Jerry **KEEFE**

FERNIE FLAMAN HEAD COACH | FOURTH SEASON

On June 30, 2021, Jerry Keefe was named the 11th Fernie Flaman Head Men's Hockey Coach in Northeastern history and is in his 14th season overall on Huntington Avenue.

In the first three seasons with Keefe at the helm, Northeastern set a 59-42-9 record. Last season, Keefe saw the Huskies to back-to-back Beanpot titles, claiming their fifth title in six tournaments. During the 2021-22, the Huskies saw one of their best seasons in recent history, going 25-13-1 overall, 15-9-1 in Hockey East play to claim the program's first-ever Hockey East regular season championship. Keefe's first three seasons produced five All-Americans, the first-ever two-time Richter Award winner, the first-ever two-time Hockey East Best Defensive Forward, a Hockey East Player of the Year, a Hockey East Goaltender of the Year and several other Hockey East accolades including the Bob Kullen Award for Hockey East's Coach of the Year in 2022.

Keefe spent the previous seven seasons as associate head coach helping the Huskies to three straight Beanpot championships, three NCAA tournament appearances, two Hockey East titles and one Belpot championship in the Friendship Four in Belfast, Northern Ireland. Additionally, Northeastern's power play was No. 1 in Hockey East at nearly 27 percent under Keefe's tutelage two seasons ago.

Along with his role at Northeastern, Keefe was selected to coach with the United States National Junior Team from 2018-20, helping Team USA win the silver medal in 2019. During the World Junior Championships, Keefe worked with fellow Huskies Tyler Madden (LA Kings), Cayden Primeau (Montreal Canadiens) and Jordan Harris (Montreal Canadiens).

Before Northeastern, Keefe established himself as a notable name in the New England college hockey ranks, making stops as an assistant coach at UMass Boston (2006-07) and a head coach at Westfield State (2008-09), before his two seasons as an assistant coach at Brown University (2009-11). He resurrected Westfield State's hockey program and led the Owls to a runner-up finish in the Massachusetts State Collegiate Athletic Conference (MASCAC) for the first time since 1981.

Keefe was a four-year center at Providence College from 1996 to 2000 and finished with 98 points (30 goals, 68 assists) in 102 career games. After leading the Friars with 52 points in 37 games, the highest single-season point total in 15 years, Keefe was honored as New England's Most Improved Player (1998-99). Upon graduation, Keefe's professional hockey career started at the end of the 2000 season with the Cincinnati Mighty Ducks (AHL) and Trenton Titans (ECHL). He spent five seasons playing professional hockey, including a pair of seasons in Europe, before retiring in 2004.

A native of Billerica, Mass., Keefe was a three-time All-Scholastic player and a member of a state championship team at Matignon High School, earning Massachusetts Player of the Year honors in 1993. Prior to enrolling at Providence, Keefe also played for the U.S. National Under-17 Team that won a silver medal in Tokyo, Japan in 1994 and the U-16 team that went 4-0 in Switzerland.

Previously, he served as the Director of Hockey Operations for Northeastern for two seasons, 2019-20 and 2020-21. Harlow helped guide the program to two winning seasons that included the program's third straight Beanpot Championship in February of 2020, and the program's first Belpot Championship.

Prior to coaching and scouting, Harlow played both collegiately and professionally. Harlow graduated from Brown University in 2015, following a four-year playing career at the school. Over the course of 127 games at Brown, Harlow scored 36 points from 17 goals and 19 assists. Following his NCAA career, Harlow played in 47 ECHL games spread across the 2014-15 and 2015-16 seasons. He suited up with the Elmira Jackals, Manchester Monarchs, and Alaska Aces during his professional career.

