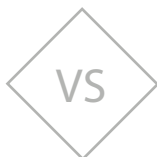

WAKE FOREST VS. NORTHEASTERN

THE MATCHUP

- The Demon Deacons begin the 2021 season with a three-game home series against non-conference opponent Northeastern in the first ever matchup between the two programs. Wake Forest hits the diamond for the first time in 345 days as the team last competed on March 11 before the cancellation of the 2020 season.
- The Deacs and Huskies look to rely on their experience as the teams are each composed of double-digit returners. Wake Forest finished the shortened season with a 10-8 mark, while the Huskies found their stride right before the cancellation of the season as the team won 10 of its final 12 games. Northeastern was selected as the preseason favorite in the CAA North Division.

LAST TIME OUT

- Wake Forest fell 10-4 on the road at Coastal Carolina in their final contest before the 2020 season was canceled due to COVID. Shane Muntz blasted his fourth home run of the new year, while Michael Turconi finished 2-for-5 with a pair of doubles.

WAKE FOREST STORYLINES

- The 2021 Demon Deacons are veteran-heavy and possess great experience positionally and on the mound. Twelve total (seven starters) positional players return in 2021 as well as nine pitchers (three starters).
- Chris Lanzilli, Bobby Seymour and Shane Muntz have excelled in the middle of the batting order over the last three campaigns and will look to again lead Wake Forest's offensive punch. Seymour heads into his fourth season in Winston-Salem as the reigning ACC Player of the Year after posting 92 RBIs in 2019, the most since Buster Posey 11 years prior. That same season, Lanzilli took home All-American honors after batting .347 with 67 RBIs and 16 home runs, while Muntz finished with the highest OPS percentage in the ACC.
- Ryan Cusick, Antonio Menendez and William Fleming hold the most experience on the Deacs' pitching staff, posting 17 wins and 282 strikeouts over 135 career games.

OPPONENT & SERIES HISTORY

- This year's opening series will be the first meeting between the two programs.

ON DECK

- The Demon Deacons will get one day off before continuing their homestand against Coastal Carolina on Feb. 23. The team then begins ACC play at The Couch against Notre Dame on Feb. 26-28.
- The first time the Deacs hit the road will be a midweek matchup against Charlotte on March 3.

PRESEASON HYPE

- Wake Forest heads into the new year with a praise from multiple media outlets, highlighted by a No. 17 ranking by D1 Baseball.
- The Demon Deacons feature a pair of Preseason All-Americans.
 - Bobby Seymour, the reigning ACC Player of the Year, earned a trio of national nods as the St. John, Ind. was named a First Team selection by Perfect Game while also garnering Second Team honors from D1 Baseball and Baseball America.
 - Ryan Cusick joined Seymour as a Second Team selection on Baseball America's list, while also being voted to the Third Team by Perfect Game.

WHAT THEY'RE SAYING

- "This is certainly the most talented pitching staff we've had by far. The 2017 team set the bar from during my time here, that team had Parker Dunshee at the front, who won 11 games, and Griffin Roberts in the back who kind of locked it down. But we certainly love this pitching staff and the depth it offers." - head coach Tom Walter
- "Because of the facilities we've built and the pitching lab, we've certainly been able to recruit a higher-caliber pitcher. That's part of it. And coming off the success in 2016, '17 and '19, we're recruiting a better caliber of pitcher. And then the second part of it is the pitching lab." - head coach Tom Walter
- "This is where the Pitching Lab and facility upgrades like the Chris Hurd Player Development Center are starting to pay dividends. Wake Forest Baseball was voted the best in the ACC and fourth in the nation in terms of player development facilities, according to a poll conducted by Baseball America earlier this year." - Les Johnson (GoDeacs.com)
- "On paper, this club looks even better than the 2017 Wake Forest club that hosted a regional and pushed eventual national champion Florida to the brink in supers. But this group of players has yet to break through to the postseason, so all that's left is to prove it. The Deacs have legitimate Omaha potential; now they just need to harness that potential and put it all together in the spring." - Aaron Fitt (D1 Baseball)

- "All Seymour has done since he got to campus is rake and we fully expect him to do so in 2021. The numbers were a bit down in the abbreviated 2020 campaign but that doesn't diminish the 2019 campaign that saw him slash .377/.439/.576 along with nine home runs. He's a monster of a physical prospect with a 6-foot-4, 250-pound frame and he uses that strength and physicality to tap into some serious raw power. The Demon Deacons are expected to bring back one of the more experienced lineups in the ACC and there's good reason to believe that Seymour is going to be a massive part of that lineup." - Vincent Cervino (Perfect Game)
- "It starts with Cusick, a legitimate first-round candidate on Friday nights. That pitch (fastball) is his calling card, and he has the ability to assert his will with that pitch and dominate hitters with heat. But he can also throw his slurvish 78-82 mph breaking ball for a strike to get ahead in counts and set up his heater, and he's working to develop his changeup. If the secondary stuff continues to develop, he could wind up going in the top half of the first round, and vying for All-America honors." - Aaron Fitt (D1 Baseball)

