SERIES WITH MERRIMACK

• Tuesday will be the first-ever meeting between the two programs. Merrimack made the transition to Division I in 2019-20 and this is the Warriors first full baseball season at the D1 level.

LAST TIME OUT: Northeastern earned the sweep over Hofstra with an impressive 13-5 win where **Jared Dupere**, **Ben Malgeri**, **JP Olson** and **Spenser Smith** each homered. **Sebastian Keane** earned the win on the bump, tossing 6.0 innings and striking out eight. **Scott Holzwasser** went 3-for-5 with a team-best three RBIs.

QUICK HITS

- The Huskies lead the CAA in batting (.288), fielding (.979) and pitching (3.31 ERA)
- Northeastern has won 10 of its last 11 games
- NU ranks No. 4 in the NCAA in stolen bases per game (2.5), No. 6 in WHIP (1.13), No. 7 in hits allowed per game (6.88) and 15th in ERA (3.31) and fielding percentage (.979)
- **Scott Holzwasser** has reached base safely in 38 consecutive games and broke the Northeastern HBP record (47)
- **Holzwasser** is second all-time in stolen bases with 69, just eight shy of breaking the all-time record at NU
- **Jared Dupere** has home runs in four of his last five games and ranks third in the CAA with seven on the season
- Prior to last year's five-round MLB Draft, two Huskies have been selected in MLB Drafts every year since 2011, including three selections in the 2019 MLB Draft
- Seventh-year head coach **Mike Glavine** became the third player from Northeastern to make it to the Major Leagues, doing so with the New York Mets in 2003, joining his Hall of Fame brother Tom Glavine on the team and recording a base hit in his final MLB at bat

HUSKIES LEADING THE PACK

- The Huskies lead the CAA for batting average (.288), fielding (.979), pitching (3.31 ERA) and stolen bases (51)
- Northeastern is No. 4 in the country in stolen bases per game (2.5), No. 7 in WHIP (1.13) and hits allowed per 9 innings (6.88) and 16th in ERA
- NU leads the conference with a No. 53 RPI ranking, ahead of No. 88 Hofstra and No. 98 UNCW for the only three that rank inside the top 100
- The Red and Black are the hottest team in the CAA, winning 10 of their last 11 games and lead the CAA North Division at 3-0, a half-game ahead of Towson

HUSKIES PRESEASON FAVORITE TO WIN INAUGURAL CAA NORTH DIVISION

- For the first time since 2003, the Colonial Athletic Association has split the conference into two divisions for 2021, North and South
- Northeastern was the unanimous favorite to win the CAA North Division, receiving 7-of-8 first-place votes (Coaches could not vote for their own team)
- UNCW is the favorite to win the CAA South Division
- The Huskies return preseason All-CAA selections **Ian Fair**, **Scott Holzwasser**, **Jared Dupere** and **Brandon Dufault**, and honorable mention **Kyle Murphy**
- Northeastern won 10 of its last 12 games last season before the season ended abruptly, and finished No. 11 in the final RPI rankings

GOING, GOING, GONE!

- **Jared Dupere** tallied an impressive 1.100 slugging percentage last week, including four home runs and two doubles over five games
- A native of Amesbury, Mass., Dupere hit .400 last week and drove in eight runs
- The redshirt sophomore ranks third in the CAA with seven home runs and is riding a seven-game hitting streak

DEPTH ON THE MOUND

- The Huskies have one of the deepest pitching staffs in the entire CAA
- The weekend starting rotation of **Kyle Murphy** (2-0, 4.45 ERA), **Sebastian Keane** (2-1, 4.91 ERA) and **Cam Schlittler** (2-0, 2.10 ERA) lead the CAA with a combined record of 6-1 and 3.82 ERA
- Joining the rotation on the weekend will be freshman **Wyatt Scotti** with a 3-1 record and 1.38 ERA
- Northeastern rolls out one of the best bullpens as well, highlighted by closer **Brandon Dufault** (1-3, 2 saves) with his 95-plus fastball, and veterans **David Stiehl** (1-1, 0.00 ERA), **Brian Rodriguez** (0-0, 2.53 ERA)

