• Northeastern leads the all-time series 45-44

LAST MEETING: Northeastern 10, UMass 8 (4/3/18)

Kyle Peterson smacked a grand slam to right field with the Huskies trailing 7-5 in the eighth inning to lead Northeastern past UMass in the semifinals of the Beanpot Championship at Friedman Diamond.

Kyle Murphy tossed 2.2 scoreless innings and Sam Jacobsak (Philadelphia Phillies) picked up the win in relief, throwing a scoreless eighth inning.

QUICK HITS

• Northeastern finished the shortened 2020 season as the highest ranked team in the RPI in all of New England at No. 11

• Prior to last year's five-round MLB Draft, two Huskies have been selected in MLB Drafts every year since 2011, including three selections in the 2019 MLB Draft

• Seventh-year head coach Mike Glavine became the third player from Northeastern to make it to the Major Leagues, doing so with the New York Mets in 2003; His brother is MLB Hall of Famer Tom Glavine and they both played for the Mets that season

• Northeastern took the series finale at No. 17 Wake Forest, 14-11, to earn their highest ranked win since defeating then-No. 17 Auburn, 2-1, in 2018 and first ranked win since defeating then-No. 28 Illinois, 8-1, in 2019

• Jared Dupere was named CAA Player of the Week after batting .462 at No. 17 Wake Forest, driving in four runs and going 3-for-4 in the finale with a three-run home run on Feb. 23

LAST TIME OUT

- The Huskies defeated No. 17 Wake Forest, 14-11, in a thrilling series finale on Sunday (2/21)
- **Scott Holzwasser** blasted his second career grand slam to highlight a six-run seventh inning for the Huskies, after the Demon Deacons scored six runs in the bottom of the sixth inning to take the lead
- RHP **Thomas Balboni** earned his first collegiate win in relief, while **Brian Rodriguez**, **Eric Yost** and **Brandon Dufault** were solid to close out the game

HUSKIES PRESEASON FAVORITE TO WIN INAUGURAL CAA NORTH DIVISION

- For the first time since 2003, the Colonial Athletic Association has split the conference into two divisions for 2021, North and South
- Northeastern was the unanimous favorite to win the CAA North Division, receiving 7-of-8 first-place votes (Coaches could not vote for their own team)
- UNCW is the favorite to win the CAA South Division
- The Huskies return preseason All-CAA selections **Ian Fair**, **Scott Holzwasser**, **Jared Dupere** and **Brandon Dufault**, and honorable mention **Kyle Murphy**
- Northeastern won 10 of its last 12 games last season before the season ended abruptly, and finished No. 11 in the final RPI rankings

ON THE BALL

- **Ian Fair** has been one of the top offensive players in the CAA since his arrival on Huntington Avenue
- The 2018 CAA Co-Rookie of the Year, **Fair** led the team with eight home runs and holds the single-season school record with a 22-game hitting streak in '18 (March 20 - May 2, 2018)
- A native of Walpole, Mass., Fair is a two-time All-CAA selection and all-tournament honoree

DEPTH ON THE MOUND

- The Huskies boast six pitchers that have thrown over 253 innings heading into the 2021 season
- **Kyle Murphy** (2-2, 3.00 ERA / 2020 stats) and **Sebastian Keane** (3-1, 4.50 ERA / 2020 stats) return in the starting rotation and **Cam Schlittler** (1-0, 1.32 ERA / 2020 stats) enters the weekend rotation

• This will be one of the deepest pitching staffs that Coach Glavine has had which will provide many options out of the bullpen this season

• Seniors **Brian Rodriguez** (2.38 ERA, 1 save / 2020 stats) and **David Stiehl** (1-0, 3.55 ERA / 2020 stats) will start the season throwing out of the bullpen and combined for seven wins in 2019

• Power arm **Brandon Dufault** (0.97 ERA, 4 saves / 2020 stats) will be the closer and features an electric fastball that touches 97; He finished last season 4-for-4 in save opportunities and 17th in the country

COACH GLAVINE REACHES 160 WINS

• **Mike Glavine** enters his seventh season at the helm for the #HowlinHuskies, and picked up his 160th win in program history at No. 17 Wake Forest, 14-11