WALTER CLIMBING THE CHARTS

- In 2019, Wake Forest head coach Tom Walter surpassed Marvin Crater for second-most victories in program history and claimed his 300th career win against Brown on Feb. 29. Walter also claimed his 700th career win against Furman on March 3, 2019.
- He heads into 2021 with 305 victories
- George Greer (1988-04) leads with 608 victories, and Marvin Crater (1976-87) is third all-time with 272.

ONE OF FIVE

- Wake Forest was one of five schools who had at least one player included in D1 Baseball's top infielder rankings (Tennessee, Virginia, Florida and Louisville). The Deacs in the Top 30 at their position are:
 - Bobby Seymour (No. 2 1B)
 - Brendan Tinsman (No. 16 C)

- Shane Muntz (No. 25 C)
- Michael Turconi (No. 25 SS)
- On Feb. 15, Chris Lanzilli was ranked as the No. 11 OF in the nation by the publication as well.
- The next day, the trio of Ryan Cusick (No. 38), Antonio Menendez (No. 114) and William Fleming (No. 148) were named to the outlet's top pitchers for 2021.

FLAME THROWERS

- The Deacs pitching rotation has been turning eyes in preseason camp as 11 pitchers have hit at least 95 MPH in team scrimmages.
- "There's Double A pitching staffs that can't say that, and maybe even big league staffs." - head coach Tom Walter.
- Ryan Cusick, Antonio Menendez and William Fleming possess the most experience on the Deacs' pitching staff, posting 17 wins and 282 strikeouts over 135 career games.

HOME OPENER MAGIC

- Wake Forest heads into the first game of the 2021 season with a six-game winning streak in home openers.
- Over the streak, the Deacs have outscored their opponents by a margin of 46-17.
- The most runs scored in a home opener over the win streak is 15 against UNCG (2017).
- The last loss in a home opener was on Feb. 15, 2014 against Towson when the Deacs fell 5-4

DRAFTED DEACS

- Jared Shuster was the lone Deac selected in the shortened 2020 draft as the Atlanta Braves selected the left-hander with the 25th pick in the last June.
- Shuster became the seventh first round pick in Wake Forest history and just the fifth Demon Deacon to be selected among the top 50 picks in the draft:

WAKE FOREST HEAD COACH TOM WALTER



HEAD COACH | 12TH YEAR | GEORGETOWN, 1991 | COACHES THIRD BASE | WEARS NO. 32

- Head coach Tom Walter is in his 12th season at the helm of Wake Forest baseball. Walter signed a new seven-year contract in 2017, which runs through 2024.
- Walter is one of two active head coaches in the country to lead three different programs to the NCAA Division I Tournament, becoming just the seventh coach all-time to do so. He joins the ranks of Larry Cochell, Augie Garrido, Sunny Golloway, Andy Lopez, Ron Polk and Jack Stallings. Randy Masey accomplished the feat in 2017.
- Players drafted in the top 10 rounds from Wake Forest under Walter include Mac Williamson (2012 - 3rd), Tim Cooney (2012 - 3rd), Will Craig (2016 - 1st), Stuart Fairchild (2017 - 2nd), Gavin Sheets (2017 - 2nd), Parker Dunshee (2017 - 7th), Ben Breazeale (2017 - 7th), Griffin Roberts (2018 - 1st) and Colin Peluse (2019 - 9th). Williamson and Cooney made their MLB debuts in 2015 after being third-round picks in 2012.
- At Wake Forest, Walter has overseen the development of 2016 National Player of the Year Will Craig, ACC Player of the Year Bobby Seymour, All-America selections Craig, Seymour, Nate Mondou, Stuart Fairchild, Gavin Sheets and Chris Lanzilli and a total of 22 All-ACC selections. Wake Forest had nine All-ACC picks in 2017, the most ever.
- Walter also has experience working with USA Baseball, spending time in the summer

of 2016 as a manager of the Stars team at the 17U National Team Development Program.

