OPENING TIP

• The Huskies open conference play after playing the 17th-toughest schedule during the non-conference season (per ESPN's College Basketball Power Index); Northeastern faced three Power 5 opponents for the first time since the 2018-19 season when the Huskies went 1-3, including an NCAA tournament loss to No. 17 Kansas

• Northeastern played just two games on its original 2020-21 schedule, UMass at home (12/13) and at Georgia (12/22); NU added road games at Syracuse (12/16), Old Dominion (12/20) and No. 9/8 West Virginia (12/29)

• The Huskies have won eight consecutive CAA season openers and are 11-4 all-time

• Northeastern has seven players born outside the United States, third-most in the country behind Maine's 11 and Cal Baptist's eight

• The Huskies are one of the youngest teams in the country with just three upper classmen and no seniors; This is the first time in head coach **Bill Coen's** 15 years that he has coached a team without a senior (*Last team to not have a senior was 2002-03*)

• Coach **Coen's** 242 wins at Northeastern is eight shy of the all-time record of 250, set by Jim Calhoun from 1972-86; He moved into second all-time in CAA history with 163 wins in league regular season and postseason play

• The Huskies are the winningest program in CAA play since Coach **Coen's** arrival in 2006; The Huskies lead the way with 146 victories and have a CAA-best five CAA Championship game appearances since 2013

• The Huskies became the fifth program in CAA history to make three consecutive CAA Championship Game appearances (2018, '19, '20), earning their ninth NCAA tournament bid in 2019

• The Huskies lost nearly 70 percent of their scoring from last year, including CAA scoring champion **Jordan Roland** (21.9 ppg), **Bolden Brace** (10.5 ppg), **Tomas Murphy** (9.3 ppg), **Max Boursiquot** (9.0 ppg), **Guilien Smith** (3.3 ppg) and **Myles Franklin** (3.0 ppg)

#8 WEST VIRGINIA 73, NORTHEASTERN 51

Game 6 | WVU Coliseum | Morgantown, W.Va.

Quirin Emanga scored a career-high 13 points and **Tyson Walker** added 10 points and three assists to lead Northeastern at No. 8 West Virginia on Tuesday inside the WVU Coliseum. The Mountaineers (8-2) defeated the Huskies (1-5), 73-51, thanks to outscoring NU 50-20 in the paint.

The Huskies crept within three early in the second half after a 3-pointer by Walker and a fastbreak layup by **Shaquille Walters**, 34-31. WVU responded with a 13-3 run over five minutes and led by double digits for the remainder of the game.

The Huskies committed 19 turnovers that led to 22 points for the Mountaineers. The much-bigger Mountaineers dominated the glass, outrebounding the Huskies 45-34, including 17 offensive rebounds that led to 14 second-chance baskets.

Northeastern limited West Virginia to just 2-for-21 (9.5%) from behind the arc. WVU's Derek Culver led all scorers with 18 points, making 8-of-11 shots, while Oscar Tshiebwe added a double-double with 12 points and 15 rebounds.

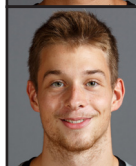

HUSKIES ASSEMBLE 17TH-TOUGHEST SCHEDULE

- According to *ESPN's College Basketball Power Index (BPI)*, Northeastern is playing the 17th-toughest schedule in the country
- NU's non-conference opponents feature (according to BPI rankings) No. 12 Syracuse (ACC), No. 20 West Virginia (Big 12), No. 100 Georgia (SEC), No. 131 UMass (A-10) and No. 165 Old Dominion (C-USA)
- Once the NCAA announced that men's basketball would begin on Nov. 25, the Huskies immediately went to work on their original schedule and which dates remained possible
- With the Ivy and Patriot League cancellations of non-conference games, Northeastern lost Boston University, Harvard and Holy Cross
- NU added the DC Paradise Jam in Washington, D.C., Nov. 26-28, against Belmont, George Mason and Howard, but decided to delay the start of its men's basketball season until Dec. 9 (George Mason and Howard had to pause men's basketball activities immediately following the tournament)
- The Huskies lost a game with UMass Lowell (Dec. 9) after the River Hawks had two positives within their Tier 1 personnel
- With UMass already on the schedule for Dec. 13 at home, the Huskies and Minutemen decided to play a home-and-home series on Dec. 11 and 13 to open the season
- Northeastern added Bryant and Old Dominion on Dec. 16 and 20, but lost Bryant when the NEC asked the Bulldogs to open conference play on Dec. 16 and 17; NU replaced Bryant with a road game at Syracuse
- The Huskies then added No. 9/8 West Virginia to their non-conference schedule just before Christmas

