mott has worked the most innings of any Aggie pitcher with 34.0 innings pitched.

**THIS WEEK'S OPPONENTS:** Texas State is 7-13 overall while going 0-7 when playing on the road. This is the first ever meeting between the two teams. The Bobcats are coached by Ty Harrington.

Tyler Pearson and Andrew Stumph lead the offensive side for the Bobcats. Pearson is hitting a .308 with two doubles, eight RBI and a .387 on-base percentage. Stumph has a .302 batting average with 10 RBI, a .377 slugging percentage and a .409 on-base percentage.

Heading up the pitching staff for Texas State are Taylor Black, Scott Grist and Kyle Finnegan. Black, who is pitching against the Aggies on Friday, March 22, has a 3.38 ERA, a 1-3 record and one complete game in 32 innings. He was a part of two shutouts, one in which he completed on his own. Grist, who is pitching on Saturday, has a 4.66 ERA, a 1-1 record and five starts in 29 innings. Finnegan has a 4.66 ERA, a 2-1 record, six appearances, five starts in 29 innings and is starting against NM State on Sunday, March 24.

**PAULSON NAMED HITTER OF THE WEEK:** Junior infielder Michael Paulson was named the Western Athletic Conference Baseball Hitter of the Week on Monday, for the week of March 11-17.

He helped the Aggies to a 4-2 record last week with a four-game series sweep over Alabama A&M. Paulson hit .533 (8-for-15) with only a single strikeout over the six games. He also tallied four walks, seven RBI's, four doubles, scored seven runs and had a stolen base.

Paulson went 2-for-3 with an RBI in a 3-2 loss to No. 17 Oklahoma on Wednesday and followed that by scoring three runs in game one of a four-game series against Alabama A&M on Friday. In a 24-4 win over Alabama A&M during Saturday's doubleheader, Paulson was 2-for-3 with three RBI and a run scored while also marking a double. He finished the week going 2-for-2 with two runs scored, two RBI and a double as the Aggies defeated the Bulldogs 30-3 in seven innings. Paulson is now hitting .333 on the year with 10 RBI.

## **COLLEGE SPORTS MADDNESS HONORS BOBBY LECOUNT:**

Senior infielder Bobby Lecount earned WAC player of the week from CollegeSportsMadness.com as he helped the Aggies to a 4-2 record last week. He posted a .412 batting average (7-of-17) and a .542 on-base percentage with four walks, while being hit by a pitch twice. Lecount tallied a team-high 10 RBI's on the week while he hammered two homers and finished the week with a .824 slugging percentage. Lecount scored one of the Aggies' two runs in a 3-2 loss to No. 17 Oklahoma as he got on base three times; twice by walks and once from being hit by a pitch. He posted a three-run homer in a 20-6 win over Alabama A&M to open the four-game series and also scored twice. In game one of the doubleheader on Saturday, Lecount went 2-of-4 with four RBI.

**AGGIES IN WAC PLAY:** The Aggies have a 73-96 overall record in conference play since joining the WAC in 2006.

The Aggies first game came in 2006 and was a 9-1 loss to Nevada on March 24. NM State won its first ever WAC game on April 2, 2006 defeating Fresno State 9-8 in Las Cruces.

The Aggies are opening 2013-conference play against Texas State, March 22. This is the second earliest the Aggies have opened WAC play, with the earliest coming in 2007 when the Aggies opened league play against Sacramento State on March 16, 2007. NM State lost that game 7-3 in Las Cruces.

NM State is 5-2 in WAC opening games.

**SCORING RUNS:** The Aggies have out-scored their opponents 172-130 so far this season with 79 of those runs coming in a four-game series with Alabama A&M. NM State is first in the league in runs while it is No. 5 nationally. The Aggies are also first in the WAC in RBI's.

