FERNIE FLAMAN HEAD COACH | THIRD SEASON

On June 30, 2021, Jerry Keefe was named the 11th Fernie Flaman Head Men's Hockey Coach in Northeastern history and is in his 13th season overall on Huntington Avenue.

In the first two seasons with Keefe at the helm, Northeastern has set a 42-26-6 record. Last season, Keefe saw the Huskies to their fourth Beanpot title in five years, while the 2021-22 Huskies saw one of their best seasons in recent history, going 25-13-1 overall, 15-9-1 in Hockey East play to claim the program's first-ever Hockey East regular season championship. Keefe's first two seasons produced five All-Americans, the first-ever two-time Richter Award winner, a Hockey East Player of the Year, a Hockey East Goaltender of the Year and several other Hockey East accolades including the Bob Kullen Award for Hockey East's Coach of the Year in 2022.

Keefe spent the previous seven seasons as associate head coach helping the Huskies to three straight Beanpot championships, three NCAA tournament appearances, two Hockey East titles and one Belpot championship in the Friendship Four in Belfast, Northern Ireland. Additionally, Northeastern's power play was No. 1 in Hockey East at nearly 27 percent under Keefe's tutelage two seasons ago.

Along with his role with Northeastern, Keefe was selected to coach with the United States National Junior Team from 2018-20, helping Team USA win the silver medal in 2019. During the World Junior Championships, Keefe worked with fellow Huskies Tyler Madden (LA Kings), Cayden Primeau (Montreal Canadiens) and Jordan Harris (Montreal Canadiens).

Before Northeastern, Keefe established himself as a notable name in the New England college hockey ranks, making stops as an assistant coach at UMass Boston (2006-07) and a head coach at Westfield State (2008-09), before his two seasons as an assistant coach at Brown University (2009-11). He resurrected Westfield State's hockey program and led the Owls to a runner-up finish in the Massachusetts State Collegiate Athletic Conference (MASCAC) for the first time since 1981.

Keefe was a four-year center with Providence College from 1996 to 2000 and finished with 98 points (30 goals, 68 assists) in 102 career games. After leading the Friars with 52 points in 37 games, the highest single-season point total in 15 years, Keefe was honored as New England's Most Improved Player (1998-99). Upon graduation, Keefe's professional hockey career started at the end of the 2000 season with the Cincinnati Mighty Ducks (AHL) and Trenton Titans (ECHL). He spent five seasons playing professional hockey, including a pair of seasons in Europe, before retiring in 2004.

A native of Billerica, Mass., Keefe was a three-time All-Scholastic player and a member of a state championship team at Matignon High School, earning Massachusetts Player of the Year honors in 1993. Prior to enrolling at Providence, Keefe also played for the U.S. National Under-17 Team that won a silver medal in Tokyo, Japan in 1994 and the U-16 team that went 4-0 in Switzerland.

Mike Levine enters his third season on the Northeastern hockey staff in 2023-2024. He was named associate head coach by Fernie Flaman Men’s Hockey Head Coach Jerry Keefe on August 3, 2021 after a five-year stint with Vegas Golden Knights of the NHL.

A native of Sandwich, Massachusetts, Levine has previously served as an assistant at Brown University and led preparatory school programs in New Hampshire.

Jason GUERRIERO

ASSISTANT COACH | SECOND SEASON

Jason Guerriero enters his second season with the Huskies for the 2023-24 slate. On July 18, 2022, Fernie Flaman Head Coach Jerry Keefe has announced that Jason Guerriero '05 would return to the Northeastern men's ice hockey program to serve as an assistant coach.

In his first year with the Huskies coaching staff, Guerriero assisted in NU's recruiting along with helping the forwards and defense with on ice skill development. Guerriero was also in charge of the Penalty Kill this year where the Huskies finished first in Hockey East and seventh in the country.

