JUST THE FACTS

- This is the 99th season of Northeastern men's basketball. Northeastern has an all-time record of 1,215-1,116 (.521) in 2,331 games
- The Huskies are 390-257 (.603) all-time in conference play including a 132-87 (.603) record since joining the CAA in the 2005-06 season
- · After last season's regular season championship, the Huskies have amassed 13 regular season conference championships and eight tournament titles including a 2015 title which sent the Huskies to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 24 years

THE OPPONENT

- · The two teams have met 72 times in year's past with the Huskies leading the series 44-28
- · Northeastern has won three-straight meetings against the Catamounts, and has come away with two-straight wins in Burlington. Vermont is 7-3 on the year heading into Sunday's contest with the Huskies
- · The Catamounts are currently on a four-game winning streak heading into the game with the Huskies with victories coming at George Washington, at Towson, at George Mason and home against Harvard last time out

SQUAD SQUAD SQUAD

- · Northeastern has been playing one of the toughest schedules in the nation, without their CAA Defensive Player of the Year Shawn Occeus, who has been out the first nine games with an ankle injury, and minus All-CAA First Team honoree Vasa Pusica, who has missed the last four games with a wrist injury (more on page 3)
- In the absense of Pusica, Donnell Gresham has stepped right up into his spot and paced the Huskies for the last five games (more on page 3)
- · Jordan Roland (George Washington) who sat out last season as a transfer, has made an immediate impact with the Huskies, especially with his 3-point shooting (more on pages 3&4)
- · The Huskies are once again guided by 2018 CAA Coach of the Year Bill Coen who enters his 13th season at the helm
- · Against Eastern Michigan, Coen picked up his 205th career victory, moving him into second-all time on the Northeaster career wins list (more on page 3)
- · Last season, during the CAA Tournament, Northeastern head coach Bill Coen picked up his 200th career win, in his 12th season with the Huskies, and will look to build upon that total this season (206)

DID YOU KNOW?

- In 405-straight games, dating back to a Jan. 28, 2006 contest at UNCW, Northeastern has had at least one player register double-digit scoring
- In addition to that streak, Northeastern has also notched at least one 3-point field goal in 162-straight games dating back to the 2013-14 season
- The last time the Huskies went without a trey was in an 0-for-11 effort against Fairfield on Dec. 15, 2013 (more on page 4)

THIS SEASON

- · Vermont is once again led by Anthony Lamb who is averaging 20.6 ppg as well as 7.1 rpg
- · Robin Duncan has tallied a team-high 27 assists in addition to 4.3 ppg while Ernie Duncan has added 26 assists and 16.1 ppg this season

ALL-TIME SERIES

- The two teams have met 72 times in year's past with the Huskies leading the series 44-28
- · Northeastern has won three-straight meetings against the Catamounts, and has come away with two-straight wins in Burlington
- · Northeastern has also now won four of the last five meetings between the two teams
- · Northeastern and Vermont will meet for the first time in four-straight seasons since they were both a part of the America East conference where they met for 35 straight seasons from 70-71 until 04-05

RETURNING TO OUR ROOTS

- · Northeastern takes on a pair of America East conference opponents this season

LAST TIME OUT VS. VERMONT

- · In a game that came down to the final minutes. Northeastern held off Vermont for a 71-67 victory to earn their fourth-straight win and improve to 5-0 at Matthews Arena last year
- · The win also marked the third-straight for the Huskies over Vermont
- · Vermont managed to make it a one-point game with just over two minutes to go, but Shawn Occeus drilled a three, on the ensuing possession, to give the Huskies a four-point lead with 1:45 left
- · Lamb cut the lead to two with a pair of free throws and after a missed layup on each end of the court, Lamb fouled Vasa Pusica with 17 seconds to go and Pusica nailed both free throws to keep the game out of reach
- The Huskies were led by Donnell Gresham who finished with 17 points, five rebounds, three assists and three steals on the night while Occeus added a season-high 16 points as well as three steals, two assists and a lot of defensive energy on the day
- Pusica finished with 12 points, 10 of which came in the second half, as well as three assists
- · The majority of Vermont's offense came at the hands of Anthony Lamb, with Trae Bell-Haynes out for the game · Lamb finished with 32 points and was a perfect 15-for-
- 15 from the free throw line on the day helping to keep UVM in the game down the stretch

