Northeastern's faculty focus on interdisciplinary research, entrepreneurship, and on transforming research into commercial solutions that address the world's most pressing problems.

Northeastern's excellence in education, research, and urban and global engagement is attracting highly-talented applicants from throughout the U.S. and around the world. This year, it received more than 47,000 applications for freshman admission—the highest in the University's history. During Aoun's presidency, Northeastern has also established a network of graduate campuses and has amassed one of the largest libraries of online and hybrid professional masters programs of any university in the U.S.

President Aoun came to Northeastern from the University of Southern California's College of Letters, Arts & Sciences where he was the inaugural holder of the Anna H. Bing Dean's Chair. He received his Ph.D. in linguistics and philosophy from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and advanced degrees from the University of Paris (France) VIII and Saint Joseph University (Beirut, Lebanon).

President Aoun has published seven books and written more than 40 articles. In 2006 he was named a Chevalier dans l'Ordre des Palmes Academiques (Knight of the Order of the Academic Palms) by the French government. In 2011, he received the prestigious Robert A. Muh Award from MIT's School of Humanities, Arts, and Social Sciences. He is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and is the immediate past Chair of the American Council on Education (ACE). In 2013, Northeastern University President Joseph E. Aoun was elected a fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS).

- Oversees Northeastern's 18-sport, NCAA Division I athletic department, as well as Northeastern Campus Recreation, which offers more than 40 club and 30 intramural teams
- Was appointed to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee in September 2012
- Named one of the 100 Most Influential Sports Educators in America by the Institute of International Sport in October 2007.
- Previously served as the director of Northeastern's Center for Sport in Society, as well as the marketing vice president at Reebok
- Was a basketball student-athlete at Dartmouth, where he graduated in 1979

Peter Roby was named Northeastern's ninth athletic director on June 21, 2007. Roby, former men's basketball head coach at Harvard University, marketing vice president at Reebok and director of Northeastern's Center for Sport in Society, brings broad experience and unique perspective to his position.

Roby oversees Northeastern's 18-sport, NCAA Division I athletic department, which competes in the highly-competitive Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), Hockey East Association and Eastern Association of Rowing Colleges (EARC). In addition, Roby oversees Northeastern Campus Recreation, which offers more than 40 club and 30 intramural sports teams, as well as a wealth of physical education opportunities for Northeastern students.

In September 2012, Roby was appointed to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee. The 10-member committee is responsible for selecting and seeding the NCAA tournament field every year. Committee members serve five-year terms. At the time of Roby's appointment, committee chair and Xavier director of athletics Mike Bobinski said, "Peter brings a wealth of basketball experience to the committee, having been a Division I student-athlete, a coach and now an administrator. We look forward to his contributions to our group."

Roby served as associate athletic director for student-athlete welfare during the 2005-06 season, in addition to his duties at Sport in Society. As the department head, Roby was a forceful national leader, championing the role sports can play in bringing about positive social change through research, education and advocacy. He also has been outspoken in decrying the use of performance-enhancing drugs, competitive pressures placed on children, permissive attitudes toward professional athletes and a number of other sports-related issues.

Roby has been referenced extensively in print, television and radio media all over the world and his opinion pieces have been published on the editorial pages of many well-known publications, including the Boston Globe, the Indianapolis Star, the Dallas Morning News and the Oregonian.

In October of 2007, Roby was named one of the 100 Most Influential Sports Educators in America by the Institute of International Sport. The criteria for selection was the effective use of sport as a means to educate.

Prior to assuming his post at Sport in Society, Roby was the vice president of U.S. marketing at Reebok. During his tenure with Reebok he held two other positions, as the director of key account marketing and the director of U.S. sports marketing. He was responsible for the development and execution of marketing plans in the United States. He also oversaw strategic planning, grassroots marketing and sponsorships.

Leading up to his time at Reebok, Roby had a fulfilling career as a college basketball coach. He served six seasons as men's basketball head coach at Harvard University and three years as an assistant coach. Before joining Harvard, Roby was the assistant coach at Stanford University, Dartmouth College and the U.S. Military Academy at West Point.

Roby is a 1979 graduate of Dartmouth College, where he was co-captain of the basketball team and earned a bachelor's degree in government. He also holds a master's degree in leadership from Northeastern, which was conferred in 2008. A native of New Britain, Conn., Roby lives with his wife, Sandra, in Newton, Mass. They are the parents of three children, Kayla, Peter and Jon Paul.

On non-game days, interviews must be coordinated through the athletic communications office at least 24 hours in advance. A student-athlete's phone number and e-mail address will not be released unless that student-athlete gives permission. Student-athletes will not be asked to miss class time. The athletic communications office will do its best to provide an interview time that is mutually convenient for both the player / coach and the media representative.