Guerriero, a four-year student-athlete for the Huskies from 2001-2005, returns to Huntington Avenue after coaching at Brown University for the past seven years. He spent four seasons as an assistant coach before being promoted to Associate Head Coach in 2019. Before Brown he coached at Yale, where he helped lead the Bulldogs to an NCAA Tournament appearance in 2014-15. In addition to his coaching duties, Guerriero played an active role in recruiting and the power play units. Before arriving at Yale, Guerriero spent two seasons as an assistant at Holy Cross, where he helped the Crusaders to back-to-back 20+ win seasons. He was in charge of the power play and recruiting efforts.

As a collegiate player, Guerriero put together an impressive four-year career at Northeastern, capped by a standout senior season when he led Hockey East in scoring, becoming the first-ever Northeastern player to do so. His senior year, he tabbed First Team All-American honors. The team captain posted 49 goals and 147 career points, highlighted by a career-high 17 goals and 48 points in 2004-05. He ranks 13th all-time among Northeastern scoring leaders. He was also named a Hockey East First Team All-Star, Northeastern's Male Athlete of the Year and Rookie of the Year and Hockey East's Len Ceglarski Sportsmanship Award winner. Guerriero, who was later named to the Hockey East 25th Anniversary All-Northeastern team and was also a New England Hockey All-Star and a Walter Brown Award runner-up.

Before moving on to coaching, Guerriero enjoyed a six-year professional career, including two seasons with the AHL Milwaukee Admirals where he posted 23 goals and 52 assists for 75 points in 137 games. He also played overseas in Finland, Austria, Switzerland, Germany and Denmark.



Brian MAHONEY-WILSON

ASSISTANT COACH | FIRST SEASON

Brian Mahoney-Wilson enters his first year with the Huskies, serving as an assistant coach for the Northeastern Men's hockey team as announced by Fernie Flaman Head Coach Jerry Keefe ahead of the 2023-24 season.

Mahoney-Wilson spent the past seven seasons as a goaltending coach for the AHL's Grand Rapids Griffins, working with notable NHL goaltenders Jimmy Howard, Magnus Hellberg, Alex Nedeljkovic, Calvin Pickard, and Kevin Poulin.

Prior to his time with the Griffins, he spent two years coaching division I college hockey with the University of Notre Dame during the 2015-16 season and with Army for the 2014-15 stint.

The San Jose Sharks draft pick (9th., 288th) played four years for Lake Superior State University from 2007-2011. He played in 99 games for the Lakers, recording a .905 save percentage, a 2.94 goals against average and three shutouts.

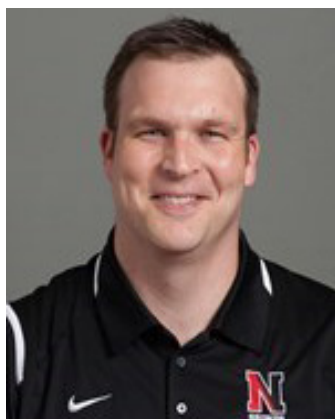
Following graduation, Mahoney-Wilson played three seasons in the CHL with the Allen Americans, Missouri Mavericks, and Bloomington Blaze.