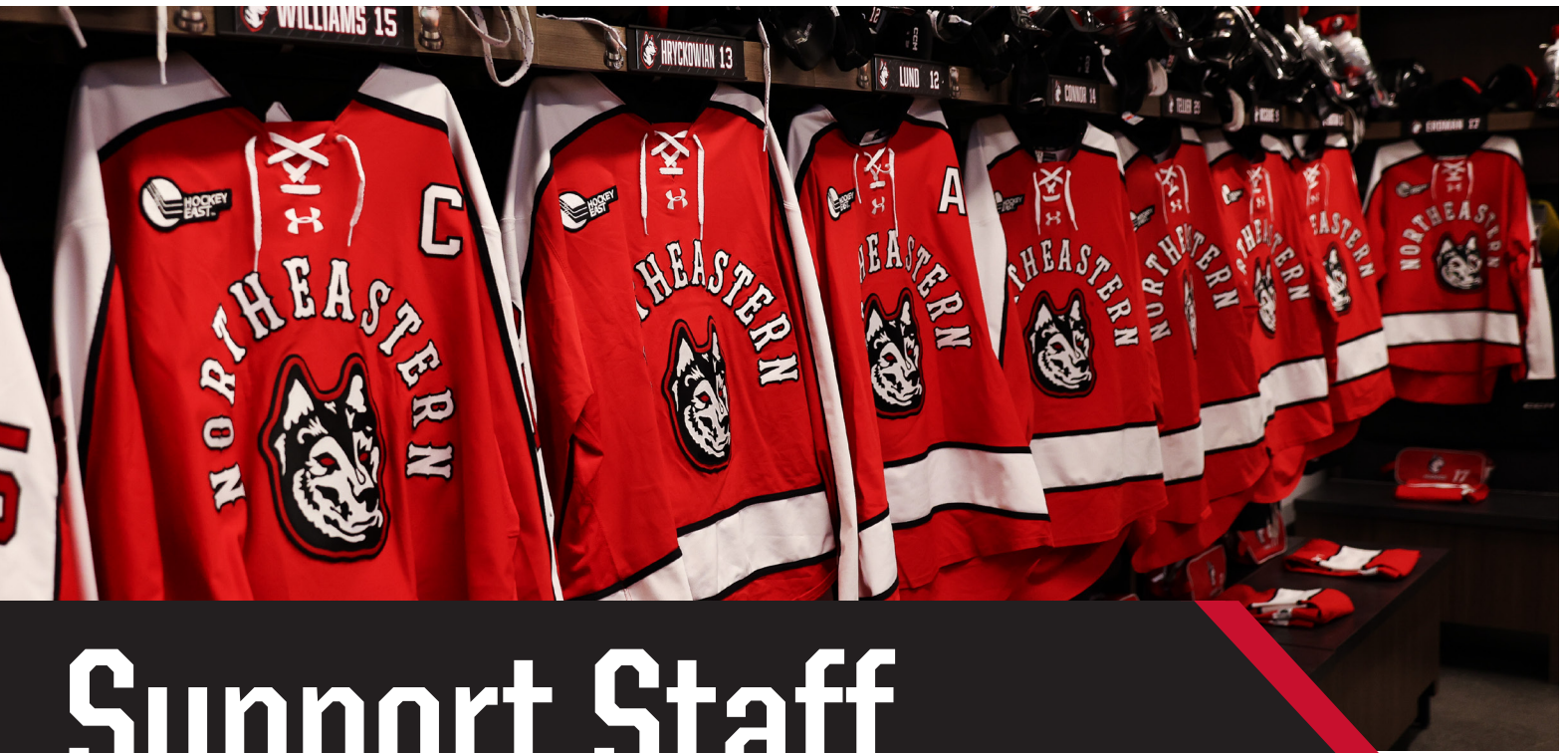
In his first year, Mahoney-Wilson helped develop the Huskies' goaltending depth chart. As a group, the Northeastern netminders collected 17 wins and four shutouts. Freshman starter, Cameron Whitehead, tied the program record for shutouts by a freshman in a single season (4), added his name to the Huskies' Top Ten list for single-season goaltending records in five categories and was named the 2024 Eberly Award recipient for best save percentage in the Beanpot tournament.

Mahoney-Wilson spent the past seven seasons as a goaltending coach for the AHL's Grand Rapids Griffins, working with notable NHL goaltenders Jimmy Howard, Magnus Hellberg, Alex Nedeljkovic, Calvin Pickard, and Kevin Poulin.

