West Virginia Looks For Program Win Number 1,800 Against Northeastern

- The Mountaineers own a 1,799-1,112 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 22nd in wins among all Division I schools.
- Following the Northeastern game, WVU will return to conference play this weekend at Oklahoma, then at Oklahoma State. WVU will play three of its next four conference games on the road after playing at Kansas on Dec. 22.
- For the fourth consecutive year, Bob Huggins has been named as a nominee for the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame.
- With the win at lowa State on March 3, 2020, Bob Huggins moved past Dean Smith for sixth place on the NCAA all-time Division I winningest coaches list. Huggins' record now stands at 888-374 in his 39th season as a head coach. He needs two more wins to tie Roy Williams for fifth place all-time and 14 more to tie Bob Knight (902) for fourth place all-time.
- Huggins is the fourth-winningest active Division I coach behind Mike Krzyzewski, Jim Boeheim and Roy Williams.
- West Virginia has won 74 of its last 78 games at home in the month of December.
- West Virginia is 114-8 at home against nonconference teams in the last 19 years, and has won 95 of its last 101.
- West Virginia is 139-35 in nonconference regular season games under Bob Huggins, including a 79-6 mark at home.
- West Virginia is 170-41 against nonconference teams in regular season games in the last 18 seasons.
- West Virginia is 161-44 at the WVU Coliseum under Bob Huggins, including an 81-37 mark in league games.
- WVU is 570-164 (.778) all-time at the WVU Coliseum and 211-50 at the WVU Coliseum in the last 17 seasons.
- WVU is 61-49 in the Big 12 regular season in the last seven seasons, including a 50-42 mark in the last six seasons.
- West Virginia is 130-106 under Bob Huggins in conference regular season games (Big 12 and Big East).
- Bob Huggins is 86-76 in Big 12 Conference games. He is 76-70 at WVU, and was 10-6 at Kansas State in 2006-07.
- The Mountaineers have won 95 of their last 136 conference games at the WVU Coliseum.
- In the latest Big 12 stats, Culver leads the league in rebounding (10.6), offensive rebounds (3.44), defensive rebounds (7.11) and double-doubles (5). Taz Sherman leads in free throw percentage (91.3). Miles McBride is fourth in assist/turnover ratio (2.77) and Oscar Tshiebwe is tied with Culver for the lead in offensive rebounds (3.44).
- Culver (3.44) and Tshiebwe (3.44) are tied for first in offensive rebounds in the Big 12.
- Culver ranks second in the country with five double-doubles on the season.
- Culver was named MVP of the Crossover Classic, while Miles McBride was named to the All-Tournament Team.
- Culver was named Big 12 Player of the Week (Nov. 30), the first WVU player since Jaysean Paige (2016) to win the award.
- Culver (6.0) and Tshiebwe (5.3) are drawing a combined 11.3 fouls per 40 minutes per game.
- This year, WVU is rebounding 39.3% of its missed shots, ranking eighth nationally. The national average is 28.3 percent.
- Tshiebwe is ninth in the country in offensive rebound percentage, rebounding 18.0% of WVU's missed shots.
- Culver is 43rd in the country in defensive rebounding percentage, rebounding 27.6% of opponent's missed shots.
- Tshiebwe was named to the Presason All-Big 12 Team, while Culver was tabbed All-Big 12 Honorable Mention.
- Culver was named to the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Preseason Watch List, given to the nation's top center.
- Tshiebwe was named to the Karl Malone Award Preseason Watch List, given to the nation's top power forward.
- Tshiebwe earned a spot on the Naismith Trophy, the NABC and Wooden Award Preseason Watch Lists.
- Last season. Gabe Osabuohien led WVU with 148 deflections and 23 charges taken.
- This season, McBride leads WVU with 50 deflections followed by Osabuohien with 48 and Culver with 33. WVU's leaders in +/- last season: Miles McBride (+227), Derek Culver (+151) and Oscar Tshiebwe (+140).
- WVU's leaders in +/- this season: Miles McBride (+85), Sean McNeil (+75) and Derek Culver (+47).
- West Virginia is 148-72 (.667) since the start of the 2014-15 season.
- WVU is 217-62 in its last 279 games against unranked teams, including winners of 116 of its last 135 at home.
- The Mountaineers have won 104 of their last 116 games when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- WVU has won 115 of its last 128 and 171 of its last 194 games when holding opponents to less than 69 points.
- WVU is 226-41 under Huggins when holding opponents to 69 points or less.
- West Virginia has allowed its opponent to shoot 50 percent or better 81 times under Bob Huggins (461 games).
- West Virginia is 75-5 under Bob Huggins when shooting 50 percent or better from the field.
- West Virginia is 234-48 under Bob Huggins when leading at halftime.
- West Virginia is 241-29 under Bob Huggins when leading by 10 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 207-16 under Bob Huggins when posting a higher shooting percentage than its opponent.
- West Virginia has made at least one 3-point field goal in 709 consecutive games.
- The Mountaineers are 221-52 under Bob Huggins when scoring 70 or more points in a game.
- West Virginia is 223-64 under Bob Huggins when outrebounding its opponent.
- The Mountaineers hold an all-time record of 15-9 in games played on December 29.

