## FOUR THINGS TO KNOW

1. Northeastern is 21-5 all-time against Colgate as the teams prepare to meet for the third time since the 2021-22 season. The Huskies earned a 78-75 victory against the Raiders last season at Matthews Arena.

2. Senior guard LA Pratt put up a game and career-high 26 points on Monday against Boston University, including 20 points in the second half and overtime. It's the second straight season that Pratt has put up 20+ on Opening Night.

3. Head coach Bill Coen currently sits at 299 career victories, one shy of becoming the 73rd active coach to reach 300 wins, and just the ninth to do it at one school.

4. This season's Northeastern roster features student-athletes from seven different countries: United States, Canada, Germany, Montenegro, Netherlands, Spain, Sweden.

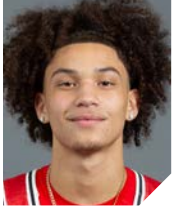

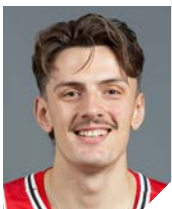

## SETTING THE STAGE

### Series history vs. Colgate

Northeastern is 21-5 all-time against Colgate as the teams prepare to meet for the third time since the 2021-22 season.

The Huskies earned a 78-75 victory against the Raiders last season at Matthews Arena. NU shot 59% in the second half after trailing by as many as 10 in the game before turning it on with a 14-2 run to retake the lead for good and hold on for the win.

### Pratt goes off on Opening Night

For the second straight year, LA Pratt kicked off the season in style with a career night against Boston University. Pratt went for a career-high 26 points, including 20 in the second half and overtime, on 10-of-19 shooting along with a team-high four assists and three steals.

He's the second player in the last 10 years, and first since Jahmyl Telfort, to lead the team in scoring on Opening Night in consecutive seasons.

Pratt played 41:54 in the contest, the second most for any player in the nation in a season opener (Utah Tech's Chance Trujillo; 45:00).

### Pratt collects All-CAA Preseason honors

LA Pratt was named to the All-CAA Preseason Second Team at the conference's annual Media Day in October.

Pratt, the Huskies' leading returning scorer, rebounder and assist man from a year ago, played in 31 games during his first season on Huntington Avenue in 2024-25 finishing fourth on the team in scoring (11.2), third in minutes (31.2) and shooting 43% overall (141-of-328). He reached double figures 15 times, including five 20+ point nights, was third on the team in assists (76) and second in steals (42).

In league play, the Columbus, Ohio native averaged 11.6 points per game (third on team), and went for a career-high 26 points on 10-of-18 shooting overall, 5-of-9 from deep (career-high) in a career-best 39 minutes at Monmouth (Feb. 24).

### Youri's hot start

Senior Youri Fritz made an immediate impact on the Northeastern lineup on Monday, going for a career-high 15 points along with five boards in 28 minutes against Boston University.

Fritz finished the night 6-of-9 from the field, also a career-high for made field goals, including his first collegiate make from beyond the arc.

### Soroa Schaller shines at FIBA U20 Eurobasket 2025

Luca Soroa Schaller represented Switzerland at the FIBA U20 Eurobasket 2025, Division B, helping the team to a fourth-place finish and earning a spot in the All-Star Five.

Soroa Schaller was the tournament's fifth leading scorer and 12th in rebounding averaging 17.1 points, 7.4 rebounds and 2.4 assists in seven games, good for top-three on the team in each category.

### (J)ust (B)uckets

JB Frankel is back for his junior season with the Huskies after a breakout year in 2024-25. The New York, N.Y. native played in 30 games, including 17 starts, with his role increasing throughout the season, averaging 7.3 points overall and 10.7ppg in conference action, shooting 44% from the floor and 40% from three against league opponents.

Frankel reached double figures 11 times, all in league play, and went for a career-high 19 points on 6-of-9 from the floor and a career-best 5-of-6 from deep against Drexel (Jan. 23, 2025).

### Loughnane Legacy

Junior Mike Loughnane joined the Huskies as a transfer from Davidson. As a sophomore in 2024-25, he appeared in 33 games (32 starts), finishing fifth on the team in scoring (5.1ppg).