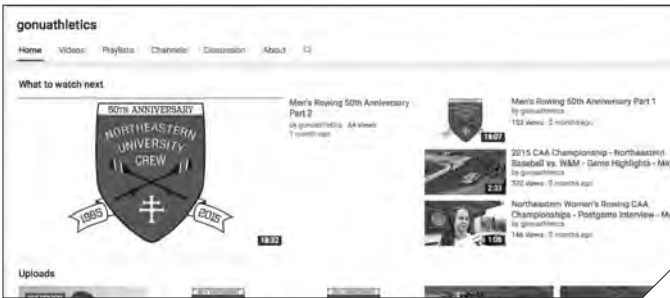

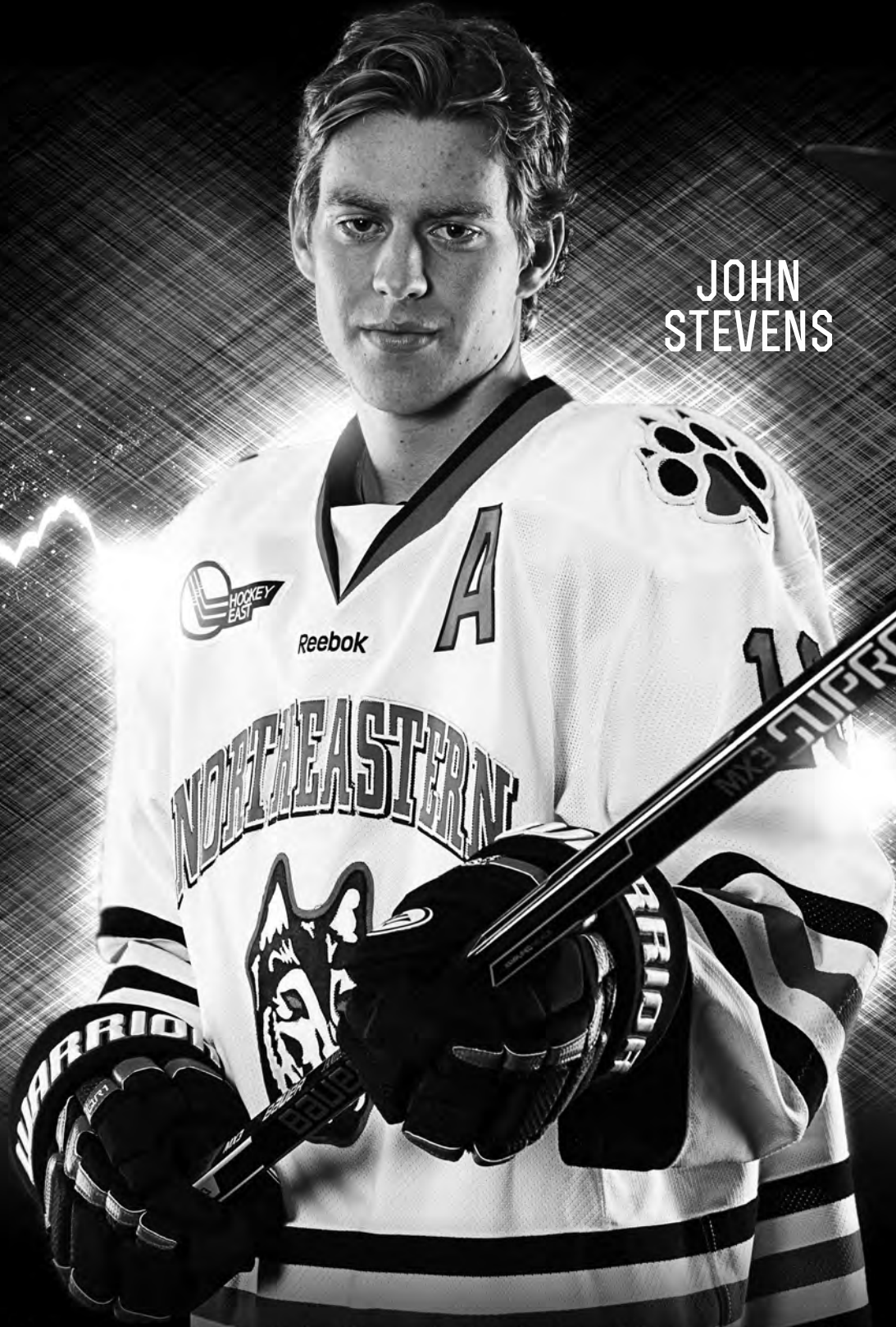

## Jim Madigan

### Head Coach

*Fifth Season • Northeastern '86*

- Named the 10th coach in men's hockey program history on July 26, 2011
- Led NU to back-to-back seasons with a .500 record or better for the first time since the 2008-09 and 2009-10 seasons.
- Guided Northeastern to 19 victories in 2013-14, the most since 2008-09, marking the first season above .500 in five years; the Huskies' 19 wins in 2013-14 were tied for the sixth most in program history
- Tied for third-most wins in school history by a first-year head coach in 2011-12
- Three-time Beanpot champion (two as a player and one as an assistant coach at Northeastern)
- Involved in college and professional hockey for more than 29 years
- Scouted for the Pittsburgh Penguins from 2006 to 2011 and helped build a team that captured the Stanley Cup in 2009
- As an assistant coach at NU (1986-93), recruited and coached four All-Americans and 15 All-Hockey East selections

Northeastern alumnus and three-time Beanpot champion Jim Madigan was named Northeastern hockey's 10th head coach in program history on July 26, 2011, and enters his fifth season as leader of the Huskies' hockey program in 2015-16.