Bob Huggins

- Huggins is WVU's 21st head basketball coach.
- Huggins is a Morgantown native and a 1977 graduate of West Virginia University.
- Huggins has won 888 games in his 39th season as a head coach
- Huggins ranks fourth in total victories among active Division I head coaches.
- Huggins ranks sixth among the NCAA's all-time winningest coaches.
- Huggins' teams have participated in postseason play in 33 of 38 seasons, including 24 NCAA Tournaments.
- His squads have won 20 or more games in all but eight of his 38 campaigns, including 30 or more twice.
- Huggins averages 23.7 victories a season.
- Huggins has made two NCAA Final Fours and four NCAA Elite Eight appearances.
- Huggins has been named national coach of the year six
- Huggins' teams have finished in the Top 10 final rankings nine times.
- Huggins has coached 13 All-Americans and 71 allconference selections.
- Huggins has coached 19 NBA draft picks, including six first round selections and four lottery picks.
- Huggins has won 13 conference regular season titles.
- Huggins has won 10 conference tournament titles.
- Huggins has led West Virginia to nine NCAA Tournament

Scouting Northeastern

- Northeastern is 1-4 on the season following a 76-58 loss at Georgia on Tuesday.
- The Huskies have split games with UMass this season (78-75 win and a 94-79 loss). Northeastern has lost games at Syracuse (62-56) and at Old Dominion (66-62).
- Bill Coen is 242-217 in his 15th season as head coach at Northeastern.

Series Record

- This will be the second meeting between West Virginia and Northeastern.
- The previous meeting took place in Morgantown on Nov. 29, 2003. Current WVU assistant coach Ron Everhart led his Northeastern team to a 91-84 victory over John Beilein's Mountaineers at the Coliseum.
- West Virginia is 50-14 against current members of the Colonial Athletic Association: College of Charleston (I-O), Drexel (I-O), Elon (1-0), James Madison (8-3), Northeastern (0-1), Towson (2-1) and William & Mary (37-9).
- Bob Huggins has never faced Northeastern as a head coach.