LAST WEEK FOR THE HUSKIES

- · Northeastern started the week off with a Tuesday night contest at Syracuse, their second meeting with an ACC program this season
- The Huskies were neck and neck with the Orange until the final four minutes of the first half, when Syracuse used a 9-0 run to end the half, holding the Huskies scoreless for the final four minutes, to take a lead Northeastern wouldn't be able to overcome
- · The second half wasn't very friendly for the Huskies, as the team shot just 32.1 percent from the field and 12.5 percent from deep en route to a 72-49 loss to the
- Tomas Murphy led the way for the Huskies with 17 points and eight rebounds on the night, while Donnell Gresham added 10 points and three assists
- · Syracuse's leading scorer Tyus Battle was held to just one basket while Oshae Brissett led the way with 21 points and 14 rebounds for the Orange
- · Northeastern bounced back on Saturday afternoon with a 92-83 victory over Oakland
- · Led by Gresham's career-high 26 points (as well as game-high seven rebounds and three assists), the Huskies shot a blistering 60.4 percent from the field en route to the victory
- Jordan Roland added another 20-point effort for Northeastern while Anthony Green finished with a career-high tying 16 points and Bolden Brace finished with six points, five rebounds, four assists and two steals

STEADY IS AS STEADY DOES

- · One of the Huskies most consistant players, across the board, is Donnell Gresham, who has set up as a shooting guard, and as of late, taken over point guard duties with Vasa Pusica missing time due to a wrist injury
- · Whenever the Huskies need a big shot, Gresham has stepped up, including a dagger of a three to seal the game against Harvard down the stretch
- · Against Syracuse he took deep three after deep three in the Carrier Dome and currently boasts a .436 3FG %
- · The last time out, Gresham paced the Huskies against Oakland putting up a career-high 26 points while pulling down a game-high seven rebounds and dishing out three assists
- This season Gresham is averaging 12.4 ppg, 4.9 rpg, 4.5 apg, and has made 18 steals while shooting .450 from the field
- · Since the absense of Pusica, Gresham has only stepped his game up in the last five games tallying 16.8 ppg, 4.6 rpg, 5.0 apg, and making 7 of his 18 steals while shooting .522 from the field and .484 from deep

SECOND ALL-TIME

- · With a win over Eastern Michigan, Bill Coen moved into second place all-time on the Northeastern wins list and now has 206 in his 13 seasons at the helm
- · Back on March 4, 2018 in the CAA Tournament, Coen, in his 12th season with the program, picked up his 200th career victory
- · Coen currently boasts a 206-191 career record with 135 of those wins coming during conference action
- Coen is just the third-ever Northeastern men's basketball head coach to hit the 200-win mark
- 1. Jim Calhoun 250-137 1972-86 (14 seasons) 2. Bill Coen 206-191 2006-pres. (13 seasons) 3. Dick Dukeshire 204-100 1958-71 (13 seasons)
- With his 123 career conference victories. Coen is the Huskies' winningest coach in conference action
- · In addition, Coen is just one of three Northeastern head coaches to have coached at least 13 seasons with the Huskies
- · Jim Calhoun leads the way with 14 seasons (1972-86) under his belt before he moved on to UConn while Dick Dukeshire coached 13 seasons from 1958-71

FROM DEEP

- · In the last few seasons, Northeastern has continued to elevate the team record for 3-point field goals made year after year, this year is no different
- The Huskies are doing so efficiently in 2018-19 shooting .394 from the field as a squad, a mark that ranks third the conference and 28th in the country
- Northeastern had a rare off day against Syracuse, shooting just 21.4 percent from deep while going 6-of-28 from the field
- · Northeastern is led by Jordan Roland in the trey department and the redshirt junior leads the way with a .457 3FG shooting percentage (32-of-70), second in the conference and 42nd nationally

FROM THE CHARITY STRIPE

- As a team this season, the Huskies have accumulated a .772 free throw percentage, a mark that ranks second in the conference and 18th in the nation
- Earlier this season, prior to the game at Davidson (Nov. 24), the Huskies led the conference and the nation with a .846 shooting percentage from the charity stripe
- · Jordan Roland leads the way for the Huskies with a .960 free throw percentage (24-of-25) which would rank fourth in the country, however his 2.4 makes per game mark is JUST shy of the 2.5 mpg standard set by the NCAA

THIRTY-FUN!

