## SERIES WITH THE OWLS

- FAU leads the all-time series 19-5-1, including a sweep in 2019
- The Huskies dropped all three games last year; 7-4, 9-6 and 2-1
- NU has dropped 11 straight games in the series, last defeating the Owls 7-3 on March 27, 1995

## QUICK HITS

- 2020 marks the centennial season for the Northeastern Huskies
- The Huskies have produced at least two MLB Draft Picks in every year since 2011, including three selections in the 2019 MLB Draft
- Freshman **Sebastian Keane** was an 11th round draft pick of the Boston Red Sox in 2019
- Sixth-year head coach **Mike Glavine** became the third player from Northeastern to make it to the Major Leagues, doing so with the New York Mets in 2003; His brother is MLB Hall of Famer Tom Glavine and they both played for the Mets that season
- Two Huskies have been drafted in the first round, and a total of five have made the Big Leagues; Carlos Pena (2001-14), Luke Carlin (2008-12), Adam Ottavino (2010-Present, currently with the New York Yankees), Aaron Civale (2019-Present, currently with Cleveland Indians) and Glavine with the Mets
- Northeastern became just the second Northeast region team to ever receive an at-large bid to the NCAA Regional, doing so in 2018 after winning the CAA regular-season title

## SNOWBIRD CLASSIC

- The Huskies finished the Snowbird Classic 4-1, matching the most wins they have produced in this annual tournament (4-0 in 2018)
- Northeastern had its seven-game winning streak snapped in the final game of the Snowbird Classic, 17-16 to Western Michigan (3/4)
- The Huskies hit .341 as a team in the tournament, connecting on 11 doubles, six triples and five home runs
- NU's *Jared Dupere* led the way offensively, hitting .455 over five games and drove in a team-best nine runs
- After hitting just four home runs all of last season, *Corey DiLoreto* smashed three home runs in the tournament, batting .381
- Starting pitching was strong for the Huskies, posting a 2.24 ERA and struck out 24 in the four wins

## TEDDY BALLGAME

- Junior catcher Teddy Beaudet was named CAA Player of the Week on Tuesday after batting .423 last weekend, including two doubles and a home run
- Beaudet has recorded a base hit in every game that he has gotten an at bat, and finished 3-for-4 with four runs scored in the 17-7 win over Eastern Michigan (3/1)
- A 5-foot-11 native of Franklin, N.H., Beaudet drove in four runs over the weekend and helped the Huskies win seven straight games

## HUSKIES PICKED SECOND IN CAA PRESEASON BASEBALL POLL

- Northeastern received two first-place votes and was picked second by the league's head coaches behind two-time defending champion UNCW
- *Baseball America* also picked the Huskies to finish second behind the Seahawks
- Junior third baseman *Ian Fair* is the CAA Preseason Player of the Year after winning the batting title in 2019 with a .357 batting average
- Freshman hurler *Sebastian Keane*, an 11th round draft pick of the Boston Red Sox out of high school, was predicted to be the CAA Freshman of the Year by *Baseball America* and was tabbed as one of the best 20 freshmen in college baseball

**FAIR BALL(ER)**

- **Ian Fair** has been one of the top offensive players in the CAA since his arrival on Huntington Avenue
- The 2018 CAA Co-Rookie of the Year, **Fair** led the team with eight home runs and holds the single-season school record with a 22-game hitting streak in '18 (March 20 - May 2, 2018)
- A native of Walpole, Mass., Fair is a two-time All-CAA selection and all-tournament honoree

**VETERAN PITCHING STAFF**

- The Huskies boast six pitchers that have thrown over 253 innings heading into the 2020 season
- Senior **Kyle Murphy** (2-1, 3.86 ERA) and junior **Sam Jacobsak** (1-1, 1.89 ERA) return and are in the top-three of the starting rotation
- This will be one of the deepest pitching staffs that Coach Glavine has had which will provide many options out of the bullpen this season
- Seniors **Brian Rodriguez** (3.68 ERA, 1 save) and **David Stiehl** (1-0, 3.48 ERA) will start the season throwing out of the bullpen and combined for seven wins last season
- Power arm and junior **Brandon Dufault** (1.42 ERA, 2 saves) will be the closer and features an electric fastball