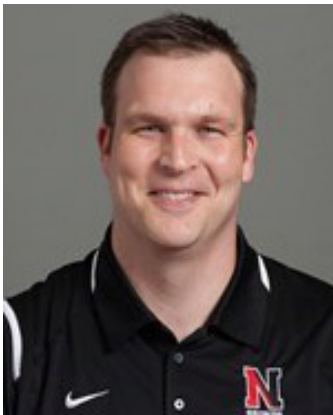

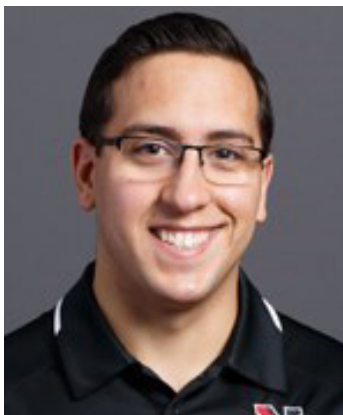

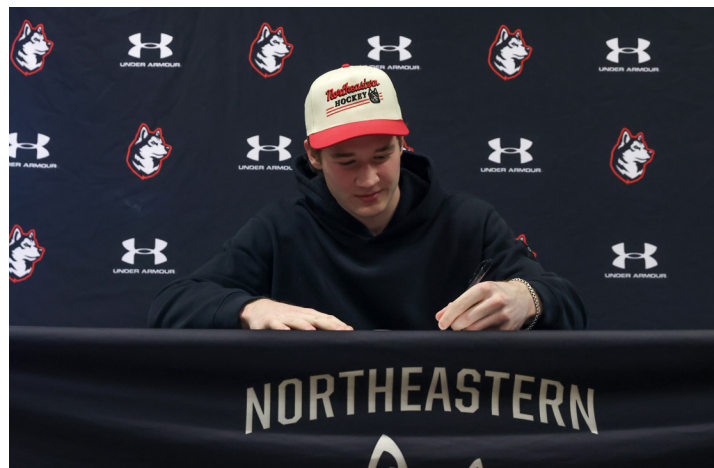
CAM LUND SIGNS WITH SAN JOSE SHARKS

Junior **Cam Lund** has signed a standard entry-level contract with the San Jose Sharks. Lund, a native of Bridgewater, Massachusetts, served as an assistant captain in his third stint with the Huskies.

During his career, the forward appeared in 107 collegiate games for Northeastern, recording 36 goals and 57 assists for 93 points. Additionally, he helped Northeastern claim back-to-back Beanpot Championships and the program's first trip to the Hockey East semifinals since 2022.

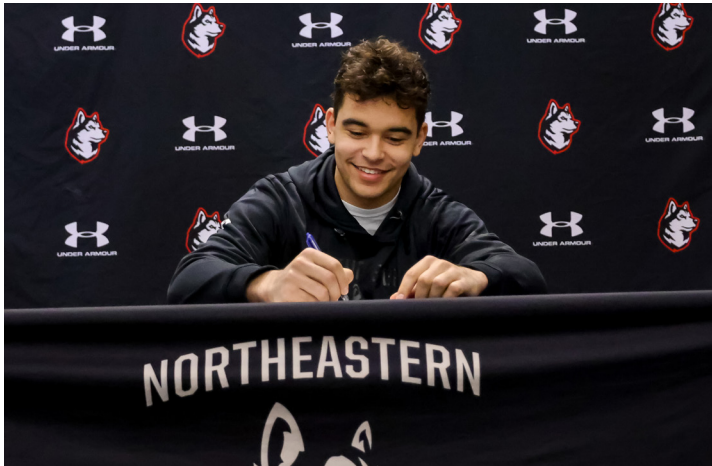
Lund was named a Hockey East Third Team All-Star following the conclusion of the 2024-25 regular season and was also named to the Hockey East All-Rookie team in 2022-23. He's a two-time Hobey Baker nominee and a semifinalist for the 73rd Walter Brown award, awarded to the best American-born college hockey player in New England.

