NM State Takes its 2-0 Record to El Paso for the Battle of I-10 with Rival UTEP; Kick-off set for 6 p.m. (MT) on Saturday

NM State will head south Saturday to face off against UTEP in the I-10 rivalry game. The Aggies head into the game coming off of a win against Georgia State (34-31, Sept. 6) and are 2-0 on the season. The Miners are 1-1 thus far, having lost to Texas Tech Sept. 6, 30-26.

NM State is heading into the game having lost the last five meetings between the two teams, with their last win coming in 2008. NM State is 35-54-2 all time in the series, with the first matchup coming in 1914 where the Aggies won 19-0. The UTEP win last year came on Sept. 14, with the Miners walking away from Las Cruces, N.M. with a 42-21 victory over the Aggies.

The game will take place in El Paso, Texas, Sept. 13 at 6:00 p.m. (MT). The game will available on TV on the American Sports Network.

Aggie Media Guidelines

INTERVIEWS

Interviews with head coach Doug Martin or any New Mexico State assistant football coach must be coordinated through Media Relations Director Tyler Dunkel, (575) 646-2927.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

All interviews must be arranged by the Media Relations Office. Players have been instructed not to grant any interview, in person or by telephone, not arranged by the Media Relations staff. Player telephone numbers are private and will not be released.

Interviews with players must be coordinated through the Athletic Media Relations Office at least one day in advance to minimize demands on the student-athlete's time. All other requests for after practice must be made by 1 p.m. on the day of the interview. No player interviews will be conducted after Wednesday of each week. Player interviews will be held on Tuesday and Wednesday and Saturday after games. Interviews will be conducted after practice or by phone if arranged prior to the day.

Head coach Doug Martin will review ALL media requests for players both before or after practice or requests by phone. Approval by Martin is needed before interviews can be scheduled. Martin or Media Relations Director Tyler Dunkel reserves the right to deny interview requests.

Phone interviews must also be coordinated through the Athletic Media Relations Office with the requested player returning the call at an agreed upon time from the Athletic Media Relations Office.

Keep in mind, team locker rooms are off limits to media representatives at ALL TIMES. Interviews during practice are strictly prohibited. New Mexico State football practices are open to the public and media is welcome to attend. Following each practice, Martin and selected players will be available for brief interviews if requested. Please coordinate with the Athletic Media Relations staff in attendance.

POSTGAME

New Mexico State provides equal access to all members of the working media.

At home games, Martin will hold a postgame press conference in the meeting room at the north end of Aggie Memorial Stadium. Access to this room can be found on the ramp leading to the field.

Requests for player interviews should be made to Media Relations Director Tyler Dunkel or the opposing SID no later than the eight-minute mark of the fourth quarter.

New Mexico State players will be brought to the meeting rooms for interviews. The opponent's coach will be available either on the field or outside the visitor's locker room at the discretion of the visiting SID.

Head coach Doug Martin will review ALL media requests for players after each game and reserves the right to select players from the submitted list.

CREDENTIALS

Credentials for New Mexico State home games are issued for working media ONLY and should be requested as early as possible due to space limitations.

All members of the media must request credentials in writing through Stephanie Taylor, Assistant Media Relations Director, (575) 646-3269.

Requests are honored from sports editors of daily newspapers and sports directors of television and radio stations. Requests from individuals not employed by a media outlet WILL NOT be considered.

along with his first career interception, which was returned (by Butler) 40 yards for a touchdown. It was also his first collegiate touchdown. The interception for a touchdown came when defensive end Jay Eakins tipped the ball behind the line of scrimmage on a 2nd-and-10 with 3:15 in the second quarter. After Eakins tipped the ball linebacker Rodney Butler snagged it out of the air returning it 40 yards for a touchdown. Johnson hit the point-after to make it a 17-10 ballgame in favor of Georgia State.

Johnson was a key component in the Aggies 3-point, come-from-behind victory as he hit field goals from 41 and 30 yards out. The 41 yard field goal, which was the longest of the season for any Aggie, came at the 4:15 mark of the second quarter giving NM State its first points of the game. His 30-yard field goal came after a 10-play 29-yard drive that started when the Aggies recovered a fumble with 2:43 left in the third quarter. Johnson scored a total of 10 points that included two field goals and four extra-point kicks, helping NM State to a 34-31 win.