COACH GLAVINE REACHES 170 WINS

• ***Mike Glavine*** enters his seventh season at the helm for the #HowlinHuskies, and picked up his 160th win in program history at No. 17 Wake Forest, 14-11

• Coach Glavine reached the 150-win plateau in the 10-0 win over USF on Feb. 22, 2020 in the opening game of the series

• The Huskies earned their first-ever at-large bid to the NCAA Regional in 2018 under Glavine's direction

• The 173 wins during this six-plus year stretch is the most by any Northeastern team over that period of time

• Glavine was voted by his peers across the country as one of the 'most underrated College Baseball Coaches' in an article by ***Baseball America*** in April 2020

HOLZWASSER STREAK

• ***Scott Holzwasser*** has reached base safely in 38 consecutive games, dating back to the 2019 season, and is preseason All-CAA

• The fifth-year infielder has been a staple in the starting lineup for the Huskies, and ranks second all-time in stolen bases with 69, just eight shy of the all-time record at Northeastern

• Holzwasser batted .429 over the last five games, including stealing 5-of-6 bases, one home run and two doubles

• A native of Sudbury, Mass., Holzwasser was named NCBL MVP after batting .444

NEWCOMERS EXPECTED TO SHINE

• ***Ben Malgeri*** had a tremendous summer in the Futures League and earned Defensive MVP

• A transfer from New Mexico Junior College, Malgeri hit four home runs in 18 games before the season was canceled, batting .314; He played his freshman season at Holy Cross, up the road from Northeastern, and earned Rookie of the Year with a .282 batting average

• Malgeri leads the CAA with 11 stolen bases, No. 52 in the NCAA, and smacked his first home run for the Huskies last weekend at Hofstra (4/10)

• ***Max Viera*** was the hottest hitter in the CAA before getting injured, missing the last eight games

• A freshman from Greenwood Lake, N.Y., Viera is currently on a seven-game hitting streak and has recorded a hit in 10-of-12 games played for Northeastern

• The infielder leads the team with a .378 batting average, and has two doubles, one triple and home run, and a .453 on-base percentage

THE GLAVINE FILE

Mike Glavine – the two-time CAA Coach of the Year (2017, 2018), 2018 NEIBA (New England) Coach of the Year and 2018 ABCA/Diamond Northeast Region Coach of the Year – enters his seventh season as head coach of the Northeastern baseball team and 15th season overall with the program.

Glavine led the Huskies to a final RPI ranking of No. 11 in 2020, before the season was canceled due to the global pandemic Coronavirus. Baseball America did a vote by coaches around the country in April 2020 and Coach Glavine earned the fourth-most votes as the 'most underrated College Baseball Coach' (story here). He earned his 150th win at Northeastern in a 10-0 victory over South Florida (2/22/20) as the Huskies picked up series wins against USF and Florida Atlantic before the season was halted.

Glavine has guided Northeastern to consecutive CAA regular-season titles during 2017 and 2018 – the Huskies' first within any conference since 2005 (America East). He has also led the Huskies back to the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2003, earning an at-large bid during 2018 after winning a program record, 36 games, including the program's first three victories against the SEC, and attaining a top-40 RPI.

Since Glavine took over the baseball program, the Huskies have won a program-best 173 games over a six-year stretch. The Huskies have never had a losing season inside the CAA under Glavine's guidance, and Cleveland Indians' hurler Aaron Civale earned All-America honors in 2016. A total of 24 players have garnered all-league honors and NU has never finished lower than fifth during Glavine's tenure.

A native of Billerica, Mass., Glavine spent four years as a player at Northeastern and left as one of the most prolific hitters in the Huskies' history. Glavine graduated having hit 28 career home runs and accumulated 110 career RBIs, ranking him third and ninth at the time, respectively, in school history. The left-handed slugger also walked 120 times during his four seasons at NU, ranking him second all-time upon completing his final collegiate campaign.

After graduating from Northeastern, Glavine spent 10 seasons in professional baseball after being drafted by the Cleveland Indians during 1995, alternating between AA and AAA levels. During September 2003, the New York Mets called Glavine up to the major leagues, where he played with his older brother and MLB Hall of Famer, Tom. Glavine became the third Northeastern alumni to ever play in the major leagues, joining George Yankowski (1942, 1949) and Carlos Pena (2001-14).