WVU Basketball Tradition

- This is the 112th season and 118th year overall for West Virginia basketball, which began in 1903.
- The Mountaineers own a 1,799-1,112 all-time record in intercollegiate basketball competition, ranking the Mountaineers 22nd in wins among all Division I schools.
- WVU has earned 29 NCAA berths, 16 NIT trips and one CBI bid since 1941, and has finished in the Top 25 23 times, including an amazing nine straight years from 1955-63.
- Since 2005, WVU played in the CBI in 2019, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2018, 2017 & 2015, NIT First Round in 2014, NCAA Second Round in 2012, NCAA Third Round in 2011, the NCAA Final Four in 2010, made the NCAA Tournament in 2016 and 2009, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2008, won the NIT in 2007, reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2006 and NCAA Elite Eight in 2005.
- In 1958, the Mountaineers finished the regular season ranked No. 1 in both polls and in 1959, West Virginia, led by All-America guard Jerry West, lost in the NCAA finals to California.
- West Virginia has had 12 first team All-Americans, headlined by West, who went on to become one of basketball's all-time greats with the NBA's Los Angeles Lakers.
- Under Huggins, Jevon Carter was named to the John Wooden, Lute Olson and Senior CLASS All-America teams in 2018. Juwan Staten was named to the Lute Olson All-America team in 2015, Da'Sean Butler earned All-America first team honors in 2010 by John Wooden & Basketball Times and Kevin Jones earned All-America honors in 2012 by John Wooden.
- Besides West, some of basketball's biggest names have been affiliated with the Old Gold & Blue, including former Lakers coach and general manager Fred Schaus, former NBA President of Basketball Operations and NBA Hall of Famer Rod Thorn and former Utah Jazz broadcaster and NBA Hall of Famer "Hot Rod" Hundley.
- West Virginia has played in four different home venues: the ROTC Armory (1903-15), The Ark (1916-27), Stansbury Hall (1928-69) and the WVU Coliseum (1970-present). When the WVU Coliseum was dosed due to asbestos removal during the 1999-2000 season, WVU played home games in Charleston, Wheeling and Fairmont.

- With six nonconference wins, WVU has finished with a winning nonconference mark for the 29th consecutive season.
- West Virginia is 170-41 against nonconference teams in regular season games in the last 18 seasons.
- The last time WVU did not post a winning non-league record was 1990-91, when WVU went 4-4 outside of conference.
- WVU is 139-35 in nonconference games under Bob Huggins.
- WVU has finished with one loss during nonconference play in nine different seasons. They were: 1981-82 when West Virginia went 11-1 out of the Atlantic 10, 1957-58 when WVU lost only to Duke in going 11-1, 1996-97 when the Mountaineers were 7-1, losing the season opener at Minnesota, 2004-05 when WVU went 10-1 outside the Big East, 2006-07 when the Mountaineers went 12-1 with their only loss to Arkansas, 2009-10 when WVU was 11-1 with its only loss at Purdue, 2014-15 when the Mountaineers had a one point home loss to LSU, finishing 12-1, in 2016-17 when WVU finished 12-1 with a four-point loss to Temple in Brooklyn and in 2019-20 (12-1) with a two-point loss at St. John's.
- WVU has had one perfect nonconference regular season, 10-0, in 1997-98.

Academic Success

- Forty-six of the last 47 seniors on the WVU men's basketball team have graduated on time or early since 2004.
- In 2020, West Virginia had the most student-athletes (six) on the Academic All-Big 12 Men's Basketball Team.
- The Mountaineers also led the Big 12 in 2019 with six student-athletes on the team.
- Derek Culver, Emmitt Matthews and Jordan McCabe were named to the Academic All-Big 12 First Team in 2019-20.
- In 2017-18, Jevon Carter was named CoSIDA Academic All-American of the Year for men's basketball and first team Academic All-American.

No. 15 West Virginia got a career-high 23 points from Deuce McBride to outlast pesky South Dakota State 79-71 in its season-opening game in the Bad Boy Mowers Crossover Classic at the Sanford Pentagon in Sioux Falls, South Dakota.

McBride, a sophomore from Cincinnati, made 9-of-19 field goal attempts and all four of his free throw attempts.

Junior guard Sean McNeil overcame a 1-for-7 shooting start to finish with a career-high 16, ending the night making 5 out of his final 9 field goal attempts.

Taz Sherman contributed 14 points on 4-of-9 shooting coming off the bench

Derek Culver pulled down a game-high 14 rebounds, but West Virginia's advantage on the glass was only 41-39.

Oscar Tshiebwe got into early foul trouble and finished with just 7 points and three rebounds in 14 minutes of action.

"The way they play kind of led to a lot of long rebounds because everything is so much penetrate and pitch and shooting 3s," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said. "It was different kind of rebounding than what

Douglas Wilson led the Jackrabbits with 17 points and Noah Freidel added 16. SDSU was picked by many to win the Summit League.

