OPENING TIP

*Drexel returns home to face Northeastern after defeating William & Mary on Saturday, 79-64. Drexel is 7-5 overall and 2-3 in CAA play. Both wins have come against the Tribe, one in Philadelphia and one in Virginia.

*James Buter and Camren Wynter were both named to the CAA Preseason First Team and have showed why. Butler tied a seasonhigh with 21 at William & Mary and leads the CAA in field-goal percentage. Wynter has had two 11-assist games in the last three outings and leads the CAA with 5.7 assists. He averages 17 points per game.

*The Dragons lead the CAA in scoring defense at just 64.3 per game. The Dragons also lead the CAA in rebound margin, assists per game, assist-to-turnover ratio, and free-throw percentage.

HEAD COACH ZACH SPIKER

Ithaca '00 · Fifth Season at Drexel

Zach Spiker is now in his fifth season leading the Drexel Men's Basketball program. Spiker and his staff have rebuilt the Dragons' roster over the last few years and have a veteran squad returning for the 2020-21 season. The Dragons return their top five scorers, including two All-Colonial Athletic Association players, as they look to challenge for the CAA title.

"Zach Spiker is an exceptional coach and a person of integrity," Zillmer said. "Zach has unbelievable energy and will bring an excitement to the Drexel fan base. His personality and playing style fits the aspirations of our University as a creative, fast-paced, and innovative place of higher education."

Spiker was named the 26th head coach in Drexel history on March 25, 2016 and just the sixth since the school became a Division I member. In his four seasons at the school, Spiker has had six All-Colonial Athletic Association selections. Two of his recruits have been named to the CAA All-Rookie Team. Cam Wynter was named the CAA's Rookie of the Year and last season was named Second Team All-League. In his four years, the Dragons have had two players lead the league in three-point percentage and James Butler has led the CAA in both rebounding and field-goal percentage.

Last season, Drexel had its most wins under Spiker. The Dragons picked up their first in-season tournament victory in 17 years by winning the Boardwalk Battle in Atlantic City, N.J. The Dragons defeated Quinnipiac and Norfolk State at Boardwalk Hall. Those were two of Drexel's seven non-conference wins, the most for the school in six years. In addition, Drexel won 10 games at the Daskalakis Athletic Center last year. It marked the first time the team won 10 or more games at the DAC since the 2011-12 team won 15. His teams are a combined 33-25 at the DAC in his four seasons. Off the court, the Dragons compiled a 3.25 grade-point average during the winter quarter.

Spiker picked up his first victory at Drexel against Hartford in his first game at the DAC on Nov. 18, 2016. Now in his fourth year at Drexel, Spiker's teams have increased their conference win total in each of the last two seasons. The Dragons have had some memorable wins in his brief time in University City. Drexel knocked off Houston, an NCAA Tournament team, at the Paradise Jam in 2017 and also won at city-rival La Salle during the 17-18 season. Spiker's team made national headlines as it rallied from a 34-point deficit to defeat Delaware at the DAC on Feb. 22, 2018. That marked the biggest come-from-behind win in NCAA history.

The Dragons increased their conference win total for the second straight year and averaged 75.8 points per game in 2018-19, their highest average since joining the CAA. Drexel picked up a 79-78 win at the College of Charleston, which snapped the Cougars' 22-game home winning streak, which was the second longest in the nation at that time. Wynter won the CAA Rookie of the Year Award, joining Chris Fouch and Damion Lee as the only Drexel players to earn the award. Graduate student Trevor John set a school record by making 103 three-pointers as Drexel finished the year with 237 treys, the third-highest total in school history. Spiker's first team at Drexel made 256 three-pointers, breaking the mark set by the 1995-96 team.