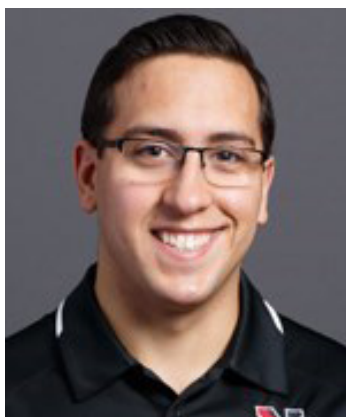

AIDAN McDONOUGH SIGNS WITH CANUCKS

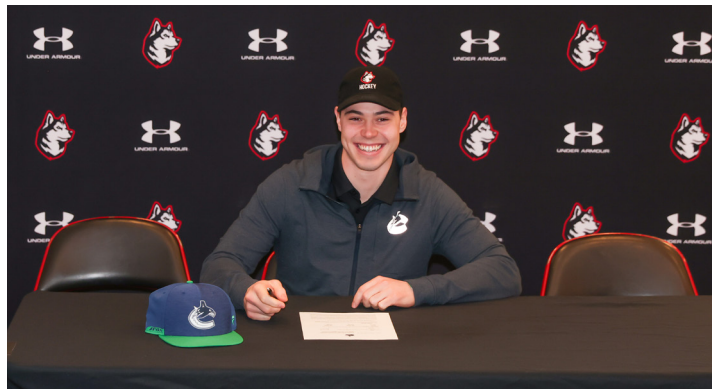
Aidan McDonough signed a two-year, entry-level contract with the Vancouver Canucks. McDonough, a native of Milton, Mass. wrapped up his fourth season as a Husky, serving as team captain. McDonough was a key presence for Northeastern, helping claim two Beanpot Championships, the program's first Hockey East Regular Season Championship, and a NCAA Tournament bid in 2022.

"Playing at Northeastern for the last four years has been a dream come true," said McDonough. "Huge thank you to my teammates, the coaching staff, the support staff, and everyone else involved in the university. It's been the best four years of my life. I'm super grateful to have been a Northeastern Husky."

He was named a Hockey East First Team All-Star team twice in his career and was a two-time Hobey Baker Nominee. McDonough also tabbed a New England Division I All-Star by the New England Hockey Writers Association in the 2021-22 and 2022-23 seasons. He finished his collegiate career with 124 appearances for Northeastern with 66 goals, 58 assists, for 124 points.

In his senior campaign, McDonough tallied 38 points in just 34 games played with 20 goals and 18 assists, including eight power-play goals. He finished as the active NCAA career leader in both goals (66) and power-play goals (29). Additionally, McDonough tallied the game-winning shootout goal to help the Huskies to their eighth Beanpot title overall, and fourth in the last five years.

McDonough is yet another member of the Northeastern men's hockey program to make an NHL roster, joining current NHLers Jordan Harris '22 (Montreal Canadiens), Jérémy Davies '19 (Nashville), Cayden Primeau '19 (Montreal Canadiens), Adam Gaudette '18 (Ottawa), Zach Aston-Reese '17 (Anaheim), Josh Manson '14 (Colorado), and Matt Benning '16 (Nashville).





JAYDEN STRUBLE SIGNS WITH CANADIENS



Blueliner and assistant captain **Jayden Struble** signed an entry level contract with the Montréal Canadiens, the team announced on March 14, 2023.

“Thank you to everyone at Northeastern for the best four years of my life,” said Struble. “My time as a Husky has meant everything to me. I’ve had the best memories and times of my life here and can’t begin to thank all of Husky Nation enough.”

Struble was a crucial member on Northeastern’s defensive core, appearing in 31 games for the Huskies this season. He posted one goal and 11 assists for 12 points, second-best among Husky defenseman. Struble also blocked 33 shots during the 2022-23 campaign, the third-best mark overall on the Huskies’ roster.

The Cumberland, R.I. native finished his collegiate career appearing in 104 games with 48 points from nine goals and 39 assists. In four years, he tallied 78 blocks, a plus-19 rating and one game-winning goal. He helped see Northeastern to two Beanpot titles, the program’s first-ever Hockey East Regular Season Championship and a berth to the 2022 NCAA tournament.

Struble will join former Husky and teammate Jordan Harris '19 who is a current defenseman with the Canadiens. Additionally, Struble is the second Husky from the 2022-23 roster to sign with an NHL organization this post-season, with McDonough signing with the Vancouver Canucks.





DEVON LEVI SIGNS WITH SABRES

Devon Levi signed an three-year, entry-level contract with the Buffalo Sabres, the team announced on March 17, 2023.

Levi was the backbone to Northeastern's team, appearing in 34 games for the Huskies last season. The Dollard-des-Ormeaux, Quebec native started in 23 Hockey East games for the Huskies. He posted a 14-6-3 record, making 753 saves, a league-high, and allowing 42 goals (.947 save%, 1.81 GAA; both league highs). He posted six shutouts in conference play (1st in Hockey East).