- · During the season opener against Boston University Vasa Pusica notched a career-high tying 31 points, which extended a few Husky records
- · Since then, in the following game, Jordan Roland finished with a 35-point effort in the Huskies' second game of the year at Harvard (Nov. 9)

DOUBLE DOUBLE-DOUBLES

- · Against Bucknell, in a dominant performance against one of the Patriot League favorites, five Huskies finished with double-digit scoring, while a pair of Huskies finished with double-doubles
- · The double double-double game marked the first time Northeastern had at least two double-doubles in the same game since the trio of Anthony Green (14p, 12r), Vasa Pusica (16p, 10a) and Bolden Brace (14p, 10r) did so against Hofstra last year (Jan. 25, 2018)

THE COEN FILES

IUSKIES IN CAA PLAY

- · 13 years ago, Bill Coen took the reins of the Northeastern men's basketball program
- · In that time, Northeastern has accomplished the best win percentage amongst current CAA teams in conference and CAA tournament play
- Coen has helped the Huskies to 123 conference wins during the regular season including a 14-4 record last season that helped the Huskies to a share of the 2018 Regular Season Title
- In the CAA tournament, the Huskies are 12-9, winning the tournament title in 2014-15 and advancing to the NCAA tournament for the first time since the 1991 season
- Entering the 2016-17 season, Charleston was ranked last in the CAA in win percentage (32.14) but improved into second last year with their 14-4 conference season and trio of wins in the conference tournament
- · After going 6-12 in conference action last year, Elon dropped to the bottom of the league in win pct. in their four years since joining the CAA

THE COEN FILE

HEAD COACH

Reigning CAA Coach of the Year Bill Coen enters his 13th season as head coach of the Northeastern basketball program in 2018-19.

Coen is widely regarded for his ability to evaluate and develop talented players. In his 12 seasons at Northeastern, NU players have earned 30 All-CAA honors, including nine First Team and seven All-Rookie selections. Eighteen of Coen's former players have earned professional contracts and eight Huskies remain active in professional basketball. Entering the 2018-19 season, Coen had amassed 201 career wins in 12 seasons at Northeastern and ranked fourth on the CAA's list of all-time winningest coaches with 135 wins in conference regular season and tournament play. He is one of just two current CAA coaches to have cracked the top 10.

Coen's teams have proven that they are contenders in the CAA. The Huskies have finished .500 or better in nine of Coen's 12 seasons at the helm. Northeastern also has appeared in the CAA Tournament quarterfinals in all 12 seasons under Coen, advanced to the semifinals six times, and to the title game in 2012-13, winning it all in 2014-15 and returning to the championship in 2017-18. Since Coen took the reins of the Northeastern men's basketball program 12 seasons ago, Northeastern has accomplished the best win percentage amongst current CAA teams in conference and CAA tournament play.

In 2017-18, Coen and the Huskies made their return to the CAA title game, falling just short of the NCAA Tournament. The Huskies won their fourth CAA Regular Season title in the last six seasons in thrilling fashion in the final day of the regular season. For his efforts Coen was named CAA Coach of the Year, his first career honor while also earning NABC All-District Coach of the Year for the second time. Coen helped coach Vasa Pusica to Lou Henson All-America, All-CAA First team, NABC First Team All-Region and USBWA All-District honors, the second-straight Husky to earn all four honors. In addition, Shawn Occeus was named the CAA Defensive Player of the Year, Bolden Brace was tabbed CAA Sixth Man of the Year and Tomas Murphy earned All-Rookie accolades. The team-first driven Huskies finished third in the country in 3-pt field goal defense.