The 30-3 win over Alabama A&M is the largest margin of victory by any team in the nation this season according to WarrenNolan.com. That game also featured the most runs scored by any team in the nation during the 2013 season. NM State is averaging 7.9 runs per game which ranks 14th nationally. Georgia Tech leads all NCAA DI teams posting 10.0 runs per game.

Tanner Rust leads the Aggies and is tied for the lead in the WAC with 26 runs scored so far this year. Michael Medina is No. 4 in the league with 20 runs and Parker Hipp joins Quinnton Mack for the No. 5 spot in the conference with 19 runs scored.

**AGGIES IN THE WAC:** On the offensive side, NM State has many players ranked in the top 10 in the WAC. Tanner Rust is ranked fourth in batting average (.375) and tied for first in hits with 26. Michael Medina is fourth in the WAC with 20 hits, followed by Parker Hipp and Quinnton Mack, who are tied for fifth with 19 hits apiece. Rust is tied for third in the WAC with seven and is second in total bases with 46. Medina is No. 2 in total plate appearances in the WAC with 99, followed by Hipp tied for third (98), Rust tied for fifth (97) and Robert Lecount, who is tied for seventh with 95. Rust is No. 4 (.575) and Lecount is No. 5 (.565) in slugging percentage. Rust is tied for second in hits with 30.

The Aggies have five players in the top 10 in walks in the WAC. Hipp leads the WAC with 23, Medina is third with 18 and Rust, Mack and Lecount are tied for fifth with 15.

Lecount leads the WAC in sacrifice flies with six, while Rust is tied for sixth in at bats with 80. Hipp leads the WAC in on base percentage (.490), Rust is ranked third (.479), Lecount is seventh (.463) and Medina is ninth (.455). Lecount is No. 1 in RBI with 28 and tied for home runs with four. Derek Umphres, Hipp and Rust are tied for fifth with three home runs apiece. Mack is tied for first in stolen bases (7) and stolen base attempts (8). Rust and Medina are tied for third with six stolen bases apiece and tied for seventh in stolen base attempts with six.

Ryan Beck is tenth in the WAC in opposing batting average with a .224, while Adam Mott is third in innings pitched with 34. The Aggies have four pitchers in the top 10 for batters struck out with Beck tied for fourth (32), Adam Mott in sixth (30), Michael Ormseth in ninth (26) and Evan Mott in tenth (24). Casey Collins is tied for fourth in saves in the WAC with two

while Christopher Bradley is tied for sixth in games finished with six. Beck is tied for second in batters struck out looking (13) and Evan Mott is tied for sixth (9). Evan Mott is tied for second in appearances and games in relief with 12. Beck is tied for No. 1 in the WAC in wins with four. Adam Mott is No. 2 in the WAC in runners picked off with five, while Bradley is tied for sixth with two.

**AGGIES IN THE NATION:** NM State is ranked 16th in the nation in scoring, fifth in runs and 26th in hits. The Aggies are 39th in doubles, No. 9 in home runs per game and No. 3 in home runs. The Aggies are second nationally in walks and sixth in strikeouts per nine innings.

Tanner Rust is ranked ninth in runs, 37th in runs per game and 43rd in hits in the nation. Robert Lecount is No. 1 in the nation in sacrifice flies and 26th in RBI per game. Parker Hipp is No. 4 in walks and 18th in walks per game in the nation. Ryan Beck is 16th in the nation in victories and 21st in strikeouts per nine innings.

**LOOKING BACK:** The Aggies went 4-2 last week, winning all four games played at home and losing two on the road.

NM State fell 3-2 against No. 17 Oklahoma in the final inning of the game, Wednesday, March 13. NM State took a 2-1 lead in the seventh before Oklahoma tied the Aggies on an RBI double. Senior pitcher Adam Mott earned a team high of 30 K's on the year in a total of 3 innings.