Madigan brings more than 29 years of college and professional hockey experience to his post on Huntington Avenue. He played for the Huskies from 1981 to 1985 and was an assistant coach at the university from 1986 to 1993. He served as a professional scout for the New York Islanders and Pittsburgh Penguins from 1993 to 2011, winning a Stanley Cup in 2009.

Madigan and the Huskies are coming off a 2014-15 season that saw NU go 16-16-4 overall, including a seven-game winning streak that was tied for the second longest in team history. The Huskies advanced to the Beanpot championship for the fourth time in five years, and hosted a playoff series at Matthews Arena for the first time since 2009. Over the final 27 games of the season, Northeastern went 16-8-3, tied for the eighth best winning percentage in the nation in that span.

With one of the youngest rosters in college hockey consisting of 19 underclassmen, including 12 freshmen, Madigan guided the 2013-14 Huskies to one of their best seasons in program history. NU was 19-14-4, which was tied for the sixth most wins in team history as well as tied for the fourth largest turnaround in the NCAA. Madigan's squad reached the Beanpot championship game for the third time in the last four years and returned to the playoffs for the first time since 2011.

Northeastern finished the 2013-14 campaign ranked 19th in the USCHO.com poll, and was ranked as high as ninth on two occasions, NU's highest ranking since the end of the 2008-09 season. The Huskies were also 18th in the final Pair-Wise ranking, narrowly missing an at-large bid to the national tournament.

In his second season at the helm of the Huskies, Madigan's team experienced success in waves, most notably ending 25 years of history at the Beanpot Tournament. In the first round of the 2013 Beanpot on Feb. 4, Madigan's Huskies defeated Boston University, 3-2, for the first time since NU last raised the trophy on Feb. 8, 1988.

Starting off the 2012-13 campaign after a season-opening win over Merrimack, Madigan's club knocked off defending national champion and No. 1-ranked Boston College, 3-1, curbing BC's 19-game winning streak from the season prior.

In his first season as head coach, Madigan led the Huskies to their fifth-longest unbeaten streak in program history. Northeastern amassed a 7-0-1 mark from Nov. 18 to Dec. 31, 2011. It was the program's longest unbeaten string since the 2007-08 season.

Madigan tied for the third most wins in school history (13) as a first-year coach. Three of those victories occurred on the road against the No. 2 team in the country (Notre Dame and Minnesota).

As a professional hockey scout, Madigan demonstrated great skill in identifying and evaluating talent in a thorough and insightful manner. He served as a scout for the Pittsburgh Penguins from 2006 to 2011, helping that franchise build a team that advanced to the Stanley Cup finals in consecutive seasons (2008 and 2009) and that captured the Stanley Cup in 2009.

He played a key role in identifying two Huskies who excelled in the Penguins organization—Brad Thiessen and Joe Vitale. In 2012-13, Vitale spent time on the Pens' NHL roster and Thiessen was named the AHL's most outstanding goaltender. Prior to his tenure with the Penguins, Madigan served as a scout for the New York Islanders for 13 years. During his time in hockey, Madigan has worked alongside some of the great innovators of the game, from Northeastern's own Ferry Flaman (NU head coach, 1970-89) to notable NHL executives Ray Shero (former general manager (GM), Pittsburgh), Don Maloney (GM, Phoenix), Chuck Fletcher (GM, Minnesota), Randy Sexton (GM, Florida), Mike Milbury (former GM, New York Islanders), Gordie Clark (director of player personnel, New York Rangers) and Jay Heinbuck (NU alumnus and co-director of amateur scouting, Pittsburgh).

Northeastern fans also will remember Madigan's tenure as an assistant coach for the Huskies from 1986 to 1993. During that seven-year stint, he recruited and coached four All-Americans and 15 All-Hockey East selections. In addition to recruiting, Madigan was involved in all aspects of running a successful Division I program. During his time on the NU bench, the Huskies won 100 games and in 1988 captured the program's last Beanpot title and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

Prior to returning to his alma mater, Madigan coached at the University of Vermont for one season (1985-86).

As a player at Northeastern, Madigan was a four-year letterwinner under Ferry Flaman (1981-85), leading the Huskies to a 67-59-5 record. During his freshman campaign, NU won 25 games, establishing a single-season wins record that remains tied for best all-time in program history. That same season, he helped lead the Huskies to the NCAA Frozen Four. Building on that success, Madigan was a key contributor to two Huskies' Beanpot championships in 1984 and 1985.

In 1982, he was voted NU Rookie of the Year. In his senior campaign he was named assistant captain and, at season's end, was presented with the program's Unsung Hero Award. Madigan skated in 119 career games, recording 78 points (34-44-78).

