OPENING TIP

• The Huskies are riding a four-game winning streak inside Cabot Center and have won 11 of their last 12 games on Solomon Court

• Northeastern is 12-2 in home openers in the **Bill Coen** era

• The 94 points allowed by the Huskies in the opener was the most points allowed in regulation in 108 games, dating back to the 2016-17 season (William & Mary, 94 / 2-2-17)

• Coach **Coen's** 241 wins at Northeastern is nine shy of the all-time record of 250, set by Jim Calhoun from 1972-86; He moved into second all-time in CAA history with 163 wins in league regular season and postseason play

• The Huskies became the fifth program in CAA history to make three consecutive CAA Championship Game appearances (2018, '19, '20), earning their ninth NCAA tournament bid in 2019

• Sophomore point guard **Tyson Walker** scored a team-best 29 points in the opener at UMass; He is a preseason All-CAA second team selection

• Last season's CAA scoring leader **Jordan Roland** finished with 722 points in 2019-20, second-best in school history behind the late great Reggie Lewis' 748 (1984-85), and finished seventh in the country; Roland was named *New England Player of the Year* and All-CAA for the second straight season

• The Huskies lost nearly 70 percent of their scoring from last year, including **Roland** (21.9 ppg), **Bolden Brace** (10.5 ppg), **Tomas Murphy** (9.3 ppg), **Max Boursiquot** (9.0 ppg), **Guilien Smith** (3.3 ppg) and **Myles Franklin** (3.0 ppg)

• The last time Northeastern defeated UMass was during the 2004-05 season inside the Mullins Center, former NBA champion and Dallas Mavericks' player **JJ Barea** led the Huskies with a game-high 24 points in an 84-68 victory on Dec. 1, 2004

GAME 1 | Mullins Center | Amherst, Mass.

Tyson Walker scored a team-high 29 points on a career-best 13-of-14 from the free-throw line, while **Jahmyl Telfort** finished with 13 points to lead Northeastern (0-1) in a 94-79 defeat to Massachusetts (1-0) on Friday at the Mullins Center. The Huskies committed 18 turnovers that led to 24 points for UMass.

Jason Strong added 11 points for the Huskies. Chris Doherty tallied eight points and five rebounds in his Northeastern debut.

The Minutemen used a 13-0 run midway through the first half to take their largest lead of the game and led by 11 at the half, 47-36. The Huskies weren't able to get much closer and trailed by as many as 19 points in the second half.

UMass' Tre Mitchell led all scorers with 31 points and added 11 rebounds for a double-double. Javohn Garcia posted 23 points and Carl Pierre scored 14 for the Minutemen. TJ Weeks tallied 11 points off the bench and UMass shot 50 percent from behind the arc in the final 20 minutes (6-for-12).

THE COEN FILE

Bill Coen enters his 15th season as head coach of the Northeastern basketball program in 2019-20. He is currently second in school history with 241 wins, trailing Jim Calhoun's 250 from 1972-86. Coen advanced into second all-time in CAA history with 163 CAA wins (league+postseason) trailing only former George Mason, and current Miami (FL) coach, Jim Larranaga (185, 1998-2011).

Coen is widely regarded for his ability to evaluate and develop talented players. In his 13 seasons at Northeastern, NU players have earned 33 All-CAA honors, including 10 first-team accolades and eight All-Rookie selections. A total of 25 of Coen's former players have earned professional contracts and 12 Huskies remain active in professional basketball.

Coen's teams have remained the most consistent in the CAA. The Huskies have finished .500 or better in 11 of Coen's 14 seasons at the helm, including back-to-back 14-win seasons in 2017-18 and 2018-19. Northeastern has appeared in the CAA tournament quarterfinals in all 14 seasons under Coen, advanced to the semifinals eight times, and to the title game five times, including three straight appearances (2018-20) and two Championship titles (2015, '19). Since Coen took the reins of the Northeastern men's basketball program 14 seasons ago, Northeastern has accomplished the best win percentage among current CAA teams in conference and CAA tournament play.

The Huskies became the fifth program in CAA history to make three straight CAA title game appearances in 2019-20, falling just short to top-seeded Hofstra, 70-61, in Washington, D.C. Northeastern is a CAA-best 11-4 in the league tournament since 2015, and have a pair of NCAA tournament appearances in 2015 and '19.

Northeastern has won a league-best 146 league games during Coen's leadership, and won a CAA-best three regular-season titles since joining the league in 2005-06 (2012-13, 2014-15, 2017-18). The Huskies have appeared in the NCAA postseason in two straight seasons with an NIT appearance in 2018 and NCAA tournament appearance in 2019. The NCAA canceled all winter and spring championships in 2020, immediately following the 2020 CAA Championship.
