SERIES WITH TOWSON

• The Huskies lead the all-time series with Towson, 36-27

LAST TIME OUT: Right-handed pitcher Cam Schlittler threw 7.0 scoreless innings, striking out eight, while Jeff Costello, Scott Holzwasser and Spenser Smith drove in runs to lead the Huskies to a 3-0 win over the Tigers. RHP Eric Yost struck out two to get out of a jam in the eighth inning, and Brandon Dufault returned to earn his third save with two strikeouts in the ninth.

- The Huskies are off to their best start in program history at 20-6 and 8-0 in the CAA; Northeastern began the 1991 season 20-6 and finished 35-15 that season
- · Northeastern is riding a 10-game winning streak (#3 in NCAA) and are 16-1 over its last 16 games
- During this winning streak, the Huskies are outscoring opponents 69-25
- NATIONAL RANKINGS: #4 in SB (2.62 per game), #5 in WHIP (1.11), #7 FLD% (.982), K's/9 (10.2) and hits allowed per game (6.84), #9 in ERA (3.08), #37 BA (.291) and #42 OBP% (.390)
- The Huskies are limiting opponents to .208 average, tops in the CAA
- · Holzwasser has reached base safely in a school record 44 consecutive games and broke the Northeastern HBP record (50); His 72 stolen bases are four shy of setting a new all-time school record
- · Jared Dupere earned his third CAA Player of the Week distinction, while Eric Yost was named CAA Rookie of the Week after tallying three saves in the Delaware series
- Prior to last year's five-round MLB Draft, two Huskies have been selected in MLB Drafts every year since 2011, including three selections in the 2019 MLB Draft

HUSKIES LEADING THE PACK

- The Huskies are off to a 8-0 start and hold a three-and-a-half-game lead over Towson at 5-4 in the CAA North Division
- The Huskies lead the CAA in BA (.291), SLG (.427), OBP (.390), SB (68), ERA (3.08) and fielding percentage (.982)
- NU's current 10-game winning streak ranks third-best in the NCAA and is a program-best since winning 11 straight during the 2018 season (April 15-May 4)

DUPERE AND YOST EARN CAA WEEKLY HONORS

- **Jared Dupere** earned his league-best third recognition as CAA Player of the Week after batting .412 (7-for-17) with three home runs, six RBIs, five walks and went 4-for-4 in stolen bases
- *Eric Yost* was named CAA Rookie of the Week for the first time in his young career after going 3-for-3 in saves in a series sweep over Delaware
- A native of Ossining, N.Y., Yost tossed 4.0 scoreless innings last week and was called upon to close after dominant closer *Brandon Dufault* was unavailable last weekend

GOING, GOING, GONE!

- **Jared Dupere** leads the CAA with a .717 slugging percentage and ranks second with 10 home runs
- A native of Amesbury, Mass., Dupere leads the CAA with three CAA Player of the Week distinctions (2/23, 4/18, 4/27) and has seven home runs over his last 14 games for the Huskies

STREAKING

- **Scott Holzwasser** has reached base safely in a program-best 44 consecutive games, dating back to the 2019 season, and ranks second all-time in school history with 72 stolen bases, just four shy of the all-time record
- The Huskies are riding a 10-game winning streak, which ranks seventh-best in school history
- The school record for longest winning streak is 20 straight wins during the 1991 season where Northeastern also started 20-6 and finished 35-15

DEPTH ON THE MOUND

- The Huskies have one of the deepest pitching staffs in the entire CAA
- The weekend starting rotation of *Kyle Murphy* (3-0, 3.67 ERA), *Sebastian Keane* (3-1, 4.84 ERA) and *Cam Schlittler* (4-0, 1.68 ERA) lead the CAA with a combined record of 10-1

- Joining the rotation on the weekend will be freshman *Wyatt Scotti* with a 3-1 record and 1.71 ERA
- Northeastern rolls out one of the best bullpens as well, highlighted by closer *Brandon Dufault* (1-3, 3 saves) with his 95-plus fastball, and veterans *David Stiehl* (1-1, 2.53 ERA) and *Brian Rodriguez* (0-0, 1.84 ERA), along with freshman *Eric Yost* (1-0, 0.63 ERA, 3 saves)
- Also out of the pen will be young guns *Thomas Balboni* (1-0, 2.45 ERA), *James Quinlivan* (2-0, 1.17 ERA, 1 save) and *Owen Langan* (0-0, 13.50 ERA)