The last time an Aggie was named a Sun Belt Conference Player of the Week was on Nov. 8, 2011 when former NM State quarterback Buck Pierce was named the offensive player of the week.

Looking Back

NM State football team walked away with a 34-27 win against Georgia State Saturday, Sept. 6 in Atlanta, GA, in their first Sun Belt Conference of the season. The Aggies moved to 2-0 overall and 1-0 in conference play.

Georgia scored the first 17 points after a 68-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Nick Arbuckle to receiver Donovan Harden. The Panthers remained in the lead until the fourth quarter when Aggie quarterback Tyler Rogers threw a five yard touchdown pass to Josep Matthews to take the lead 27-24.

The Panthers came back in the lead 31- 27 after 13 plays that moved them 86-yards. The game came to a final close when the Aggies made the winning touchdown with 15 seconds left on the clock. Rodgers threw an 11-yard pass to wide receiver Teldrick Morgan, securing the NM State victory 34-31.

Rodgers had 241 yards passing with three touchdowns and one interception on 25-of-44 passing. Rose recorded 89 yards on 17 carries with a long of 16. Morgan had eight receptions for 89 yards and two touchdowns with a long of 36. He added one carry for 18 yards. Aggie place kicker Maxwell Johnson was 2-for-2 on field goals and 4-4 on PAT's. Aggie linebacker Rodney Butler returned a 40 yard interception for a touchdown.

Coming back from 17 points was the first time the Aggies had come back from being down 14 or more points since 2002, when the Aggies overcame a 0-14 halftime deficit to beat Arkansas State 21-14. Butler's interception return was the first time NM State returned an interception for a score since 2010 when former Aggie Donovan House returned an interception against Hawai'i.

Aggie Comeback Victories

The Aggies came back from a 17-0 deficit against Georgia State Sept. 6, winning the game 34-31 off a late touchdown from Tyler Rogers to NM State receiver Teldrick Morgan with 15 seconds remaining on the clock.

The last time the Aggies came back from 14 or more points down was in 2002 against Arkansas State. On Oct. 26 in Jonesboro, Ark., the Aggies were down early to the Red Wolves in the first half, 0-14. To end the second quarter the Aggies rattle off 21 straight points, giving them a 21-14 lead going into the half.

Former Aggie Julmar Howard sacked the Arkansas State quarterback in the opening minutes of the third quarter in what would be the final points the Aggies needed to put away the Red Wolves. After an Aggie field goal and a Red Wolves touchdown in the fourth, the game ended 26-21, capping off an impressive NM State comeback.

The come-from-behind win against Georgia State marked the Aggies second win of the season, putting them at 2-0 on the year and 1-0 in conference.

NM State Defense has Great Opening Game Performance

The NM State defensive performance against Cal Poly was one to remember as the six passing yards they allowed, which ranked first in the NCAA that week. The dominating effort also ranks amongst the top in school history right behind the No. 1 performance when NM State held Lamar to zero yards passing on Nov. 4, 1972.

The last time the Aggies held a team to 10 points or fewer came against Alcorn State on Oct. 4, 2008, in a 45-10 win. NM State also held the Mustangs to only six yards passing, with the last time they accomplished that feat being in 2008 against San Jose State.

Sun Belt Preseason Preview

The Sun Belt Conference released its preseason rankings and co-champions UL Lafayette and Arkansas State were projected at No. 1 and No. 2 respectively. Newcomers NM State and Idaho were projected toward the bottom of the conference, with Idaho getting the No. 9 spot while the Aggies were placed No. 11.

After UL Lafayette's 121 points to earn first place, the second spot was much closer to the rest of the conference. Arkansas State earned 102 points, with South Alabama at No. 3 with 98 points, followed by five-time Sun Belt Champion Troy at No. 4 with 84 points.

