- · The Huskies open the season with a home-andhome with UMass after canceling Wednesday night's game against UMass Lowell due to COVID-19 protocols within the UMass Lowell program
- The Huskies are riding a six-game winning streak in road openers and are 9-5 in the Bill Coen era
- · Coach Coen's 241 wins at Northeastern is nine shy of the all-time record of 250, set by Jim Calhoun from 1972-86; He moved into second all-time in CAA history with 163 wins in league regular season and postseason play
- The Huskies became the fifth program in CAA history to make three consecutive CAA Championship Game appearances (2018, '19, '20), earning their ninth NCAA tournament bid in 2019
- · Sophomore point guard Tyson Walker returns after becoming the sixth freshman in program history to surpass 100 assists; Walker was named to the preseason All-CAA second team, voted on by the league head coaches and media
- · Last season's CAA scoring leader Jordan Roland finished with 722 points in 2019-20, second-best in school history behind the late great Reggie Lewis' 748 (1984-85), and finished seventh in the country; Roland was named New England Player of the Year and All-CAA for the second straight season
- The Huskies lost nearly 70 percent of their scoring from last year, including *Roland* (21.9 ppg), *Bolden* Brace (10.5 ppg), Tomas Murphy (9.3 ppg), Max Boursiquot (9.0 ppg), Guilien Smith (3.3 ppg) and Myles Franklin (3.0 ppg)
- The last time Northeastern defeated UMass inside the Mullins Center, former NBA champion and Dallas Mavericks' player JJ Barea led the Huskies with a game-high 24 points in an 84-68 victory on Dec. 1, 2004

Max Boursiquot posted a team-best 15 points, nine rebounds and five assists, while Bolden Brace finished with 13 points and four assists as Northeastern (17-16) dropped a hard-fought Hercules Tires Men's Basketball Championship Game to Hofstra (26-8), 70-61. The Huskies were outscored 16-1 at the free-throw line and the Pride added 14 second-chance points.

Shaquille Walters filled the stat sheet with 11 points, six rebounds, three assists and three steals. Jordan Roland added 11 points for the Huskies and finished with 722 points, No. 2 all-time in single-season history, surpassing the late great Reggie Lewis' 714 points in the 1985-86 season and behind Lewis' 1984-85 season where he scored 748 points.

The game featured eight lead changes and six ties. The Huskies trailed 52-50 with 5:40 remaining in the game when Boursiquot and Roland were both dinged for their fourth fouls. The Pride would take advantage with an 8-2 run to seize control of the game. Hofstra scored 20 points off NU's 10 turnovers and made 16-of-17 foul shots for an impressive 94 percent.

The Huskies became just the fifth program in CAA history to reach three consecutive CAA title games. Northeastern was just the third No. 6 seed to reach the final, and first since George Mason in 2007.

- The Huskies made their ninth ever appearance in the NCAA tournament in 2019, posting a record of 3-9 in the Big Dance
- Head Coach Bill Coen made his ninth appearance in the Big Dance and second as a head coach last season
- Coen previously helped Rhode Island make two tournament appearances as an assistant coach (1993, 1997), while helping Boston College to five tournaments as an assistant/associate head coach (2001, 2002, 2004, 2005, 2006)



THE COEN FILE

Bill Coen enters his 15th season as head coach of the Northeastern basketball program in 2019-20. He is currently second in school history with 241 wins, trailing Jim Calhoun's 250 from 1972-86. Coen advanced into second all-time in CAA history with 163 CAA wins (league+postseason) trailing only former George Mason, and current Miami (FL) coach, Jim Larranaga (185, 1998-2011).

Coen is widely regarded for his ability to evaluate and develop talented players. In his 13 seasons at Northeastern, NU players have earned 33 All-CAA honors, including 10 first-team accolades and eight All-Rookie selections. A total of 25 of Coen's former players have earned professional contracts and 12 Huskies remain active in professional basketball.

Coen's teams have remained the most consistent in the CAA. The Huskies have finished .500 or better in 11 of Coen's 14 seasons at the helm, including back-to-back 14-win seasons in 2017-18 and 2018-19. Northeastern has appeared in the CAA tournament quarterfinals in all 14 seasons under Coen, advanced to the semifinals eight times, and to the title game five times, including three straight appearances (2018-20) and two Championship titles (2015, '19). Since Coen took the reins of the Northeastern men's basketball program 14 seasons ago, Northeastern has accomplished the best win percentage among current CAA teams in conference and CAA tournament play.

The Huskies became the fifth program in CAA history to make three straight CAA title game appearances in 2019-20, falling just short to top-seeded Hofstra, 70-61, in Washington, D.C. Northeastern is a CAA-best 11-4 in the league tournament since 2015, and have a pair of NCAA tournament appearances in 2015 and '19.

Northeastern has won a league-best 146 league games during Coen's leadership, and won a CAA-best three regular-season titles since joining the league in 2005-06 (2012-13, 2014-15, 2017-18). The Huskies have appeared in the NCAA postseason in two straight seasons with an NIT appearance in 2018 and NCAA tournament appearance in 2019. The NCAA canceled all winter and spring championships in 2020, immediately following the 2020 CAA Championship.
