OPENING TIP

• **Bill Coen's** 250 wins at Northeastern matches the all-time record set by Jim Calhoun from 1972-86; He is second all-time in CAA history with 171 wins in league regular season and postseason play

• Northeastern ranks second among New England schools in the latest RPI rankings (as of 3/5) at #83, behind #46 UConn, and ahead of #106 Providence, #149 Vermont, #168 UMass, #175 Rhode Island, #191 Boston University and #268 Boston College; *The Huskies are the top-ranked team in the CAA in the RPI with JMU second at #116*

• The Huskies have a league-best five championship game appearances since 2013, winning in '15 and '19, and are trying to become the fourth team in CAA history to play in four straight title games; *The Huskies are 11-4 (.733) in the tournament since 2015*

CAA Defensive Player of the Year/First-Team All-CAA

• **Tyson Walker** led the CAA in steals per game (2.24) and ranks 18th nationally; He led the CAA in league games with 19.3 points and 2.5 steals per game, and finished No. 3 in assists per game (5.1)

CAA Sixth Man of the Year/All-Rookie Team

• **Jahmyl Telfort** is second among all freshmen in the CAA with 10.6 points per game, tallying double-figures in 9-of-16 games this season

• Northeastern has seven players born outside the United States, third-most in the country behind Maine's 11 and Cal Baptist's eight

• The Huskies rank 319-of-343 active D1 teams in the country in terms of experience with just three upper classmen and no seniors (*KenPom.com*); This is the first time in head coach **Bill Coen's** 15 years that he has coached a team without a senior (*Last team to not have a senior was 2002-03*)

• The Huskies lost 70% of their scoring from a season ago, and replaced it with freshmen and sophomores that account for 65% of the team's offense

• Northeastern played the 17th-toughest non-conference schedule (*per ESPN's College Basketball Power Index*)

NORTH CAROLINA 82, NORTHEASTERN 62

Game 17 | Dean Smith Center | Chapel Hill, N.C.

Tyson Walker scored a game-high 27 points and **Coleman Stucke** finished with 14 to lead Northeastern in a tough 82-62 defeat to North Carolina in a rare February non-conference game inside the Dean Dome.

Stucke reached double figures for the first time in 10 games, making a career-high 4-of-8 3-pointers.

The Tar Heels used a 13-2 run over the final five minutes of the first half to take a 41-30 lead at the break. Walker led all scorers with 21 in the opening 20 minutes and became the first player to score 20 or more points in the first half against UNC since 2017.

Northeastern would get as close as nine points in the second half, but the Tar Heels continued to dominate the glass, finishing with 17 offensive rebounds and 18 second-chance points, to prevent any sort of comeback in the second half for the Huskies. UNC's Garrison Brooks finished with 11 points and 13 rebounds, while Day'Ron Sharpe led the Tar Heels with 15 points.

- A native of Westbury, N.Y., Walker has reached double figures (34 in his career) in 14 straight games and leads the league with two 30-point games
- His 36 points at Towson (2/13) ranks second in the CAA this season and 13th-best in NU single-game history
- Walker dished out a career-high nine assists at Hofstra (1/7) and has a career-best five steals three times this season

TELFORT EARNS CAA SIXTH MAN OF THE YEAR AWARD

- Freshman **Jahmyl Telfort** has been one of the top newcomers in the CAA and becomes the second NU player to earn Sixth Man of the Year, joining former standout Bolden Brace who earned the distinction in the first year of the recognition in 2017
- A native of Boucherville, Quebec, Telfort is a league-best three-time CAA Rookie of the Week (12/14, 1/4, 1/25) and ranks second in the CAA in scoring among freshmen
- He has reached double figures in 9-of-16 games, and has a pair of 20-point games

Since the beginning of October, Nigerians have taken to the streets to protest police brutality in their country. Young people in particular are mobilizing in major Nigerian cities, calling for the abolition of the SARS special police task force that has been operating for more than two decades. The task force, which is under government jurisdiction, has been accused of inflicting severe human rights violations on its citizens. And people have had enough.

The **#EndSARS** hashtag dates back to at least 2017, when people began using it online share their experiences of violence and assault at the hands of SARS. This most recent protest was launched by an October 8 viral video which allegedly showed SARS officers killing a young man in one of the country's southern states. While authorities have denied that the video is real, according to Al Jazeera, the man who filmed it has been arrested, leading to more outrage from citizens. And this recent round of mass protests has led to further violence against the protestors themselves, including 25 people who were shot in Lagos, Nigeria while demonstrating on October 21, with an unnamed witness telling BBC News that soldiers "pulled up... and they started firing directly" at protestors. An investigation by Amnesty International also found that Nigerian army and police killed at least 12 peaceful protesters on October 20.

In addition to protesting police brutality, demonstrators are also speaking out against Nigeria's bad governance, citing grievances such as poor educational opportunities for citizens.

#24 SHAQUILLE WALTERS says ...

THE COEN FILE

Bill Coen enters his 15th season as head coach of the Northeastern basketball program. He is currently tied in school history with 250 wins with legendary former head coach Jim Calhoun's 250 from 1972-86, and second all-time in CAA history with 171 CAA wins (league+postseason), trailing Miami (FL) head coach Jim Larranaga's 183 wins at Georgia Mason from 1998-2011.

Coen is widely regarded for his ability to evaluate and develop talented players. In his 15 seasons at Northeastern, Huskies have earned 34 All-CAA honors, including 11 first-team accolades and nine All-Rookie selections. A total of 25 of Coen's former players have earned professional contracts and 12 Huskies remain active in professional basketball.

Coen's teams have remained the most consistent in the CAA. The Huskies have finished .500 or better in 12 of Coen's 15 seasons at the helm, including back-to-back 14-win seasons in 2017-18 and 2018-19. Northeastern has appeared in the CAA tournament quarterfinals in 14 of 15 seasons under Coen, advanced to the semifinals eight times, and to the title game five times, including three straight appearances (2018-20) and two titles (2015, '19). Since Coen took the reins of the Northeastern men's basketball program 15 seasons ago, Northeastern has accomplished the best win percentage among current CAA teams in conference and CAA tournament play.

The Huskies became the fifth program in CAA history to make three straight CAA title game appearances in 2019-20, falling just short to top-seeded Hofstra, 70-61, in Washington, D.C. Northeastern is a CAA-best 11-4 in the league tournament since 2015, and have a pair of NCAA tournament appearances in 2015 and '19.

Northeastern has won a league-best 154 league games during Coen's leadership, and won a CAA-best four regular-season titles since joining the league in 2005-06 (2012-13, 2014-15, 2017-18, 2020-21). The Huskies have appeared in the NCAA postseason in two straight seasons with an NIT appearance in 2018 and NCAA tournament appearance in 2019. The NCAA canceled all winter and spring championships in 2020, immediately following the 2020 CAA Championship.

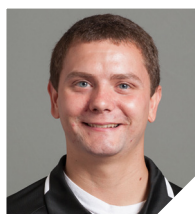