**RUNNIN' HUSKIES**

- The Huskies finished 23rd in the country with 101 stolen bases in 2019, behind No. 1 Fordham with 178
- Northeastern stole a season-high eight bases against Holy Cross (3/17/19) and Delaware (3/31/19)
- The Red and Black had a streak of 15 consecutive games with at least one stolen base (March 10-April 2)
- Northeastern stole a season-high six bases in the final game of the USF series on Feb. 23, winning 7-5
- The Huskies stole four bases in the 17-7 win over Eastern Michigan (3/1)

**OFFENSIVE SURGE**

- The Huskies rank second in the CAA with 73 runs scored so far this season
- Northeastern is batting .270 as a team, fifth-best in the CAA
- The Red and Black are third in the league with 102 hits and second in runs batted in with 64
- NU has scored 33 runs over its last two games, including 32 hits, six doubles, three triples and three home runs

**GLAVINE GOES OVER 150**

- **Mike Glavine** enters his sixth season at the helm for the #HowlinHuskies, and he has helped lead the team to a 156 wins
- Coach Glavine reached the 150-win plateau in the 10-0 win over USF on Feb. 22 in the opening game of the series
- The Huskies earned their first-ever at-large bid to the NCAA Regional in 2018 under Glavine's direction
- The 156 wins during this five-plus year stretch is the most by any Northeastern team over that period of time

## THE GLAVINE FILE

**Mike Glavine** – the two-time CAA Coach of the Year (2017, 2018), 2018 NEIBA (New England) Coach of the Year and 2018 ABCA/Diamond Northeast Region Coach of the Year – enters his sixth season as head coach of the Northeastern baseball team in 2020 and 14th season overall with the program, having previously served as the Huskies’ assistant coach and recruiting coordinator. He was named Neil McPhee’s successor as head coach during September 2013 and took the reigns of the program upon McPhee’s retirement at the conclusion of the 2014 season, following McPhee’s 29th year at Northeastern.

Glavine has guided Northeastern to consecutive CAA regular-season titles during 2017 and 2018 – the Huskies’ first within any conference since 2005 (America East). He has also led the Huskies back to the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2003, earning an at-large bid during 2018 after winning a program record, 36 games, including the program’s first three victories against the SEC, and attaining a top-40 RPI.

Since Glavine took over the baseball program, the Huskies have won a program-best 149 games over a five-year stretch heading into the 100th season of baseball at Northeastern University. The Huskies have never had a losing season inside the CAA under Glavine’s guidance, and Cleveland Indians’ hurler Aaron Civale earned All-America honors in 2016. A total of 24 players have garnered all-league honors and NU has never finished lower than fifth during Glavine’s tenure.

A native of Billerica, Mass., Glavine spent four years as a player at Northeastern and left as one of the most prolific hitters in the Huskies’ history. Glavine graduated having hit 28 career home runs and accumulated 110 career RBIs, ranking him third and ninth at the time, respectively, in school history. The left-handed slugger also walked 120 times during his four seasons at NU, ranking him second all-time upon completing his final collegiate campaign.

After graduating from Northeastern, Glavine spent 10 seasons in professional baseball after being drafted by the Cleveland Indians during 1995, alternating between AA and AAA levels. During September 2003, the New York Mets called Glavine up to the major leagues, where he played with his older brother and MLB Hall of Famer, Tom. Glavine became the third Northeastern alumni to ever play in the major leagues, joining George Yankowski (1942, 1949) and Carlos Pena (2001-14).

Retiring from the pro ranks in 2004, Glavine now resides in Lexington, Mass., with his wife, Carissa, their two daughters, Ava and Sophia, and their son, Luke.