The Aggies will play four of the five top ranked Sun Belt teams this season, starting with an away game at Troy, Oct. 11, and finishing with Arkansas State in Jonesboro, Ark. NM State will meet Louisiana Nov. 8 for the Aggies homecoming game.

Meet the NM State Backfield

The Aggies are looking forward to a successful year from their running backs, with high expectations for the ground game in the 2014 season. Headlining the backfield are sophomore back Xavier Hall and senior Brandon Bettencourt, assisted by incoming freshman Larry Rose.

Rose led the way for the Aggie backfield, recording 149 yards on 30 carries and scoring one touchdown. Rose also had four receptions for 13 yards and another touchdown. Hall had six carries for 22 yards and a touchdown, while Bettencourt ran seven times for 42 yards.

Hall and Bettencourt are Las Cruces natives; both having successful careers at Las Cruces High and Mayfield High respectively. Rose is coming off of his senior season at Fairfield High in Fairfield, Texas, where he rushed for 2,924 yards on 237 carries and recorded 49 touchdowns.

Last year Bettencourt played in eight games for the Aggies, rushing for 415 yards and two touchdowns, averaging 4.5 yards a carry. He also caught 13 receptions for 106 yards and one touchdown, averaging 8.2 yards per catch. Bettencourt rushed for a career-high 139 yards against I-25 rival New Mexico (Oct. 5). He followed that performance with 103 yards rushing on 17 carries against Rice (Oct. 19). Versus No. 13 UCLA (Sept. 21) he rushed for 95 yards and one touchdown.

Hall ran for 247 yards on 48 carries and two touchdowns during the 2013 season and recorded seven receptions for 47

yards in 11 games. He averaged 5.1 yards a rush and 6.7 yards a catch, starting the final four games of the year. His best game came against Boston College (Nov. 9), where Hall recorded career-high 95 yards on 14 carries and one touchdown. He also recorded four receptions for 32 yards in the same game.

NM State rushed for 1,701 yards last season on 444 carries. Averaging 3.8 yards a carry and 141.8 yards a game, the Aggies scored 14 touchdowns on the ground last season.

Las Cruces Aggies in the Backfield

Sophomore Xavier Hall and senior Brandon Bettencourt both hail from Las Cruces, N.M., and are a just a few of the local talent playing a big role for the Aggies this season.

In the season opener against Cal Poly, Bettencourt, who played for Mayfield High School, had seven carries for 42 yards, with an average of six yards a carry and a long of 17 yards. Hall, who played for Las Cruces High School, had six carries for 22 yards, with a 3.7 yard-average, one touchdown and a long of 13 yards. The two Aggie running backs combined for almost one-fifth of NM State's total offense against the Mustangs.

NM State Receivers are a Talented Bunch

NM State boasts a talented receiving core that features five of last years top six receivers led by seniors Jerrel Brown and Adam Shapiro. The Aggies tend to spread the wealth amongst the receiving core, which makes any receiver capable of being a threat to make a play. Of the five receivers who return from a year ago, each of those players appeared in every game last season. Each player also managed to catch at least 20 passes and gain at least 200 receiving yards a season ago.

Although the Aggies have a lot of experience among their receivers, they still are receiving production from their younger wideouts. Redshirt sophomore, Teldrick Morgan led the way for the Aggies in their season opener against Cal Poly on Aug. 28, where he recorded six receptions for 51 yards and caught the first touchdown of the season for the Aggies on the initial drive of the game. Redshirt freshman, Gregory Hogan served as the full-time punt returner and kick returner for the Aggies in the first game, which appears to be his role going forward.

NM State Showing its Youth

The Aggies opened up the season against Cal Poly on Aug. 28, with six freshman starters, two on offense and four on defense. Throughout the course of the game, 11 freshmen received playing time for the Aggies. Eight of the 11 freshmen who played in the season opener were true freshmen while the other three were redshirt freshmen.

True freshmen, Derek Ibekwe and Larry Rose III made the biggest impact of the freshmen in their first game with NM State. Ibekwe led the team with 14 tackles while Larry Rose III led the team with 149 rushing yards and two touchdowns.