Loughnane was a three-time captain and is the all-time leading scorer at Boston College High School, where he helped them to a 2022 Massachusetts state championship before being named the 2022 Maxpreps Massachusetts Player of the Year.

His father, Bill, played at Northeastern from 1976-80, and is the program's record holder in single-game assists (15 vs. Delaware on Dec. 29, 1977), and third in team history with 500 assists in 100 games.

Newcomers Xander Alarie and Miles Newton have family legacies of their own.

Alarie's father, Mark, played at Duke and was a first-round NBA draft pick in 1986, while his sister, Bella, played four years at Princeton and was drafted fifth overall by Dallas Wings in 2020 WNBA Draft.

Newton's father, Milt, played basketball at Kansas, helping the Jayhawks to the 1988 national championship before playing professionally overseas. He is currently the assistant general manager of the Milwaukee Bucks.

### The winningest coach in Northeastern history

Head coach Bill Coen moved ahead of Hall of Fame coach Jim Calhoun's 250 wins set from 1972-86 for the all-time Northeastern record with a win vs. William & Mary on Mar. 7, 2021.

Coen became the winningest coach CAA history in 2023-24, reaching 184 regular season and postseason wins, passing George Mason's Jim Larranaga.

Coen is the longest tenured coach in the CAA, and one of the longest tenured in all of Division I men's basketball (see right).

He currently sits at 299 career wins, one shy of becoming the 73rd active coach to reach 300 victories, and just the ninth to do it at one school (see right).

### Keeping it in the family

With Matt Janning, Brian McDonald and Joel Smith on the bench in 2025-26, Northeastern is one of just a few schools in the country to have all three assistant coaches play for the head coach at the same school.

Additionally Patrick Isberg, now in his second season as the Director of Operations, was a student manager for the Huskies before graduating in 2023 and working as a graduate manager in 2023-24.

### Jahmyl Telfort Signs Two-Way Contract With LA Clippers

Former Northeastern standout Jahmyl Telfort signed a two-way contract with the Los Angeles Clippers, the team announced on Oct. 18.

Telfort spent three seasons at Northeastern, appearing in 79 games (62 starts) and averaging 13.9 points per game, 3.7 rebounds per game and shooting 43% overall.

He joined the LA Clippers for NBA 2K26 Summer League action in July before earning a spot on the Training Camp roster this fall, appearing in three preseason games.

He made his NBA debut on Oct. 28.

## HISTORIC MATTHEWS ARENA

Matthews Arena is home to Northeastern basketball. The arena, which opened on April 16, 1910, is the oldest active men's basketball arena in the nation. Located on the east end of the Northeastern campus, the hallowed hall was the original home of Boston's beloved Celtics and Bruins and was the birthplace of the Celtics' famed parquet floor.

• Northeastern has a strong list of coaches that have achieved high success while at NU and after:

**Jim Calhoun (1972-86)** - Led the Huskies to 250 wins, five NCAA tournament appearances and recruited first-round NBA draft pick Reggie Lewis, taken 22nd overall by the Boston Celtics

- Won three national titles at UConn where he coached from 1986-2012; Made his return to coaching at Division III Saint Joseph (CT) in 2018 before retiring in 2021

**Dave Leitao (1984-86)** - Served as an assistant coach on Calhoun's staff that made NCAA tournament appearances in all three seasons he was there (*Played basketball at NU from 1978-82*)

- Became the first African-American head coach at Virginia in 2005 and spent four seasons with the Cavaliers, leading UVA to the NCAA postseason in 3-of-4 seasons in 2006 (NIT), 2007 (NCAA Second Round) and 2008 (CBI Semis)
- Served two stints with DePaul as head coach (2002-05, '15-21), leading the Blue Demons to postseason appearances in three seasons (2 NIT, 1 NCAA) during his first stint and the CBI championship game in 2019

**Jay Young (1990-92, '96-2000)** - Had two different stints on the coaching staff at Northeastern, helping the Huskies to the 1991 NCAA tournament

- Is currently in his second stint as an assistant coach at Rutgers (2016-19) after spending four seasons as the head coach at Fairfield (2019-23).