In his junior campaign, Lund tallied 40 points in just 37 games played, ranking him among the top-20 in the country. He collected a team-high 18 goals and 22 assists, all marking career highs. Additionally, Lund concluded the 2024-25 season with 174 shots (fourth in the NCAA), 19 blocks and a team-high four power-play goals.





JACKSON DORRINGTON SIGNS WITH NEW YORK RANGERS



Northeastern University blueliner **Jackson Dorrington** has signed a three-year, entry-level contract with the New York Rangers, the team announced Sunday afternoon.

Dorrington was an integral member of Northeastern's defensive core, appearing in all 37 games for the Huskies this season. The assistant captain posted two goals and a career-high 13 assists for a career-high 15 points, second-best among all Husky defensemen. Dorrington also blocked a team- and career-high 73 shots during the 2024-25 campaign, sitting as the ninth-best mark in the NCAA.

The North Reading, Massachusetts native finished his collegiate career appearing in 105 games with 33 points from eight goals and 25 assists. In three years, he tallied 153 blocks, a plus-17 rating and 150 shots. He helped see Northeastern to two Beanpot titles and the program's first trip to the Hockey East semifinals since 2022.

Additionally, Dorrington was a two-time Hockey East Defender of the Week, a two-time Hockey East All-Academic Team honoree and an ACHA/Krampade All-American Scholar in 2022-23.





JACK WILLIAMS SIGNS WITH COLUMBUS BLUE JACKETS

Northeastern University men's ice hockey's **Jack Williams** has signed a two-year entry level contract beginning with the 2024-25 National Hockey League season, with the Columbus Blue Jackets. Williams, a native of Biddeford, Maine, wrapped up his third season as a Husky, serving as team captain. During his time with NU, he helped claim back-to-back Beanpot Championship titles in 2023 and 2024 and the program's first trip to the Hockey East semifinals since 2022.

He finishes his collegiate career with 106 appearances for Northeastern with 39 goals and 55 assists for 94 points. The junior tallied ten power-play goals, six game-winning goals, 245 shots and 90 blocked shots.

In his junior campaign, Williams tallied a career- and team-high 41 points and 25 assists, while adding 16 goals, the third best mark on the team. His point total finished ranked among the top-18 in the country. In Hockey East action, Williams' numbers rank among the top-15 with 275 faceoff wins (1st), three game-winning goals (T-4th), 15 assists (T-8th), 22 points (T-12th), and .92 points per game (T-13th).

In his 37 games played, the 5-11 forward recorded at least one point in 24 outings, while recording 11 multi-point games, led by two outings with four-points each against No. 18/17 Quinnipiac and No. 9/8 Boston University.





CAMERON WHITEHEAD SIGNS WITH VEGAS GOLDEN KNIGHTS



Northeastern Men's Hockey's **Cameron Whitehead** has signed a two-year, entry-level contract with the Vegas Golden Knights, the team announced on Friday evening.

Whitehead was the backbone to Northeastern's team, appearing in 35 games for the Huskies this season. The Orleans, Ontario native posted a 13-17-3 record, making 973 saves for a .911 save percentage. He helped see NU to their first Hockey East semifinal run since 2022. Whitehead tallied 131 saves for a 94.9 save percentage and 1.79 goals against average through three playoff games. Additionally, he set a career-high 44 saves in the opening round game against eight-seeded Merrimack that was quickly broken again in the Hockey East semifinals with 57 saves against two-seeded and No. 4 Maine.

The sophomore goaltender finished his collegiate career appearing in 70 games. His .914 save percentage and a 2.68 goals against average finished tied for fifth and seventh overall, respectively, in program history. His five career shutouts also rank tied for sixth, while his 30 career wins rank tied for tenth among all Husky goaltenders.