In 1998, Madigan was awarded the Friends of NU Hockey Ferry C. Flaman Award. The honor is presented to a benefactor of Northeastern hockey who has demonstrated the commitment and dedication of Coach Flaman to making NU hockey a success.

Madigan's appointment as head coach continues his nearly three-decades-long at Northeastern. His dedicated service to the university includes roles as men's ice hockey assistant coach (1986-93), assistant director of physical plant services (1993-99), director of athletic development (1999-2004) and associate dean and director of development in the College of Business Administration (2004-11). In his most recent post, he led a development effort that generated an average of \$5.7 million in gifts over seven years, including \$13 million in 2010-11. Over the course of his career, Madigan has shown an unparalleled ability to promote Northeastern to a broad and diverse constituency—including prospective students, alumni and other supporters.

Madigan graduated from Northeastern in 1986 with a degree in business administration. He and his wife, Kim, an NU alumna, have two daughters, Kelly and Kate, who graduated from Northeastern in 2013 and 2014, respectively.

## Jerry Keefe

### Associate Head Coach

*Fifth Season • Providence '00*

- Leads Northeastern's power play unit and plays a significant role in the Huskies' recruiting efforts
- Assistant coach at Brown University (2009-11), head coach at Westfield State (2008-09) and assistant coach at UMass Boston (2006-07)
- Resurrected Westfield State's program after a 20-year dormant phase, recruiting 27 student-athletes and leading them to a second-place finish in the league
- Four-year center for Providence College (1996-2000) and finished with 98 points in 102 career games
- Honored as New England's Most Improved Player as a student-athlete at Providence College

Jerry Keefe enters his fifth season at Northeastern, and second as associate head coach. Keefe served as the assistant coach for three seasons before being promoted to his current post in 2014. Keefe has established himself as a notable name in the New England college hockey ranks, making stops at Westfield State and UMass Boston before his two seasons at Brown from 2009 to 2011. Keefe has also gained valuable experience through many different capacities with USA Hockey.

Keefe oversees the Huskies' power play unit and holds a significant role in Northeastern's recruiting process, including the recruitment of Kevin Roy, who led the team in scoring for the third straight season in 2014-15 and was named the program's 18th All-American in team history. During the 2014-15 season, the NU power play unit converted 34 times, ranked second in Hockey East and tied for seventh nationally. The Huskies' 20.7% (34-of-164) success rate on the man advantage was good for 10th in the country last season.

Keefe and the Huskies are coming off a 2014-15 season that saw NU go 16-16-4 overall, including a seven-game winning streak that was tied for the second longest in team history. The Huskies advanced to the Beanpot championship for the fourth time in five years, and hosted a playoff series at Matthews Arena for the first time since 2009. Over the final 27 games of the season, Northeastern went 16-8-3, tied for the eighth best winning percentage in the nation in that span.

With one of the youngest rosters in college hockey consisting of 19 underclassmen, including 12 freshmen, Keefe helped guide the 2013-14 Huskies to one of their best seasons in program history. NU was 19-14-4, which was tied for the sixth most wins in team history as well as tied for the fourth largest turnaround in the NCAA. The squad reached the Beanpot championship game for the third time in the last four years and returned to the playoffs for the first time since 2011.

Northeastern finished the 2013-14 campaign ranked 19th in the USCHO.com poll, and was ranked as high as ninth on two occasions, NU's highest ranking since the end of the 2008-09 season. The Huskies were also 18th in the final PairWise ranking, narrowly missing an at-large bid to the national tournament.

In his second year at Northeastern, Keefe was instrumental in Northeastern's first victory over Boston University in the Beanpot Tournament in 25 years. Keefe's impression was also felt through the recruiting class he ushered in as Northeastern's freshmen class led the way with 77 points (24-53-77) in 2012-13.

In his first season on NU's bench, Keefe assisted the Huskies to their fifth-longest unbeaten streak in program history. He also helped lead Northeastern to three road victories against the No. 2 ranked team in the country during the 2011-12 season.

In his first season behind the bench with Brown in 2009-10, Keefe helped direct the Bears to an ECAC semifinals berth for the first time since the 2002-03 campaign.

One of Keefe's most notable accomplishments was the resurrection of the Westfield State hockey program for the 2008-09 season after a 20-year dormant phase. Keefe was able to recruit 27 student-athletes and led the Owls to a second-place finish in the MASCAC. Keefe's squad posted an 11-9-4 record and made the playoffs for the first time since 1980-81.

Before breathing life into Westfield State's program, Keefe served as an assistant for one season with UMass Boston in 2006-07.

Keefe's roles with USA Hockey include the Yankee Conference Team New England District head evaluator (2006-08), an instructor for New England District Festivals (2006-07), a coach for the USA Hockey Select-17 Festival in St. Cloud, Minn. (2007-08), and a coach for the Massachusetts Satellite Program (2008-present).

As a student-athlete, Keefe was a four-year center with Providence College from 1996 to 2000 and finished with 98 points (30-68-98) in 102 career games. After leading the Friars with 52 points in 37 games, the highest single-season point total in 15 years, Keefe was honored as New England's Most Improved Player. Upon graduation, Keefe's professional hockey career started at the end of the 2000 season with the Cincinnati Mighty Ducks (AHL) and Trenton Titans (ECHL). Keefe's pro career lasted five years, including a pair of seasons in Europe.