COACH GLAVINE APPROACHING 180 WINS

- *Mike Glavine* enters his seventh season at the helm for the #HowlinHuskies, and picked up his 160th win in program history at No. 17 Wake Forest, 14-11
- Coach Glavine currently has 179 wins which is the most by any coach in program history over a seven-year stretch
- The Huskies earned their first-ever at-large bid to the NCAA Regional in 2018 under Glavine's direction
- Glavine was voted by his peers across the country as one of the 'most underrated College Baseball Coaches' in an article by Baseball America in April 2020

NEWCOMERS EXPECTED TO SHINE

- **Ben Malgeri** had a tremendous summer in the Futures League and earned Defensive MVP
- A transfer from New Mexico Junior College, Malgeri hit four home runs in 18 games before the season was canceled, batting .314;
 He played his freshman season at Holy Cross, up the road from Northeastern, and earned Rookie of the Year with a .282 batting average
- Malgeri is third in the CAA with 14 stolen bases
- Max Viera was the hottest hitter in the CAA before getting injured, missing 11 games
- A freshman from Greenwood Lake, N.Y., Viera has reached base in 13 of the 14 games he has played

HUSKIES PRESEASON FAVORITE TO WIN INAUGURAL CAA NORTH DIVISION

- For the first time since 2003, the Colonial Athletic Association has split the conference into two divisions for 2021, North and South
- Northeastern was the unaminous favorite to win the CAA North Division, receiving 7-of-8 first-place votes (Coaches could not vote for their own team)
- UNCW is the favorite to win the CAA South Division
- The Huskies return preseason All-CAA selections *Ian Fair, Scott Holzwasser, Jared Dupere* and *Brandon Dufault,* and honorable mention *Kyle Murphy*
- Northeastern won 10 of its last 12 games last season before the season ended abruptly, and finished No. 11 in the final RPI rankings

THE GLAVINE FILE

Mike Glavine – the two-time CAA Coach of the Year (2017, 2018), 2018 NEIBA (New England) Coach of the Year and 2018 ABCA/Diamond Northeast Region Coach of the Year – enters his seventh season as head coach of the Northeastern baseball team and 15th season overall with the program.

Glavine led the Huskies to a final RPI ranking of No. 11 in 2020, before the season was canceled due to the global pandemic Coronavirus. Baseball America did a vote by coaches around the country in April 2020 and Coach Glavine earned the fourth-most votes as the 'most underrated College Baseball Coach' (story here). He earned his 150th win at Northeastern in a 10-0 victory over South Florida (2/22/20) as the Huskies picked up series wins against USF and Florida Atlantic before the season was halted.

Glavine has guided Northeastern to consecutive CAA regular-season titles during 2017 and 2018 – the Huskies' first within any conference since 2005 (America East). He has also led the Huskies back to the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2003, earning an at-large bid during 2018 after winning a program record, 36 games, including the program's first three victories against the SEC, and attaining a top-40 RPI.

Since Glavine took over the baseball program, the Huskies have won a program-best 179 games over a six-year stretch. The Huskies have never had a losing season inside the CAA under Glavine's guidance, and Cleveland Indians' hurler Aaron Civale earned All-America honors in 2016. A total of 24 players have garnered all-league honors and NU has never finished lower than fifth during Glavine's tenure.

A native of Billerica, Mass., Glavine spent four years as a player at Northeastern and left as one of the most prolific hitters in the Huskies' history. Glavine graduated having hit 28 career home runs and accumulated 110 career RBIs, ranking him third and ninth at the time, respectively, in school history. The left-handed slugger also walked 120 times during his four seasons at NU, ranking him second all-time upon completing his final collegiate campaign.

After graduating from Northeastern, Glavine spent 10 seasons in professional baseball after being drafted by the Cleveland Indians during 1995, alternating between AA and AAA levels. During September 2003, the New York Mets called Glavine up to the major leagues, where he played with his older brother and MLB Hall of Famer, Tom. Glavine became the third Northeastern alumni to ever play in the major leagues, joining George Yankowski (1942, 1949) and Carlos Pena (2001-14).