Whitehead also tied the program record for shutouts by a freshman in a single-season after totaling 22 saves against Merrimack for his fourth shutout in the 2023-24 season. He helped see Northeastern to the 2024 Beanpot title, where he won the Eberly award for best tournament save percentage. Additionally, he was a five-time Hockey East Goaltender of the Week, while also earning Hockey East Rookie of the Week honors on Oct. 9, 2024.





CAM LUND TABS POSTSEASON HONORS

Following the conclusion of the 2024-25 season, assistant captain **Cam Lund** earned two postseason honors as he was named a Hockey East Third Team All-Star and a 2024-25 New England Division I All-Star by the New England Hockey Writers Association.

Lund was one of eight players to appear in all 37 games for the Huskies this season. His team-high 18 goals, in addition to his 22 assists and 40 points that ranked second on NU's roster all marked career-highs. Additionally, he posted 174 shots, 13 multi-point games, a team-high four power-play goals and three game-winning goals. The Massachusetts native has tallied ten points (3g, 7a) in his last seven games, including four multi-point outings.

In Hockey East play, Lund ranked second in shots (112), fifth in power-play goals (94), seventh in goals (11) and tenth in points (23). Following the month of December, Lund was named the Hockey East Player of the Month after he collected nine points (4g, 5a) in six games, which ranked second in the entire nation.

The 6-2 forward totaled five points in Northeastern's Hockey East playoff run with two assists against eight-seeded Merrimack in the opening round, one goal against top-seeded No. 1 Boston College in the quarterfinals, and two points (1g, 1a) against No. 4 two-seeded Maine in the Semifinal game.

Additionally, Lund was named a semifinalist for the Walter Brown award and 2025 Hobey Baker nominee for the Huskies.

NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

1982 - Future Hockey Hall of Famer, Stanley Cup Champion and Boston Bruins' captain, Fernie Flaman led the 1981-82 Huskies' to their first-ever NCAA tournament appearance and first Frozen Four game in program history in his 12th season as head coach.

The Huskies went 20-8-1 in the regular season on the road to the team's first-ever ECAC Championship. Northeastern defeated St. Lawrence 5-3, before a 7-1 victory over Clarkson in the semifinals and then took down Harvard in the title game, 5-2. In addition to claiming the title, goaltender Mark Davidner was named tournament MVP.

Led by captain Jeff Hiltz and assistant captains, Paul Filipe and Paul McDougall, the 1981-82 team swept Bowling Green in the quarterfinal round of the NCAA tournament, winning the series by a score of 5-4. They advanced to face North Dakota in their first-ever Frozen Four appearance, falling short 6-2.

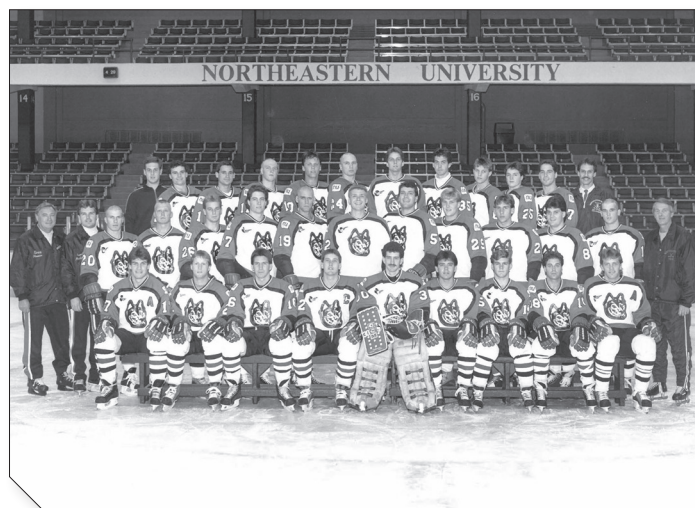
At the conclusion of the season, Flaman would be honored with the Spencer Penrose Award, giving yearly to the most outstanding coach in NCAA Division I men's ice hockey.