The junior goaltender finished his collegiate career appearing in 66 games. His .942 save percentage and a 1.90 goals against average finished first in program history. Devon has also notched his name in the Northeastern record books as his 16 career shutouts set the Northeastern record, passing former goaltender Chris Rawlings (2010-13).

Levi also holds the single-season shutout record for Northeastern (6). His 28 career wins are sixth overall in Northeastern program history. He helped see Northeastern to the 2023 Beanpot title, where he won tournament MVP and the Eberly award for best tournament save percentage. Additionally, he helped claim the program's first-ever Hockey East Regular Season Championship in 2021-22 and a berth to the 2022 NCAA tournament.

Last season, he was the recipient of the Mike Richter award, the Hockey East Player of the Year award, the Hockey East Goaltender of the Year award, and was named a First Team All-Star. He was also named a Top-10 finalist for the Hobey Baker Memorial award.

Additionally, Levi is third Husky from the 2022-23 roster to sign with an NHL organization during the post-season, with Aidan McDonough signing with the Vancouver Canucks and Jayden Struble signing with the Montréal Canadiens.





LEVI NAMED RICHTER AWARD WINNER & HOCKEY EAST PLAYER/GOALTENDER OF THE YEAR

Devon Levi was the Mike Richter award winner, in addition to tabbing Hockey East Player of the Year and Hockey East Goaltender of the Year honors.

He posted an incredible final season of play for the Huskies, recording a .933 save percentage, a 2.24 goals against average, and posting a 17-12-5 record in net with six shutouts. His save percentage ranked first in the NCAA last season, while his 1,066 saves were third among all college goaltenders.

In Hockey East play, Levi finished with a 1.81 goals against average, a .947 save percentage, six shutouts, 753 saves, 1392:53 minutes played and 14 wins (all league-highs). He also posted 18 games in which the opponent tallied two goals or fewer and had 20 games where he made 30+ saves.

Additionally, he tallied 65 saves and a .956 save percentage en route to claiming the 2023 Beanpot title, earning Tournament MVP and Eberly Award accolades. Levi became the first netminder to win Beanpot MVP since Northeastern's Cayden Primeau in 2019.

During his tenure with Northeastern, Levi re-wrote the Huskies' goaltending record book, setting seven new program records:

Best career goals against average (1.90)
Best career save percentage (.942)

Most career shutouts (16)
Best single season goals against average (1.54)
Best single season save percentage (.952)
Most shutouts in a single season (10)
Most saves in a single game (60)

Levi became the first-ever goaltender to win the Richter award twice in their career, doing so in consecutive seasons. He is the second Husky to receive the honor since its inception in 2014, following Cayden Primeau, who claimed the honor in the 2018-2019 season. Primeau finished that season with a 25-10-1 record, posting .933 save%, 2.09 GAA, and four shutouts.

He was also just the fourth Northeastern player to tab Player of the Year honors, joining Adam Gaudette (2018), Zach Aston-Reese (2017), and Brad Thiessen (2009). He is also the first goaltender to win since Boston College's Spencer Knight following the 2020-21 season. Additionally, he earned the Goaltender of the Year accolade in consecutive seasons, the first to do so since Primeau in 2018 and 2019.

Levi was also a top-10 finalist for the Hobey Baker Award and a two-time New England Division I All-Star while obtaining the following additional Hockey East accolades during the 2022-23 season: a unanimous First Team All-Star, Goaltender of the Month (Feb.), and five Goalie of the Week awards.





MCDONOUGH & LEVI NAMED ALL-AMERICANS



Aidan McDonough and **Devon Levi** were named CCM/AHCA Hockey Division I First Team East All-Americans for their performances on the ice in the 2022-23 season. McDonough and Levi were named to the first team in consecutive years, becoming the first to do so since Bruce Racine (1987, 1988).