A native of Billerica, Massachusetts, Keefe was a three-time All-Scholastic player and a member of a state championship team at Matignon High School, earning Massachusetts Player of the Year honors in 1993. Prior to enrolling at Providence, Keefe also played for the U.S. National Under-17 Team that won a silver medal in Tokyo in 1994 and the U-16 team that went 4-0 in Switzerland.

In 1995, he was the team MVP and the leading scorer for the Omaha Lancers (USHL), leading the team in scoring for the second straight year as a captain in 1996. He was twice named a USHL All-Star and still ranks in the Lancers' all-time top 10 in scoring.

Keefe graduated from Providence with a B.S. in business administration and currently resides in Saugus, Massachusetts with his wife, Maria, and their son, Owen (9), and five-year old daughter, Emmerson.





## Jason Smith

### Assistant Coach

Third Season • Salem State '98

- Leads Northeastern's penalty-killing unit and acts as the Huskies' academic liaison
- Previously served as Northeastern's director of hockey operations during the 2013-14 season
- Assistant coach at Holy Cross (2007-13), assistant coach at Babson (2003-07), and assistant coach at Salem State (1999-03)
- Graduated from Salem State in 1998, where he was a two-year captain and led the team in scoring as a junior and senior
- Played one season at Massachusetts in 1993-94

Jason Smith begins his third season at Northeastern, and second as assistant coach. Smith served as the director of hockey operations during the 2013-14 season before being promoted to assistant coach on Sept. 3, 2014. Smith oversees the Huskies' penalty-killing unit and works with NU's student-athletes as their academic liaison.

A native of West Yarmouth, Massachusetts, Smith graduated from Salem State in 1998 where he was a three-year member of the hockey team and was a captain as a junior and senior. Smith led the team in scoring in the 1996-97 season. He previously played at Massachusetts during the 1993-94 season.

Smith and his wife, Karen, reside in Assonet, Massachusetts, with their daughters Allyson and Ashley.





## Ed Walsh

**Volunteer Assistant Coach**

*Third Season • Salem State*

Ed Walsh enters his third full season as Northeastern's volunteer assistant coach after stepping in midway through the 2012-13 season. Walsh will primarily work with the Huskies' goaltending corps. The Tewksbury, Massachusetts, native owns a formidable resume within the New England hockey ranks.

In relation to college hockey, Walsh left his footprint on both the UMass Lowell and Dartmouth programs. In 2010-11, Walsh returned to UMass Lowell as the team's primary goaltending coach before a six-year run at Dartmouth where he served in a similar position. Before his time in Hanover, New Hampshire, Walsh served as systems analyst and goaltender coach for UMass Lowell for eight seasons from 1994 to 2003.

During his primary run with UMass Lowell, Walsh was on staff in 1996 when the River Hawks' staff received the NCAA Division I Coaching Staff of the Year Award. Also during that time, Lowell made six appearances in the Hockey East Championship and NCAA quarterfinals twice.

Walsh coached with the USA Hockey New England program and also works with USA Hockey as a coach and lecturer. Before that opportunity, Walsh skippered the New Hampshire Select-17 Team.

As a player, Walsh was a top-end goaltender and was named the defensive player of the year and goaltender of the year in Massachusetts. He also backstopped Team Massachusetts when it went on to claim the 1983 USA Championship. Walsh's collegiate career was cut short at Salem State after he endured an injury that ended his career just after his freshman season.

For the last 25 years, Walsh has owned and operated the Ed Walsh Hockey Schools. Walsh has placed many of his pupils in the professional, collegiate and prep school ranks. His classes specialize in providing offensive and defensive training and goaltending training. Walsh and his wife, Joanne, have two sons, Alexander and Cameron. They reside in North Salem, New Hampshire.

Mike McLaughlin is in his second season as the director of hockey operations at Northeastern. McLaughlin joined the coaching staff in a fulltime capacity in 2014 after spending two seasons as a volunteer graduate assistant.

McLaughlin is responsible for the team's digital video analysis system, including all video breakdown and management of video databases for coach and player use as well as maintaining statistical databases. He also coordinates the pre-scouting of opponents, scouting reports and video exchange for all opponents.

McLaughlin was a four-year letterwinner with the Huskies from 2008 to 2012, and served as team captain as a senior during the 2011-12 campaign. During his time at Northeastern, he totaled 46 points (23 goals, 23 assists) in 120 career games played. He was also a member of the 2008-09 Huskies, who tied the program record for most wins en route to a national tournament berth. McLaughlin was as much a leader off the ice as he was on it. The Seaforth, Ontario native was a four-time Hockey East All-Academic Team honoree, and was named the Hockey East Top Scholar-Athlete as a senior. He graduated with a degree in psychology in 2012.