Spiker came to the Dragons from Army West Point, where he spent seven seasons as the head coach of the Black Knights. He led Army West Point to it most win in more than 30 years in his final season. Spiker won 102 games during his time at West Point, which is tied with Naismith Hall of Fame coach Bob Knight for second all-time at the Academy. In his final season, Spiker led the Black Knights to a 19-14 record and tied for the best overall mark in the Patriot League. They earned Army's first postseason appearance since another Hall of Famer, Mike Krzyzewski, led them to the National Invitation Tournament in 1978. He is the only coach in Army history to win 15 or more games in four consecutive seasons, a mark the program has not achieved — even under multiple coaches — since 1920-24.

Spiker was selected as the 2016 Skip Prosser Man of the Year. He was named the 2013 Patriot League Coach of the Year award and was a finalist for the Hugh Durham Award, presented annually to the nation's top mid-major coach. Spiker was one of only seven coaches in the country to receive at least one vote for the Associated Press National Coach of the Year honor that season.

The 2015-16 Black Knights squad was one of the best in recent memory at West Point. The team's 19 wins were the most by Army since the 1977-78 season. Spiker's team also set a school record with 11 road wins. Army led the Patriot League in three-pointers and rebounding, and was second in scoring offense, putting up 76.9 points per game. It had top-30 national rankings in rebounds per game (40.58), defensive rebounds (28.21) and three-pointers made per game (8.9), as its high-powered offense was one of the quickest in the nation with 75.4 possessions per contest. Its 294 three-pointers made set a program record, surpassing the previous high-water mark by 30. The Black Knights hosted quarterfinal and semifinal games in the Patriot League Tournament before falling to eventual champion Holy Cross.

Presenson Prognostications

The pollsters of the CAA predicted good things are ahead for Drexel. The Dragons finished third in the CAA preseason poll, their highest placement under head coach Zach Spiker. Seven voters placed Drexel at the top of the 10-team league.

Preseason praise was also handed out to James Butler and Camren Wynter. The Dragon duo earned places on the Preseason All-CAA First Team following stellar 2019-20 seasons. Butler was fifth nationally in both rebounding and double-doubles and earned a spot on the All-CAA Third Team. Wynter, an All-CAA second teamer, was second in the conference in assists and fifth in steals. No other program placed multiple players on the preseason first team.

THE CAPTAINS

Drexel has co-captains for the 2020-21 season. James Butler and Cam Wynter will serve in that role this season after doing the same last year. Wynter became the first Drexel sophomore in recent memory to captain the Dragons when he did so in 2019-20.

New Face on Staff

There is a new face on the Drexel bench this season. Mike Jordan joined the Dragons in July of 2020 following eight years as an assistant at Colgate University in Hamilton, N.Y. Jordan played an important role in the Raiders' rebuild. While on staff, Colgate posted its first two 20-win seasons, won its first Patriot League tournament and made its first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 1996.

While Jordan's face is new to Drexel, it isn't new to University City. Jordan was a three-time First Team All-Ivy League selection for the Penn Quakers. A 2014 inductee into the Big 5 Hall of Fame, Jordan was the Ivy's Player of the Year in 2000.

Scoring Defense

Drexel's defense been stingy when it comes to allowing points in the early going. The Dragons have allowed 61 points or less in five games in the early going. They have gone 3-2 in those games. Drexel enters the weekend leading the CAA in scoring defense at 64.3 points per game.

Proficiency From The Line

The Dragons have gotten off to a great start from the charity stripe. Drexel is shooting .774 from the free throw line, which is tops in the CAA and 20th in the nation in free throw percentage. All five of Drexel starters shoot at least 75 percent from the foul line. James Butler is eighth in the CAA from the line at .808. Cam Wynter (.871) and Zach Walton (.818) are both shooting better than 80 percent but do not have enough attempts to qualify.

THREE-POINT DEFENDERS

Drexel's defense has been been good at guarding the 3-point stripe in the early going. The Dragons allow opponents to shoot just .291 from behind the arc through 12 games. That ranks 38th in the nation as of Jan. 25. They have held four opponents to 25 percent or less shooting from deep this season.

Drexel From Downtown

Potency from beyond the 3-point arc has become a calling card of Drexel under head coach Zach Spiker. This was true again in 2019-20, when the Dragons finished in the top half of the CAA in long-range accuracy. The Dragons have four players on the roster who shot .340 or better from deep on three-point attempts.