NM State swept Alabama A&M in a four game home series at Presley Askew Field March 15-17. The Aggies opened the series with 20-6 victory on Friday, March 15 after coming back from a 5-0 deficit. They beat Alabama A&M in a double-header by a score of 24-4 in game one and 5-3 in game two. Eight different players had at least one RBI in the game scoring 24 runs off 21 hits and earning 11 walks. In the final game of the series the Aggies dominated the Bulldogs with a 30-3 victory scoring 30 runs off 26 hits and five walks on the day. The Aggies scored a total of 79 runs throughout the whole series. Senior Parker Hipp tied the all-time career school record for walks with 142 and only needs one more to break the record.

**TANNER RUST NAMED WAC HITTER OF THE WEEK:** Rust was named the W AC Baseball Hitter of the Week, for the week of March 4-10. Rust helped the Aggies to a 4-0 record during that week with a four-game series sweep over LaSalle. Rust hit .600 (9-for-15) without a single strikeout over the four games. He also tallied two walks, four RBI, scored eight runs and was 3-for-3 on stolen base attempts.

Rust opened the series with the Explorers going 3-for-4 with two RBI and scored a season-high three runs as the Aggies won 18-8 in eight innings. He went 2-for-3 in game one of a double-header on Saturday

with one RBI and two runs scored with NM State winning 8-2. Rust followed up hitting a double in game two of the double-header as the Aggies won 4-2 in seven innings. In the series finale, Rust was 3-for-5 with an RBI and two runs scored as the Aggies came-from-behind to win 12-11 in 10 innings. Rust tallied a double each day of the series.

**HIPP WATCH:** Senior Parker Hipp has a chance at breaking eight-different records at NM State. Below are the categories and his career stats with a tally on how many more he needs to break the record.

**BECK SHOOTING FOR STRIKEOUT RECORD:** Senior pitcher Ryan Beck has 254 strikeouts in his career and needs 67 to catch record-holder Gary Goldsmith (1990-93). He is currently No. 4 on the all-time list as he just surpassed former Aggie Mark Conti (1978-81) who finished his career with 238 K's. Former Aggie Jason Conner (2004-08) is now No. 6 as he tallied 235 strikeouts during his time.

**TAKE YOUR BASE:** The Aggies have racked up 143 walks so far this season. NM State is first in the WAC with 47 more walks than the No. 2 team in the league. The Aggies rank second nationally in walks as Central Arkansas leads the way with 150 on the year. Senior Parker Hipp leads the team with a total of 23 walks this season followed by Michael Medina who has 18. Hipp is heads into the weekend with 142 walks on his career, which is tied for the school record. Former Aggie Richard Stout posted 142 from 2007-09.

Last season the Aggies were ranked second in the nation with 347 walks. Tanner Waite led the nation in walks with 69 and Parker Hipp also walked 57 times and was ranked sixth in the nation.

**WAC PRESEASON POLL:** New Mexico State baseball was selected to finish third in the 2013 Western Athletic Conference regular season, in the coaches' preseason poll behind Dallas Baptist and Texas State, the WAC announced. The Aggies received 60 points in the voting that was done by the 10 WAC baseball coaches after a 35-24 season (11-7 WAC), which resulted in the 2012 WAC regular season co-champion title and an at-large bid to the NCAA tournament. Dallas Baptist, who joined the WAC this year, was picked to win the league with 80 points and eight first place votes after a 41-19 season. Surpassing the Aggies for the second spot is Texas State who received 65 points and one first place vote.

**PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN:** Senior short stop Parker Hipp of the New Mexico State baseball team was recently named to the 2013 Louisville Slugger Pre-Season All-American baseball team, selected by Collegiate Baseball newspaper. Hipp was a third team selection after hitting .349 with 51 runs scored and 49 RBI last year. He was first on the team in on-base percentage (.488) as he helped the Aggies win a share of the 2012 Western Athletic Conference title.