Return of the Lefty

During the 2013 season, NM State was one of only two schools in the nation that boasted left footed kickers starting at both punter and place kicker. While punter Cayle Chapman-Brown

has left the Aggies, kicker Maxwell Johnson is returning for his senior year.

In his 2014 season debut, Maxwell went 4-4 in PATs for a total of four points against the Cal Poly Mustangs on Aug. 28. He scored 10 points in a come-from-behind win over Georgia State, which included a 41-yard field goal and another from 30-yards out.

Johnson played in 12 games for the Aggies in 2013 as a place kicker, kicking 29-of-32 PATs, 10-of-12 field goal and 20 kick-offs. He was 2-of-2 on field goals attempts three times in the season against Rice (Oct. 19), Abilene Christian (Oct. 26) and Boston College (Nov. 9). Johnson recorded his longest field goal of his career, against Rice, a 49-yard kick. Over the last six games of the season, Johnson made 18 straight extra point attempts, including a 5-of-5 performance against Louisiana (Nov. 2).

Aggies Honor Teammate

The NM State football team will wear No. 39 on the back of their helmets during the 2014 season to honor teammate Miles Washington, who suffered a life-altering injury during spring practice in April, 2013.

Johnson on Lou Groza Award Watch List

New Mexico State's Maxwell Johnson was named to the thirty-player Watch List for the 2014 Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award, as announced by the Palm Beach County Sports Commission.

Johnson returns after he was NM State's leading scorer in 2013. His 10 field goals came in the span of the final eight games, including a pair in the 4th quarter of a 34-29 victory over Abilene Christian.

In the 2014 season opener against Cal Poly, Aug. 28, Maxwell went a perfect 4-4 on PATs, for a total of four points.

Accomplishments are tabulated throughout the season and the Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award will announce its 20 semifinalists on Thursday, November 6th. From this list, a panel of more than 300 FBS head coaches, SIDs, media members, and former Groza finalists selects the top three finalists for the award by Monday, November 24th. That same group then selects the national winner, who will be announced on Thursday, December 11th during the Home Depot College Football Awards, broadcast live from Orlando, Fla.

Valerian Ume-Ezeoke named to Rimington Trophy Watch List

The Rimington Trophy Committee has released its 2014 Fall Watch List, which features 66 of the best centers in Division I football, including three centers from the Sun Belt Conference. Valerian Ume-Ezeoke was listed among the preseason candidates for the award that annually goes to the nation's best center.

In the season opener against Cal Poly, Aug. 28, Ume played on all 75 snaps, recording five knockdowns and one pancake.

Ume-Ezeoke started at center for the Aggies offensive line during the 2013 season, recording 56.5 knockdowns, second highest on the team. He had a season-high 10 knockdowns against Louisiana (Nov. 2). Ume-Ezeoke's play helped the Aggies' leading rusher Geremi Morrison rush for an average of 4.1 yards a rush on 109 carries for 451 yards and a team-high four rushing touchdowns. His blocking ability also allowed quarterback Andrew McDonald lead the Aggies in passing, throwing for 2,497 yards and 15 touchdowns, averaging 208.1 yards a game. Ume-Ezeoke was also named to the Remington Trophy Watch List last season as well.

While more than a dozen All-America teams are selected annually, the Rimington Trophy committee uses the Walter Camp Foundation, Sporting News and Football Writers Association of America teams to determine a winner. The winner will be recognized at the Rimington Trophy Presentation at the Roco Theatre in Lincoln, Neb., on Saturday, Jan. 17, 2015.

New Mexico Talent on Display in 2014

The 2014 NM State football team is filled with local players from N.M. The team boasts 17 players from the land of enchantment, with six from the Las Cruces area and nine from the Albuquerque area.

Some of the local players returning from last year are wide receivers Adam Shapiro and Joshua Bowen, running backs Xavier Hall and Brandon Betancourt and linemen Abram Holland and Matt Ramondo.

Hall and Bettencourt combined for one touchdown and 64 yards on 13 carries in the season opener against Cal Poly, Aug. 28, while Bowen had one reception for six yards.

Aggies in the Sun Belt

After playing an independent schedule in 2013, the Aggies are now members of the Sun Belt Conference for the 2014 season.