McDonough led the Huskies with 20 goals and 38 points in 34 games played while adding 18 assists to the scoresheet. He also led the Hockey East conference in goals (14), power-play goals (6), and posted 88 shots, the second-best mark in the league. He finished as the active NCAA career leader in both goals (66) and power-play goals (29). Additionally, he was named a Hockey East First Team All-Star and a New England Division I All-Star. McDonough, who signed a two-year, entry-level contract with the Vancouver Canucks, made his debut on March 26 and recorded his first NHL goal in his second career game.



Levi posted an incredible final season of play, recording a .933 save percentage, a 2.24 goals against average, and a 17-12-5 record in net with six shutouts. His save percentage ranked first in the NCAA this season. He also posted 30+ saves in 20 outings, including six 40+ save performances and a season-high 54 saves against Providence College. He also named the Mike Richter Award recipient, Hockey East Player of the Year, Goaltender of the Year, a First Team All-Star, Hobey Baker Top-10 finalist, Beanpot Tournament MVP, and Eberly Award recipient. Most recently, Levi signed a three-year, entry-level contract with the Buffalo Sabres and made his debut on March 31, claiming his first NHL victory.



HRYCKOWIAN & McDONALD TAB HOCKEY EAST POSTSEASON AWARDS

Justin Hryckowian and **Hunter McDonald** represented the No. 15/16 Northeastern men's hockey team, earning honors from Hockey East as the league unveiled its preliminary postseason award selections. Hryckowian was named the Gladiator Custom Mouthguards Best Defensive Forward and McDonald earned Best Defensive Defenseman honors.

For the first time in his career, Hryckowian is the Gladiator Custom Mouthguards Best Defensive Forward, posting 29 points in 24 league games. Hryckowian recorded 29 points from a league-high 14 goals and 15 assists. His 319 faceoff wins led the conference in addition to his plus-19 rating and tied for second with four game-winning goals. His 22 blocks on the year edged all Northeastern forwards. This season, Hryckowian was named Hockey East Player of the Week (Nov. 7) and Player of the Month in November. He is the second-ever Husky to be named Best Defensive Forward in program history.

The Hockey East Best Defensive Defenseman, and Pro Ambitions All-Rookie honoree, McDonald kicked off his collegiate career with 11 points this season from 11 assists in 34 games played. The Philadelphia Flyers draft pick led the league with 65 blocked shots and was second in the nation with 91 blocks. McDonald helped guide the Huskies' defensive unit that ranks first in team save percentage (.945), penalty-kill percentage (.874) and allowed the least number of goals (45) in the conference. In his debut season, McDonald is the first-ever freshman to receive Best Defensive Defenseman honors. He was also named the Army ROTC Defender of the Week twice by Hockey East this season.



NORTHEASTERN HISTORY & RECORDS





NCAA TOURNAMENT TEAMS

2016 - It was a tale of two seasons for the 2015-16 Northeastern hockey team, who rebounded from a 1-11-2 start to finish the season 21-3-3, including a 13-game winning streak that was the longest in program history and a 14-game unbeaten streak (13-0-1) that was also the longest in team history, culminating in the program's first Hockey East championship since 1988. After knocking off No. 5/4 Boston College and No. 8 UMass Lowell on consecutive nights to capture the program's second Hockey East title, the Huskies earned the league's automatic berth into the national tournament. Northeastern drew the No. 4 seed in the Midwest Regional and a trip to Cincinnati for a date with North Dakota, the No. 3 overall seed.

Nolan Stevens put the Huskies on top early with his 20th goal of the season just 3:07 into the game, but the Fighting Hawks responded with three goals over the next 11 minutes of the contest. UND added two more goals in the second period before the teams traded tallies in the third, including one from Matt Benning, to send North Dakota to a 6-2 victory over NU. The Fighting Hawks went on to win the national championship, with Northeastern being the only team to hold a lead on North Dakota during the tournament.