"I think they're really good," Huggins said. "They are extremely well coached. They make shots. They really do a good job of handling the ball and creating shots for one another."

West Virginia (1-0) struggled out the outset to make open shots and trailed 19-14 following Wilson's three-point play. The Mountaineers used an 8-3 run to tie the game at 22, and eventually took a 25-24 lead on Sherman 3 from the right wing with 6:36 left in the first half.

McNeil's first three with 3:31 remaining gave the Mountaineers a four-point advantage and a McBride three-point play with 38 seconds left boosted the margin to seven, 37-30.

West Virginia's biggest lead of the game was 12, 52-40, with 14:37 remaining, but SDSU quickly whittled it to six. WVU's margin remained in the six-point range until a Wilson layup with 5:56 to go reduced it to four,

WVU's lead was four again with 1:50 left when Wilson converted another lavup and added a free throw after he was fouled by Gabe Osabuohien while driving to the basket.

Osabuohien answered a with a big baseline bucket and McNeil tacked on another field goal with 23 seconds left to push the margin back

West Virginia was just 8-of-32 from 3 and finished the game 30-of-77 overall for 39%. SDSU was 27-of-62 for 43.5% and outscored WVU 34-28 in the paint.

Recap

West Virginia's powerful inside duo of Derek Culver and Oscar Tshiebwe were simply too much for VCU in the second semifinal game of the Bad Boy Mowers Crossover Classic in the Sanford Pentagon in Sioux Falls, South Dakota.

Culver scored 23 points and grabbed 15 rebounds and Tshiebwe added 11 points and 16 boards to lead the 15th-ranked Mountaineers to a 78-66 victory over the Rams.

Against VCU, Culver was 8-of-14 from the floor and 7-for-9 from the free throw line for his 23 points - two shy of his career-high 25 scored against Rhode Island during his freshman season.

"We've been trying to get Derek to slow down and when he slows down like he did today, you can see how effective he can be," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said.

The story of the game was West Virginia's work on the offensive glass. The Mountaineers grabbed 23 offensive rebounds and turned that into 25 second-chance points.

WVU had an overall 52-35 advantage on the glass.

That offset the 21 Mountaineer turnovers the Rams managed to force off of their full-court pressure defense. VCU got 13 steals out of it resulting in 22 fast-break points.

WVU (2-0) shot a little better from the field than it did in its opening victory over South Dakota State, connecting on 41.3% of its field goal attempts, and a lot of that can be attributed to fewer 3-point attempts.

After jacking 32 3s in its season opener against SDSU, West Virginia attempted half that many, making six for 37.5%.

"I thought we did a better job offensively, although we turned it over 21 times compared to three last night," Huggins said. "We can't turn it over 21 times and continue to win. We've got to take better care of the

"That's the statistic that stands out," he added. "I thought we did a good job on the glass; Derek kept balls alive and scored close to kind of give us the lead before our perimeter guys kind of warmed up. When they started making shots we were able to stretch the lead and get a little bit more comfortable."

Back-to-back transition 3s by Taz Sherman and Sean McNeil in the second half broke open a six-point WVU lead.

McNeil contributed his second straight 16-point effort while Sherman came off the bench to score 9.

Deuce McBride added 12 but was tagged with four turnovers. Sherman and backup point guard Jordan McCabe also turned the ball over four times against VCU's full-court pressure.

The Rams got 13 points from guard Bones Hyland and 11 off the bench from Vince Williams.

VCU (1-1) shot just 35.9% from the floor and only 14.3% from 3-point range, the Rams connecting on only 3 of their 21 triples.

Tournament MVP Derek Culver scored 15 points in his head-to-head matchup with touted Western Kentucky center Charles Bassey, who also scored 15

Culver scored 45 points in the three tournament games and the Mountaineers needed all 15 in this game, especially down the stretch after the Hilltoppers took a 45-35 lead with 15:37 remaining on a Bassey dunk.