Founded in 1976, the Sun Belt has adapted and evolved in its nearly 40 year existence. The Sun Belt Conference has a permanent seat on the NCAA's 18-member Board of Directors. With the 2014-15 year marking the debut of the College Football Playoff (CFP) the Sun Belt continues to find itself among the 10 premier college football conferences and the new system is guaranteed universal access based on performance – there are no automatic qualifiers for the playoff system. Additionally, the CFP will mean that a spot among the premier bowl games of college football will be guaranteed to the highest-ranked champion from the other "Group of Five" conferences: the Sun Belt Conference, American Athletic Conference, Mountain West Conference, Mid-American Conference and Conference USA.

With the College Football Playoff included with the league's other bowl arrangements, the Sun Belt Conference is tied to seven total bowl games. The R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl, the GoDaddy Bowl, the Raycom Media Camellia Bowl, the Cure Bowl (debuting in 2015) all guarantee a home for a bowl eligible Sun Belt Conference team each year. And beginning with the 2016 season, the Sun Belt is also part of a rotation of conferences that will send a team to the Bahamas Bowl and the

Miami Beach Bowl.

The Sun Belt's 21 non-conference football wins in the 2013 season was a new record for the league - eclipsing the mark of 19 set the year prior. Additionally of note for the league's non-conference win total was that the Sun Belt fared well against its peer opponents in the non-AQ BCS ranks. The Sun Belt finished a combined 8-1 against members of Conference-USA (4-1), the Mid-American Conference (3-0) and the Mountain West Conference (1-0). The Sun Belt also had the best overall non-conference win percentage when comparing the four non-AQ conferences.

Aggie Walk-On Awarded Scholarship

Sophomore Rayvean Moore was awarded a football scholarship after playing the 2013 season as a walk on. Head coach Doug Martin said Moore earned the scholarship because of his hard work on the field and in the classroom.

Moore played in nine games during the 2013 season at wide receiver and on special teams. He had one reception for two yards against San Diego State Sept. 28. Moore redshirted as a freshman.

Tyler Rogers Steps in as Aggie QB

Tyler Rogers has been named as the starting quarterback for the NM State Aggies for the 2014 season.

In his debut behind center, the sophomore quarterback went 18-for-27 for 158 yards and two touchdowns. With a pass completion rating off 66.7 percent and only one interception, Rogers had an efficiency rating of 132.86 against Cal Poly.

Rogers is a transfer sophomore who played one year at Arizona Western. He played one season with Arizona Western as the team's starting quarterback. He threw for 1,832 yards and 14 touchdowns with only seven interceptions. Rogers also ran for 364 yards and a team-best 10 touchdowns. Rogers missed two and a half games down the final stretch of the season, but was able to dress for the Matadors third straight appearance in the Fisher Automotive El Toro Bowl.

In high school Rogers was the starting quarterback at Liberty High School for four years, leading his team to three league championships. He threw for 5,903 yards during his high school career, including 76 touchdown passes. Rogers also ran for 1,691 yards and 26 scores. As a senior, Rogers was the league and district player of the year, while also being selected as a first team all-section and second team all-state. He was one of two quarterbacks from Arizona selected to play in the California vs. Arizona All-Star game.

NM State RB Named to Award Watch List

Aggie freshman running back Larry Rose III was named to the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watch List Aug. 20, one of 43 players and one of only two freshman named to the list.

The Earl Campbell Tyler Rose award recognizes the top offensive player in Div. 1 football who also exhibits the enduring characteristics that define Earl Campbell: integrity, per-

formance, teamwork, sportsmanship, drive, community and tenacity. More specifically the tenacity to overcome adversity and injury in pursuit of reaching goals.

In addition to those attributes, the athlete must be born in Texas and/or graduated from a Texas high school and/or played at a Texas-based junior college or four year college.

Rose is from Fairfield, Texas, where he attended Fairfield High School. Playing running back and defensive back, as a senior Rose was named the Associated Press Sports Editor Class 3A Offensive Player of the Year and a first team all-state selection.