2018 - Northeastern returned to the NCAA Tournament for the second time in three seasons during a 2017-18 campaign that saw the Huskies log their most wins since 2009 with a 23-10-5 overall record. Using the program's first Beanpot title in 30 years as a springboard to seven-straight victories down the stretch run of the season, the Huskies earned an at-large bid to the national tournament as the No. 3 seed in the Northeast Regional, earning a matchup with Michigan.

But, despite digging its way out of two one-goal deficits, Northeastern didn't have an answer for Michigan's tally with 4:30 remaining in the game as the Wolverines ended the Huskies' season, 3-2.

Senior Dylan Sikura netted his career-best 22nd goal at 18:04 of the second period, and junior Eric Williams leveled the score at 2-2 at 12:01 of the third period on a lightning-quick wrister from the right boards. Michigan's Cooper Marody scored twice for the Wolverines, including the game-winner at 15:30 of the third as Michigan continued its journey to a Frozen Four appearance.

NCAA TOURNAMENT TEAMS

2019 - Expected by many to be a rebuilding year on Huntington Avenue, the Huskies responded with a record-breaking season in 2018-19. The team finished the year 27-11-1, good for the most victories in single-season history, becoming the 14th team to ever win both the Beanpot and the Hockey East championship in the same season.

The Huskies claimed the No. 2 seed in the NCAA tournament after one of their most successful seasons ever. Paced by outstanding team performances and the Mike Richter Award-winning goaltender Cayden Primeau, the Huskies reached their seventh NCAA tournament, and third in the last four seasons, squaring off against the No. 3 seed Cornell. Northeastern started behind the game early letting up four unanswered goals in the first two periods. After recording a power-play goal from Liam Pecarraro, the Huskies could not climb any closer, ultimately falling 5-1.

Primeau and defenseman Jérémy Davies were both named CCM/ACHA All-Americans prior to signing professional contracts.

2022 - The Huskies earned an at large bid after their groundbreaking 25-13-1 record, going 15-8-1 in Hockey East play to capture the program's first regular season championship. Led by Hockey East First Team All-Stars Jordan Harris, Aidan McDonough, and Devon Levi, the Huskies were the four seed in the Worcester Regional, facing top-seeded and #3 overall seed Western Michigan.

The Broncos took an early 1-0 lead, but the Huskies surged to gain all momentum in the game and culminating in a great individual effort by assistant captain Aidan McDonough, who tied the game with four minutes left in regulation. Hockey East Rookie of the Year Devon Levi made the highlight reel with several top notch saves, ending the game with 34 - one potential highlight-reel save involved him diving back into his crease to catch a shot off a turnover. What was initially called a save was overturned via video replay and called a good goal, giving the Broncos the overtime victory.

McDonough, Levi, and Harris were all named ACHA All-Stars, while Levi went on to win the Mike Richter award and the National Rookie of the Year award. Jordan Harris would go on to sign with the Montreal Canadiens and debut with one goal and a +3 rating in his first 10 games.

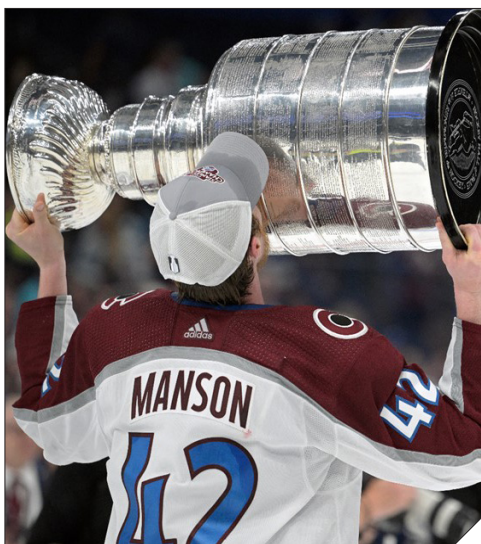

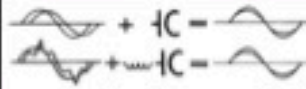