1988 - After finishing second in the Hockey East regular season standings, the Huskies earned a bye to the conference tournament semifinals en route to the program's first-ever Hockey East Tournament Championship. NU defeated Maine, who finished atop of the league, 4-3, at the Boston Garden. The Huskies' conference honors included: Bruce Racine (Tournament MVP), Brian Dowd and David O'Brien (First Team All-Stars), Claude Lodin (Second Team All-Star) and Will Averill (All-Rookie Team).

Earning a spot in the NCAA Tournament, NU would face Merrimack for two games, total goals series at Matthews Arena. The Huskies won the first game 5-3 after erupting for four goals in the third period. The Huskies had five different goal scorers and Kevin Heffernan had three assists. The next night, the Huskies were in control with a 3-2 lead headed into the third period. However, in the final frame, Merrimack scored five unanswered goals, including two in the final three minutes for the series victory.

The loss concluded the college careers of two-time All-American goalie Bruce Racine and Kevin Heffernan, NU's ninth all-time leading scorer.

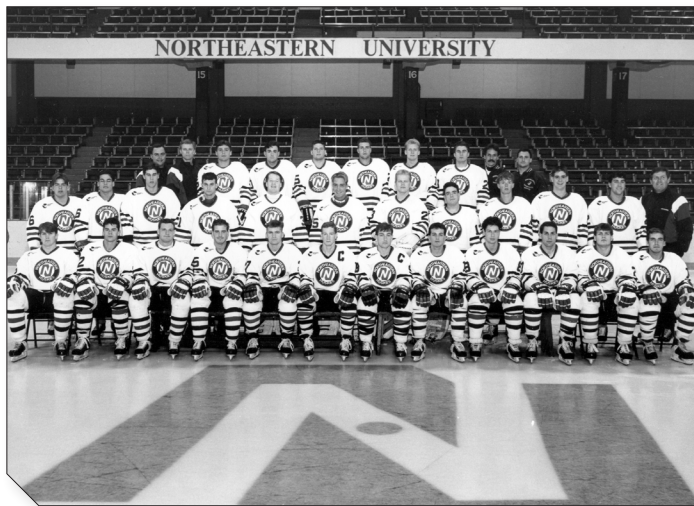


NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

1994 - Under the helm of head coach, Ben Smith, Northeastern made its third appearance in the NCAA Tournament and first since 1988. Northeastern received an at-large bid to the tournament after advancing to the Hockey East semifinals following a quarterfinal sweep of Providence and a strong overall record of 19-12-7.

NU's hopes were short-lived, however, as the Huskies were ousted in the first round by eventual-champion Lake Superior State. Led by goalie Blaine Lacher, the Lakers dispatched the Huskies, 6-5, in an exciting, high-scoring game which ended 15 seconds into sudden-death overtime. Replays showed that a Dan Lupo shot crossed the goal line in the third period, but the apparent go-ahead tally for NU was ruled a Lacher save. It was the second time in NU history that the Huskies had lost to the eventual national champion (North Dakota - 1982).

Co-captain Mike Taylor and Francois Bouchard were named Hockey East First Team All-Stars at the conclusion of the season.

2009 - In 2009, Northeastern returned to the NCAA Tournament after a 14-year hiatus in what had become one of the most successful seasons in Huskies history. Head coach Greg Cronin guided the Huskies to a 25-11-4 record and a second-place finish in Hockey East with an 18-6-3 mark. After dispatching Massachusetts in the Hockey East quarterfinals, the Huskies lost to UMass Lowell in overtime in the semis.

Despite the loss, the Huskies earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament and were awarded the No. 2 seed in the Midwest Regional in Grand Rapids, Mich. The Huskies faced Cornell in the opening round and started strong with a 2-0 lead on goals by Louis Liotti and Steve Silva. But Cornell responded with three unanswered goals, including the game-winner with just 18 seconds remaining in regulation, to end Northeastern's Frozen Four hopes.

It was the final game for Huskies All-American goalie, and 2009 Hockey East Player of the Year, Brad Thiessen, who went on to sign with the Pittsburgh Penguins of the NHL. Additionally, during the 2008-09 season, Joe Vitale became the first Husky to be named Hockey East's Best Defensive Forward, while Louis Liotti earned the league's Best Defensive Defenseman honors.

NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

2016 - It was a tale of two seasons for the 2015-16 Northeastern hockey team, who rebounded from a 1-11-2 start to finish the season 21-3-3, including a 13-game winning streak that was the longest in program history and a 14-game unbeaten streak (13-0-1) that was also the longest in team history, culminating in the program's first Hockey East championship since 1988. After knocking off No. 5/4 Boston College and No. 8 UMass Lowell on consecutive nights to capture the program's second Hockey East title, the Huskies earned the league's automatic berth into the national tournament. Northeastern drew the No. 4 seed in the Midwest Regional and a trip to Cincinnati for a date with North Dakota, the No. 3 overall seed.

Nolan Stevens put the Huskies on top early with his 20th goal of the season just 3:07 into the game, but the Fighting Hawks responded with three goals over the next 11 minutes of the contest. UND added two more goals in the second period before the teams traded tallies in the third, including one from Matt Benning, to send North Dakota to a 6-2 victory over NU. The Fighting Hawks went on to win the national championship, with Northeastern being the only team to hold a lead on North Dakota during the tournament.

2018 - Northeastern returned to the NCAA Tournament for the second time in three seasons during a 2017-18 campaign that saw the Huskies log their most wins since 2009 with a 23-10-5 overall record. Using the program's first Beanpot title in 30 years as a springboard to seven-straight victories down the stretch of the season, the Huskies earned an at-large bid to the national tournament as the No. 3 seed in the Northeast Regional, earning a matchup with Michigan.

But, despite digging its way out of two one-goal deficits, Northeastern didn't have an answer for Michigan's tally with 4:30 remaining in the game as the Wolverines ended the Huskies' season, 3-2.

Senior Dylan Sikura netted his career-best 22nd goal at 18:04 of the second period, and junior Eric Williams leveled the score at 2-2 at 12:01 of the third period on a lightning-quick wrister from the right boards. Michigan's Cooper Marody scored twice for the Wolverines, including the game-winner at 15:30 of the third as Michigan continued its journey to a Frozen Four appearance.

2019 - Expected by many to be a rebuilding year on Huntington Avenue, the Huskies responded with a record-breaking season in 2018-19. The team finished the year 27-11-1, good for the most victories in single-season history, becoming the 14th team to ever win both the Beanpot and the Hockey East championship in the same season.

The Huskies claimed the No. 2 seed in the NCAA tournament after one of their most successful seasons ever. Paced by outstanding team performances and the Mike Richter Award-winning goaltender Cayden Primeau, the Huskies reached their seventh NCAA tournament, and third in the last four seasons, squaring off against the No. 3 seed Cornell. Northeastern started behind the game early letting up four unanswered goals in the first two periods. After recording a power-play goal from Liam Pecarraro, the Huskies could not climb any closer, ultimately falling 5-1.

Primeau and defenseman Jérémy Davies were both named CCM/ACHA All-Americans prior to signing professional contracts.

2022 - The Huskies earned an at-large bid after their groundbreaking 25-13-1 record, going 15-8-1 in Hockey East play to capture the program's first regular season championship. Led by Hockey East First Team All-Stars Jordan Harris, Aidan McDonough, and Devon Levi, the Huskies were the No. 4 seed in the Worcester Regional, facing top-seeded and No. 3 overall seed Western Michigan.

The Broncos took an early 1-0 lead, but the Huskies surged to gain all momentum in the game and culminating in a great individual effort by assistant captain Aidan McDonough, who tied the game with four minutes left in regulation. Hockey East Rookie of the Year Devon Levi made the highlight reel with several top notch saves, ending the game with 34 saves. What was initially called a save was overturned via video replay and called a good goal, giving the Broncos the overtime victory.

McDonough, Levi, and Harris were all named CCM/ACHA All-Americans, while Levi went on to win the Mike Richter award and the National Rookie of the Year award. Jordan Harris would go on to sign with the Montreal Canadiens and debut with one goal and a plus-three rating in his first 10 games.