**Pat Skerry (1998-2000)** - Spent two seasons on the Northeastern coaching staff under head coach Rudy Keeling

- Towson named Skerry their head coach in 2011 and was named the 2022-23 Skip Prosser Man of the Year and is a two-time CAA Coach of the Year
- Led the Tigers to their winningest season in school history in 2021-22, winning a share of the CAA Regular Season championship and earning the program's first-ever invitation to the NIT.
- The Tiger also won the CAA regular season title in 2024-25.

**Ron Everhart (2001-06)** - Led the Huskies to 19 or more victories in his final three seasons and a runner-up finish in America East with a 15-3 record in 2005-06, finishing 21-10 overall and making their first postseason appearance in 14 seasons with an NIT bid

- Took over as head coach at Duquesne (2006-12) and was an assistant coach at West Virginia (2012-23) where the Mountaineers have made three Sweet Sixteen appearances

**Frank Martin (2000-04)** - Served on Ron Everhart's staff, helping the Huskies become one of the top teams in America East

- Became the head coach at Kansas State (2007-12) and led the Wildcats to an Elite Eight appearance in the NCAA tournament in 2010;
- Coached at South Carolina (2012-2022) where he led the Gamecocks to their first-ever Final Four appearance in 2017
- Currently the head coach at Massachusetts

**Richard Pitino (2005-06)** - Spent two seasons as an assistant coach on Ron Everhart's staff, following him to Duquesne

- Named head coach at Minnesota in 2013 spent eight seasons with the Golden Gophers, leading UM to the NIT championship in 2014 and NCAA tournament appearances in 2013, '17 and '19
- After spending four seasons at the helm of New Mexico, leading the Lobos to two NCAA appearances, he was named the head coach at Xavier on March 25, 2025.

**Pat Duquette (2010-13)** - Worked with **Bill Coen** at Boston College and joined the Northeastern staff as Associate Head Coach in 2010

- Named UMass Lowell's head coach in 2013 and helped transition the River Hawks to Division I that season, reaching the America East championship game in 2024

**David McLaughlin (2013-16)** - Worked on **Bill Coen's** staff as associate head coach and part of the 2015 NCAA tournament squad that pushed Notre Dame to the final seconds in the opening round

- Named Dartmouth's head coach in 2016, and is currently in his 10th season with the Big Green.

**Chris Markwood (2014-21)** - Worked on **Bill Coen's** staff as assistant coach for four seasons before being elevated to associate head coach and recruiting coordinator for his final three seasons

- In his stint at Northeastern, Markwood helped guide Northeastern to three 23-win seasons, three CAA regular season titles, two CAA tournament championships, and a pair of trips to the NCAA Tournament.
- Is currently in his fourth season as the head coach at Maine, his alma mater

Bill Coen is the all-time winningest coach in Northeastern and CAA basketball history, and has led the Huskies to four regular-season championships since 2006 and two NCAA tournaments since 2015. Coen has recruited some of the most talented players across the globe, including 28 players that have gone on to play professional basketball.

Coen owns the all-time CAA record with 19 tournament wins and 197 regular season and postseason victories. The Huskies are an impressive 13-9 (.591) in the CAA tournament since 2015, and have advanced to the CAA quarterfinals in all but two of Coen's 19 seasons at the helm.

The Huskies lead the conference with 178 league wins since Coen's arrival in 2005-06, and produced 35 All-CAA first team selections and nine All-Rookie accolades. Northeastern became the fifth program in CAA history to make three consecutive trips to the championship game in 2018, 2019 and 2020, and have advanced to the semifinals in four of the last eight seasons.

**NCAA TOURNAMENTS**

**2015:** The Huskies captured their first-ever CAA tournament championship, defeating No. 1 seed William & Mary, 71-60 in Royal Farms Arena in Baltimore, Md., and Quincy Ford earned Most Valuable Player. Northeastern took on No. 9 Notre Dame in the first round of the NCAA tournament, and the Huskies had the ball in the final seconds with a change to tie or take the lead, but turned it over with two seconds left as the Irish held on to defeat NU, 69-65, in Pittsburgh inside the CONSOL Energy Center.