Following his career at Northeastern, McLaughlin went on to earn his Master's degree at Boston University, where he graduated in 2014 with a degree in sport psychology. While earning his advanced degree, McLaughlin volunteered as a graduate assistant at Northeastern. In that role, he monitored and assisted student-athletes in the development of quality practice habits, as well as analyzed and review game film. McLaughlin also served as an alternate support system for student-athletes with one-on-one player development meetings, and acted as a positive influence and a mentor for student-athletes which helped translate into a top-ten national ranking in 2013-14.

Bob Saunders is in his 22nd season on the Northeastern hockey staff in the role of administrative assistant for external affairs. He assists in the day-to-day operations of the program and does extensive technical work for the team.

He is in his second stint with Northeastern hockey, as he served as goaltenders coach from 1989 to 1993. Prior to his first run as a coach at Northeastern, Saunders was on the staff at Rensselaer for 11 years with head coach Mike Addesa, including RPI's NCAA championship season of 1984-85.

A 1961 NU graduate, Saunders earned a bachelor's degree in business administration. He has been a part of the New England ice hockey community nearly all his life, competing on several amateur teams in his playing days before entering the collegiate coaching ranks as an assistant at Holy Cross in 1973.

Saunders has coached at every level, including a stretch from 1994 to 1997 at UMass Boston. In 1998, Saunders was given the American Hockey Coaches Association's Terry Flanagan Award for lifetime achievement. The prestigious award honored him for his experience with so many different individual programs and for his contributions to the development of national coaching clinics. Saunders was given the Friends of NU Hockey Fernie Flaman Award for dedication and commitment to NU hockey in 2001.

Saunders lives in Randolph, Massachusetts, with his wife, Geraldine.

*22nd Season • Northeastern '61*

Rob Moura enters his sixth season at Northeastern, and his first full season as head equipment manager for men's ice hockey. Moura served as temporary equipment manager from January to March of 2015 and was hired full-time position in June.

Dan Boothby begins his 10th full season as strength and conditioning coach for the Northeastern University hockey team. Boothby oversees all strength, conditioning and nutrition for the team, and aids in team building and organization. Boothby was promoted to director of strength and conditioning at Northeastern in 2010.

Boothby has spent the last seven years working with Northeastern athletes, having joined the staff as an assistant strength and conditioning coach in November 2005. He has served as the director of player development for the Northeastern men's and women's hockey teams since July 2006.

Mike McKenney joined the Northeastern sports medicine staff in 2013 and is in his second season with the men's ice hockey team. Additionally, he works with men's soccer and is a preceptor for Boston University's athletic training education program.

Prior to arriving at Northeastern, he was a graduate assistant at North Dakota State University in Fargo, N.D. There, he completed his master's degree in advanced athletic training and worked with the men's baseball program. As part of his master's degree, he conducted research to investigate changes in plasma variables as a result of ingesting pickle juice during exercise. His research will be published in the Journal of Athletic Training.

Prior to North Dakota State University, McKenney was a physician extender at Front Range Orthopaedics in Colorado Springs, Colo. ## NORTHEASTERN'S BEANPOT CHAMPIONSHIPS

### 1980

The most memorable moment in the history of Husky sports occurs with a 5-4 overtime win over Boston College on Feb. 11 to give Northeastern its first Beanpot in the 27-year history of the tournament. Paul McDougall ties the game in the third period and Wayne "Beanpot" Turner nets the winner just 2:47 into overtime, giving the Huntington Hounds the 'Pot. NU goalie George Demetroulakos wins the Eberly Award.

### 1984

The Huskies roll to a 7-3 win over Harvard in round one and then capture their second Beanpot Championship by taming the Terriers of Boston University on Feb. 13. Thanks to the spectacular play of NU goalie Tim Marshall and goals by the brothers Averill (Bob and Jim), Jay Heinbuck, Ken Manchurek and Randy Bucyk, the Huskies notch a 5-2 title game victory. Marshall earns the Eberly Award and Most Valuable Player honors.

### 1985

After dispatching Boston College 4-2 on the first Monday, Northeastern wins its third Beanpot title via a spectacular 32-save, Eberly Award-winning performance by freshman goaltender Bruce Racine. Goals by Greg Neary, Kevin Heffernan, Rod Isbister and Mark Lori enable the Huskies to defeat Boston University 4-2 for their second straight championship. Racine takes home the Most Valuable Player Award, as well.

### 1988

NU wins its fourth Beanpot of the decade, the most of any school in the tournament and NU's third in five seasons. Bruce Racine turns in another spectacular goaltending performance and receives the Eberly Award for the second time. Racine, who earned his first collegiate shutout versus BC in the first round Feb. 1, turns away 25 shots in the championship game against BU. David O'Brien's two goals lead NU in its 6-3 victory.