Hipp also posted 17 doubles, one triple and one home run on the year while he led the team defensively with 148 assists. The middle-infielder was also in on the most double-plays (30) in 2012 as he finished the year making nice plays in the Aggies' NCAA Tournament appearance. Hipp was a second team All-WAC selection last year as he hit .328 (21-of-64) in league play with four doubles and 17 RBI.

**COLLEGE SPORTS MADNESS PRESEASON TEAMS:** CollegeSportsMadness.com recently announced its baseball preseason all-conference teams and All-American teams with New Mexico State well represented. Senior right-hand pitcher Adam Mott and senior short stop Parker Hipp were named first team members on the preseason team, while infielder Tanner Rust and outfielder Kyle Phillips earned second team honors.

Parker Hipp earned CollegeSportsMadness.com All-American honors as he was named to the fourth team.

**LOOKING AHEAD:** NM State goes head-to-head against Texas Tech on Monday, March 25 at 6:05 p.m. (MT). The Aggies hold a 16-37 record against the Red Raiders since 1965. The game can be heard live in Las Cruces on KSNM AM 570.

 Oklahoma State, 1988



Head coach Rocky Ward heads into his 17th season at the helm of the NM State baseball team. Ward guided the Aggie squad for the 14th season in 2012 as the head coach. On two other occasions, 2001 and 2002, Ward shared the head coaching duties with his father, Gary. During his 16 seasons as part of the Aggie program, Ward's teams have set or tied 68 team records and set or tied 51 individual records.

Before Ward, NM State baseball was not considered a program with a winning tradition. That has changed, however, in the 16 years Ward has been part of the Aggie team. Ward, NM State's all-time winningest baseball coach, has worked diligently each season to improve the team's status, both locally and nationally. The 2012 season was no exception.

In one of the best seasons in recent NM State baseball history, Ward led the 2012 Aggie squad to a 35-24 overall record, including a two-game sweep in Tucson of eventual national champion, Arizona. The Aggies were the only team to win a series against the Wildcats all season long. The 2012 season was the fourth consecutive 30-plus win season for NM State. The Aggies also finished with a share of the WAC regular season title with an 11-7 conference record. Ward and his squad were rewarded at the end of the season by earning an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament, their first appearance in the tournament since 2003.

Under Ward's direction, the Aggie offense finished in the top 10 nationally in six different categories, including finishing second in the nation in walks with 347. Senior Tanner Waite led the nation in walks per game and was also tied for most total walks. Waite was one of five Aggie players to earn first-team All-WAC honors after the season. The Chicago White Sox drafted two of those players, senior shortstop Zach Voight and junior catcher Zac Fisher, during the 2012 MLB draft. NM State also had two players make the second team All-WAC and six players earn an Academic All-WAC honor.

On a personal level, Ward became the first NM State baseball coach to reach the 400-win milestone. He reached 400 wins on May 16, 2012, when the Aggies defeated CSU Bakersfield, 5-3, in Bakersfield, Calif. Ward finished the 2012 season with a total of 403 career wins.

The 2011 season was also a banner year for NM State and Ward, who had become the Aggies' all-time winningest coach the previous season. The Aggies finished the season with a 34-24 record, marking their third consecutive season with at least 30 wins. Ward finished the season with 368 career wins in his Aggie coaching career.

NM State won the 2011 NCAA Division I batting average title with a combined .337 batting average on the season. Twelve Aggie players finished with a batting average above .300, including eight starters who finished with a batting average above .325. The Aggies also led the nation in slugging percentage (.474), were third in total runs (495), third in walks (333), had a 10-win pitcher for the first time since 1995 and had five players who earned All-WAC honors.

Ward entered the 2010 season just two wins short of Jim Kwasny who tallied 300 wins from 1969-82. Ward surpassed Kwasny on the all-time wins list when the Aggies defeated Akron, 8-3, in game one of a doubleheader, Saturday, Feb. 27, 2010. The Aggies won 36 games in 2010, giving Ward's team 80 wins over two seasons. The 14 conference wins NM State posted in 2010 were second-most in team history,

one win short of the 2009 total. The Aggies established two significant winning streaks during the season, which helped the team obtain a national ranking. The first was a 12-game win streak that went from March 20-April 9. The second was a 10-game win streak that went from April 18-May 2.