**2019:** After falling in overtime in the 2018 CAA title game, the Huskies rebounded by defeating the top seed Hofstra in the CAA championship game, 82-74, behind a tremendous performance from tournament MVP Vasa Pusica. The Huskies drew No. 17 Kansas in the opening round out in Salt Lake City, Utah, falling 87-53.

**CAA CHAMPIONSHIP GAMES**

The Huskies lead the conference with five championship game appearances since 2013. Northeastern made three straight title games from 2018-20, and advanced to the semifinal round in each of the last four seasons.

**BOSTON CONNECTIONS**

Coen has built a reputation for success in the Boston area. He came to Northeastern after spending nine seasons coaching at Boston College. A longtime member of head coach Al Skinner's staff, Coen served four years as an assistant coach before being promoted to the role of associate head coach in May 2001.

During Coen's nine years at Boston College, the Eagles posted a 175-108 (.618) overall record and enjoyed six postseason berths, while winning three Big East regular season crowns. In 2000-01, the Eagles went 27-5 and defeated Pittsburgh to take home the school's first-ever Big East Tournament Championship. Between 2000-01 and 2005-06, the Eagles posted the most victories in any six-year span in school history. BC entered the ACC in 2005-06, and made a run to their first NCAA Sweet 16 since the 1991 season in 2006, falling to Villanova in a thrilling overtime game, 60-59.

**RHODE ISLAND**

Prior to his arrival in Boston, Coen worked under Skinner for eight seasons at the University of Rhode Island, six as an assistant coach and two as a graduate assistant. During that time, the Rams enjoyed four seasons of postseason play, heading to the NCAA Tournament in 1993 and 1997, while receiving NIT bids in 1992 and 1996. Combined, the Rams' postseason record while Coen was on staff was 5-4. In 1991, Coen received his MBA from Rhode Island.

**UNDERGRADUATE WORK**

A 1983 graduate of Hamilton College in Clinton, N.Y., Coen played four years for the Continentals, winning three ECAC Championships. As a senior, he served as team captain and led Hamilton to a national ranking.

After graduation, Coen spent three years working in the computer software industry, before accepting his first coaching position at Canajoharie (N.Y.) High School. In his one year as head coach, he led the school to a 19-3 mark and was named Coach of the Year. The following year, he returned to his alma mater and served two seasons as assistant varsity coach and head junior varsity coach. During his tenure, Hamilton compiled a 38-10 mark.

Coen is an active member of the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and resides in Charlestown.