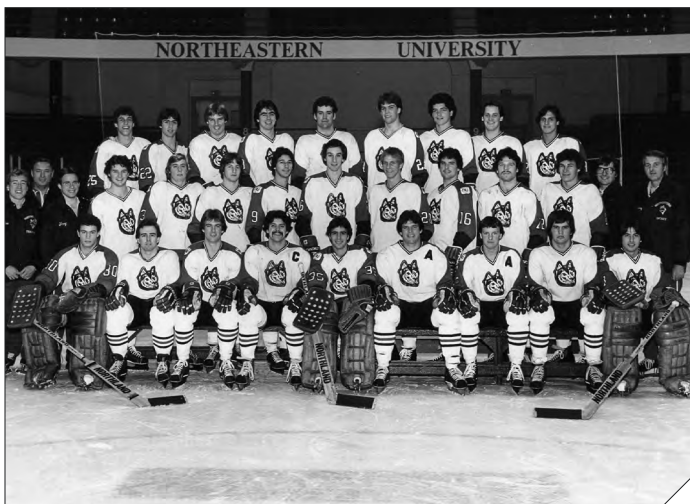

## NORTHEASTERN'S 1982 NCAA TOURNAMENT TEAM

In arguably the finest year in Husky hockey history, Northeastern earned a third-place trophy in the 1982 NCAA Tournament. Entry into the Big Dance came via ECAC regular season and tournament domination and the intrepid play of junior goaltender Mark Davidner, senior defenseman Jeff Hiltz, and senior forwards Paul McDougall and Gerry Cowie. The first round began against Bowling Green in a two game, total goal series. The two teams tied the in first game 2-2. The next evening, the Huskies would advance to the final four thanks to Bob Averill's overtime game winner and a 3-2 victory. The Huskies traveled to Providence to face the North Dakota Fighting Sioux on March 25 in the final four. North Dakota pounced on the Huskies early, opening up a four goal lead after two periods and eventually advancing with a 6-2 victory en route to the national championship. NU claimed the third-place trophy via a 10-4 win over New Hampshire in the prelude to the national championship game two days later. In the consolation game, Scot McKenney scored a hat trick and added an assist for a four-point game.

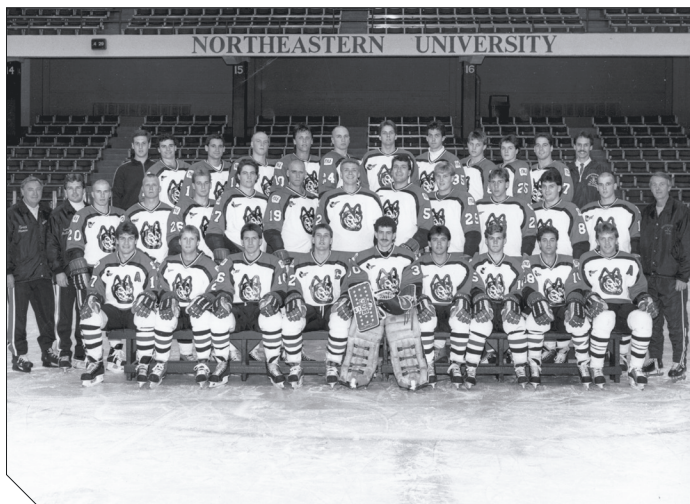

## NORTHEASTERN'S 1988 NCAA TOURNAMENT TEAM

The 1988 season ended prematurely for the Huntington Hounds, as the team was upstaged in the first round of NCAA action by underdogs-turned-spoilers, Merrimack College. After a season in which the Huskies won 20 games in Hockey East, won the Hockey East Tournament title and garnered their fourth Beanpot championship, coach Fern Flaman's team was eliminated by the Warriors in a two-game, total goals series. The Huskies won the first game 5-3 after erupting for four goals in the third period. The Huskies had five different goal scorers and Kevin Heffernan had three assists. The next night, the Huskies were in control with a 3-2 lead headed into the third period. However, in the final frame, Merrimack scored five unanswered goals, including two in the final three minutes for the series victory. The loss concluded the college careers of two-time All-American goalie Bruce Racine and Heffernan, NU's ninth all-time leading scorer.