Ward's 2010 team did not go unnoticed by its conference. The Aggies earned five WAC Hitter of the Week honors with senior Leo Aguirre earning the honor twice. Wade Reynoso, Ben Harty and Nate Shaver each earned the honor once, while junior Dan Reid was the only Aggie pitcher to earn WAC Pitcher of the Week Honors.

Along with all the weekly honors, the Aggies also picked up a few post-season awards. Aguirre, along with shortstop Ryan Aguayo, earned All-WAC honors. Aguirre was named to the first team, while Aguayo was a second team honoree. Probably the most impressive accomplishments, especially with a 60-game season, was having 12 baseball players being named to the 2009-10 Academic All-WAC teams.

Ward had one of the best seasons of his Aggie career in 2009 as his team won the most games in program history, made it to the WAC Tournament finals and broke two home run records. The 44 games the Aggies won in 2009 broke the record that was held by the 2003 NM State baseball team the won 43 games while a part of the Sun Belt Conference. With its winning ways, NM State went into the WAC tournament as the No. 4 seed and eventually ousted No. 1 seed San Jose State and No. 2 seed Louisiana Tech before falling to Fresno State in the championship series, losing 9-7 and 5-3. The Aggies did place three players on the all-tournament team including senior outfielder Richard Stout, junior infielder Mike Sodders and junior right-hand pitcher DJ Simon.

Ward's 2009 Aggie squad led the nation in on-base percentage (.469), slugging percentage (.599), runs (688), RBIs (628), total bases (1,310) and walks (416). NM State got off to 26-3 start, which helped to get the Aggies into the national polls at No. 24. It was the best start in program history. NM State hadn't had such an impressive start since the 1990 team went 19-3 to open the season.

The 2009 Aggies started the season with 487 wins at Presley Askew Field and on March 14, NM State picked up win No. 500 at Presley Askew Field with a 19-5 victory over visiting Northern Colorado.

With all of the success that season, Ward had two players placed on All-America teams. Shortstop Bryan Marquez was named to six different All-American teams while catcher Jeff Farnham was also named to an All-American team.

The 2008 seasons saw Ward and the Aggies have one of their best offensive seasons in school history. NM State led the WAC with 100 home runs and made it to the WAC tournament for the first time in school history after posting a 15-17 conference record, the best record for the Aggies since joining the WAC. Four players hit double-digit home runs including Joseph Scaperotta (23), Franky Busani (16), Marcus Quade (11) and Chris Auten (10). Scaperotta led the WAC in home runs, RBIs (82) and total bases (160). The offensive production by the Aggies was rewarded at the end of the year as six players were named to the All-WAC teams. Scaperotta earned first-team honors as an outfielder; Joe Leghorn was named first-team for his play at catcher, while Tyler Hardt earned first-team as a designated hitter. Right-handed pitchers Tyler Sturdevant and Heath Goin, along with shortstop Richard Stout, all made the second team.

2012 WAC Baseball Champion,  
2002, 2003, 2012 NCAA Tournament

Only the 2003 NM State baseball team had as many all-conference selections as the Aggies did in 2008. That year there were three first team and three second team All-Sun Belt Conference selections. Goin and Sturdevant were the first pitchers to be selected to an all-conference team since Dustin Cameron was selected to second team All-Sun Belt Conference in 2003. For the second consecutive season, Richard Stout led the team and conference in stolen bases with 20. He posted 26 in 2007. First baseman Chris Auten finished the 2008 season with a 21-game hitting streak, which carried over into the next season. He also led the Aggies with 24 doubles and had the most multiple hit games with 26. The 21-game hitting streak was the longest hitting streak in the WAC in 2008. Auten also led the conference in hits per game with 1.53.