• Coach Glavine reached the 150-win plateau in the 10-0 win over USF on Feb. 22, 2020 in the opening game of the series

• The Huskies earned their first-ever at-large bid to the NCAA Regional in 2018 under Glavine's direction

• The 160 wins during this six-plus year stretch is the most by any Northeastern team over that period of time

• Glavine was voted by his peers across the country as one of the 'most underrated College Baseball Coaches' in an article by **Baseball America** in April 2020

HOLZWASSER STREAK

• **Scott Holzwasser** has reached base safely in 21 consecutive games, dating back to the 2019 season, and is preseason All-CAA

• The fifth-year infielder has been a staple in the starting lineup for the Huskies, and ranks fifth all-time in stolen bases with 60

• A native of Sudbury, Mass., Holzwasser was named NCBL MVP after batting .444

TEDDY BALLGAME

• Junior catcher **Teddy Beaudet** was named CAA Player of the Week after batting .423 in the final weekend of 2020, including two doubles and a home run on Tuesday, March 10

• Beaudet recorded a base hit in 9-of-11 games to end the year, and finished 3-for-4 with four runs scored in the 17-7 win over Eastern Michigan (3/1)

• A 5-foot-11 native of Franklin, N.H., Beaudet drove in four runs over the weekend and helped the Huskies win seven straight games

NEWCOMERS EXPECTED TO SHINE

• **Ben Malgeri** had a tremendous summer in the Futures League and earned Defensive MVP

• A transfer from New Mexico Junior College, Malgeri hit four home runs in 18 games before the season was canceled, batting .314; He played his freshman season at Holy Cross, up the road from Northeastern, and earned Rookie of the Year with a .282 batting average

• **Max Viera** is a very talented incoming freshman that can hit for power and to all fields

• A native of Greenwood Lake, N.Y., Viera recorded a hit in every game at No. 17 Wake Forest, hitting .357 in the opening weekend

THE GLAVINE FILE

Mike Glavine – the two-time CAA Coach of the Year (2017, 2018), 2018 NEIBA (New England) Coach of the Year and 2018 ABCA/Diamond Northeast Region Coach of the Year – enters his seventh season as head coach of the Northeastern baseball team and 15th season overall with the program.

Glavine led the Huskies to a final RPI ranking of No. 11 in 2020, before the season was canceled due to the global pandemic Coronavirus. Baseball America did a vote by coaches around the country in April 2020 and Coach Glavine earned the fourth-most votes as the 'most underrated College Baseball Coach' (story here). He earned his 150th win at Northeastern in a 10-0 victory over South Florida (2/22/20) as the Huskies picked up series wins against USF and Florida Atlantic before the season was halted.

Glavine has guided Northeastern to consecutive CAA regular-season titles during 2017 and 2018 – the Huskies' first within any conference since 2005 (America East). He has also led the Huskies back to the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2003, earning an at-large bid during 2018 after winning a program record, 36 games, including the program's first three victories against the SEC, and attaining a top-40 RPI.

Since Glavine took over the baseball program, the Huskies have won a program-best 159 games over a six-year stretch. The Huskies have never had a losing season inside the CAA under Glavine's guidance, and Cleveland Indians' hurler Aaron Civale earned All-America honors in 2016. A total of 24 players have garnered all-league honors and NU has never finished lower than fifth during Glavine's tenure.

A native of Billerica, Mass., Glavine spent four years as a player at Northeastern and left as one of the most prolific hitters in the Huskies' history. Glavine graduated having hit 28 career home runs and accumulated 110 career RBIs, ranking him third and ninth at the time, respectively, in school history. The left-handed slugger also walked 120 times during his four seasons at NU, ranking him second all-time upon completing his final collegiate campaign.

After graduating from Northeastern, Glavine spent 10 seasons in professional baseball after being drafted by the Cleveland Indians during 1995, alternating between AA and AAA levels. During September 2003, the New York Mets called Glavine up to the major leagues, where he played with his older brother and MLB Hall of Famer, Tom. Glavine became the third Northeastern alumni to ever play in the major leagues, joining George Yankowski (1942, 1949) and Carlos Pena (2001-14).