Culver immediately answered with a layup to key a 17-7 Mountaineer run to tie the game with 8:39 left on Deuce McBride's layup.

A defensive stop led to a Taz Sherman 3, and McBride added two free throws to boost the lead to 57-52. Sean McNeil's only 3 of the game in transition expanded the lead to nine, 64-55, with 3:57 to go.

A Bassey tip in with 59 seconds remaining trimmed WVU's lead to four, 66-62, but free throws by McBride and McNeil put the game away for West Virginia

"We didn't guard anybody in the first half and kind of let them do what they wanted to do and then in the second half when we started getting under them a little bit we made them score the ball over us the game gets a little bit harder," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said.

McBride, who contributed 14 points, was named to the all-tournament team, but senior forward Gabe Osabuohien was the top complimentary guy. Osabuohien played a tremendous all-around game today with 8 points, eight rebounds, five assists, a steal and a block.

It was Osabuohien's effort at both ends of the floor that really keyed West Virginia's comeback victory.

Sherman came off the bench to score 12, his second-double digit performance of the season.

Sophomore forward Oscar Tshiebwe had another rough outing with just 5 points to go along with seven rebounds. In three games so far this year, the Naismith Award candidate has scored 7, 11 and 5 points in the Mountaineers' three victories.

"We've got to get Oscar going," Huggins said.

West Virginia once again limited its 3-point attempts after trying 32 in the season opener against South Dakota State. WVU tried just 12, making five, after trying only 16 in the victory over VCU.

Western Kentucky (2-1) shot just 43.5% from the floor and was limited to just eight free throw attempts. In WKU's first two wins against Northern lowa and Memphis, it attempted 55 free throws, making 46.

Joel Ayayi's 21 points rallied No. 1-ranked Gonzaga to an 87-82 comefrom-behind victory over 11th-ranked West Virginia in the opening game of the Jimmy V Classic in Bankers Life Fieldhouse in Indianapolis, Indiana.

Gonzaga's superior depth and outstanding second-half shooting helped it overcome a 39-34 halftime deficit.

"We had every opportunity in the world to come out of here with a win, and we kind of gave it away," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said afterward. "Missed free throws, missed layups, turning the ball over without being pressured, not throwing the ball to open people ... we've got a lot of things to fix. But the positive thing is they are all things that are fixable.

As it did in its first two wins of the season against Kansas and Auburn, Gonzaga really turned it on in the second half, making 21 of its 34 second-half field goal attempts for 61.8% - matching its second-half shooting for the season. It also shot extremely well in its first two wins against the Jayhawks and Tigers.

Huggins said his bigs consistently were beaten to the spot on ball screens and the guards were unable to get through screens to help.

The game was at West Virginia's pace until about the 10-minute mark of the second half when the Zags finally began scoring transition points as the Mountaineers began to tire.

West Virginia's last lead came with 6:43 remaining, 67-65, on two Taz Sherman free throws, and it was still a two-point game with five minutes to go before the Zags used an Ayai put-back basket and a Corey Kispert 3 to give them a 78-71 advantage

The margin swelled to 86-77 on another Ayayi layup off of a Jalen Suggs steal. A late WVU flurry got it to four, and it could have become a one-possession game when Derek Culver was fouled with 18 seconds to go, but the junior couldn't get his free throw to go down.

Culver missed five of his 11 attempts from the line while the rest of the team was an impressive 23-of-24 from the charity stripe.

Another big factor was Mountaineers bigs Oscar Tshiebwe and Gabe Osabuohien getting into foul trouble in the second half. Tshiebwe's night ended with 7:26 to go, and Osabuohien joined him on the bench four minutes later.

Culver, who finished with 18 points and 15 rebounds, also played a good portion of the second half with four fouls.

Freshman Isaiah Cottrell was pressed into emergency action when Tshiebwe's night was finished, and he performed well, scoring six points in 11 minutes of action.

Tshiebwe finished 14 points and nine rebounds and Osabuohien added 10 points and three boards.

Gonzaga's big guns, Corey Kispert (19 points) and Drew Timme (17 points), were held below their season averages, but Florida transfer Andrew Nembhard picked up the slack with 19.