He rushed for 2,924 yards on 237 carries and 49 touchdowns his senior year. He also caught nine passes for 114 yards and three touchdowns. His season high was six scores in one game. Rose helped his team to a 15-1 record, the state championship game, and the No. 19 ranking in the state of Texas. Defensively Rose recorded seven tackles, six pass breakups and one interception.

Of the 43 players to be named to the watch list, there are nine conferences represented as well as three independent schools. By position, 17 wide receivers, 12 running backs, eight quarterbacks, three tight ends, two fullbacks and one halfback were selected for the watch list.

Aggie Linebackers

The Aggies will have a large void to fill after the departure of senior linebackers Trashaun Nixon and Bryan Bonilla who were second and third respectively for most tackles on the team last year. As a team, NM State recorded 47 tackles for loss a season ago. Nixon and Bonilla accounted for 19 of those 47 tackles for loss. Nixon also led the team with three sacks in his final season with the Aggies.

NM State will be expecting senior returning starter Clint Barnard to make a big impact on the field as he did a season ago. With a very young defense, Barnard will be leaned on for his veteran leadership throughout the course of the season. With 67 tackles last year, which was good for fourth on the team, Barnard will be wreaking havoc in a different way this year after making the move from linebacker to defensive end.

The linebacker position will be totally different from the core that took the field a year ago in terms of experience, but there will not be a drop off in talent. NM State is excited about two young linebackers who look to be cemented in the rotation. True freshman linebacker Derek Ibekwe is looking forward to making a difference for the Aggies after starring at Lamar Consolidated High School in Rosenberg, Texas. Sophomore linebacker Rodney Butler will also be a key factor for this defense after a solid freshman season where he spent time on special teams and finished the season with 39 tackles.

Aggie Underclassmen and Seniors on the Two-Deep

The Aggies rank No. 5 in the nation for most freshman and sophomores on the two-deep roster. Oklahoma State is first with 32 underclassmen in the rotation, followed by Colorado (29) and Utah, Pitt and Wake Forest all with 28.

The Aggies are tied with Texas A&M and place right above Arizona State, Florida and San Jose State all with 26 underclassmen.

NM State also ranks No. 5 in the Nation for fewest seniors in the rotation, with only nine seniors. The Aggies are tied with Washington State and USC, behind Pitt and Arizona State with eight seniors, Baylor (7) and Temple with six.

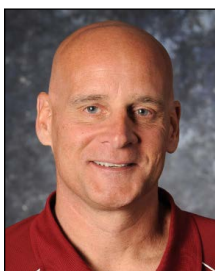

DOUG MARTIN

Second Season • Head Coach • Special Teams
Kentucky, 1985



Doug Martin begins his second season at the helm of the NM State football program in 2014. Martin and the Aggies played as an independent team during Martin's inaugural season at NM State and will play as a member of the Sun Belt Conference in 2014.

Martin was officially announced as the Aggies' 34th head football coach on Feb. 1, 2013, after the departure of former head coach DeWayne Walker to the NFL. Martin was no stranger to the NM State program as he was the Aggie offensive coordinator under

Walker in 2011.

NM State went 2-10 in 2013 during Martin's first season as head coach after playing one of the toughest schedules in the school's history. The Aggies faced five teams that had participated in a bowl game the previous season while also playing two teams ranked in the top 15 in the nation.

NM State kicked off the season with a trip to Austin, Texas, to face the 15th-ranked Texas Longhorns and also made a trip to Los Angeles during the season to play No. 13 UCLA. The Aggies' home schedule included games versus Minnesota, which was the first school out of the Big Ten to play at Aggie Memorial Stadium, and Boston College, which was the first school out of the Atlantic Coast Conference to make a trip to Las Cruces.

The Aggies averaged 20.9 points per game and 382.2 yards per game in 2013, including 141.8 yards per game on the ground and 240.5 yards per game through the air. The team had a season-high 224 yards rushing against Abilene Christian on Oct. 26 and a season-high 380 yards passing and receiving versus Boston College on Nov. 9.

Martin's influence and system began to take shape during the final five games of the season as NM State went 2-3 in those games and had fourth-quarter chances for a win in two of the three losses.