Although the 2007 season was filled with plenty of ups and downs, there were plenty of highlights for Ward. First of all, he became the second-winningest coach in school history with 226 wins. He surpassed Elliot Avent (1989-96), May 14, 2007, when the Aggies beat Texas Tech, 5-4. Under Ward, catcher Joe Leghorn hit for the cycle against Sacramento State, March 18, 2007, while utility player Marcus Quade set a new hitting streak record going 33 straight games with a hit. Stout's 26 steals led the team and the conference in 2007 and also got him into the top-10 single-season record book as an Aggie for steals.

From 2001-06, the Aggies posted a combined record of 174-120, the most wins in a five-year span in the history of Aggie baseball. The Aggies set school records for most Division I wins in a season three years in a row - 29 in 2001, 34 in 2002 and 41 in 2003

Ward's 2006 team saw two players pick up preseason awards. Second baseman Jason Long and first baseman Luke Hopkins were both named to the Preseason All-WAC Team. In addition, Hopkins was named a 2006 second team preseason All-American and was listed on the Wallace Award Watch List, an honor awarded each year to the national college baseball player of the year. At the season's conclusion, center fielder Vince Rodden was named to the second-team All-WAC as he led the conference in stolen bases (33), stolen bases per game (0.61), plate appearances per game (4.94) and was second in walks (48). Serving as the Aggies' most powerful weapon at the plate, Hopkins also scattered his name in the record books after completing his second full season with NM State.

In single season records, Luke finished 2006 with the highest on-base percentage in school history (.548), tied for fifth in walks (53) and fifth in slugging percentage (.799). He led the nation in walks per game (1.2), was third in the nation in RBIs per game (1.48), seventh in slugging percentage, 10th in home runs per game (0.36) and 24th in batting average (.403). Injuries took a major toll on the Aggies throughout the year, as six players were lost for all or part of the season. One of the biggest losses was Tyler Sturdevant, who in only five appearances from the mound struck out 29 batters in 28 innings and had one complete game before falling victim to an arm injury. Six other Aggies sustained injuries, including Hopkins.

Despite the injuries, NM State did manage to post a record-setting game in their 17th test of the season as they pounded the Northern Iowa Panthers 37-11 on March 4. Heading into the series, the Panthers had a national RPI ranking of six and were undefeated at 6-0.

In the series opener, the Aggies looked like they were on their way to a win as they led 11-9 heading into the final inning. UNI then exploded for six runs on five hits in the top of the ninth and shut NMSU down in the bottom half to steal the win in the comeback effort. That was just the motivation the Aggies needed to exact revenge on the visiting squad as they hammered out their 37 runs on 22 hits the following day. In the win, NM State also set two school records, one of which had stood for 26 years. The 37 runs scored was the most in school history, eclipsing the record set when NM State beat Western New Mexico 35-0 back in 1981. The Aggies also set the record for most RBI in a game (33), surpassing the old mark of 32 set in 2005 against Chicago State.

Ward went into the 2005 season with four consecutive winning seasons in five years and NCAA Tournament appearances in 2002 and 2003. NMSU had never made a postseason appearance before 2002 and had never posted four straight winning seasons.

During the 2005 season, the Aggies had another successful year despite finishing with an overall record of 28-29. Ward's Aggies finished ranked in the top 10 in the country in three categories while finishing in the top 20 in a third. As a team, the Aggies finished second in the nation in home runs per game (1.56) with 89 total, third in scoring (9.3 runs/game), sixth in slugging percentage (.522) and 16th in batting average (.320). Several Aggies also made their mark in individual statistics as Mark Aranda led the nation in RBIs per game (1.57) and Hopkins finished closely behind in fourth (1.41). Aranda also finished second in home runs per game (.41) and third in slugging percentage (.767) while Hopkins ranked 38th in batting average (.392) and in slugging percentage (.679) as a freshman. Following the season, Aranda signed as a free agent with the Florida Marlins.