Coletrane Washington led the CAA in 3-point accuracy, hitting 43.9 percent (43-98) of his tries from deep. Washington, who has yet to play due to injury this year, became the second Drexel player to lead the league in 3-point percentage in Spiker's first four seasons. Not far behind Washington was Mate Okros, who knocked down 41 of his 99 (.414) attempts from behind the arc.

Both Camren Wynter (.355) and Matey Juric (.342) were reliable threats from deep last season, and James Butler flirted promisingly with the long-rage game, making three of his six treys.

The Dragons are starting to find their mark from deep this season. Wynter is shooting .432 from behind the stripe to lead the team, whie Zach Walton and Okros each have 19 3-pointer. Freshman Lamar Oden, Jr., has made eight shots from behind the arc. Okros made five three-pointers on Jan. 17 against William & Mary and has seven in his last two games.

Home Cooking

Drexel had a significant homecourt advantage last season. The Dragons were 10-5 at the DAC, reaching 10 wins at home for the first time since the 2011-12 team. That year, DU finished the regular-season undefeated at home and 15-1 overall. The Dragons have won 10 or more in the DAC 13 times since the building opened in 1974. Spiker's squad has now won nine games or more in three straight seasons at the DAC. His home record overall is 36-27 and the Dragons are 31-19 over the last three plus seasons on their homecourt. Spiker's team is 4-1 in home openers at the DAC after defeating Coppin State.

PLAYERS IN THE PROS

Since 2000-01, the Dragons have had more than 20 players sign professional contracts. Former players still active as of last season include Damion Lee, Troy Harper, Austin Williams, Samme Givens, Frantz Massenat, Dartaye Ruffin, Chaz Crawford, Scott Rodgers, Frank Elegar and Robert Battle.

CAM WYNTER

Cam Wynter has been a key player for the Dragons since arriving on campus. He enters this weekend's games leading the team in scoring (17.0) and leading the CAA with 5.7 assists . A two-year captain, the junior is also tops on the club with a .432 3-point percentage. Wynter is currently in the CAA top 10 in scoring, assists, steals, field-goal percentage and minutes played. Wynter tied a career-high with 31 points against Fairleigh Dickinson.

As a sophomore, he averaged 15.7 points, was second in the CAA with 5.1 assists per game. Wynter, a Second Team All-CAA selection, had 31 points against Princeton on 13-for-16 shooting. He was named the MVP of the Boardwalk Battle, averaging 14 points and seven assists in Drexel's two wins. Earlier in the year, he had a career-high 14 assists in the win vs. Bryant. Wynter was the CAA Rookie of the Year in 2019 after averaging 11.3 points and 5.4 assists. His 174 assists broke the school freshman record, and he was named the CAA Rookie of the Week five times. Wynter finished 2019-20 with 517 points and became the 20th Dragon to score 500 points in one season.

A Preseason All-CAA First Team selection, he was named the CAA Player of the Week on Dec. 7 after leading DU to three straight wins.

JAMES BUTLER

James Butler had a solid junior season in University City and has picked up where he left off. Butler, a Third Team All-CAA pick, has had double-doubles in four of the last seven games, including both games at Charleston, and now has 30 in his career. He scored a season-high 21 points and against Saint Joseph's and matched that at William & Mary. He is third in the CAA with 9.7 rebounds per game and leads the conference in field-goal percentage (.596).

Last year, Butler averaged 13.2 points and was fifth in Division I with 11.7 rebounds per game. He had 20 double-doubles last season, the fifth most in the nation.

In his first year with the Dragons, Butler led the CAA in field-goal percentage (.598) and was seventh in rebounds (8.2). Butler came to DU from the U.S. Naval Academy. Now a graduate student, he has two years of eligibility remaining.

Rebounding the basketball is a family tradition for Butler. His father, Vern, was a prolific glass cleaner in his own right and is second in career scoring and career rebounds at Navy, trailing only David Robinson in both categories.