LEADER OF THE PACK

- The Huskies have ranked ahead of crosstown foes Boston College and Boston University in the final RPI/NET rankings in six straight seasons (2015-present) and in front of UMass in five straight years
- Northeastern held the second-best ranking in all of New England in 2018 and '19, behind only Providence out of the BIG EAST (New England states include Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Vermont)

Since the beginning of October, Nigerians have taken to the streets to protest police brutality in their country. Young people in particular are mobilizing in major Nigerian cities, calling for the abolition of the SARS special police task force that has been operating for more than two decades. The task force, which is under government jurisdiction, has been accused of inflicting severe human rights violations on its citizens. And people have had enough.

The **#EndSARS** hashtag dates back to at least 2017, when people began using it online share their experiences of violence and assault at the hands of SARS. This most recent protest was launched by an October 8 viral video which allegedly showed SARS officers killing a young man in one of the country's southern states. While authorities have denied that the video is real, according to Al Jazeera, the man who filmed it has been arrested, leading to more outrage from citizens. And this recent round of mass protests has led to further violence against the protestors themselves, including 25 people who were shot in Lagos, Nigeria while demonstrating on October 21, with an unnamed witness telling BBC News that soldiers "pulled up... and they started firing directly" at protestors. An investigation by Amnesty International also found that Nigerian army and police killed at least 12 peaceful protesters on October 20.

In addition to protesting police brutality, demonstrators are also speaking out against Nigeria's bad governance, citing grievances such as poor educational opportunities for citizens.

#24 SHAQUILLE WALTERS says ...

- Northeastern has been one of the top teams in the country from the free-throw line over the last two seasons (2018-20); The Huskies ended last season No. 3 in the country (.794) and No. 35 in 2018-19 (.751)
- The Huskies' 79.4 percent from the free-throw line set a new single-season record (366-for-461); No. 3 all-time in CAA history
- Northeastern leads the CAA this season with a .753 percentage from the charity stripe, No. 46 in the NCAA

Bill Coen enters his 15th season as head coach of the Northeastern basketball program. He is currently second in school history with 242 wins, trailing Jim Calhoun's 250 from 1972-86, and second all-time in CAA history with 163 CAA wins (league+postseason), trailing Miami (FL) head coach Jim Larranaga's 183 wins at Georgia Mason from 1998-2011.

Coen is widely regarded for his ability to evaluate and develop talented players. In his previous 14 seasons at Northeastern, NU players have earned 33 All-CAA honors, including 10 first-team accolades and eight All-Rookie selections. A total of 25 of Coen's former players have earned professional contracts and 12 Huskies remain active in professional basketball.

Coen's teams have remained the most consistent in the CAA. The Huskies have finished .500 or better in 11 of Coen's 14 seasons at the helm, including back-to-back 14-win seasons in 2017-18 and 2018-19. Northeastern has appeared in the CAA tournament quarterfinals in 13 of 14 seasons under Coen, advanced to the semifinals eight times, and to the title game five times, including three straight appearances (2018-20) and two titles (2015, '19). Since Coen took the reins of the Northeastern men's basketball program 14 seasons ago, Northeastern has accomplished the best win percentage among current CAA teams in conference and CAA tournament play.

The Huskies became the fifth program in CAA history to make three straight CAA title game appearances in 2019-20, falling just short to top-seeded Hofstra, 70-61, in Washington, D.C. Northeastern is a CAA-best 11-4 in the league tournament since 2015, and have a pair of NCAA tournament appearances in 2015 and '19.

Northeastern has won a league-best 146 league games during Coen's leadership, and won a CAA-best three regular-season titles since joining the league in 2005-06 (2012-13, 2014-15, 2017-18). The Huskies have appeared in the NCAA postseason in two straight seasons with an NIT appearance in 2018 and NCAA tournament appearance in 2019. The NCAA canceled all winter and spring championships in 2020, immediately following the 2020 CAA Championship.