Martin would start making an impact on the squad as soon as he accepted the head coaching position. Before the season began, the Aggies had four players placed on six different preseason watch lists, the most for any NM State football team in the school's history. NM State also had 12 players honored on the College Sports Madness Independent Preseason All-Conference team and 11 players on the Phil Steele College Football Preview All-Independent team.

During the season, senior safety Davis Cazares was nominated as a Bulsworth Trophy finalist, honoring the most outstanding collegiate football player who began his career as a walk-on. Linebacker Clint Barnard would be named to the Capital One Academic All-District VII first team. The Aggies would also pick up three FBS Independent Player of the Week nods in 2013 under Martin, Cazares and Barnard on the defensive side and punter Cayle Chapman-Brown on special teams.

At the conclusion of the 2013 season, NM State would place five players on the All-Independent Football team including Cazares, Trashaun Nixon, Austin Franklin, Andy Cunningham and Davonte Wallace.

In 2012, Martin left his offensive coordinator position at NM State to take the same position for Boston College out of the ACC. The Eagles ranked 47th in the nation in passing offense, as Martin guided wide receiver Alex Amidon and offensive tackle Emmett Cleary to All-ACC honors. Amidon finished the season ranked 11th among all receivers in the country in receiving yards per game (100.8). He ranked second among all ACC receivers in both receptions per game (6.5) and receiving yards per game.

As the offensive coordinator for the Aggies in 2011, Martin helped NM State rank 47th in the country in total offense and 26th in passing offense. He helped guide the Aggies to a win over Minnesota, the program's first win against a team from the Big Ten. Under Martin, the Aggies had three All-WAC selections in wide receiver Taveon Rogers, offensive tackle Davonte Wallace and running back Kenny Turner. Quarterback Matt Christian led the Aggies with 2,158 yards passing and 15 touchdowns in 2011.

With seven seasons under his belt as the head coach at Kent State University and eight as the offensive coordinator, Martin was instrumental in building a true football program at the university. A total of 20 Golden Flashes earned All-Mid-American Conference accolades from 2007-10, including Eugene Jarvis, who was atop the active Football Bowl Subdivision running backs list with 3,722 career yards on the ground, and Brian Lainhart, whose 17 career interceptions was also tops among active FBS players.

In 2010, Roosevelt Nix was named the MAC Defensive Player of the Year under Martin's watch. Also under Martin, four players were selected in the NFL draft including Jameson Konz (2010 - 7th round, Seattle Seahawks), Usama Young (2007 - 3rd round, New Orleans Saints), Jack Williams (2008 - 4th round, Denver Broncos) and Julian Edelman (2009 - 7th round, New England Patriots), with Young becoming the sixth-highest pick in the history of the program.

During that time, Martin's offense at Kent State recorded a remarkable 16,907 yards of total offense, averaging 422.6 yards per game during that spanned including 26.3 points a game.

In December of 2006, Martin signed a four-year extension that kept him in Blue and Gold through 2010. The extension rewarded a 2006 campaign that saw Kent State pull off the fourth-largest turnaround in the nation, improving by five wins over the previous year's total.

Included in the performance was a five-game winning streak, including four straight MAC victories - the Flashes' longest conference streak ever. Furthermore, the nation's 25th-ranked team in total defense in 2006, limited Miami and Bowling Green to a combined 17 points as Kent State won road games against the RedHawks and Falcons in the same season for the first time since 1972. Kent State saw five players earn All-MAC accolades.

In addition to his head coaching duties, Martin also served as quarterbacks' coach and was the offensive coordinator for all but the 2009 season.

Martin is widely regarded as one of the nation's premier quarterback mentors. His list of protégés includes three-time All-Conference USA selection and current NFL passer David Garrard, record-setting CFL quarterback Marcus Crandell and other pros Richard Alston and Joshua Cribbs, who both played quarterback in college under Martin before switching positions in the NFL.

In 2005, Martin's spread passing attack posted the third-highest yardage total in school history while the team's 15 touchdown passes were the sixth most in a single year at Kent State. The Flashes also reached the 30-point mark three