In an early season series against Chicago State, the Aggies set a new school record for runs scored in a four-game series as they plated 94 runs to sweep the series. The Aggies also defeated their rivals from the north, the New Mexico Lobos, three straight times, a feat that had not been accomplished since the 2001 season. The Aggies also proved to be a dominating force on their own diamond as they finished the season with a home record of 22 wins and only seven losses.

In 2004 the Aggies hit 115 home runs, setting a school and Sun Belt Conference record. Six different players hit at least 10 home runs that season, another school record. For the second consecutive season, the Aggies led the nation in home runs. The team also finished fifth in runs scored. All the records, however, were not set at the plate. NM State set a school record for best fielding percentage with a mark of .968. The Aggies finished 12-12 in conference play, the first time in school history the team finished .500 or better in league play in back-to-back seasons. Billy Becher became the first player in NCAA Division I history to lead the country in home runs and runs batted in per game in consecutive seasons. Becher finished the season with a .329 average, 19 doubles, 25 home runs and 90 RBI.

In 2003, the Aggies set school records for most wins in a season (43), most home wins in a season (31), best home winning percentage in a season (.912) and extended a school record home winning streak against non-conference opponents to 40. The Aggies had three players -- Becher, Alex Borgo and Brad Ditter -- earn first-team All-Sun Belt Conference honors while Becher and Ditter were taken in the Major League Baseball free agent draft.

In 2002, Ward helped lead NM State baseball to its first ever NCAA Tournament appearance and a Sun Belt Conference championship. Four players off that team were taken in the Major League Baseball free agent draft. Corey Harrington, Ryan Kenning, Gabe Veloz and Erik Winegarden all continued their careers after leading the Aggies to a spectacular season.

In 2001, the Aggies posted its first winning record since 1996 with a record of 32-23. In the season finale, NM State won two of three games versus Louisiana-Lafayette, who was a 2000 College World Series Final Four team.

In 2000, the Aggies finished 11th in the nation in doubles and led the Big West Conference, while ranking 21st nationally in scoring.

In 1999 Chris Barski, Luke Sullivan, Corey Richardson and Chris Weekly were all taken in the draft, which represented the most Aggies ever drafted in one year.

In 1998, the Aggies ranked fifth in the country in batting with its .351 team average and scored 10.35 runs per game to rank third in the country.

In 1997, Ward led the Aggies to a two-game sweep of the then No. 1 Texas Tech Red Raiders by scores of 12-11 and 19-17.

Ward came to Las Cruces from Kansas State, where he served two years as the hitting and infield coach and recruiting coordinator for the Wildcats from 1995-96. Prior to Kansas State, Ward spent the 1994 fall season as the top assistant coach at the University of Indianapolis. He served as the interim administrative assistant at Oklahoma State in the spring of 1994 before moving to Indianapolis.

A 1988 graduate of Oklahoma State, Ward played third base and catcher for the Cowboys from 1986 to 1988. The 1987 team finished as the runner-up at the College World Series, losing to Stanford in the championship game. The 1988 team ended its campaign with an amazing 61-8 record and was ranked No. 1 in the nation by Baseball America for a record 12 consecutive weeks. Ward was a two-time Phillips 66 Academic All-Big Eight selection during his three-year playing career at OSU.

He began his collegiate playing career at Connors State College in Warner, Okla., where he helped the squad to a 72-13 record in 1984. Ward transferred to Western Oklahoma State University in 1985.

In 1989, Ward created the Mid-America II Baseball Schools. Each year, he hosts a variety of camps that teach and fine-tune the baseball skills of America's youth. From 1988 through 1994, he served as the marketing director and an instructor for the Mid-America Baseball School.

Ward earned his bachelor's degree from Oklahoma State in 1988 and his master's at the University of Central Oklahoma in 1992.