West Virginia was seeking its sixth victory against college basketball's No. 1-ranked team, with two of those coming under Huggins.

Recap

Guard Miles McBride flirted with a triple-double in 11th-ranked West Virginia's come-from-behind 80-71 victory over Georgetown in a Big 12-Big East Battle game played at McDonough Arena in Washington, D.C.

The sophomore guard scored a team-high 17 points, grabbed seven rebounds and handed out seven assists in the nine-point victory over West Virginia's former Big East rival.

Georgetown (1-2) led 34-32 at halftime and had a six-point lead with 13:33 left after a Timothy Ighoefe layup.

But McBride answered with a 3 to ignite a nine-point run that included a couple of dunks by Oscar Tshiebwe and Emmitt Matthews Jr., and some free throws by Tshiebwe.

With the scored tied at 62, Taz Sherman hit a big 3 and Derek Culver followed with a couple of free throws to build the margin to five. A defensive stop led to another Culver basket, and Sherman added two more to push the lead out to nine with 3:20 left

The advantage swelled to 10 on Matthews' 3 from the right wing with 1:53 remaining.

That was Matthews' only 3 of the game, although he contributed a season-best 13 points to go with four rebounds.

At one point in the second half, Huggins had his team in a zone defense despite being primarily a man-to-man coach.

Culver, despite early foul trouble, contributed 14 points and nine rebounds in just 18 minutes of action.

He finished with three fouls in a recurring early-season theme that has seen West Virginia's bigs continually getting into foul trouble. Oscar Tshiebwe finished with nine points and six rebounds despite his three fouls, and Gabe Osabuohien failed to score in a game in which he was saddled with four fouls.

West Virginia (4-1) shot 40.6% from the floor for the game, but connected on 16 of its 32 field goal attempts in the second half to outscore the Hoyas by 11 after intermission.

Georgetown got a game-high 19 points from guard Jahvon Blair. The senior hit 5-of-12 from 3-point distance as the Hoyas were 11-of-30 from behind the arc

Jamorko Pickett added 11 points and eight rebounds.

Sherman once again provided a big spark coming off the bench with 12 points on 4-of-9 shooting. Jordan McCabe also gave West Virginia a boost off the bench with five points to spell McBride.

West Virginia outscored Georgetown at the free throw line 22 to 10 and also forced 15 Hoya turnovers resulting in a 21 to four advantage in

Georgetown managed to hold its own on the glass by matching West Virginia's 43 rebounds.

West Virginia's victory trimmed Georgetown's lead to one, 27-26, in a longtime series that dates back to 1922. West Virginia last played at Georgetown in 2014 when it lost to the Hoyas in the first round of the

Last year's regular-season Conference USA champs had the Mountaineers down by 10 with nine seconds to go in the first half before a late Deuce McBride layup trimmed the deficit to eight at the

"We were less than ready to play, obviously," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said.

For most of the first half, West Virginia (5-1) couldn't buy a basket and allowed the Mean Green to score layup after layup late in the first half

WVU used an 18-0 run to begin the second half and never trailed the rest of the way. North Texas was held without a field goal for the first seven minutes as WVU built a 13-point lead, but the Mean Green went on a mini-run with five minutes to go to cut the Mountaineers' lead to 49-45.

A McBride pull-up jumper with 4:18 to go stopped the run. Two Taz Sherman free throws with 43 seconds left got the lead back to 10.

Sean McNeil, coming into the game shooting 27.3%, made 5-of-9 today for a team-high 15 points, which was encouraging.

Derek Culver had his 19th career double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds. All 10 of Culver's points came in the second half.

"Honestly, the turnaround was putting (Culver) back into the game and him actually wanting to play in the second half," Huggins said. "We threw the ball to him and he scored.

"They can't guard him and now it's two-on-one and three-onone in the post," Huggins said. "We need to be able to do more than just throw the ball to him when we're in trouble."

Sherman came off the bench to score 13.

