OPENING TIP

• The Huskies are 3-7 over their last 10 games against Power-5 opponents, including a nationally-ranked win over then-No. 15 Miami, 78-77, in Coral Gables (11/27/15); Northeastern is 2-8 against ACC opponents over the last 14-plus seasons

• Northeastern has seven players born outside the United States, third-most in the country behind Maine's 11 and Cal Baptist's eight

• The Huskies are one of the youngest teams in the country with just three upper classmen and no seniors; This is the first time in head coach **Bill Coen's** 15 years that he has coached a team without a senior

• Coach **Coen's** 242 wins at Northeastern is eight shy of the all-time record of 250, set by Jim Calhoun from 1972-86; He moved into second all-time in CAA history with 163 wins in league regular season and postseason play

• The Huskies became the fifth program in CAA history to make three consecutive CAA Championship Game appearances (2018, '19, '20), earning their ninth NCAA tournament bid in 2019

• Sophomore point guard **Tyson Walker** was named CAA Player of the Week after tallying a pair of 20-point games in the first two games and 5.0 assists per game; Freshman **Jahmyl Telfort** earned CAA Rookie of the Week after consecutive double-figure scoring games

• Last season's CAA scoring leader **Jordan Roland** finished with 722 points in 2019-20, second-best in school history behind the late great Reggie Lewis' 748 (1984-85), and finished seventh in the country; Roland was named *New England Player of the Year* and All-CAA for the second straight season

• The Huskies lost nearly 70 percent of their scoring from last year, including **Roland** (21.9 ppg), **Bolden Brace** (10.5 ppg), **Tomas Murphy** (9.3 ppg), **Max Boursiquot** (9.0 ppg), **Guillen Smith** (3.3 ppg) and **Myles Franklin** (3.0 ppg)

NORTHEASTERN 78, UMass 75

GAME 2 | Cabot Center | Boston

Tyson Walker scored 20 points and **Jason Strong** finished with 16 points to lead Northeastern (1-1) to a 78-75 win over UMass (1-1) on Sunday inside the Cabot Center. The Huskies have won five straight games on Solomon Court.

Jahmyl Telfort tallied 11 points to reach double figures for the second straight game, while **Shaquille Walters** and **Greg Eboigbodin** reached double figures with 12 and 10 points, respectively. Walters led the Huskies on the glass with nine boards.

The Huskies used a 16-5 run in the second half to take a 14-point lead and held off a late-charging UMass team. The win snaps a six-game losing streak against the Minutemen and gave the Huskies a series split this season. NU is 13-2 in home openers under head coach **Bill Coen**.

After scoring 31 points in the opener, the Huskies held Tre Mitchell to just 10 points on 3-of-10 shooting. Javohn Garcia led UMass with 18 points.

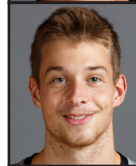

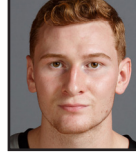

- Northeastern has been one of the top teams in the country from the free-throw line over the last two seasons (2018-20); The Huskies ranked No. 3 in 2019-20 (.794) and No. 35 in 2018-19 (.751)

THE COEN FILE

Bill Coen enters his 15th season as head coach of the Northeastern basketball program in 2019-20. He is currently second in school history with 242 wins, trailing Jim Calhoun's 250 from 1972-86. Coen advanced into second all-time in CAA history with 163 CAA wins (league+postseason) trailing only former George Mason, and current Miami (FL) coach, Jim Larranaga (183, 1998-2011).

Coen is widely regarded for his ability to evaluate and develop talented players. In his 13 seasons at Northeastern, NU players have earned 33 All-CAA honors, including 10 first-team accolades and eight All-Rookie selections. A total of 25 of Coen's former players have earned professional contracts and 12 Huskies remain active in professional basketball.

Coen's teams have remained the most consistent in the CAA. The Huskies have finished .500 or better in 11 of Coen's 14 seasons at the helm, including back-to-back 14-win seasons in 2017-18 and 2018-19. Northeastern has appeared in the CAA tournament quarterfinals in all 14 seasons under Coen, advanced to the semifinals eight times, and to the title game five times, including three straight appearances (2018-20) and two Championship titles (2015, '19). Since Coen took the reins of the Northeastern men's basketball program 14 seasons ago, Northeastern has accomplished the best win percentage among current CAA teams in conference and CAA tournament play.

The Huskies became the fifth program in CAA history to make three straight CAA title game appearances in 2019-20, falling just short to top-seeded Hofstra, 70-61, in Washington, D.C. Northeastern is a CAA-best 11-4 in the league tournament since 2015, and have a pair of NCAA tournament appearances in 2015 and '19.

Northeastern has won a league-best 146 league games during Coen's leadership, and won a CAA-best three regular-season titles since joining the league in 2005-06 (2012-13, 2014-15, 2017-18). The Huskies have appeared in the NCAA postseason in two straight seasons with an NIT appearance in 2018 and NCAA tournament appearance in 2019. The NCAA canceled all winter and spring championships in 2020, immediately following the 2020 CAA Championship.

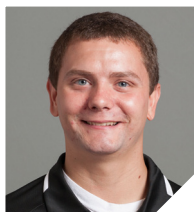