- Development off the field is equally as important as on the field under Walter. All of the program's seniors have graduated on time for five consecutive years, and the team has raised more than \$100,000 for various charities including the ALS Association, JDRF, and the Vs. Cancer Foundation. The team has had 100 percent roster participation in community service for eight straight years, and also took a service trip to the Dominican Republic in 2012. Walter also selflessly donated a kidney to outfielder Kevin Jordan just days before the 2011 season opener after Jordan was diagnosed with a serious kidney disease and needed a transplant.
- He guided his 2006 team at New Orleans through the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina. The team spent the fall in Las Cruces, New Mexico, then spent time in Mobile, Alabama, and Westwego, Louisiana, before returning to campus in March.
- The Johnstown, Pennsylvania native earned his degree in finance from Georgetown in 1991 and an MBA from George Washington in 1994. Walter started all four seasons for the Hoyas as a catcher and outfielder.
- Walter's son, Chase, is a sophomore on the Georgetown baseball team.

Bill Ciento enters his 12th year at Wake Forest in 2020, after being promoted to Associate Head Coach in January 2019. He works primarily with the Demon hitters and infielders.

In his time as a coach, 61 of his student-athletes have gone on to play professionally, including five big leaguers.

He oversaw the development of National Player of the Year Will Craig, the first-round pick of the Pittsburgh Pirates in 2016. After not making an all-conference team his freshman year, Craig's improvement earned him ACC Player of the Year honors in 2015 and made him a unanimous first team All-American in 2016.

Wake Forest has had 15 hitters earn all-ACC honors the last five seasons. In 2017, Wake Forest became the first Division I school in the nation to surpass 100 home runs in the BBCOR era, leading the nation with 106 blasts and 1.68 longballs per game.

Ciento has coached with Tom Walter for 12 years, including a pair of seasons at New Orleans. Ciento was a four-year starter at Siena.

He and his wife, Jen, have three daughters: Brooke, Katie and Megan.

John Hendricks joined the coaching staff at his alma mater in December 2018 and enters his third season as pitching coach.

Hendricks still ranks as the program's all-time leader with 34 career wins and 409.2 innings pitched, and was also the strikeout leader with 312 until 2017. He was inducted into the Wake Forest Sports Hall of Fame in February 2020.

Hendricks spent more than nine years working in the MLB, including the last five seasons with the New York Mets. After two years as the Area Supervisor of the Carolinas, he was promoted to National Pitching Supervisor in 2015. In that role, Hendricks was responsible for evaluating and drafting pitchers nationally.

He has also served as a roving pitching coordinator with the USA Baseball U-18 National Team Program. He has assisted in the player evaluation and roster building process, and also served as an on-field pitching coach and head coach.

Hendricks has worked at the collegiate level. He spent two seasons at Tennessee Wesleyan, serving as an assistant coach, where the team reached the NAIA World Series, and also spent five years at Lenoir Rhyne, starting as a graduate

Joey Hammond joined the Wake Forest coaching staff as the volunteer assistant coach and enters his seventh season in 2020. A former professional baseball player for 11 years, Hammond came to Wake Forest after spending five seasons as the head coach of Westchester Country Day School.

Hammond works extensively with the Wake Forest outfielders. Under his watch, Stuart Fairchild was perfect defensively in both 2015 and 2017, earning the 2017 Rawlings Gold Glove Award in the outfield.

The Deacs have become one of the nation's top offenses under Hammond's assistance. Wake Forest became the first Division I school in the nation to surpass 100 home runs in the BBCOR era, leading the nation with 106 blasts in 2017.

Hammond was drafted in the 25th round of the 1998 MLB Draft by the Baltimore Orioles and spent eight seasons with the Orioles and three with the Phillies. He recorded more than 1,000 career hits, playing primarily at the AAA level.

Hammond earned a bachelor's degree from Charlotte and was a standout shortstop from 1996-98. He was First Team All-Conference USA in 1998 after batting .398 with 100 hits.

He and his wife, Rebecca, have three sons: Caleb, Josh and Mason.