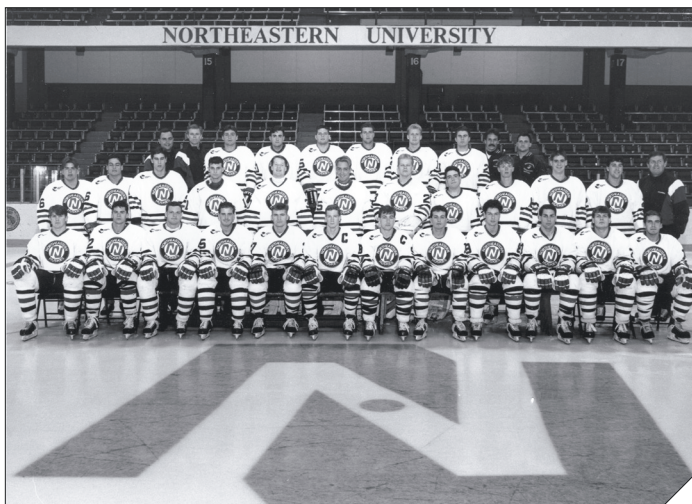

## NORTHEASTERN'S 1984 NCAA TOURNAMENT TEAM

The 1994 championship bracket held a plethora of familiar foes for Northeastern. Hockey East opponents UMass Lowell and New Hampshire as well as Beanpot rivals BU and Harvard joined the Huskies in the field of 12. Northeastern received an at-large bid to the tournament after advancing to the Hockey East semifinals following a quarterfinal sweep of Providence and a strong overall record of 19-12-7. NU's hopes were short-lived, however, as the Huskies were ousted in the first round by eventual-champion Lake Superior State. Led by goalie Blaine Lacher, the Lakers dispatched the Huskies, 6-5, in an exciting, high-scoring game which ended 15 seconds into sudden-death overtime. Replays showed that a Dan Lupo shot crossed the goal line in the third period, but the apparent go-ahead tally for NU was ruled a Lacher save. It was the second time in NU history that the Huskies had lost to the eventual national champion (North Dakota - 1982).

## NORTHEASTERN'S 2009 NCAA TOURNAMENT TEAM

In 2009, Northeastern returned to the NCAA Tournament after a 14-year hiatus in what had become one of the most successful seasons in Huskies history. Head coach Greg Cronin guided the Huskies to a 25-11-4 record and a second-place finish in Hockey East with an 18-6-3 mark. After dispatching Massachusetts in the Hockey East quarterfinals, the Huskies lost to UMass Lowell in overtime in the semis. Despite the loss, the Huskies earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament and were awarded the No. 2 seed in the Midwest Regional in Grand Rapids, Mich. The Huskies faced Cornell in the opening round and started strong with a 2-0 lead on goals by Louis Liotti and Steve Silva. But Cornell responded with three unanswered goals, including the game-winner with just 18 seconds remaining in regulation, to end Northeastern's Frozen Four hopes. It was the final game for Huskies All-American goalie Brad Thiessen, who went on to sign with the Pittsburgh Penguins of the NHL.

## CLASS OF 2015: BILL COTTER

Bill Cotter, class of 1973, was one of six former Northeastern student-athletes to be inducted into the Varsity Club Hall of Fame for 2015.

Cotter, a native of Belmont, Massachusetts, was a three-year letterwinner with the Northeastern men's ice hockey team. His hockey career at Northeastern was highlighted by the 1970-71 season in which he finished fourth on the team in scoring. Cotter tallied five goals and 13 assists in 29 games for the Huskies, playing on a line with Les Chaisson and Paul Scherer.

In addition to his on-ice contributions to Northeastern, Cotter has been an active member in the Northeastern community since his graduation. In 1999, he received the Friends of NU Hockey Fernie C. Flaman award for commitment to Northeastern hockey. He was also recognized as one of Hockey East's "20 Special Friends" for his support of Northeastern hockey.

Despite graduating more than 40 years ago, Cotter's presence at Northeastern is still felt across the entire university. He currently serves as a trustee and is involved with the Torch Scholar's program, a program that provides scholarship money to students who have overcome adversity to attend Northeastern.

Away from Northeastern, Cotter is the Senior Vice President of Investments at Union Bank of Switzerland (UBS). He also has close connections with the Dana Farber Cancer Institute, The Hole in the Wall Gang and the Pine Street Inn charities.

Cotter joins former Northeastern football player Mike Genetti (Class of '85), rower John Maslowski ('74), baseball pitcher Adam Ottavino ('08), runner Tramaine Shaw ('09), and volleyball star Kristen Ursillo ('04) as the inductees for 2015.

Established in 1974, the Varsity Club Hall of Fame reaches 245 members with the induction of the class of 2015. The Hall of Fame honors former student-athletes who have made notable contributions to their teams and to the school as a whole both during and after their careers as Huskies.

## COACHES IN THE HALL OF FAME

Of the 10 head coaches to have guided the Northeastern hockey program, four have been inducted into the Hall of Fame. With the exception of one season (1942-43), the four coaches guided Northeastern hockey from 1936 through 1991.

Herb Gallagher (NU '35) coached the Huskies for 15 seasons, beginning in 1936. After a hiatus from 1942-46, Gallagher returned to lead the hockey program until 1955 when he became the school's Athletics Director.

Jim Bell (NU '54) took the reigns from Gallagher and coached the Huskies for the next 15 seasons, receiving the Shaeffer Pen Award for outstanding contribution to college hockey in 1970.

Following Bell was Fernie Flaman, who is Northeastern hockey's all-time winningest coach with 255 victories over his 19 seasons. He coached NU to four Beanpots, two NCAA Tournament appearances and one Hockey East title.

In 1970, Don McKenney joined the hockey program as an assistant to the newly hired Flaman and served as his right-hand man for 19 years. With Flaman's retirement in 1989, the Huskies quickly turned to McKenney as the team's new leader. After serving as head coach for the next two seasons (1989-91), McKenney retired with 21 years of devotion to the University.

## GEORGE J. AND HOPE M. MATTHEWS ARENA



Home to Northeastern men's and women's ice hockey and men's basketball, Matthews Arena is the world's oldest multi-purpose athletic building and houses the world's oldest artificial ice sheet.