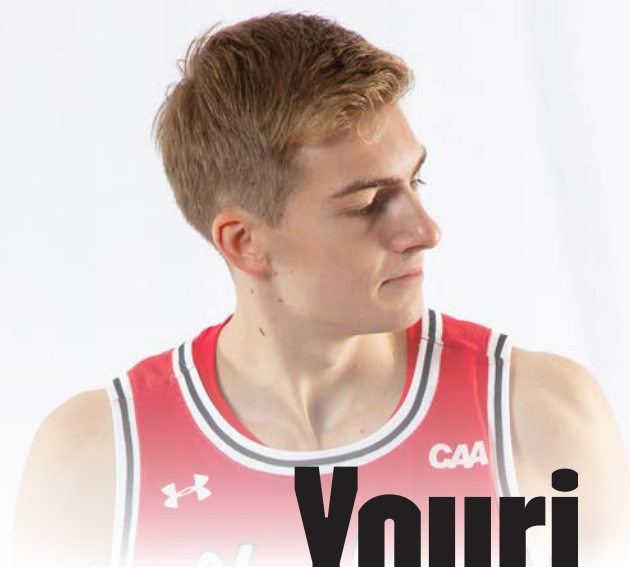

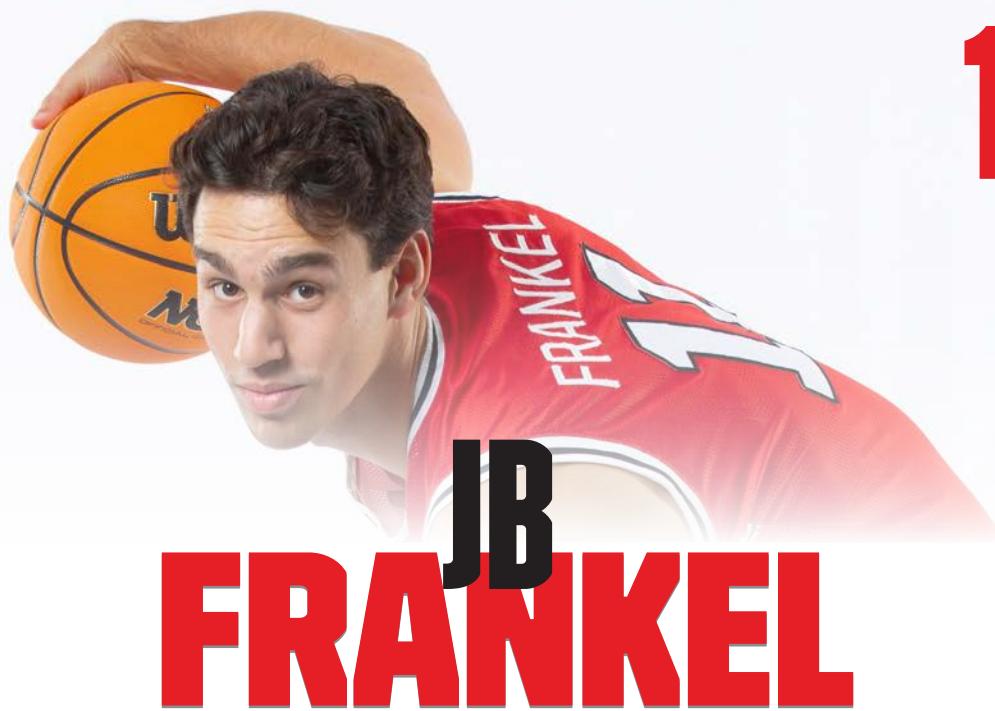

NORTHEASTERN BASKETBALL TELEVISION/RADIO SPOT CHART



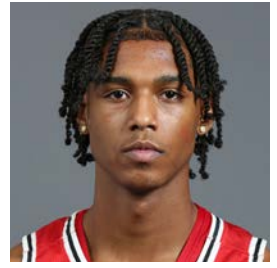

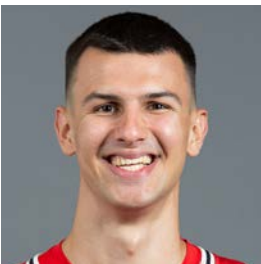

20th Season at Northeastern



Northeastern University is moving forward with plans to build a state-of-the-art, multi-purpose athletics and recreation complex on the site of Matthews Arena in Boston.

University leaders describe the new complex as an investment in the future that will provide recreational opportunities to all students, faculty and staff in addition to hosting ceremonies and other public and private events for the Northeastern and neighboring Boston communities.

The new multi-purpose complex will include a modern Division 1 athletics arena and training facilities that will elevate Northeastern's varsity athletic programs, especially in the nationally recognized sports of basketball and ice hockey.

"This is a place where memories will be made," says Ken Henderson, chancellor and senior vice president for learning at Northeastern. "This will be a place where we hold convocation, where we hold graduations, where we hold events for recreation, club sports and varsity sports. It will also be a place where students are coming together in small groups and large crowds.

"It will be transformational," Henderson says.

The 310,000-square-foot complex will occupy the entire two-acre footprint of Matthews Arena, including areas currently used as surface parking lots.

It will include an arena that will seat 4,050 people for ice hockey and 5,300 for basketball, providing excellent sightlines for fans as well as for television broadcasts of Northeastern competitions. It will be Northeastern's largest indoor gathering space, also enabling thousands of people to attend academic ceremonies and other non-athletic events.

### EMPHASIS ON STUDENT RECREATION

The most profound improvement of the new multi-story complex is its commitment to serving a wide variety of university and community interests simultaneously, with an emphasis on student recreation.

Its multi-purpose nature will create myriad opportunities that cannot be matched by Matthews Arena, Henderson says.