WAKE FOREST BASEBALL

THE COUCH

- David F. Couch Ballpark is home to the Demon Deacon baseball team. The Deacons moved in to the facility before the start of the 2009 season after playing the previous 28 seasons on campus at historic Gene Hooks Stadium.
- Formerly known as Ernie Shore Field, the park was home to Winston-Salem's Carolina League minor league team for more than 40 years. Wake Forest purchased the facility after the team, now known as the Winston-Salem Dash, moved in to a new downtown ballpark.
- In February 2016, Wake Forest baseball park was renamed David F. Couch Ballpark in honor of former baseball player David Couch ('84). A longtime supporter of Wake Forest Athletics and the baseball program, Couch made the lead gift toward a new \$12 million facility, which opened in February 2017, and included construction of a new dugout and bullpen, locker room, equipment room, training room, team lounge, nutrition area, and pitching lab.
- The latest phase of the Chris Hurd Player Development Center was made possible, in part, thanks to the generosity of Chris and Nancy Hurd who made the lead gift toward the project. It features a team meeting room, dedicated video room, coaches' offices, a biomechanist's office, a conference room, game day suites, and a baseball heritage area. It was dedicated on Oct. 12, 2018, and the construction wrapped up in January 2019.
- With the completion of the pitching lab inside the Chris Hurd Player Development Center at David F. Couch Ballpark, the state-of-the-art biomechanics lab is used to develop Wake Forest student-athletes and transform the game of baseball. Wake Forest Athletics is partnering with Wake Forest Baptist Health on a historic agreement, which combines the two units to enhance player safety and development. On Wake Forest's side, pitching coach John Hendricks, athletic trainer Jeff Strahm and strength coach Mark Seaver works with Wake Baptist's Dr. Brian Waterman, the team physician specializing in shoulder and elbow care, and biophysicist Dr. Kristen Nicholson.
- Wake Forest players also have access to state-of-the-art technology with the Trackman Pro video system with cameras set up on both the first and third base dugouts, center field and behind home plate. The system allows hitters to view their swings and pitchers their pitching motions following each game, and tracks 27 different data points varying from pitch velocity to spin rate to launch angle.
- Other renovations include:
 - 2020: New FieldTurf DoublePlay Classic surface installed prior to the season.
 - 2015: Visiting clubhouse converted into state-of-the-art weight room facility.
 - 2013: Multi-colored chairback seats replaced with modern all-black seats.
 - 2012: 18' x 24' LED video board installed.
 - 2011: AstroTurf GameDay 3D52H Grass installed, as well as the manual scoreboard in left field.
 - 2010: Indoor hitting facility built beyond left field.
 - 2009: Wake Forest purchased and moved into stadium. It previously belonged to the Winston-Salem Dash since it was built in 1956.

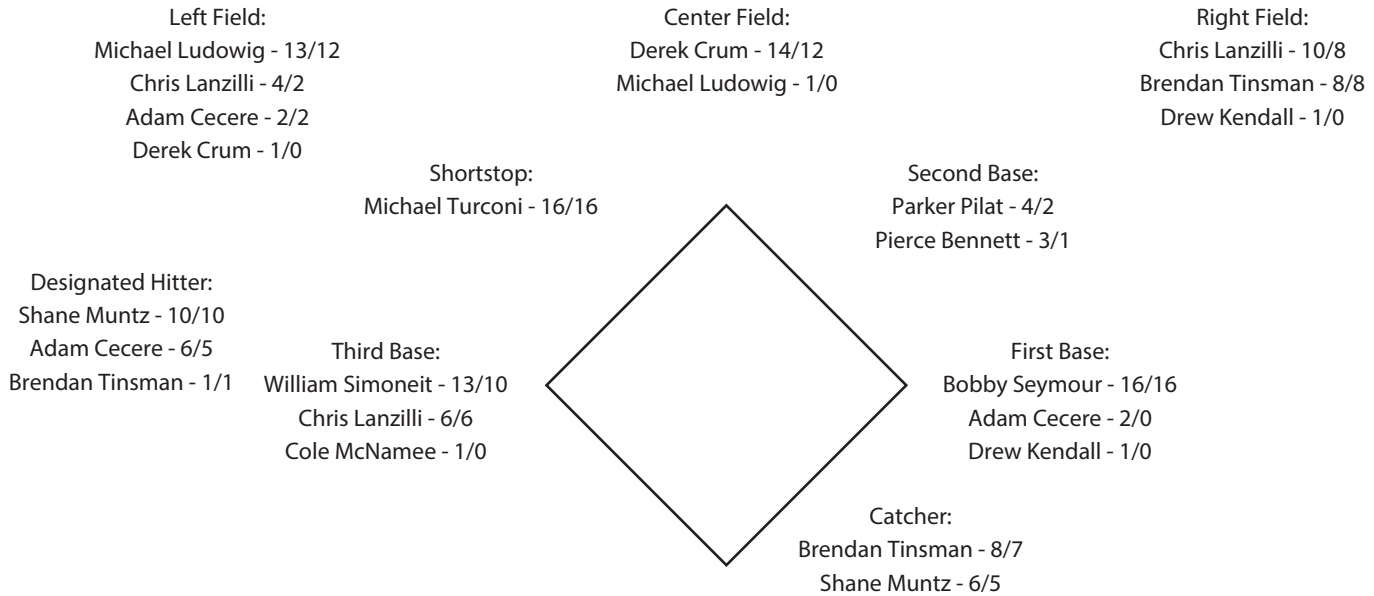

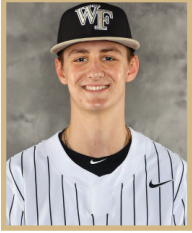