"I thought Taz was really good. I think he gives us somebody really solid and somebody who can make an open shot," Huggins said. "And Gabe (Osabuohien) defensively was outstanding."

Guard Javion Hamlet led North Texas with 15 points. Forward Thomas Bell added 12.

West Virginia shot just 37.7% from the floor while North Texas shot worse at 34.5%.

The Mountaineers out-rebounded the Mean Green 48-32

Sophomore guard Miles McBride scored 20 points on 9-of-11 shooting, while junior forward Derek Culver produced his 20th career double-double with 10 points and 11 rebounds in easily the Mountaineers' best showing of the season.

The final 10 minutes of the first half were certainly Final Four caliber for the Mountaineers.

Huggins took McBride out early in favor of Jordan McCabe, who hit a couple of big 3s, and when he put McBride back into the game the sophomore put on a clinic to finish up the half with 16 points.

West Virginia's biggest lead was 30 early in the second half before Huggins began substituting liberally.

Richmond (4-1) outscored West Virginia 27-13 over the next 12 minutes, requiring Huggins to call timeout with 5:22 left to get his guys reorganized. He also put his starters back into the game and within the lead quickly returned to 20.

West Virginia (6-1) shot 58.1% from the floor (36 of 62) including a sizzling 57.1% (8 of 14) from 3-point distance.

McNeil continued his solid marksmanship by connecting on 5-of-8 to finish with 12, matching Oscar Tshiebwe's 12.

Sherman contributed 15 points on 5-of-7 shooting coming off the bench. The junior guard connected on three of his four 3-point attempts in a season-high effort.

Recap

Christian Braun's 22 points led No. 3-ranked Kansas to a 79-65 victory over No. 7 West Virginia at Allen Fieldhouse in Lawrence, Kansas.

The Jayhawks bombed away from three by hitting 16-of-37 from behind the arc in administering West Virginia its worst loss of the season.

"We put a 3-2 zone in to try and keep them from penetrating and I thought that was pretty effective in the first half and then we had some breakdowns," West Virginia coach Bob Huggins said.

Braun was 6-of-12 from three, Jalen Wilson made four and Ochai Agbaji and Marcus Garrett hit three each for the Jayhawks.

"They had a great night and we didn't have a great night," Huggins

Sean McNeil's torrid outside shooting in the first half kept the Mountaineers in it, and his bank-shot three right before the end of the first half gave them a 36-35 lead.

McNeil hit all six of his first-half threes and was seven of seven overall for 20 points at intermission. After the break, Kansas permitted him to make only two baskets to finish with a game-high 24.

The game turned in Kansas' favor when guard Miles McBride picked up three quick fouls in the second half and was forced to go to the bench with 15:50 remaining and West Virginia trailing 46-44.

When he finally got back into the game, the Kansas lead was 10 and quickly swelled to 15.

The Jayhawks' biggest lead was 22 with 4:16 left on a Garrett three. Overall, Kansas shot three percentage points better than West Virginia's 41% from the floor, but the Jayhawks doubled up the Mountaineers from behind the three-point arc, several of those coming after initial misses.

"The ones they missed bounced out to the three-point line and they chased them down and we kind of stood there and watched them do it," Huggins said. "They got a ton of rebounds that bounced out long."

Kansas out-rebounded West Virginia 40-37 and outscored the Mountaineers 25-to-14 in second chance points. The Jayhawks had 19 assists on their 28 field goals while West Virginia had only 10 assists on its 26 field goals.

Wilson contributed 17 points, Garrett scored 15, Agbaji 11 and center David McCormack added 10 points and a game-high 11 rebounds.

McBride was the only other West Virginia player to reach double figures with 19 points on 8-of-16 shooting.

West Virginia's inside tandem of Derek Culver and Oscar Tshiebwe combined to shoot just five-of-14 for 11 points. Culver scored eight points and grabbed eight rebounds.

"We tried to throw it close and we didn't play through their physicality in the post," Huggins said. "We threw it close to Oscar and he didn't finish and Derek didn't finish the way he has been finishing."

A limited capacity of 2,500 attended the game.