"We love Matthews Arena, but it is a single-use space. It's an arena where you can do one thing at a time," Henderson says. "The new complex will have multiple events and activities going on at the same time. You could be having a hockey game at the same time as you're having a club soccer game on the floor above — and perhaps a varsity basketball practice is being held, while other students are lifting weights and doing cardiovascular training at an individual level."

Students will welcome greater access to recreational facilities, says Ella Freedman, a second-year undergraduate studying music industry and communication studies.

"I do think students — especially freshmen and new people coming in — will be excited about it," Freedman says. "Everyone wants more space to work out. So that is a huge benefit for students and something a lot of people will look forward to. Having enough space for students to feel encouraged to have a healthy lifestyle is really important."

The investment in a new complex will be worthwhile, says Emma Sullivan, who will be graduating in May.

"I won't be a student by the time the new complex opens, but I do think it will be a really great opportunity for the next generations of Northeastern students," Sullivan says. "Getting the opportunity to grow in that space is going to be really cool."

### COMPLEX WILL REPRESENT EXCELLENCE IN ATHLETICS

Jim Madigan, a former ice hockey star and men's coach at Northeastern who now serves as the university's athletic director, envisions the new complex thrusting the Husky varsity programs to a higher competitive level.

*"For our varsity sports, this building signals to our peers and our competitors that Northeastern represents excellence," Madigan says. "It is going to be a game-changer for our programs to recruit the best student-athletes to Northeastern. It signals to them that we're serious about the development and success of our student-athletes and it signals to our coaches that this is a place where we can win national championships and league championships, where we have the modern-day amenities to compete against any institution in the country."*

The men's and women's varsity basketball programs will each have a practice court, which will be a boon to recruiting, according to Madigan. There will be improved training facilities and office spaces for varsity athletes and coaches. An example of the new building's versatility will be the presence of indoor rowing tanks for the men's and women's varsity teams.

For spectators, the arena will offer a "first-rate fan experience" with high-end concessions and multiple entry and exit points. Fans will be seated near the action with a ded-

icated section behind one of the hockey goals for the Dog-House, providing the Huskies with an impassioned advantage for home games.

"The building is going to offer food and entertainment and excitement and enjoyment," Madigan says. "This is a complex that will be bringing people together. It's going to create a sense of community, a sense of belonging throughout the university."

### OPPORTUNITIES FOR NEIGHBORHOOD ORGANIZATIONS

The multipurpose athletic complex is the next step in an extended series of infrastructure investments on Northeastern's Boston campus that have included the developments of International Village, East Village, the Interdisciplinary Science and Engineering Complex and EXP.

Since its 1979 purchase by Northeastern, Matthews Arena has served as a community venue for high school graduations and other events. That access will grow when the new complex is opened, says John Tobin, Northeastern's vice president for city and community engagement.

"This new complex will allow us to increase our offerings with our neighbors and with our great partners in the City of Boston," Tobin says. "It's going to be more than just a building. It will serve as a vital part of Boston's civic community from concerts to blood drives to Boston Public School ice hockey games. It will bring people together in ways that matter."

Matthews Arena was originally constructed in 1910 and rebuilt in 1918 after a devastating fire. At that time it was known as Boston Arena, and over the years it would serve as a home to the Boston Bruins and Boston Celtics in addition to a wide variety of sporting, cultural and community events.

It was renamed by Northeastern in 1982 in honor of George Matthews, who would rise to chairman of the Board of Trustees, and his wife, Hope.

Northeastern has invested millions of dollars in renovations of Matthews Arena over the years. The replacement of its historic features predating Northeastern's ownership makes Matthews Arena ineligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places, according to a 2023 evaluation conducted by Epsilon Associates.

The new complex, designed by the architectural firm Perkins&Will, is pursuing net-zero carbon certification and the deconstruction of the existing arena will capture reclaimed materials. Suffolk Construction is the contractor for the project, which will reuse rainwater for ice making, irrigation, and flushing, among other green initiatives.

During construction, the men's and women's basketball programs will move their games and practices to the Cabot Recreation Complex. Northeastern is making arrangements with local facilities to host the men's and women's hockey practices and games.

The project is awaiting final approvals from the city and state, which will determine the timelines for deconstruction and construction.
